Football Faces 1969 NAIA Semifinal Opponent New Mexico Highlands From Rocky Mountain AC

The Texas A&M-Kingsville football team will step out of the Lone Star Conference this weekend as it hosts New Mexico Highlands from the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference.

Game time will be 7 p.m. Saturday in Javelina Stadium.

It will be the second meeting of the Javelinas and Cowboys, and the first since 1972.

The Javelinas lead the series, 2-0.

The Javelinas are 1-3 for the year and 0-3 in the LSC standings.

The squad is averaging 332.5

total yards a game, 128.8 rushing and 203.7 passing.

Nick Pelrean, 5-9, 185-pound senior running back from Houston (Chavez), is the Javelinas' leading rusher with 50.3 yards a game. He averages 5.2 yards a carry and has scored three times.

Koy Detmer Jr., 5-10, 175-pound junior quarterback from Somerset, has completed 70 of 120 (.583) passes for 173.5 yards a game. He has thrown seven touchdown passes and has had six interceptions.

Aaron Dilworth, 6-3, 190-pound junior wideout from Corpus

Christi (Flour Bluff), is the top receiver with 12 catches for 140 yards and two touchdowns.

Tre' Michael Tutt, 5-10, 190-pound sophomore linebacker from Channelview, leads the tackle chart with 34 and he has 5.5 tackles for losses.

Caleb Valentine, 6-1, 220-pound junior defensive lineman from Fulshear, has 7.5 tackles for losses.

Highlands is 2-2 for the year.

The Cowboys average 443 total yards a game, 209 rushing and 234 passing.

The Texas A&M-Kingsville volleyball team will return home to host a pair of Lone Star Conference opponents Friday and Saturday in the Steinke Center.

West Texas A&M will be in town Friday for a 7 p.m. match and the Javelinas will take on Eastern New Mexico at 2 p.m. Saturday.

The Javelinas are 10-7 for the year and 2-4 in the conference standings.

Madison Brabham, 5-10 senior right side from Kingwood, leads the Javelinas statistically with a .236 attack percentage and 3.39 kills a set.

She missed matches with Angelo State, Tarleton State and St. Mary's last weekend with an injury.

Emily North, 5-8 freshman setter from Red Oak, averages 6.08 assists and Nicole Murff, 5-7 freshman libero from San Antonio (Antonian Prep), averages 5.13 digs.

JAVELINA ALL-AMERICAN football and track and field athlete Roberto Garza is appearing in national television ads for Modelo beer, along with Anthony Munoz and Tony Gonzalez.

These ads are appearing on numerous sports telecasts, and especially those of the NFL games.

Garza was an 11-time All-American in football and track and field while with the Javelinas and played with the Chicago Bears and Atlanta Falcons professionally.

He is married to former Javelina volleyball and cross country athlete Ashley Golden.

THE NCAA PLAYING Rule Oversight Panel has approved a beach volleyball rule that mandates a referee stand with a platform, podium ladder or platform workstation for each competition court by the 2020 season for a contest to count.

The platform may be attached to a permanently installed net standard or may be free-standing.

The platform should be adjustable in height to allow the referee's eye position to be approximately 19 inches above the top of the net.

The platform must be constructed, positioned and padded so that it presents the least potential hazard for players while retaining maximum stability for the referee.

Step ladders, jump boxes and other devices not specifically designed as referee platforms may not be used.

The front and sides of the referee's platform must be padded to a minimum height of 5-6 with at least a one-half inch thick resilient, shock-absorbing materials.

The Javelina beach courts are equipped with referee stands as required by the NCAA.

The panel also approved a requirement for the visiting team to wear a uniform top that is of contrasting color to that selected by the home team.

That is a requirement that is good not only for the referee but the fans as well.

FORMER JAVELINA FOOTBALL player Mark Jaimes has a son who is playing at the University of Nebraska.

Brendon Jaimes is a 6-6, 300-pound sophomore for the Huskers and broke the Nebraska record for starting the most games (seven) as a freshman.

Mark played for the Javelinas in the early 1990s.

His father, Abel, is a Javelina alum and an uncle, Lupe Jaimes, played for the Javelinas in the late 1950s and was a member of the 1959 national championship team. He is a member of the Javelina Hall of Fame.

BIDS WERE DUE last week for sites wanting to host the NCAA Division II championship game in December.

The game was originally scheduled for Kansas City, Kan., but stadium renovations made it necessary to move the game to a new location.

The defense has allowed 508.3 total yards a game, 197.8 rushing and 310.5 passing.

Dione Alston, 5-8, 157-pound senior running back from Salem, N.J., leads the Highlands rushing with 116.8 yards a game. He averages 8.1 yards a carry and has a touchdown.

Danny Cameron, 6-1, 208-pound senior quarterback from Baton Rouge, La., has completed 64 of 113 (.566) passes for 225.8 yards a game. He has thrown for nine touchdowns and has had two picked off.

D.J. McFadden, 6-3, 206-pound senior wideout from Philadelphia, Pa., has 20 receptions for 271 yards and three scores.

Eli Schoettmer, 6-1, 214-pound sophomore linebacker from Columbus, Ind., tops the defensive chart for the Cowboys with 37 tackles.

The game is the second of four in a row on the home field for the Javelinas.

They host Western Oregon Oct. 6 in another non-league matchup and will return to LSC action Oct. 13 with Midwestern State.

Five of the team's seven remaining games are in Javelina Stadium.

McAllen would also make a good location. The Valley hosted the NAIA national title games in the 1970s and 1980s.

LONE STAR CONFERENCE notes:

...Texas A&M-Commerce has announced that it had a record-setting revenue year in 2017-18, receiving more than \$715,000 in private cash gifts, corporate gifts and external sales.

The total includes more than \$600,000 in philanthropic gift support and corporate partnerships.

The remaining revenues came from record ticket sales across all ticketed sports (football, men's and women's basketball, soccer, softball, volleyball and outdoor track and field).

The record giving was anchored by three key philanthropic initiatives:

The Lion Champions Fund, the athletic development arm for TAMUC athletics, generated more than \$418,186 in cash gifts to directly support 426 student-athletes. In 2016, that number was less than \$60,000.

The Ernest Hawkins Legacy Campaign saw \$361,000 in cash gifts and pledges over a six-week period during which the Memorial Stadium field was named for Hawkins.

The Night With Champions event, celebrating the 2017 national football championship, generated more than \$99,400 in football summer school scholarship support.

...The West Texas A&M men's and women's basketball teams will hold their Maroon & White Tip-Off Classic Oct. 18 in Piehl Barn.

The evening will include dinner, drinks, live and silent auctions as well as a meet and greet with the basketball players and staff.

Money raised will go to the teams' fall tournament schedules.

...Kami Norton of Angelo State has been named the Division II Conference Commissioner's Association Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

She has a 4.0 grade point average in her collegiate career.

A member of the ASU indoor and outdoor track and field teams, she has won numerous LSC titles in her career.

...West Texas A&M has won three NCAA Division II national volleyball championships and ranks the Buffs with the third most.

Concordia-St. Paul (Minn.) has nine titles and Portland (Ore.) State has won four.

The Buffs won their national titles in 1997, 1991 and 1990.

No other teams in the Lone Star Conference has taken a national volleyball trophy.

...Eastern New Mexico athletics and Proview Sports Network of Albuquerque, N.M., have reached an agreement that will broadcast replays of ENMU sports events across New Mexico.

The football games will be replays of the broadcast from KENW that airs the contests live.

Johnson C. Smith cancelled all of its athletic activities. It included a football game with Virginia Union and a volleyball match with Shaw (N.C.).

Smith was the site of the NCAA Division II track and field championship last spring. The Javelina men won the national title at the meet.

Chowan (N.C.) postponed all of its athletic events. This included football, volleyball, men's and women's soccer, men's and women's tennis and men's and women's cross country.

A football game between Mississippi College and North Greenville (S.C.), scheduled in Tigerville, S.C., was cancelled.

It will not be rescheduled in that both teams have 10 other games on the schedule, the minimum required by the NCAA to be considered for postseason play.

As a part of the aftermath of the hurricane, the North Carolina-Pembroke football team cancelled its game with Tusculum in Greenville, Tenn., last weekend.

The severe flooding threat to eastern North Carolina caused the UNCP safety personnel to recommend that staff, students and fans continue to shelter in place.

Trevecca Nazarene (Tenn.) is giving a \$50 per gender discount for any team needing to reschedule a missed cross country meet because of Hurricane Florence.

With the discount, the participation cost per team is \$125.

...A Central Oklahoma football player lost a foot when he was run over by a train recently.

His foot was severed.

Former Javelina Basketball Player Receives Promotion With TxDOT

Former Texas A&M-Kingsville basketball player Tito Olivarez has been appointed Corpus Christi District Engineer with the Texas Department of Transportation.

In his new role, Olivarez will oversee the planning, design,

construction, operation and maintenance of the state's transportation system for the 10-county Corpus Christi District where he has served as deputy district engineer since 2015.

A 19-year veteran with TxDOT, Olivarez began his career

in the Pharr District where he worked as Pharr Area Engineer.

His office managed the design, construction and maintenance of state roadways and bridges in Hidalgo County.

Olivarez received a construction award from the Association of General Contractors and TxDOT in 2003, and again in 2009, for overseeing the expansion of Expressway US 83 in Mercedes.

He was selected as director of operations for the Corpus Christi District in 2014

After being named Corpus Christi District Deputy District Engineer in June 2015, he served as project manager for the district's \$1 billion Harbor Bridge design-build project.

A native of Mission, he received a bachelor's degree in civil engineering from TAMUK in 1999.

He played on the Javelina basketball team that won the Lone Star Conference championship in 1996 and was a teammate of current Javelina head men's basketball coach Johnny Estelle.

Olivarez received his Professional Engineer's license in 2004.

He and his wife, Kimberly, have two sons, Nathan Ezra and Nicholas Elijah.

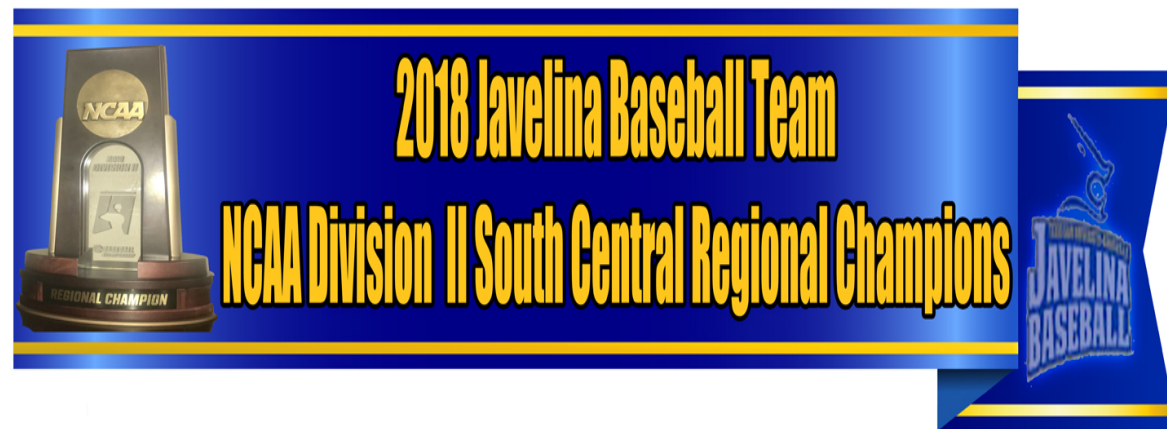

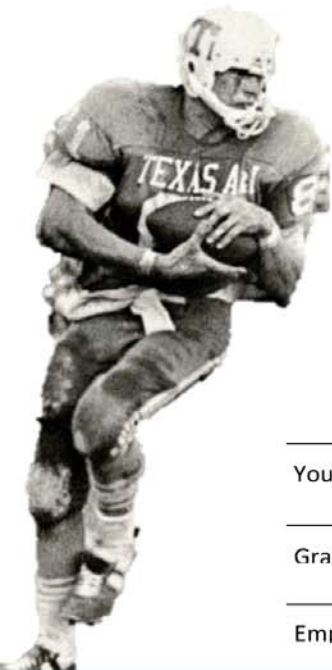

The Javelinas prevailed, 28-23, but it went to the wire before the final decision was reached.

Wideout Eldridge Small made a spectacular 33-yard pass from quarterback Karl Douglas with 1:12 left in the game to provide the victory margin for the home team.

Highlands had taken a 23-22 lead with 2:12 left in the fourth before Douglas and Small combined for the winner.

The leads switched back and forth throughout the game.

The Javelinas led 7-0 in the first period, Highlands scored twice in the second quarter to lead 13-7 at halftime and the Javelinas

had a 14-13 lead going into the final period.

Highlands went in front 16-14 with a field goal midway in the fourth quarter.

Running back Henry Glenn scored with 6:57 left to push the Javelinas back ahead, 22-16.

Then came the exciting finish with Highlands scoring at 2:12 and the Javelinas at 1:12.

Highlands had 369 total yards to the Javelinas' 330.

Douglas had eight pass completions but they were for 194 yards and three touchdowns.

Wideout Dwight Harrison had three receptions for 75 yards, Small had two for 65 yards and

Glenn had one reception for 37 yards. All three had receiving touchdowns.

Harrison returned three kickoffs for 63 yards.

Javelina lineman Claude McMillon had 16 tackles. Lineman Margarito Guerrero had nine tackles and was named the most valuable lineman in the game.

Javelina defensive back Roy Farmer tied the NAIA playoff record with two interceptions.

The only other matchup between the Javelinas and Cowboys came in 1972, in Kingsville, and the Javelinas took a 30-6 victory.

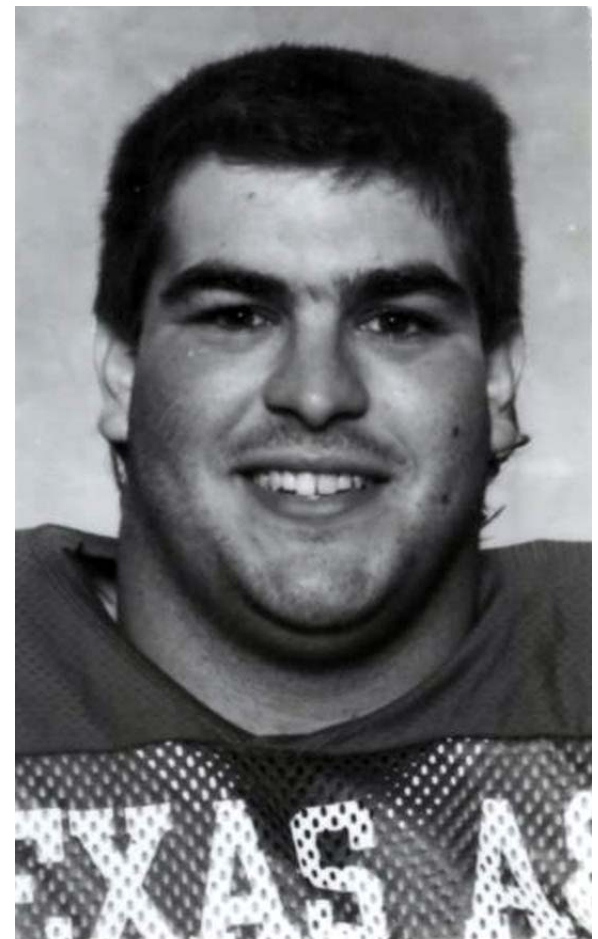
