Requests must be made to the Sports Information Director prior to the end of contest. Requested athletes and coaches will be made available for interviews on the playing field or outside of the locker room following a contest.

Interviews during the week will be made on arrangement with the Sports Information Director. Please allow 24 hour notice for all such interviews.

SETTING THE SCENE

- After a break of nearly three weeks, the SWOSU Men's Basketball team returns to action on Saturday afternoon at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center against Randall University
- This will mark the final non-conference game of the season for the Bulldogs, who are now 3-6 on the year and they bring a three-game winning streak into Saturday's contest
- SWOSU is hosting Randall (formerly Hillsdale Baptist) for the fourth consecutive season, with three straight wins in the series for the Dawgs
- Last season, the Bulldogs cruised to a 92-75 victory over the Saints, but the meeting between the teams in 2014 was a one-point contest won by SWOSU 82-81
- Randall comes to Weatherford with a record of 4-8 on the heels of a four-game losing skid that includes several games against NCAA Division I and II institutions

THE OPPONENT*Randall (4-8)*

- After winning their first two games in December to move to 4-4 on the season, the Saints have dropped four straight contests to fall to 4-8 on the year
- The Saints are averaging 82.8 points per game while shooting 44.2% from the field and 37.9% from three-point range for the year
- Six players for Randall average 7.5 points per game or better, led by Trey Sneed at 18.0 points per game and Xavier Hunter with 11.0 ppg

THE COACHES*SWOSU: Bob Battisti (53-41, 4th season; 462-337 career, 28th season)*

- In his fourth season as the head coach of the Bulldogs, having led SWOSU to at least 16 wins in each of his first three years at the helm
- Has coached five players at SWOSU that earned All-GAC distinction, including one GAC Player of the Year (Rod Camphor) and one GAC Defensive Player of the Year (Michael Bradley)
- Previously spent 25 years at Northwestern Oklahoma State, coaching the men's basketball team for 21 seasons before taking over as the school's athletic director
- In 26 years as a head coach, Battisti has a career record of 462-337 (.582) and he is 3-0 against Randall as the head coach at SWOSU

Randall: Mark Berokoff (5th season)

- Now in his fifth season leading the Saints after one year as the Director of Basketball Operations for the Texas State men's basketball team
- Led Randall (then Hillsdale Baptist) to the 2015-16 NCCAA National Championship with a 97-84 overtime win over Grace Bible last March

CHECKING THE STANDINGS

- With Great American Conference play on a hiatus until January, Arkansas-Monticello will take the league lead into the holiday break with a perfect 4-0 mark in GAC games
- A log jam of four teams are just one game back of the Weevils with a 3-1 conference mark to date: Harding, Henderson State, Southern Arkansas, Southern Nazarene
- Tied for sixth place with even records of 2-2 through the first four games are Arkansas Tech, East Central and Ouachita
- After picking up their first conference victory, the Bulldogs moved into a share of ninth place in the standings with Oklahoma Baptist

SWOSU NOTES

- After scoring a career-high 25 points against Panhandle State, SWOSU's Nick Shoemaker was named the Great American Conference Player of the Week on December 12
- Shoemaker was 7-for-11 from three-point range and 4-for-5 from the stripe against OPSU, becoming the first Bulldog since Marin Zelalija (February 7, 2013) to hit seven three-pointers in a single game
- Shoemaker became the fourth different SWOSU player to lead the Bulldogs in scoring this season, joining Devin Pugh (five times), Markeise Champion (twice) and Reshardd Harris (once)
- The 81-69 victory at Panhandle State was the first road win of the year for the Dawgs and their third straight overall after beginning the year 0-6
- SWOSU tied a season-high with six steals at OPSU, led by Devin Pugh and Collin Jennings with two apiece
- Luke Lewallen scored a career-high 11 points against Panhandle State, one game after setting a new career-high with eight rebounds against Cameron
- Collin Jennings returned to the starting lineup for the first time in four games at Panhandle State, scoring 10 points with six rebounds in 32 minutes of action

LOOKING AHEAD

- Great American Conference play heats back up with a weekend trip to Arkadelphia to face Ouachita and Henderson State on January 5-7
- The following week, SWOSU starts in-state league games at East Central (Jan. 12) and against Southern Nazarene (Jan. 14) at the Pioneer Cellular Event Center

BOB BATTISTI - HEAD COACH

Bob Battisti is in his fourth season at SWOSU in 2016-17 after being tabbed as the 14th men's basketball coach in Bulldog basketball history in April 2013. In three years with the Bulldogs, Battisti has guided SWOSU to a record of 50-35, giving him a career record of 459-331 in 27 years as a collegiate head coach.

Battisti has guided five All-Great American Conference selections while at SWOSU, including two-time all-conference selection Martell Collins, who was named a First Team All-GAC honoree in 2016. Battisti has also mentored one All-American (Rod Camphor), one GAC Player of the Year (Camphor) and one GAC Defensive Player of the Year (Michael Bradley).

Battisti has led the Bulldogs to at least 16 wins in each of his first three seasons, including a record of 17-12 in 2015-16. SWOSU opened the season with a 7-1 record and went on to finish fourth in the regular season GAC standings at 13-9 before being knocked out of the GAC Tournament by Southern Arkansas in the quarterfinals. Two players earned all-conference distinction for the Bulldogs, with Martell Collins being named to the first team and Markeise Champion garnering an honorable mention selection.

In his second year at SWOSU, Battisti guided a Bulldog team that again led the Great American Conference in scoring defense, allowing 68.4 points per game while also committing the fewest turnovers in the league at 9.8 per game. SWOSU finished the season with a 16-13 (9-11 GAC) record, tying for seventh place in the regular season standings. In the GAC Tournament, the Bulldogs became the first No. 8 seed earn a quarterfinal victory with a dramatic 71-67 overtime win

against league-champion Ouachita Baptist. Martell Collins was named a Second Team All-GAC selection in 2014-15, becoming the third all-league player tutored by Battisti.

Battisti's first team at SWOSU finished as the runner-up in the Great American Conference with a 17-10 (14-6 GAC) record after being picked ninth in the preseason conference poll. Under the direction of Battisti, SWOSU's Rod Camphor blossomed into one of the top players in the Central Region, being named the GAC Player of the Year before earning all-region honors from Daktronics and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and an Honorable Mention All-American selection by the Division II Bulletin. Camphor capped off his senior season by becoming the first GAC player to be chosen for the Reese's Division II College All-Star Game where he scored 17 points to lead his team.

Defense and ball control helped the Bulldogs have a successful season in Battisti's first campaign. SWOSU led the GAC in blocked shots behind conference Defensive Player of the Year Michael Bradley and they committed the fewest turnovers in NCAA Division II with 243, an average of just 9.0 per game.

Battisti came to SWOSU as no stranger to the collegiate basketball scene in the state of Oklahoma after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma Christian University in Edmond, helping the Eagles to a record of 40-25. In 2012, OCU won the Sooner Athletic Conference tournament title, giving the program its first postseason basketball title in 30 years, and this past season they reached the National Christian College Athletic Association championship game.

Prior to his stint at OCU, Battisti spent 25 years at Northwestern Oklahoma State, coaching the men's basketball team for 21 seasons before taking over as the school's athletic director for four years.

As the school's athletic director, Battisti launched the 'Vision for Victory' fundraising campaign which netted \$2.4 million for major athletic facility improvements. He also led Northwestern's efforts to seek membership into NCAA Division II.

He took over the men's basketball team at Northwestern in 1986 and quickly turned the program into a consistent winner. Battisti's teams, often known for their intense defensive style, posted a record of 374-265 over his 21-year tenure. He led the Rangers to six conference titles and finished in the NAIA Top 25 seven times. For his efforts, Battisti was named a conference coach of the year five times and he was selected as the NAIA National Coach of the Year by the Basketball Times in 1994.

His teams also advanced to the NAIA National Tournament on six occasions, including an appearance in the national quarterfinals in 2007. His best year at Northwestern was the 1992-93 season, when Battisti led NWOSU to a 29-2 record and No. 2 national ranking entering the national tournament.

Battisti went to Northwestern after serving two seasons as an assistant at the University of Minnesota on a staff that included veteran NBA coach, Flip Saunders. He went to Minnesota following a stint as the head coach at Lakewood Community College in Minnesota where he posted a record of 35-31 in three seasons. His coaching career started at Bethany Lutheran where he was an assistant coach for three seasons for three seasons from 1978-81.

A native of Warren, Mich., Battisti received his bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education from Minnesota State University-Mankato in 1981 before earning his master's degree in Education from the University of Minnesota-Minneapolis in 1985. He and his wife Shelly have one son, Cooper, 19.
