LAST TIME OUT:

Southern Utah Drops 41-20 Decision at Sacramento State

SACRAMENTO, Calif. – After falling behind early, the Southern Utah University football team went on to score 20 points, but it was not enough as Sacramento State claimed a 41-20 victory Saturday night at Hornet Stadium.

The setback dropped SUU to 1-5 on the season and 0-3 in Big Sky Play. The Hornets improved to 3-2 for the year and stayed unbeaten in league competition while moving to 2-0.

“We didn’t come out ready to go,” said SUU head coach Demario Warren. “They had two weeks to prepare and had a good game plan. We had a couple three and outs early, but they ran the ball well and we couldn’t tackle them. Our guys battled and fought and tried to put themselves back in the game. I love their fight and I appreciate that they continue to work hard.”

The Thunderbirds quickly found themselves in a hole when Sacramento State jumped out to a 17-0 lead in the first quarter. SUU appeared to be turning the tide when Isaiah Williams punched in his second touchdown of the season from five yards out. The score was set up by a huge pass from Justin Miller to Frank Harris III. The T-Birds set up the 40-yard strike on a flea flicker play. Miller handed the ball to Karris Davis who then pitched it back to his quarterback for the pass.

Southern Utah was unable to cut into the lead any further in the opening half, and the Hornets added one more touchdown to take a 24-7 advantage with them to the locker room.

After Sacramento State scored the first points of the second half, SUU was able to find the end zone again when Miller connected with Ethan Bolingbroke from 13 yards out to give the T-Birds their second score of the game. Southern Utah went for a two-point conversion to make it a two-possession game, but the try was unsuccessful.

The Hornets added 10 more points for the night before backup quarterback Tyler Skidmore entered the game and led SUU on one final drive. Skidmore and his running backs chipped away down the field before the sophomore quarterback hit David Atencio on a 29-yard pass to place the Thunderbirds at the one-yard line. Jordan Jefferson then capped the drive on a run up the middle to wrap up the scoring for the night.

Miller finished the game with 197 yards passing while Skidmore added 75. Bolingbroke was the top target on the night with eight catches while Harris III led the team in receiving yards with 72. Williams led the ground attack with seven carries and 31 yards for a score.

Defensively, the T-Birds were paced by All-American Linebacker La’akea Kaho’ohanohano-Davis who recorded nine tackles. Aubrey Nellems, Jayden Clark and Francis Bemiy each chipped in five tackles with Nellems and Bemiy earning tackles for loss.

SCOUTING THE LUMBERJACKS

Northern Arizona owns a 2-3 record to date and is an even 1-1 in Big Sky play entering Saturday's Grand Canyon Rivalry. The Lumberjacks fell to No. 1 Sam Houston State and South Dakota to open the year before pulling a major upset against FBS foe Arizona for their first win of the season. NAU dropped its conference opener to Northern Colorado in overtime before defeating Idaho State. The Lumberjacks enter Saturday's matchup with SUU fresh off a bye week. NAU gets contributions at quarterback from both RJ Martinez and Jeff Widener. Martinez owns 666 passing yards and four touchdowns while Widener has thrown for 505 yards and three scores. Kevin Daniels is the top rusher for the Lumberjacks with 335 yards and a touchdown. The receiving efforts are balanced for NAU, but Coleman Owen leads the charge with 272 yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Morgan Vest leads the way with 42 tackles and two interceptions.

SERIES HISTORY

The Lumberjacks lead the all-time series with Southern Utah by a count of 15-10. SUU and NAU met twice during the Spring 2021 season with Northern Arizona claiming victory in both games by scores of 34-33 and 28-20. Southern Utah last defeated the Lumberjacks in 2019 by a score of 31-30 in the friendly confines of Eccles Coliseum.

TROPHY GAME

The winner of the Grand Canyon Rivalry takes home the HintonBurdick Trophy, which NAU currently holds possession of. Since the trophy's induction in 2012, the Thunderbirds own a 6-4 advantage in the series, including winning five of the first six competitions.

SEIZE THE OPPORTUNITY

With a few injuries in front of him, wide receiver Ethan Bolingbroke stepped up against Portland State and Sacramento State the last two weeks. The receiver has tallied 15 catches and 142 yards for two touchdowns over the past two games with an increased snap count.

TONS OF TURNOVERS

After forcing only two turnovers last season, the Southern Utah defense has forced turnovers in all but one game so far this season. The Thunderbirds have come up with three interceptions and four fumble recoveries through five games. Cornerback Kobe Singleton leads SUU's defense with two interceptions, and four different T-Birds have recorded fumble recoveries on the year.

ALL-AMERICANS

Southern Utah is led by a pair of returning All-Americans in Braxton Jones on the offensive line, and La'akea Kaho'ohanohano-Davis at linebacker. Both were named All-Americans for the 2021 spring season, and both have been selected to multiple preseason All-American teams and award watch lists. Quarterback Justin Miller was also named an FCS Sophomore All-American during the spring 2021 season.

PROVE THEM WRONG

Southern Utah will work hard to prove the doubters wrong this season as both the coaches and media picked the Thunderbirds to finish 11th in the Big Sky Standings. Both the media and coaches tabbed Weber State as the preseason favorite to win the league. Spots one through 11 in both polls were identical with Montana, Eastern Washington, Montana State and Sacramento State rounding out the top five. UC Davis Northern Arizona and Idaho took spots six, seven and eight, while Idaho State and Portland State were picked to finish right before the Thunderbirds. The coaches selected Cal Poly to finish 12th and Northern Colorado 13th, while the media had those two schools in the opposite order. Southern Utah is fresh off a seventh-place finish from the previous season that was shortened and played in the spring due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Every loss the Thunderbirds suffered last year was by one possession.

ONE LAST RIDE

The 2021 season marks Southern Utah's last year as a member of the Big Sky Conference. Beginning in 2022, Southern Utah will join the Western Athletic Conference in all sports aside from gymnastics. In addition to SUU, the WAC's football schools will consist of Dixie State, Tarleton State, Abilene Christian, Lamar, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin.

We have to be locked in at all times to beat the number six team in the country, and we didn’t do that tonight.”

A big emphasis for us is finishing. Finishing plays, finishing drives and finishing games. With the confidence these guys have built from year one to year two, and all the teaching points they have been getting through camp, it now comes down to being able to do it in a high-pressure situation. I think with our foundation, we’re on the right path to being able to finish because they’re learning how to execute their assignments. I have definitely seen that out here at camp. Our guys are finishing because they are reacting instead of thinking, which allows them to play faster.”

2021 THUNDERBIRD COACHES



Head Coach Demario Warren Sixth Season as Head Coach 21-37 Overall, 16-25 Big Sky 13th Season at SUU

At the start of the 2021 season, Thunderbird head football coach Demario Warren will be in his sixth year at the helm of the program.

Although his team only managed one victory during the pandemic-interrupted 2020-21 campaign, all five of the T-Birds' losses came by a combined 15 points. Each contest SUU dropped ended as a one-possession game. Despite the disappointing, close setbacks, Warren mentored nine all-conference performers and two All-Americans in La'akea Kaho'ohanohano-Davis and Braxton Jones. Quarterback Justin Miller was also named a Hero Sports FCS Sophomore All-American.

The 2019 season concluded with three victories for the Thunderbirds, as SUU finished the year with a winning record at home at 3-2. The T-Birds knocked off Stephen F. Austin in overtime, blew out Idaho State 59-34 and secured the Grand Canyon Rivalry Trophy with a narrow victory over Northern Arizona. The 2018 campaign, and his third year as head coach, proved to be a challenge for Warren and his staff as the Thunderbirds recorded just one victory over the course of the season.

Despite their record the T-Birds were fifth in the Big Sky in Total Offense with an average of 435.2 yards per game, third in the league in First Downs with an average of 24.1 per game, fifth in third-down conversion at 40% and second in fourth-down conversion at 64%.

Following the season the Thunderbirds continued to build their brand. Zach Larsen was named to both the Walter Camp and Phil Steele FCS All-American Team. Southern Utah also continued to build their footprint in the National Football League, as Marquez Tucker and Logan Parker were signed as free agents by the Chicago Bears and the Kansas City Chiefs respectively.

In just his second season as head coach of the Thunderbird football team, Warren led the T-Birds to their second Big Sky Conference Championship in 2017 and to their third FCS Playoff appearance in school history.

Finishing the season 9-3, which marked the most Division I victories in a single season for the program, Warren led the Thunderbirds to their first ever trip to the Second Round of the FCS Playoffs when the team received a BYE in the opening round. The Thunderbirds also reached their highest ranking in both major FCS Polls, ending the season No. 13 in the FCS Coaches Poll and No. 14 in the STATS FCS Top 25.

Following the season, Warren was named AFCA Region 5 Coach of the Year and Co-Coach of the Year in the Big Sky Conference. This was his first time earning each of these accolades.

Under Warren's leadership, the T-Birds had 22 players named to the various Big Sky All-Conference Teams. Larsen was named to a number of All-American teams.
