Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Weatherford is located 70 miles west of Oklahoma City. The university is authorized to offer curricular in arts and sciences, business, teacher education and health sciences. A branch campus at Sayre is authorized to provide Associate of Science and Associate of Applied Science degrees in both general and specialized areas of study, as well as career and technical education.

The University was established by an act of the Oklahoma Territorial Legislature in 1901 as the Southwestern Normal School, authorized to offer two years of training for public school teachers. The first classes met in 1903. Initially, four years of preparatory work for pre-college students were offered.

In 1920, the preparatory courses were eliminated and two additional years of college work in teacher training were added. The State Legislature approved a change of name to Southwestern State Teachers College. The first baccalaureate degrees were awarded in May 1921. Other changes in name and purposes occurred in 1939 when the institution was designated as Southwestern State College of Diversified Occupations and in 1941, when it became Southwestern Institute of Technology. During this two-year period, the college

added a school of pharmacy, degree work in the arts and sciences, and trade schools.

In 1949, the Oklahoma State Legislature changed the name of the institution to Southwestern State College, and in 1974, to Southwestern Oklahoma State University, without altering its purposes and objectives. On July 1, 1987, Sayre Junior College was merged with Southwestern Oklahoma State University as a branch campus designated Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre.

Southwestern Oklahoma State University at Sayre was founded as Sayre Junior College in 1938 under legislative authorization which permitted public high schools to add a 13th and 14th year of study to their curricula. A total of 19 public schools took this step. In 1949, the college name was changed to Oklahoma Western Junior College; however, the original name was soon adopted again, and in May 1940 the first degrees were conferred. In 1956, Sayre Junior College moved from facilities occupied jointly with Sayre High School to its present location on old Highway 66. The merger with Southwestern Oklahoma State University marked the end of the Oklahoma community college system, since Sayre Junior College was the only such institution remaining of



the original nineteen.

The Sayre campus is located 60 miles west of the Weatherford campus on Interstate 40. It serves western Oklahoma and the Texas panhandle within a 60 mile radius of Sayre. It offers open admission to high school graduates as well as to students who do not hold a high

school diploma.

Southwestern Oklahoma State University offers five advanced degrees. The Master of Education degree was inaugurated in 1969. (The Master of Teaching Degree was offered during the period 1953-1969.) Graduate programs leading to the following degrees have been

added since 1969: Master of Business Administration, 1977; Master of Music, 1981; a professional doctorate, the Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD), 1998; and a Master of Science in the School Psychology 2005.

## UNIVERSITY PRESIDENT -- RANDY BEUTLER

Southwestern Oklahoma State University graduate Randy Beutler of Elk City was named president of Southwestern Oklahoma State University on Feb. 1, 2010. Beutler, who previously served as vice president for public policy and leadership development, becomes the school's 17th president

Beutler, who heads up the successful President's Leadership Class program at SWOSU, was born and raised on a ranch north of Elk City. He graduated from Canute High School in 1979. Beutler earned a Bachelor of Arts in Education degree from SWOSU in 1983, graduating Cum Laude with a social science major/minor. He completed his Master of Education degree at SWOSU in 2003.

Beutler taught social science at Washita Heights Public Schools and Weatherford High School after graduating from SWOSU. He was named Weatherford Public Schools "Teacher of the Year" in both 1987 and 1990.



served until 2000. Beutler represented the counties of Roger Mills, Beckham, Greer and Harmon. He eventually became the Majority Whip of the House and was on the leadership team of both Speakers Glen Johnson and Loyd Benson.

In 2003, Beutler was appointed by Governor Brad Henry as his legislative liaison to the Oklahoma House of Representatives. In this capacity, he worked closely with all members of the Legislature. He was promot-

In 1992, Beutler decided to run for the District 60 seat in the Oklahoma House of Representatives. He was reelected three times without opposition and

ed to director of legislative relations, which elevated him to a senior staff member of Governor Henry's administration. In addition to his duties with Governor Henry, Beutler served as an adjunct professor of history at SWOSU.

When SWOSU President John Hays hired Beutler to work at the university in 2006, he assisted with external affairs, legislative matters, grant development and development of external funds.

Beutler serves on the Quartz Mountain Arts & Conference Center Board of Directors and Oklahoma Higher Education Chancellor Glen Johnson's Legislative Advisory Network. He is a member of the Weatherford Kiwanis Club and has been active in the Elk City Kiwanis Club. He has served on the Oklahoma Academy of State Goals Board of Directors and the Elk City Old Town Museum Board of Directors.

## ATHLETICS DIRECTOR -- TODD THURMAN

SWOSU called upon its own men's basketball coach to take an even larger responsibility as the school's new director of athletics in 2008.

Todd Thurman gained wide-spread popularity in the community with his exciting style of basketball where the Bulldogs quickly grew into a crowd favorite. Thurman's SWOSU teams qualified for the LSC Postseason Tournament all three years and made the school's first-



ever appearance in the league championship game. He resigned as coach in March of 2009 to concentrate on his duties as athletic director on a full-time basis.

Before coming to SWOSU, Thurman went 188-110 (.631) in seven seasons at Wayland Baptist University.

Prior to Wayland, he worked as an assistant coach for nine seasons at his alma mater, Southern Nazarene, and as an assistant at the University of Central Oklahoma and Oklahoma Christian University.

Thurman had an illustrious basketball career, playing several years professionally in England, Argentina and the Philippines. An all-stater at Yukon High School, Thurman led

the Millers to the 1979 state title and went on to earn all-American honors at nearby Bethany Nazarene.

He led BNC (now Southern Nazarene) to the NAIA title by scoring 39 points in the 1981 finals Alabama-Huntsville. He is set to be inducted into the school's athletic hall of fame in 2011.

Thurman holds dual degrees in business administration and education from SNU. He also earned a master's degree from Central Oklahoma.

Thurman's wife, Lynne, is SWOSU's Assistant to the President for Institutional Advancement. The couple have two teenage sons, Nick and Alex.

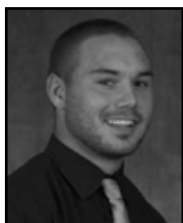

## DAN COCANNOUER

### HEAD COACH

Dan Cocannouer eagerly returns for his third season as the head coach of the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Bulldogs football team. In that short time, Cocannouer has fashioned a new blue print for success with the primary emphasis focusing on hard work, team discipline and high enthusiasm.

Now after two full seasons, the evidence is starting to take shape in the classroom, in the community and on the scoreboard.

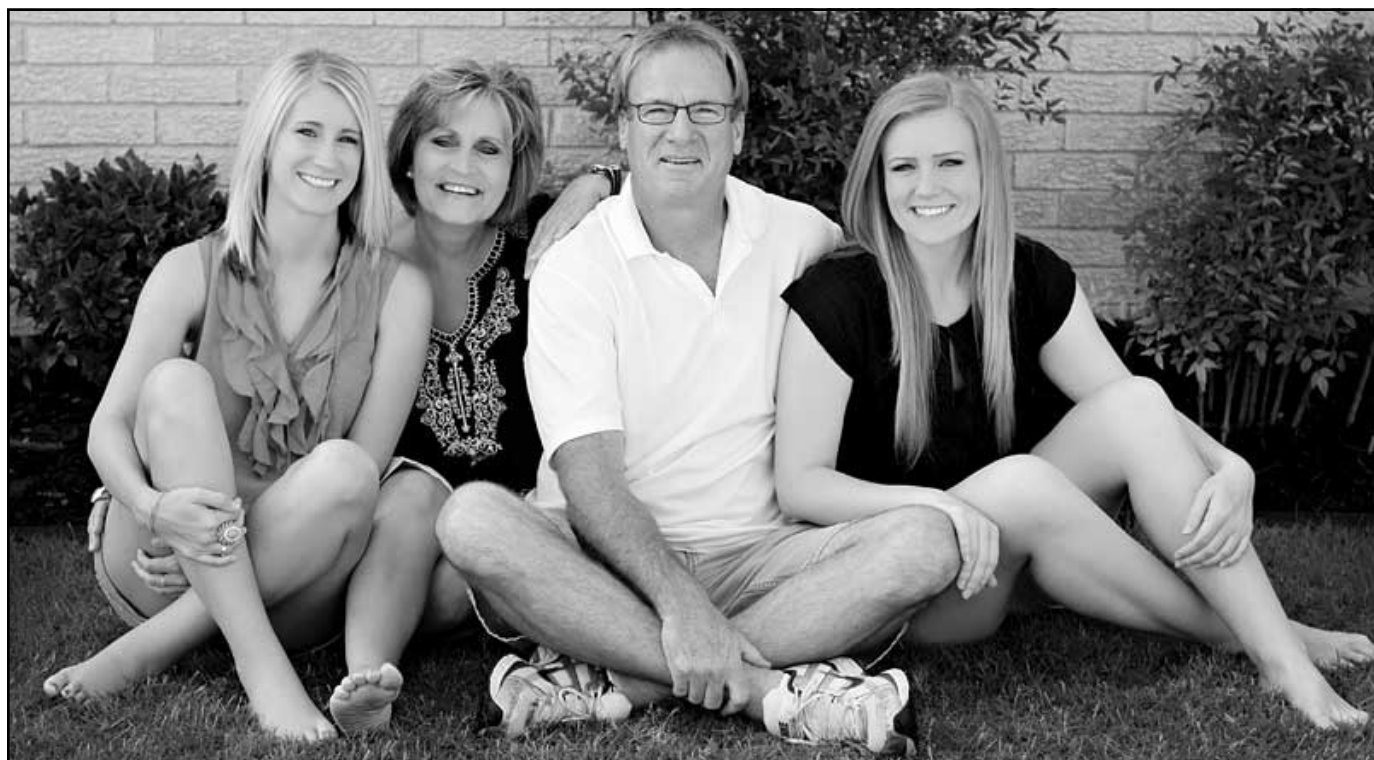
In the most recently completed semester, the Bulldogs had 25 players named to the school's scholar-athlete list for maintaining a grade point average of 3.0 or better for the term.

Footballers under Cocannouer have played a part in volunteering their efforts at a wide-range of service projects. They have included reading to school children to assisting victims whose homes were destroyed in the tornado outbreaks.



The rekindled spirit has shown itself on the football field as well. The Bulldogs finished Cocannouer's second year with a 3-8 record, but improved weekly after

an 0-4 start. SWOSU was winners against Eastern New Mexico, Texas A&M-Commerce and long-time arch rival Central Oklahoma.

SWOSU enters this season carrying with them the considerable momentum that was generated by last year's inspired play. The staff didn't stop there, leading into a productive spring practice and later signing several top-ranked recruits have many signs pointing to an even brighter 2011.

Already known for rebuilding several high school programs across the state, Cocannouer has long been considered one of the most prominent and well-respected coaching leaders in the Oklahoma.

He came to SWOSU in 2010 after eight years at Edmond Santa Fe High School, a suburban school that competes in Oklahoma's largest class, 6A.

Cocannouer compiled a 70-26 record (.729 winning percentage) at the Edmond school where he led the Wolves to the Class 6A finals in 2003 and semifinal appearances in 2001 and 2004.

All total, Cocannouer has coached 33 years on the football field, including the last 27 as a head coach.

One of the things that set him apart and makes him so well received is that he

is always been eager to share and learn knowledge from his coaching counterparts. He has held positions of leadership at a number of advisory boards and organizations. Most recently, he has served as president of the Oklahoma Football Coaches Association and president of the Oklahoma Coaches Association.

This structure helps him to continue to maintain strong relationships with the high school coaches in the state. In fact, Cocannouer requires his entire staff to attend the state's annual high school football coaches association meetings.

"I want people to see us not just on the recruiting trail," Cocannouer said. "It's important for us to learn all we can and use every possible avenue to make ourselves better coaches. I don't think anyone would argue that better coaches don't make better teams."

Prior to his work at Edmond Santa Fe, Cocannouer had previously led high school programs at John Marshall, Chandler, Alva, Pauls Valley and Walters High Schools and was an assistant at a number of others.

Cocannouer played at SWOSU after earning all-state honors as a running back at Tuttle High School. He played four seasons under legendary coach Otis

Delaporte and helped the Bulldogs win two conference titles in 1974 and 1977.

Cocannouer was a senior leader on a Bulldog team that won a school record 11 games and finished as the NAIA National Runner-up in 1977. SWOSU played Abilene Christian in what was called the Apple Bowl in the Kingdome in Seattle, Wash.

Cocannouer's success on the field has been recognized a number of times both by statewide newspapers and high school coaches associations. In 2006, he was named as the High School Coach of the Year by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. He has also coached several all-star and all-state games throughout his career.

He received his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from SWOSU in 1978 and earned his master's degree in education in 1983 also from SWOSU. He later obtained a secondary administrative certificate from Northwestern Oklahoma State in 1996.

His wife, Jeri Lynn, is Director of Special Education, Federal Programs and Testing for the Weatherford Public Schools.

The couple has two daughters, Janie and Josie.



## **TODD HELTON**

### **DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR**

The popular bridge between the Bulldogs past and present, Todd Helton has spent the last 22 seasons on the SWOSU football coaching staff. He brings with him a wealth of knowledge and experience while fashioning some of the league's top-rated defensive units for more than two decades.

A native of Perryton, Texas, Helton was an NAIA All-American for the Bulldogs in 1989 under longtime SWOSU coach Paul Sharp. His 197 career tackles and 15 sacks rank him among the school's all time leaders for lineman. He was recently honored with induction into the SWOSU Athletics Hall of Fame in 2010.

Helton's defensive unit last year was among the league's most improved. SWOSU bettered themselves in every statistical category while earning the reputation as one of the most aggressive units in the region.

Helton has coached three All-Americans: linebacker Ruzell McCoy in 2008; defensive linemen John Wichert in 1992 and 1993 and Robert Newberg in 1996.

Helton earned his bachelor's and his master's degree from SWOSU. He has two daughters, Kennedie and Ireland.



## **TOBY TROTTER**

### **SECONDARY/RECRUITING COORDINATOR**

One of Dan Cocannouer's first steps at shaping the SWOSU football coaching staff came with the hiring of Toby Trotter as the defensive secondary coach in 2009. Since that time, Trotter's secondary has been among the conference statistical leaders in pass defense, Red Zone defense and interceptions.

He has previous coaching experience at Southern Nazarene and Louisiana College. At SNU, he served as defensive secondary coach from 2001 to 2003. Prior to that he helped to start Louisiana College's first football team in 2000.

Trotter has served as a player representative for Sosnick Cobbe Sports Agency where he handled more than two dozen professional baseball clients. He assisted players in the signing of contracts that resulted in negotiated bonuses well over \$7 million, including that of Jay Bruce of the Cincinnati Reds and Cliff Pennington of the Oakland A's.

Trotter, a graduate of Westmoore High School, obtained a bachelor's degree from Oklahoma Baptist and a master's degree from SWOSU.

He and his wife, Cari, have three children, Cade, Ainsley and Shelby.



## **DUSTIN HADA**

### **OFFENSIVE LINE/STRENGTH COACH**

Returning for his third season as the offensive line coach is Dustin Hada who also took over as the team's primary strength and conditioning coach last year.

Hada's energetic approach has motivated the Bulldogs to better themselves not only on the offensive line but across the board with his rigorous conditioning and strength training programs.

Hada came to SWOSU in 2009 after previously working nine seasons at Olivet Nazarene, the last six of which were as the team's defensive coordinator.

Hada, who played high school ball under Dan Cocannouer at Alva, went on to play collegiately at Mid America Nazarene where he was a three-year starter in the offensive line and was awarded the team's most inspirational player. The Pioneers made three consecutive post-season bowl appearances in 1997, 1998 and 1999. Hada has a bachelor's degree in biology from Mid America Nazarene and later earned his master's degree in teaching from Olivet Nazarene in 2002.

He and his wife, Dana, have a young daughter, Madelynn.





## STEVE DAY QUARTERBACKS

Steve Day, SWOSU's record-setting quarterback, returns for his second season in charge of coaching the same position he starred at for four years with the Bulldogs.

Day finished his career as the school record holder in a number of passing categories, including career records in completions (692), attempts (1,334), yards (7,482) and touchdowns (46).

Day won the quarterback starting job as a true freshman in 2005, taking over the position full time after just 12 fall practices. He guided the Bulldogs offensive fortunes for the next five years, missing the 2006 season with a shoulder injury.

He graduated in 2010 with a 3.67 GPA in kinesiology and was twice named the Lone Star Conference North Division Football Academic Player-of-the-Year. He is nearing completion of his master's degree from SWOSU.

Day is a graduate of Edmond Santa Fe High School where he played for Dan Cocannouer and was a member of the Class 6A state runner-up team in 2003.



## TONY SAVINO LINEBACKERS

Tony Savino is in his first year on the Southwestern Oklahoma State University football staff and is in charge of the linebacker position. Savino previously spent two-plus years at Cisco Junior College, where he was a member of SWOSU alum Scott Taylor's coaching staff. Savino had the dual responsibilities of

working with linebackers and later the defensive line during his time at the Texas junior college.

A native Orange, Calif., Savino was a member of the TCU football team from 2003 to 2007. He was a teammate of current SWOSU coach Steven Coleman. Savino was a three-year letterman for the Horned Frogs and played offensive line. He participated in four bowls while at TCU: the Fort Worth Bowl, Houston Bowl, Poinsettia Bowl and Texas Bowl.

Savino played high school ball for Orange Lutheran, where he was a three-year starter and the team's captain his senior year. He was a first-team, all-district selection and an honorable mention, all-county selection.

He is married to the former Monica Jackson of Fort Worth.



## STEVEN COLEMAN CORNERBACKS

Steven Coleman starts his second year with the Southwestern Oklahoma State University football program as an assistant in charge of the cornerbacks.

Coleman was a defensive standout at TCU where he was a four-year letter winner and a three-year starter for Horned

Frogs secondary from 2005 through 2008.

Coleman was selected to the 2008 Mountain West All-Conference team as a senior when he finished with 46 tackles and three interceptions. During his college career, Coleman totaled 124 tackles and picked off eight passes, blocked one punt and recovered a fumble.

He played in two bowl games, the Poinsettia Bowl and the Texas Bowl.

Coleman is a graduate of Lake Highlands High School, where he was a first-team, all-state selection in Class 5A. He recorded 79 tackles and eight interceptions as a senior, while catching 20 passes for 229 yards and a TD as a wide receiver.



## RODERIC SMITH RECEIVERS

Roderic Smith, a longtime assistant at Mid America Nazarene University, Kansas Wesleyan University and Southern Nazarene University continues with the Southwestern Oklahoma State University Bulldogs football staff this fall.

He will again be responsible for helping develop the receiver's position.

Smith, a native of Aurora, Ill., played collegiately at Jackson State where he was a member of back-to-back conference title teams in 1995 and 1996.



# SWOSU makes debut in new conference

## *New opponents await with beginning of GAC*

Southwestern Oklahoma State University football coach **Dan Cocannouer** appears more than comfortable with the increased expectations for the 2011 Bulldog football team. The veteran coach who begins his third year at the helm has steadily improved his Alma Matter since his arrival in 2009.

He now for the first-time has a solid core of returners that understand better the Bulldogs offensive and defensive philosophies. A total of 16 full-time starters (eight offense and eight defense) return along with a number of others who saw significant playing time. Even with the high amount of veterans Cocannouer and his staff added more than 70 new players to the roster, 20 of which are junior college transfers and the remaining 50 first-time freshman.

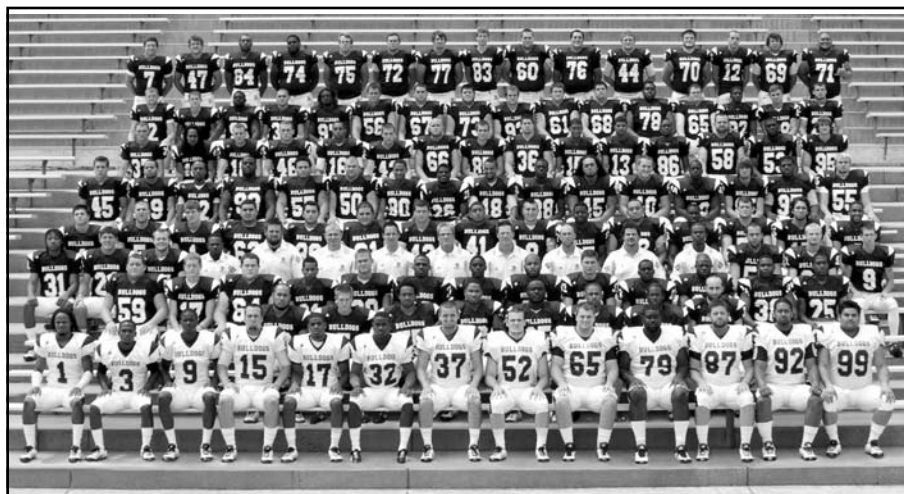
"I like the chemistry of the team, I like the athleticism of the team and I'm looking forward to seeing them under fire," Cocannouer said. "We're going to find out early about this football team."

SWOSU finished 2010 with a 3-8 record but did not rattle after a shaky 0-4 start. The Bulldogs collected victories over Eastern New Mexico, Central Oklahoma and Texas A&M-Commerce. In division play, SWOSU was 3-3 and tied for third in the Lone Star Conference's North Division.

### OFFENSIVE NOTES

Returning sophomore **Dustin Stenta** showed some signs of becoming a top-flight quarterback in his first year under center, completing 152-of-296 (51.2%) passes and throwing for 1,477 yards and seven touchdowns. He showed good mobility and was able to extend plays after the pocket collapsed around him. He finished as the team's second-leading rusher with 251 yards on 82 carries (3.1 average) and five TDs.

"Dustin now understands how important consistency is needed for our offense to succeed," Cocannouer said. "He can do a lot of positives when the ball is in his hands. We expect him to make the

correct reads and the right decisions that will move us down the field."

Help for Stenta is expected to come from an offensive line that returns three starters, including two-time all-conference selection **Stephen Speer** at center. The two tackle spots will again be book-ended by a pair of 300-pound heavy-weights, **Terrence Humes** on the left side and **Kane Bryen** on the right.

The two guard spots are expected to be manned by redshirt freshman **Mack Cannon** and transfer **Jamall Lewis**.

Cannon's father played in the NFL for the Green Bay Packers and Lewis was a starter at Kilgore Junior College.

All should provide running lanes for **D.C. Walker** who appears ready to carry bulk of the ball carrying duties after serving last season as a key back-up. Walker rushed for 249 yards on 67 carries (3.7 average) and had a 32-yard touchdown run against UCO.

A number of downfield options will be available for SWOSU with the return of slot back **Bruce Hatton** and tight end **Ryan Corbin**. Hatton was the team's top receiver with 44 catches for 344 yards and one touchdown, while Corbin accounted for 36 catches for 389 yards and two scores, both of which came against second-ranked Abilene Christian.

The healthy return of wideout **Esau Bauknight** and **Eric Charles** could open things up even more for SWOSU's aerial attack. Bauknight averaged 18.2 yards on

six catches before breaking his hand in Game four.

Charles played the first seven before he also was lost for the season with injury. While playing, Charles provided a reliable pass-catching target, latching on 27 balls for 333 yards and one touchdown.

### DEFENSIVE NOTES

SWOSU has long made a name for itself on the defensive side of the ball with its aggressive, opportunistic-style that disrupts many offenses. The Bulldogs always seem to put players on the field who hit hard and can create turnovers. SWOSU nearly doubled its total of interceptions from the previous year with 13 picks in 2010. The defense also came up with 11 quarterback sacks and eight fumble recoveries, both an increase from its previous numbers.

"Defensively, we are going to be able to do a number of things because of the amount of depth," Cocannouer said. "I've been most pleased with the amount of speed and athleticism. They have great closing speed and can really give chase."

Even with eight starters returning, no spots remains unchallenged thanks to the arrival of several talented junior college transfers.

Senior **Sean Gordon**, an honorable mention all-conference pick, is back at one defensive end spot. He will welcome the healthy return of **Nick Walker** opposite him. Walker missed the entire 2010

season with knee surgery. When healthy, Walker was one of the team's best players leading the Bulldogs in sacks and tackles for losses.

Controlling the line of scrimmage appears likely with **Ozzie Donato** back at one tackle. A transfer from Santa Barbara Community College, Donato had 21 tackles, five of which were for negative yardage. Two sophomores, **Lorenzo Barnes** and **Antuanya DeBose**, have shown early promise and will share duty at the other tackle.

The team's strength might well be at linebacker where returning starters **Ryan Feller** and **Preston Margain** have been in a fierce battle with **Kale Sawatzky** and **Jim O'Brien**, a pair of impact newcomers for the lead job. Feller worked his way into front-line duty as a true freshman and ended the season with 37 tackles, including a team-best 13 against UCO. Margain started throughout the year after transferring from Golden West Community College. His 23-yard interception return against Texas A&M-Kingsville was one of the year's biggest highlights.

Patrolling the back line of defense will again be free safety **Clarence Laster** and cornerback **Marvin Tribble**. Both seniors will be responsible for keeping a secondary intact after the unfortunate season-ending knee injury by all-conference safety **Jonathan Darby** in spring drills.

Laster was second to Darby with 71

tackles. He had two interceptions, one of which he returned 53 yards.

Tribble, a transfer from Independence Community College, intercepted two passes in his first game against Emporia State. He later added two more and finished as the team leader with four.

**Jesse Wright**, a starter in 2009, looks to have won a job back with the first teamers. As a true freshman, he finished fourth with 66 tackles while playing strong safety. Now two years later he will line up as a projected starter at the Rover position, a hybrid linebacker-defensive back role.

Newcomers **Davionne Amie** and **Matt Watson** should fill in the remaining spots in the secondary. Both have had outstanding careers so far in the junior college ranks and hold promise for that to continue with the Bulldogs.

## SPECIAL TEAMS

Junior kicker **Colton Rainey**, the hero of the Southeastern game, is back after making seven-of-14 field goals, including a 47-yarder with no time remaining against SOSU. He made all 22 of his point-after-attempts and averaged 32.4 yards on 77 punts last season.

True freshman **Kenny Wooldridge** could also be used if necessary as a possible option at punter. He has shown promise in fall drills and will battle Rainey for that spot.

Hatton returns as the team's primary kick and punt returner. He is the

school's all-time leader in kickoff return yards and could do the same in the punt return yardage at some point later this season.

## SCHEDULE

The Bulldogs open the 2011 season on the road against longtime rival Northwestern Oklahoma on a special Thursday night game on Sept. 1. SWOSU will have its first home game, its first-ever Great American Conference game, on Sept. 10 against Southern Arkansas. The game will be called the Fast Lane Kickoff Classic and again be featured as the Parents Day game.

Next will be a road game on Sept. 17 at GAC favorite Henderson State before returning home to face former Lone Star Conference foe Central Oklahoma on Sept. 24.

A trip to Southeastern Oklahoma will take place on Oct. 1 followed by back-to-back home games against East Central on Oct. 8 and a Homecoming encounter against GAC foe Ouachita Baptist on Oct. 15.

The season continues with consecutive road games at Harding University on Oct. 22 and at Northeastern State on Oct. 29.

SWOSU's final home game is on Nov. 5 against Arkansas Tech before closing the 2011 season on the road against the University of Arkansas at Monticello on Nov. 12.

## Coaching History Filled With Legends

In the program's 104-year history, Southwestern has had 21 different men lead the Bulldogs into the field of football competition. In that time the Bulldogs have accounted for 17 conference titles, participated in three bowl games, made three playoff appearances and won one national championship.

SWOSU's first-ever football coach was Lemley Whitcomb, who also handled duties as a professor in the school's physical education department. Whitcomb and his teams played sparingly but did collect the school's first-ever win against Kingfisher College in 1905.

It was more than 20 years later when SWOSU began to make its name on the gridiron under coach Joe Milam.

Led by star Jenks Simmons, the Bulldogs beat Central State for the first time in 13 years and completed an undefeated 5-0 conference season in 1926.

Milam, who also coached wrestling at the school, stayed with football until 1932 posting a 22-25-7 overall record.

Rankin Williams stepped in following Milam, and like his predecessor, had his best success early. His first two teams won seven games each year and

were conference champs in 1932 and 1933. Williams spent seven years as football coach and was 31-30-7 during that time. He would continue to coach baseball, basketball and track at SWOSU and did so until his retirement in 1964, a span of 42 years.

SWOSU would again enjoy considerable success with the arrival of Joe Metcalf who had previously coached at Hollis High School. Metcalf's teams won or shared conference titles in 1954, 1955 and 1957. Metcalf returned back to Hollis as superintendent but not before going 32-21-2 in five seasons.

The arrival of Otis Delaporte in 1964 sent signaled what would be a long and prosperous run for the Bulldogs. Delaporte had the Bulldogs back in the conference title picture soon, winning it all in 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971 and 1974.

The 1969 team went 9-1, losing by a 7-6 score to Central State. SWOSU's average margin of victory was 32 points that year as they beat their final three foes by scores of 52-7, 56-0 and 66-0.

Still a better team may come in 1977 when the Bulldogs completed a perfect 10-0 regular season.

SWOSU would later beat Nebraska Kearney in the playoffs only to lose to Abilene Christian in the Apple Bowl (NAIA Championship Game) in a game played in the Seattle Kingdome.

Delaporte stepped aside in 1977 after 13 years, posting a record of 89-53-2. At the time the win total was more than double of any previous coach.

Delaporte's mark stood for 25 years before Paul Sharp overtook him. Sharp passed Delaporte in 2003 and after 19 years as coach had totaled 93 wins before resigning in 2004. Sharp's teams won or shared three conference titles and his 1996 squad won the NAIA Division I Championship.

Ryan Held took over the Bulldogs in 2004 and led SWOSU to back-to-back winning seasons in 2005 and 2006 for the first time in over a decade. The 2006 team finished as co-champions of the LSC North Division, marking the first time since 1997 a Bulldog team finished atop the NCAA Division II conference.

SWOSU's newest coach came aboard in 2009 with the arrival of Dan Cocannouer who had 30+ years of success at the high school level.



## FAST LANE FIELD

Fast Lane Field, one of the largest football stadiums in the Great American Conference, has been the home of Southwestern Oklahoma State University football for more than 70 years.

The facility, which seats 8,600 spectators, is located on the west end of campus at Seventh Street and Davis.

New for 2010 is an Astro Turf playing surface which was installed earlier this spring and gives the field a special customized look.

Thousands of outstanding student-athletes and hundreds of games have played at the historic stadium, including the 1996 NAIA National Championship game. SWOSU went on to win its first-ever national football championship beating Montana Tech, 33-31.

Despite its long and storied history, the stadium has continued to improve since the original construction in 1936. A new pressbox was added in 1985, followed by the completion of new lights and an eastside seating project in 1988.

Parking improvements, new rest



rooms and concession stands dominated renovations during 1991.

In 1992, new bleachers were placed on the west side of the stadium creating the current seating capacity of 8,600. They also added a new sound system

that same year.

In 2008, the Bank of Western Oklahoma sponsored the Bulldogs current scoreboard located behind the north endzone which is complete with a full color digital message board.

## LOCKER ROOM



SWOSU football program is fortunate to have the use of a first-class, state-of-the-art locker room for their game and practice-related needs.

Built in 1998 at a cost of approximately \$90,000 the facility was converted from existing classroom space in Rankin Williams Fieldhouse to that of a spacious air-conditioned meeting facility complete with 85 individual metal navy blue lockers.

The area stretches over 3,100 square feet and includes plentiful showers and restroom facilities along with multiple meeting rooms for specialized groups.

## FITNESS CENTER



SWOSU's strength and conditioning program is extremely important to Bulldog student-athletes. It prepares them for competition, not only physically, but also mentally.

Housed in the SWOSU fitness center, the complex features nearly five tons of equipment spread over 30 workout stations within the 2,000 square foot air-conditioned facility.

The training regimen at SWOSU is a year-round process with closely monitored workouts that involve a great deal of individual instruction and attention. Student-athletes are taught the correct techniques to increase their ability to perform at their peak during eventual competition on the playing field or court.
