# Martinez LSC Female Track Athlete of the Year

For the second consecutive year, Texas A&M-Kingsville sprinter Kaina Martinez has been named the Lone Star Conference female track athlete of the year.

Martinez, senior from Seine Bight, Belize, has been one of the top sprinters in the LSC and NCAA Division II for the past four

seasons.

She posted the best times in the 100-meter and 200-meter dashes during the spring season and was on the 400-meter relay team that also had the best time.

Despite being injured in the LSC Championships and forced to scratch from the 100 and 200, she

qualified for the NCAA Division II Championships in the 100, 200 and long jump and as a member of the sprint relay.

Not running at full strength, she was a three-time All-American, finishing second in the 100 and seventh in the 200 and running on the third-place 400-meter relay.

Her two awards give the Javelinas the honor eight times.

Samantha Alvarez was the female field athlete of the year in 2011, Tim Price was the male track athlete of the year in 2014, Jordan Yamoah was the male field athlete of the year in 2016 and Jeron Robinson was the male field athlete of the year in 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Robinson is the only LSC athlete to receive the award three times.

Soliz has been Class 5A all-state and has played in the Texas Girls Coaches Association all-star game.

She has been named the District 4-5A offensive and defensive player of the year.

Soliz has been the top scorer on her team for three seasons.

She was named All-West Texas most valuable player as a sophomore and was All-West Texas twice.

She is the fourth signee for the women’s basketball team this season.

# Douglas Nominee For 2018 College Football Hall of Fame Selection

Karl Douglas, Texas A&I quarterback in 1967-70 and one of the most successful players at his position in college football history, is again a nominee for the College Football Hall of Fame.

Douglas quarterbacked the Javelinas to national championships in 1969 and 1970, and the team was national runnerup in 1968. As a freshman, the Javelinas were 9-0, becoming the first undefeated, untied team in school history.

During Douglas' four years on the team, the Javelinas were 41-4 and won four Lone Star Conference championships.

He has been inducted into the Lone Star Conference and Javelina halls of fame.

The list of nominees includes 98 players from the divisional ranks (non-Division I).

More than 12,000 National Football Foundation members and current Hall of Fame members will vote on the 2018 induction class.

The announcement of the honorees will be Jan. 8 in Atlanta, Ga. And they will be inducted Dec. 4, 2018, at the New York Hilton Midtown. The inductees will be

permanently enshrined at the College Football Hall of Fame in Atlanta later that December and honored on the field at the Chick-Fil-A Peach Bowl.

The Javelinas have seven members of the College Football Hall of Fame, more than any other divisional school.

Karl Douglas

...Johnny Bailey, running back in 1986-89 and one of the top running backs in the history of college football.

...Darrell Green, defensive back in 1978 and 1980-82 who was a first-round draft choice of the Washington Redskins. He retired after 20 seasons with the Redskins and is a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

...Ron Harms, head coach of the Javelinas in 1979-99 and had one national title team and numerous Lone Star Conference championships.

...Dwayne Nix, wide receiver for the Javelinas in 1965-68 and member of the LSC Hall of Fame as well as the Javelina Hall of Fame.

...John Randle, Javelina defensive lineman in 1988 and 1989 who went on to become an All-Pro athlete and is a member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame.

...Richard Ritchie, quarterback in 1973-76 who went 39-0 as a starter, helped the team win three national championships and has been hailed as the most successful quarterback in the history of the game.

...Gil Steinke, Javelina coach in 1954-76 who had six national championship teams and produced dozens of professional athletes.

# Martinez Extends NCAA Division II All-American Total to 10

The list of Texas A&I and Texas A&M-Kingsville athletes making All-America in track and field continued to grow last week when four athletes made the 2017 outdoor list in three events.

Kaina Martinez, senior from Seine Bight, Belize, was first-team All-America three times at the championships in Bradenton, Fla.

She made the list in the 100-meter and 200-meter dashes as well as a member of the 400-meter relay team.
