1982 Season in Review

Boston College 38, A&M 16

Eagle quarterback Doug Flutie threw for three touchdowns and 346 yards to lead Boston College to a 38-16 opening-game victory over the Texas Aggies in Coach Jackie Sherrill's debut as Texas A&M's new head football coach. A crowd of 55,177 and a national television audience looked on.

The 5-10 sophomore riddled the Aggie defense in the first half for 211 yards as BC held a comfortable 24-6 lead at intermission. Flutie spotted split end Jon Schoen behind the A&M defense for a 45-yard touchdown in the first quarter and set up his own eight-yard TD run late in the first quarter with a 55-yard pass to flanker Brian Brennan.

In the second half, with A&M scoring 10 unanswered points to pull within 24-16 behind QB Gary Kubiak's passing and tight end Mark Lewis' five receptions, Flutie again snuffed out the Ag rally with a 32-yard pass to Brennan and later engineered the Eagles' final TD drive culminated by a one-yard run by fullback Bob Biestek, concluding all scoring in the third quarter. Besides the game, Texas A&M also lost the services of Lewis for the year with a knee injury and fullback Earnest Jackson for three weeks.

Texas A&M 61, UTA 22

The Aggies displayed an impressive, potent offensive attack that rang up six touchdowns, while the defense scored another, and David Hardy booted four field goals, all in the second quarter to boost Texas A&M to an easy 61-22 win over UT-Arlington before 54,098 at Kyle Field.

Once again, it was the arm of Kubiak that sparked the Aggies. The senior QB completed 22-of-36 passes for 233 yards and three touchdowns. Senior running back Johnny Hector had a big day, ripping off his longest gain of the year for A&M's first touchdown, a 41-yard dash. Hardy capped an exciting first half by hitting a career-long 57-yard field goal as time expired in the second quarter to give A&M an insurmountable 26-9 lead. Linebacker Jerry Bullitt picked off an errant Maverick pass and returned it 32 yards for a touchdown, while Jeff Fuller led the A&M defense with 14 tackles, 12 unassisted.

But there was a cloud over the victory — the loss of Hector to a shoulder separation.

Texas Tech 24, Texas A&M 15

For the second game in a row, David Hardy capped an explosive second quarter attack by the Aggies with a long field goal, as A&M slipped past NCAA Division I-A power Louisiana Tech 38-27 at Kyle Field before 53,214.

Hardy hit a 56-yard field goal with six seconds to play in the first half, climaxing a 24-point explosion by the Aggies. But the game cost A&M another skill position player — Thomas Sanders, who severely twisted his ankle on a 14-yard touch-down pass from Kubiak in the first quarter. He was lost for the season, and the total lost after the third game of the year was four — three of those running backs.

Kubiak started the big second quarter with a two-yard run; he later found Tommy Sugg for a 20-yard touchdown, sandwiched around a 20-yard run by freshman fullback George Smith. In the fourth quarter, Kubiak teamed up with Jimmie Williams on a 73-yard pass play for a score. The Bulldogs' Matt Dunigan completed 33 of 62 passes for 396 yards and three touchdowns in a losing cause.

With four former offensive performers sitting on the bench with injuries, the Aggies lost their Southwest Conference opener 24-15 to an inspired Red Raider club on Kyle Field before 59,416 and a regional television audience.

A&M placekicker David Hardy put the Aggies out front first as Texas A&M scored eight points in the second quarter on a safety and two long Hardy field goals to head to the locker room up 8-0. But in the third quarter it was all Tech as the Raiders scored three touchdowns while holding the Aggies without a first down throughout the third period. In the fourth quarter, the Aggies came on with a rush, Don Jones scoring on an 18-yard pass to narrow the gap to 21-15 with nine minutes remaining. But in the clutch, the Raiders were too much, as they converted three key third down situations and used up all but two minutes on the clock before kicking the decisive field goal to secure the win.

Houston 24, Texas A&M 20

With running backs Hector and Jackson returning to the fold, the Aggies played one of their best games of the year in the first road contest of the season, losing to Houston 24-20 before 46,302 in the Astrodome.

Returning to his hometown, senior Gary Kubiak had one of his best games of the year, completing 19 of 32 passes for 181 yards and two touchdowns. However, it was a third, a nine-yard apparent scoring pass to tight end John Keilen that was called back by a holding call, that was so costly for the Ags, up 17-14 at the time.

In the fourth quarter, after UH had tied the score 17-17, Kubiak went back to pass, was hit from both sides and the ball popped up into the air. The fumble was recovered by Greg Harmon who returned the ball 20 yards for the clinching touchdown.

Hector caught eight passes for 51 yards and rushed for 37 yards on 12 carries as a highlight for A&M, which dropped to 2-3 on the year.
