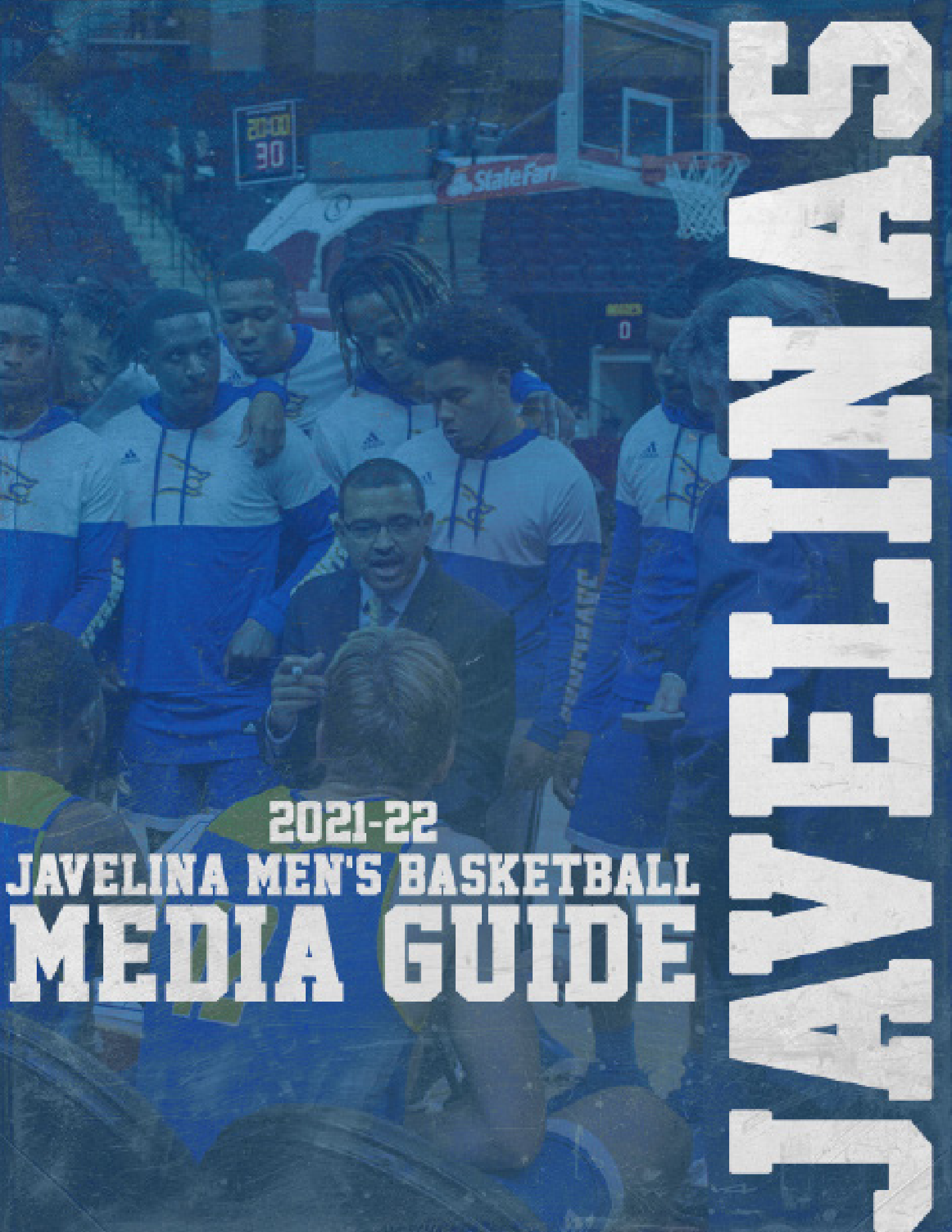

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Montoya joined the TAMUK Athletic Department in March 2018.

Montoya brings six years of experience between the NCAA Division I and II levels to Kingsville with his most recent stop at Oregon State University in Corvallis. He was the primary media contact for the Oregon State men's soccer, women's swimming and softball programs, and assisted with game day coverage for the football, volleyball, wrestling, and men's and women's basketball programs.

Prior to Oregon State, Montoya spent a year in the University of Denver athletic communications department as the primary media contact for the volleyball and women's lacrosse programs, and the secondary media contact for the men's soccer, men's basketball and men's lacrosse programs.

While at Denver, Montoya was also the primary contact for the 2016 Summit League Volleyball Championships, and assisted with coverages of the men's soccer program at the 2016 NCAA College Cup in Houston, Texas and the men's lacrosse program at the 2017 NCAA Tournament.

Montoya first got his start in the sports information field at the Division II level in the Colorado Mesa University sports information department as a student worker/intern with primary media responsibilities for the track and field and lacrosse programs.

Following his time at CMU, Montoya spent an additional two years at the University of Mary sports information department as a graduate assistant with primary media responsibilities for the men's soccer, volleyball, wrestling, women's basketball, softball and women's tennis programs.

A native of Austin, Texas, Montoya graduated with a bachelor's degree in sport management from Colorado Mesa in 2012 and finished his MBA at U-Mary in 2016.

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Mark Inserra joined the TAMUK sports information department in August of 2017, taking on the title of the "The Voice of the Javelinas" in addition to a role as assistant sports information director. He serves as the main contact for indoor and beach volleyball, men's basketball and softball.

Inserra came aboard in Kingsville after spending the 2016-17 academic year as the associate director of sports information at Carson-Newman University. In that role, he functioned as the main contact for men's and women's soccer, men's and women's golf and men's and women's swimming. He also handled play-by-play duties for C-N's home soccer matches and occasionally filled in as play-by-play broadcaster for Eagles' women's basketball and baseball.

In 2015-16, Inserra worked for ESPN Williamsport, serving as the broadcasting voice for Wilkes University football and men's and women's basketball.

The New Jersey native spent 2013 as the Director of Media Relations and Marketing for the Beloit Snappers, the Single-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics. He began his career in sports media in 2012, when he spent the year as the Assistant Director of Media Relations and Broadcasting for the Charleston RiverDogs, the Single-A affiliate of the New York Yankees.

Inserra is a 2011 graduate of Marist College, having earned a degree in Sports Communication. He is a native of Florham Park, New Jersey.

Smith has worked for TAMUK sports information since 2017, first as an intern, then moving on to a graduate assistant spot starting in the fall of 2021. He is the department's primary contact for men's and women's cross country and men's, women's golf and women's indoor and outdoor track and field.

His duties have included writing press releases, keeping stats, managing social media accounts, designing graphics, producing video content and conducting interviews, among other responsibilities.





In each of the last two seasons, the Texas A&M-Kingsville men's basketball team has accomplished something never done before in program history.

During the 2019-20 season, the Javelinas piled up 16 Lone Star Conference wins, the most in school history, and they also reached 20 wins for the first time in more than 20 years and earned the sixth NCAA Tournament bid in program history.

In 2020-21, the Javelinas crafted the highest win percentage in program history with a mark of .833 and they also defended home court to the tune of an 11-0 mark at the Steinke Physical Education Center. Those numbers helped the Javelinas capture the LSC's South Division Championship.

Now, with the 2021-22 season on the horizon, the Hogs have rested and reloaded and are preparing to try and put together another history-making campaign.

The Javelinas first two matchups of the season will take place on the road, first with a Friday matchup against the South Dakota Mines Hardrockers that will take place at the King Center in Rapid City, S.D. at 8 p.m. The team's next stop will be in at the Chicoine Center in Chadron, Neb., where they'll be taking on the Chadron State Eagles at 8 p.m. on Saturday.

"Last year we had a great year," said coach Johnny Estelle. "We've had a really good couple of years, but at the end of the day, that doesn't do anything about the future. We have to take care of what is in front of us today and what that means is being the best version of us today."

Among the players forming the core of this edition of Javelina men's basketball are four returning all-conference players. Senior Tre Flowers (Bryan, Texas) and juniors Creighton Avery (Corpus Christi, Texas), Will Chayer (Corpus Christi, Texas) and Jordan Wilson (Blytheville, Ark.) formed the program's first-ever all-conference quartet and the efforts of Chayer and Avery were also recognized with spots on the All-LSC Defensive Team.

Avery's second season in Kingsville saw him become the first Javelina since Wendell Mulkey in 2009 to earn an All-LSC First-Team spot and his average of 14.3 points per game was the program's best since Rashad Basey's mark of 16.5 in 2013-14. He saved his best performance for the first round of the conference tournament, when he helped the Javs oust Angelo State with a 32-point night, the highest single-game point total by a TAMUK player in nearly a decade.

Chayer spent his third year in Kingsville collecting a pair of LSC Player of the Week awards, leading the Hogs in shooting percentage and blocking 23 shots, tied for third-most in the league. He was one of anchors for a defense that allowed the fewest points per game in the conference while posting the best scoring average of his career and logging a pair of double-doubles.

For Flowers, it was his second consecutive season on all-conference roster and he accomplished that feat by starting every game in 2020-21 and leading the team in minutes played and made threes. Wilson's selection followed a successful first year in Blue and Gold in which he finished as the squad's second-leading scorer and rebounder.

"We have a lot of guys that played significant roles on last year's championship level team," said Estelle, "and I think that has boiled over to this year. You can have a lot of guys back, but if they haven't experiences winning at a high level, it can be difficult to get program headed where it needs to head. We only have two new guys and they've done a great job coming along and doing their part and adding to the family."

Joining the Javelinas' long list of returners are newcomers C.J. Smith (Mansfield, Texas) and Xavier Armstead (Waco, Texas), both of whom made their first impression by scoring in double figures on Nov. 1st when the Javs battled the Texas A&M Aggies.

Smith's night in College Station saw him log a game-high 17 points and six assists, as well as five steals and he showed off the skills that helped him lead Western Texas College to a 38-19 record in two seasons there. Armstead tallied 14 points against the Aggies and flashed some of the ability that he showed in two seasons at McLennan College, where he scored 1,016 points, twice was named to the all-region roster and was the leading scorer on a pair of Highlander teams that ran up a combined total of 49 wins.

The man guiding this group is Johnny Estelle, who returns for his eighth season as head coach and who has led the Javelinas a 36-12 record over the last two years. Estelle's eighth season beings with a major milestone in sight, as Estelle needs just two more wins to become the fifth Javelina coach ever to reach 100 victories. He would be joining a group that includes Bill Carter, Jerry Hopkins, Ted Carley and Pete Peterson.

Both the Hardrockers and the Eagles have become familiar foes for the Javelinas, who will be visiting both schools for the second time in four years. TAMUK has a combined record of 6-1 against these two teams, which each of those games coming within the last five seasons.

In 2019-20, the Hardrockers and Eagles both came to Kingsville and the Hogs edged out a one-point win over each squad. Against SDM, the Javs eliminated a seven-point deficit in the final two minutes for a 70-69 victory that included 21 points from Flowers in his Javelina debut.

"We have played these guys a lot," said Estelle, "but I like playing them because they are a conference level team. Their style makes them a very deep team and there aren't many teams in our conference that play like that, but also they're regional opponents. Our year isn't going to be won or lost this weekend, but it's the first game of the season that basically sets the tone for the rest of the year."

Eighth Season at Texas A&M-Kingsville

Texas A&M-Kingsville '98

Former men's basketball player and graduate assistant Johnny Estelle returned to his old stomping grounds as Texas A&M University-Kingsville's 16th head coach in program history in 2014-15 after spending the 2013-14 season at the University of Houston. The 2018-19 campaign will be his fifth season guiding the program.

As an assistant coach under James Dickey, Estelle helped the Houston Cougars earn upset victories over nationally-ranked University of Memphis, Southern Methodist University and 2014 NCAA National Champion University of Connecticut in the American Athletic Conference Tournament. UH went on to win 17 games in 2013-14.

In 2021-22, Estelle will embark upon his eighth season as head coach following a 2020-21 campaign in which the Javelinas reached numerous milestones. The team's 15-3 record gave them an .833 win percentage, the best single-season mark in program history. At one point, the Hogs reeled off 11 straight wins, which matched a team-best set during the 1994-95 campaign. Estelle saw his club rise as high as No. 10 in the national rankings, the highest for any Javelina team since 1995-96, and four of his pupils were named all-conference. That group included junior point guard Creighton Avery, who became the first player in program history to be named to the All-LSC First-Team and LSC All-Defensive Team.

In 2019-20, Estelle presided over one of the most successful seasons in the history of Javelina basketball. The Javelinas posted a record of 16-6 in the Lone Star Conference, their highest win total ever in conference play, and rolled up 21 victories overall, their most since 1995-96 and the team's sixth 20-win campaign. For their efforts, the Hogs reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time, landing the No. 5 seed in the South Central Region. This marked TAMUK's second NCAA Tournament appearance under Estelle.

Four members of the 2019-20 squad garnered recognition from the Lone Star Conference, the highest total for a Javelina team since 2008-09. Senior Rashon Thomas was named the LSC's Sixth Man of the Year and joined junior Tre Flowers on the All-LSC Second-Team. An all-conference Honorable Mention spot went to senior Chauncey Thomas, with sophomore Will Chayer landing on the LSC's All-Academic Team.

Under Estelle's watch, the Javelinas returned to the LSC Tournament in 2018-19 following a regular season in which they upset a pair of ranked teams and had two players honored by the Lone Star Conference. On Nov. 24th, the Hogs visited No. 14 St. Edward's and left with a 69-58 victory. The Javelinas sprung another upset on Jan. 10th, defeating No. 8 West Texas A&M 86-74, a victory that started a six-game win streak. Senior

Robert Stevenson landed on the All-LSC Defensive Team for the second straight year and was also on the conference's honorable mention roster. Stevenson finished his career as the program's all-time leader in blocked shots. Freshman Darius Mickens was placed on the All-LSC Third-Team.

The 2016-17 season was Estelle's best year as he led the Javelinas to a fourth place tie in the Lone Star Conference and played in the semifinals of the LSC Tournament. Claiming one win in the conference tournament, the Javelinas received the 7th seed for the NCAA South Central Regional Tournament and knocked of the undisputed LSC Champions and No. 2 seed, UT Permian Basin on a last second three-point shot. Making the Round of 32 is the furthestest for the TAMUK basketball program.

A Waco, Texas native, Estelle became head coach at Navarro College prior to the 2008-09 season. During his seven-year stint, he led the Bulldogs to a 126-48 overall record with an unprecedented run of six Region XIV Tournament championship game appearances.

He guided Navarro College to Region XIV Tournament titles in 2009, 2010 and 2012 and the regular-season championship in 2013. His resume also includes two NJCAA All-America First-Team honorees, 16 Region XIV All-Conference members, 12 Region XIV All-Tournament Team members and four Region XIV Texas All-Stars vs. United States All-Star Game competitors.

His 2009-10 Navarro team posted a 30-7 overall record to tie a school single-season record for wins and advanced to the NJCAA National Tournament semifinals. Earlier in the year, the program earned a No. 2 national ranking, its highest since 1979.

Estelle and his staff were successful in placing 21 of their student-athletes in NCAA Division I programs while retaining a 93.7 percent graduation rate during his tenure.

In addition, 13 student-athletes achieved Dean's List honors with five being named to the Region XIV All-Academic Team. Individually, players for Estelle received numerous awards under his guidance. Among the honorees were two first-team All-Americans, two Region XIV Conference Player of the Year winners, three Region XIV Tournament MVPs, three NJCAA National Tournament All-Tournament sections and one Texas Association of Basketball Coaches Junior College Player of the Year. Twelve players were chosen all-conference, and four were named first-team all-region.

In his first year as a head coach, he guided the team to a 25-11 record, Region XIV Tournament championship and a berth in the NJCAA National Tournament. For his team's impressive accomplishments, he was named the Region XIV Coach of the Year, the first of three Region XIV honors during his career.

Following Navarro's season, he was selected to serve as a coach for the 2009 USA Basketball Men's U19 World Championship and World University Games team trials. He was one of only six coaches from across the country to receive the honor.

Estelle began his affiliation with Navarro Junior College as an assistant coach in 2000-01. Working with Orr, he helped lead the program to six Region XIV tournament appearances, four Region XIV tournament semifinal berths and two Region XIV tournament finals.

He entered the coaching ranks as a student assistant coach at Texas A&M-Kingsville from 1996 to 1998 and moved to a graduate assistant position in 1998-99. Estelle also served as an assistant coach at Northland Pioneer College during the 1999-00 campaign.

Estelle played college basketball at Missouri Valley College (1992-93) and Northland Pioneer College (1993-94). In his lone season at Northland Pioneer for coach Richard Zalenski, he led the team to a 30-5 record, the ACCAC and NJCAA Region I championships and a berth in the NJCAA National Tournament. After transferring to Texas A&M-Kingsville, the sharpshooter set school records as a senior for coach Bill Carter. In 1995-96, he led the Javelinas to a school-record 23 wins, the Lone Star Conference Tournament championship and a berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament.

He earned All-Lone Star Conference Second-Team honors after averaging 16.0 points per game and swiping a school-record 88 steals. Later that season, he drained a school-record nine 3-pointers in the LSC Tournament championship against Central Oklahoma and was named the tournament's Most Valuable Player.

Fourth Season at Texas A&M-Kingsville

After a year away from Kingsville, Omar Gonzalez is back in Blue and Gold, once again joining the staff of men's basketball coach Johnny Estelle, who is bringing Gonzalez into the fold once again as an assistant coach, the program announced on Thursday. From 2014 to 2017, Gonzalez was a graduate assistant for Estelle.

In 2020-21, the hard work of Gonzalez and the rest of the coaching staff paid off in the form of a 15-3 record, good enough for an .833 win percentage that stands as the best in school history. During one stretch, the Javelinas did not lose for more than two months, stringing together 11 straight wins to match a team record. Four TAMUK student-athletes achieved all-conference status, including one of Gonzalez's prize pupils, junior forward Will Chayer, who was an All-Lone Star Conference Second-Team pick and made the LSC All-Defensive Team.

During the 2019-20 season, Gonzalez was on the bench for the one of the best seasons in program history. The Javelinas posted a record of 16-6 in the Lone Star Conference, their highest win total ever in conference play, and rolled up 21 victories overall, their most since 1995-96 and the team's sixth 20-win campaign. For their efforts, the Hogs reached the NCAA Tournament for the sixth time, landing the No. 5 seed in the South Central Region. This marked TAMUK's second NCAA Tournament appearance with Gonzalez on the staff.

Four Javelinas earned recognition from the LSC, with Rashon Thomas and Tre Flowers picking up spots on the all-conference second-team, Chauncey Thomas garnering Honorable Mention

status and Will Chayer being selected for the conference's all-academic team. Rashon Thomas also nabbed the LSC's Sixth Man of the Year award.

Gonzalez helped the Javelinas return to the Lone Star Conference Tournament in 2019 after they missed out on postseason play in 2018. He also helped freshman Darius Mickens and senior Robert Stevenson earn spots on the All-Lone Star Conference roster. Mickens was a third-team honoree and Stevenson was named an honorable mention choice and a member of the all-defensive team.

During his first stint with the Javelinas, Gonzalez helped guide a squad that would improve from eight wins in year one to 11 in year two. In year three of Estelle and Gonzalez's tenure, the team racked up 19 victories, including a record of 10-8 in Lone Star Conference play, TAMUK's highest win total in conference action since 1995-96. The Javs capped the season with their first ever NCAA Tournament victory, a 74-71 triumph at the expense of UT Permian Basin. During this time, Gonzalez also earned his master's degree in education and human performance from Texas A&M-Kingsville.

Gonzalez spent the 2017-18 campaign as an assistant coach at Blinn College in Brenham, Texas, helping the Buccaneers accumulate 20 wins and reach the regional semi-finals. The team also placed three student-athletes on the All-Region XIV squad.

Prior to coming to Kingsville, Gonzalez spent two seasons as the head manager of the University of Houston basketball team. His duties included planning and coordinating official recruiting visits and assisting with practices, travel itineraries and summer camps. He also served as intramurals coordinator, training new basketball referees.

Gonzalez first opportunity in basketball came at the University of Texas at El Paso, where he was the basketball manager for two seasons. He received a bachelor's degree in Kinesiology and Sports Administration in 2014 from the University of Houston.

Matt McGouran is in his second season on Johnny Estelle's staff and spent his first year in Kingsville helping Estelle lead the Javelinas to a 15-3 mark and a program-record .833 win percentage. The Hogs also matched a school record by winning 11 consecutive games at one point and put four players on the All-Lone Star Conference roster.

McGouran arrived in Kingsville after spending four years at the University of Houston, where he earned a degree in Sport Administration, served as a sports marketing intern in the athletic department and handled internal operations for the Houston Cougars men's basketball program. In the latter roll, his responsibilities included assisting with game day operations, compiling recruiting information and serving as a liaison between the men's basketball and the offices of compliance and business, as well as the athletic director's office. 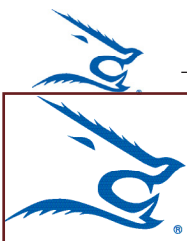

His leadership from the point guard spot helped TAMUK pile up 21 victories, the team's highest win total since Johnny Estelle was the point guard in 1995-96 and their 16 LSC wins set a new program record. All that added up to TAMUK's sixth appearance in the NCAA Tournament.

Thomas earned his undergraduate degree from TAMUK, graduating in the summer of 2020. He is a native of Plano, Texas.

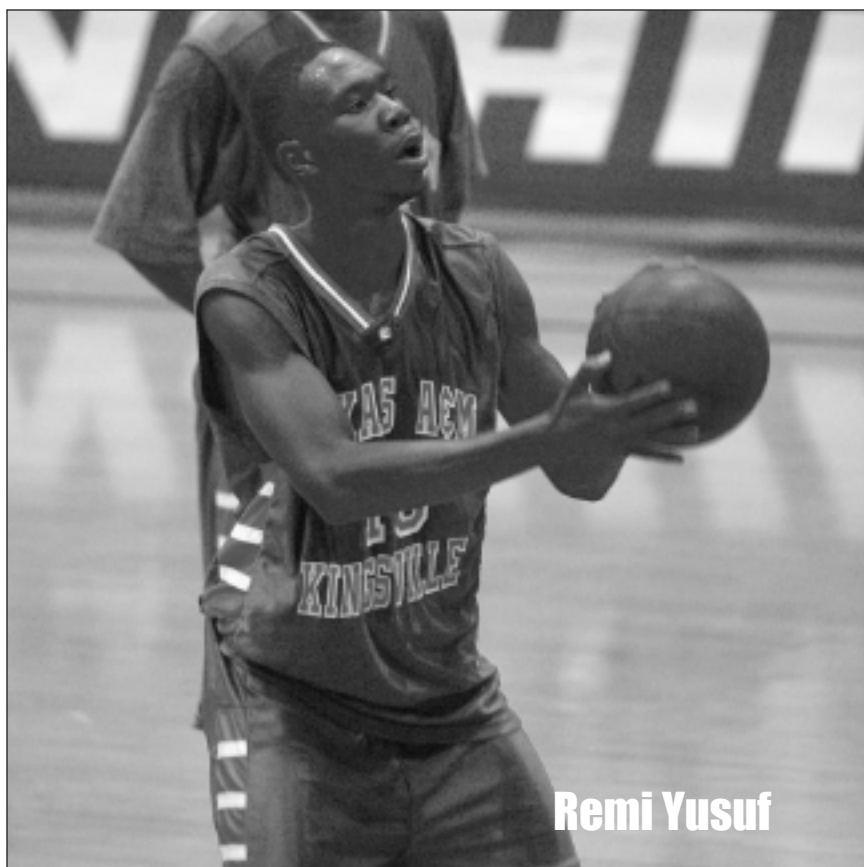

Played: USBL

Javelina Career: Barnett averaged 10.9 points per game in his two-year career. He averaged 10.7 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.8 assists per game as a senior. He earned Second Team LSC honors.

William Brown

Played: Mexico, Lebanon

Javelina Career: Brown played from 2002-04 and was a big-time scorer for the Javelinas. He averaged 20.3 points en route to earning LSC First Team honors and Second Team All-Region honors as a junior. He led the team to the NCAA Tournament as a senior averaging 17.2 points per game. He was a Division II Bulletin Honorable Mention All-American and the LSC Most Valuable Player. He scored 1,062 points in two seasons.

Roberto Flores

Played: Mexico

Javelina Career: He played one season for the Javelinas in 2005-06 averaging 2.1 points per game.

Richard Gonzales

Played: Mexico

Javelina Career: A four-year starter from 2001-05. He finished his career with 146 three-pointers, 316 assists, 159 steals and 1,115 points. He was the LSC Freshman of the Year in 2002 and the LSC Defensive Player of the Year in 2005.

Rickey Huckaby

Played: Kuwait, Saudi Arabia, Slovakia

Javelina Career: A two-year starter during the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons. He averaged 12.3 and 12.7 points per game and had two nearly identical seasons. He was a two-time LSC South Second Team player. He made 68 three-pointers and scored 715 points in 58 career games.

Bobby Pandy

Played: Dominican Republic

Javelina Career: Pandy played the same two years as Huckaby and had a similar career. He averaged 12.1 points and 6.3 rebounds as a junior and 12.8 points and 6.3 rebounds as a senior. He shot 54.3 percent from the field for his career.

Deron Rutledge

Played: England, IBA, USBL, ABA, NBDL

Javelina Career: Rutledge was one of the greatest players in school history. He was a First Team NCAA Division II All-American in 1995 and a Second Team NCAA D2 All-American and Second Team Basketball Times All-American in 1996. He was the LSC MVP in 1996 after averaging 21.3 points and 10.7 rebounds per game. In two seasons he scored 1,229 points and grabbed 560 rebounds while shooting 64.6 percent from the field.

Vince Williams

Played: Paraguay, Argentina, Texas Tycoons (ABA)

Javelina Career: Williams played two seasons for the Hoggies from 2002-04. He averaged 8.2 points and 2.6 rebounds as a junior. He shot 55.8 percent from the field as a junior.

Remi Yusuf

Javelina Career: A four-year letterwinner from 2002-07. Averaged 18.8 points and 5.5 rebounds per game as a junior and 16.7 points and 5.2 rebounds as a senior. The 2006 Lone Star Conference MVP, Division II Bulletin All-American and Daktronics all-South Central Region honoree.

Long known as a leader in intercollegiate athletics, the Lone Star Conference (LSC) is an innovative athletics conference that aims to provide a superior competitive experience for member institutions and to allow for comprehensive development of student-athletes through academic services and life skills programming.

The LSC continues to build upon its proud history while intending to be recognized as the premier NCAA Division II conference in the nation.

The league's mission is to provide comprehensive student-athlete experiences in high-level athletic competition, with particular dedication to student-athlete development, graduation success, sportsmanship, ethical conduct, community engagement, and expanding opportunities.

The LSC - founded on April 25, 1931 - has developed from a five-team conference of Texas-based schools to a nine-member league that spans three states (Texas, Oklahoma and New Mexico). The league continues to assist its member institutions in the maintenance of intercollegiate athletic programs that are compatible with the highest standards of education and competitive sports.

Throughout the league's 83-year history, various institutions have competed under the LSC banner. Today, only Texas A&M University-Commerce (then East Texas State) remains from the original group that was formed in 1931 when North Texas State, Southwest Texas State, Sam Houston State and Stephen F. Austin withdrew from the old Texas Intercollegiate Athletic Association.

The membership alignment has changed over the years, with current members having been added from 1954 to 1995. Texas A&M-Kingsville (formerly Texas A&I) joined in 1954, and Angelo State in 1968.

Conference membership remained within the Texas borders until 1984 when Eastern New Mexico was admitted. Since then, the LSC has included members from Arkansas and Oklahoma.

Cameron (1988, 1996) was added near the outset of an expansion phase, while Texas Woman's (1989) and previous members West Texas A&M (1986, 1993) and Tarleton State (1968, 1994) joined the league soon after.

Midwestern State was admitted early in 1995, while Harding reconnected with the league as an affiliate member in track and field in 2013. In 2014, McMurry returned as an affiliate member in indoor and outdoor track and field, and football.

While the LSC has maintained a long-standing tradition of competitive athletic programs for its members, many teams and individuals have gone on to distinguish themselves on the national stage. Entering 2014-15, LSC member institutions have collected 75 NCAA national championships since the league joined the Division II membership in 1982. West Texas A&M supplied the most recent addition to that total by claiming the softball championship this past spring.

The LSC conducts conference championships in 16 sports (seven men and nine women). Men's championships include football, cross country, basketball, baseball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field and golf. Women's titles are determined in volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, indoor track and field, outdoor track and field, tennis and golf.

The conference office is located in Richardson, a northern suburb of Dallas. Jay Poerner serves as the interim commissioner and director for compliance and Melanie Robotham is the assistant commissioner for media relations.

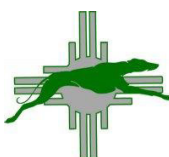
