

Texas A&M Football Post Game Notes

No. 5/5 Texas A&M 34, Florida 17 Kyle Field (Bryan-College Station, Texas) Saturday, October 11, 2025 Attendance: 105,086

About the Win

- The Aggies improved to 6-0 overall, matching the team's best overall start since 2016.
- The Maroon & White are also 3-0 in conference play for the second consecutive year and third time since joining the SEC in 2012 (2016).
- In Texas A&M's first season under head coach **Mike Elko** in 2024, the Aggies won their first five SEC contests.
- With the victory, the Aggies earned bowl eligibility for the third-straight season.
- The victory marked the 30th of Elko's career as a head coach.
- Saturday's crowd of 105,086 marked the 10th-straight home game with 100,000-plus fans in attendance. It was the fourth above-capacity game in five home contests in 2025.

Offense

- The Aggies' 34 points were the most allowed by Florida this season.
- With 33:42 in time of possession, the Aggie have now controlled the ball for at least 33:42 in all three SEC games.
- Redshirt sophomore QB **Marcel Reed** passed and rushed for a touchdown in a game for the seventh time in his career. He is responsible for 39 career touchdowns, putting him in a tie for eighth all-time at A&M with **Stephen McGee**.
- Junior WR **KC Concepcion**'s second reception of the night was the 150th of his career. Concepcion finished the game with a team-high four catches for 46 yards.
- Sophomore WR Mario Craver got loose for a 67-yard reception and has now recorded a reception of 65-plus yards in three games this season. He finished with a game-high 77 yards (tie) on two catches. With his output on Saturday, Craver surpassed the 1,000-yard plateau in receiving yards in just his 15th career game.
- Senior RB **Le'Veon Moss**' 22-yard rushing touchdown was his sixth of the season and 22nd of his career. The scoring scamper was a season-long as well.
- Freshman RB **Jamarion Morrow** scored the first touchdown of his collegiate career on a 22-yard reception.
- The Aggies' tight end corps contributed eight catches for 78 yards with graduate student **Nate Boerkircher** and junior **Theo Melin Öhrström** leading the way with three grabs.
- The two-play, 75-yard and 54-second scoring drive was the fastest game-opening drive for A&M since 2018 against NC State in the Gator Bowl, which was two plays, 71 yards and 32 seconds.
- Texas A&M reached the end zone on its first three drives, marking the first time the Aggies have scored a TD on the first three drives against an SEC opponent since 2021 at Mizzou.

Defense

The Texas A&M defense limited the Gators to just 74 rushing yards on 24 carries. Florida became
the third-straight SEC opponent the Aggies have held to 77-of-fewer rushing yards in a contest. It
also marked the first time since 2021 Texas A&M has held three consecutive SEC foes to under

- 100 rushing yards. After three SEC games, Texas A&M is allowing just 67.7 yards per contest and 2.6 yard per rushing attempt. For the season, the Aggies have held four-of-six opponents under 78 rushing yards.
- Senior DE Cashius Howell logged his eighth sack of the season and now has had at least 1.0 sack
 in three consecutive games, becoming the first Aggie to do so since Edgerrin Cooper in 2023.
 Additionally, Howell added 1.0 tackle for loss, pushing his career number to 30.5.
- Junior LB **Daymion Sanford** set up the Aggies' first scoring drive of the second half after he forced his first career fumble that was recovered by junior LB **Taurean York** at the Florida 29. Sanford finished with a team-high eight tackles, 1.0 tackle for loss, one pass breakup, one quarterback hurry and one forced fumble.
- Senior DT **Albert Regis'** strip sack in the second quarter was his second sack of the season and the first forced fumble of his career. He finished with four tackles, including three solo stops, with a quarterback pressure and one pass breakup.
- Senior CB **Tyreek Chappell** had season highs with five tackles and two pass breakups, while also chipping in with 0.5 tackle for loss.

Special Teams

- Redshirt sophomore P **Tyler White** averaged a season-high 48.8 yards on four punts with one kick downed inside the Florida 20.
- Graduate student K **Randy Bond** connected on a pair of field goals, raising his career total to 67, which is just four behind the school record of 72 set by **Seth Small** (2018-21).
