On The Aggies

- The Aggies have started 3-1, and have been at least 3-1 through 4 games in 11 of the last 12 seasons
- Four Aggies scored in double figures in each of the first four games, with Chennedy Carter, Khaalia Hillsman, Anriel Howard and Danni Williams reaching that mark in all four games
- Carter is the first Aggie freshman to score in double figures in each of her first four games since at least 2000-01. Carter has scored 15+ points in all four of her career games
- Howard has posted double-doubles in all four games this season, and is looking to become the first Aggie since Kelsey Bone in 2012-13 with five straight double-doubles
- Hillsman became the 29th Aggie with 1,000 career points and first to reach that milestone since 2014-15 on Nov. 22
- The Aggies are ranked No. 19 in the Associated Press Top 25, and No. 25 in the USA Today/Coaches' Poll
- Texas A&M returns 73.5% of its scoring and 78.8% of its rebounds in 2017-18. The Aggies only return 27.6% of their assists in 2017-18.
- Khaalia Hillsman was voted Preseason First Team All-SEC by the league's coaches, plus Anriel Howard and Danni Williams were voted Preseason Second Team All-SEC. The Aggies were picked to finish fourth.
- The Aggies welcome in the nation's No. 8 recruiting class this season, with Chennedy Carter, N'dea Jones, Emer Nichols, Jada Walton and Kayla Wells joining the squad
- Texas A&M is 56-11 in Reed Arena since the start of the 2013-14 season, and are 149-5 against unranked teams at Reed Arena since February 2005
- Khaalia Hillsman ranks fourth and Anriel Howard ranks sixth on Texas A&M's career double-double list
- Texas A&M went 22-12 in 2016-17, qualifying for its 12th straight NCAA Tournament and winning 20+ games for the 12th straight season.
- Texas A&M head coach & Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Gary Blair is tied for 12th all-time in career wins with a 742-305 career record. He is eighth among active coaches.

Strong Second Half Leads Aggies Past Little Rock

- Khaalia Hillsman scored her 1,000th career point, helping Texas A&M defeat Little Rock 66-49 on Nov. 22
- Texas A&M went on a 16-3 run to start the third quarter, breaking a 30-30 halftime tie, and never letting the Trojans closer than 10 points after that
- Danni Williams led the Aggies with 18 points and 3-of-3 shooting from beyond the arc

Carter is the First Texas A&M Freshman To...

- Start a career with 4 games of 10+ points
- Score 20+ points in a game since Courtney Walker in 2012-13
- Start a season opener at point guard since A'Quonesia Franklin in 2004-05, and just the second to do so under Gary Blair
- Start a season opener at any position since Courtney Walker in 2012-13
- Score 15 points in her debut since Ashley Bolden in 2004-05, which ties for the freshman debut record

Carter's Freshman Scoring Pursuit

- Chennedy Carter is on pace to set the Texas A&M freshman scoring average record.
- She leads SEC freshmen in points per game

Hillsman becomes 29th Aggie With 1,000 Points

- Khaalia Hillsman scored her 1,000th career point on Nov. 22, becoming the 29th Texas A&M player to reach that milestone, and the first since Courtney Walker and Courtney Williams reached that milestone in 2014-15

Aggies 40-2 When Leading Or Tied After 3 Quarters

- Since women's basketball changed to the four quarter system, Texas A&M is 40-2 when leading or tied after three quarters. (Leading: 37-2, Tied: 3-0)
- The losses were a 59-58 setback at No. 2 South Carolina on Jan. 17, 2016 and a 72-67 loss against No. 3 Mississippi State on Feb. 19, 2017

Hillsman, Howard & Williams Named Preseason All-SEC

- Three Aggies were named to the Preseason All-SEC Team by the league's coaches
- Khaalia Hillsman was named to the First Team
- Anriel Howard and Danni Williams earned Second Team Preseason All-SEC honors

What Comes Back

- The Aggies return 73.5% of their points, 78.8% of their rebounds and 27.6% of their assists from last season's team that went 22-12 and reached the NCAA Second Round
- The Aggies return three starters, and four of their six rotation players from last season's squad

What's Gone

- Texas A&M only had three seniors on last season's roster, but they were all team captains
- Curtcyce Knox, in her one season as a full-time starter, averaged 10.8 points and 8.9 assists, leading the nation in assists. She set the Texas A&M and SEC assist records.
- Taylor Cooper averaged 6.2 points, shooting 41.6% beyond the arc, the second-best 3-point shooting season in Texas A&M history
- Alyssa Michalke only played in 16 games, but provided leadership off the bench. She was the commander of the Texas A&M Corps of Cadets in 2015-16.

Series History - Texas Tech leads 54-21

- The Aggies have won five straight in the series, including a 98-90 overtime victory last year in College Station
- This is Texas A&M's third-most played opponent, trailing just the 86 matchups with Baylor and the 85 games with Texas
- Two of Texas A&M's most historic wins have come against Texas Tech:
- The Aggies upset No. 4 Texas Tech 67-64 in 1994, the Aggies' highest ranked win until 2009, and propelling the Aggies into the Top 25 for the first time in school history
- Texas A&M knocked off No. 7 Texas Tech 72-68 in the 1996 Southwest Conference Tournament championship game, the last SWC game ever played and the first conference championship for Texas A&M

- Texas A&M won in overtime after 22 lead changes and eight ties.
- The last seven seconds of regulation featured three lead-altering shots, including a go-ahead 3-pointer from Danni Williams with 2.7 seconds left
- Williams' 32 points in that game is still her career-high
- Hillsman (17 pts, 12 reb) and Howard (17 pts, 16 rebs) had double-doubles, and Lumpkin had 14 points in that game.

- Danni Williams led the Aggies with 14.0 points per game in the tournament, scoring 10+ in all three games
- Anriel Howard (13.0) and Khaalia Hillsman (13.0) both averaged double digit points in the tournament
- Texas A&M had to rally from deficits of 8+ points to win the first two games in Greenville

AGGIE TRADITIONS**Home of the 12th Man**

- Texas A&M is known by sports fans everywhere as the home of the 12th Man
- The tradition was born out of the willingness to serve. This willing spirit has endured, and today the Aggie student body is known as the 12th Man: united in loyalty, united in support and ready to serve when they are called to do so.

Yell Leaders

- Yell Leaders are a team of upperclassmen, three seniors and two juniors, elected each year by the student body. Aggie Yell Leaders still wear white during games and attend all home women's basketball games, plus postseason. The tradition dates back to 1907.

Reveille

- Reveille, the first lady of Aggieland, is a purebred collie and the official mascot of Texas A&M. As a five-star general, she is the highest ranking member of the Corps of Cadets.

Aggie Ring

- The distinctive Aggie Ring serves as the symbolic link to the Aggie network of former students. The ring is not given, it must be earned academically. It was E.C. Jonas, class of 1894, who designed the ring Aggies wear today. Nothing on the ring has changed, except when the university's name changed to Texas A&M University in 1963.

Gig 'Em

- At a yell practice before the 1930 TCU game, a dedicated fan and member of the Texas A&M Board of Regents named Pinky Downs '06 shouted, 'What are we going to do to those Horned Frogs?' Improvising, he borrowed the name of a sharppronged frog hunting tool, called a gig. 'Gig 'em, Aggies!' he said as he made a fist with his thumb extended straight up. With that, the first hand sign in the old Southwest Conference was born.

GARY BLAIR

15th Season at Texas A&M

Women's Basketball Hall of Fame member, Gary Blair, led Texas A&M to the 2011 NCAA Championship and has transformed the women's basketball program into a national power since his appointment as head coach in 2003.

Blair, a two-time national finalist for the Naismith Coach of the Year Award, has guided Texas A&M to 12 straight NCAA Tournament appearances, and to four conference championships, including the 2013 SEC Tournament Championship.

Blair led the Aggies to their first national title in their first-ever trip to the NCAA Women's Final Four and closed out the 2010-11 season with a 33-5 record, the most victories in program history.

The Aggies have made five appearances in the Sweet Sixteen in the past nine years, and reached the Elite Eight in 2008, 2011 and 2014.

Over the course of his 33-year collegiate coaching career (this includes 2017-18), which includes stops at Stephen F. Austin from 1985-93 and Arkansas from 1993-03, Blair has led his teams to 31 winning seasons, 26 20-win seasons, 23 NCAA Tournament appearances and 35 NCAA postseason victories.

Blair has won a championship at every level of his coaching career, including three state championships at Dallas South Oak Cliff High School, two national championships as an assistant coach at Louisiana Tech, a WNIT Championship at Arkansas and an NCAA championship at Texas A&M.

ON BLAIR'S CAREER

- Blair led Texas A&M to the 2011 NCAA Championship, and 12 straight NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Blair is a member of six Hall of Fames, including the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame
- Blair is one of three coaches who has taken two or more schools to the Women's Final Four, joining Marianne Stanley (Old Dominion & Stanford) and C. Vivian Stringer (Cheyney, Iowa, Rutgers)
- Blair is sixth among active coaches with 23 NCAA Tournament appearances
- Blair has won 20+ games in 26 seasons which is 11th all-time
- Seven of Blair's former players and assistants have gone on to become head Division I women's basketball coaches.
- Blair has won a total of 17 conference and conference tournament championships between the Southland Conference, Big 12, and SEC

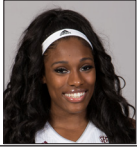
