LEADING OFF

The No. 1 Texas A&M Aggies continue their string of games against ranked opponents as they face the No. 25 Houston Cougars in a Tuesday night showdown at Schroeder Park.

The Maroon and White face the Cougars between winning two of three against No. 13 LSU last weekend and a three-game series at No. 3 Florida starting Friday.

The Aggies look to extend a 24-game midweek win streak.

Texas A&M has seven players hitting over .300, including **BOOMER WHITE** (.404), **J.B. MOSS** (.396), **NICK CHORUBY** (.351), **MICHAEL BARASH** (.350), **RYNE BIRK** (.338), **HUNTER MELTON** (.311) and **JOEL DAVIS** (.311).

The Aggies rank third in the nation in batting average with a .336 mark. Texas A&M also ranks fifth in triples per game (0.58), sixth in slugging percentage (.507), eighth in on-base percentage (.416), 13th in scoring (8.2) and 24th in doubles per game (2.25).

On the mound, the Aggies rank second in the nation in shutouts (5), ninth in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.5) 12th in strikeouts per nine innings (9.6), 16th in ERA (2.65) and WHIP (1.13).

BULLPEN NOTES

The Aggies bullpen has been solid in 2016. The relievers have a 7-3 record with seven saves and a 2.24 ERA on the year, yielding 26 runs, 22 earned, on 62 hits and 26 walks while striking out 96 in 88.1 innings. Texas A&M's bullpen owns a 1.00 WHIP and 3.69-to-1 strikeout-to-walk ratio and their holding the opponent to a .196 batting average. The Aggie bullpen has allowed just 15 extra-base hits in 88.1 inning of work. **MARK ECKER** is 2-1 with a 0.82 ERA, yielding three runs, one earned, on 11 hits and one walk while striking out eight. **RYAN HENDRIX** is 0-0 with five saves and 2.03 ERA, yielding four runs, three earned, on four hits and nine walks while striking out 22 in 13.1 innings. **BRIGHAM HILL** has been a top setup man, going 1-0 with one save and a 1.12 ERA with two runs on 11 hits, two walks and 11 strikeouts in 16.0 innings.

TEXAS A&M/HOUSTON SERIES NOTABLES

Texas A&M owns a 110-57-1 edge in the all-time series, but the series has been tighter in the 21st century as the Aggies own an 18-13 edge in the series. Last season the Aggies won a top 25 meeting at the Houston College Classic, 6-0. In the victory, Texas A&M got a two-run home run from **HUNTER MELTON** and **MICHAEL BARASH** added one double and one home run. Grayson Long and **KYLE SIMONDS** combined to hold the Cougars to three hits. Long worked 7.0 innings, striking out 10.

MORE ON HOUSTON

Houston enters the fray with a 16-7 record and the Cougars are coming off a series sweep against George Washington. The Cougars also have series sweeps against Villanova and Grand Canyon and they own series wins against Baylor and Alabama. Houston lost all three games at the Shriners Hospitals for Children College Classic at Minute Maid Park losing games against Texas Tech, Arkansas and TCU.

The Cougars are batting .279 and averaging 5.91 runs per game. They boast a team on-base percentage of .367 and a .421 team slugging percentage. Joe Davis leads the squad with a .402 batting average, 16 runs, 10 doubles, six home runs and 31 RBI. Connor Wong is hitting .364 with 23 runs, six doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI and seven stolen bases. Michael Pyeatt is batting .349 with 12 runs, one double, one triple and seven RBI.

Houston's pitching staff owns a 2.25 ERA and .201 opponent batting average. The Cougars have a 5.05 strikeout-to-walk ratio and 0.94 WHIP.

The Tigers have 28 NCAA Championship appearances, winning 21 regional titles, appearing in 17 College World Series and winning six titles. Houston has a pair of College World Series appearances with a debut in 1953 and a second-place finish in 1967.

Twenty-two former Houston players have reached the Majors. The group is led by 1990 NL Cy Yong Award winner Doug Drabek. The list also includes former MLB All-Stars Michael Bourn, Jesse Crain, Tom Paciorek and Woody Williams.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

The Aggies boast four preseason All-Americans, including **NICK BANKS**, **MARK ECKER**, **RONNIE GIDEON** and **RYAN HENDRIX**. Banks made a clean sweep of the preseason All-America circuit, earning first-team recognition from Collegiate Baseball and NCBWA and second-team accolades from D1Baseball.com and Baseball America. The other three players each found their way onto one of the four teams.

STRONG STARTS

Aggie pitchers have allowed first inning runs just one time in 24 games, A&M's 9-7 loss at Auburn. On the season, the staff owns a 1.50 ERA and .185 opponent batting average in the first innings of games, yielding four runs on 15 hits and six walks while striking out 24 in 24.0 innings. Maroon and White pitchers own a 0.88 WHIP and 4.00 strikeout-to-walk ratio in the opening frames. The Aggies are outscoring opponents 31-4 in the first inning.

TURNER BASEBALL

TURNER LARKINS has the distinction of being selected in the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft one spot before Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Manziel. The Milwaukee Brewers selected Larkins out of Arlington Martin High School in the 28th round with the 836th overall pick. The San Diego Padres followed by drafting Manziel with the 837th pick.

TOUGH TESTS SPANGLE THE 2016 SCHEDULE

The Aggies will play 11 teams that participated in the 2015 NCAA Championship for a total of 25 games, including Arkansas (3), Auburn (3), Florida (3), LSU (3), Ole Miss (3), Pepperdine (3), Vanderbilt (3), Houston, Houston Baptist, Rice and Texas. The Aggies will play seven SEC series against teams that played in the 2015 NCAA Championship, including College World Series participants Arkansas, Florida, LSU and Vanderbilt.

Four of A&M's opponents hosted a regional in 2015. The Aggies' meat grinder of a schedule includes 16 games against squads that racked up 40 or more wins last season, including nine games against 50-game winners.

CALL ON ME

Seniors **ANDREW VINSON** and **TY SCHLOTTMANN** are maintaining a chance of joining the slim list of Aggie pitchers to appear in 100 or more games in their career. The list currently includes only two pitchers with Kyle Thebeau owning the school record with 103 appearances followed by Estevan Uriegas (2009-12) with 100.

Vinson enters the weekend ranked fourth on Texas A&M's career list with 88 appearances. With 11 more games, "Vinnny" will pass Kyle Martin (98 - 2010-13) on the career list. He currently ranks eighth among active Division I pitchers in appearances.

Schlottmann has 71 games, ranking 10th on the career list. He will move into ninth place with three more appearances.

RELATIVELY SPEAKING

NICK CHORUBY - father, Shawn Choruby, was an outfielder for the Aggies in 1984-85.

RONNIE GIDEON - father, Ron Gideon works in the Colorado Rockies organization as a development supervisor with Double-A Eastern League affiliate Hartford Yard Goats. He played in the Philadelphia Phillies and New York Mets organization from 1984-90, starting as a first baseman before spending the last two years as a pitcher.

LEE MAY GONZALEZ - cousin, Michael Gonzalez, is an 11-year MLB veteran, including stints as a relief pitcher with the Pittsburgh Pirates (2003-06), Atlanta Braves (2007-09), Baltimore Orioles (2010-11), Texas Rangers (2011), Washington Nationals (2012) and Milwaukee Brewers (2013). Has appeared in 509 games, all in relief, with a 17-24 record, 56 saves, 3.14 ERA and 511 strikeouts in 444.1 innings. Best season to date came in 2006 with the Pirates, going 3-4 with a career-high 24 saves, a 2.17 ERA and 64 strikeouts in 54.0 innings.

LEE MAY GONZALEZ - uncle, Eric Gonzalez, played for the Aggies in 1992-93 and is currently the head coach at Laredo Community College. As a junior in 1992, Eric batted .287 with 31 runs, 14 doubles, one triple, one home run, 26 RBI and 14 stolen bases in 55 games.

GEORGE JANCA - brother, Sam Janca, pitched for Texas Tech in 2007 and 2008. Ended his collegiate career at Angelo State.

TREY JIMMERSON - father, Marty Jimmerson, was a barefoot kicker for Baylor's football team, scoring 181 points from 1981-84 on 31-of-43 field goal attempts and 88-of-91 PATs.

DAKOTA KLEIN - grandfather, Bobby North, was a player on the Aggie baseball team in the late 1950s.

STEPHEN KOLEK - brother, Tyler Kolek, was the second overall pick of the 2014 MLB Draft, taken by the Miami Marlins with their first-round selection.

CASON SHERROD - grandfather, Horace "Bud" Sherrod, played football at the University of Tennessee and was Most Valuable Player of the 1951 Cotton Bowl Classic as a defensive end, helping lead UT to a 20-14 win over the Texas Longhorns. He spent one season in the NFL, playing for the New York Giants in 1952. He is a member of the University of Tennessee Athletic Hall of Fame.

DAYNE SOMMER - father, Don Sommer, played football collegiately at UTEP and played one season for the Buffalo Bills. He is currently in his 16th year as TCU's head strength and conditioning coach.

1,000 WINS AT OLSEN FIELD

The Aggies notched their 1,000 win at Olsen Field in 2015. Now in their 39th season at the now Blue Bell Park, the Maroon and White are 1,034-332-4 at the facility.

NOTES AND NOTABLES

• Head coach Rob Childress is in his 11th season at the helm of the Texas A&M baseball program, beginning the year with a 430-225-2 record. Last season, he led the Aggies to the postseason to extend their school-record streak to nine consecutive seasons.

• Texas A&M is one of 11 teams to win 250 or more games from 2010-15. The Aggies went 253-130-1 over the span. A&M trails only Virginia (293), Vanderbilt (291), LSU (281), Florida State (278), South Carolina (277), Louisville (271), Florida (268), TCU (265) and North Carolina (263) over the span.

• The Aggies entered the season ranked in the top five of all five of major college baseball polls. Texas A&M's highest ranking is in the *Baseball America* poll where they are slotted No. 3. It's the highest preseason ranking for the Aggies since they were tabbed No. 1 by *Baseball America* to start the 2009 campaign. Texas A&M's No. 4 ranking in the *USA Today* Coaches Poll is the best ever.

PITCHER WEDGE

KYLE SIMONDS is the only player on the squad to not play high school baseball. Simonds spent his springs at Grand Island (Neb.) Central Catholic High School playing golf. Skilled on the links, Simonds qualified for the Nebraska Class C state tournament all four years, finishing 11th at the championship as a junior. He got his share of baseball in the summers starring for American Legion squad Home Federal. He went 2-for-2 with one double, one home run and three RBI at the Cornhusker League All-Star Game in July 2012.

Simonds honed his pitching skills at Hutchinson Community College. As a sophomore, he was named the National Junior College Athletic Association Division I Pitcher of the Year, posting a 13-0 record (13 wins led the nation) and a 2.30 ERA. He broke single season school records for wins (13), complete-games (nine), shutouts (three) and strikeouts (103) in 2014.

MELTON'S SENIORITY

Senior **HUNTER MELTON** enters the weekend as the most senior of veterans on the squad. Heading into the series against LSU, Melton has played in 147 games, including 138 starts. Junior **NICK BANKS** has 137 starts to his credit. Banks, who has played in 139 career games, had a 59-game start streak snapped against Prairie View A&M.

Junior **BOOMER WHITE** has played in 143 Division I games, including 119 at TCU. He has 140 starts to his credit. Senior **MICHAEL BARASH** has played in 101 Division I games, including 18 at LSU. He has 77 starts under his belt.

Other Aggies with more than 100 games under their belts including seniors **J.B. MOSS** (131 gp/86 gs) junior **RYNE BIRK** (126 gp/113 gs) and **JONATHAN MORONEY** (121 gp/68 gs).

CLOSING NOTES

The Aggies return three pitchers who logged five or more saves in 2015, including **MARK ECKER**, **RYAN HENDRIX** and **ANDREW VINSON**. Ecker and Hendrix were both named to the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Preseason Watch List. Ecker led the Aggies with eight saves in 2015, posting a 1-2 record with a 2.45 ERA and 36 strikeouts in 33.0 innings. Hendrix went 6-4 with five saves, a 3.66 ERA and 69 strikeouts in 59.0 innings. Out of the bullpen, Hendrix went 5-2 with a 0.73 ERA and a .194 opponent batting average. Vinson was 5-2 with five saves and 64 strikeouts in 63.2 innings last season. "Vinny" logged a 4-1 record with a 2.04 ERA and 55 strikeouts over 53.0 innings of relief as a junior. For his career he has seven saves and ranks fourth on A&M's career list with 88 appearances.

MIDWEEK PERFECTION

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Aggies have won 24 consecutive midweek games, including a 6-0 mark this season. The first two midweek games of the year were blowouts, but A&M battled to one-run victories in consecutive games, including a 3-2 victory over HBU in 13 innings, a 7-6 win against Northwestern State and a 5-4 win against Texas on a ninth-inning, walk-off dinger by **MICHAEL BARASH**. On Tuesday, the Aggies bludgeoned A&M-Corpus Christi, 13-3.

The Aggies finished the 2015 regular-season with a 13-0 record in midweek action this season, outscoring opponents 92-31. The A&M offense was highlighted by **NICK BANKS**, batting .500 (22-for-44) with 11 runs, three doubles and eight RBI, and Mitchell, hitting .487 (19-for-39) with 11 RBI. **RONNIE GIDEON** had four home runs and 12 RBI. The pitching staff posted a 2.08 ERA and the Aggies had 126 strikeouts in 121.0 innings in midweek action. **TURNER LARKINS** started 10 of the games, posting a 4-0 record with a 3.32 ERA and 37 strikeouts in 40.2 innings. The bullpen was 8-0 with six saves and a 1.46 ERA in midweek action, striking out 73 in 68.0 innings.

RED, WHITE, AND BLUE

Two Aggies were blessed with the experience of traveling with the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team last summer. Junior outfielder **NICK BANKS** and junior pitcher **RYAN HENDRIX** were selected to the team with Banks spending his second summer with the squad. It marked the second consecutive summer that Banks suited up for USA Baseball.

Banks appeared in 17 games with USA Baseball, batting .386 (22-of-57) with three doubles, one home run, 11 RBI and four stolen bases. Hendrix combined on a no-hitter against the Cuban National Team, the first-ever no-no against Cuba in international competition. USA Baseball recognized Hendrix and the two other pitchers for the "International Performance of the Year." He finished the stint with three saves in seven appearances.

PITCHERS WITH RUNNERS IN SCORING POSITION

The Texas A&M pitchers are holding the opposition to a .204 batting average with runners in scoring position. They have struck out 66 of the 238 batters they faced with runners in scoring position. **RYAN HENDRIX** is holding foes to a .071 (1-for-14) batting average with six strikeouts in RISP situations. **BRIGHAM HILL** is holding foes to a .116 (5-for-43) batting average with 13 strikeouts in RISP situations.

HOME FRIES

The Aggies had a 19-game home win streak snapped last Friday. The Maroon and White are 17-1 at Olsen Field at Blue Bell Park this season.

Offensively, the Aggies are hitting .338 at home and averaging 8.33 runs per game. The arsenal is paced by **RYNE BIRK** who is batting .418 with 16 runs, three doubles, three triples, one home run, 14 RBI and seven stolen bases at the friendly confines. **J.B. MOSS** is hitting .384 with 21 runs, six doubles, two triples, one home run, 14 RBI and seven stolen bases. Four other players are batting over .300 at home, including **BOOMER WHITE** (.373), **MICHAEL BARASH** (.364), **HUNTER MELTON** (.323) and **NICK CHORUBY** (.314). Melton leads the team with 24 RBI and he has 20 runs in 17 games at home.

The pitching staff has been equally impressive at Blue Bell Park. The staff owns a 1.85 earned run average and .211 opponent batting average. **BRIGHAM HILL** has been the top performer at home, logging a 2-0 record with a 0.98 ERA, yielding three runs on 24 hits and three walks while striking out 22 in 27.2 innings over nine appearances, including three starts.

BASES LOADED - HITTING

Texas A&M is pouncing on bases-loaded situations with a .450 on-base percentage and .355 batting average with the bags full of Ags. Texas A&M is 11-for-31 with six walks, one HBP, three doubles, one home run and 34 RBI in the situations. **NICK CHORUBY** is hitting .750 (3-for-4) with one walk and seven RBI with bases loaded. **RONNIE GIDEON** is hitting .667 (2-for-3) with one double, one home run and seven RBI with the bases loaded. His walk with the bases loaded against Houston Baptist accounted for the winning run in the 13th inning. **AUSTIN HOMAN** has delivered singles in two bases-loaded plate appearances, driving in three runs.

HEAD COACH ROB CHILDRESS

One of the top pitching coaches and recruiters in the country, Rob Childress enters his 11th season as the head coach of the Texas A&M baseball program.

With a steady stream of success, Childress has led A&M to a school-record nine consecutive NCAA Championship appearances, four NCAA Regional titles, two conference regular-season crowns, three league tournament titles and the 2011 College World Series. He owns a career record of 409-222-2, trailing only Mark Johnson (876) and Tom Chandler (660) in coaching victories at Texas A&M.



The 2015 squad started the season with an SEC-record 24-game win streak en route to a 50-14 campaign, the highest victory tally for the Aggies since 1999. A&M finished third in the SEC with an 18-10 league ledger and won their seventh NCAA Regional title. The Aggies came up one run shy of the College World Series, dropping game three of a Super Regional against TCU, 5-4, in 16 innings.

The 2015 campaign was one of the best coaching performances Childress has put in, as his pitching staff posted a 3.04 ERA (22nd in the nation) despite losing two weekend starters for most of the season. Matt Kent and Grayson Long, who both posted 9-1 records on the year, went on to get drafted, along with A.J. Minter, who went 2-0 with a 0.43 ERA in four starts before succumbing to a season-ending injury. The Aggies had four different players earn All-America honors on the year, including Grayson Long, Logan Taylor, Nick Banks and Blake Allemand.

In 2014, Childress guided the Aggies through their second season in the SEC, securing a spot in the SEC Tournament for the second consecutive year and earning a bid to a school-record eighth consecutive NCAA Championship.

In Texas A&M's first run through the SEC in 2013, Childress led A&M to the final six of the SEC Tournament and a seventh straight NCAA Championship. The Gilmer, Texas, native's expertise as a pitching coach is evident and has made an immediate impact. A&M's pitching staff ranked first or second in the rugged Big 12 in earned run average in each of his seven seasons in the league, including a Big 12-best 2.92 team ERA in 2012.

In 2011, Childress captured co-Big 12 Coach of the Year honors as he led the Aggies to another milestone campaign as he guided the squad back to college baseball's promised land of Omaha, Nebraska, and the College World Series. The trip to Omaha was the fifth in program history and capped off another successful run in the NCAA Tournament.

The 2011 team also claimed the 23rd conference championship in program history as it brought home both the Big 12 regular season and tournament titles before emerging victorious in both the College Station Regional and Tallahassee Super Regional.

A trio of Aggies (Tyler Naquin, Ross Stripling and Michael Wacha) garnered All-America honors in 2011 as Naquin was also named Big 12 Player of the Year while both Stripling and Wacha excelled on the mound under Childress' tutelage. Stripling blossomed during his third year in the A&M program as he led the nation in wins by turning in a 14-2 campaign with a 2.29 ERA.

Named the Big 12's Coach of the Year by his peers in 2008, he guided the Aggies to 46 wins, their first regular-season title in nine years and the first back-to-back NCAA regional championships in school history. Along the way A&M set a new school and Big 12 record by winning 16 straight conference games.

After just one season at the helm, Childress orchestrated the biggest turnaround in NCAA Division I baseball. His 2007 team finished 48-19, winning 23 more games than in 2006, in addition to claiming the NCAA College Station Regional championship, a berth in the Super Regionals and the school's first Big 12 title since 1999.

Childress was named the 19th head baseball coach in school history on June 21, 2005, after spending the previous eight seasons at Nebraska—the first five as an assistant under current Arkansas Head Coach Dave Van Horn and the last three as an assistant to Mike Anderson. In those eight seasons, the Huskers made the NCAA Tournament five times, advanced to the Super Regionals four times and made three appearances in the College World Series (2001, 2002 and 2005).

Childress was a collegiate assistant coach for 14 seasons, including 10 years at the Division I level. He spent seven seasons at Nebraska overseeing the pitching staff and the Husker recruiting efforts after serving with Van Horn at Northwestern State from 1995 to 1997.

SUMMER LOVIN'

Aggies picked up a number of accolades during the summer campaign.

Baseball America listed five Aggies among the Top Prospects from Summer League action. **NICK BANKS** highlighted the group, named the No. 4 prospect on the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team, with **RYAN HENDRIX** tabbed No. 18. Banks played in 26 games for Team USA, including 23 starts, hitting .241 with 11 runs, two doubles, two home runs and 13 RBI. Hendrix was honored by USA Baseball for the "Top International Performance" as he combined with two other pitchers to pitch a no-hitter against Cuba. He logged three saves in seven games for USA.

CORBIN MARTIN was named the No. 1 prospect of the Alaska Baseball League and **KYLE SIMONDS** was slotted as the No. 6 prospect. **BRIGHAM HILL**, Martin and Simonds were all selected to play for the Alaska Baseball League All-Star Game. Martin played for the Mat-Su Miners, logging a 1-1 record with a 0.00 ERA and 27 strikeouts in 21.2 innings. Simonds pitched in eight games for the Miners, including six starts, registering a 5-0 record with one save, a 1.77 ERA and 28 strikeouts in 40.2 innings. Hill appeared in eight games for the Miners, including six starts, notching a 2-3 record with a 1.85 ERA and 40 strikeouts in 39.0 innings.

In the Florida Collegiate League, **HUNTER MELTON** was tabbed the No. 8 prospect. Melton appeared in 24 games for the Sanford River Rats, hitting .241 (19-of-79) with nine runs, five doubles, one triple, three home runs and 12 RBI.

BLAKE KOPETSKY was selected to play in the Texas Collegiate League All-Star Game. Kopetsky played in 26 games for the Brazos Valley Bombers, hitting .297 with 16 runs, four doubles, three triples, 11 RBI and five stolen bases. He also pitched in seven games, going 0-0 with a 1.80 ERA and nine strikeouts in 10.0 innings. Kopetsky hit 2-of-5 with one double and one run in the TCL All-Star Game. He played in all three of the Bombers' playoff games, logging two runs and three RBI.

SHUTOUT NOTES

With the back-to-back shutouts at Pepperdine on Feb. 27 & 28, the Aggies recorded consecutive shutouts for the first time since February 2006. It also marked the first time A&M recorded consecutive shutouts away from Olsen Field since the Coral Gables Regional in May of 1995.

They recorded four shutouts in seven games for the second time in program history, with the only other occasion coming in 1907, which is before people made sounds in the motion pictures.

Texas A&M already has five shutouts on the season, matching the number they amassed in 2014 and 2015. The last time the Aggies had more than five shutouts in a season was 2012 when the blanked opponents on eight occasions.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

The Aggies are outscoring opponents 31-4 in the first inning. A&M has scored in the first inning in 14 games this season, including five of the last seven games.

Texas A&M is outscoring opponents 135-48 after the third inning, including 85-23 in the middle third of games (innings 4-6).

The Aggies have scored first in 20 of the 24 games this season.

Texas A&M has seven players hitting .300 or better, including **BOOMER WHITE** (.404), **J.B. MOSS** (.396), **NICK CHORUBY** (.351), **MICHAEL BARASH** (.350), **RYNE BIRK** (.347), **HUNTER MELTON** (.311) and **JOEL DAVIS** (.311).

The Aggies are batting .394 with a .430 on-base percentage in the fourth inning with 33 runs, nine doubles, two triples and two home runs. **BOOMER WHITE** is hitting .692 (9-for-13) with one walk, four doubles and four RBI in the frame. **J.B. MOSS** is batting .444 (4-for-9) with two doubles and seven RBI in the frame.

2016 SEC TOURNAMENT

The 2016 SEC Baseball Tournament is scheduled for May 24-29 at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium in Hoover, Ala., a suburb of Birmingham.

The tournament, being held in Hoover for the 19th consecutive year. For the four consecutive year, the tournament will be a 12-team field. The regular-season division winners will claim the top two seeds and the next 10 teams by conference winning percentage, regardless of division will claim the remaining berths in the tournament. The 5-12 teams will play a single-elimination opening round on May 19, followed by a double-elimination format until the semifinals, when the format will revert to single elimination through the championship game.

BENCH MOB

Players coming off the bench are batting .355 (22-for-62) with seven doubles, one triple, one home run and 12 RBI. **JOEL DAVIS** has a team-high five hits off the bench, going 5-for-9 with two doubles, one home run and three RBI when called into reserve action. **AUSTIN HOMAN** and **WALKER PENNINGTON** both have four hits off the bench. Davis leads reserves, going 4-for-6 with two doubles, one home run and three RBI. Pennington is 4-for-10 with two doubles and four RBI. Homan is 4-for-6 with four runs and one RBI.

In pinch-hitting roles, the Aggies are batting .407 (11-for-27) with two doubles, one home run and five RBI. Davis is 3-for-6 with one home run and three RBI as a pinch-hitter. **JONATHAN MORONEY** and Pennington each have two pinch-hits.

This season, Hendrix has been bring the heat with a 14.85 strikeouts per nine innings clip. On the year, the junior northpaw is 0-0 with a 2.03 ERA and five saves, yielding four runs, three earned, on four hits and nine walks while striking out 22 in 13.1 innings. He boasts a .087 opponent batting average and 0.98 WHIP.

For his career, Hendrix is 6-6 with a 3.78 ERA and nine saves in 44 appearances, including six starts. He has a 100 strikeouts in 81.0 innings of work.
