#### BRONCOS HEAD TO WAC CHAMPIONSHIPS (3.18.13)...

##### WHAT'S HAPPENING:

The No. 24 Boise State gymnastics team heads to the 2013 Western Athletic Conference Championship meet on Sat., March 23 in Cedar City, Utah. The meet, which is hosted by Southern Utah University, will take place in Centrum Arena at 6 p.m. MT. The Broncos will face No. 13 Denver, No. 34 Southern Utah, No. 39 Sacramento State, No. 43 San Jose State and No. 53 Utah State in their first conference meet since 2011.

##### BRONCO CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY:

The 2013 WAC Championships will be the 10th the Broncos have competed in throughout program history. Boise State has won three WAC titles, including the 2008, 2009 and 2011 meets. The Broncos competed in the WAC during the 1991-1993 seasons, as well as the 2006-2011 seasons as a member institution and will compete for the first time as an affiliate at the 2013 championships.

Throughout all conference championships in program history, Boise State has collected 11 titles: Mountain West Athletic Conference (1983, 1986, 1987); Big West Conference (1997, 1999, 2000); Western Gymnastics Conference (2003, 2004) and WAC (2008, 2009, 2011).

##### ABOUT BOISE STATE:

Boise State falls one spot to No. 24 in this week's national rankings (according to Troester.com/gym). Boise State holds a 12-3 record on the season, including a 4-2 record against Western Athletic Conference teams. They sit in fourth in the NCAA West Region, and remain in second in the WAC, while holding a season-high score of 196.575 scored on March 1 against Southern Utah.

The Broncos have an RQS of 195.785 and rank No. 17 in the country on vault (49.165 RQS), No. 16 on uneven bars (49.105), No. 41 on balance beam (48.545) and No. 15 on floor exercise (49.200).

Individually six Broncos hold top-100 national rankings in their respective events. Kelsey Black hold top-100 spots in three events, ranking No. 73 (tie) on vault (9.850), No. 87 (tie) on bars (9.825) and No. 40 (tie) on floor (9.880). Amanda Otuafi ranks No. 50 (tie) on vault (9.875) and No. 69 (tie) on floor (9.860), while Ciera Perkins ranks No. 98 on vault (9.840) and No. 63 (tie) on bars (9.845). Brittany Potvin-Green ranks No. 65 (tie) on beam (9.830) and No. 64 (tie) on floor (9.860) as the final Bronco with multiple rankings. Erin Wippermann sits at No. 82 (tie) on bars (9.830), while Caitlin Mann ranks No. 70 in the all-around (38.845).

Boise State will open the 2013 WAC Championship on balance beam. The Broncos' rotation order continues with a bye, followed by floor exercise, vault, bye, and uneven bars.

##### A LOOK AT THE OPPONENTS:

No. 13 Denver (18-2)

Denver enters the championship with a No. 13 ranking (196.470 RQS) and a season-high 197.20 scored at home on March 9 against Arizona State and Illinois State. DU also ranks No. 13 on vault, No. 11 on bars, No. 12 on beam and No. 10 on floor in the national rankings this week. Denver holds a 1-0 lead over the Broncos for 2013 competitions. Individually, Moriah Martin ranks No. 4 on vault, No. 33 (tie) on bars, No. 99 (tie) on beam, No. 73 (tie) on floor and No. 16 in the all-around. Additionally, Nina McGee sits at No. 18 on bars, No. 41 (tie) on beam and No. 10 (tie) on floor, while Kaitlin Moorhead ranks No. 44 (tie) on vault and No. 48 (tie) on floor. Brianna Springer (63rd, tie), Ellese Sakai-Hart (91st, tie) and Jorie Hall (53rd, tie) round out the ranked Pioneers on bars, beam and floor, respectively.

No. 34 Southern Utah (7-8)

Southern Utah holds the No. 34 spot this week (195.145 RQS) in the national rankings. They rank No. 35 on vault, No. 29 on bars, No. 33 on beam and No. 42 on floor. The Thunderbirds have a season-high of 196.20 scored at home against San Jose State, Iowa and Ball State on March 15. Boise State topped SUU on March 1 in their only meeting of the season. Individually Michaela Chernoch holds the team's highest ranking, sitting at No. 53 in the all-around. Caitlin Kennedy ranks No. 66 and Jamie Armijo No. 90 in the all-around, while Natalie Trejo ranks No. 80 (tie) on beam.

No. 39 Sacramento State (6-12)

Sacramento State enters the week at No. 39 (tie) in the nation (194.740 RQS) with a season-best of 195.240 scored at Southern Utah on February 15. The Hornets rank No. 37 on vault, No. 38 (tie) on bars, No. 42 on beam and No. 41 on floor. Sacramento State is the only WAC team the Broncos have not faced during the 2013 season. Kalliah McCartney holds three individual ranks within the nation's top-100, including No. 28 in the all-around, No. 55 on beam and No. 82 (tie) on floor. Cassie Benning sits at No. 74 in the all-around, while Nicole Meiller rounds out the top-100 ranked Hornets with a No. 68 (tie) spot on bars.

No. 43 San Jose State (12-11)

San Jose State sits at No. 43 this week (194.60 RQS), while also ranking No. 48 on vault, No. 38 (tie) on bars, No. 30 (tie) on beam and No. 43 on floor. The Spartans hold a season-high of 195.70 scored at UC Davis on March 1. SJSU earned a win over the Broncos in their only meeting this season on March 8. Cassandra Harrison holds two top-100 rankings sitting at No. 60 in the all-around and No. 98 (tie) on floor. Bekah Gher ranks No. 64 (tie) in the all-around, as well as No. 91 (tie) on beam.

No. 53 Utah State (3-11)

Utah State ranks No. 53 in this week's national rankings (193.445 RQS) holding a season-best 194.20 score earned at Southern Utah on February 1. The Aggies rank No. 43 on vault, No. 48 on bars, No. 51 (tie) on beam and No. 58 on floor. Boise State is 2-0 over Utah State in 2013 meetings. Two all-around gymnasts hold top-100 rankings, including Sarah Landes at No. 40 and Paige Jones at No. 76.

##### ALL-TIME SERIES:

Boise State holds an all-time series advantage over three of the five opponents they will face this weekend. They hold a 28-6-1 lead over San Jose State, as well as a 27-20 record with Southern Utah and an 18-7 record with Sacramento State. Denver holds an 11-9-1 advantage over the Broncos, while Utah State leads 55-30 all-time.

#### BRONCOS SWEEP TITLES AT UTAH STATE (3.15.13)...

The No. 23 Boise State gymnastics team closed out its 2013 regular season slate with a 195.300-194.125 win over Utah State Friday evening at Utah State's Dee Glen Smith Spectrum. The Broncos (12-3, 4-2 WAC) outscored the Aggies (3-11, 0-7 WAC) as a team on all four events, while also sweeping all five individual titles on the night.

Sophomores Ciera Perkins and Caitlin Mann led the Broncos, picking up two individual titles apiece, while senior Brittany Potvin-Green and juniors Kelsey Black and Amanda Otuafi earned one title apiece, including shared titles.

Perkins earned the first two wins of the night collecting the vault title with a 9.90 score for her second win of the season and third of her career on the event. She earned her second uneven bars title of the season, as well as her fourth-career win, with a score of 9.875.

Mann earned a career-high score of 39.325 to win her fourth all-around title of the season. Her win moves her to a tie for seventh in Boise State season all-around wins. Mann also tied her career-best of 9.90 to share the floor exercise title with teammates Otuafi and Black. The title was the first of the season for Mann, third for Otuafi and fourth for Black. Black's fourth title on floor this season moves her to a tie for 10th in Boise State season floor wins.

Boise State's gymnastics team placed second in a San Jose State quadrangular competition on Friday evening to move to 11-3 on the season and 3-2 against Western Athletic Conference teams. The Broncos scored a 195.425 and were edged out by host San Jose State who earned a 195.575 team score. UC Davis earned a 194.500 team total, while Seattle Pacific earned a 191.725.

Broncos Amanda Otuaifi and Brittany Potvin-Green collected individual titles, winning on vault and balance beam, respectively. Otuaifi's wins was her fourth on vault this season and in her career, while Potvin-Green earned her first career beam win.

Boise State opened the meet on the uneven bars earning a 48.075 score. Kelsey Morris led the team for the second-straight week, earning a 9.80. Ciera Perkins earned a 9.775, while Kelsey Black was close behind with a 9.750 performance. Maddie Krentz picked up a 9.650, while Erin Wippermann had a 9.100 and Caitlin Mann a 6.750.

On balance beam the Broncos collaborated for a 48.700 team total, led by Potvin-Green's 9.90 careertying performance. Mann and Morris added 9.775 and 9.725 performances, respectively, while Black and Krystine Jacobsen garnered 9.675 and 9.625 scores. Otuaifi rounded out the lineup with an 8.575 score.

Boise State earned a solid score of 49.275 on floor exercise thanks to six steady performances. Otuaifi earned a 9.90 and Mann a 9.875, while Black and Potvin-Green collected 9.850 scores each. Krentz and Morris each closed out the event with 9.80 performances.

The Broncos ended the evening on a high note by tying the school's third-best team vault score of 49.375 to lead all teams on the event. Otuaifi led the Bronco charge, earning a career-best 9.950 score, tying the fifth-best score in school history. Perkins tied her career-best and was joined by Potvin-Green in earning 9.90 scores, while Black had a 9.850 performance. Mann earned a 9.775 and Krentz a 9.450 to round out the lineup.

Additional individual event winners included SJSU's Bekah Gher in the all-around (39.20) and teammate Cassandra Harrison on floor (9.925), while UC Davis' Katie Yamamura earned the bars title with a 9.825 score. ## BRONCOS HAVE RECORD NIGHT IN WIN OVER SOUTHERN UTAH (3.1.13)...

The Boise State gymnastics team tied the eighth-best score in school history, 196.575, in a win over Southern Utah Friday night (March 1) at Taco Bell Arena. The Broncos (9-2) tied two school records en route to their best score of the season, while also collecting seven career-best performances. The team tied the school record on floor with Kelsey Black and Brittany Potvin-Green leading the way with 9.950 scores, also tying the individual score school record. Southern Utah scored a near season-best of 195.60 to place second in the meet.

The meet was the final home competition for three Bronco seniors: Crisy Dahquist, Erin Wippermann and Brittany Potvin-Green, who were honored following the meet.

"Tonight was special for our seniors who all had great performances," said Tina Bird, co-head coach for the Broncos. "We look forward to them finishing out the season much like they did tonight."

Boise State started the night out on vault where they scored 48.875 as a team. Amanda Otuaifi led the Broncos with a 9.90 score, winning her fourth vault title this season. Ciera Perkins tied for second on the event with a 9.775, while Kelsey Black and Caitlin Mann tied for sixth with 9.750 scores each. Maddie Krentz earned a 9.70 to tie for 10th while Potvin-Green placed 12th with a 9.650 score.

In the second rotation the Broncos joined forces to earn a 49.250 team total, tying the 10th-best effort in school history. Kelsey Morris led the troops with a career-best 9.90 performance, garnering her second career win on the event. Perkins earned a 9.875 to place second, while Wippermann scored a 9.850 to place third. Black and Krentz snagged the fourth and fifth place spots with 9.825 and 9.80 scores, respectively, while Krystine Jacobsen tied for seventh with a 9.775 score.

Southern Utah earned the top individual spot on beam

with Michaela Chernoch winning the event with a 9.875 score. Boise State scored a 48.875 as a team with Potvin-Green earning a 9.825 to place fifth to lead the Broncos. Morris earned a season-best and Jacobsen a career-best of 9.80 each to tie for sixth, while Otuaifi tied her career-high of 9.775 to place eighth. Mann picked up a 10th-place finish (9.675) and Black a 12th-place finish (9.10) in the third rotation of the night.

"We are so proud of Krystine Jacobsen who competed for the first time on beam tonight," said Bird. "At the end of the lineup, she was in a big pressure spot after someone ahead of her missed and she came through with a spectacular routine. It was so great to see a freshman step up at a critical time and that was definitely the turning point of the meet."

Turning point indeed, the Broncos fed off the finale on beam and were able to earn a 49.575 to tie the school record on floor as a team. Black earned a new career-best and Potvin-Green tied her career-best of 9.950 to share the event title, as well as tie the school record on floor. The win was the fourth of Black's career and sixth of Potvin-Green's, tying the ninth-best total career floor wins (6) at Boise State. Mann also had a career-best performance, scoring 9.90 to tie Otuaifi for a third-place finish. Krentz earned a 9.875 to tie for fifth, while Morris earned another career-best of 9.850 to place seventh.

Co-head coach Neil Resnick said happily of the Broncos' performance, "Not too shabby!"

SUU's Chernoch captured the all-around title with a 39.30 score, followed by teammate Caitlin Kennedy, who scored 38.950. Black earned a 38.625 score to place third in the all-around standings.

Boise State closes out its home season with the win over Southern Utah, bringing the all-time series to a 27-20 Bronco lead.

Up next for the blue and orange are two away meet to close out the regular season. The Broncos head to San Jose State on March 8, followed by a March 15 trip to Utah State before heading to Cedar City, Utah, for the Western Athletic Conference Championships on March 23.

Boise State returns home for the final time this season on March 1. They enter the week at No. 27 in the national rankings (according to Troester.com/gym) after falling from No. 16 last week. This week is the first of the Regional Qualifying Scores (RQS) taking over how teams are ranked, causing the drop for the Broncos. Boise State holds an 8-2 record on the season, including a 2-1 record against Western Athletic Conference teams. They hold a season-high score of 196.325.

The Broncos traveled to Denver in a last minute change of schedule due to inclement weather. Originally the Broncos were to travel to Lincoln, Neb., to take on the Huskers and Iowa State on Friday, Feb. 22.

In Denver, Boise State earned team scores of 49.050 on vault, 49.00 on uneven bars, 48.125 on balance beam and 48.350 on floor exercise. The Broncos' bars total led all four teams on the night, while DU led the team totals on vault, beam and floor.

The Broncos opened up the night on floor where they were led by Brittany Potvin-Green's 9.80 score. Potvin-Green's mark was good for a three-way tie for fourth, while Kelsey Black added a 9.725 effort on floor, placing 12th. Kelsey Morris tied for 14th (9.650), Amanda Otufi placed 18th (9.60), Caitlin Mann placed 19th (9.575) and Marissa Wossner placed 21st (8.850) to round out the floor line-up.

The No. 16-ranked Boise State gymnastics team joined the No. 23 wrestling team in big wins Sunday evening (Feb. 10) in the second Beauty and the Beast competition of the season. The Bronco gymnastics team (4-0) earned a 196.30-191.325 win over Southeast Missouri, while the Bronco wrestlers (9-5) topped Cal Poly 43-3 in front of a crowd of 1,768 fans at Taco Bell Arena.

The Bronco gymnastics team put forth a great group effort earning the 15th-best team total in school history. They also tied the third-best team floor exercise score in Bronco history (49.50), while tying the sixth-best vault total (49.325). Boise State also earned team totals of 48.950 on uneven bars and 48.525 on balance beam in the win over the Redhawks.

"We are really proud of the team effort tonight," said Tina Bird, co-head coach of the Broncos. "We are excited because they competed so well as a team, yet we see big potential since there is still room for improvement."

Co-head coach Neil Resnick added, "The kids are competing daily in the gym and it shows in the meets. It's great to have a performance like we did tonight where we were competing as a team."

Leading the charge Sunday evening was Kelsey Black, Amanda Otuaifi and Caitlin Mann who earned two individual titles apiece. Black earned a career-best of 9.875 to tie for her first-career vault title, while tying her career-best on floor to share her third-career title (9.925). Otuaifi shared both titles with Black earning a career-best on floor and collecting her third-career win on each event. Mann earned her third-career titles in the all-around (38.675) and on beam (9.850).

Brittany Potvin-Green and Ciera Perkins earned season-bests on vault, tying with Black and Otuaifi for the win with 9.875 scores. The win marked Perkins' second in her career, while Potvin-Green earned her eighth-career win, tying the No. 8 spot in career vault wins at Boise State. Maddie Krentz earned a career-high of 9.825 to place fifth on vault, while Mann tied for seventh with a 9.775.

Erin Wippermann earned her third-career title on bars, scoring a 9.825 to win the event outright. Black, Mann and Perkins each scored 9.80 to share the runner-up title with Southeast Missouri's Taryn Vanderpool. Morris earned a season-best 9.725 to place sixth, while Krentz earned a 9.70 to tie for seventh on bars.

Potvin-Green finished just behind Mann on beam, earning a season-best 9.825 to earn the runner-up title. Molly McFarland placed fourth (9.675), while Morris (9.650) and Otuaifi (9.525) placed fifth and sixth, respectively. Alessandra Cinfio rounded out the Broncos' lineup with a ninth-place finish (9.025).

Krentz earned her second career-best score of the day, earning the third-place spot on floor behind Black and Otuaifi with a 9.90, while Potvin-Green tied with Krentz earning a season-best score. Morris collected a fifth-place finish on floor after recording a career-best 9.850 performance while Mann placed 10th with a 9.250.

The Redhawks' Vanderpool earned a 38.450 in the all-around, placing second behind Mann, while teammate Kimmie Pickler placed third with a 37.875 total.

Boise State prepares to close out the month of February with a pair of tough meets on the road. The Broncos head to No. 2 Oklahoma on Feb. 15 followed by a trip to No. 9 Nebraska the next week (Feb. 22).

"We are excited to have a pair of meets like we did today under our belts," said Resnick. "It serves as a great springboard for the next two meets we have against highly ranked opponents. Next stop - Oklahoma - a great place for Bronco Nation!"

The Cougars hold a No. 31 rank in this week's Troester.com national rankings. As a team they rank No. 37 on vault, No. 17 on bars, No. 39 on beam and No. 33 on floor. Regionally they sit at No. 4 in the North Central Region.

Individually three Cougars sit in the nation's top-100 rankings in their respective events. Raquel Willman sits in a tie for No. 49 in the all-around (38.933), is tied for No. 52 on bars (9.817) and tied for No. 100 on beam (9.758). Megan Bain holds the highest rank, sitting in a tie for No. 18 on beam (9.858), while also tying for No. 81 on floor (9.792). Haylee Rollins holds the final individual rank, tying for No. 35 on bars (9.833).

#### POTVIN-GREEN, WIPPERMANN LEAD IN RECORD SEASON OPENER WIN (1.18.13)...

Boise State's gymnastics team began its 2013 season on a high note earning the school's best season opening score in a win over Utah State Friday (Jan. 18) night at Taco Bell Arena. The Broncos earned a team total of 194.875, topping the Aggies who scored 191.250. Boise State was led by seniors Brittany Potvin-Green, who won three titles, and Erin Wippermann, who earned her first career win.

"Breaking a school scoring record is a good start, but we have a long way to go to accomplish our season goals," said co-head coach Neil Resnick.

Potvin-Green led the Broncos with wins on vault, floor exercise and the all-around, while Wippermann won a title on the uneven bars. The Broncos outscored the Aggies as a team on all three of the four events, tallying scores of 48.825 on vault, 48.725 on bars, 48.525 on beam and 48.80 on floor.

"Brittany performed like the veteran she is, which was no surprise to the entire coaching staff," said Resnick. "Hard work and dedication yields good results."

Potvin-Green captured her sixth career all-around title, moving her to a tie for seventh in all-time Bronco all-around titles. The senior earned a 38.875, best five other all-around competitors.

Leading a top-four sweep on vault, Potvin-Green earned a 9.825 score for her seventh career title on the event. With the win she moves to a tie for ninth in total vault wins at Boise State. Ciera Perkins finished close behind in second (9.80), while Kelsey Black placed third (9.775) and Amanda Otufi came in fourth (9.750). Kelsey Morris notched a 9.675 placing sixth and Caitlin Mann earned a 9.425 to place 11th.

Wippermann recorded her first career win as a Bronco after improving her career-best score by nearly a full point. Wippermann won the uneven bars with a 9.825, followed by Black and Mann who tied for second with scores of 9.80 each. Morris tied for sixth (9.70), Potvin-Green placed eighth (9.60) and Perkins was ninth (9.025) to round out the Broncos' bars line-up.

Alessandra Cinfio led the Broncos on beam, tying for a second-place finish and a score of 9.80. Otufi placed fifth, tying her career-best of 9.725, while Molly McFarland and Kelsey Morris tied for sixth (9.70). Potvin-

Green (9.60) and Mann (9.525) rounded out the lineup, placing ninth and 10th, respectively.

In the final rotation the Broncos swept the top four spots again, led by Potvin-Green's 9.850 winning score. The win was her fourth career title in the event. Black scored a 9.80 to place second and Mann a 9.775 for third, followed by Perkins' 9.750 for fourth. Otufi tied for sixth (9.625) and Morris placed 10th (9.425) in the final event of the night.

Utah State earned scores of 48.025 on vault, 47.10 on bars, 48.550 on beam and 47.575 on floor as a team. The Aggies earned a team victory, as well as their only individual title of the night on balance beam. JoAnna Cuba earned a 9.825, topping her nearest opponent by .025 for the win.

Boise State will continue their season in one week when they hit the road for the first time this season. The Broncos will travel to Provo, Utah, to take on BYU on Saturday, January 26 in a 7:00 p.m. match-up.

#### BRONCOS PICKED TO TOP WAC IN PRE-SEASON COACHES' POLL (1.3.13)...

The Boise State gymnastics team was selected as the top pick in the 2013 Western Athletic Conference pre-season gymnastics coaches' poll, as voted on by the head coaches of the league. The Broncos were selected as the favorite to win this year's WAC championship title, earning the top spot with 25 points and five first place votes.

Boise State, who was picked No. 15 in the 2013 national preseason coaches' poll, has won three of the last five WAC championship titles. Their most recent title was earned in 2011, while the Broncos as an independent in 2012.

Denver, the 2012 WAC champion, was picked to finish second this season with 21 points and one first place vote. Southern Utah was selected third with 16 points, while Sacramento State was picked fourth with 11 points. #### BRONCOS PICKED NO. 15 IN GYMINFO PRESEASON COACHES' POLL (12.4.12)...

Boise State gymnastics has been named the No. 15 team in the 2013 GymInfo Women's Gymnastics Pre-season Coaches' Poll. The poll, which was released Monday (Dec. 3), is based on votes from each of the NCAA Division I gymnastics head coaches from across the nation.

The Broncos drop one spot from their 2012 preseason ranking and final season ranking of No. 14, respectively. The team's 2013 spot is the ninth top-25 preseason ranking since 1997, as well as the second-best all-time preseason ranking (three No. 19 spots, two No. 25, one No. 14, one No. 18 and one No. 21).

Boise State will take on three 2013 preseason top-25 picks in the coming months all, on the road. Oklahoma, who sits at No. 4, will be their first ranked opponent, hosting the Broncos, BYU and Texas Women's University on Friday, Feb. 15 in Norman, Okla. The following week Boise State heads to take on No. 7 Nebraska, as well as unranked Iowa State, in Lincoln, Neb., on Friday, Feb. 22. They face their final ranked opponent No. 20 Denver at the Western Athletic Conference Championships on Saturday, March 23.

Alabama, the 2012 national champion, will continue to hold the No. 1 spot heading into the 2013 season. UCLA sits just behind at No. 2, while Florida takes the No. 3 slot.
