Tailback Leeland McElroy's 59-yard touchdown run late in the game propelled the Aggies past the upset-minded Louisiana State Tigers 18-13 in front of 75,504 fans at Tiger Stadium in Baton Rouge, La. McElroy led the Aggies with 132 yards rushing on 11 carries and scored two touchdowns. Aggie quarterback Corey Pullig led the offense to 320 yards, completing 16-of-24 passes for 126 yards enroute to the victory. Redshirt freshman placekicker Kyle Bryant gave the Aggies an early 3-0 lead by kicking a 50-yard field goal on the Aggies' first drive. Bryant returned in the fourth quarter to kick a 47-yard field goal to bring the Aggies within one point of the Tigers, 12-13. The Tigers' big-play minded offense thwarted A&M's Wrecking Crew defense all evening, but the Aggies passed the test, limiting

the Tigers to 251 total yards. The swarming Aggie defenders stifled the Tiger rushing attack, holding LSU to only 25 rushing yards on 32 carries. Brandon Mitchell led the Wrecking Crew with eight tackles, six for a 34-yard loss. In the end, LSU's blitzing defense combined with their big-play offense gave the Aggies the one chance needed to leave Death Valley with a victory.

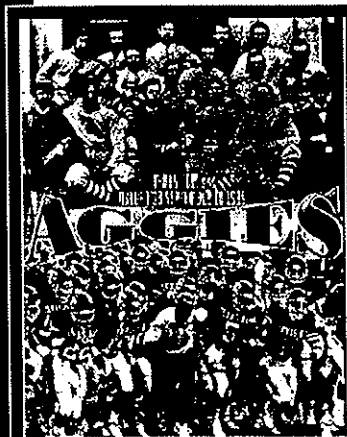

After last season's disappointing 44-14 loss to the Oklahoma Sooners in Norman, Okla., Aggieland graciously welcomed the Sooners. The Aggies earned a measure of revenge by beating Oklahoma 36-14 in front of 72,577 fans at Kyle Field. Corey Pullig passed for a Kyle Field career-high 191 yards and added two touchdowns as he completed 17-of-30 pass attempts. Meanwhile, the potent Aggie offense racked up 359 yards of total offense. Redshirt freshman placekicker Kyle Bryant continued his perfect field goal streak by connecting from distances of 53, 33 and 26 yards to pace the Aggie attack. The Wrecking Crew defense held the Sooner offense to 216 total yards, including only 98 yards on the ground. A&M's defensive secondary was unmatched. Cornerback

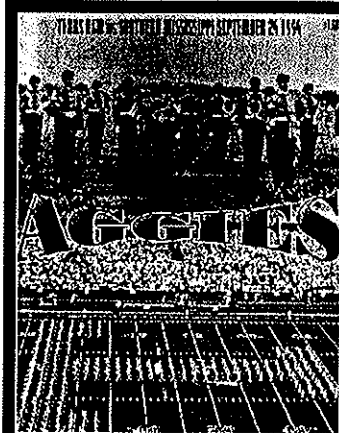

Leeland McElroy's 100-yard return of the opening kickoff electrified the 56,007 fans at Kyle Field and the Aggies never looked back as they sprinted to a 41-17 victory over the Southern Mississippi Golden Eagles. The Aggie's rarely left the ground as the offense rushed for 281 yards and three touchdowns on 61 rushing attempts. Tailback Rodney Thomas rushed for 90 yards on 23 attempts and scored two touchdowns, and McElroy rushed for 85 yards on 15 attempts and scored one touchdown. Quarterback Corey Pullig was perfect when passing. Pullig completed 5-of-5 pass attempts for 129 yards and connected with receiver Ryan Mathews on a fake reverse for a 57-yard touchdown early in the second quarter. Redshirt freshman place-kicker Kyle Bryant extended his perfect field goal streak to seven as he connected from 30 yards and then igniting the crowd by booting a NCAA freshman record 61-yard field goal, as the second quarter was ending. The Aggie defense held the Eagles to only 44 yards on the ground and 243 yards of total offense. Linebacker Reggie Graham led the Wrecking Crew with 10 tackles and defensive end Larry Jackson added 5 tackles and he sacked the Southern Miss quarterback twice. The victory extended the Aggies' Kyle Field winning streak to 22, making it the longest current home winning streak in the nation.

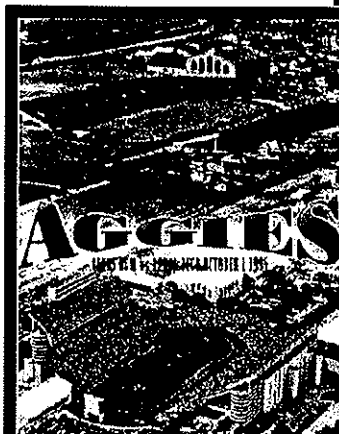

Rodney Thomas rumbled for a season-high 124 yards and two touchdowns on 22 carries as the Aggies won their Southwest Conference opener against the Texas Tech Red Raiders 23-17 in front of 64,242 fans at Kyle Field. On the first drive of the game, A&M's Jason Andrus blocked a punt on the Raiders' 13-yard line and the Aggies began their first drive from the Raiders' 1-yard line. Rodney Thomas scurried into the endzone and the Aggies had taken an early 7-0 lead. The Aggies found themselves down 17-7 at halftime after Tech scored a pair of touchdowns on a fake punt and an interception return late in the half. Down, but not out, the Aggies came out for the second half with a vengeance. The Aggie offense jettied 80 yards in five plays to the endzone. The Wrecking Crew defense held the Raiders scoreless in the second half as the Aggie offense scored 16 unanswered points. The blitzing Aggie defense sacked the Raiders' quarterback five times, limiting their offense to 48 yards rushing and allowing only 255 total yards. Linebacker Reggie Graham led the Wrecking Crew with 10 tackles. The Aggies extended the nation's longest conference winning streak and the nation's longest home winning streak to 23.



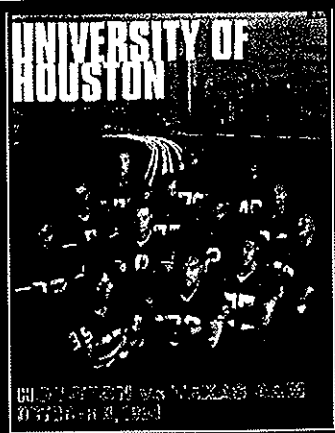

Corey Pullig launched three touchdown passes and racked up 264 yards, while completing 21-of-37 passes as the Aggies trounced the Houston Cougars 38-7 in front of 40,184 fans in the Astrodome. The junior quarterback completed touchdown throws of 4, 36 and 55 yards to receivers Chris Sanders and Ryan Mathews, and running back Wilbert Biggens, respectively. The Aggie offense compiled 405 yards of total offense, 264 yards in the air and 141 yards on the ground enroute to the win. The Cougars had a difficult time moving the ball all evening. True to form, the A&M Wrecking Crew defense held the Cougars to just 85 yards rushing and limited the Cougars to just 128 yards passing. The Aggie defense never allowed the Cougars to complete a third down conversion, forcing a fourth down in 13-of-13 tries. Aggies' free safety Dennis Allen recovered a blocked punt in the Cougars endzone late in the fourth quarter and coupled with a Kyle Bryant point-after attempt, gave the Aggies the 38-7 victory. Linebacker Reggie Brown racked up five tackles and defensive lineman Edward Jasper added three tackles and two quarterback sacks. The victory allowed the Aggies to extend the nation's longest conference winning streak to 24.

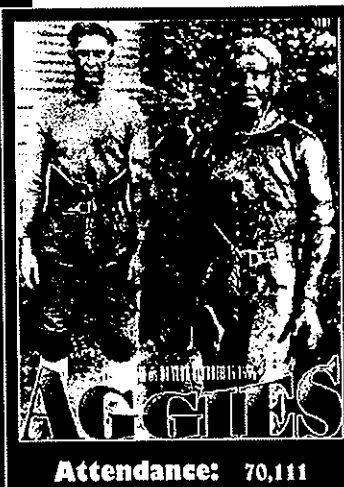

Rodney Thomas rushed for 105 yards on 14 carries and Leeland McElroy ran for 105 yards on 22 carries as the Aggies marched to victory over the Baylor Bears 41-21 in front of 70,111 fans at Kyle Field in the "Battle of the Brazos." The Aggie offense steamrolled 524 yards of total offense on the Bears. Quarterback Corey Pullig completed 15-of-27 passes for 269 yards and two touchdowns as he led the Aggies past the Bears. The Aggies took a 10-7 lead into the locker room at halftime. Determined to put the Bears away early in the second half, receiver Chris Sanders grabbed a short pass by Pullig on the Aggies first play of the third quarter, and scampered 75 yards to the endzone to give the Aggies a 17-7 advantage. The Aggie offense then proceeded to score on every possession thereafter to thoroughly trounce the Bears. The victory allowed the Aggies to maintain first place in the Southwest Conference with a record of 3-0. In addition, they kept alive the nation's longest conference winning streak (25 games) and advance the nation's longest home winning streak to 24 games. The Aggies' defense was paced by linebacker Reggie Brown's nine tackles and defensive back Michael Hendricks's eight tackles.

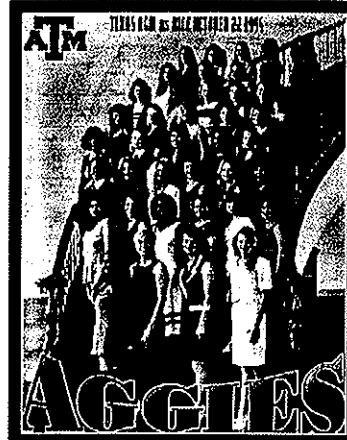

In the lowest scoring game at Kyle Field since 1975, Rodney Thomas caught a swing pass from quarterback Corey Pullig and hurried 60 yards to the endzone for the only touchdown in the Aggies' 7-0 victory over the Rice Owls, before a crowd of 56,214. Thomas rushed for 136 yards on 21 carries and caught two passes for 71 yards, giving him 207 tandem yards for the afternoon. Pullig kept the offense moving, completing 17-of-25 passes and tallying 191 yards in the process. The Aggies totaled 395 yards of offense, 204 yards recorded on the ground. In a game where the wishbone attack of the Owls kept the clock ticking, it was the pressure defense of the A&M Wrecking Crew that kept the Owls from going to the air. The Owls managed only 19 yards through the air on 11 attempts. The victory extended the nation's longest home winning streak to 25 and moved the nation's longest conference winning streak to 26. Linebacker Reggie Graham made 13 tackles to help the Aggie defense and defensive back Donovan Greer added nine tackles.

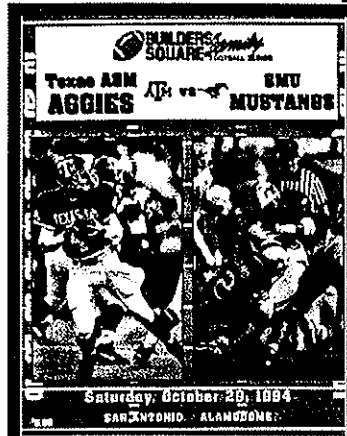

The Aggies' road to an undefeated season, as well as their quest to maintain the nation's longest conference winning streak, ran into a roadblock in the form of a 21-21 final against a fired-up Southern Methodist team at the Alamodome in San Antonio before a crowd of 51,056. The Ponies jumped out to a 14-0 lead and the third quarter had begun before the Aggies could score. Rodney Thomas got the Aggies on the board as he scampered 57 yards for the touchdown. On the first play of the fourth quarter, quarterback Corey Pullig connected with Thomas for a 25-yard touchdown. Despite placekicker Keith Waguespack's failed extra point attempt, the Aggies were within one point of the Mustangs, 13-14. The Aggies soon found themselves down by eight points, but they found away to score on the pesky Ponies. On the ensuing A&M drive, Thomas scurried 35 yards to the endzone. Pullig remained on the field, completed the two-point conversion to receiver Brian Mithcell and the score was tied at 21. With one second remaining, the Aggies had one last chance to win the game. After being benched in the first half, redshirt freshman placekicker Kyle Bryant was brought back into the game to attempt a 67-yard field goal. The kick fell short as did the Aggies' hopes of a perfect season and their strangelhold on the nation's longest conference winning streak.



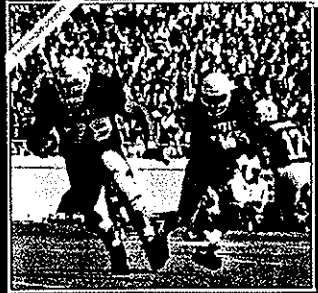

Rodney Thomas compiled 74 all purpose yards enroute to scoring two touchdowns for the 10th Aggie victory over the Longhorns in 11 years. The Aggie offense gave a near perfect performance by not committing a turnover and by allowing quarterback Corey Pullig to complete 13-of-21 passes for 161 yards. A&M's Wrecking Crew defense gave an equally good performance by limiting the Longhorns to just 51 yards rushing. Linebacker Larry Walker led the Aggie defense with 10 tackles and linebacker Antonio Armstrong added six tackles.

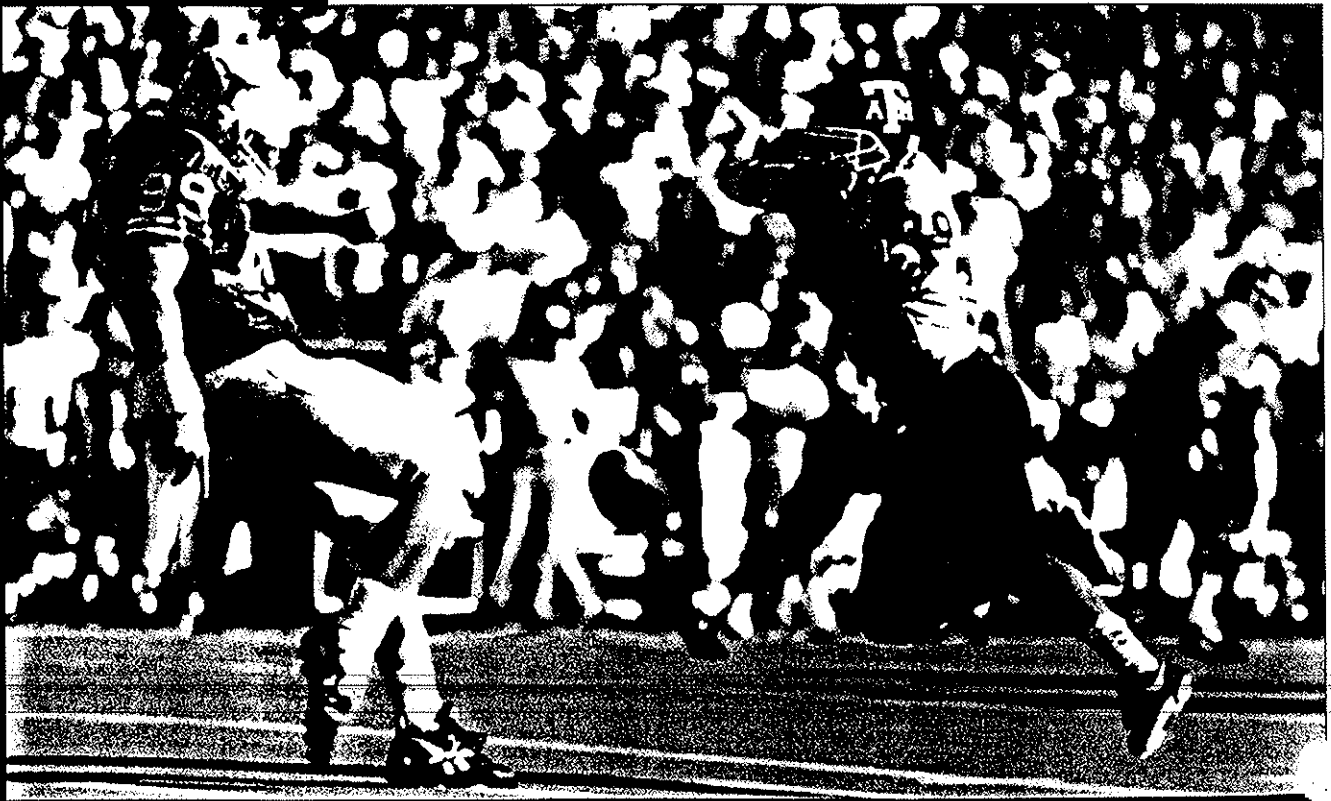
