WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- The Aggies closed out the regular season strong, winning each of their last two games to secure their fifth consecutive 20-win season and a fourth-place finish in the league, marking the sixth time they have notched a top-five finish in the SEC.
- Graduate Rashaun Agee has been a consistent threat on both ends of the floor and earned All-SEC Third Team accolades after averaging 16.1 points and 9.3 rebounds in league play ... He has scored 15-plus points in five of the last six games and led the Aggies in rebounding 24 times this season.
- On the year, Agee's 8.8 rebounds and 6.2 defensive boards are good for second in the league ... His 12 double-doubles rank second in the SEC and are tied with Tyler Davis for Texas A&M's single-season record ... His 32 career double-doubles are good for eighth among active DI players.
- Senior Rylan Griffen went off in the final two games of the regular season, notching back-to-back 20-point games for the first time in his career, tallying 45 points, 11 rebounds and eight steals on the week ... Griffen leads the Aggies with 47 steals on the year and his 1.6 per game are good for seventh in the SEC.
- Texas A&M boasts the No. 8 scoring offense in the country with 88.5 points per game and is third nationally averaging 36.3 bench points per game ... The Aggies have seen at least 30 points come from non-starters in 18 games this season, including 57 against Kentucky.
- Graduate Zach Clemence and junior Pop Isaacs have been strong off the bench to close out the regular season ... Clemence has registered three 20-point games in league play and is averaging 12.5 points and 4.5 rebounds over the last four games, while Isaacs has been filling out the stat sheet and averaged 14.7 points, 5.0 rebounds, 5.0 assists and 1.7 steals through the last three games.
- The Maroon & White rank 14th in the nation and second in the SEC averaging 10.9 made 3's per outing ... Sophomore Rubén Dominguez leads the way shooting 40.7-percent from beyond the arc, good for third in the SEC ... He is one 3-pointer away from moving into third on A&M's single-season list with 81 on the year.
- The Aggies closed out SEC play ranking third in defensive efficiency (111.6) according to KenPom and boasted the best 3-point defense in the conference (30.3%) ... On the season, Texas A&M sits atop the SEC forcing 13.8 turnovers and is third with 8.2 steals per game and ranks fourth among Power 4 teams in both categories.

AGGIES FROM 3

- The Maroon & White have seen success from 3-point range throughout the season, setting new program records and ranking among the top 3-point shooting teams in the nation.
- The Aggies had a record-setting performance from beyond the arc in the win over Manhattan as they knocked down a program-best 18 3's, taking down the previous record of 16 set against Savannah State in 2017.
- Rubén Dominguez led the way against the Jaspers with a school record 10 3-pointers in the victory, shooting an impressive 71.4-percent from long range ... He connected on four in the first half and six in the second, scoring all his points from beyond the arc to register the lone 30-point game of this season for the Aggies.
- Dominguez ranks third in the SEC shooting 40.7-percent from 3-point range this year, while his 2.6 3-pointers per game are good for sixth in the league ... His 81 total makes on the year are good for fifth in the SEC and rank fourth on Texas A&M's single-season list.
- As a team, Texas A&M ranks 14th in the country and second in the SEC knocking down 10.9 3's per game.
- Rylan Griffen closed out the regular season shooting 9-of-16 from beyond the arc en route to a pair of career performances ... Griffen knocked down 4-of-8 against Kentucky to help him notch his first 20-point game of the year and followed it up with another career performance, shooting 62.5-percent (5-8) from long range to score 24 points in the triple overtime win at LSU.
- In the win over the Wildcats, the Maroon & White notched their most efficient night from beyond the arc in league play this year, shooting 46.4-percent (13-28), as Dominguez led the way with five 3-pointers.
- Against Missouri, the Aggies saw a season-high nine players knock down a 3-pointer in the first half alone as Griffen led the way with four.
- The Aggies neared the school record, while setting a new mark in SEC action, when they knocked down 17 3-pointers in the win over South Carolina ... Their 12 3's in the first half were the most in a half in program history.
- Zach Clemence led the way against the Gamecocks, connecting on seven of his eight attempts from beyond the arc to pace the team with 21 points.
- Griffen went off in the second half at Texas, scoring all 17 of his points in the period, knocking down four of his five attempts from beyond the arc and was an efficient 83-percent (5-6) from long range in the win over Jacksonville to lead the way with 19 points.
- Against East Texas A&M, Pop Isaacs had his best shooting night from beyond the arc this year, burying five of his seven 3-point attempts en route to a season-best 15-point night.

STRONG OFF THE BENCH

- The Aggies continue to use a consistent rotation, as nine players average at least 13 minutes per outing.
- Texas A&M ranks third in the nation and lead the SEC averaging 36.3 points off the bench and has seen at least 30 points come from non-starters in 18 outings, most recently racking up 57 in the win over Kentucky.
- Zach Clemence has added depth down low for the Maroon & White and has been a spark on offense, notching three 20-point games and the only double-digit rebounding game of his career in SEC play ... In the win over South Carolina he registered his first 20-point game, scoring 21 points on 7-of-8 shooting from beyond the arc, also adding a career-high three blocks ... He notched a career-high 29-point at Arkansas, knocking down a team-season-best 11 field goals.
- Pop Isaacs added 10.6 points and 2.8 assists in league play, scoring in double figures in each of the last three

conference games, including an 18-point performance against LSU in the finale after filling out the stat sheet with 12 points, six rebounds, eight assists and two steals against Kentucky ... In the win at Auburn, Isaacs led the way with a season-high 21 points, including a 9-0 run of his own in the second half, to go with five assists.

AGEE LEADS THE WAY

- Rashaun Agee was named a team captain ahead of the 2025-26 season, bringing a strong voice and unselfish attitude to the team, along with a competitive edge and years of experience in the college game.
- Agee leads the team averaging 14.7 points, scoring 15-plus points in five of the last six games ... His 8.8 rebounds per game, 274 total rebounds and 6.2 average on the defensive boards are all good for second in the SEC.
- His 12 double-doubles are tied for the most in a single season at Texas A&M with Tyler Davis' mark set in 2017-18 ... They are also the second-most in the SEC this season and his 32 career double-doubles are No. 8 among active Division I players.
- The Chicago native averaged 16.1 points and 9.3 rebounds through SEC play, notching seven double-doubles in league action.
- For his outstanding play, Agee earned All-SEC Third Team accolades at the conclusion of the regular season.
- Leading by example, Agee has paced the team in scoring 14 times this season and been the top rebounder on 24 occasions ... He tallied the most assists for the Aggies five times in league play.
- Agee was named SEC Player of the Week following Texas A&M's 92-77 road victory over Georgia to remain atop the conference standings, leading the way with 18 points, 15 rebounds and a career-high seven assists.
- In non-conference action, he strung together three consecutive double-doubles in the Aggies' most challenging stretch in the slate when he added 13 points and 11 rebounds in the overtime game against SMU after filling out the stat sheet at Pitt, posting 21 points, four assists and four steals, while adding 13 rebounds and a pair of blocks ... In the win over Florida State, Agee matched his career high with 17 rebounds to go with 17 points.
- Agee came to Aggieland after spending last season at USC where he averaged 9.4 points and 4.5 rebounds, leading the team in rebounding eight times.

EVERYBODY EATS

- The Aggies have shared the load on the offensive side of the floor, seeing five-or-more players score in double figures in 11 games so far this season.
- The Maroon & White saw five players put up double-digit points in the 15-point road victory over Georgia as Rashaun Agee led the way with his 10th double-double of the season (18 pts, 15 reb.), while Marcus Hill added 15, shooting 77-percent from the floor (7-9) and Ali Dibba added a season-high 15, making 3-of-4 from beyond the arc, off the bench.
- Texas A&M saw five players score in double figures in the win over Oklahoma as it moved to 3-0 in league play behind a 16-point, 12-rebound performance from Agee.
- In the SEC opener, Texas A&M saw 10 of the 11 players that logged minutes score points to help the Maroon & White earn a 75-72 win over LSU.
- Six players scored in double figures in the 112-75 win over Jacksonville where 14 of the 15 Aggies that entered the game registered points ... Rylan Griffen led the way with 19 points, landing 5-for-6 shots from beyond the arc, and Jamie Vinson added a career-high 14 points, going a perfect 6-for-6 from the field.
- The Aggies notched their highest point total at Reed Arena in the 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State as six players

HEAD COACH BUCKY MCMILLAN



Bucky McMillan was named the head men's basketball coach at Texas A&M on April 5, 2025. The three-time Southern Conference Coach of the Year arrived in Aggieland after five seasons at the helm at Samford.

In his first season at Texas A&M, McMillan has guided the Aggies to their fifth consecutive 20-win season and a fourth-place finish in the SEC after being predicted to finish 13th prior to the season. The Aggies' 21 wins so far this year tie McMillan with Billy Gillispie (2004-05) for the second-most by a coach in their first year at Texas A&M, while their 11 conference victories are the most since Shelby Metcalf went 13-1 in the Southwest Conference in his first season at the helm (1963-64).

Renowned for his innovative and fast-paced offensive and defensive styles of play, known as "Bucky Ball," McMillan transformed Samford into one of the top basketball programs in the Southern Conference. He guided the Bulldogs to three SoCon Championships – two regular season crowns and a tournament title – while compiling a 99-52 record, which included 20-plus victories in each of his last four seasons. He earned SoCon Coach of the Year honors in 2022, 2023 and 2024.

In 2024-25, the Bulldogs ranked No. 13 nationally in scoring offense (82.9 ppg) while ranking in the top-10 in three-pointers attempted and made. Defensively, Samford forced an average of 16.1 turnovers per game, which ranked No. 4 in the country.

Within the SoCon, Samford led the league in scoring, fast break points (14.2/g), steals (9.9/g), turnovers forced, turnover margin (3.2/g), offensive rebounds (13.1/g) and bench scoring (28.5 ppg) as the Bulldogs earned an invitation to the 2025 NIT.

McMillan orchestrated the best season in Samford program history in 2023-24 when the Bulldogs earned their first NCAA Tournament berth in more than 20 years. Samford compiled a school record 29 wins and swept the SoCon regular season and tournament titles for the first time. In the NCAA Tournament, the Bulldogs narrowly lost to Kansas, 93-89, in one of the most memorable games of the tournament. The 2023-24 season included a school record 17-game winning streak and the team was a perfect 18-0 on its home court.

McMillan's path to the collegiate level came after experiencing unprecedented success at the high school level in the state of Alabama. As the head coach of Mountain Brook High School, located just outside of Birmingham, McMillan led the Spartans to five state championships in Alabama's highest classification and advanced to the championship game seven times in his 12 seasons at his alma mater. Named the National Coach of the Year in 2018 by the National High School Coaches Association, McMillan won 333 games at Mountain Brook while averaging nearly 28 wins per season.

McMillan played his college basketball at Birmingham-Southern from 2002 to 2006. He earned his bachelor's degree in education services from Birmingham-Southern in 2007.

As a student at Mountain Brook High School from 1999 to 2002, McMillan received All-State honors from the Birmingham News in 2002 and was nominated for the McDonald's High School All-America Team. The Birmingham News also named him to its All-State Athletic Academic Team.

scored in double figures in the win ... Hill (7-7), Mackenzie Mgbako (6-6), Rubén Dominguez (6-6), Noah Shelby (4-4), Jacari Lane (2-2) and Jeremiah Green (2-2) were perfect from the free throw line as A&M connected on 42 free throws, the second-most in a game in program history.

- In the win over Montana, Griffen led five players in double figures with 17 points, while Rashaun Agee registered his first double-double as an Aggie with 10 points and 10 rebounds.

HELPING HAND

- The Aggies rank eighth in the nation and lead the SEC in assists per game, averaging 18.3 on the year and are eighth among Power 4 teams in assist per made field goal (62%) ... Jacari Lane leads the team with 97 assists on the season, while his 2.9 assist/turnover ratio is second in the league and ranks 33rd nationally.
- Pop Isaacs and Rylan Griffen rank second and third on the team in assists with 78 and 77, respectively ... Isaacs has had at least five assists in three games this year, including a season-high eight against Kentucky, while Griffen has tallied eight games with five-or-more helpers.
- In the win over East Texas A&M, three players dished out five-or-more assists as Lane and Pop Isaacs led the way with six apiece and Rylan Griffen added five to help the Maroon & White match their season high with 32 assists.
- Against Manhattan, Texas A&M tallied a near-school record 32 assists, led by Lane with seven, on 39 made field goals.

BUCKY BALL

- Head coach Bucky McMillan's teams are known for their fast-paced play that features aggressive full-court defense and a high-power offensive attack ... McMillan has seen great success with the play at the collegiate level, notching five consecutive 20-win seasons while ranking among the top-30 in the nation in multiple offensive and defensive categories.
- Texas A&M has put Bucky Ball on display, ranking in the top-15 in the nation in bench points (36.3), assists (18.3), 3-pointers made (10.9) and scoring offense (88.5) ... The Aggies also rank among the top-four Power 4 teams forcing 13.8 turnovers and tallying 8.2 steals per game.
- In the month of November, the Aggies registered three 100-point games for the first time since the 1989-90 season, set a new program record for 3-pointers made in a game with 18 against Manhattan and scored the second-most points in a game in A&M history, the most by the Aggies at Reed Arena, with a 120-86 win over Mississippi Valley State.
- The Maroon & White tallied 32 assists on 39 field goals in the win over Manhattan, the second-most helpers in a game all-time at Texas A&M ... Against Mississippi Valley State, the Aggies made the second-most free throws in a game with 42 and their 31 forced turnovers rank in the top-seven in school history.
- To start the year, the Aggies tallied 202 total points which marked the highest point total through the first two games since the 2015-16 season ... The Maroon & White have scored 60-plus points in a half four times this year, including a season-best 68 against Mississippi Valley State, the third-most in a half in program history.
- Last season, McMillan's Samford squad ranked in the top-20 nationally in fast break points (14.0 ppg) and scoring offense (82.9 ppg), while also ranking third in steals per game (9.9), fourth in the turnovers forced (16.1/g) and seventh in threes made per game (10.8).

RECORD-SETTING AGGIES

- In the regular season finale, Rashaun Agee tied the record for double-doubles in a season, registering his 12th of the year after finishing the triple overtime road win over LSU with 26 points and 11 rebounds ... He matched Tyler Davis' mark set in 2017-18.
- The Aggies closed out non-conference play with their sixth 100-point game of the season, topping Prairie View 111-82 to set a new program record for 100-point games in a season ... Texas A&M previously tallied five 100-point games in 1978-79 and 1975-76.
- In the win over Manhattan, the Maroon & White went off from 3-point range courtesy of a record-setting night from sharp-shooter Rubén Dominguez ... As a team, the Aggies took down the record for 3-pointers in a game, sinking 18 of their 37 attempts ... Dominguez was 10-of-14 from beyond the arc to make the most 3's in a game all-time at A&M.
- Texas A&M scored the most points in Reed Arena and tallied the second-highest point total in a game in program history with a 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State earlier in the year.

100+

- Texas A&M has put its high-power offense on display from the start of the season, setting a new scoring record in Reed Arena and tallying the most 100-point games in program history through just the non-conference portion of the schedule.
- The Aggies had a strong finish to non-conference play, stringing together three-straight 100-point games, topping Jacksonville 112-75, taking down East Texas A&M 118-77 and closing things out with a 111-82 victory over Prairie View for their program record sixth 100-point game of the year.
- The Maroon & White notched their second-highest point total in a game and scored the most points in Reed Arena with a 120-84 win over Mississippi Valley State.
- With the 109-68 win over Manhattan, the Aggies recorded multiple 100-point games in a season for the first time since 2015-16 when they topped USC Upstate 104-64 and Southeastern Louisiana 100-58.
- In the second game of the year, Texas A&M registered a 104-70 win over Texas Southern, marking the first time the Aggies scored 100 points in a game since topping Dallas Christian 102-52 in 2021.

WELCOME BACK TO AGGIELAND

- The Texas A&M coaching staff has seen a number of familiar faces return to Aggieland in associate head coach Mitch Cole, assistant coach Kyle Keller, assistant coach Frank Haith and strength & conditioning coach Darby Rich.
- Cole, who served in the same role on McMillan's staff at Samford from 2021-25, and Keller were assistants on Billy Kennedy's staff from 2011-16, helping the Aggies notch a school record 28 wins, claim a regular season SEC title and advance to the Sweet 16 in 2015-16.
- Haith first came to Aggieland as an assistant coach in 1992 and spent three seasons on head coach Tony Barone's staff before taking an assistant coaching job at Penn State ... Haith returned to Texas A&M for one more season in 1996-97 as the associate head coach.
- Rich, who has helped develop 23 NBA players during his career, including six Aggies, also worked with Coach Kennedy, serving as the strength & conditioning coach from 2011-19.

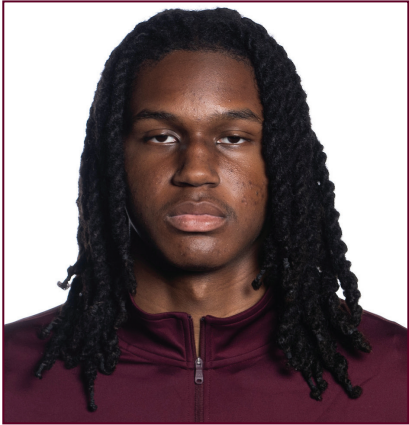

Pitt nosed ahead for the first time early in the second half, 37-35, but Ol' Sarge's charges offered a rude response. They outscored the Panthers 22-8, staking claim to a 57-45 advantage at the 11:55 mark.

A brief scoring drought prevented the Aggies from pulling away. They missed eight consecutive shots as Pitt went on a 16-0 run to go ahead 61-57 at the 6:23 mark. Back-to-back layups by Lane and Rylan Griffen sparked Texas A&M's decisive run.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team matched the school record for 100-point games in a season, registering its fifth of the year with a 118-77 victory over East Texas A&M at Reed Arena Sunday afternoon.

The Aggies (9-3) shot a season-high 64.9-percent (48-74) from the field and 50-percent (14-28) from 3-point range in the win as Rashaun Agee led four players in double figures with 21 points, adding eight rebounds. The Maroon & White matched their season-high with 32 assists, led by Pop Isaacs and Jacari Lane, who tallied six apiece.

Texas A&M dominated in the paint, outscoring the Lions (6-6) 66-24 while holding a 43-36 advantage on the boards. Mackenzie Mgbako, who rounded out the double-digit scorers with 12 points, led the way with nine rebounds.

The Aggies got things going early, using a 16-2 run to go up 20-6 with just over 13 minutes remaining in the first half. Texas A&M continued to push, knocking down four straight 3's around the midway point in the period before a 12-2 spree saw the Aggies take their largest lead of the half, up 48-17 with 5:15 on the clock.

Texas A&M took a 56-35 lead into the break as Marcus Hill led three Aggies in double figures with 13 points, going 5-for-5 from the field. Isaacs knocked down four 3-pointers to tally 12 points and Agee added 10. As a team, Texas A&M shot 67-percent from the field in the opening period and went 7-for-12 (58%) from beyond the arc.

East Texas A&M hung around early in the second half, but the Aggies eventually got the difference back over 30 points with seven minutes left to play to put the game away.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team downed Prairie View, 111-82, at Reed Arena Monday night to close out non-conference play and set a new school record with its sixth 100-point game of the season.

The Aggies took control early and used a 17-2 run to go up 23-7 with 14:06 on the clock, forcing Prairie View to call an early timeout. Texas A&M continued to push and got the difference to 20 before the midway point in the half, eventually taking a 60-39 lead into the break.

The Maroon & White shot an impressive 68-percent (23-34) from the field in the first half. Rashaun Agee led the way with 15 points, knocking down two of the team's six 3-pointers, while Marcus Hill added 10 points in the opening period.

Six early points from Hill and a 3-pointer from Rubén Dominguez helped the Aggies extend their advantage to 30 points in the first five minutes of the new half. The Panthers continued to fight and put together a 16-3 run of their own to make it 94-73 with under seven minutes to play, but Texas A&M halted the spree and closed out the victory.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team opened conference play with a victory, edging out LSU 75-72 Saturday evening at Reed Arena.

The Aggies led for much of the second half, but eight straight points for LSU got the Tigers back within two and forced a Texas A&M timeout with just under seven minutes to play. LSU turned it into a 12-1 run over 3:37 to take its first lead of the half with 5:33 left in the game.

Four straight points from Rashaun Agee put the game back in Texas A&M's favor, 68-66, with 2:05 on the clock. An Agee layup with 25 seconds remaining gave the Maroon & White a 71-68 lead and LSU was forced to foul in the closing seconds as the Aggies held on for the victory.

The two teams traded baskets to start the game, but back-to-back 3-pointers from Dominguez and Dibba, and a tip-in from Zach Clemence put the Maroon & White up 16-8 with 14:06 on the clock.

Texas A&M remained in control for much of the half until LSU strung together a 14-4 run to go up 34-31 with 1:00 remaining in the half. The Aggies responded quickly as Rylan Griffen knocked down a 3-pointer to tie the game with 42 seconds on the clock and Dominguez struck again from long range as the final seconds ticked down to give the Maroon & White a 37-34 edge at the break. Texas A&M outrebounded the Tigers 22-14 in the first half, outscoring LSU 22-12 in the paint.

Play remained tight to start the second half before back-to-back Dominguez 3's in a 23-second span forced an LSU timeout and put the Aggies up 47-40 with 15:22 on the clock. A three-point play from Marcus Hill made it nine-straight points for Texas A&M and got the difference to double digits for the first time on the night.

A raucous crowd of 9,121 at Neville Arena thought the home team triumphed when Keshawn Murphy drained a 30-foot shot at the buzzer, but video replay overturned the outcome giving Texas A&M (12-3, 2-0) the well-earned win.

A 33-6 run midway through the second half powered Texas A&M to its fifth consecutive victory. Pop Isaacs scored 16 of his season-high 21 points in the second half. The Maroon & White shot 18-of-31 (58.1%) from the field in the second stanza, including 9-of-17 (52.9%) from long range.

While the Aggies landed 43.3% (13-of-30) of their punches from beyond the arc, the defense held Auburn (9-6, 0-2 SEC) to 26.9% (7-of-26), including 15.4% (2-of-13) in the second half.

Four steals in the opening 3:22 gave the Aggies the upper hand early and they built their largest advantage of the first half, 20-12, at the 12:40 mark. Auburn responded with six consecutive made field goals to wrangle a 21-20 edge. The teams traded blows and knotted the contest on five occasions before a 12-2 run in the final 2:50 of the stanza gave the Tigers a 47-37 advantage at the intermission.

With Auburn drifting out to a 61-45 edge at the 13:29 mark, the Maroon & White scored 11 points in 31 seconds, including 3-pointers by Rylan Griffen and Lane to trim the deficit to 61-56. The Aggies' onslaught continued and they reclaimed the lead, 72-62, with 7:52 remaining when Isaacs drained three consecutive 3-pointers. Texas A&M would ultimately open a 12-point lead on two occasions.

Keyshawn Hall, who scored a game-high 32, clawed Auburn back into the contest, scoring nine points in a span of 1:54 to cut the deficit to 88-87 with seven seconds remaining. Isaacs made two from the charity stripe to stretch the margin back to three points. Hall hit one of two from the line on the other end to set up the late game dramatics which included a handful of video reviews and tenths of seconds added to the clock on multiple occasions.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team pulled away late in a seesaw affair to top the Oklahoma Sooners, 83-76, Saturday afternoon inside Reed Arena to earn their 11th win in the last 12 games.

The game saw 19 lead changes before Texas A&M (13-3, 3-0) closed out strong, beating the Sooners (11-5, 1-2 SEC) in Reed Arena for the fifth straight time. Defense paved the way for the Maroon & White as they created a 17-8 turnover advantage.

The Aggies began the matchup with tough inside scoring and an 11-2 run over a 2:43 period to take a 33-23 advantage with 7:45 left in the opening half. Oklahoma's Nijel Pack got the Sooners back in the game with three 3-pointers, but Griffen buried a shot from beyond the arc with :01 left on the clock to give Texas A&M a 48-45 lead heading into the break. Agee paced the offense with 12 points, shooting 3-for-4 from the field, in an opening act that featured 11 lead changes.

The teams traded blows to start the second half, but that slowed down when both offenses were held scoreless for 2:23. Oklahoma ended the lull and went up 67-63 midway through stanza, but the Aggies found momentum late with a 16-4 run bookended by 3-pointers from Zach Clemence and Dominguez. The trifecta by Dominguez gave Texas A&M a 79-71 edge with 2:52 remaining. The Sooners trimmed the deficit to 79-76 at the 1:00 mark, but a layup by Agee and a pair of free throws by Isaacs sealed the victory.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team's valiant effort came up short in an 87-82 double overtime loss against the No. 24 Tennessee Volunteers Tuesday evening inside the Food City Center.

The Aggies had their six-game win streak snapped despite leading for 35:48 and not trailing by multiple possessions until the second overtime period.

The Aggies never trailed in the first half, taking a 34-30 lead into the intermission. The defense stymied the Volunteers' shooters who hit just 3-of-14 (21.4%) from 3-point range, including missing their first eight attempts. Meanwhile Lane hit 3-of-4 from beyond the arc in the opening act.

After the Maroon & White opened the game on an 8-0 run, Tennessee matched it, tying the game at the 14:56 mark. The score was knotted again, 15-15, when A&M went on an 11-0 surge sparked by Dominguez with a long-range 3-pointer and an old-fashioned 3-point play. The charge put the Aggies ahead 26-15 with 6:47 left the half. The Volunteers shaved the deficit to 28-27, but Lane sank two trifectas in the last three minutes of the half.

The Aggies stretched the lead to nine points early in the second half, but the Volunteers clawed back and eventually took their first lead of the game, 56-55, with 5:29 remaining. The advantage changed hands eight times in the closing moments of regulation. Texas A&M had a chance to close out the victory, but hit just 2-of-7 from the charity stripe. The Aggies led 71-69 with 16 seconds on the clock, but Tennessee converted on the front end of two foul shots on two occasions and grabbed the offensive rebound on the back end both times. The Volunteers' Ja'kobi Gillespie missed a 3-pointer at the buzzer, sending the contest to overtime.

The first extra period did not feature much action on the offensive end as the teams went to double overtime tied 75-75. The teams combined to hit just 2-of-13 (15.4%) from the field while they both drained 2-of-2 from the foul line.

Texas A&M took its last lead of the game when Isaacs hit a 3-pointer as the Aggies nosed ahead 79-77 at the 3:58 mark of the second extra period. The Maroon & White would go without a field goal for the remainder of the game, while the Volunteers outscored A&M 10-3 down the stretch.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team defeated the Mississippi State Bulldogs, 88-68, behind a stellar night from the free-throw line and a season-low three turnovers Wednesday inside Reed Arena.

The Aggies shot a season-high 95.8% (23-of-24) from the charity stripe. The Maroon & White also recorded a 6-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio with 18 assists. The turnover tally was tied for the second-lowest in program history.

Texas A&M was led by Rashaun Agee who registered season highs with 23 points and five assists. He shot 7-of-14 from the field and 9-of-9 from the charity stripe. He pulled down 10 rebounds for his ninth double-double of the season. Rylan Griffen added on 15 points, including 5-of-6 from the free-throw line.

The first half began tightly contested with five lead changes in the opening 9:52 of the game. Zach Clemence jumpstarted a 13-2 run over a 2:34 period where the Aggies nailed four down from triple town to take a 34-23 advantage in 14 minutes of action. Griffen and Agee paced the scoring efforts in the first half each recording 11 points. The Aggie defense backed them up with eight points off six turnovers to extend the advantage to 44-33 entering the break.

The Aggies continued their momentum into the second half going a perfect 13-13 from the free-throw line, never allowing the Bulldogs (10-9, 2-4 SEC) to get within 12 points. Texas A&M went the entire second stanza without committing a turnover. The Maroon & White took their largest lead of the game with 2:50 remaining in the game, 85-65, and matched it again with the final score.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team drained 17 3-point field goals in Saturday's 92-69 victory over the South Carolina Gamecocks inside Reed Arena.

The Aggies knocked down 17-of-39 (43.6%) from triple town. The tally was the most ever for Texas A&M in an SEC contest and one shy of the school record of 18 set earlier this season against Manhattan. The Maroon & White also set a team record with 12 made 3-pointers in the first half.

Zach Clemence paced the Aggies with 21 points in just 15 minutes of action. He sank 7-of-8 from 3-point range. His .875 3-point percentage in the game matched Lynn Suber (1989) and Antoine Wright (2005) for the highest by an Aggie with six-or-more attempts.

Rylan Griffen added 16 points, six rebounds and five assists. Rashaun Agee tallied 11 points and seven rebounds. Pop Isaacs had 11 points, four rebounds and three assists.

The Aggies also did damage on the boards, posting a 43-30 rebounding margin as they won for the ninth time in the last 10 games.

South Carolina raced out to a 14-7 lead and nursed it to 19-16 at the 10:15 mark before Texas A&M went on an overwhelming run.

The Aggies rained down eight 3-pointers, including three each by Clemence and Rubén Dominguez, during a 29-2 surge spanning 9:03.

After emerging from halftime with a 46-25 advantage, the Aggies inflated the cushion to 70-38 at the 12:30 mark of the second half. The Gamecocks cut the deficit to 16 points with 5:36 remaining, but the Aggies responded immediately with a 13-2 spurt to close the deal.

A Rylan Griffen 3-pointer at the buzzer front-rimmed as the Texas A&M men's basketball team dropped a 100-97 slugfest against the Alabama Crimson Tide Wednesday at Coleman Coliseum.

The thriller featured 28 lead changes and 13 ties. The game came down to the final moments. Marcus Hill put in a fast break layup to cut the Crimson Tide's edge to 99-97 with 15 seconds remaining.

Alabama was unable to get the ball over the halfcourt line and were given two free throws when Ali Dibba fouled Amari Allen in the back court. Allen hit 1-of-2 from the charity stripe as the Tide's lead stretched to three points, setting up the Aggies' final trip down the court.

Rashaun Agee was fouled immediately and missed the front end of two foul shots. He missed the second free throw on purpose and the Aggies' ricochet the rebound out to Griffen who took the final shot which was a hair's breadth shy of going through the hoop.

The teams played on an even keel for the first 20 minutes, going into halftime knotted 46-46. Hill padded the Aggies with 10 points and four rebounds in the opening act. Jamie Vinson added nine points and four boards. The Maroon & White shot 18-of-34 (52.9%) from the field in the first half.

The game was a seesaw affair early with six lead changes in the first seven minutes. The Crimson Tide used a 12-4 run to drift ahead 28-19 at the midway point of the half. Vinson sparked a 21-6 run for the Aggies with nine points including three dunks and a 3-pointer as Texas A&M staked claim to a 40-34 lead at the 4:11 mark. After trading blows for two minutes, the Crimson Tide outscored the Aggies 6-1 down the stretch and tied the game on a 3-pointer by Latrell Wrightsell Jr. as the first-half buzzer sounded.

The Aggies matched their largest lead of the game when Dibba drained a 3-pointer to go ahead 70-64 at the 11:30 mark. Texas A&M led by six again before the Crimson Tide went on a 19-6 run thanks to eight free throws surging ahead 90-83 with 4:29 remaining. Texas A&M tied the game at 91-91 at the 2:46 mark by way of two free throws from Jacari Lane and layups by Agee and Hill. The lead changed hands the next four times down the court with a Wrightsell 3-pointer putting Alabama up 97-95 with 1:11 remaining.

A Rashaun Agee spinning layup in the lane was blocked at the buzzer as the Texas A&M men's basketball team came up on the short end of an 86-85 outcome against the Missouri Tigers Wednesday inside Reed Arena.

The lead changed hands eight times in the last five minutes with the last swap coming on a dunk by the Tigers' Shawn Phillips Jr. to put the Missouri up 86-85 with 17 seconds remaining.

Zach Clemence powered Texas A&M's effort, scoring 20 points on 8-of-10 shooting from the field, including 3-of-4 from 3-point range. Rylan Griffen added 17 points, five rebounds and three assists. Agee tacked on 13 points, nine rebounds, four assists and two blocks. Texas A&M had another strong night from beyond the arc, rattling in 15-of-33 (45.5%) from 3-point range with Griffen's 4-of-9 (44.4%) leading the way.

The Aggies had nine different players knock shots down from long range in the first half, hitting 11-of-17 (64.7%) beyond the arc en route to a 46-41 halftime lead. The 3-point field goal tally was one shy of the school record for a half set against South Carolina 18 days ago.

Griffen led the way for the Maroon & White in the opening act, draining 3-of-4 (75.0%) for 11 points. Texas A&M's distance shooting offset an 18-9 rebounding deficit. Neither team led by more than six points in the competitive first half.

Texas A&M built its largest lead, 57-50, when Clemence drained a 3-pointer at the 16:18 mark. Missouri responded with a 24-9 surge to go ahead 74-66 with eight minutes remaining. The Aggies bounced back with a 13-4 run with 3-pointers by Jacari Lane, Clemence and Griffen before a Marcus Hill layup put Of Sarge's charges up 79-78 with 4:57 showing on the clock. The teams traded buckets leading to the final attempt by Agee at the buzzer.

The Texas A&M men's basketball team outscored Ole Miss 12-2 in the final four minutes to pull out an 80-77 victory over the Rebels.

The Aggies played from behind for the first 18:08 of the second half, trailing by as many as 13 points at 63-50 with 11:46 left in the contest. Every time Texas A&M cut the deficit to a single digit over the next four minutes, Ole Miss answered back.

The Maroon & White snapped the lull with a 3-point field goal by Rubén Dominguez and a dunk by Zach Clemence on back-to-back trips down the court to pull within five points at the 6:11 mark. The Rebels led 75-68 when Dominguez sank three from the charity strip and rained down a long-range bucket to spark the game-ending 12-2 run.

Clemence hit a jumper with a defender hanging on him, cutting Ole Miss' advantage to 77-76 at the 2:06 mark. He missed his and-1 opportunity from the foul line to tie the game, but Josh Holloway pounced on the rebound and dished to Rashaun Agee for a driving layup as Texas A&M grabbed its first lead with 1:52 on the clock.

The Rebels missed 3-pointers on their next three trips down the court, but the Aggies were unable to seal the deal until Agee dropped in two from the foul line in the closing seconds.

Texas A&M made 19-of-31 (61.3%) from the field in the second half as Agee marshaled the troops with 13 points and seven boards in the stanza.

Texas A&M dominated on the glass with a 37-23 rebounding margin, resulting in an 18-4 cushion in second-chance points.

The Aggies trailed by just five at halftime despite the offense failing to hit on all cylinders. The Maroon & White were ahead 14-8 with 13:21 on the clock before Ole Miss turned the tables. A 17-4 run over a span of 6:05 staked the Rebels to a 27-20 lead with 5:36 remaining in the half. The Texas A&M men's basketball team held off a late charge by Oklahoma to register a 75-71 victory over the Sooners Saturday evening inside the Lloyd Noble Center.

Oklahoma went on a 10-2 run late to cut Texas A&M's lead to 72-71 with 26 seconds remaining, but Rashaun Agee hit two from the charity stripe and after Dayton Forsythe missed a potential game-tying shot from bonus land, Rylan Griffen connected on one of two from the free throw line with eight seconds remaining to put the contest away.

Agee powered the Aggies with 18 points and seven rebounds. Griffen added 14 points, five rebounds and three steals. Zach Clemence stuffed the stats sheet with nine points, five rebounds, four assists and two blocks.

In a contest with minimal runs, the Maroon & White played from behind for just 10 seconds but never led by more than nine points. The Aggies owned a 32-12 advantage in points in the paint and they took care of the ball committing just five turnovers, including two in the second half.

Texas A&M never trailed in the first half, but was unable to pull away, nursing a 43-41 lead at the intermission. The Maroon & White scored the first eight points of the game before Oklahoma evened the score on three occasions, including 24-24 at the 7:55 mark. Texas A&M rattled in 7-of-14 (50.0%) from beyond the arc. Agee powered Ol' Sarge's charges through the opening act with 12 points and four rebounds.

The Sooners grabbed their only lead of the contest two minutes into the second half when Nigel Pack drained his first 3-pointer of the game. Griffen answered from triple town 10 seconds later, sparking a 13-4 A&M surge, resulting in a 56-48 lead at the 13:00 mark. The teams traded blows for the next seven minutes and the Aggies led 70-61 with 6:16 remaining before the Sooners' last charge.

The charity stripe kept Oklahoma in striking distance the entire game. The Sooners made 20-of-24 (83.3%) from the free throw line while Texas A&M made just 11-of-20 (55.0%).

The Texas A&M men's basketball team was doomed by a late surge from No. 20 Arkansas in a 99-84 loss to the Razorbacks Wednesday inside Bud Walton Arena.

The Aggies came out on the wrong end despite a career-high 29 points from Zach Clemence.

Texas A&M made 52.6-percent (30-of-57) from the field in the game, including 59.4-percent (19-of-32) in the second half, but was unable to overcome the Razorbacks' 18-4 margin in second chance points.

After the Razorbacks made the game's initial bucket, Texas A&M ran out to an 11-2 advantage at the 15:08 mark. Arkansas answered with 16-0 and 14-4 surges to take a 37-22 lead with 2:32 remaining in the first half. The Aggies pulled back into striking distance, scoring the last three baskets of the stanza to cut the deficit to 37-28 at the intermission. Agee paced Texas A&M with 13 points, making 4-of-4 from the floor, including one from bonus land.

The Razorbacks inflated their cushion to 52-35 in the first five minutes of the second half, before the Aggies jumped back in the fray. Ten points by Clemence spearheaded a 20-7 charge as the Arkansas lead was cut to four points at the midway point. The Maroon & White were unable to make it a one-possession game as the Razorbacks made 13 straight field goals at one point down the stretch.

Rashaun Agee converted on an old-fashioned 3-point play to put the Texas A&M men's basketball team ahead with 24 seconds left in the third overtime period as the Aggies beat the LSU Tigers, 94-91, in the Maravich Assembly Center Saturday evening.

The Maroon & White trailed 91-90 after the Bayou Bengals' Jalen Reece made a jumper in the paint with 42 seconds on the clock. On the next trip down the court, Agee got his defender in the air with a pump fake beyond the arc and drove the lane converting a layup and added the and-one to put Texas A&M up by two. After Reece missed a jumper, Ali Dibba made 1-of-2 from the charity stripe and the Aggies survived a missed 3-pointer by Max MacKinnon with the clock running out.

The Aggies fought through a grueling 15 minutes of overtime where neither team ever led by more than one possession and the only three-point cushions were held by the Maroon & White in the final three minutes. The first came when Rubén Dominguez drained his only shot from bonus land at the 2:57 mark of the third overtime, staking the Aggies to a 90-87 lead.

LSU took advantage of Texas A&M's shooting struggles to take a 38-33 advantage into halftime. After the Maroon & White held a brief early lead, the Tigers responded with a 24-7 run to balloon the margin to 26-11 at the 8:52 mark. The Aggies used a 22-9 surge of their own to cut the gap to two points before LSU sank a 3-pointer in the waning moments of the first half. Griffen's 13 points, four rebounds and two steals kept the Aggies in the fight.

The Aggies played catchup most of the second half. They cut the deficit to one point on three occasions before breaking through on a Dibba layup to go ahead 61-60 at the 7:25 mark. Texas A&M would eventually pull out to a 70-67 lead on an Agee layup with 1:52 showing. The Bayou Bengals tied the game with a free throw at 1:28 and a layup by MacKinnon with 38 seconds left.

The lead changed hands five times in a seesaw first overtime period with no team leading by more than two points. The Aggies had a chance to win at the buzzer, but Griffen lost his footing on a layup attempt.

The squads struggled to score in the second overtime combining for just three field goals. The Aggies held the last advantage, 85-83, with 21 seconds remaining, but MacKinnon made 2-of-2 from the charity stripe to knot the contest with 12 seconds left. The Maroon & White had the last chance to score but were unable to get a shot off.
