Brigham Young, 1996 Sixth Season At SUU

A 2010 and 2013 Eddie Robinson Award finalist, Ed Lamb is entering his seventh season as head coach of the Thunderbird football program.

In his first six years Coach Lamb has overseen a total transformation of the program. After inheriting a squad that finished 0-11 the year prior to his arrival he led the team to a Great West Conference championship in just his third season and to the program's first-ever NCAA playoff berth last year.

During his first year at SUU Coach Lamb turned around a program which had been mired in a 19-game slide, and while the 2008 team finished with just four wins, they were four more wins than the program had in any of the previous three seasons. SUU also broke through with its first road-win in four years when it stopped Southland Conference champion and 22nd-ranked Texas State, 34-30, in that 2008 campaign.

That same season Lamb's program landed 11 players on the all-GWC squad, including seven first-team selections as well as its special teams player of the year. The Thunderbirds finished the season ranked among the nation's top-20 teams in punting and punt returns, passing offense and tackles-for-loss.

The improvement continued in 2009 when the team finished with a 5-6 mark, its best record since 2004. The T-Birds ranked among the nation's top-20 programs in passing, pass efficiency, total offense, scoring offense and punt returns in addition to leading the nation on net punting.

The Thunderbirds had two all-Americans in 2009, placed 12 players on the all-conference squad and had 14 academic all-conference selections. SUU had individuals ranked among the nation's top 10 in pass receptions, receiving yards, total offense, punt returns and scoring as well.

In 2010 the team continued its ascent, as the T-Birds claimed their first Great West championship with a perfect 4-0 mark in conference games, posted an overall 6-5 record – the team's first winning record since 2004 – and finished the season ranked among the nation's top-30 in both the coaches and the media polls.

SUU matched 2010's 6-5 record in 2011, a season which included the team's first win over a FBS-level team in 14 seasons, a 41-16 win at UNLV. Although the team went through a three-game GWC skid midway through the year, SUU closed the season winning three of four games, including a win over UC Davis and victories at future Big Sky rivals Weber State and Northern Arizona, with the only setback a loss at then-No. 5 Northern Iowa.

SUU dominated the all-GWC teams in 2010 and 2011, with 14 selections each year. In 2010 SUU had 10 first-team selections, four on the second-team and three more earning honorable mention. SUU wide receiver Tysson Poots was the GWC's offensive player of the year in 2010 as well as a consensus first-team All-American.

In 2011 SUU swept the GWC's individual awards, as QB Brad Sorensen was named offensive player of the year, DE Tyler Osborne earned defensive player of the year honors, RB/KR Austin Minefee was the special teams player of the year

and WR/PR Brady Measom was the newcomer of the year. In addition to those honors, SUU had nine first-team and five second-team all-GWC selections, while Osborne and Minefee both earned all-America honors.

In 2012, the program's first season in the Big Sky, SUU notched wins over a pair of ranked teams, then-No. 1 Eastern Washington and then-No. 11 Northern Arizona, and picked up a road win at perennial BSC power Montana. Lamb's T-Birds placed 13 players on all-BSC teams, and linebacker Zak Browning was tabbed as the league's newcomer of the year.

Last year Lamb's Thunderbirds advanced to the FCS playoffs for the first time in the school's history after tying the SUU record for wins with eight. Highlights of the season included wins over FBS-level South Alabama and then-No. 8 Montana State, both on the road. SUU went 5-3 on the road in 2013, tying the SUU record for road wins.

SUU finished at 8-5 overall and 5-3 in Big Sky play in 2013, when the T-Birds ranked among the nation's leaders in a number of statistical categories, incuding second with just two lost fumbles all year, fourth in net punting, 12th in turnovers gained, 13th in turnover margin, 14th in red zone defense and 15th in fumbles recovered.

SUU also had an all-American, kicker Colton Cook, and a total of 16 players named all-Big Sky, including Cook and first-team linebacker Zak Browning, six more second- and third-team selections and eight who earned honorable mention.

Coach Lamb came to SUU from the University of San Diego, where he served as special teams coordinator, recruiting coordinator and defensive backs coach for three years.

A 1996 graduate of Brigham Young University, Lamb helped guide the University of San Diego to three consecutive Pioneer League championships as well as back-to-back NCAA Division I-AA Mid-Major National Championships in 2005 and 2006. In 2007 the USD special teams ranked first or second in the Pioneer League in every statistical category and the defense finished 2006 ranked fourth nationally after the Toreros completed an 11-1 season. While at USD Coach Lamb's responsibilities included serving as the team's budget manager and recruiting in addition to his on-field responsibilities.

Prior to joining the Toreros in 2005, Lamb spent two seasons as defensive coordinator at the University of Idaho where his 2003 team finished second in the Sun Belt Conference in scoring defense. As part of his duties as coordinator, his primary responsibility was with the Vandal secondary.

Coach Lamb spent the 2001 season on the BYU staff as a defensive assistant working with the linebackers. While with the Cougars he helped the squad to a 10-2 record and a Mountain West Conference title.

Lamb served as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at the University of Redlands from 1998 through 2000, where his teams went 21-6 overall and boasted the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference's top scoring defense every year he was with the program. He also served as the Bulldogs' recruiting coordinator.

Prior to becoming defensive coordinator at Redlands Lamb spent one season as a graduate assistant working with the defensive line.

As a student-athlete, Lamb played linebacker and defensive end from 1992-96 on Brigham Young University and BYU-ldaho teams which combined to win four conference championships.

Lamb and his wife, Sarah, are the parents of three daughters: Anna, Amelia and Summer, and son Claude Edward IV.

2013, A Landmark Year For SUU Football

T-Birds Make First Playoff Appearance, Finish Season In Top-25



Twenty-thirteen was a landmark year for Southern Utah football.

The Thunderbirds broke through several barriers in 2013. They opened the season with the program's second win over a Bowl Subdivision team in the past three years (and just the third ever) and wrapped it up with the program's first-ever NCAA playoff game.

Along the way the Thunderbirds tied the school's records for wins and road wins in a season. Included in that road-win total was a victory over the No. 8 team in the country, which effectively locked up the playoff bid. When everything was said and done the team finished the season ranked among the nation's top-25 programs in both major polls for the first time in school history.

The season began with 22-21 win at South Florida of the Bowl Subdivision Sunbelt Conference. The T-Birds jumped out to a 10-0 lead only to see the Jaguars battle back to take a 21-13 fourth quarter advantage. SUU rallied in the final minutes, however, as an Aaron Cantu-to-Anthony Norris touchdown pass pulled the 'Birds within 21-19, and senior kicker Colton Cook nailed a gamewinning 28-yard field goal as time expired.

A 49-0 win over Division II Ft. Lewis followed but the first bump in the season came the following week when SUU lost a 48-10 decision at Washington State of the Pac-12 Conference.

The T-Birds bounced back from that loss, however, by winning their next two games, both on the road. SUU went into overtime at Sacramento State but outlasted the Hornets, 24-21, after Cook hit another game-winner. The following week the Thunderbirds notched a 27-21 win at Northern Colorado in the team's Big Sky opener, giving SUU a 4-1 record and its best start since 1997.

Although the 'Birds were flying high after the back-to-back road wins, the darkest days of the season were on the horizon as they lost two of their next three games to dip to 5-3 overall and 2-2 in conference play.

The resilient Thunderbirds bounced back, however, with a 19-9 home win over Idaho State followed by a pair of road victories, a

27-21 victory at arch-rival Weber State and a 22-14 win at Montana State.

The high point of the season was arguably the win at Montana State. On a cold and snowy evening SUU dominated the eighthranked Bobcats, holding them to 38 yards of total offense through the first three quarters in taking a 15-0 lead, then holding on for the win.

The win at Montana State gave SUU its eighth win of the season and its fifth road victory, tying the school records for both wins and road wins in a season.

A match-up with 10th-ranked Northern Arizona followed and once again the Thunderbirds held a second half lead, 10-0, but the Lumberjacks got two field goals and a touchdown to take a 13-10 advantage, then returned a late interception for a touchdown to wrap up a 20-10 win.

With the loss to NAU many T-Bird faithful feared the team's playoff dreams had been dashed, but on the morning of Nov. 24 those dreams became reality as the NCAA announced that the Thunderbirds had indeed earned their first playoff berth.

SUU traveled to Sam Houston State – a team that had advanced to the NCAA Division I FCS championship game the past two seasons – for that playoff contest. Again the Thunderbirds built a 10-0 lead but the Bearkats turned it around and went on to end the 'Birds' championship hopes, handing them a 51-20 loss.

Following the season Cook was named an all-American, while he and sophomore defensive end James Cowser earned Academic All-American honors. Freshmen Robert Torgerson, a defensive lineman, and Chandler Dowell, a long-snapper, earned freshman all-American recognition. Coach Ed Lamb was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS coach of the year. And on Jan. 6 the final polls came out with the Thunderbirds ranked 21st in the Sports Network's media poll and 24th in the American Football Coaches poll.

All-in-all, a landmark season.
