WHAT TO WATCH FOR: #TAMUvsKSU

Texas A&M will face old Big 12 rival Kansas State in the 2016 edition of the Advocare V100 Texas Bowl on Dec. 28 at NRG Stadium.

- Fifth-year Aggie head coach Kevin Sumlin will be seeking his fourth bowl victory, which would be the most in program history. He is currently tied with R.C. Slocum, who won three from 1989-2002.
- Texas A&M will be playing in a bowl game for the eighth straight season, which is the longest streak of bowl appearances in program history.
- Texas A&M will be facing a Big 12 opponent in a bowl game for the third time since leaving the league for the SEC after the 2011 season. The Aggies are 2-0 in those games with wins over Oklahoma in the 2013 Cotton Bowl and West Virginia in the 2014 Liberty Bowl.
- Although the Aggies lead the all-time series between the schools (8-7), Texas A&M will be seeking to snap a three-game losing streak to the Wildcats.
- A Texas A&M victory would give head coach Kevin Sumlin his third nine-win season in five seasons in Aggieland.
- Texas A&M is one of 12 FBS teams with at least eight wins in the last five seasons. The others are Alabama, Boise State, BYU, Clemson, Florida State, Louisville, Navy, Ohio State, Oklahoma, Stanford and Wisconsin.
- The Aggies are 14-2 on artificial turf under Sumlin, including a 6-0 record in domed stadiums.

MILESTONES ACHIEVED OR ON THE HORIZON

- Sophomore WR Christian Kirk needs three catches to become the first Aggie to post multiple 80-catch seasons. He needs 158 receiving yards to join 2013 All-American Mike Evans as the only Aggies with multiple 1,000-yard seasons.

- RB Trayveon Williams became the first true freshman to reach the 1,000-yard plateau in season rushing yards in program. He hit the milestone on a 33-yard TD run vs. LSU enters the bowl game with 1,024 yards.
- Graduate QB Trevor Knight is the fifth QB in school history to rush for 500+ yards and pass for 2,000+ yards in a season (Others are Johnny Manziel, Jerrod Johnson, Reggie McNeal and Stephen McGee).
- Junior DE Myles Garrett is 1.5 QB sacks away from becoming the second player in SEC history to reach double digits in the first three seasons of his career.
- Senior WR Josh Reynolds will be seeking a TD catch in his eighth straight game, which is already a school record. Reynolds is already the first Aggie with multiple double-digit receiving TD seasons (13 in 2014 and 10 in 2016).
- Junior punter Shane Tripucka already owns A&M's single school record with 28 inside-the-20 punts. The old record was 22 shared by Drew Kaser and Cody Scates.
- Sophomore PK Daniel LaCamera became the fifth Texas A&M place kicker to score 100 points in a season. LaCamera has connected on 67-of-73 total placekicks (.918) -- 17-23 on FGs and 50-50 on PATs. With three more FGs, LaCamera would become the fourth PK in school history to connect on 20 in a season.
- Texas A&M is four successful PATs away from reaching 200 straight extra points made. The Aggies have connected on 196 consecutive extra points dating back to 2013, which is easily the longest streak in school history. The NCAA record is 262 straight by Syracuse from 1978-89.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Texas A&M has compiled a 21-9 record in games away from Kyle Field (road and neutral site games) during the Kevin Sumlin era.
- The Aggies are 7-1 at neutral sites and 14-8 in true road games.
- Texas A&M has at least one win over AP Top 25 opponents away from Kyle Field in all five seasons under Sumlin.

- Senior QB Trevor Knight received the prestigious Wuerffel Trophy, which is considered "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service."
- Junior DE Myles Garrett remains a finalist for the 2016 Rotary Lombardi Award, along with Alabama DE Jonathan Allen, Louisville QB Lamar Jackson and Michigan LB Jabrill Peppers. The winner will be announced in Houston on Feb. 11. Garrett was also a Lombardi finalist in 2015.
- Garrett was invited to the 2016 Home Depot College Football Awards in Atlanta as a finalist for the Bednarik Award (defensive player of the year).
- Additionally, Knight and Garrett were Maxwell Award semifinalists; Knight was a Davey O'Brien and Johnny Unitas Golden Arm semifinalist; WR Christian Kirk was a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award; and DB Justin Evans was a Thorpe Award semifinalist.

ALL-AMERICANS

- Junior DE Myles Garrett became the ninth unanimous All-American in school history, joining former Texas A&M greats John Kimbrough (1940), John David Crow (1957), Ed Simonini (1975), Robert Jackson (1976), Marcus Buckley (1992), Dat Nguyen (1998), Luke Joeckel (2012) and Jake Matthews (2013).
- Garrett was named to the teams selected by the American Football Coaches Association, Associated Press, Football Writers Association of America, The Sporting News and Walter Camp Foundation among others.
- Sophomore WR Christian Kirk was named to the FWAA's second team as punt returner and the AP's third team as all-purpose player.
- Freshman RB Trayveon Williams was named to ESPN's True Freshman All-America team and Campus Insiders Freshman All-America team.

ALL-SEC

- Earning All-SEC honors from the league head coaches were Kirk (as wide receiver, all-purpose and return specialist), Garrett and senior offensive tackle Avery Gensy on the first team, and senior safety Justin Evans on the second team.

TEAM, KIRK CHASING HISTORY

Sophomore WR Christian Kirk is the NCAA's active career leader in punt return average by more than seven yards per attempt and is within shouting distance of multiple SEC and NCAA punt return records.

As a team, Texas A&M is averaging 28.6 per punt return on 12 returns in 2016. The season NCAA record for a team (with a minimum of 15 returns) is 25.22 by Arizona State in 1952.

- Kirk has three punt return TDs in 2016, which puts him two away from the NCAA FBS season record of five originally set by Chad Owens of Hawaii in 2004 and matched by Ryan Switzer of UNC in 2013.
- Kirk has five career punt return TDs in 25 career games. Texas Tech's Wes Welker and Oklahoma's Antonio Perkins share the NCAA FBS record of eight.
- In the SEC record book, Kirk has already matched the single-game record of two PR TDs (shared by nine other players) ... He needs one more PR TD to match the SEC season record of 4 by three players (most recently by Alabama's Cyrus Jones in 2015) ... He needs two to match the SEC career record of seven by Alabama's Javier Arenas (2006-09).
- Kirk is averaging 24.5 yards on 11 returns in 2016. The SEC season record (minimum of 10 returns) is 26.7 by Florida's Hal Griffin in 1947.

THE CHAVIS EFFECT

Veteran SEC defensive coordinator John Chavis was hired at Texas A&M prior to the 2015 season and his influence on the Aggies' defense has been undeniable, especially run defense, pass efficiency defense and takeaways.

RUN-GAME RENAISSANCE

A year after ranking No. 66 nationally with a 169.1 rushing average (4.4/carry), Texas A&M has improved its rushing attack by nearly 50 yards/game and 1.4 yards/carry.

- The Aggies' 2016 12-game rushing total of 2,610 yards is already the fourth-highest total by Texas A&M in last 20 seasons.
- With 27 rushing touchdowns in 2016, the Aggies have more than doubled last year's 13-game total (13).
- Texas A&M ranks No. 6 in the SEC and No. 33 in the FBS with a 217.5 rushing average and averages 5.7 per carry.
- The Aggies has rushed for 200+ yards in seven of 12 games in 2016, and has had two games over 350 yards against SEC opponents (366 vs. ARK, 353 vs. TENN).

Junior DE **Myles Garrett** is, arguably, the nation's most feared pass rusher.

- Garrett is the ninth unanimous first-team All-American in program history.
- Appeared healthy for the first time in over a month in game 11 vs. UTSA when he flirted with the single game record for sacks with 4.5 and also chipped in a forced fumble.
- Active sack leader in FBS with 32.5 sacks and is one of just eight SEC players ever to reach the 30-sack plateau.

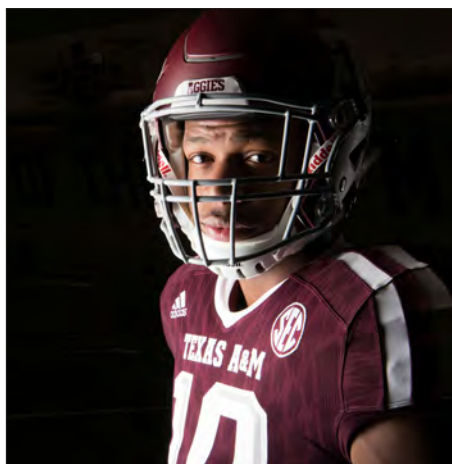
One of the keys to Texas A&M's 2016 improvement on defense has been the continued development and leadership by senior LB Shaan Washington.

HALL'S GROWTH

While developing into one of the nation's top DEs, senior DE Daeshon Hall has gained nearly 60 pounds since coming to campus on his recruiting visit.

- Hall came to Texas A&M on his recruiting visit in 2013 as a 208-pound "basketball player," according to head coach Kevin Sumlin. He has bulked up to 270 pounds as a senior.
- Hall's nickname is "Dae Dae."
- Hall moved from Seattle, Wash., to Lancaster, Texas in high school. His high school coach Chris Gilbert got his first glimpse of Hall playing basketball. "He was just like hammering dunks," Gilbert said. "He was a little thin, but I could tell he was strong. He said, 'Coach, I love basketball but everybody tells me they think I can play on Sundays, and I think I can.'" (Dallas Morning News, Sept. 12, 2014)
- Hall's four-sack effort vs. Arizona State in 2015 tied for second-most in a single game in school history, trailing only the five-sack performance by Alex Morris vs. Houston in 1987. Hall matched the sack total of three first-team All-Americans: Jacob Green, Ray Childress and John Roper.
- Teams with Myles Garrett to give the Aggies one of the nation's top defensive ends combos.
- Garrett said of the pair's friendly competition to get to the quarterback, "It's a race to get to the quarterback every time."



BIG PLAY ABILITY

Junior FS Armani Watts is one of an elite few SEC players to have registered at least one QB sack, tackle for loss, QB hurry, interception, pass breakup, forced fumble and recovered fumble this season.

- Despite missing three games in 2016, including the final two of the regular season, Watts' stat line reads: 56 tackles (36 solo), 6.0 TFL, 1.0 QBS, 2 INT, 3 PBU, 1 QBH, 2 RF, 3 FF.
- Had the game-winning INT of Tennessee's Josh Dobbs in the Aggies' epic overtime win over the Volunteers.
- Earned SEC Defensive Player the Week after the Aggies' 2016 win over Arkansas. He posted a pair of game-changing plays with a strip and fumble recovery at the goal line and a fourth-down TFL vs. ARK.
- A consensus 4-star recruit out of North Forney HS, Watts earned all-state honors at safety and was an all-district pick on offense and defense and as a return man.

RECORD-SETTING REYNOLDS

Senior Josh Reynolds is the only player in Texas A&M and SEC history and FBS's only active player with two 90-yard plus catches -- a 95-yarder vs. Vanderbilt in 2015 and a 92-yard vs. Arkansas in 2016.

- Prior to Reynolds, the last FBS player with two 90-yard catches in a career was Clemson's Sammy Watkins.
- Reynolds is the SEC's leading active receiving TD producer with 28 since 2014.
- Reynolds had made at least one TD catch in a school-record seven straight games.
- Overlooked by FBS programs out of HS, Reynolds went to Tyler JC as a full qualifier and then transferred to A&M with three years of eligibility in 2014. The FB coaching staff was tipped off to Reynolds by TAMU T&F coach Pat Henry, who had recruited Reynolds as a high jumper.
- Reynolds' younger brother, Moses, is a true freshman DB for the Aggies.

- Texas A&M defensive coordinator John Chavis says of Wilson, "We need that catalyst and he's been that catalyst force. He's made big play after big play. (Former LSU All-American Tyrann Mathieu) had the 'it' factor. We're starting to see some of that with Donovan." (Bryan-College Station Eagle, Oct. 7, 2015)
- One of the reasons for the Aggies' heavy use of the nickel defensive package is because the coaching staff wants to keep Wilson's play-making abilities on the field.
- Versatility allows him to excel at nickel, safety and cornerback.
- A late addition to the Aggies' 2014 signing class, Wilson led the Shreveport, La., area with 13 interceptions while earning All-City Defensive POY (Shreveport Times) and Louisiana Class 4A all-state honors.

TOUGH MATCHUP

At 6-foot-5 and 240 pounds, junior WR Ricky Seals-Jones ranks as one of the toughest matchups for defensive backs in the nation.

- Seals-Jones missed the SC and UT games due to injury, but returned vs. ALA. Had his best game since returning to action vs. UTSA with six catches for 75 yards.
- Seals-Jones has been consistently praised as one of the team's top blockers on the perimeter.
- Seals-Jones was the team's third-leading receiver the past two seasons with 49 catches in 2014 and 45 in 2015.
- His receptions single game high is 10 catches vs. Mississippi State in 2014, which ranks as one of five double-digit catch games by a freshman.
- RSJ played in two games as a true freshman in 2013 before suffering a season-ending injury. In his first career game, Seals-Jones reeled off a 71-yard TD catch and run against Rice that remains his career long.
- The early-season showdown of future Texas A&M signees Seals-Jones of Sealy HS and QB Kohl Stewart of St. Pius in 2012 was the first destination of the "Swag-copter" when head coach Kevin Sumlin used a helicopter to get from College Station to St. Pius' Parsley Field in Houston.

CAPTAIN KIRK

Sophomore WR/RS Christian Kirk leads the SEC with 77 catches and he has a school-record five TD punt returns on just 25 career tries.

- Used as a rusher, receiver and return man and averages 13.0 yards per touch, which ranks sixth-highest in the SEC.
- Became the first Aggie to post two punt return TDs in same game vs. NMSU (70 and 73 yards).
- Kirk, USC's Adoree' Jackson and Washington's Dante Pettis are the only FBS players with multiple PR TDs the past two seasons.
- Among his 25 career punt returns are five TD and six 50-yard plus returns.
- His career PR average of 24.4 is the best among active FBS players (minimum: 24 returns).
- Kirk posted a career-high 12 catches vs. South Carolina.
- A consensus 5-star recruit out of Saguaro HS in Scottsdale, Ariz., Kirk was an early enrollee in January of 2015.

Graduate transfer Trevor Knight suffered a shoulder injury against MSU and missed the ensuing two games (Ole Miss, UTSA) before returning for the regular season finale vs. LSU.

- Winner of the Wuerffel Trophy, which is the "Premier Award for Community Service." Knight helped spearhead the Aggies' humanitarian trip to Haiti last summer, and had made previous trips to the impoverished nation while at OU.
- Named Midseason National Offensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com. Also, semifinalist for Davey O'Brien Award.
- Knight joined the Aggies in January as a graduate transfer after playing three seasons at the University of Oklahoma.
- Established career highs in total offense (422 vs. PVAMU) and rushing yards (157 vs. ARK).
- Named Davey O'Brien National QB of the Week and Earl Campbell Tyler Rose POTW after rushing for 157/2 TDs and passing for 225/2 TDs in win over ARK (9/24).
- At OU, Knight started 15 games, including two bowl games.
- Knight's stats at OU were 3,424 passing yards/25 TDs and 852 rushing yards/8 TDs. He was named the MVP of OU's 2014 Sugar Bowl win over Alabama after connecting on 32-of-44 passes for 348 yards and four TDs.
- His fraternal twin brother, Connor, is a senior fullback for the Sooners.
- Knight earned his bachelor's degree in finance at OU and is pursuing his master's degree in management at Texas A&M.

- With 217 rushing yards against UT, Williams became the first Aggie true freshman to surpass the 200 rushing yards plateau. His 89-yard sprint vs. AUB was the second-longest by a freshman in A&M history.
- Was an early enrollee at Texas A&M in January 2016. A four-star recruit, Williams rushed for nearly 4,000 yards and 40 touchdowns his final two seasons.

- Five-star recruit from Cypress Ranch HS near Houston after rushing for 1,868 yards and 24 TDs as a senior.

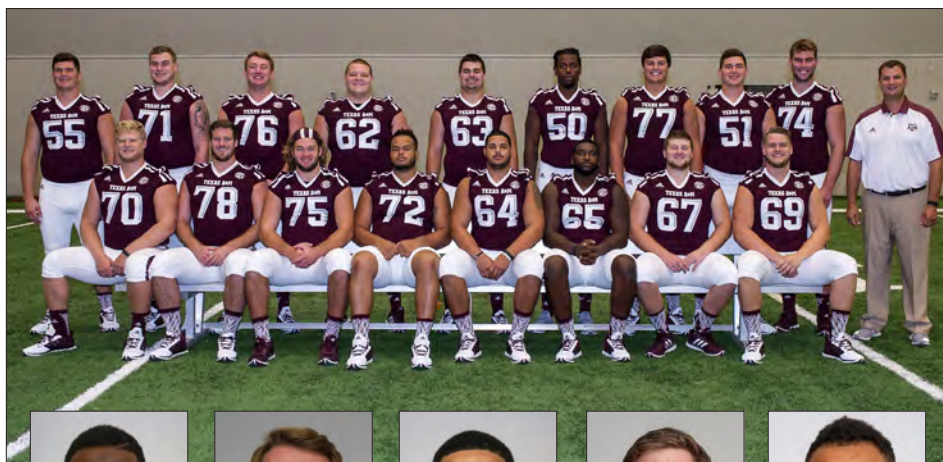

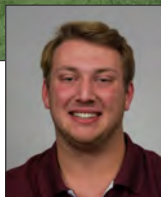

2014 Liberty Bowl Defensive MVP Otar Alaka is back in action in 2016 after taking a redshirt season in 2015 due to an injury.

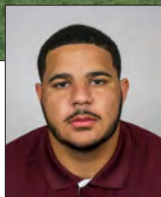
- Has started every game in 2016 at middle linebacker and ranks third on the team in tackles, second among linebackers.

Goon Facts

- Texas A&M has produced a NFL first-round pick at offensive tackle for the past four seasons -- Luke Joeckel in 2013, Jake Matthews in 2014, Cedric Ogbuehi in 2015 and Germain Ifedi in 2016.
- Easily the most experienced Goon, senior LT Avery Gennessee started all 13 games in 2015 and has 24 career starts.
- Entering 2016, RT Jermaine Eluemenor was the only other Goon with starting experience -- he started one game at guard in 2015 (bowl game vs. Louisville).

- Eluemenor is nicknamed "London" because he grew up in London, England before moving to New Jersey as a teen.
- Eluemenor was the "hot chicken eating" champion at last year's Music City Bowl in Nashville, Tenn.
- The Aggies have rushed for 200+ yards in seven games, including 366 vs. ARK which was the most against a SEC opponent since joining the league.
- Texas A&M hadn't rushed for 200+ yards in the first six games of a season since the days of Emory Bellard's famed Wishbone offense with Bubba Bean and George "Big Woo" Woodard in 1975.
- The first Goon off the bench has been 305-pound swing tackle Koda Martin, who has made a pair of starts at RT in 2016 and came in for an injured Gennessee against UCLA.
- Martin has also seen action as tight end.
- The Aggies lost eight-game RG starter Connor Lanfear to a knee injury in the Mississippi State game.



READY WHEN CALLED

Junior QB Jake Hubenak started vs. Ole Miss and UTSA after regular starter Trevor Knight suffered a shoulder injury on Nov. 5 vs. Mississippi.

- Won his first game as a starter last week vs. UTSA, while completing 19-of-32 passes for 248 yards and a TD.
- Hubenak also started the Music City Bowl against Louisville last year and passed for 307 yards and two touchdowns on 28-of-48 passing.
- A late addition to the Aggies' 2015 signing class, Hubenak joined the roster in June after a spectacular freshman season at Blinn JC in nearby Brenham, Texas.
- Hubenak led the NJCAA with more than 4,000 passing yards as a redshirt freshman in 2014. He completed 216-of-333 passes (64.9 percent) for 4,052 yards and 47 touchdowns against only nine pickoffs in eight games of action.
- Hubenak was teammates with fellow signee Damion Ratley at Blinn. Ratley caught 20 touchdown passes for the Buccaneers with Hubenak at QB.
- He redshirted as a walk-on at Oklahoma State in 2013.
- Prior to walking on at OSU, Hubenak was All-Central Texas Player of the Year by the Austin American-Statesman, Class 4A Player of the Year, all-state and district MVP at Georgetown HS ... led the team to a 19-1 record as a starter, with his lone loss coming in the state championship game, where he threw for 318 yards, three touchdowns and rushed for 60 yards ... threw for 4,108 yards and 48 touchdowns as a senior ... he missed most of his junior season due to injury.

- Kevin Sumlin enters his fifth season at Texas A&M in 2016. His 36 wins (36-16 record) after his first four seasons marked the second-fastest coaching start in school history behind R.C. Slocum's 39 wins from 1989-92.
- Sumlin ranks as just the second Texas A&M head coach to lead the Aggies to at least eight wins in his each of his first five years.
- Sumlin's record against non-conference teams ranked in the AP Top 25 is a perfect 5-0 (wins over No. 22 Louisiana Tech and No. 11 Oklahoma in 2012, No. 22 Duke in 2013, No. 15 Arizona State in 2015 and No. 16 UCLA in 2016).
- Sumlin's 12 wins against AP Top 25 opponents rank No. 2 among Texas A&M head coaches in school history. Slocum leads the list with 17 wins vs. ranked opponents.
- Sumlin was the first Texas A&M coach to win three straight bowl games (2012-14). His three bowl wins match the most by a Texas A&M head coach (Slocum had three from 1989-2002). He was the second head coach in program history to take his first four squads to a bowl game.
- Sumlin was the 2012 SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press and the SEC Co-Coach of the Year by the league head coaches.
- Sumlin was a 2009, 2011 and 2012 Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year finalist, and a AFCA Coach of the Year finalist in 2011.
- Sumlin was hired at Texas A&M on Dec. 10, 2011 after four highly successful seasons as head coach at the University of Houston.
- He compiled a 35-17 record at UH, and led the Cougars to three bowl games in his four seasons.
- He earned his degree in Criminology and Criminal Justice from Purdue University in 1988. Sumlin was a standout linebacker for the Boilermakers from 1983-86.
- Sumlin served as an assistant coach at Texas A&M from 2001-02. Was hired as assistant head coach and wide receivers coach, and he added offensive coordinator to his responsibilities early in the 2002 season after the offense struggled early in the season. With Sumlin calling the plays, the Aggie offense flourished, averaging 33.0 points and 419 yards per game for the remainder of the season after posting just 16.0 points and 286 yards per game previously. A highlight of the season included a 30-26 win over top-ranked Oklahoma with the Aggies gaining 404 total yards to key the victory.
- Other assistant coaching stops for Sumlin include: Oklahoma (2003-07), Purdue (1998-2000), Minnesota (1993-97) and Wyoming (1991-92). He got his coaching start as a graduate assistant at Washington State from 1989-90.
- Sumlin is a native of Indianapolis, Ind., and attended high school at Brebeuf Jesuit Prep. He was born Aug. 3, 1964, in Brewton, Ala.

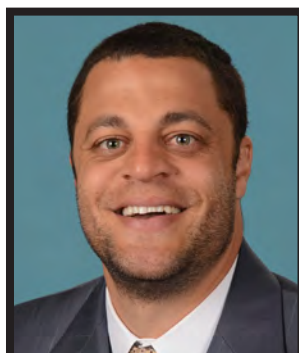

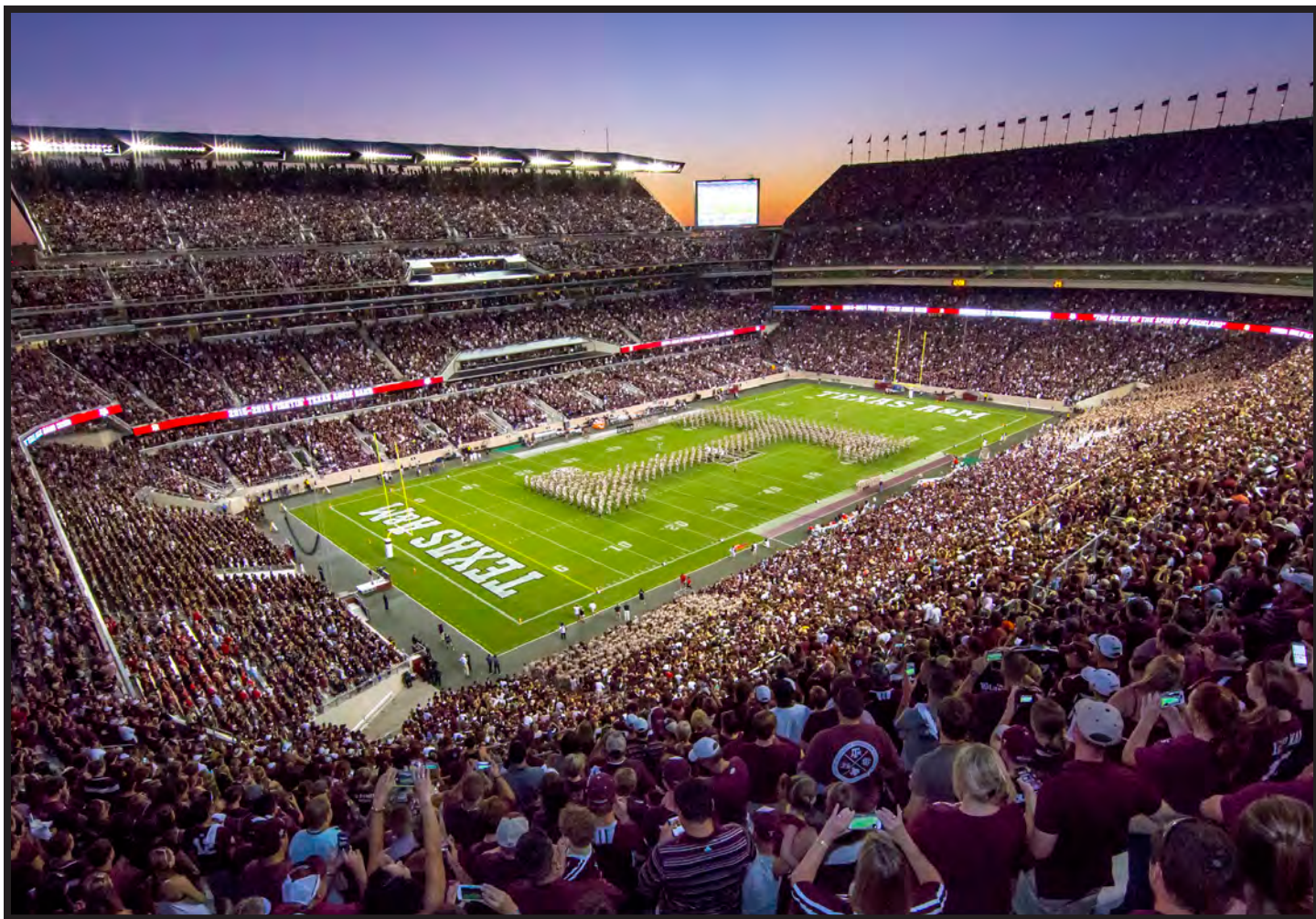

- Home of the Aggies since 1905. Stadium built in 1927 and the horseshoe enclosed in 1929.
- Capacity: 102,733
- Stadium record crowd is 110,633 (A&M vs. Ole Miss, 10/11/2014).
- Kyle Field is named for former A&M Dean of Agriculture Edwin Jackson Kyle, who donated a 400 x 400-foot area of the southern edge of campus that had been assigned to him for horticultural experiments. It became the home of the Aggies.
- Texas A&M just finished a \$485 million re-development of Kyle Field that makes the Home of the 12th Man the largest football stadium in the SEC and the state of Texas.
- Texas A&M has led the SEC in home attendance the past two seasons, with an average of 105,122 in 2014 and 103,622 in 2015.

Texas A&M's 2016 attendance at Kyle Field surpassed the 700,000 level for the second straight year with 713,418 fans attending seven home games.

The Bruins were driving again after a third straight punt by A&M when Evans intercepted Rosen's pass for the second time to give A&M a chance to win it in regulation.

But Knight's pass was knocked down in the end zone to force overtime.

Knight wasn't the only former Sooner to shine for the Aggies on Saturday. Running back Keith Ford had a touchdown and 65 of A&M's 203 yards rushing in his first game since setting out a year following his transfer from Oklahoma.

Texas A&M kept its hopes of a higher division finish firmly intact with a 478-yard offensive performance. Freshman Trayveon Williams weaved through Auburn defenders for an icing-on-the-cake 89-yard touchdown run with 6:52 left and gained 127 yards on eight carries.

The Aggies are 3-0 for the third straight year, a run they haven't had since 1939-41.

Knight kept the Aggies moving even if though they struggled to find the end zone. He completed 20 of 40 passes but led one 92-yard drive in the first half and another march for three points in the fourth quarter.

Auburn couldn't cash in on defensive stops with any points in the third quarter.

Auburn drove deep into Texas A&M territory with runs by speedy backup quarterback John Franklin III and hard running Kamryn Pettway. Then Daeshon Hall stuffed Franklin behind the line on fourth down from the 12. Williams put it away with his sprint to the end zone, though Franklin did lead an Auburn scoring drive in the final minutes.

Knight gave Texas A&M a 16-7 first-half lead with the long second-quarter drive. He completed all four attempts for 86 yards, including a dead-on 51-yard strike to Josh Reynolds. That set up Reynolds' 5-yard touchdown catch.

LaCamera had kicks of 46, 35, 31, 37 and 26 yards.

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) -- The momentum quickly turned for 10th-ranked Texas A&M when Trevor Knight, the quarterback already with two long touchdown runs, had another big play right after a huge defensive stand by the Aggies.

Knight hit Josh Reynolds for a 92-yard tiebreaking TD pass two plays after 17th-ranked Arkansas was stopped three times from the 1, ending a 19-play drive that took nearly 10 minutes, and the Aggies went on to a 45-24 victory late Saturday night.

Reynolds caught the ball in stride just short of midfield and quickly shed defensive back DJ Dean on his way to the end zone to break a 17-all tie and put the Aggies (4-0, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) ahead to stay.

Texas A&M has won five straight against the Razorbacks (3-1, 0-1), all since joining the SEC in 2012.

The long catch-and-run by Reynolds came two plays after Keon Hatcher was tackled by Armani Watts for a 5-yard loss on fourth down, ending the drive that started after A&M fumbled from the Arkansas 2.

Quarterback Austin Allen was stopped twice from the 1, though officials reviewed the third-down run before ruling the play stood. One overhead replay showed just how close the ball was to the goal line, with Allen's tight end basically pulling him toward the end zone.

Earlier, the Razorbacks had to settle for a field goal after six snaps from the 2 on the same series.

Knight's 48-yard TD run just before halftime tied the game at 17, after an earlier 42-yard scoring run. He finished with 10 rushes for 159 yards, the last a 62-yarder on third down in the final minute of the game.

COLUMBIA, S.C. -- Trevor Knight threw for 206 yards and ran for 84 more, leading No. 9 Texas A&M to a 24-13 win over South Carolina on Saturday.

Knight also had a fumble and an interception that kept this one close. But the Aggies (5-0, 3-0 Southeastern) used a tight defense to win this one, tackling the Gamecocks (2-3, 1-3) for losses on 10 plays and keeping them out of the end zone after A.J. Turner's 75-yard touchdown run on South Carolina's first play from scrimmage.

Knight came in second in the SEC in total offense, and either threw the ball or ran it on 52 of Texas A&M's 79 plays. Trayveon Williams and James White each ran for a touchdown for the Aggies. The SEC's best rushing team had 216 yards on the ground.

Four starters were out for Texas A&M, including last year's SEC sack leader Myles Garrett, two receivers in Speedy Noil and Ricky Seals-Jones and right tackle Jermaine Eluemunor and the Aggies were away from home for a third straight game. Coach Kevin Sumlin said he told them if they weren't careful, this could be a trap and the touchdown on the opening play could have spiraled things out of control.

The Gamecocks had chances to end their six-game losing streak to ranked opponents, but kicker Elliot Fry missed two field goals and Jamarcus King fumbled a punt with 3:12 left in the game.

Knight threw for 239 yards and two touchdowns and ran for 110 yards and three more scores.

The Volunteers (5-1, 2-1 Southeastern Conference) had rallied from double-digit deficits to win four of their last five games, including last week's last-play victory over Georgia. They trailed by 21 points in the third quarter Saturday thanks to six turnovers before tying it on Alvin Kamara's 18-yard touchdown reception with 41 seconds left.

Texas A&M (6-0, 4-0) had a chance to win it in regulation, but Daniel LaCamera's 38-yard field goal attempt sailed wide left.

The Aggies could have put this one away with less than 2 minutes remaining, but freshman Trayveon Williams had the ball knocked from his hands and out of the back of the end zone just before he crossed the goal line on a 71-yard run.

Texas A&M was facing third-and-2 when Knight dashed 62 yards for a touchdown that pushed the lead to 35-21 with about three minutes left. Kamara's 4-yard run about a minute later made it a one-score game.

The Aggies built a 21-7 lead in the first quarter after three fumbles by Tennessee. Knight threw touchdown passes of 13 and 2 yards and had a 7-yard TD run in the opening frame.

Allen, a lineman, scooped up the ball after Ryan Anderson knocked it loose from Keith Ford to finally build a cushion over the Aggies (6-1, 4-1), who led 14-13 well into the third.

It was 20-14 when Allen extended Alabama's streak to 10 games with a score on defense or special teams, half the duration of a winning streak now at 20 going into an open date.

Alabama's freshman quarterback Jalen Hurts then galloped 37 yards for another score, stepping out of a defender's grasp and making a nifty move to get past another. The Tide was rolling again, a powerful encore to easy wins over ranked Tennessee and Arkansas teams.

The Aggies seemed likely to put up the biggest fight, with a defense that kept the pressure on Hurts and a handful of big runs by quarterback Trevor Knight. Then Allen and Anderson changed that in an instant.

The Tide defense sustained a big loss when safety Eddie Jackson was injured on a late punt return. Coach Nick Saban said Jackson, a senior, is out for the season with a broken leg.

Alabama racked up five sacks of Knight, who had engineered Oklahoma's Sugar Bowl upset of Alabama as a redshirt freshman with a 348-yard, four-touchdown performance. He passed for 164 and ran for 24 in the semi-rematch.

Hurts passed for 166 yards and rushed for 93 more, throwing for a pair of touchdowns while getting intercepted twice. Damien Harris rushed 17 times for 126 yards.

Trevor Knight found Kirk on a 3-yard reception in the corner of the end zone in the second quarter to leave Texas A&M up 24-0.

Texas A&M was up by 28 points early in the third quarter when Kirk added his second return score to make it 38-3. Knight was replaced by backup Jake Hubenak not long after that, and most of A&M's starters were soon on the bench.

Tyler Rogers threw for 138 yards and a touchdown and ran for 40 yards for New Mexico State (2-6).

STARKVILLE, Miss. (AP) -- Nick Fitzgerald ran for 182 yards and two touchdowns, Aerie Williams ran for a career-high 140 yards and Mississippi State used a dominant ground game to upset No. 7 Texas A&M 35-28 on Saturday.

It was a stunning win for Mississippi State (4-5, 2-3 Southeastern Conference), which was coming off an uninspiring 56-41 win over lower-level Samford. The Bulldogs had lost their previous three games against FBS competition.

It was an equally stunning loss for Texas A&M. The Aggies were ranked No. 4 in the first College Football Playoff rankings released on Tuesday, but will now almost certainly tumble out of contention.

Mississippi State finished with 365 yards rushing. The Bulldogs' biggest drive was a grinding 14-play, 73-yard push in the fourth quarter that ended with Fitzgerald running for a 4-yard touchdown for a 35-21 lead. Mississippi State ran 10 straight running plays at one point in the drive.

Fitzgerald was 18 of 31 passing for 209 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions.

Texas A&M (7-2, 4-2) not only lost the game, but possibly its starting quarterback. Trevor Knight was knocked out of the game in the second quarter with an apparent right shoulder injury and didn't return.

Knight wasn't very effective when he was playing, completing just 5 of 14 passes for 43 yards. He also ran for 54 yards and a touchdown.

Mississippi State took a 28-7 lead late in the second quarter after Fitzgerald's 7-yard touchdown pass to Ross, but Texas A&M responded with Christian Kirk's 93-yard punt return for a touchdown to pull within 28-14 by halftime.

Knight's backup Jake Hubenak threw a 54-yard touchdown pass to Kirk early in the fourth quarter to pull Texas A&M within 28-21. Hubenak added a 4-yard touchdown pass to Josh Reynolds with 1:33 left, but the Aggies couldn't get enough momentum to overtake Mississippi State.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Shea Patterson threw for 338 yards and two touchdowns in his debut and Gary Wunderlich made a 39-yard field goal with 37 seconds left to lift Mississippi past No. 10 Texas A&M, 29-28 on Saturday night.

The Rebels pulled the redshirt off Patterson, the highly regarded recruit, to start in place of Chad Kelly, who suffered a season-ending knee injury last week.

Mississippi (5-5, 2-4 Southeastern Conference) trailed by 15 entering the fourth quarter before Patterson got going.

A 13-yard touchdown reception by Josh Reynolds put A&M up 28-19. Patterson then connected with Van Jefferson on a 32-yard reception for his second TD pass of the quarter to cut the lead to 28-26 with 5:17 remaining.

A&M (7-3, 4-3) had to punt and Patterson moved the offense into position for Wunderlich's game-winning field goal.

The Aggies had a chance to win it late, but Jake Hubenak was intercepted by Deontay Anderson to secure the victory. Hubenak was making his first start this season in place of Trevor Knight, who injured his shoulder last week.

Early in the fourth quarter Patterson looked like he was channeling A&M Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Manziel when he scrambled to one side, avoided the rush and ran the other way before launching a 6-yard touchdown pass to Damoreea Stringfellow to get Ole Miss within 21-13.

On their next drive Stringfellow reached out with his right hand and tipped the ball with his fingertips before reeling it in with one hand for an eye-popping 40-yard reception. Akeem Judd's 21-yard run made it 21-19, but the two-point conversion failed.

The Aggies led 21-6 at halftime thanks to two touchdown runs by Keith Ford.

The Rebels had turnovers on their first two possessions of the second half, but Texas A&M couldn't convert either of them into points. Patterson threw an interception on the first one and Jason Pellerin was sacked and fumbled after that.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Jake Hubenak threw for 248 yards and a touchdown and Myles Garrett had 4 1/2 sacks to help No. 23 Texas A&M get back on track with a 23-10 win over UTSA on Saturday.

The Aggies (8-3) were in desperate need of a victory after consecutive losses to Mississippi State and Mississippi ruined their shot at the College Football Playoff.

The Roadrunners cut the lead to 3 points early in the second quarter after a one-handed touchdown grab by Josh Stewart. The Aggies then scored the next 13 points, capped by a 47 yard run by Trayveon Williams to make it 23-7 in the third quarter.

UTSA (5-6) was led by Jared Johnson, who threw for 186 yards and a touchdown.

Garrett was finally healthy after missing two games and being limited in several others because of a high ankle sprain. Garrett finished with eight tackles, broke up a pass and forced a fumble. Instead of limping as he has been in recent weeks, Garrett was harassing UTSA's two quarterbacks all game.

He further showed his ankle is fine when he batted down a pass in the second quarter and celebrated with a spirited dance. He had another big play in the fourth quarter when he sacked Johnson to force a fumble, which A&M recovered.

Garrett has 8 1/2 sacks this season to give him 32 1/2 for his career, making him the eighth player in Southeastern Conference history with at least 30 career sacks.

Josh Reynolds caught a 16-yard touchdown pass in the first quarter and finished with 93 yards receiving. Williams had 11 carries for 80 yards to leave him 44 yards shy of becoming the first true freshman at the school to rush for 1,000 yards.

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (AP) -- Derrius Guice ran for a school-record 285 yards with four touchdowns and Danny Etling threw for 324 yards and two scores to give short-handed No. 25 LSU a 54-39 victory over No. 22 Texas A&M on Thursday night.

The Tigers were playing without star running back Leonard Fournette and leading tackler Kendell Beckwith because of injuries. But Guice and Etling did plenty to allow LSU (7-4, 5-3 SEC) to handle Texas A&M, and gave the Tigers a 300-yard passer and a 200-yard rusher in the same game for the first time in school history.

While LSU wasn't at full strength, the Aggies (8-4, 4-4) were the healthiest they've been in weeks, with defensive end Myles Garrett over an ankle injury and quarterback Trevor Knight back from a shoulder injury. Knight made an unexpected return after missing the last two games with the injury. Coach Kevin Sumlin said days after he was injured that he would miss the remainder of the regular season but would return for A&M's bowl game. Instead he returned to throw for 211 yards and three touchdowns before leaving the game late in the fourth quarter with what looked to be a knee injury.

The Aggies cut the lead to 10 with a field goal on the opening drive of the second half, but soon Guice was at work again. His second 45-yard touchdown run came on LSU's next drive to extend the lead to 27-10. Texas A&M failed to convert on fourth-and-4 to give the Tigers the ball back and Guice got to the end zone again, this time on a 6-yard run, to make it 34-10.

Texas A&M cut to deficit with touchdowns three times after that, but each time LSU responded with TDs of its own to keep the game out of reach.

Guice, who had 37 carries, had 65 yards rushing on LSU's first possession, highlighted by a 45-yard touchdown run that made it 7-0. The Aggies tied it in the first with a 36-yard touchdown pass from Knight to Christian Kirk.

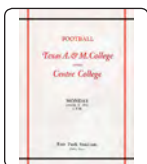

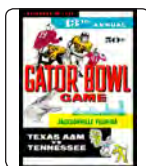

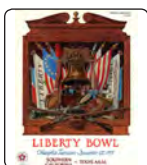

The Irish carried the momentum into the third quarter and took command with a pair of touchdowns, the first on a 26-yard pass from Mirer to Jerome Bettis and the second on a 1-yard run by Bettis.

A&M added a 41-yard field goal by Terry Venetoulis early in the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 21-3, but another touchdown run by Bettis put the game out of reach and handed the Irish a big 28-3 victory.

The Aggies gained just 165 yards of total offense and managed just 11 first downs, while Notre Dame compiled 439 yards of offense and 28 first downs.

Sophomore linebacker Jessie Cox had a big game for the Aggies, posting 17 tackles.

With less than four minutes to play, Notre Dame's Michael Miller returned an Aggie punt 38 yards to the A&M 22-yard line, the longest punt return allowed by A&M all season. The A&M defense held firm, but Notre Dame managed a 31-yard field goal by Kevin Pendergast to end the scoring.

With just :24 left, A&M narrowly missed a miracle comeback when, on fourth-and-17 from the Aggie 41, Corey Pullig completed a 14-yard pass to Tony Harrison, who attempted to lateral to trailing Leeland McElroy. However, the pitch sailed high and was recovered by Notre Dame, who took home an exciting 24-21 victory.

The Aggies outgained the Irish in total offense, 341-311, as Pullig passed for 238 yards.

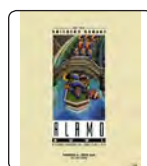

NEW ORLEANS—Ohio State players, coaches and fans came to the Bayou State with one purpose in mind: To ring in 1999 with a Sugar Bowl victory befitting the Big Easy's nickname.

And in the end, the boisterous, cocksure Buckeyes did indeed get their win. But it wasn't by a big margin, and it certainly wasn't easy. The underdog and under-appreciated Texas Aggies gave their Big Ten-champion counterparts far more than they bargained for in front of 76,503 fans at the Louisiana Superdome.

In fact, for 53 minutes and 25 seconds of play, the Aggies did more than enough to make the Buckeye fans sweat out their New Year's Eve hangovers. Unfortunately for A&M, it was that other 6:35 of play that gave OSU fans a reason to revel throughout all corners of the French Quarter.

"We played a great team, and we played pretty well at times," Texas A&M freshman fullback Ja'Mar Toombs said following the Aggies' 24-14 loss. "They were ranked No. 1 for a long time, and there's a reason for that. They're very talented. But I think we proved we are, too. We just got too far behind."

Ohio State (11-1) used two impressive drives and a key blocked punt to score 21 points in a span of 6:35 in the first quarter. That proved to be enough for the Buckeyes to register a hard-fought win. But it wasn't what OSU had envisioned

in the days in weeks leading up to the Sugar Bowl.

The Buckeyes, who spent nine weeks ranked No. 1 in the nation, wanted to destroy the Aggies (11-3) and stake their claim to the national title. That simply wasn't the case, as Texas A&M stood toe-to-toe with Ohio State and frequently had OSU on its heels.

A&M became only the second team this season to hold the Buckeyes to as few as 24 points (Michigan State also held OSU to that total in the Buckeyes' lone loss). And the Aggies became the first team to hold the high-powered Ohio State offense scoreless in the second half.

In other words, it was a struggle for the Buckeyes, not a stroll.

If it wouldn't have been for that little scoring outburst they had, it could have been a whole different ballgame," A&M junior running back Dante Hall said. "But we never panicked, and there in the second half, I kind of thought we might be on the verge of another Kansas State-type comeback."

Even with a convincing 24-7 lead at the intermission, Ohio State coach John Cooper spent plenty of time in the locker room reminding his players about A&M's heroic, late-season comebacks.

"At halftime, we were talking about the Kansas State game," Cooper said of the Big 12 title game in which the Aggies overcame a 15-point fourth-quarter deficit to win in double overtime. "(The Aggies) were getting the second-half kickoff, and we knew what they did in the second half against Kansas State."

Despite the warning, the Buckeyes appeared to be on the verge of buckling several times in the second half. First, A&M quarterback Brannndon Stewart hit Leroy Hodge on a 7-yard scoring pass to cut the lead to 24-14 with 5:24 left in the third quarter.

Then, after stuffing OSU on its next series, A&M drove to as deep as the Ohio State 33, as the Superdome rocked and resembled- in appearance and volume level- Kyle Field with a roof on it.

"We had them on their heels, and this place was going nuts," A&M senior tight end Dan Campbell said. "That's the frustrating thing to me. If we make it 24-21, I really would have liked to have seen (the Superdome) crowd. And I would have liked to have seen how (Ohio State) responded to it."

To the Aggies' chagrin, the Buckeyes never had to deal with that kind of pressure late in the game. A&M's late third-quarter drive into Buckeye territory was halted by a penalty and a sack. Then with the Aggies marching early in the fourth quarter, Stewart's lateral pass to Toombs was recovered by OSU at the Aggies' 48.

That killed a promising A&M drive and effectively ended the Aggies' comeback momentum. Ohio State simply held on the rest of the way to send the Aggies to their fifth-straight New Years Day bowl loss.

"(Ohio State) knew they had been in a war," Campbell said. "That much, I know for sure."

The Buckeyes should have sensed that from the opening kickoff. A&M forced OSU to go three-and-out on its first offensive possession of the game, and then A&M went on an impressive touchdown march. A&M drove 59 yards in six plays, with Hall capping the drive with a 9-yard scoring run to give the Aggies an early 7-0 lead.

Then on OSU's next possession, the Buckeyes faced a third-and-15 at their own 24. But OSU quarterback Joe Germaine completed a 28-yard pass to a wide-open Dee Miller to give the Buckeyes a big first down. Three plays later, Germaine hit Reggie Germany on an 18-yard scoring pass, and OSU's touchdown barrage had officially begun.

If that wasn't the key play of the game, then the blocked punt some six minutes later was. With OSU leading 14-7, Ohio State's Derek Ross blocked Shane Lechler's punt, and Kevin Griffin scooped it up and ran 16 yards for the score to put the Buckeyes up, 21-7. It was the first blocked punt against the Aggies since 1993, and it proved to be devastating.

"That was a significant play," A&M head coach R.C. Slocum said. "Being behind 21-7 is a whole lot different than being behind 14-7. Our team settled down and played a whole lot better in the second half, but it took us too long to get it going."

But unlike most games this year, the Aggies' magic ran out in the end, as a brilliant season met with a bitter end. Still, the Aggies proved all year long- and again in the Sugar Bowl- that they belong on the same center stage with the elite teams of college football.

"It's disappointing to end the season with a loss, but I can't say enough about my team," Slocum said. "We were Big 12 Champions, won 11 games and played eight bowl teams. A loss (in the Sugar Bowl) doesn't take away from a tremendous season."

SAN ANTONIO (AP)—Rashard Casey passed for a touchdown and ran for one as No. 13 Penn State, ending a three-game losing streak that cost it a possible shot at the national title, defeated No. 18 Texas A&M 24-0 in the Alamo Bowl.

"It seemed like a Hollywood script," All-American linebacker LaVar Arrington said after Penn State's first shutout of the season. "It's too bad it's too late to show what we had—but better late than never."

Penn State (10-3) sent longtime defensive coordinator Jerry Sandusky into retirement with a strong performance, holding Texas A&M to just 80 net yards rushing and 122 yards passing.

"We played like a Penn State defense," said Sandusky, the defensive coordinator since 1977. "We bent, but we didn't break, and people made plays in the clutch. That is what did it. And that's symbolic of the way we played so many, many times."

The defense had carried Penn State to a 9-0 start and a No. 2 national ranking, before the team's title hopes were dashed by losses to Minnesota, Michigan and Michigan State.

Penn State avoided what could have been the first four-game losing streak in Joe Paterno's 34-year career as coach.

As the Lions received their Alamo Bowl trophy, Paterno praised his players and the Penn State fans who traveled to Texas.

"It was a great effort by our team, and I'm very, very proud of them," he said. "Let's go get a shower and have fun tonight, guys!"

Penn State jumped to a 14-0 lead by halftime, then added another touchdown when Casey ran in for the score from the 4 on the first play of the fourth quarter.

A 39-yard field goal by Travis Forney pushed the Lions' lead to 24-0.

Casey had his first start of the season and played the whole game for Penn State, which had used Casey and Kevin Thompson at quarterback this year. Paterno said Monday that Thompson's arm was slightly sore.

"I knew I was going to get the start because coach had told me Kevin had messed up his shoulder," Casey said. "I went and practiced like I was going to be the starter."

Casey was 8-of-16 for 146 yards and Penn State added 175 yards rushing.

Randy McCown of Texas A&M was 13-for-22 for 105 passing yards but threw four interceptions, matching the career high he threw in a loss to Nebraska this season. McCown was sacked three times.

"It was tough to stay positive," McCown said. "We wanted to get a good start and we didn't. You're not going to win many football games playing like that."

Arrington, a junior who might make himself available for the NFL draft, had a big game for Penn State with 14 tackles, including one for an 8-yard loss.

"We had a lot of pressure on the quarterback," Arrington said.

Texas A&M coach R.C. Slocum knew going into the game that Arrington, not to mention his two fellow All-American defensive teammates, would pose problems for his offense.

"He's a great player," Slocum said. "He was up for every postseason award for

a linebacker, so this is not the first time he's done it."

The Aggies had only one promising drive in the first half, and it failed when Shane Lechler—also the team's punter—saw his 44-yard field-goal attempt fall short.

Texas A&M looked as though it might get its running game together to start the second half, as Ja'Mar Toombs and D'Andre Hardeman combined for an impressive drive to begin the third.

But when the Aggies got near the end zone, Ron Graham of Penn State intercepted McCown's pass at the 7. Other Aggies mistakes followed, including Bethel Johnson's fumble of a kickoff return in the fourth quarter.

An ocean of Aggies fans packed the 65,000-seat Alamodome, but the loud maroon-clad crowd couldn't keep the Aggies afloat. Some fans started to head for the exits with 10 minutes left in the game.

The defeat ended a season of tragedy for Texas A&M (8-4), whose players wore a helmet decal honoring the students killed in the Nov. 18 bonfire log collapse on campus that killed 12 people and injured 27.

The Lions got on the scoreboard early when Derek Fox ran 34 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter after intercepting a pass by McCown.

Earlier in the first quarter, the Lions took points off the board when they opted to take a first down on a roughing-the-kicker call after Forney made a 38-yard field goal. Four plays later, Forney was wide right on a 30-yard field goal attempt.

Penn State drove 73 yards and scored on a 45-yard pass from Casey to Eddie Drummond and moved ahead 14-0 with 8:54 left before halftime.

This was Paterno's 30th bowl appearance, breaking the record of 29 he shared with Bear Bryant of Alabama. Paterno has won more bowl games than any other coach and now has a bowl record of 20-9-1.

A&M junior running back Ja'Mar Toombs carried the ball 35 times (a school bowl record) for 193 yards and three touchdowns (a school bowl record), while MSU's Dontae Walker netted 143 rushing yards and three touchdowns.

The Aggies held an early 14-0 lead in the first quarter after touchdowns by Richard Whitaker and Toombs. MSU answered with two touchdowns in the second before A&M quarterback Mark Farris connected with receiver Robert Ferguson on a 42-yard TD pass.

The Aggies led 20-14 at the half, but would trail 21-20 entering the fourth. Farris opened the 4th with a 35-yard TD pass to Bethel Johnson and Toombs added another TD run and the Aggies led 35-21.

MSU rallied with two late TDs to force overtime. Toombs scored on the first possession, but the PAT by Terence Kitchens was blocked and returned for two points by Julius Griffith.

MSU's Wayne Madkin scored on the next possession to give the Bulldogs the overtime bowl win.

It set an A&M record for combined points in a bowl game and was the first overtime bowl game in school history.

HOUSTON (AP)—Not a bad way to begin a career.

Freshman Byron Jones intercepted three passes in his first start, and Joe Weber scored two touchdowns, helping Texas A&M end a four-game bowl losing streak with a 28-9 victory over TCU in the Galleryfurniture.com Houston Bowl on Friday.

Jones, one of five freshmen in the lineup, helped the Aggies beat their former Southwest Conference rivals for the 24th straight time. A&M won a bowl game for the first time since a 22-20 victory over Michigan in the 1995 Alamo Bowl.

"It was fun to finally win a bowl," Slocum said. "But I haven't beat myself up personally about it. Sometimes we were just playing one of the best teams in the nation and we just weren't good enough to win. Today, the better team won the game."

The Aggies ended the season 8-4 after losing their final three regular-season games. The Horned Frogs (6-6) haven't beaten the Aggies since 1972, and trail the series 56-29-7.

Weber, voted offensive player of the game, broke a 7-7 second-quarter tie with a 2-yard touchdown run and added a 14-yard run that put the Aggies in control with 1:14 left in the third quarter.

TCU's Casey Printers was intercepted four times, including the first three of Jones' career.

Aggies safety Wes Bautovich got A&M's fourth interception. On the next play, Mark Farris hit Mickey Jones for an 82-yard touchdown pass and a 28-7 lead with 14:40 left in the game. Weber broke straight up the middle on his second touchdown, knocking aside two tacklers and running into the end zone. He finished with 59 yards on nine carries.

Jones was the game's MVP and also was the defensive player of the game. He had three tackles and ran back his interceptions a total of 77 yards.

Starting in place of the injured Sean Weston, Jones had only two broken-up passes on his defensive chart in 11 games before he returned his first interception 62 yards in the first quarter to the Frogs' 35.

The Aggies couldn't score on that chance, but Jones had a 15-yard interception return to TCU's 1-yard line in the second quarter, setting up Farris' quarterback keeper for the score.

Charlie Owens scooped up a fumble by A&M running back Derek Farmer and returned it 89 yards for a TCU touchdown with four minutes left in the half, tying the game 7-7. It was the second-longest fumble return in school history.

Thomas returned the ensuing kickoff 43 yards, and Carriger, a converted defensive lineman, lumbered 19 yards with his second reception of the season to set up Weber's 2-yard touchdown run with 1:06 left in the half.

DALLAS (AP)—Rick Clausen looked nothing like the third-stringer he was most of the season, leading No. 15 Tennessee to five touchdowns in just 2 1/2 quarters, and the defense had its way with No. 22 Texas A&M in a 38-7 victory in the Cotton Bowl.

The Volunteers (10-3) had lost four of their last five bowl games, the last two by a combined 40 points. After never leading in either of those games, they made things different just seven plays into this one when Clausen's short pass to C.J. Fayton turned into a 57-yard touchdown.

Tennessee wound up with the most lopsided victory in its 45-game bowl history. The Vols came within 5:13 of their first bowl shutout since the last time they played the Aggies, way back in the 1957 Gator Bowl.

The rout was as much a result of the Volunteers playing perfectly as it was the Aggies self-destructing. For instance, A&M lost only one fumble in its first seven games, but gave away four this time. Three came in the first half, helping Tennessee stretch its quick 7-0 lead to 21-0 early in the second quarter, forcing the Aggies out of their game plan.

The Vols' plan was excellent, especially on offense.

Instead of relying on the rushing of Gerald Riggs Jr. and Cedric Houston, Clausen came out firing from a variety of formations and showed the poise and patience of a seasoned leader, not a junior transfer who was beaten out by two freshmen and was playing only because they were both hurt.

Clausen was 18-of-27 for 222 yards with three touchdowns, no interceptions and no sacks. He also handled a hostile crowd of 75,704-- the game's largest since 1978, the vast majority dressed in A&M maroon-- by scampering around the backfield to make sure everyone heard his audibles.

That was the case until he took the crowd out of it completely.

Tennessee gained 306 yards by halftime, even though two TD drives went just 28 and 8 yards thanks to fumble recoveries. The Vols set another school bowl record with 32 first downs.

Riggs followed his career-high 182 yards in the SEC championship with 102 and a touchdown on 18 carries. Houston ran 13 times for 62 yards, enough to make him and Riggs the first Tennessee teammates to have 1,000 yards in the same season. He also had a touchdown before leaving with a bruised thigh in the third quarter.

A&M trailed 28-0 at halftime, but had a chance to make it a game when Terrence Thomas ran 54 yards to the 15 on the opening drive of the third quarter. Then quarterback Reggie McNeal was tackled from behind on fourth-and-1 from the 6 and the Aggies hardly threatened again.

They finally scored in the closing minutes on a 5-yard pass to Earvin Taylor. It was the eighth time in coach Phillip Fulmer's tenure Tennessee has won at least 10 games.

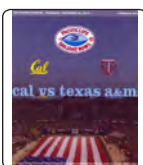

SAN DIEGO (AP)—Marshawn Lynch ran for 111 yards and two touchdowns, and No. 20 California's defense played impressively in a 45-10 win over No. 21 Texas A&M in the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl.

Nate Longshore threw for a touchdown and ran for another, and Lynch's backup, Justin Forsett, ran for 124 yards and one score.

Cal (10-3) put an emphatic final touch to its second 10-win season in three years. The Golden Bears had lost to Arizona and Southern California in disheartening fashion before beating rival Stanford and then the Aggies (9-4).

In 2004, Cal was in position to end its long Rose Bowl drought but was leapfrogged in the final Bowl Championship Series standings by Texas. Although the fourth-ranked Golden Bears claimed not to be bothered by the snub, they couldn't even hang with No. 23 Texas Tech in the Holiday Bowl and were humiliated 45-31.

This trip to San Diego turned out a lot better.

Lynch, the Pac-10 offensive player of the year, scored on a 2-yard run in the second quarter to give Cal a 14-7 lead. While Longshore lined up at wide receiver, Lynch was in the shotgun formation, took the snap and bulled into the end zone.

Lynch scored on a 1-yard run in the third, leaping over the line and fumbling as he came down in the end zone. The Aggies recovered and referee John O'Neill signaled first down for Texas A&M, then said the play was being reviewed. Replay official Jim Augustyn ruled that Lynch had possession when he broke the plane of the end zone, making it 21-10 Cal.

While the Golden Bears moved up and down the field, their defense came up big, too.

Jorvorskie Lane, Texas A&M's 274-pound tailback, wasn't much of a factor after tying a 79-year-old school record with 19 rushing touchdowns this year. He was held to 36 yards and no touchdowns on seven carries.

Longshore scored on a 1-yard keeper to tie the game at 7 in the first quarter, eight plays after Texas A&M's Stephen McGee threw a 19-yard TD pass to Chad Schroeder.

Longshore also threw a 4-yard touchdown pass to Lavelle Hawkins late in the third quarter. He finished 19-of-24 for 235 yards.

Texas A&M gambled a few times too many. After Bryce Reed gained 7 yards on a fake punt in the first quarter, the drive bogged down and the Aggies went for it on fourth-and-8 from the Cal 32. McGee was sacked by Nu'u Tafisi.

Lynch scored his first TD five plays later.

His second touchdown was set up when Texas A&M's Justin Brantly shanked a punt out of bounds for no gain at the Aggies' 41. Lynch scored four plays later.

ARLINGTON (AP) — Jordan Jefferson threw three touchdown passes to Terrence Toliver and ran for a score to help the 11th-ranked Tigers rally for a 41-24 victory over No. 18 Texas A&M in the 75th Cotton Bowl.

Texas A&M (9-4) led 10-0 in the first quarter, including a field goal after Jefferson threw an interception, but had its six-game winning streak snapped.

Jefferson was 10 of 19 for 158 yards with scoring passes of 42, 2 and 41 yards to Toliver, who had only two TD catches in the regular season.

LSU went ahead for good when Stevan Ridley had a 17-yard TD run, jumping over a defender near the line and then sweeping right untouched into the end zone for a 21-17 lead with 4:43 left in the first half.

Ryan Tannehill, who had been 5-0 since taking over as the Aggies starting quarterback, then threw two interceptions in a span of three throws- after 127 consecutive attempts without a pick. The second interception was by Eric Reid, who returned it 34 yards to the 2 to set up Jefferson's short TD pass to Toliver for a 28-17 halftime lead.

Ridley had 24 carries for 105 yards. Spencer Ware ran for 102 yards on 10 carries as LSU got its first Cotton Bowl win since beating Arkansas 14-7 in the 1966 game.

Uzoma Nwachukwu had two TD catches for the Aggies to match his regular-season total. He caught a 6-yarder from Tannehill and a 14-yarder on a halfback pass by Cyrus Gray, who also had his seventh consecutive 100-yard rushing game- 100 yards on 20 carries.

Coryell Judie help set up A&M's two first-quarter scores.

Judie returned the opening kickoff 69 yards to the 31, setting up Nwachukwu's first TD. It was the first time all season that LSU's defense gave up a score on the opening drive.

After the Tigers' opening offensive drive was extended by a roughing the punter penalty, Judie had a one-handed interception near the end zone when he leaped and fully extended his right arm. That led to Randy Bullock's 39-yard field goal for a 10-0 lead.

When LSU got the ball back, Oliver had both arms stretched over his head when he caught a 42-yard touchdown pass. He had the 41-yarder on the opening drive of the second half.

The Tigers took their first lead on Jefferson's 1-yard TD run early in the second quarter after Bullock missed a 52-yarder. On that drive, Ware had a 24-yard run when he spun to avoid a tackler at the line and shed two different defenders before being driven out of bounds and Jefferson converted a third-and-11 with a 13-yard scramble.

HOUSTON (AP) - Ryan Tannehill threw for 329 yards and a touchdown and Ben Malena ran for two more scores to lead Texas A&M to a 33-22 win over Northwestern on Saturday in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Northwestern led 7-3 early in the second quarter before A&M reeled off 27 straight points to take a decisive lead and then fight off a late rally to capture its first bowl victory since 2001.

Texas A&M broke a five-game bowl losing streak in a win the team dedicated to fired coach Mike Sherman and offensive lineman Joseph Villaviesceno, who was killed in a car accident a week before.

Malena ran for 77 yards, filling in ably for Cyrus Gray, who missed his second straight game with a stress fracture in his left shoulder.

A&M won a bowl for the first time since a 28-9 victory over TCU after the 2001 season. That also came in Houston, when this game was called the GalleryFurniture.com bowl and played next door at the Astrodome.

The Aggies were up 30-7 before Brian Peters intercepted Tannehill early in the fourth quarter and the Wildcats took advantage of that mistake when Kain Colter scored on a 1-yard run for Northwestern's first points since early in the second quarter. The 2-point conversion left A&M ahead 30-15.

Colter found Tim Riley in the corner of the end zone for on a 2-yard touchdown pass to get Northwestern within 30-22 with less than six minutes remaining.

A&M responded with a clock-eating drive capped by a 31-yard field goal to secure the win. Senior Jeff Fuller, who has had a disappointing and injury-plagued year, had a key third down catch for 29 yards on that drive and finished with a season-high 119 yards receiving.

The Aggies were led by interim coach Tim DeRuyter in his last game at Texas A&M before leaving to become Fresno State's coach. The Aggies hired former Houston coach Kevin Sumlin earlier this month to replace Sherman, but he wasn't involved in bowl preparations.

Texas A&M erased a 7-3 second quarter deficit thanks to touchdowns by Malena and Fuller and a field goal by Randy Bullock to lead 20-7 at halftime.

Malena's second touchdown came on a 19-yard run early in the third quarter that made it 27-7. Another field goal by Bullock, this one from 47 yards, pushed A&M's advantage to 30-7.

Texas A&M's offense got rolling in the second quarter when Tannehill found Ryan Swope, who was a high school running back, on a short pass that he took 37 yards to the 1. Swope tight-roped the sideline and avoided a half dozen tacklers before he was brought down.

ARLINGTON (AP) — Johnny Manziel tiptoed the sideline for a 23-yard touchdown on Texas A&M's first drive of the game.

The Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback known as Johnny Football and the 10th-ranked Aggies were just getting warmed up in the Cotton Bowl. There were plenty more highlights after that nifty run.

In his first game since becoming the first freshman to win the Heisman, Manziel set a Cotton Bowl-record with 516 total yards and accounted for four TDs as the Aggies capped their first SEC season with a 41-13 win over 12th-ranked Oklahoma on Friday night.

With first-year coach Kevin Sumlin and their young star quarterback, the Aggies (11-2) fit right in with the SEC after leaving the Big 12. They broke the SEC record with their 7,261 total yards this season (the first over 7,000 after 633 in Cowboys Stadium). They also averaged more than 40 points a game.

And they capped their debut season with an overwhelming victory in the only postseason game matching teams from those power conferences. It is the Aggies' first 11-win season since 1998, when they won their only Big 12 title.

Texas A&M led by only a point at halftime, but scored on its first three drives of the second half -- on drives of 91 and 89 yards before Swope's score on a fourth-and-5 play.

Oklahoma (10-3), which like the Aggies entered the game with a five-game winning streak, went three-and-out on its first three drives after halftime.

SEC teams have won the last five Cotton Bowls, all against Big 12 teams, and nine out of 10. That included Texas A&M's loss to LSU only two years ago.

Manziel set an FBS bowl record with his 229 yards rushing on 17 carries, and completed 22 of 34 passes for 287 yards.

Oklahoma, led by quarterback Landry Jones in his 50th career start, had only 312 total yards as a team.

ATLANTA (AP) — Even by Johnny Manziel's Heisman-winning standards, his lead role in Texas A&M's comeback was one to remember.

Manziel threw four touchdown passes, and Toney Hurd Jr. returned an interception 55 yards for the late go-ahead touchdown in Texas A&M's 52-48 victory over Duke on Tuesday night in the Chick-fil-A Bowl.

Led by Manziel, the Aggies rallied after trailing 38-17 at halftime. It was the highest-scoring game in the bowl's history.

Manziel, playing in what might be his final college game, completed 30 of 38 passes for 382 yards and ran for 73 yards and a touchdown.

"I was in a zone I haven't been in before," Manziel said. "Ever. I just wanted this game."

Hurd's interception return gave the No. 20 Aggies (9-4) their first lead with 3:33 remaining.

No. 22 Duke (10-4) took a 41-31 lead into the fourth quarter. The Blue Devils couldn't hold off the comeback and are still looking for their first bowl win since beating Arkansas 7-6 in the 1961 Cotton Bowl.

Hurd stepped in front of receiver Johnell Barnes for the interception, the first turnover for either team. Texas A&M linebacker Nate Askew ended Duke's next possession with another interception.

Texas A&M's defense opened the second half with its first stop of the game. The Blue Devils, successful on two fourth-down calls in the first half, were stopped on fourth down from the Texas A&M 35.

That set the stage for Manziel's magic.

The elusive quarterback had runs of 12 and 14 yards before his highlight play of the game. On second down from the Duke 17, Manziel danced and shuffled in traffic before vaulting a defender and dumping a short pass to Travis Labhart, who scored easily for his third touchdown of the game.

"It looked like we had him down three times," Duke coach David Cutcliffe said. "He's just strong, so strong."

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Kyle Allen threw for four touchdowns and ran for a fifth, and Texas A&M erased an early 10-point deficit to defeat West Virginia 45-37 in the Liberty Bowl.

Allen, a true freshman making his fifth career start, went 22 of 35 for 294 yards to make up for an early interception that KJ Dillon returned for a touchdown. The Aggies' season leaders in sacks (Myles Garrett), all-purpose yards (Speedy Noil) and interceptions (Armani Watts) also were true freshmen.

'Malcome Kennedy caught two of Allen's touchdown passes, and Tra Carson rushed for a career-high 133 yards on 25 carries. Allen's 14-yard rushing touchdown in the final minute of the first half put the Aggies (8-5) ahead for good.

Texas A&M has won bowl games in four straight seasons for the first time in school history. The Aggies won the Chick-fil-A Bowl last year, the Cotton Bowl two seasons ago and the Texas Bowl in 2011.

"That's something that nobody can ever take from them and puts (the seniors) in a separate class by themselves," coach Kevin Sumlin said.

The game lived up to its billing as a shootout between two fast-paced offenses that had scored over 30 points per game while allowing more than 25 this season. This wound up as the second-highest scoring day in the Liberty Bowl's 56-game history, trailing only Louisville's 44-40 victory over Boise State in 2004.

The first quarter alone featured 34 combined points, with West Virginia leading 20-14.

Texas A&M outlasted West Virginia by outrushing the Mountaineers 235-126 and holding West Virginia below 4 yards per carry. The Aggies had allowed 5.1 yards per rush this season.

Texas A&M pulled ahead 21-20 early in the second quarter on Allen's 11-yard touchdown pass to Kennedy. Just 39 seconds later, West Virginia went back in front 27-21 on Howard's 49-yard TD throw to White.

Texas A&M took over from there.

The Aggies got a 28-27 lead with 53 seconds left in the half as Allen went to his right and saw a defender converging, then headed to his left and ran down the sideline for a touchdown. Texas A&M scored 17 points on its first three series of the third quarter to pad its advantage to 45-30.

West Virginia cut the deficit to 45-37 on Howard's 4-yard touchdown pass to Elijah Wellman with 2:32 remaining, but the Mountaineers' offense wouldn't touch the ball again.

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Lamar Jackson ran for a career-high and Music City Bowl-record 226 yards and two touchdowns and threw for two more scores to help Louisville beat Texas A&M 27-21.

The freshman, making his first start since Oct. 30, finished with a bowl-record 453 total yards, and set the Louisville career rushing mark before the end of the first quarter in giving the Cardinals a 20-7 lead they never lost. Jackson ran for 126 yards in the first 15 minutes, including a 61-yard scoring run.

Louisville (8-5) won for the eighth time in 10 games. The Cardinals also had their third bowl victory in their past four trips.

The Aggies made it interesting in the final minutes with their third-string quarterback making his first career start.

Hubenak shook off five sacks and two turnovers to throw for 307 yards, including a 29-yard touchdown pass to Christian Kirk with 4:54 left that pulled the Aggies to 27-21.

Texas A&M nearly had first-and-goal at the Cardinals 6, but a review showed Kirk did not maintain possession of the ball on his catch. That left Hubenak two more chances inside the final 2 minutes. The Cardinals batted down a pass, then Hubenak was incomplete throwing into the end zone.

The Aggies lost their second straight overall and snapped a four-game bowl winning streak. Aggies wide receiver Josh Reynolds set Music City Bowl records with 11 catches for 177 yards.

Louisville linebacker Devonte Fields had three sacks, and Louisville safety Josh Harvey-Clemons stripped Hubenak him of the ball and intercepted a pass both in the third quarter.

Jackson had no such issues as he passed Stefan LeFors' previous career rushing mark of 756 yards between 2002 and 2004. He showed off the speed that Louisville coach Bobby Petrino wants to bring to the Atlantic Coast Conference, running through, around and over the Aggies.

Jackson set a bowl rushing record, topping the 187 yards Marion Barber of Minnesota ran for in 2004. He also set the total offense mark of 424 set by Mike Glennon of North Carolina state in 2012 as he threw for 227 yards.

He put Louisville up 27-14 with 3:01 left in the third with a 17-yard TD pass to a wide-open Keith Towbridge for his second TD.

Louisville senior linebacker James Burgess' career ended on the Cardinals' first defensive play of the game. He was flagged, then ejected for targeting Texas A&M wide receiver Damion Ratley on a hit that left both the receiver and Cardinals cornerback Shaq Wiggins on the ground for a few minutes. He didn't return until late in the first quarter with a strained lower back.

Aggies defensive end Myles Garrett, who came in leading the SEC in sacks, had a pretty quiet night aside from one sack, giving him a career-high 12 1/2 for the season.
