SETTING THE SCENE

- SWOSU Women's Basketball (1-1) opens up Great American Conference play in Russellville, Arkansas against No. 25-ranked Arkansas Tech for their second top-25 matchup the last three games

The Golden Suns have won the last six meetings against the Lady Dawgs, including

the GAC Championship game last season - SWOSU has yet to play a home game as this will mark the third-straight game on the road to open up the year

- The Lady Bulldogs are coming off a 90-73 victory over Missouri Southern State, a team they had lost their previous two meetings to dating back to the 2013-14 season

THE OPPONENT

#25 Arkansas Tech (1-0)

- Arkansas Tech was picked to finish second in the conference in the preseason coaches poll
- The Golden Suns posted a 27-4 record en route to its fourth GAC regular-season championship and second GAC tournament championship last season
- Two key starters from that championship squad return in the form of Anissa Pounds and Calli White
- ATU won their first game in the Central Region Tournament by defeating Missouri Western 81-80, but fell in the second round to Pittsburg State 91-80 to end their season
- Currently Tech is 1-0 on the year, after beating Lane College 81-51 in their season
- The Golden Suns are currently ranked 25 in both major polls for Division II, the WBCA and D2SIDA

THE COACHES

SWOSU: Kelsi Musick (111-92, 8th season)

Coach Musick is a two-time GAC Coach of the Year, winning back-to-back honors for the 2011-12 and 2012-13 seasons

- A great developer of talent, Musick has coached one All-American and 15 All-GAC selections, including one Player of the Year recipient

- She earned her 100th win as a head coach last season against rival Northwestern Oklahoma State on January 18, 2016

- Musick has won GAC Tournament Championships in two of the last five years, and made consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament in 2012-13 and 2013-14

Coach Musick has also spent time as an assistant coach at Fresno State, where they won two Western Athletic Conference regular season and tournament titles, as well as qualifi ed for the NCAA Division I National Tournament in the 2008-09 season

Arkansas Tech: Dave Wilbers (218-58, 10th season)

- Wilbers was named Tech's sixth women's head coach on April 30, 2007

Coach Wilbers has seen his Golden Sun squad make it as far at the Elite Eight in the NCAA Tournament multiple years, and has led a ranked ATU team in at least six seasons

- Prior to coming to Tech, Wilbers spent six years as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Oral Roberts University, an NCAA Division I school in Tulsa, Okla., that

is a member of the Mid-Continent Conference
-Prior to Oral Roberts, Wilbers spent three seasons on Cindy Stein's staff at the University of Missouri of the Big 12 Conference, as the first assistant coach and recruiting coordinator

Before heading to Missouri, Wilbers served as the assistant women's basketball and head volleyball coach at Seward County Community College in Liberal, Kan., for five years (1993-98)

SWOSU NOTES

- The Lady Bulldogs have been chosen as a third-place finisher for the upcoming season in the preseason coaches' poll after finishing the regular season last year in that same position
- SWOSU is coming off a (20-11, 14-8 GAC) season which came to an end in the GAC Tournament Championship game against Arkansas Tech 106-85
- To start the 2016-17 season, the Lady Bulldogs hold an even 1-1 record after falling to No. four-ranked Emporia State on opening night and then bouncing back the following day to defeat Missouri Southern State in the GAC / MIAA Crossover
- In the first two games of the season, Hailey Tucker has posted back-to-back double doubles by reaching double digits in both points and rebounds
- Tucker leads SWOSU in both of those categories by averaging 23 points and 11 rebounds
- Hayden Priddy is the leading sharer of the basketball for SWOSU, having recorded 13 assists through two games followed by Tyra Aska's nine
- Savannah Gray has knocked home a team high four three-point shots and is shooting 57 percent from deep so far this season (4-7)
- As a team, SWOSU is shooting 42 percent from the field including 37 percent from the three-point line while holding opponents defensively to 32 percent from the field and 26 percent from three point line
- The Dawgs will look to improve upon their rebounding margins, currently being out rebounded 123-77

LOOKING AHEAD

- The Lady Bulldogs will travel to Searcy, Arkansas following the game at ATU, where they will take on Harding on Saturday at 4 pm in another GAC game
- From there, SWOSU will not play another game until the following Saturday in Tahlequah, Oklahoma to take on Northeastern State in a non-conference affair
- Thursday, December 1 marks the first home game in the friendly confines of the Pioneer Cellular Event Center for the Lady Dawgs, when they will take on Arkansas-Monticello

KELSI MUSICK - HEAD COACH

Kelsi Musick has rebuilt the Southwestern Oklahoma State University women's basketball program with an exciting brand of basketball that has led the Lady Bulldogs to two NCAA Division II National Tournament appearances and three 20-win seasons. She enters her eighth season as the head coach of the Lady Bulldogs in 2016-17 with a career record of 110-91.

The fast-paced play of the Lady Bulldogs has helped SWOSU rank in the top ten nationally in scoring offense in four of the past five seasons, averaging better than 80 points per game in three of those seasons. Additionally, the Lady Bulldogs have ranked in the top ten of NCAA Division II for three-pointers made three times in the past five seasons, including ninth (8.0/game) in 2013 14 in 2011-12 and second (9.5) in 2013-14.

Musick's teams improved their win total in each of her first four seasons as she took the Lady Bulldogs from three wins in her first season to 24 in her fourth year. She is a two-time Great American Conference Coach of the Year who has led the Lady Bulldogs to three 20-win seasons. Musick has her teams playing their best in the postseason, where SWOSU has won two GAC Tournament Championships while advancing four GAC Championship games in the league's five-year history. She also led the Lady Bulldogs to NCAA Division II postseason appearances in 2013 and 2014, the first for the program since they made the transition in 1996-97.

SWOSU made an eight-win improvement in 2015-16, finishing 20-12 and tying for third place in the regular season GAC standings with a 14-8 record. The Lady Bulldogs rebounded after starting the season 0-4 and used an nine-game winning to get back into contention near the top of the league standings. SWOSU defeated in-state rivals Southeastern Oklahoma State and East Central to advance to the GAC Tournament Championship game, where they were defeated by No. 15 Arkansas Tech.

The Lady Bulldogs placed three players on the All-GAC teams in 2015-16, led by First Team All-GAC selection Hailey Tucker, who was also named the GAC Freshman of the Year. Janae Coffee was named the GAC's Newcomer of the Year and a Second Team All-GAC selection while Jennifer

Williams garnered all-conference honorable mention.

In seven seasons at SWOSU, Musick has tutored 16 players who have earned all-conference recognition including two-time first team selections in Michelle Fisher and Sumiya Darden. Additionally, she has coached one GAC Player of the Year (Darcie Dick, 2012) and one GAC Freshman of the Year (Hailey Tucker, 2016). Dick became Musick's first All-American at SWOSU, being named an honorable mention selection by the Women's Division II Bulletin in 2012, while Tucker was named to the All-Freshman Team by the same outlet, an honor for only 10 freshman players from all of NCAA

During the 2014-15 season, the Lady Bulldogs featured a young and inexperienced squad that struggled to a 12-15 overall record, including a 9-11 mark that tied for sixth in the Great American Conference. SWOSU was 10-3 on their home court during the year, including a 78-65 upset of No.

20 Harding on February 7 and they finished the year with five consecutive home wins.

Her 2013-14 squad finished 19-11 and tied for second place in the Great American Conference before making a magical run through the conference tournament. The Lady Bulldogs defeated Henderson State and East Central before handing No. 2 Harding just their second loss of the season, 78-74, in the finals of the tournament to earn the GAC's automatic bid to the national tournament. SWOSU was upended by top-seed and No. 7 Emporia State in the first round of the regional tournament, but the Lady Bulldogs became one of only four teams that have reached the Central

tournament, but the Lady Bulldogs became one of only four teams that have reached the Central Regional in each of the last two seasons. Musick's squad was led by Michelle Fisher, who became the school's all-time leading 3-point shooter and fourth-leading scorer at the conclusion of a stellar career. Fisher was a First Team All-GAC selection for the second straight season while Sarina Sayama earned honorable mention honors in 2013-14.

SWOSU finished second in the GAC in 2012-13 as Musick earned her second straight conference Coach of the Year after leading her squad to a 24-7 record and their first-ever berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament. The Lady Bulldogs earned the No. 7 seed in the regional and defeated second-seeded Central Missouri 73-71 in the Central Regional Quarterfinals before being eliminated by eventual Region Champion and Final Four participant Augustana 68-64 in the semifinals

Musick earned her first GAC Coach of the Year award after leading the Lady Bulldogs to a 20-9 record and second-place finish in 2011-12 after winning just 12 games the season before. SWOSU stormed through the conference tournament as the No. 2 seed to claim the inaugural GAC Tournament championship 69-58 over No. 4-seed Harding.

Prior to taking over the Bulldogs, Musick was an assistant coach at Fresno State University where she was part of a staff that posted consecutive 20-win seasons. Fresno State won the Western Athletic Conference (WAC) regular-season and tournament titles in each of her last years and finished

Athletic Conference (WAC) regular-season and tournament titles in each of her last years and finished 24-9 and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 2008-09 before being eliminated by California.

Previous head coaching experience for Musick came from her hometown of Canton, Okla., where she led the high school girls team starting in 2005. She spent two seasons at CHS and had her team in the Class A regional tournament in 2006-07 before finishing with a 16-9 record.

Musick played collegiately at Cameron where she was a four-year starter for the Aggies from 1998-2002 at point guard. She set school records in career three-point average and assists while remaining a President's Leadership scholar at the school. Her final season in 2001-02, the Aggies set a school record for most wins (25) and made their first-ever appearance in the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

Musick's family has a strong basketball background. Her mother, Pam Bond, was a longtime head coach at Canton High School and her younger sister, Kenzi, was a star on Oklahoma City University's NAIA Women's National Runner-up teams in 2003, 2004 and 2005.

A native of Canton, Okla., and a 2002 graduate of Cameron University, Musick is married to former SWOSU strength and conditioning coach Josh Musick. The couple resides in Weatherford with their two sons, Maddox and Titus.
