Requests must be made to the Sports Information Director prior to the end of contest. Requested athletes and coaches will be made available for interviews on the playing field or outside of the locker room following a contest.

Interviews during the week will be made on arrangement with the Sports Information Director. Please allow 24 hour notice for all such interviews.

SETTING THE SCENE

- SWOSU Basketball heads to Lawton on Saturday for a non-conference contest against Cameron, with tipoff set for 3:00 pm at Aggie Gym
- This marks the second straight year the Bulldogs have faced the Aggies in a nonconference matchup after not meeting since the 2010-11 season, the final year that both teams were members of the Lone Star Conference
- SWOSU defeated Cameron 73-71 last December inside the Pioneer Cellular Event Center in Weatherford behind a game-high 19 points from Devin Pugh
- The Bulldogs are reeling as they enter the game on a four-game losing skid after picking up a season-opening win against Lincoln on November 10
- Cameron is 2-3 on the year and on a two-game slide after dropping close contests against Maryvile and Dallas Baptist in their last two outings

THE OPPONENT

Cameron (2-3)

- The Aggies are playing at home for the first time during the regular season on Saturday after playing in two tournaments to open the season
- Cameron owns victories over Oklahoma Christian and Central Missouri with setbacks coming against Newman, Maryville and Dallas Baptist
- A balanced offense with five players averaging better than 10 points has the Aggies scoring better than 80 points per game

THE COACHES

SWOSU: Bob Battisti (57-61, 5th season; 466-357 career, 29th season)

- In his fifth season as the head coach of the Bulldogs, having led SWOSU to at least 16 wins in three of his first four years at the helm
- Has coached five players at SWOSU that earned All-GAC distinction, including one GAC Player of the Year and one GAC Defensive Player of the Year
- In 28 years as a head coach, Battisti has a career record of 466-357 (.582) and he is 1-0 against Cameron as the head coach at SWOSU

Cameron: Andrew Brown (19-15, 2nd season)

- In his second season as the head men's basketball coach at Cameron after spending the 2015-16 season as the Aggies top assistant coach
- Previously spent eight years (2007-15) at Northwestern Oklahoma State, where he replaced SWOSU's Bob Battisti as head coach of the Rangers

CHECKING THE STANDINGS

- After one week of GAC play, three times remain unbeaten in league play with 2-0 records: East Central, Northwestern, and Southern Nazarene
- Six teams sport even 1-1 slates: Arkansas Tech, Arkansas-Monticello, Ouachita, Henderson State, Oklahoma Baptist, and Southeastern
- SWOSU, along with Harding and Southern Arkansas remain winless at 0-2
- Northwestern has collected the most wins overall, sitting at a perfect 5-0 overall record with all four wins coming in Alva
- Ouachita has the most impressive win, coming against Division I University of Arkansas Little Rock in an exhibition

SWOSU NOTES

- After posting a season-high 24 points against Rogers State, Charles Beauregard, Jr. leads the team ranks among the top 10 scorers in the Great American Conference with 15.8 points per game
- SWOSU ranks seventh in the conference with an average of 70.8 points per game, but the scoring defense is allowing 77.6 points and ranks 10th among GAC schools
- The Bulldogs have attempted 132 free throw attempts in five games more than any other league school and connected at a 72.7% clip (96-132) for the fourth-best free throw percentage in the conference
- Jerry Hurt was held to a season-low nine points against Rogers State but he remains ranked second on the team in scoring with 14.4 points per game
- Justin King returned to double figures with 11 points against RSU after being held to a combined four points in two GAC games last weekend
- In addition to scoring, Beauregard leads the Bulldogs in rebounding (5.2 per game) and he's tied for the team lead with nine assists and eight steals
- SWOSU has recorded just 40 assists on 108 made field goals for a league-low 8.0 assists per game

LOOKING AHEAD

- SWOSU will return to GAC play next weekend with games against Arkansas Tech on Thursday night and Harding on Saturday afternoon
- The Bulldogs then play their final two non-conference games in December against Panhandle State (Dec. 8) and Randall (Dec. 30)

BOB BATTISTI - HEAD COACH

Bob Battisti is in his fifth season at SWOSU in 2017-18 after being tabbed as the 14th men's basketball coach in Bulldog basketball history in April 2013. In three years with the Bulldogs, Battisti has guided SWOSU to a record of 56-57, giving him a career record of 459-331 in 27 years as a collegiate head coach.

Battisti has guided six All-Great American Conference selections while at SWOSU, including two-time all-conference selection Martell Collins, who was named a First Team All-GAC honoree in 2016. Battisti has also mentored one All-American (Rod Camphor), one GAC Player of the Year (Camphor) and one GAC Defensive Player of the Year (Michael Bradley).

Battisti has led the Bulldogs to at least 16 wins in three of his first four seasons, including a record of 17-12 in 2015-16. SWOSU opened the season with a 7-1 record and went on to finish fourth in the regular season GAC standings at 13-9 before being knocked out of the GAC Tournament by Southern Arkansas in the quarterfinals. Two players earned all-conference distinction for the Bulldogs, with Martell Collins being named to the first team and Markeise Champion garnering an honorable mention selection.

In his second year at SWOSU, Battisti guided a Bulldog team that again led the Great American Conference in scoring defense, allowing 68.4 points per game while also committing the fewest turnovers in the league at 9.8 per game. SWOSU finished the season with a 16-13 (9-11 GAC) record, tying for seventh place in the regular season standings. In the GAC Tournament, the Bulldogs became the first No. 8 seed earn a quarterfinal victory with a dramatic 71-67 overtime win

against league-champion Ouachita Baptist. Martell Collins was named a Second Team All-GAC selection in 2014-15, becoming the third all-league player tutored by Battisti.

Battisti's first team at SWOSU finished as the runner-up in the Great American Conference with a 17-10 (14-6 GAC) record after being picked ninth in the preseason conference poll. Under the direction of Battisti, SWOSU's Rod Camphor blossomed into one of the top players in the Central Region, being named the GAC Player of the Year before earning all-region honors from Daktronics and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and an Honorable Mention All-American selection by the Division II Bulletin. Camphor capped off his senior season by becoming the first GAC player to be chosen for the Reese's Division II College All-Star Game where he scored 17 points to lead his team.

Defense and ball control helped the Bulldogs have a successful season in Battisti's first campaign. SWOSU led the GAC in blocked shots behind conference Defensive Player of the Year Michael Bradley and they committed the fewest turnovers in NCAA Division II with 243, an average of just 9.0 per game.

Battisti came to SWOSU as no stranger to the collegiate basketball scene in the state of Oklahoma after spending two seasons as an assistant coach at Oklahoma Christian University in Edmond, helping the Eagles to a record of 40-25. In 2012, OCU won the Sooner Athletic Conference tournament title, giving the program its first postseason basketball title in 30 years, and this past season they reached the National Christian College Athletic Association championship game.

Prior to his stint at OCU, Battisti spent 25 years at Northwestern Oklahoma State, coaching the men's basketball team for 21 seasons before taking over as the school's athletic director for four years.

As the school's athletic director, Battisti launched the 'Vision for Victory' fundraising campaign which netted \$2.4 million for major athletic facility improvements. He also led Northwestern's efforts to seek membership into NCAA Division II.

He took over the men's basketball team at Northwestern in 1986 and quickly turned the program into a consistent winner. Battisti's teams, often known for their intense defensive style, posted a record

of 374-265 over his 21-year tenure. He led the Rangers to six conference titles and finished in the NAIA Top 25 seven times. For his efforts, Battisti was named a conference coach of the year five times and he was selected as the NAIA National Coach of the Year by the Basketball Times in 1994.

His teams also advanced to the NAIA National Tournament on six occasions, including an appearance in the national quarterfinals in 2007. His best year at Northwestern was the 1992-93 season, when Battisti led NWOSU to a 29-2 record and No. 2 national ranking entering the national tournament.

Battisti went to Northwestern after serving two seasons as an assistant at the University of Minnesota on a staff that included veteran NBA coach, Flip Saunders. He went to Minnesota following a stint as the head coach at Lakewood Community College in Minnesota where he posted a record of 35-31 in three seasons. His coaching career started at Bethany Lutheran where he was an assistant coach for three seasons for three seasons from 1978-81.

A native of Warren, Mich., Battisti received his bachelor's degree in Health and Physical Education from Minnesota State University-Mankato in 1981 before earning his master's degree in Education from the University of Minnesota-Minneapolis in 1985. He and his wife Shelly have one son, Cooper, 20.
