## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- Texas A&M made it four straight victories, opening league play with a 75-72 win over LSU at Reed Arena to start league play 1-0 for the fourth time in the last five years.
- The Maroon & White have dished out at least 20 assists in eight of their last 10 games ... The Aggies are No. 2 in the country averaging 21.4 assists per game.
- Graduate Rashaun Agee ranks second in the SEC with six double-doubles on the season after leading the Aggies with 15 points and 11 rebounds against LSU ... Agee ranks fourth in the league averaging 8.4 boards per outing, while his 118 total rebounds are the third-most in the SEC.
- Sophomore Rubén Dominguez has been a consistent threat from beyond the arc this season, ranking 13th in the country averaging 3.5 3's per game, while his 49 total 3's and 46.7 shooting percentage rank among the top-15 nationally.
- As a team, the Aggies are 11th in the nation and second in the SEC averaging 11.4 made 3's per outing.

- Senior Rylan Griffen closed out non-conference play strong, averaging 11.7 points, 3.7 assists and 3.3 steals through the final three games.
- The Maroon & White are third in the country averaging 43.0 bench points per game on the year ... The Aggies have seen at least 40 points come from non-starters in nine games this season, including 45 in the win over Prairie View.
- Junior Pop Isaacs has been strong off the bench as of late, scoring in double-figures in each of the last three games, including a season-high 15 points on 5-of-7 shooting from beyond the arc against East Texas A&M and an 11-point effort against LSU.
- The Aggies shot a season-best 65-percent (48-74) from the field and 50-percent (14-28) from 3-point range against East Texas A&M.
- Texas A&M leads the all-time series with the Tigers, 16-7, and have claimed four of the last five meetings ... Last season, the Aggies took down No. 1 Auburn, 83-72, at Reed Arena marking the program's first victory over a top-ranked opponent.

**RECORD-SETTING AGGIES**

- The Aggies closed out non-conference play with their sixth 100-point game of the season, topping Prairie View 111-82 to set a new program record for 100-point games in a season ... Texas A&M previously tallied five 100-point games in 1978-79 and 1975-76.
- In the win over Manhattan, the Maroon & White went off from 3-point range courtesy of a record-setting night from sharp-shooter Rubén Dominguez ... As a team, the Aggies took down the record for 3-pointers in a game, sinking 18 of their 37 attempts ... Dominguez was 10-of-14 from beyond the arc to make the most 3's in a game all-time at A&M.
- Texas A&M scored the most points in Reed Arena and tallied the second-highest point total in a game in program history with a 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State earlier in the year.

**100+**

- Texas A&M has put its high-power offense on display from the start of the season, setting a new scoring record in Reed Arena and tallying the most 100-point games in program history through just the non-conference portion of the schedule.
- The Aggies had a strong finish to non-conference play, stringing together three-straight 100-point games, topping Jacksonville 112-75, taking down East Texas A&M 118-77 and closing things out with a 111-82 victory over Prairie View for their program record sixth 100-point game of the year.
- The Maroon & White notched their second-highest point total in a game and scored the most points in Reed Arena with a 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State.
- With the 109-68 win over Manhattan, the Aggies recorded multiple 100-point games in a season for the first time since 2015-16 when they topped USC Upstate 104-64 and Southeastern Louisiana 100-58.
- In the second game of the year, Texas A&M registered a 104-70 win over Texas Southern, marking the first time the Aggies scored 100 points in a game since topping Dallas Christian 102-52 in 2021.

**A HELPING HAND**

- The Aggies rank second in the nation in assists per game, averaging 21.4 on the year and are fourth in assist per made field goal (68%) ... Jacari Lane leads the team and ranks among the top-15 in the SEC with 48 total assists on the season, while his 3.2 assist/turnover ratio is fourth in the league.
- In the win over East Texas A&M, three players dished out five-or-more assists as Lane and Pop Isaacs led the way with six apiece and Rylan Griffen added five to help the Maroon & White match their season high with 32 assists.
- Against Manhattan, Texas A&M tallied a near-school record 32 assists, led by Lane with a season-high seven, on 39 made field goals.

**EVERYBODY EATS**

- The Aggies have shared the load on the offensive side of the floor, seeing five-or-more players score in double figures in seven games so far this season.
- In the SEC opener, Texas A&M saw 10 of the 11 players that logged minutes score points to help the Maroon & White earn a 75-72 win over LSU.
- Six players scored in double figures in the 112-75 win over Jacksonville where 14 of the 15 Aggies that entered the game registered points ... Rylan Griffen led the way with 19 points, landing 5-for-6 shots from beyond the arc, and Jamie Vinson added a career-high 14 points, going a perfect 6-for-6 from the field.

- The Aggies notched their highest point total at Reed Arena in the 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State as six players scored in double figures in the win ... Marcus Hill (7-7), Mackenzie Mgbako (6-6), Rubén Dominguez (6-6), Noah Shelby (4-4), Jacari Lane (2-2) and Jeremiah Green (2-2) were perfect from the free throw line as A&M connected on 42 free throws, the second-most in a game in program history.
- In the win over Montana, Griffen led five players in double figures with 17 points, while Rashaun Agee registered his first double-double as an Aggie with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

**AGGIES FROM 3**

- The Maroon & White have seen success from 3-point range throughout the season, setting new program records and ranking among the top 3-point shooting teams in the nation.
- The Aggies had a record-setting performance from beyond the arc in the win over Manhattan as they knocked down a program-best 18 3's, taking down the previous record of 16 set against Savannah State in 2017.
- Rubén Dominguez led the way against the Jaspers with a school record 10 3-pointers in the victory, shooting an impressive 71.4-percent from long range ... He connected on four in the first half and six in the second, scoring all his points from beyond the arc to register the first 30-point game of the season for the Aggies.
- Nationally, Dominguez ranks 13th making 3.5 per game and 14th with 48 total makes on the year, both totals are also good for top-three in the SEC ... He also ranks among the top-15 in the country and four in the league shooting 46.7-percent from beyond the arc.
- As a team, Texas A&M ranks 11th in the country and second in the SEC knocking down 11.4 3's per game.
- Against East Texas A&M, Pop Isaacs had his best shooting night from beyond the arc this year, burying five of his seven 3-point attempts en route to a season-best 15-point night.
- Rylan Griffen was an efficient 83-percent (5-6) from long range in the win over Jacksonville to lead the way with 19 points ... Earlier in the year he shot 57-percent from beyond the arc against the Jaspers, making four of his seven attempts to add 17 points ... The Manhattan game marked the second time this season Griffen has connected on three-or-more 3's.

**STRONG OFF THE BENCH**

- The Aggies continue to use a consistent rotation, as 10 players average at least 10 minutes per outing.
- Texas A&M ranks third in the nation averaging 43.0 points off the bench ... Pop Isaacs leads the way averaging 9.3 points per game off the bench ... He closed out non-conference play strong going 5-of-7 to finish with a season-best 15 points against East Texas A&M and added 13 points in the win over Prairie View.
- Jamie Vinson has seen increased minutes and had a career game in the win over Jacksonville, putting up 14 points after going a perfect 6-for-6 from the field.
- Zach Clemence has added depth down low for the Maroon & White, ranking second on the team with 48 rebounds (3.4) ... Against Mississippi Valley State, Clemence scored a career-high 15 points, knocking down four of his five attempts from 3-point range ... He made it back-to-back games in double figures, going 4-for-4 from the field to chip in 10 points against Montana after a 12-point, five-rebound performance against UCF.

**HEAD COACH BUCKY MCMILLAN**



Bucky McMillan was named the head men's basketball coach at Texas A&M on April 5, 2025. The three-time Southern Conference Coach of the Year arrived in Aggieland after five seasons at the helm at Samford.

Renowned for his innovative and fast-paced offensive and defensive styles of play, known as "Bucky Ball," McMillan transformed Samford into one of the top basketball programs in the Southern Conference. He guided the Bulldogs to three SoCon Championships – two regular season crowns and a tournament title – while compiling a 99-52 record, which included 20-plus victories in each of his last four seasons. He earned SoCon Coach of the Year honors in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

In 2024-25, the Bulldogs ranked No. 13 nationally in scoring offense (82.9 ppg) while ranking in the top-10 in three-pointers attempted and made. Defensively, Samford forced an average of 16.1 turnovers per game, which ranked No. 4 in the country.

Within the SoCon, Samford led the league in scoring, fast break points (14.2/g), steals (9.9/g), turnovers forced, turnover margin (3.2/g), offensive rebounds (13.1/g) and bench scoring (28.5 ppg) as the Bulldogs earned an invitation to the 2025 NIT.

McMillan orchestrated the best season in Samford program history in 2023-24 when the Bulldogs earned their first NCAA Tournament berth in more than 20 years. Samford compiled a school record 29 wins and swept the SoCon regular season and tournament titles for the first time. In the NCAA Tournament, the Bulldogs narrowly lost to Kansas, 93-89, in one of the most memorable games of the tournament. The 2023-24 season included a school record 17-game winning streak and the team was a perfect 18-0 on its home court.

McMillan's path to the collegiate level came after experiencing unprecedented success at the high school level in the state of Alabama. As the head coach of Mountain Brook High School, located just outside of Birmingham, McMillan led the Spartans to five state championships in Alabama's highest classification and advanced to the championship game seven times in his 12 seasons at his alma mater. Named the National Coach of the Year in 2018 by the National High School Coaches Association, McMillan won 333 games at Mountain Brook while averaging nearly 28 wins per season.

McMillan played his college basketball at Birmingham-Southern from 2002 to 2006. He earned his bachelor's degree in education services from Birmingham-Southern in 2007.

As a student at Mountain Brook High School from 1999 to 2002, McMillan received All-State honors from the Birmingham News in 2002 and was nominated for the McDonald's High School All-America Team. The Birmingham News also named him to its All-State Athletic Academic Team.

AGEE LEADS THE WAY

- Rashaun Agee was named a team captain ahead of the 2025-26 season, bringing a strong voice and unselfish attitude to the team, along with a competitive edge and years of experience in the college game.
- Agee is averaging 13.0 points and leads the way, ranking fourth in the SEC, with 8.4 rebounds per game ... His 118 total rebounds rank third among league players, while his 5.9 average on the defensive boards also rank among the top-five in the SEC ... He has registered seven double-digit rebounding games and his six double-doubles are the second-most in the SEC this season.
- The Chicago native had a strong start to SEC play, leading the way with 15 points, including four key points in the closing minutes of the game, and 11 rebounds to help lift the Aggies to victory over LSU.
- The Chicago native made it three consecutive double-doubles when he added 13 points and 11 rebounds in the overtime game against SMU after filling out the stat sheet at Pitt, posting season highs with 21 points, four assists and four steals, while adding 13 rebounds and a pair of blocks ... In the road win over Florida State, Agee matched his career high with 17 rebounds to go with 17 points.
- Agee came to Aggieland after spending last season at USC where he averaged 9.4 points and 4.5 rebounds, leading the team in rebounding eight times.
- After beginning his college career battling injuries at New Mexico State, Agee landed at Bowling Green following a brief JUCO stint ... He averaged 13.3 points and a team-best 9.9 rebounds in 2023-24 for the Falcons to earn All-MAC Second Team accolades.

BUCKY BALL

- Head coach Bucky McMillan's teams are known for their fast-paced play that features aggressive full-court defense and a high-power offensive attack ... McMillan has seen great success with the play, notching four consecutive 20-win seasons while ranking among the top-30 in the nation in multiple offensive and defensive categories.
- Texas A&M has put Bucky Ball on display, ranking in the top-three in the nation and lead the SEC in assists (21.4) and bench points (43.0), while sitting in fifth in points per game (94.7) and 11th in 3-pointers per game (11.4) ... The Aggies also rank fourth among Power 4 teams forcing 16.4 turnovers per game.
- In the month of November, the Aggies registered three 100-point games for the first time since the 1989-90 season, set a new program record for 3-pointers made in a game with 18 against Manhattan and scored the second-most points in a game in A&M history, the most by the Aggies at Reed Arena, with a 120-86 win over Mississippi Valley State.
- The Maroon & White tallied 32 assists on 39 field goals in the win over Manhattan, the second-most helpers in a game all-time at Texas A&M ... Against Mississippi Valley State, the Aggies made the second-most free throws in a game with 42 and their 31 forced turnovers rank in the top-seven in school history.
- To start the year, the Aggies tallied 202 total points which marked the highest point total through the first two games since the 2015-16 season ... The Maroon & White used a huge second half to take down Texas Southern in Game 2, as their 63 points were the most by the Aggies in a half since scoring 65 against Grambling State in 2006 and currently ranks as the fifth-highest total in a half in program history.
- Last season, McMillan's Samford squad ranked in the top 20 nationally in fast break points (14.0 ppg) and scoring offense (82.9 ppg), while also ranking third in steals per game (9.9), fourth in the turnovers forced (16.1/g) and seventh in threes made per game (10.8).

NEW LOOK AGGIES

- Texas A&M welcomed 14 new faces to the roster for the 2025-26 season, retaining just one player, Chris McDermott, from a season ago.
- The Aggies' roster features nine transfers with Power 4 experience in Marcus Hill (NC State), Pop Isaacs (Texas Tech), Rylan Griffen (Alabama, Kansas), Jamie Vinson (Texas), Zach Clemence (Kansas), Noah Shelby (Vanderbilt), Rashaun Agee (USC), Mackenzie Mgbako (Indiana) and Federiko Federiko (Pitt, Texas Tech).
- Mgbako was one of the first players to commit in head coach Bucky McMillan's initial signing class after spending two years at Indiana and going the NBA Draft Combine in the offseason ... Mgbako averaged 12.2 ppg in each of his two seasons with the Hoosiers and was named co-Big Ten Freshman of the Year in 2024.
- Issacs has worked his way back after being out nearly a year due to injury, which cut his lone season at Creighton short ... Through the first eight games last year with the Bluejays, he averaged 16.3 points, 4.8 rebounds and 3.9 assists after putting up 13.9 points and 3.1 assists in two seasons at Texas Tech.
- Agee arrived in Aggieland after spending the 2024-25 season at USC, where he added 9.4 points and 4.5 rebounds per game off the bench.
- Griffen has brought high-level experience to the roster, spending his first two seasons at Alabama before transferring to Kansas in 2024-25 ... Griffen started 33 games and averaged 11.2 points on Alabama's 2024 Final Four squad.
- The Maroon & White also welcomed former professional player Rubén Dominguez from Spain and former North Alabama standout Jacari Lane, as well as Josh Holloway from Samford, Ali Dibba from SIU and freshman Jeremiah Green from Compass Prep in Arizona

WELCOME BACK TO AGGIELAND

- The Texas A&M coaching staff has seen a number of familiar faces return to Aggieland in associate head coach Mitch Cole, assistant coach Kyle Keller, assistant coach Frank Haith and strength & conditioning coach Darby Rich.
- Cole, who served in the same role on McMillan's staff at Samford from 2021-25, and Keller were assistants on Billy Kennedy's staff from 2011-16, helping the Aggies notch a school record 28 wins, claim a regular season SEC title and advance to the Sweet 16 in 2015-16.
- Haith first came to Aggieland as an assistant coach in 1992 and spent three seasons on head coach Tony Barone's staff before taking an assistant coaching job at Penn State ... Haith returned to Texas A&M for one more season in 1996-97 as the associate head coach.
- Rich, who has helped develop 23 NBA players during his career, including six Aggies, also worked with Coach Kennedy, serving as the strength & conditioning coach from 2011-19.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team represented its league in style with Tuesday's 81-73 victory over the Pitt Panthers in ACC/SEC Challenge action from the Petersen Events Center.

Texas A&M went on a 15-2 run late in the game to grab a 75-65 lead with 1:07 remaining. Rashaun Agee's 3-pointer put an exclamation point on the surge as the Aggies pulled ahead by double digits. Pitt hit two 3-pointers and a put-back jumper in the final 48 seconds, but A&M made 6-of-6 from the charity stripe to close the deal.

The Aggies hit 20-of-22 (90.9%) from the foul line, including 16-of-17 (94.1%) in the second half as the Maroon & White held on for their fifth consecutive victory, including back-to-back triumphs over ACC foes.

Texas A&M never trailed the opening act, taking a 35-33 lead into halftime. The Aggies pounced on the Panthers early, building a 10-1 advantage in the first four minutes, but Pitt persisted. The home team shaved the deficit to one point on five occasions. The Maroon & White responded every time, including two layups and a dunk by Agee, who finished the first half with 11 points and seven rebounds.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team matched the school record for 100-point games in a season, registering its fifth of the year with a 118-77 victory over East Texas A&M at Reed Arena Sunday afternoon.

The Aggies (9-3) shot a season-high 64.9-percent (48-74) from the field and 50-percent (14-28) from 3-point range in the win as Rashaun Agee led four players in double figures with 21 points, adding eight rebounds. The Maroon & White matched their season-high with 32 assists, led by Pop Isaacs and Jacari Lane, who tallied six apiece.

Texas A&M dominated in the paint, outscoring the Lions (6-6) 66-24 while holding a 43-36 advantage on the boards. Mackenzie Mgbako, who rounded out the double-digit scorers with 12 points, led the way with nine rebounds.

The Aggies got things going early, using a 16-2 run to go up 20-6 with just over 13 minutes remaining in the first half. Texas A&M continued to push, knocking down four straight 3's around the midway point in the period before a 12-2 spree saw the Aggies take their largest lead of the half, up 48-17 with 5:15 on the clock.

Texas A&M took a 56-35 lead into the break as Marcus Hill led three Aggies in double figures with 13 points, going 5-for-5 from the field. Isaacs knocked down four 3-pointers to tally 12 points and Agee added 10. As a team, Texas A&M shot 67-percent from the field in the opening period and went 7-for-12 (58%) from beyond the arc.

East Texas A&M hung around early in the second half, but the Aggies eventually got the difference back over 30 points with seven minutes left to play to put the game away.

The Aggies led for much of the second half, but eight straight points for LSU got the Tigers back within two and forced a Texas A&M timeout with just under seven minutes to play. LSU turned it into a 12-1 run over 3:37 to take its first lead of the half with 5:33 left in the game.

Four straight points from Rashaun Agee put the game back in Texas A&M's favor, 68-66, with 2:05 on the clock. An Agee layup with 25 seconds remaining gave the Maroon & White a 71-68 lead and LSU was forced to foul in the closing seconds as the Aggies held on for the victory.

The two teams traded baskets to start the game, but back-to-back 3-pointers from Dominguez and Dibba, and a tip-in from Zach Clemence put the Maroon & White up 16-8 with 14:06 on the clock.

Texas A&M remained in control for much of the half until LSU strung together a 14-4 run to go up 34-31 with 1:00 remaining in the half. The Aggies responded quickly as Rylan Griffen knocked down a 3-pointer to tie the game with 42 seconds on the clock and Dominguez struck again from long range as the final seconds ticked down to give the Maroon & White a 37-34 edge at the break. Texas A&M outrebounded the Tigers 22-14 in the first half, outscoring LSU 22-12 in the paint.

Play remained tight to start the second half before back-to-back Dominguez 3's in a 23-second span forced an LSU timeout and put the Aggies up 47-40 with 15:22 on the clock. A three-point play from Marcus Hill made it nine-straight points for Texas A&M and got the difference to double digits for the first time on the night.
