WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Saturday marks the first meeting between the Mountaineers and Aggies ... A&M's most recent game against a Sun Belt foe was a 41-7 win over Texas State to kick off the 2019 season at Kyle Field.
- Senior WR Ainius Smith looks to extend his streak of 24 consecutive games with at least one reception, which dates back to the 2019 season ... Smith started the 2022 season making a statement, hauling in a pair of 40-plus yard scoring passes and finishing the game with a career-high 164 yards.
- Junior RB Devon Achane was one of the most productive backs in the nation last season, ranking 11th in the FBS with a 700 yard-per-carry average ... He led the A&M offense with 10 trips to the end zone, while also adding a 96-yard kickoff return score.
- Sophomore QB Haynes King regained his starting role after he was named QB1 just ahead of the Week 1 matchup with Sam Houston ... It was a career-day for King against the Bearkats, as he sent a pair of 60-plus yard TD passes down field and finishing the day with 364 yards and three passing touchdowns.
- A key contributor since arriving in Aggieland, DB Demani Richardson returns for his senior season and leads all Aggies with 32 starts through 33 career games ... He helped lead the way in the season opener with five tackles, including a tackle for a 5-yard loss.
- Junior DB Jaylon Jones has started all 22 games of his career he has played in and led the Aggies last season with a pair of picks, while also ranking second on the team with six breakups.
- Junior P Nik Constantinou led the SEC and was 10th nationally in 2021, as he boasted a 46.61 yards-per-punt average on the season ... Constantinou was named to the Ray Guy Award Preseason Watch List and was a semifinalist for the national accolade in 2020.

QUICK HITS

- With Saturday's 31-0 shutout of Sam Houston, the Texas A&M defense hasn't allowed a touchdown on its home turf since last year's South Carolina game on Oct. 23, 2021 -- a streak of 12 quarters without a TD allowed ... During that span the Aggies have kept then-No. 12 Auburn, Prairie View and Sam Houston out of the end zone.
- The Aggies' starting WR trio of senior Ainius Smith, junior Chase Lane and true freshman Evan Stewart combined for 13 catches against Sam Houston -- 10 of which produced a first down or a touchdown ... Leading the way was Smith with his six catches producing two scores and five first downs.
- The A&M defense picked up right where it left off last season, not allowing a touchdown on its home field for the third consecutive game and giving up just 198 yards of offense, including 91 passing yards ... The Aggies finished the 2021 season third in the nation in scoring defense (15.9 ppg) and second in points allowed (191 pts), while also leading the SEC in passing yards allowed (2,312).
- Six of the team's top 10 tacklers return from a season ago, led by junior DB Antonio Johnson, who tallied 79 takedowns in 2021, including 53 solo tackles.
- The Aggies were tied for fifth in the SEC last season with 55 passes defended on the year ... Sophomore DB Tyreek Chappell, who started the final eight games of the season at corner, was fifth in the league after defending 10 passes in 2021.
- The Aggies are 22-4 (.846 win pct.) at Kyle Field under Jimbo Fisher ... In the five seasons prior to Fisher's arrival, the Aggies were 23-12 on their home turf (.657).
- Quick starts have been a harbinger of Aggie victories in the Jimbo Fisher era ... The Aggies are 27-4 when scoring first and a perfect 25-0 when leading after the first quarter.

BRYAN-COLLEGE STATION IS THE HOME OF TEXAS A&M ...

On August 20, 2020 the Texas A&M Board of Regents voted and approved the use of "Bryan-College Station" as the home of Texas A&M University. "Bryan-College Station" should be used to reference all sporting events, academic events, press releases, marketing collateral, letterhead, and other representations of Texas A&M University and The Texas A&M University System where a specific postal address is not required.

Aggieland has grown beyond the boundaries of any one municipality. College Station is known as the "Home of Texas A&M University", but the City of College Station and the City of Bryan have had an entwined history since the City of College Station was incorporated in 1938. Bryan and Texas A&M University's historical ties go back to 1871, when Bryan was incorporated and the Texas Legislature established the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas.

The former Bryan Air Force Base was operated as the Texas A&M University Research and Extension Center for a quarter of a century before being designated as the Texas A&M University Riverside Campus in 1988, and the Texas A&M University Riverside Campus grew into the Texas A&M University Research Annex before transforming into the RELLIS Campus in 2016. The RELLIS Campus is home to Texas A&M University System entities including ten regional universities, the Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX), the Texas A&M Engineering Experiment Station (TEES) and the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI). In 2007, the City of Bryan gifted more than 200 acres to the Texas A&M University Health Science Center.

Recognizing that over the past decade, Texas A&M University and the Texas A&M University System have expanded into the City of Bryan with seven Texas A&M University System colleges, ten Texas A&M University System universities and multiple Texas A&M University System state agencies on more than 2,200 acres with more than \$1 billion in investment, the Board of Regents voted to recognize the long history and partnership between the City of Bryan, the City of College Station and both Texas A&M University and The Texas A&M University System.

MILESTONES TO WATCH FOR

- Senior WR Ainias Smith needs three TD catches to reach the 20-touchdown plateau and crack A&M's all-time top five in the category, which has only been attained previously by Jeff Fuller (34), Josh Reynolds (30), Christian Kirk (26) and Ryan Swope (24) ... He needs six receptions to move into the top 10 of the Aggies' career receptions list, entering the game with 118 to date.
- With two more punt returns, Smith would become the 10th player in school history to log 60 punt returns in his career.
- Junior RB Devon Achane is 28 rushing yards away from moving into the top 40 all-time at A&M as he enters the game with 1,316 and aims to pass Trey Williams' (2012-14) 1,343 career mark.
- Graduate DB Myles Jones cracked the top-10 on A&M's and the SEC's career passes defended lists by season's end in 2020, sitting at 10th all-time at A&M and eighth in SEC history with 28 breakups to-date.

SWISS ARMY KNIFE

- Senior WR Ainias Smith has been called a "Swiss Army Knife" by head coach Jimbo Fisher because of his do-it-all ability on the field.
- Smith made a statement in the first game of his final season in Aggieland, leading the team with six receptions for a career-high 64 yards and a pair of trips to the end zone.
- Smith has recorded seven multi-touchdown games in his career, catching multiple TD passes in a game five times ... Against the Bearkats, Smith hauled in a 63-yard scoring pass to put the Aggies up 17 points at the half and sealed the victory in the fourth quarter with a 43-yard TD grab.
- Dating back to the 2019 LSU game, Smith has caught a pass in 24 consecutive games.
- Smith is the only player in Texas A&M history to gain 250+ yards as a receiver, rusher, punt returner and kickoff returner, and is one of 10 players in SEC history to reach the plateau ... Smith is one of three SEC players to have accomplished the feat in the past decade.
- Against Mississippi State in 2021, Smith became the third player in SEC history to rack up 1,000 receiving yards while also gaining 250+ yards as a rusher and returner (punt and kickoff) ... The others are Kentucky's Randall Cobb (2008-10) and LSU's Skyler Green (2002-05).
- A&M's go-to on punt return, Smith finished the 2021 season 11th in the nation with an 11.3 yards-per-return average, good for third in the SEC ... He recorded the first special teams TD of his career on A&M's first possession of the game against South Carolina when he posted the sixth-longest punt return in SEC history, going 95 yards to the house.

ACHANE IS OFF THE CHAIN

- Junior RB Devon Achane looks to lead the Aggies as the premier back this season after flexing his speed and versatility last year.
- Achane led the SEC and was second in the nation (min. 100 attempts) averaging 7.00 yards per carry last season, while also pacing A&M's kickoff return team that ranked No. 2 in the country, averaging 30.55 yards per return.
- Achane reached the end zone as rusher, receiver and returner in 2021, leading the offense with 10 touchdowns.
- In the win over New Mexico, Achane's success came through the air as he caught all three passes that came his way and finished the day with 45 yards and the second receiving TD of his career.
- Achane put his speed on display in the win over No. 1 Alabama when he returned a third quarter kickoff 96 yards to the end zone.

- Against Prairie View, Achane's two trips to the end zone marked the sixth multi-TD game of his career, fourth of the year ... He also tallied four 100-yard games as a sophomore to bring his career total to six through his first two seasons.
- The talented back also runs track for the Aggies, already receiving NCAA All-America selections in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay ... In April of this year, Achane clocked the sixth-fastest time in A&M history in the 200m (20.20) and posted a time of 10.14 in the 100m at the 2022 Texas Relays.

KING RETURNS AS QB1

- Sophomore QB Haynes King returned to the field for the Aggies in the 2022 season opener against Sam Houston ... King previously earned the starting job in 2021, but suffered a season-ending ankle injury in the first quarter of the Colorado game, A&M's second game of the season.
- King showed Aggieland why he was able to regain his starting job, going 20-for-31 on 364 yards passing and three touchdowns in the lopsided win over the Bearkats.
- The two 60-plus yard touchdown passes by King marked the first time an Aggie QB has sent multiple scoring passes over 60 yards to the end zone since Oct. 15, 2011, when Ryan Tannehill tossed a pair of 68-yard passes to Ryan Swope against Baylor.
- Despite his limited time on the field, King is set to graduate in December 2022 with a degree in management.

MAROON GOONS

- The Texas A&M offensive line returns great experience from last season ... Led by junior Layden Robinson, the Aggies return three of five starters from a year ago.
- Robinson is in his second year as a starter after helping clear the way for one of the top running back tandems in the nation in 2021 ... He was a key reserve in 2020 when A&M became the first school in the last 10 years to lead the SEC in sacks allowed (0.7), tackles for loss allowed (3.8) and yards per carry (5.45) in the same season.
- In 2021, the Maroon Goons cleared the way for a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game on three occasions, as the duo of Isaiah Spiller and Devon Achane rushed for over 100 yards a combined 10 times on the year.
- Sophomores Bryce Foster and Reuben Fatheree II made immediate impacts in their debut seasons as Foster started all 12 games at center and Fatheree II earned a starting role at right tackle for the final nine games of the season ... The pair of newcomers were recognized for their hard work as they were named Freshman All-Americans by the FWAA and The Athletic.
- Sophomore Aki Ogunbiyi, along with redshirt freshmen Matthew Wykoff and Trey Zuhn III, added depth for the Aggies off the bench last season with Ogunbiyi starting four of the eight games he appeared in.

SEASONED SECONDARY RETURNS

- A&M boasts a seasoned secondary that returns four starters, including senior Demani Richardson and junior Jaylon Jones, who have combined to start 54 games.
- In the season opener against Sam Houston, two of A&M's leaders in tackles were from the secondary with Richardson sending the opposing running back 5 yards behind the line of scrimmage and sophomore DB Jardin Gilbert adding the first interception of his career and returning the ball 13 yards in the second quarter.
- The Aggies picked up right where they left off last season, shutting out Sam Houston and limiting the Bearkats to just 198 yards of offense, including 91 yards through the air which marks the sixth game under Coach Fisher that A&M has held its opponent to less than 100 passing yards in a game.
- A&M was one of the best in the nation at limiting

opponents last season, finishing the year second in the country in points allowed (191) and third in scoring defense (15.9) ... A&M led the SEC in yards allowed (3,930) and pass yards allowed (2,312).

- The Aggies return six of their top 10 tacklers from the 2021 season, four of which were secondary starters ... While Richardson boasts the most career tackles on the current roster (177), junior Antonio Johnson is the top returner in the category after tallying 79 tackles, 53 solo last year.
- A&M's 55 passes defended last season was good for fifth among SEC teams ... Sophomore Tyreek Chappell was fifth in the SEC with 10 passes defended in his debut season, nine of which were breakups, which tied him for fourth in the league ... Jones added eight passes defended, putting him in a tie for 13th in the SEC.

JOHNSON EMERGES AS LEADER

- Junior DB Antonio Johnson emerged as one of the SEC's top tacklers among DBs in his first season as the Aggies' starter at nickel in 2021.
- Johnson tallied 79 tackles on the year, which was the second most on the team ... He led the Aggies and was tied for 11th in the SEC with 53 solo takedowns.
- On the season, Johnson led the team in tackles in four games, including against Mississippi State when he tallied a career-high 15 ... He added 11 tackles at Ole Miss to record the second double-digit tackle game of his young career.
- Against Prairie View, Johnson laid the boom on the Panthers' QB to force a fumble and set up an Aggie defensive touchdown as he registered both stats for the first time in his career.
- Johnson was third on the team with five passes defended last season and recorded the first interception of his career when he picked off Missouri in the first quarter and returned the ball 6 yards.

NON-CONFERENCE GRAVEYARD

- Kyle Field is a graveyard for non-conference opponents with the Aggies enjoying a 33-1 record against non-Big 12 or SEC opponents on their home field since 2010.
- Texas A&M's lone out-of-conference loss at Kyle Field in that span was a narrow 28-26 decision to No. 2 Clemson on Sept. 8, 2018.
- Under head coach Jimbo Fisher, the Aggies have posted a record of 9-1 against non-SEC opponents at Kyle Field.

- Since joining the SEC, the Aggies are 28-1 against non-conference foes at Kyle Field.

TEXAS A&M-APP STATE CONNECTIONS

- Texas A&M Associate AD for Football Mark Robinson was an offensive lineman for Appalachian State from 1998-2002 and graduated with his degree in communications in 2002. The Mountaineers were ranked in the top 10 in the nation in I-AA and earned playoff bids all five seasons. He set the school record with a 615-pound squat lift and received the Strongest Player Award on the team his senior year. ... App State WR coach Lawrence Dawsey served on Jimbo Fisher's coaching staff at Florida State from 2010-17. In addition to overseeing the wide receivers in Tallahassee, Dawsey served as the Seminoles' passing game coordinator from 2010-12 and the co-offensive coordinator from 2013-17.

NEW FACES, NEW ROLES

- The Aggies have welcomed 41 freshmen and a pair of new coaches for the 2022 season, as well as four transfers.
- The A&M coaching staff saw a shift in roles during the offseason as Elijah Robinson was promoted to Assistant Head Coach/Run Game Coordinator, while also remaining as the defensive line coach ... James Coley has joined Darrell Dickey in the role of offensive coordinator, and moved position groups to coach the wide receivers while Dickey will now oversee the tight ends ... Tyler Santucci was promoted to co-defensive coordinator and remains with the linebackers ... After spending his first four seasons in Aggieland as the WR coach, Dameyune Craig will work with the quarterbacks this season ... Brandon Sanders was promoted to head strength & conditioning coach in the offseason after serving as an assistant in the weight room for the last four seasons.

- A versatile athlete, Choate was a two-year letterman in both football and lacrosse at Coppell High School (Coppell is a suburb of Dallas with a population of 42,982) ... Rated the nation's No. 5 long snapper at the Kohl's Kicking Camp ... ESPN.com ranked him as the nation's No. 7 long snapper ... In 2016, helped Coppell High School to a 10-3 record and a 6-1 Class 6A Region II District 9 mark (second in district) ... The Cowboys advanced to the 6A Division I Region 2 semifinal round ... Following his senior campaign, invited to play in the Blue-Grey All American Bowl at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas ... Earned the school's lacrosse Iron Man Award in 2015 and 2016.

- In honor of the tradition, the Texas A&M student body "stands ready" to show their support of their team on the field.

(Source: MyAggieNation.com) Beginning in 1991, a single 12th Man was chosen to represent the study body on the kickoff unit.

- Jimbo Fisher is one of five active coaches to have won a National Championship.
- Fisher was hired at Texas A&M on Dec. 4, 2017 after eight successful seasons at Florida State, which included the 2013 BCS National Championship.
- Guided the Aggies to their first New Years Six bowl appearance, topping No. 13 North Carolina in the Orange Bowl to finish the 2020 season at 9-1 following a grueling SEC-only regular season slate.
- In his eight seasons in Tallahassee, Fisher established himself as one of the elite coaches in college football. He led the Seminoles to an 83-23 record, winning three Atlantic Coast Conference championships, four Atlantic Division titles and five bowl games.
- Fifteen of Fisher's student-athletes have earned consensus All-America honors with quarterback Jameis Winston winning the Heisman Trophy in 2013.
- Fisher has seen 164 of his student-athletes graduate, and NFL teams drafted 68 of his players, including 23 first- or second-round selections.
- The Seminoles set a modern-day NFL draft record with 29 players selected over a three-year period (2013-15), and Fisher had a first-round NFL draft choice every year he was head coach at FSU.
- The 2013 Rawlings College Football Coach of the Year, Fisher has twice been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award (2013, 2014) and was a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year Award in 2014 as well as in 2020.
- Fisher has been active in the community through his foundation, Kidz1stFund. The non-profit was founded in 2011 to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for Fanconi anemia, a rare blood disorder that affects thousands, including Fisher's youngest son, Ethan.
- Fisher's oldest son, Trey, is a junior quarterback at Florida A&M.
- Fisher played quarterback at Salem College for Terry Bowden for three seasons and followed Bowden to Samford for his final season. Fisher became NCAA Division III's national player of the year in 1987 and earned induction into Samford's Hall of Fame.

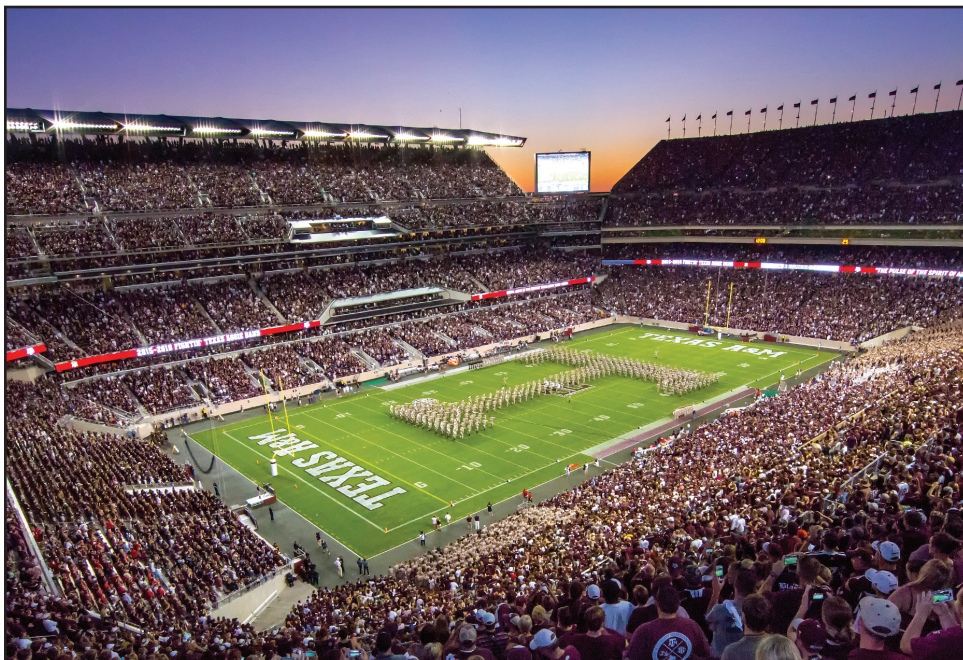

Texas A&M ranked No. 3 nationally in home attendance in 2021 with an average of 102,883 and has drawn more than a half-million fans to Kyle Field every season since 2006, with the exception of the pandemic-limited 2020 campaign.

- Texas A&M finished a \$485 million redevelopment of Kyle Field in time for the 2015 season that made the Home of the 12th Man the largest football stadium in the SEC and the state of Texas.
- Texas A&M has led the SEC in home attendance five times since joining the league in 2012, including the past two seasons.
- A&M was one of three teams nationally to average over 100,000 in home attendance in 2021. Kyle Field averaged 102,883 in home attendance last year with a total of 720,181 fans attending seven home games.
- Two of the top three crowds in Kyle Field history were from the 2021 season with 109,835 for Auburn on Nov. 6 and 106,815 for Alabama on Oct. 9. Kyle Field's all-time record crowd was 110,633 for the Texas A&M-Ole Miss contest on Oct. 11, 2014 when capacity was expanded to over 107,000 during the stadium redevelopment.

AINIAS SMITH

- Senior WR Ainias Smith has been one of the most versatile contributors on offense and special teams throughout his career.
- A triple-threat, Smith arrived in Aggieland as a wide receiver and moved to running back prior to the 2019 Texas Bowl, serving in that role through 2020. Last season he returned to wide receiver where he led the team with 47 receptions and six touchdowns and was second with 509 yards.
- The speedster was named to the Preseason Coaches All-SEC First Team as an all-purpose player and return specialist on the third team.
- Smith has recorded a reception in 24 consecutive games, dating back to the 2019 LSU game. Over that span, he has had 11 games in which he has had five-or-more catches and six with at least 75 yards.
- Smith started the 2022 season with a statement, racking up a career-high 164 receiving yards and adding two 40-plus yard touchdown grabs. His pair of aerial scores marked the seventh multi-touchdown game of his career and his fifth multi-receiving TD game.
- Smith is currently in a tie for seventh on A&M all-time list with recent Texas A&M Hall of Fame inductee and Super B'sowl Champion Mike Evans with 17 career TD grabs.
- Throughout his career he has handled the punt return duties where he has averaged 9.7 yards per return with one touchdown. Last season, he ranked third in the SEC and 11th nationally at 11.3 yards per return. As a freshman, he was the kickoff return specialist.
- Smith currently ranks 11th all-time in A&M school history in career punt return yards at 524 and needs 79 more to crack in to the top 10 (Chris Taylor, 581).
- Against South Carolina in 2021, Smith returned a punt 95 yards to the end zone. Smith's 95-yard return is tied for the sixth-longest in SEC history.
- In the Aggies' upset over No. 1 Alabama, Smith led the Aggie wideouts with six catches for 85 yards and two touchdowns. In the game-tying drive, Smith hauled in two catches for 42 yards, including a 25-yard touchdown that tied the game with 3:00 remaining.
- Smith led the team in total touchdowns (10) in 2020, becoming the first Aggie to average a touchdown per game for an entire season since Trayveon Williams in 2018.
- Smith is already the only player in school history with 200+ career yards in rushing (373), receiving (1,321), punt return (524) and kick return (257). The rarity has only been achieved by 14 SEC players, including notables like Carnell "Cadillac" Williams of Auburn, Randall Cobb of Kentucky and Chris Rainey of Florida.
- Smith was not unfamiliar with the SEC prior to committing to Texas A&M, as his brother Maurice Smith was a cornerback at Alabama before transferring after graduation to Georgia. Maurice played four seasons in the NFL with the Miami Dolphins, Washington Football Team, Cincinnati Bengals and Tennessee Titans.

DEVON ACHANE

RB • JR-2L • MISSOURI CITY, TEXAS [FORT BEND MARSHALL]

- Junior RB Devon Achane has electrified crowds with his dazzling speed and is coming off a stellar sophomore campaign in which he rushed for 910 yards and a team-best nine touchdowns on 130 carries.
- Achane ranked first in the SEC and No. 2 in the FBS among players with 100-or-more carries as he averaged 7.0 yards per carry. Additionally, he led the team in all-purpose yards at 1,472, which ranked fifth in the conference.
- He totaled 11 touchdowns (9 rushing, 1 receiving, 1 kickoff), which was the most by an A&M player last season.
- Achane was named to the Maxwell Award, Hornung Award and Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch Lists as well as the Preseason Coaches All-SEC Second Team as a running back and third team all-purpose player. He was also recognized as a second team running back and all-purpose player by the league's media.
- Known for his playmaking ability, Achane recorded 27 20-plus yard plays last season, 17 more than Aini Smith, who finished second on the team with 10.
- Against Prairie View, Achane rushed for two scores in the first half, marking his sixth multi-touchdown game of his career.
- At Ole Miss, Achane recorded his fifth-career 100-yard game as he ran for 110 yards on 12 carries and added two scores.
- Achane led the Aggies versus South Carolina as he rushed for a career-high 154 yards off 20 carries and a touchdown.
- Against Alabama, Achane returned a kickoff 96 yards to the end zone midway through the third quarter to help the Aggies upset the top-ranked Tide.
- A&M's kickoff return game ranked among the nation's best as the group ranked No. 2 with 30.55 kickoff return yards per game.
- Achane earned 2020 Orange Bowl MVP honors after his breakout performance with 140 rushing yards and two touchdowns as the Aggies defeated North Carolina, 41-27.
- The Missouri City, Texas, native also is an NCAA All-American sprinter for the track & field team in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m relay. On April 2, 2022, Achane clocked the sixth-fastest time in A&M history in the 200m (20.20), and clocked a 10.14 in the 100m at the 2022 Texas Relays.

- Richardson helped lead the way for the Aggies in the season opener as he tallied five takedowns, including one for a 5-yard loss as the defense held the Bearkats scoreless and limited them to just 198 yards of offense.
- Last season, Richardson was third on the team with 65 tackles and added an interception, 2.0 sacks, a forced fumble and three pass breakups.
- He was a key cog for A&M's defense that ranked as the No. 3 scoring defense in the country last season (15.9) and topped the SEC in total yards allowed. Additionally, the defense ranked in the top 20 in passing defense (192.7) and was tied for fifth in the league in passes defended (55).
- At Ole Miss, Richardson logged a career-high 13 tackles as well as 2.0 tackles for loss and forced a fumble.
- In the upset win over No. 1 Alabama, he recorded his third career interception as he picked off Bryce Young in the endzone.
- Richardson, who represented Texas A&M at SEC Media Days, closed out the regular season strong as he broke up a pair of passes, tallied his second sack of the season, had 2.0 tackles for loss and registered seven tackles.
- Richardson helped the Aggie defense hold No. 12 Auburn to just three points, their lowest offensive output since 2012, as he made four tackles, 1.0 sack and two QB hurries.
- He was given the Defensive Production Award and Defensive Aggie Award for strength & conditioning at the team's annual banquet.

- Johnson helped lead the way for the Aggies in the season opener, making four tackles, including a sack for a 1-yard loss as the defense held the Bearkats scoreless and limited them to just 198 yards of offense.
- The East St. Louis, Illinois, native ranked in the top-11 in the SEC and led the Aggies with 53 solo takedowns in 2021.
- He was a leader for Aggie defense that ranked No. 3 nationally in scoring defense last season (15.9) and led the SEC in total yards allowed. Additionally, the defense ranked in the top 20 in passing defense (192.7) and was tied for fifth in the SEC in passes defended (55).
- Last season, Johnson led the Aggies in tackles in three games.
- According to Pro Football Focus, Johnson is one of the highest graded Power 5 CB's in the country with a defensive grade of 88.6.
- Against Prairie View, Johnson blitzed and rocked the Panthers' QB, forcing him to fumble and allowing teammate Aaron Hansford to scoop-and-score.
- Against Ole Miss, Johnson registered a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss as part of his second double-digit tackle performance of his career (11).
- Against Missouri, Johnson picked off a pass and returned it 6 yards, recording his first career interception.
- Against Mississippi State, Johnson recorded the first double-digit tackle game of his career, tallying 15 takedowns, the most by an Aggie since 2017.
- Johnson was an early enrollee at A&M, arriving on campus in January 2020 ... He was a four-star recruit according to all three major outlets and played in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl following his senior season.



HAYNES KING

QB • SO-1L • LONGVIEW, TEXAS [LONGVIEW]

- Sophomore QB Haynes King returns to the field for the Aggies as QB1 after missing the majority of the 2021 season due to a season-ending ankle injury.
- King made an impactful return to the field in the 2022 season opener as he went 20-for-31 on 364 yards passing and three touchdowns, connecting with sophomore WR Yulkeith Brown for 66 yards to put the Aggies on the board in the first quarter and with senior WR Alnias Smith for 63 yards just before the half.
- King registered the first 300-yard passing game since Kellen Mond threw for over 300 yards against Florida in 2020, and was the first Aggie to send two 60-plus yard touchdown passes to the end zone since Oct. 15, 2011, when Ryan Tannehill tossed a pair of 68-yard passes to Ryan Swope against Baylor.
- After being named the starter during 2021 fall camp, King went 21-for-33 with 292 yards and two touchdowns in the season opener against Kent State before suffering season-ending ankle injury in the first quarter of the Colorado game in Denver. Despite missing the season, King never stopped working and eventually earned the Offensive Aggie Award for strength & conditioning at the annual team banquet.
- King played in two games during his redshirt season in 2020, connecting with TE Max Wright on a 45-yard crossing route for the first TD pass of his young career.
- Haynes played high school football for his father, John King, who was a four-year starter on the offensive line at Northwestern State. John was hired as the head coach at Longview High School in 2004 and in 2008 helped the Lobos to their first state championship since 1937. Haynes became a state champion under his father's guidance in 2018, throwing for 423 yards and adding 65 more on the ground.

- Diggs recorded the first sack of his career in the 2021 season-opening win over Kent State.
- A standout on both sides of the ball at Woodrow Wilson High School, Diggs was named the New Jersey Gatorade Player of the Year in 2019. He finished his senior year with 65 receptions for 1,035 yards and 11 touchdowns, adding 95.5 tackles and more than 60 QB hurries.

The No. 6 Texas A&M football team dominated the Sam Houston Bearkats, 31-0, recording the program's first season-opening shutout since 1993 at Kyle Field.

Haynes King threw for a career-best 364 yards and recorded three touchdowns through the air. Ainius Smith hauled in six passes for a career-high 164 yards and two touchdowns.

The defense stifled the Bearkat attack, giving up only 182 total yards and recording two takeaways. Jardin Gilbert matched a career-high five tackles and hauled in the first interception of his career. Andre White Jr., broke up two passes and forced a fumble that halted a Sam Houston drive in A&M territory midway through the fourth quarter.
