# Football Teams Celebrate LSC Championship Anniversaries

Eight Texas A&I and Texas A&M-Kingsville football teams are celebrating anniversaries this fall of their winning Lone Star Conference championships.

The 1959 team is celebrating the 55<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its winning the first LSC title for the Javelinas.

The 1969 club is celebrating the 45<sup>th</sup> anniversary of its championship, the 1974 squad is celebrating the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of winning the trophy, the 1979 team is celebrating its 35<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the 1989 Javelinas are celebrating the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the 1994 team is celebrating its 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the 2004 squad is celebrating the 10<sup>th</sup> and the 2009 Javelinas are celebrating the fifth anniversary of

its taking the league title.

The 1959 Javelinas won the first conference championship for the Javelinas as well as winning the first national championship.

The Javelinas have won seven national titles through the years and they have taken 27 LSC titles.

The university became aligned with the LSC in 1954 and is celebrating the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of membership this year.

The 1959 team went 12-1 and had a 6-1 league record. It

downed Lenoir-Rhyne (N.C.), 20-6, for the national title in a game played on national television.

Kenneth Kachtik and Gerald Lambert were captains of the 1959 squad and Lambert was a two-time, first-team All-American.

The 1969 Javelinas went 11-1 and were 6-1 in the LSC. They also won the national championship, beating Concordia (Minn.), 32-7, in the title game.

Alvin Matthews was a first-team All-American in 1969 and captains were Leroy Deanda, James Respondek and Gene Walkoviak.

In 1974, the Javelinas were 13-0 for the year and 8-0 in the league. The squad took the national title, defeating Henderson

(Ark.) State, 34-23, for the trophy.

Captains of the team were Charles Bishop, Ray Evans and David Hill. Don Hardeman was a three-time, first-team All-American and Hill and Jerry Janik also received first-team All-America honors.

Gil Steinke was head coach of the 1959, 1969 and 1975 teams.

In 1979, the Javelinas compiled a 12-1 record and were 6-1 in the conference. Again, a national championship was won and the Javelinas defeated Central Oklahoma, 20-14, in the title contest.

Andy Hawkins was a three-time, first-team All-American and Jafus White was first-team All-American. *(Continued on Page 8)*

**ALTHOUGH MANY OF** the NAIA playoff games were held in Javelina Stadium because of the outstanding support the Javelina fans gave their team, there were some very good trips for postseason action when the Javelinas were winning seven national titles and being national runnerup once.

Maybe the most memorable was to Greenville, S.C., for the 1970 championship matchup with Wofford (S.C.).

It was the Christmas season and Greenville is a beautiful Southern city that goes all out with its decorating.

Poinsettias aren't the state flower of South Carolina but they are probably more popular there than elsewhere. The Christmas flower is named for Joel Poinsett, who is a South Carolina native and politician.

There were several very nice social events for the players and staff and it was one of the better postseason trips.

Another was to Montgomery, Ala., in 1968 for the national title game with Troy (Ala.).

Even though the Javelinas lost their only NAIA postseason game on that occasion, Montgomery was likewise spruced up for the holidays and an enjoyable place to visit in December.

The thing I remember most about the Montgomery game was the cold weather. I've never been colder in my life.

In order to phone in the game story (that's how you did it in those days), you had to use a pay telephone booth outside the stadium. I don't think the North Pole would have been any colder.

And the game result didn't make it any warmer.

The 1979 NAIA title game was in McAllen and that was lots of fun.

The host group in the Valley did a super job holding the Palm Bowl for several years and it was a really big year when the Javelinas were in the contest.

Javelina fans filled the McAllen High School stadium for the nationally televised game on ESPN.

And the sportscaster who did the game for ESPN was James Hill, a former Javelina All-American defensive back who is a long-time sports director for a network station in Los Angeles, Calif.

It was truly a Javelina day including the thrilling 20-14 victory over Central Oklahoma.

The Javelinas compiled a 16-1 record in NAIA postseason play.

The Javelinas have had lots of nice trips to the NCAA postseason games and again, a lot of these have been in Javelina Stadium.

In reaching the NCAA championship game once, being in the semifinals six times and reaching NCAA postseason play 15 seasons, there have been some good road treks.

Florence, Ala., home of North Alabama, has been a site several times and that area, which hosted the national title game for years before seeing it moved at the end of last season, knows how to host.

The entire visit there each time has been First Class and Southern hospitality at its best is displayed.

There were also multiple visits to Portland, Ore., for games with Portland State.

The scenery there makes it a most desirable destination.

Mount Hood is visible from the football stadium and fans were able

# Lone Star Football Festival Information

## Tickets on Sale

Tickets for the Lone Star Football Festival Sept. 20 in AT&T Stadium in Arlington are on sale at the Texas A&M-Kingsville athletic ticket office in McCulley Hall on campus.

The Javelinas will meet Texas A&M-Commerce at 10 a.m. in the opening game of the Festival.

Three other games will follow with West Texas A&M meeting Shorter (Ga.) at 1 p.m., Tarleton State taking on Florida Tech at 5 p.m. and Midwestern State and Eastern New Mexico meeting in the finale at 8 p.m.

Tickets purchased in advance are \$25 for adults and \$10 for students and children.

Children are one-year-olds and older and students are anyone 18 years old and under or college students with valid ID cards.

Tickets purchased at the gate will be \$30 for adults and \$12 for students and children.

The Javelina athletic department is offering a free ticket with each ticket purchased. The offer is good until Sept. 12.

A ticket will allow the fans to attend each of the four games. No re-entry will be permitted.

There will be no advanced parking sales. Parking the day of the game will be \$10 and cash only will be accepted.

There will be no designated lot assignment this year.

RV, limo and bus parking in designated lots is \$50.

The Javelina ticket office is open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m.-noon and 1-5 p.m.

McCulley Hall is on the east side of Javelina Stadium.

## Stadium Purse/Bag Policy

In an effort to enhance public safety, AT&T Stadium has modified its security policy by limiting the size and style of bags allowed in the stadium.

Prohibited bags are:

.....All purses, bags or containers larger than a small clutch bag.

.....Backpacks.

.....Binocular case.

Binoculars may be worn around the neck.

.....Briefcases.

.....Camera bags.

.....Cinch bags.

.....Computer bags.

.....Coolers.

.....Diaper bags.

.....Fanny packs.

.....Luggage of any kind.

.....Seat Cushions.

Approved bags are:

.....Clear totes. Plastic, vinyl or PVC and do not exceed 12x6x12.

.....Plastic storage bag. Clear, one gallon, resealable.

.....Small clutch purse.

Approximately the size of a hand with or without a handle or strap. No larger than 5.5x8.5 with or without a handle or strap. Can be carried separately or within an approved plastic bag.

An exception will be made for medically necessary items after proper inspection at a gate designated for this purpose.

Please limit the number of items you bring to the stadium on event days.

**MICHAL IDZIAK, JAVELINA** sophomore from Mosina, Poland, competed for his home country in a recent under-23 international meet in the Czech Republic.

The meet included athletes from Slovenia, Czech Republic, Hungary and Poland.

Idziak finished sixth in the 800-meter run, running 1:50.85.

He holds the Javelina school record at 1:49.64 and that was set last spring.

Idziak has two of the three fastest times ever run in the 800 by a Javelina.

Karol Konieczny of Poland won the race in the Czech Republic in 1:47.53.

Lovrenc Valic of Slovenia was second, Miroslav Burian of Czech Republic third, Ales Zver of Slovenia fourth and Martin Sadil of Czech Republic fifth.

Idziak is a member of the Javelina cross country team and is training for the upcoming season at the cross country distance rather than the middle distances.

**FORMER JAVELINA JOHN** Randle, a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame and Javelina Hall of Fame, helped sponsor, along with the Minnesota Vikings, a golf tournament benefiting St. David's Center in Minneapolis last week.

# Lambert Inducted Into RGV Hall

Gerald Lambert, a member of the 1959 Texas A&I football team that won the school's first national championship, was

inducted into the Rio Grande Valley Sports Hall of Fame recently in Pharr.

Lambert played football at McAllen High School before joining the Javelinas in the late 1950s.

He was Associated Press Little All-America and NAIA All-America his senior season as a defensive lineman.

Lambert was All-Lone Star Conference as a junior and senior and was All-Texas College.

He was named the most valuable player in the 1959 national title game, played on national television in St. Petersburg, Fla.

Lambert served as a Javelina

captain in 1958 and 1959.

He was drafted by the Oakland Raiders and then coached for 12 seasons before becoming superintendent of transportation for the Bryan Public Schools.

Lambert current resides in the Austin area.

Other former Javelina athletes in the RGV Hall are Robert Capello, Juan Capello, Juan Castillo, Regeno Conover, Willie Crafts, Corky Crane, J.W. Helms, E.C. Lerma, Jesse Longhofer, Homer Martinez and Carl Spoonemore.

The 2004 club, with Richard

Cundiff as head coach, went 9-2 and reached the second round of the national playoffs. It had a 7-1 conference record.

Deandrae Fillmore, Daniel Taylor, Curtis Tyler and Larry Williams were captains in 2004 and Fillmore was a first-team All-American.

And the most recent LSC title came in 2009 and the Javelinas, with Bo Atterberry as head coach, were 9-3 that season. They lost

out in the first round of the playoffs and had an 8-2 LSC record.

Billy Garza, Jeff Edwards, Jimmy Saddler-McQueen and Markeith Wesley were captains of the 2009 squad.

The 2014 Javelinas begin their pursuit of a 28<sup>th</sup> LSC championship Sept. 20 when they take on Texas A&M-Commerce in the Lone Star Football Festival in Arlington.
