The No. 17 Texas A&M Aggies embark on a pivotal weekend as they host Alabama on Friday and travel to No. 8 Auburn on Sunday. The Aggies enter the weekend in fifth place, but just four points behind conference leader South Carolina. On Friday, the Maroon and White look to continue a 15-match home unbeaten string, including a 12-match win streak at Ellis Field. Sunday marks the fourth time this season the Aggies will travel for a road match against a Top 20 team and the third time they will face a Top 10 squad on the road.

FOLLOW THE ACTION

Both matches are available digitally on mobile devices, tablets, PCs and connect-TVs for SEC Network subscribers whose cable/satellite packages allow access to SEC Network+ through the WatchESPN app and SECsports.com. The matches can be heard on the RadioAggieland app, RadioAggieland.com and 12thMan.com. Friday's match may be heard on Fusion FM - HD2 on HD radio at 95.1-2 FM locally. Sunday's match may be heard on Sports Radio 1150 and 102.7 The Zone in Bryan-College Station.

ELLIS FIELD WIN STREAK

The Aggies own a 12-match home win streak entering Friday's action. The stretch includes a 7-0-0 mark at Ellis Field in 2015 and four wins at the 2014 NCAA Tournament. Texas A&M is also unbeaten in their last 15 matches at Ellis Field, going 14-0-1.

WEAPONS UPON WEAPONS

Texas A&M boasts one of the largest caches of offensive weapons in the nation. Among SEC teams, the Aggies are the lone squad to boast more than six players with three or more goals. Haley Pounds (9), Janae Cousineau (4), Mikaela Harvey (4), Emily Bates (3), Kate Hajdu (3) and McKayla Paulson (3) all have three or more goals on the season.

CREAM OF THE SEC CROP

Since Texas A&M's entrance in the SEC in 2012, the Aggies own the best winning percentage in league play at .800. Texas A&M (31-7-2) and Florida (31-8-1) are tied for the most victories in league action during the span. Kentucky is the only other team in the league to log more than 25 wins in SEC play from 2012-15, going 26-12-2.

Texas A&M and Florida have accounted for all of the regular-season and tournament titles the last three years. In 2012, Florida won the regular-season title by a two-point edge (33-31) and claimed the tournament crown. In 2013, the teams were co-champions identical 9-2-0 records in SEC play, but the Aggies prevailed over the Gators in the SEC Tournament championship game, 2-1. Last season, Texas A&M edged out Florida by one point for the regular-season title (28-27) and completed their second consecutive SEC Double with a 1-0 win over Kentucky in the tournament title match.

LAST TIME OUT - MISSISSIPPI STATE

The Aggies had their offense and defense clicking on all cylinders as they snapped a two-match funk with a 4-0 win over Mississippi State. Mia Hummel picked up the shutout in her second career start, making one save and pouncing on a plethora of crosses to snuff out attacks. McKayla Paulson put the Aggies on top in the 12th minute knocking in a loose ball on a corner kick opportunity. Brittany Crabtree tacked on a goal in the 56th minute sending home a rebound after Stephanie Malherbe's shot hit the crossbar. Janae Cousineau and Karlie Mueller assisted on a Haley Pounds goal in the 66th minute and Cousineau capped off the scoring in the 89th minute, getting her head on a Mueller free kick.

SERIES VS. ALABAMA

The Aggies are 4-1-0 all-time against Alabama, including 2-0-0 since the Maroon and White joined the SEC in 2012. Texas A&M won the initial SEC meeting, 5-0, at Ellis Field led by Shea Groom with two goals. The last meeting came in 2013 with the Aggies scoring a 3-0 victory in Tuscaloosa paced by Groom with two goals again. The teams met on three occasions in the 1990s. The first contest was in 1995 with Alabama scoring a 3-1 victory in College Station. The next season, the Aggies won 2-1 in Tuscaloosa and the Maroon and White won a 1998 NCAA Tournament meeting, 3-1, at Ellis Field.

2015 TEXAS A&M SOCCER GAME NOTES

SCOUTING ALABAMA

The Crimson Tide are 4-7-2 overall and are tied for 13th place in the SEC standings with a 1-4-0 mark. Alabama's offense has been its Achilles heel, logging just 11 goals in 13 matches and suffering six shutouts. The Crimson Tide opened league play with a 3-2 win in double overtime against LSU, but have losses to Kentucky (1-0), Ole Miss (3-2), South Carolina (3-2) and Auburn (2-1 - 2ot). Alabama has non-conference wins against Troy (1-0), Southern Miss (1-0) and Jacksonville State (2-0), ties against Wake Forest (0-0) and Harvard (0-0) and losses to Memphis (1-0), Tennessee Tech (2-1) and Rhode Island (1-0).

Emily Rusk has started 11 matches in goal, playing 952 of the 1,234 minutes in the woodwork. She owns a 0.95 goals-against average, 36 saves and four shutouts. Kat Stratton has two starts in goal and has played 283 minutes in four matches. She has a 1.59 goals-against average and 10 saves.

SERIES VS. AUBURN

The Aggies are 4-1-0 all-time against the Tigers, including a win in their only previous meeting in Auburn. All five meetings have come since Texas A&M joined the SEC. The Aggies won the initial meeting, 2-0, at Ellis Field in 2012. Auburn rebounded to knock A&M out of the 2012 SEC Tournament with a 2-0 semifinal win. The Aggies won a pair of matches in 2013, besting the Tigers 3-1 in Auburn and 1-0 in the SEC Tournament semifinal. Last year, the Maroon and White earned a 3-1 victory at Ellis Field. Annie Kunz, Bianca Brinson and Janae Cousineau all logged goals in the victory.

SCOUTING AUBURN

The Tigers sit in second place in the SEC standings with a 4-1-0 mark in league action. Ranked No. 5 in the most recent RPI released by the NCAA, Auburn is 11-1-0 overall. The Tigers did not yield a goal in their first six non-conference matches, blanking UC Irvine (1-0), Long Beach State (1-0 - 2ot), UAB (4-0), Furman (2-0), Samford (2-0) and Old Dominion (1-0). They also have a 2-1 win against South Alabama. After dropping the league opener at Missouri (2-1), Auburn rattled off wins against Tennessee (3-1), LSU (3-2 - 2ot), Florida (3-2) and Alabama (2-1 - 2ot).

The Auburn offense is paced by the Ramsier sisters. Casie Ramsier leads the squad with 18 points on a team-high eight goals and two assists. Brooke Ramsier has 11 points on three goals and a team-high five assists. Taylor Troutman has added nine points on three goals and three assists and Kristen Dodson has seven points with three goals and one assist. Sarah Le Beau has started all 12 matches in goal for Auburn, notching a 0.74 goals-against average, 43 saves and five shutouts.

TEXAS A&M OWNS LONGEST ACTIVE 15-WIN SEASON STREAK

Texas A&M entered the 2015 campaign with 11 consecutive 15-win seasons, the longest active stretch in Division I. The only other team to enter the season with a double-digit stretch was Florida State with 10 consecutive 15-win seasons. Stanford (9) and Florida (8) were the only other schools with more than five consecutive 15-win campaigns. In their first 22 seasons, the only two years the Aggies have not reached the 15-win plateau are 1998 (14-8) and 2003 (13-6-3). The school record for victories stands at 22, set last season with a 22-3-2 mark.

AGGIES SET SINGLE-SEASON RECORD WIN TOTAL IN 2014

With their 2-1 win against Notre Dame in the NCAA Championship third round, the Aggies set a new school record with their 21st victory of the season, eclipsing the 20 wins amassed in 2002. That season, the Aggies finished 20-5-1, advancing to the NCAA Championship quarterfinal round. In 2002, teams were credited with wins if they prevailed in a penalty kick shootout situation. A&M won two penalty kick shootouts during the 2002 NCAA Championship.

The Aggies finished the season 22-3-2 and own an .852 winning percentage. A&M's school-record for best winning percentage in a season is 1997 when they finished 18-3 (.857). Last year, the Maroon and White set a new school-record for matches played in a season with 27. The prior record was 26 set in 2002.

RETURNING OFFENSE

The Aggies return just seven of 71 goals (9.9 percent) from last season. Janae Cousineau accounts for six of the returning goals and Haley Pounds notched one goal in 2014. A&M returns 14 of 60 assists from 2014. Karlie Mueller had the highest total among the returnees with five. Cousineau, Pounds, McKayla Paulson and Mikaela Harvey each notched two assists in 2014. Cousineau's 14 points last season is the most among the returnees.

Texas A&M's 11 returnees combined for just seven goals and 14 assists (28 points) during the 2014 campaign. Through 13 games, the same 11 returnees have notched 22 goals and 17 assists (61 points).

HARVEY NAMED TO MAC HERMANN TROPHY WATCH LIST

Mikaela Harvey was named to the Missouri Athletic Club's Hermann Trophy 28-player watch list. Harvey and Stanford's Andi Sullivan were the only two sophomores named to the list. Harvey battled through multiple injuries in 2014 playing 21 games with eight starts. She logged two assists on the season. Harvey participated in five matches for the US U20 Women's National Team in 2015 with four starts.

MAKING ELLIS FIELD A FORTRESS

Texas A&M owns a 213-30-6 (.867) all-time record at Ellis Field (formerly Aggie Soccer Stadium). The Maroon and White have called the field home since the 1994 season, playing the inaugural 1993 season at Old Tiger Field. Since 2005, the Aggies have registered a 113-14-6 (.872) mark on the friendly pitch. Texas A&M is 220-30-6 (.871) all-time in College Station, going 7-0-0 in their one season at Old Tiger Field.

WINNING

A&M has finished with a winning record in all of its previous 22 seasons. The closest the Aggies have finished to the .500 mark is the 14-8 (.636) record they posted in 1998.

NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

The Aggies welcomed nine freshmen to the squad this season and they've made the immediate impact that was necessary for a strong start to the season. Emily Bates leads the squad with nine starts and Kate Hajdu and Ally Watt have eight starts apiece. Brittany Crabtree has received the starting assignment on seven occasions. Mia Hummel, Amethyst Kelly, Claudette Lassandro, Kendall Ritchie and Margaret Schmidt have all seen relief action.

Hajdu was named the SEC Freshman of the Week the opening weekend and Bates earned the honor for the fourth week of action. Bates ranks second on the team with 11 points on three goals and five assists. Hajdu has three goals and two assists. Crabtree has one goal and one assist and Lassandro has one goal on the season.

GUERRIERI REACHES 400-WIN MILESTONE

Texas A&M head coach G Guerrieri ranks among the leaders in winning percentage and victories among active Division I coaches. With a career record of 404-124-29 (.751), he ranks fifth in victories and sixth in winning percentage (minimum five years as a Division I head coach). Guerrieri ranks fifth all-time among NCAA Division I coaches in victories, trailing only North Carolina's Anson Dorrance (790), Connecticut's Len Tsantiris (535), Florida's Becky Burleigh (444) and Santa Clara's Jerry Smith (431).

2015 ROSTER

The Aggies' 21-player roster features three seniors, four juniors, one redshirt sophomore, four sophomores and nine true freshmen. The team returns three players who started at least 50 percent of last year's matches (Janae Cousineau, Karlie Mueller and McKayla Paulson) and eight players who started at least one match.

NOTABLE DEBUT FOR HAJDU

Kate Hajdu became the fourth Aggie freshman to register two goals in a season opener and the first since Allie Bailey tallied two goals in the season debut against Fresno State (W, 4-2). Others to accomplish the feat included Jessica Hamilton in 2000 (5-0 win vs Central Florida) and Michelle Remington in 1998 (5-1 win vs North Texas).

CONFERENCE WINNING

The Aggies have finished with a winning record in league play in all 19 years it was aligned with a conference. The closest the Aggies have finished to the .500 mark in league play is the 5-3-2 (.600) record they posted in Big 12 play in 2003. In 19 seasons of league action, A&M has finished first or second in the conference standings on 16 occasions with the other finishes coming in 1998 (3rd Big 12 - 7-2) and 2003 (5th Big 12 - 5-3-2).

SENSATIONAL SOPHOMORES

After getting a year of seasoning under the auspices of last year's nine-player senior class, Texas A&M's four sophomores came out like gang busters in the first 13 games of the season. The quartet accounted for 17 goals and 10 assists for 44 points through the first seven weekends. Haley Pounds has produced 22 points with nine goals and four assists, including her first career hat trick against Abilene Christian. She was named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week the opening week when she logged one goal and four assists. After going without a goal in her first 22 career matches, Mikaela Harvey has scored a goal in four of the last 12 contests. McKayla Paulson notched the first two goals of her career, both in the win at Rice, and added a goal against Mississippi State and assists against UC Irvine and North Texas. Stephanie Malherbe logged her first career goal in the 2-1 win against then No. 10 Florida and has added three assists. The four sophomores all played at least 1,000 of the 1,189 minutes on the season with Paulson playing every second of the matches.

BACK-TO-BACK SEC DOUBLES

In 2014, the Aggies won both the SEC regular-season and tournament titles for the second consecutive season. The Maroon and White became the first team to win the SEC double in consecutive years since Florida in 2000 and 2001. The Aggies were the first team to win back-to-back SEC Tournament titles since Tennessee in 2002 and 2003.

POUNDS SETS THE TABLE IN AGGIE OPENER

In the Aggies season opener at Rice, Haley Pounds became the 11th Texas A&M player to record three assists in a game. The feat has been accomplished on 12 occasions with Yvette Okler hitting the mark on two occasions. Kat Krambeer owns the Texas A&M record with four assists against UTSA in 2006. Karlie Mueller was the most recent Aggie to notch three assists, accomplishing the feat in A&M's 8-0 win against Mississippi State in 2013.

FILLING THE HOLE IN GOAL

With the exit of Jordan Day and Renee McDermott, the Aggies lost all but 31 of their goalkeeper minutes from the last four seasons. Day and McDermott played every minute of 2012 and 2013. In 2011, Megan Majewski played 17 minutes in goal. Last season, Taylor Saucier played 14 minutes in Texas A&M's NCAA Championship first round win against Houston Baptist, for the only action in her career entering the 2015 campaign.

On the season, the Aggie goalkeepers have combined to register a 0.98 goals-against average and five shut-outs. Saucier has started 11 contests, logging 920 minutes. She owns a 1.08 goals-against average, 35 saves and two shutouts. Saucier's goals-against average when PKs are taken out of the equation, stands at 0.88. Mia Hummel has seen action in five matches, including two starts. She has yielded two goals, made 11 saves and owns a shutout against Mississippi State. The pair combined to record shutouts against Northwestern State and UC Irvine.

MUELLER AMONG ACTIVE LEADERS IN GAMES PLAYED

Texas A&M senior Karlie Mueller ranks 10th in the nation and second among SEC players in career matches played with 81 caps. She trails on Florida's Christen Westphal (84) among SEC players. Mueller has made 69 career starts and owns 18 career assists, including 10 as a sophomore in 2013. Her first career goal came in her 6,047th minute of play, scoring a golden goal in the 109th minute of a 2-1 victory against North Texas.

HISTORIC SEC SEASON

The Maroon and White helped spearhead a historic season for the Southeastern Conference on the pitch in 2014. A&M's College Cup marked just the third appearance for an SEC school and the first since Florida in 2001. The Gators also played in the College Cup in 1998, winning the national championship. The SEC set new league standards for the number of teams reaching the Elite Eight (3 - Florida, South Carolina, Texas A&M) and number of teams reaching the Sweet 16 (4 - Florida, Kentucky, South Carolina, Texas A&M). The SEC led all conferences with its three Elite Eight squads, topping the ACC (2), Pac 12 (2) and Big Ten (1).

POUNDS LOGS THE HAT TRICK

In the Aggies' 4-1 win over Abilene Christian, Haley Pounds recorded the 35th hat trick in school history. She notched three goals in a span of 12:37 starting with 33:00 remaining in the second half. The first goal came on an assist from Kate Hajdu and Karlie Mueller. The last two goals came on penalty kicks after Mikaela Harvey drew fouls in the 18-yard box.

PAULSON EARNS EARLY IRONMAN HONORS

Defender McKayla Paulson leads the Aggies in minutes played, working the entirety of the first 13 matches for 1,189 minutes of play. Grace Wright (1,170), Haley Pounds (1,124), Ashlynn Harryman (1,113), Mikaela Harvey (1,106), Karlie Mueller (1,090) and Stephanie Malherbe (1,059) are all averaging over 80 minutes per match.

LONE STAR DOMINANCE

With their win against North Texas on September 20, the Aggies improved to 24-0-5 (.914) mark against in-state rivals since 2008, including an 11-0-4 record against their former Big 12 Conference colleagues. This season, A&M is 3-0-0 against teams from Texas, toppling Rice 4-2 in the season opener and Abilene Christian, 4-1, on September 6, in addition to the North Texas victory. Last season, A&M went 2-0-0 against Lone Star foe, dropping Stephen F. Austin, 1-0, on August 24 and Houston Baptist, 5-0, in the NCAA Championship first round.

SUCCESSFUL SENIORS

Janae Cousineau, Kristi Leonard and Karlie Mueller represent one of the winningest active senior classes in the nation. The trio have enjoyed a record of 69-16-5 over their four years, the third-best win total in the nation. Florida State's seniors are 75-8-5, followed by Virginia 72-9-4.

NIP-AND-TUCK

Over the last three seasons, the Aggies are 24-6-4 in games decided by one game or less. This season, the Maroon and White are 3-2-0 in games decided by one goal or less. Last season, Texas A&M went 11-2-2 in one-goal games, including a pair of 2-1 victories in their run to the College Cup. The Aggies went 10-2-2 in the nail-biters in 2012, including all three of their wins en route to winning their first-ever SEC Tournament title.
