## 1979 National Championship Football Team To Celebrate Its 40th Anniversary Nov. 8-9

The 1979 Texas A&I football team will be one of three Javelina national championship squads to celebrate anniversaries this fall.

The '79 squad won the sixth national trophy in an 11-year period.

The team has been inducted into the Javelina Hall of Fame.

Fourteen members of the team and staff have been inducted into the Hall individually or with other teams.

These are players Juan Castillo, Randy Friedrich, Andy Hawkins, Robert Pool, Durwood Roquemore, Mike Sheffield, Glenn Starks, Martin Stroman and Robert Young.

Coaches previously inducted are Ron Harms, Pete Murray and Young.

Staff members are trainer Willie Gipson and sports information director Fred Nuesch.

The 1979 football team was picked to finish third in the Lone Star Conference.

The team compiled a 12-1 record en route to the seventh national trophy for the Javelina program.

Harms took over the head position two months before the start of the season. He had been the Javelina offensive coordinator in 1974 and 1975 before going to Baylor.

In the three postseason games, the Javelinas defeated Western Colorado, 38-14, in the

# Javelina Hash

**GARRETT ALEXANDER, WHO** finished his eligibility with the Javelina baseball team last spring, is a pitcher with the Swift Current team in Swift Current, Saskatchewan.

The squad is in the Western Canadian Baseball League.

**TWO LSC TEAMS** ranked among the NCAA Division II leaders in women's basketball attendance in 2018-19.

West Texas A&M averaged 940 a game and that ranked 21<sup>st</sup>.

Angelo State was 24<sup>th</sup> with 895 a game.

Northern (S.D.) State led the division with an average of 2,609 a game.

The Lone Star Conference was fourth among the Division II leagues in attendance, averaging 572 a contest.

The Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association had the best attendance figures among the leagues with an average of 1,053 a game.

**LONE STAR CONFERENCE** notes:

...Cameron and Texas Woman's claimed the 2018-19 Lone Star Conference Academic Excellence Award.

Cameron took the men's honor for the first time and TWU was the women's recipient for the fifth time. The Aggies and Pioneers will each receive a cash reward and custom trophy.

Cameron had the top team grade point average in outdoor track and field and TWU had top team GPAs in basketball, soccer and volleyball.

The award winners were determined by a point system, with points distributed according to finish by sport in those that the LSC sponsors, after a conference-wide comparison of team GPAs.

The member institution with the highest team GPA in each sport was named the sport's academic champion and earned five points toward the overall award.

Each sport's runnerup picked up four points and third-place three points toward the overall award. Any program with a team GPA of 2.00 and above earned one point.

Points for each member institution were totaled by gender and then divided by that institution's number of counter programs in that gender to arrive at the comparison value.

Davis & Elkins (W. Va.) and Frostburg (Md.) State became part of the league.

North Carolina-Pembroke became an associate member of the conference in women's swimming, wrestling and men's and women's track and field. It will compete in the MEC in football beginning in 2020.

...The Minnesota State-Moorhead Student-Athletic Activities Committee has granted two wishes for a five-year-old who is battling cancer.

Through the Make-A-Wish program, she and her family were able to go to Disney World where she met Princess Elsa from the movie Frozen.

...Edward Waters (Ga.) has received an invitation to join the Southern Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and it will rejoin the league after a lapse of 85 years.

The program was part of the SIAC in 1929-35.

Waters will transition from the NAIA to NCAA Division II.

The school will become the 15<sup>th</sup> in the SIAC. The current members are Albany (Ga.) State, Benedict (S.C.), Central (Ohio) State, Clark Atlanta (Ga.), Fort Valley (Ga.), Kentucky State, Lane (Tenn.), LeMoyne-Owen (Tenn.), Miles (Ala.), Morehouse (Ga.), Paine (Ga.), Savannah (Ga.) State, Spring Hill (Ala.) and Tuskegee (Ala.).

The NCAA requires a provisional period of three years for colleges moving into Division II during which the school must demonstrate its compliance with NCAA rules, attend orientation sessions and submit an updated strategic plan to the association by June 1 of the first provisional year.

A school must also provide a financial model for its program and show that it meets NCAA requirements for financial aid, staffing and facilities. There is an application fee of \$33,000 for programs wanting to enter Division II.

A school must have an invitational from an existing conference before applying for the division.

During the provisional membership period, schools are not eligible for NCAA postseason championships.

### Javelina Hall of Fame Charter Members

The first inductees into the Javelina Hall of Fame when it was started in 1972 were, left to right, standing, Gil Steinke, W.L. Harbin, Johnny McNabb, John Mark Dixon and Robert Rich, and seated, Mrs. Don Hightower, accepting for her husband; Mrs. Robert Hodgkiss, accepting for her husband, and Louise Clarkson, accepting for her brother, Stuart Clarkson. Steinke later played pro football for the Philadelphia Eagles and returned to his alma mater in 1954 as head football coach. His teams won six national championships and he became one of the most successful coaches in collegiate football history. Clarkson was the first Javelina to play in the NFL when he had a career with the Chicago Bears. Most of the Hall of Fame inductees participated in several sports during their careers with the Javelinas. The 48th Javelina Hall of Fame induction is set for Sept. 20 in the Memorial Student Union Building. Former football quarterback Okay Basci and former men's head basketball coach and assistant football coach Ted Carley will be inducted as individuals along with the 2002 softball team.

## Annual LSC Football Media Day Monday in McKinney

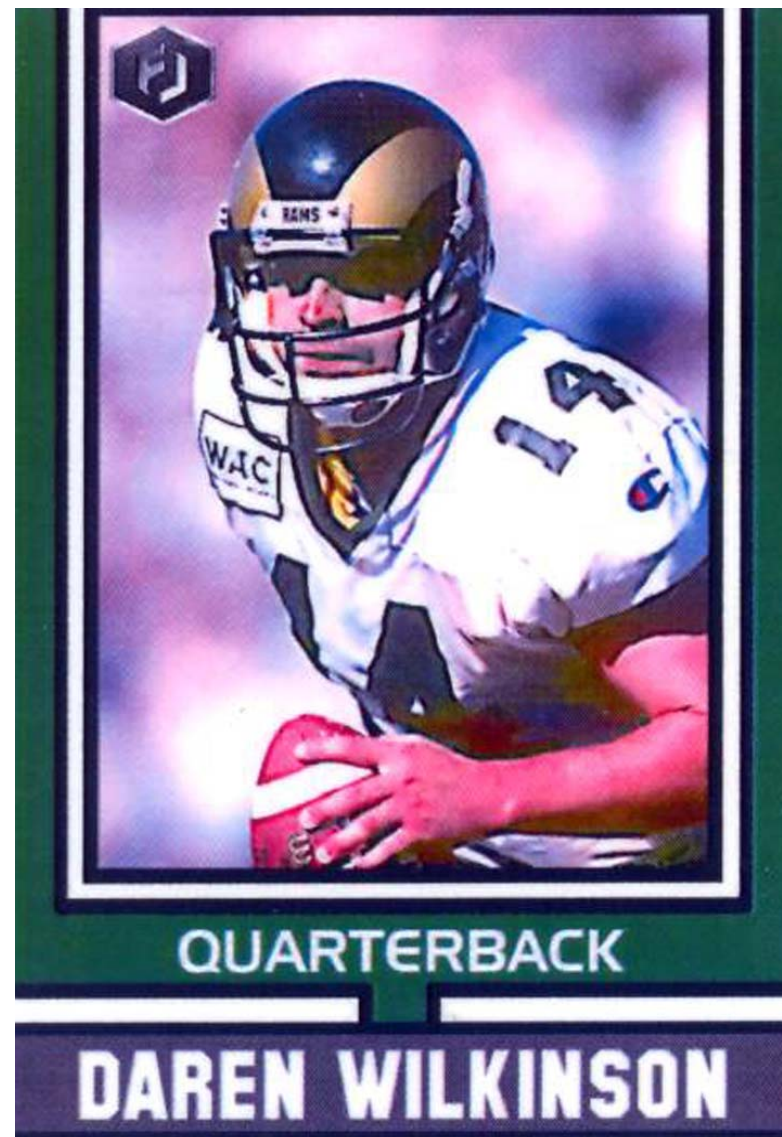
The annual Lone Star Conference football media day will be held Monday in the McKinney Independent School District Stadium and Community Event Center in McKinney.
