in 1901 as the Southwestern Normal School, authorized to offer two years of training for public school teachers. The first classes met in 1903. Initially, four years of preparatory work for pre-college students were offered.

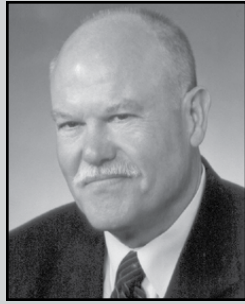
In 1920, the preparatory courses were eliminated and two additional years of college work in teacher training were added. The State Legislature approved a change of name to Southwestern State Teachers College. The first baccalaureate degrees were awarded in May 1921. Other changes in name and purposes occurred in 1939 when the institution was designated as Southwestern State College of Diversified Occupations and in 1941, when it became Southwestern Institute of Technology. During this two-year period, the college added a school of pharmacy, degree work in the arts and sciences, and trade schools.

In 1949, the Oklahoma State Legislature

changed the name of the institution to Southwestern State College, and in 1974, to Southwestern Oklahoma State University, without altering its purposes and objectives. On July 1, 1987, Sayre Junior College was merged with Southwestern Oklahoma State University as a branch campus designated Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre.

Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre was founded as Sayre Junior College in 1938 under legislative authorization which permitted public high schools to add a 13th and 14th year of study to their curricula. A total of 19 public schools took this step. In 1949, the college name was changed to Oklahoma Western Junior College; however, the original name was soon adopted again, and in May 1940 the first degrees were conferred. DR. JOHN HAYS **University President**

Dr. John Hays is in his seventh year as president of Southwestern Oklahoma State University. He is SWOSU's 16th president.

Hays is a 1969 graduate of SWOSU and served as Executive Vice President for Administration at SWOSU for 11 years before being named president in May of 2001.

He started his working career at SWOSU in 1972 as the university's assistant business manager. He served as comptroller starting in 1984. In 1986, he became assistant to the president and was vice president for administration from 1989-90.

Hays, a native of southwest Oklahoma, earned a Master of Education degree in business from SWOSU and completed his Doctor of Education in higher education administration from the University of Oklahoma.

He has been active in community and economic development activities in western Oklahoma. Hays has been on the ground floor of many projects such as the Center for Economic and Business Development at SWOSU and other economic development activities in the area.

The 1994 Leadership Oklahoma graduate has been very involved in civic activities, including Leadership Weatherford, YMCA, Vision 20/20, Weatherford Arts Council, Weatherford's assisted senior citizen living center and many other projects through the Weatherford Chamber of Commerce, an organization he served as president in 1993. He serves as President for the Oklahoma Community Institute.

Hays earned the 2002 Distinguished Service award from the Southern Association of College and University Business Officers for making major contributions to higher education administration. He won the Outstanding Service Award from the Weatherford Area Chamber of Commerce in 1996, and Hays was inducted into the Chamber's Hall of Fame in 2004.

Hays is well known for his work in professional organizations, such as the Oklahoma Association of College and University Business Officers, Oklahoma Association of College of Affirmative Action Officers, and the American Institute of CPAs.

moved from facilities occupied jointly with Sayre High School to its present location on old Highway 66. The merger with Southwestern Oklahoma State University marked the end of the Oklahoma community college system, since Sayre Junior College was the only such institution remaining of the original nineteen.

The Sayre campus is located 60 miles west of the Weatherford campus on Interstate 40. It serves western Oklahoma and the Texas panhandle within a 60 mile radius of Sayre. It offers open admission to high school graduates as well as to students who

do not hold a high school diploma.

Southwestern Oklahoma State University offers five advanced degrees. The Master of Education degree was inaugurated in 1969. (The Master of Teaching Degree was offered during the period 1953-1969.) Graduate programs leading to the following degrees have been added since 1969: Master of Business Administration, 1977; Master of Music, 1981; a professional doctorate, the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD), 1998; and a Master of Science in the School Psychology 2005.

SWOSU offers a scenic campus, a career-based learning environment and the opportunity to meet new friends from all parts of the country and the world.

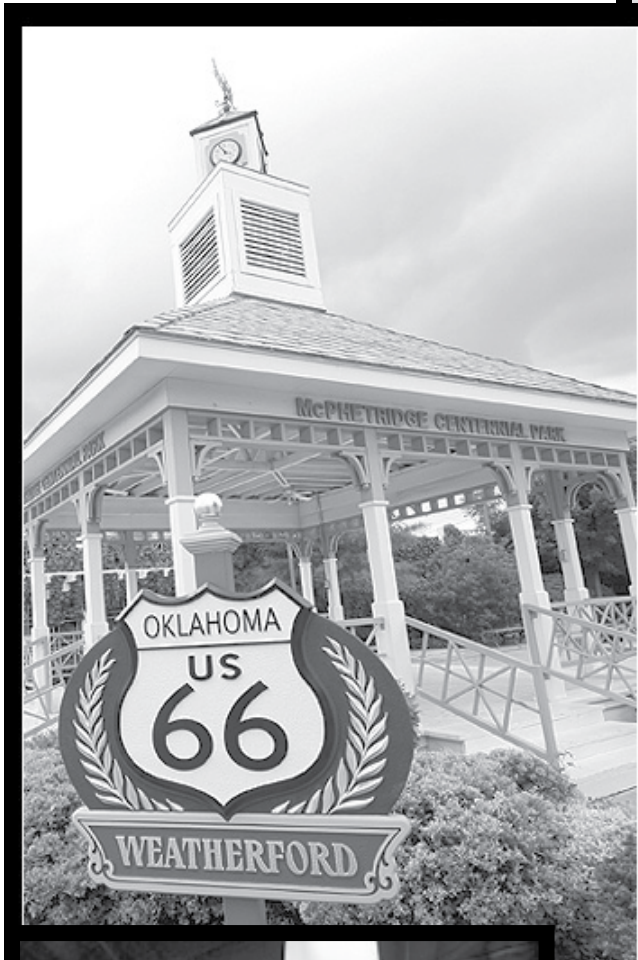

Kelli Litsch won championships, set records and brought wide-spread acclaim to Southwestern Oklahoma State University as a basketball player during the 1980's. Now after a number of years as a coach and later as an athletic administrator, she serves as the school's interim athletic director after Cecil Perkins stepped down this summer.

She continues as a diligent champion for all student athletes, male and female, and has served in numerous roles at SWOSU. Some of those include acting as the Title IX Officer, Senior Women's Administrator and Adviser to the Student Athlete Advisory Council. She has been inducted into four Hall of Fames: SWOSU Athletic Hall of Fame 1990, NAIA Hall of Fame 1991, Oklahoma Sports Hall of Fame 2004, Women's National Basketball Hall of Fame 2005.

Head Coach

RYAN HELD

In a very short time as football coach at Southwestern Oklahoma State University, Ryan Held has breathed new life into a program that had fallen on rough times. He has infused a fiery, aggressive style of play while directing a program that conducts itself the right way off the field. And now, as Held embarks on his fourth season with the Bulldogs, SWOSU is poised for a breakthrough in 2008.

The progress that Held has made here is both noticeable and remarkable. Since a 1-10 start in 2005, the Bulldogs have posted back-to-back 6-5 campaigns wic included winning a share of the Lone Star Conference's North Division title in 2007.

Held has built a reputation as a determined coach and a teacher as the Bulldog's star continues to climb. With the help of strong recruiting classes put together by Held and his assistants, SWOSU has become an annual contender for the Lone Star Conference North Division title year in and year out. As his fourth year at SWOSU begins, anything less would be considered a disappointment.

Last year, his young team took some lumps with a difficult early-portion of the schedule. But the Bulldogs held together and became one of the top LSC teams down the stretch, grabbing a share of the North crown by winning its last two games including a 21-14 season-ending victory against Texas A&M-Commerce.

To those who know Held, this growth and potential of the Bulldog program is not a surprise.

Prior to coming to SWOSU, Held spent three years at Panhandle State University, where he conducted a remarkable resurgence, finishing it with winning seasons in his final two years. At OPSU, Held inherited a program that had only 17 players and was in the midst of a 28-game losing streak. The Aggies had not been winners since the 1992 season. Held quickly went about restoring pride and support in the program and turned the Aggies around, going 6-5 in back-to-back years. OPSU had 131 players report to begin fall drills in Held's final year.

Held's career head coaching record is 32-44 (.421) which includes a 14-19 record at OPSU and a 5-5 year as a 25-year old head coach at Peru State in 2001.

Held played at the University of Nebraska under former coach Tom Osborne from 1993-96. After graduating in 1996, Held remained with the Huskers serving as an administrative assistant.

Held either played for or was part of three NCAA National Championship squads (1994, 1995, 1997).

He then joined the University of Tennessee staff under coach Phil Fulmer as a graduate assistant in 1998. He worked two years with the Volunteers and was a part of the 1998 BCS National Champion team, his fourth such as a player or coach.



ASSISTANT COACHES



Offensive Coordinator

RUSSELL GASKAMP

Russell Gaskamp carries a degree of instant credibility as a coach after playing in the collegiate game at its highest level. He earned all-Big XII honors at the University of Texas where he was the starting center for an offensive line that paved the way for NCAA record breaker and 1998 Hesiman Trophy winner Ricky Williams.

Gaskamp, a native of Weatherford, was part of back-to-back state title teams in 1991 and 1992. He became the first graduate from an Oklahoma high school to sign with UT in 17 years.

Previously, he coached five years and was most recently with Texas A&M-Commerce as the offensive line coach. He also coached at Sam Houston State, Johnston High School and the Austin Rattlers, a semi-professional team.

Gaskamp earned a bachelor's degree in management from Texas and later obtained his master's degree from SHSU.

He is married to the former Justine Forshage of New Braunfels, Texas.



Defensive Coordinator

TODD HELTON

Todd Helton has been the constant link between the Bulldogs past and present, spending his last 19 seasons on the SWOSU football coaching staff. He brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience and has put together some of the league's top-rated defensive units for nearly 20 years.

SWOSU finished among the top five in the LSC last year in pass defense, rush defense, total defense and turnover margin.

He has guided some of the school's top defensive lineman, including NAIA All-Americans John Wichert and Robert Newberg and current all-star Joe Castle.

A native of Perryton, Texas, Helton was an NAIA All-American for the Bulldogs in the late 1980's. His 197 career tackles and 15 sacks rank him among the school's all time leaders for defensive lineman.

Helton earned his bachelor's and his master's degree from SWOSU in 1993.

He and his wife Stephanie, have two young daughters, Kennedie and Ireland.

JUDD REMMERS

Judd Remmers has been with Ryan Held every step since the two began their coaching careers together at tiny Peru State more than six years ago. Remmers loyalty and hard work has paid off when he was elevated to one of the three full-time assistant football coach positions at SWOSU in 2006.

Remmers, 31, will have the coaching responsibilities of linebackers and remain as the team's primary recruiting coordinator.

Prior to coming to SWOSU, Remmers spent three years as an assistant under Held at Oklahoma Panhandle State University where he helped lead the Aggies to back-to-back winning seasons for the first time in a decade. He coached six all-conference defensive players in the Independent Football Alliance during that time.

A native of Auburn, Neb., Remmers earned his bachelor's degree from Peru in 2001. He earned his master's degree from SWOSU in 2006.



2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

BULLDOGS EYE BIGGER PRIZE IN 2008

After posting winning seasons in back-to-back years and earning a share of the Lone Star Conference North Division title, there is little doubt Southwestern Oklahoma State University has emerged as a team to be reckoned with heading into the 2008 season.

Fourth-year head coach **Ryan Held** makes no promises or guarantees insisting that this year's Bulldogs will have to fight for their spot at head of the LSC table.

The Bulldogs appear capable of rising to the challenge and return a strong nucleus of players that finished the year with a 6-5 record. The group of returnees features 10 starters from last season, as well as the two top yardage producers and the two leading tacklers on defense.

"We may not have a lot of starters back, but the ones we do were very important in our success," Held said. "It will be critical for them to provide the necessary leadership on the field if we are to achieve even higher goals in 2008."

QUARTERBACK

Headlining the Bulldogs on offense will be the return of junior quarterback **Steve Day**.

Day took over starting duties midway through last season and emerged as one of the team's strong points. He ended the year completing 53 percent of his passes for 1,410 yards. He through 13 touchdowns against only 10 interceptions. In his last four starts, he averaged over 218 yards per game and through eight touchdowns.

RUNNING BACKS

The running game began to hit its stride late in the year and will look to continue that momentum in 2008 with a whole new cast of ball carriers.

Redshirt freshman **Luke Lundy** looks to be the early favorite for the starting job while junior college transfer **Ovie Esalomi** will be used in a number of packages.

Lundy led all Nebraska high schoolers by rushing for over 2,400 yards as a senior in 2006. He is not bashful about seeking out contact and can find open lanes to run.

Esalomi will provide a change of pace to Lundy's bruising style with his electric speed. He is the team's fastest player and averaged 8.8 yards on 84 carries at his junior college.

RECEIVERS

All-Conference selection **Johnathan Haggerty** returns for his junior year and will

again be a primary target. He has caught 91 balls for nearly 1,600 yards and 13 touchdowns in his career and is widely considered one of the top pass-catching threats in the league.

The tight end position should play a more prominent role in the offense with the addition of **Joe Sawyer**, a transfer from Snow Junior College. Sawyer's combination of aestheticism, size and strength will give the Bulldogs an extra dimension at the position that they have lacked for a number of years.

Potential impact should also come from senior **Kyle Wimberly** and newcomers **Brandon Dixon** and **Eric Sykes**. All three have shown that they can consistently make plays and will be given ample opportunity to be showcased throughout the year.

OFFENSIVE LINE

SWOSU's offensive line has played at a high

level for the last two seasons and although the graduation of three starters is significant, the return of starters **Jacob Olivarez** and **Jerrod Hunt** and the emergence of freshman **Jordan Pettitt** have the Bulldogs believing that the elevated level of play continues. Two positions guard and center — remain open and could be capably filled by either returnees **Jacob Ciesynski**, **Ben Waldron** and **Jazz Kennerson** or some junior college transfers that hoped to be added during the summer

DEFENSIVE LINE

SWOSU's defensive line should boast a combination of quick, hard-hitting ends and strong physical interior lineman that will keep opposing offenses and their quarterbacks on their heels.

Leading the way is senior **Greg Franklin** who will make the switch to end after three solid years at middle linebacker.

Franklin has recorded more than 230 tackles in his career and has produced a number of big plays including two defensive touchdowns and an amazing seven blocked kicks.

Opposite Franklin at the other end will be **James Vei** who has had marked improvement and should be ready to shine in this his final year.

The interior line positions will use **Cory**

SEASON OUTLOOK

Summers and **Justin Cannon** along with returnee **Isacc Mason**.

Summers missed last season with shoulder surgery but was an all-conference pick in 2006. Cannon has shown great potential in limited play last year. Mason is the biggest player on the team at 6-3, 340 pounds and is generally considered the team's best run stopper.

LINEBACKERS

SWOSU will look to senior all-conference selection **Ruzell McCoy** to carry a group of linebackers who are talented yet untested at the Division II level. McCoy tied for the team lead with 85 tackles in 2007 and has worked hard at making himself one of the conference's elite defenders.

The other two linebacker spots will be up for grabs as a number of lettermen and junior college transfers will be given the opportunity to win the spot.

DEFENSIVE BACK

SWOSU lost three-fourths of its secondary from 2007 but believes the people now in place will quickly establish themselves as one of the strengths of the team. **Demarcus Render** is the lone hold over from 2007 and will continue to get better and improve on his junior campaign.

Although the secondary will be new, the bulk of the group has played together as a unit. Three starters **Jeff Lemon, Sam Nwafor, Carlos Bates** — from the College of Dupage agreed to continue their playing days with the Bulldogs. All will be counted on to provide some big plays for a secondary that should improve on its nine interceptions from a year ago.

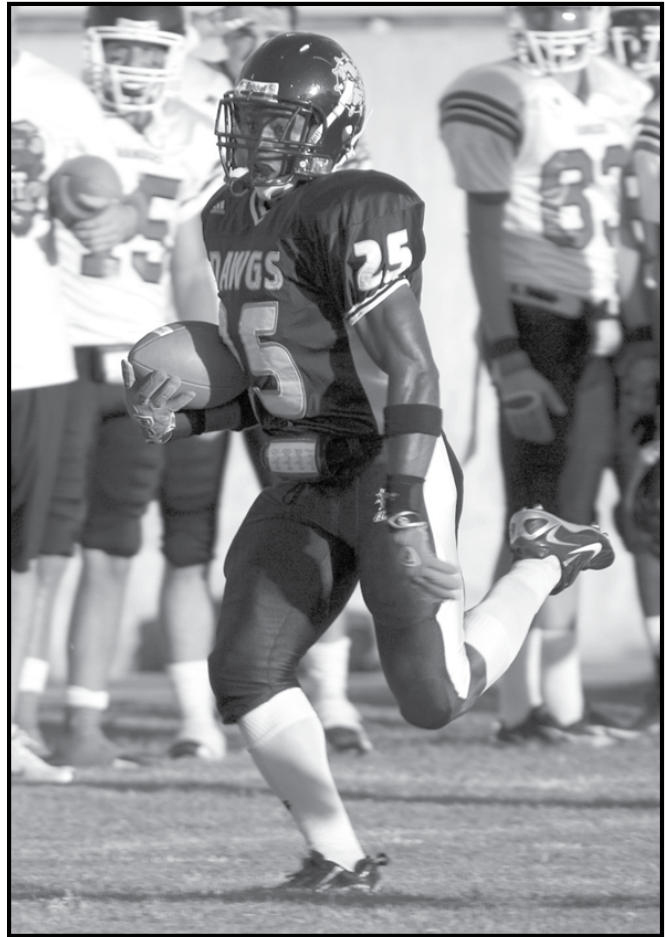
SPECIAL TEAMS

SWOSU returns two specialists, including one who has already cemented his stature as one of the best in conference and region.

Patrick Weaver, an all-conference pick each of the last two years, returns for his final season. Weaver has brought back two kickoffs and one punt for touchdowns in his career. He consistently ranks among the league leaders in both categories and will look to do the same again in 2008.

Kicker **Spenser Daniel** has made better than 60% of his field goal attempts over the last two years. He once kicked 25 consecutive extra points and has only missed five in 53 attempts, a rate of better than 91%.

Senior offensive lineman **Josh Ishmael** is also back at the important position after successfully handling all of the snapping chores on punts, field goals and extra point attempts.

STORYLINES

Will the team be more explosive on offense? SWOSU had only one touchdown longer than 50 yards in 2007.

How will quarterback Steve Day hold up through the season? No QB on the roster has attempted a collegiate pass other than Day.

What kind of improvement is expected from the secondary? SWOSU made a complete overhaul in an attempt to ramp up a unit that intercepted only six passes in the defensive backfield.

SCHEDULE

The 2008 schedule features five home games and the pairing of three new conference crossover opponents.

We're very excited about our schedule, Held said. It's good to be able to have some different crossover games with the addition of a power house like (three-time LSC champ) West Texas A&M and two historic programs like Eastern New Mexico and Angelo State back on the schedule.

SWOSU kicks off the season on the road Thursday, Aug. 28 against storied rival Northwestern Oklahoma State University in Alva. The game will be the 78th meeting between the two teams, but only the second since 1996 since when the series resumed last year.

The Bulldogs first home game of the year will Saturday, Sept. 13 against Angelo State. The game will be part of Parents Day activities and will kickoff at 6 p.m. at Milam Stadium.

The Homecoming opponent will be Oklahoma Panhandle State University. The Aggies will play Saturday, Nov. 1 in Weatherford with kickoff set for 6 p.m.

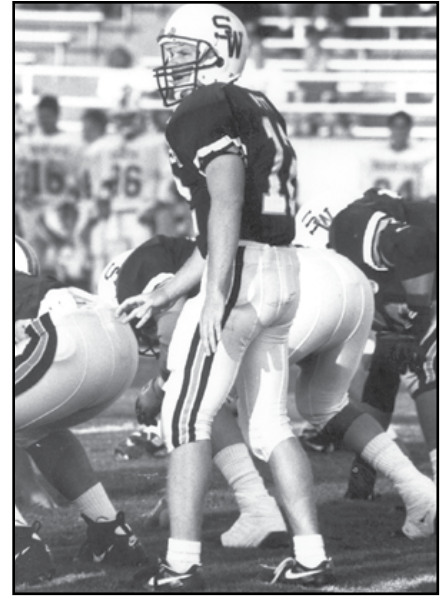

COACHING RECORDS

Coaching Legacy Filled With Heroes

In the program's 103-year history, Southwestern has had 20 different men lead the Bulldogs into the field of football competition. In that time the Bulldogs have accounted for 17 conference titles, participated in three bowl games, made three playoff appearances and won one national championship.

SWOSU's first-ever football coach was Lemley Whitcomb, who also handled duties as a professor in the school's physical education department. Whitcomb and his teams played sparingly but not before collecting the school's first-ever win against Kingfisher College in 1905.

It was more than 20 years later when SWOSU began to make its name on the gridiron under new coach Joe Milam.

Led by star Jenks Simmons, the Bulldogs beat Central State for the first time in 13 years and completed an undefeated 5-0 conference season in 1926.

Milam, who also coached wrestling at the school, stayed with football until 1932 posting a 22-25-7 overall record.

Rankin Williams stepped in following Milam, and like his predecessor, had his best success early. His first two teams won seven games each year and were conference champs in 1932 and 1933. Williams spent seven years as football coach and was 31-30-7 during that time. He would continue to coach baseball, basketball and track at SWOSU and did so until his retirement in 1964, a span of 42 years.

SWOSU would again enjoy considerable success with the arrival of Joe Metcalf who had previously coached at Hollis High School. Metcalf's teams won or shared conference titles in 1954, 1955 and 1957. Metcalf returned back to Hollis as the school's superintendent but not before going 32-21-2 in five seasons.

The arrival of Otis Delaporte in 1964 sent signaled what would be a long and prosperous run for the Bulldogs. Delaporte had the Bulldogs back in the conference title picture soon, winning it all in 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971 and 1974.

The 1969 team went 9-1, losing by a 7-6 score to Central State. SWOSU's average margin of victory

was 32 points that year as they beat their final three foes by scores of 52-7, 56-0 and 66-0.

As good as 1969 was, a better team may have come in 1977 when the Bulldogs completed a perfect 10-win regular season. SWOSU would later beat Nebraska Kearney in the playoffs only to lose to Abilene Christian in the Apple Bowl (NAIA Championship Game) in a game played in the Seattle Kingdome.

Delaporte stepped aside in 1977 after 13

years, posting a record of 89-53-2. At the time the win total was more than double of any previous coach.

Delaporte's mark stood for 25 years before Paul Sharp overtook him. Sharp passed Delaporte in 2003 and after 19 years as coach had totaled 93 wins before resigning in 2004. Sharp's teams won or shared three conference titles and his 1996 squad won the NAIA Championship.

Milam Stadium

Milam Stadium, one of the largest football stadiums in the Lone Star Conference, has been the home of Southwestern Oklahoma State University football for more than 70 years

The facility, which seats 8,600 spectators is located on the west end of campus at 7th Street and Davis.

Thousands of outstanding student-athletes and hundreds of games have played at the historic stadium, including the 1996 NAIA National Championship game. SWOSU went on to win its first-ever national football championship beating Montana Tech, 33-31.

Despite its long and storied history, the stadium has continued to improve since the original construction in 1936. A new pressbox was added in 1985, followed by the completion of new lights and an eastside seating project in 1988.

Parking improvements, new rest rooms and concession stands dominated renovations during 1991.

In 1992, new bleachers were placed on the west side of the stadium creating the current seating capacity of 8,600. The also added a new sound system that same year.

In 1996, the Coca-Cola company sponsored the Bulldogs current scoreboard located behind the south endzone.

Fitness Center

SWOSU's strength and conditioning program is extremely important to Bulldog student-athletes. It prepares them for competition, not only physically, but also mentally.

Motivating, educating and helping to reach maximum athletic development is the primary focus of the SWOSU program.

SWOSU provides each student-athlete with top-quality strength training regimens as well as flexibility, plyometric and conditioning. Because every program is geared to the student-athlete's respective sport, no two are exactly the same.

Directed by strength coach Josh Musick, SWOSU program has a progressive style that incorporates up-to-date training techniques into each individual programs.

Housed in the SWOSU fitness center, the complex features nearly five tons of equipment spread over 30 workout stations within the 2,000 square foot air-conditioned facility.

The training regimen at SWOSU is a year-round process with closely monitored workouts that involve a great deal of individual instruction and attention. Student-athletes are taught the correct techniques to increase their ability to perform at their peak during eventual competition on the playing field or court.

Locker Room

SWOSU football program is fortunate to have the use of a first-class, state-of-the-art locker room for their game and practice-related needs.

Built in 1998 at a cost of approximately \$90,000 the facility was converted from existing classroom space in Rankin Williams Fieldhouse to that of a spacious air-conditioned meeting facility complete with 85 individual metal navy blue lockers.

The area stretches over 3,100 square feet and includes plentiful showers and restroom facilities along with multiple meeting rooms for specialized groups.
