Four Individuals, 1994 Football Team to Be Inducted Into Javelina HOF

Four individuals and a team will be inducted into the Javelina of Fame Friday night in the Memorial Student Union ballrooms.

The individuals are Levi Johnson, Kim Martinez Lambert, Rosie Moreno, Garrett Murdy

and the 1994 football team.

LEVI JOHNSON

Johnson played football for the Javelinas in 1969-72.

He was a third round draft choice of the Detroit Lions and played with the squad in 1973-77.

He had 21 interceptions in

less than five years as an NFL player and returned three for touchdowns. He led the Lions in interceptions with five in 1973 and in the 1974 season.

Johnson had a career-high six interceptions in 1976.

His pro career ended with a knee injury.

Johnson, who played high school football at Corpus Christi Miller, was on the 1969 and 1970 Javelina national championship squads.

He was Associated Press Little All-America first team, NAIA All-America first team and Gridiron Magazine All-America first team.

He was All-Texas College as a junior and senior, All-Lone Star Conference and NAIA All-District.

Johnson was an All-American Bowl game participant after his senior season.

The Javelinas were 35-10 in his four-year career with the Javelinas.

Johnson was on the Javelina track and field team in 1970, 1971 and 1972.

He was on the 1970 Javelina 440-yard relay team in 1970 that won the Lone Star Conference gold medal.

The Javelinas were LSC champions in 1970.

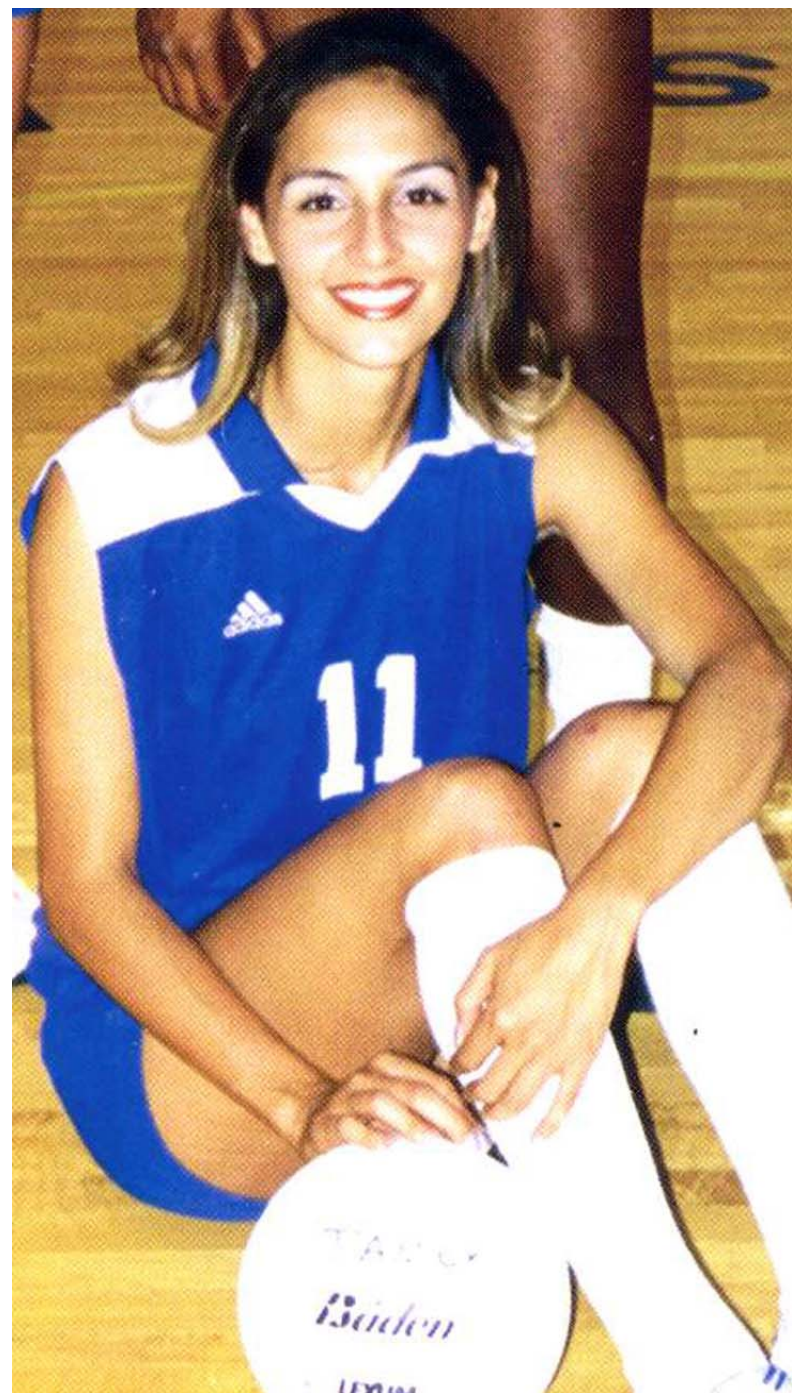
Johnson lives in Detroit.

KIM MARTINEZ LAMBERT

Lambert was on the Javelina volleyball teams in 1996-99.

She was an All-Lone Star Conference first team honoree in

1999, second team in 1998 and honorable mention in 1997.

Lambert ranks first in career digs, first in season digs, second in single match total attacks, second in career service aces, second in match block solos, second in career points, second in career kills, third in career total attacks, fourth in career digs per set, fifth in season kills, eighth in season total attacks, eighth in season points and ninth in career kills per set.

She has been a successful college coach since finishing her career.

Lambert is currently head volleyball coach at the University of Delaware. Before going there, she was assistant coach at North Carolina State.

She spent four seasons as the top assistant coach at Marshall.

Lambert was the head coach at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi in 2006-08 and was the top assistant at Texas-El Paso in 2004-05.

She began her coaching career at Rice.

Lambert is from Sugar Land.

She holds a bachelor's degree in kinesiology from TAMUK.

ROSIE MORENO

Moreno, who passed away in 2016, was a member of the athletic staff for 21 years and oversaw all ticket sales for the athletic programs.

More than a thousand family members, friends and Javelina athletic department friends along with many former Texas A&I and Texas A&M-Kingsville athletic staff members, athletes, sports information directors and trainers filled the Kingsville Memorial Funeral Chapel and the Our Lady of Good Counsel Church for services for Moreno.

A funeral procession a mile long took a long route from the church to the Santa Gertrudis Cemetery so that it passed Javelina Stadium, where Rosie had been a secretary and ticket

manager for several decades.

Following is the eulogy, delivered by Fred Nuesch, who had worked with Rosie beginning in 1980, from the funeral mass:

"When Johnny asked if I would deliver the eulogy, my first thought was, 'How can I possibly say in words my feelings for Rosie'. So much of what you felt for Rosie is in the heart and can't be expressed in words.

"But I first tried to come up with a word that would describe Rosie. Kind. Considerate. Compassionate. Loving. And then 'sweetheart' came to mind. For thousands of athletes, coaches, staff members and friends, at the University and elsewhere, she was just that...a sweetheart.

"I first met Rosie in 1980 when she became secretary in the public affairs office at Texas A&I. She was very shy and was in an office with people who were anything but shy. I quickly found out that Rosie had a great sense of humor. It was subtle. I once told her that I thought she had some British blood in her because of her having the same type sense of honor as the Brits.

"Rosie was a hard worker and most of her work was behind the scenes. She preferred it that way. I would often ask her to get in a picture with an athlete who had received an award and she would shy away. She didn't particularly want to be in the spotlight.

"She not only worked in athletes, but was a big booster of all things Javelina. And while the Javelinas were her first love, she was also a big Dallas Cowboy fan. The Cowboys have had a couple of bad years and we've had fun teasing her about her team.

"She was in charge of tickets for all Javelina events—spring, summer, fall and winter. And not only did she work the Javelina events but high school playoffs in all sports as well.

"After the games, she would have to count the money until all hours of the night and then on

Monday morning, she had to go to the business office and count it all over again.

"She also paid bills. She took care of the staff members' travel expense reports and this is a full-time job in itself.

"Rosie was an unofficial host for events in McCulley Hall. She would remind all of birthdays and often would purchase the cake and beverages needed to throw such a party.

"When there was a death of a former player or coach, she would order flowers.

"She was the go-to person for everyone in athletics, no matter what the job or problem. If there was a question in any area, the person was advised to 'go ask Rosie'.

"Although short in stature,

she could stand up to the tallest and most muscular coach or athlete. When she gave an order, you obeyed.

"She would keep her door locked especially during football season because of the tickets and money. There would be times when she would be on the telephone and I would reach inside the peep-hole in the window and unlock the door. She would tell me that the lock was on that door for a reason. I knew to make an exit.

"Rosie worked with thousands of people in the athletic department through the years. But closest were her student employees. By hiring these students as ticket sellers, ticket takers and security people,

she helped them get through college financially. Their love of Rosie could be seen in the number of them who would always drop by to see her whenever in town or passing through.

“The large number of former trainers who have returned for her services yesterday and today from throughout the state is a great indication of how much she was loved by all who have passed through the athletic department.

“At the word of Rosie’s passing, the emails that poured in were numerous. They wanted to express ways that she helped them while they were at the University...

“Preceding her in death were her son, John David; her parents and a brother, David Hinojosa.

“Survivors are her husband, Johnny Moreno; sister Mary Jane Anzaldúa and husband Thomas; sister Graciela Esquivel; sister Norma De La Rosa and husband Modesto Morales; sister-in-law

Margie Galvan and husband Rudy; sister-in-law Nelda Harbour and husband Tom; sister-in-law Martha Nellie Molina and husband Eduardo; sister-in-law Virginia Moreno; sister-in-law Naida Salinasa and husband Ben; brother-in-law Eduardo Moreno Jr.; brother-in-law Tim Moreno and wife Janie; brother-in-law Roel Moreno and wife Angie; brother-in-law Master Sergeant Romeo Moreno and wife Delia, and numerous nieces, nephews, aunts, uncles and cousins along with thousands of friends.

“Even though Rosie may be gone physically, she will always be with us in spirit. Any time there is a gathering of Javelinas, Rosie will be there. This will continue as long as her thousands of friends, and their children, and their children are around.

“We mourn but Rosie is in a place so wonderful we can’t even imagine. And she is with her beloved son, J.D., her parents and other relatives, and with her good

friend Vivian (Scholz).

“I can hear Rosie telling Vivian that she still had to stop the athletes from coming in the front doors of McCulley Hall and they were supposed to use the back doors. And she still had to fuss because someone had tracked dirt into the building. And that the coaches were still messing up the fax machine. And yes, whenever it rains, you still have to move the garbage cans to catch the water when the roof leaks.

“Rosie was truly a sweetheart to so many people. And her love, and our love for her, will endure forever. I told Johnny that Rosie was like a sister—a much younger sister—of mine and I’m sure many, many others have felt the same way.

“While we naturally mourn, we should rejoice and give thanks to the Lord for giving us the blessing of having had Rosie as a friend.”

GARRETT MURDY

Murdy was with the

Javelinas one season and was the American Baseball Coaches Association national player of the year.

He was NCAA Division II All-America first team, ABCA All-American.

Murdy was the regional player of the year, Lone Star Conference player of the year, all-conference and the LSC tournament most valuable player.

He was named to the Javelina team of the decade for the 2000s.

In 2004, Murdy had a 14-1 (.933) record and had nine complete games. His winning percentage and number of victories are school records.

He pitched 115.0 innings, a school record, and had 158 strikeouts, also a school record.

Murdy, from Mission Viejo, had a WHIP (walks and hits per inning pitched) of 1.157 and a K-to-B ratio of 4.27.

The opponent’s batting average was .229 and he averaged 12.37 strikeouts each nine innings

pitched.

Murdy’s 19 strikeouts against Texas Southern is a Lone Star Conference record.

After finishing his career with the Javelinas, he was drafted by the Houston Astros.

1994 FOOTBALL TEAM

The 1994 Javelina football team was NCAA Division II national runnerup and had a 12-2 record.

The squad lost in the championship game, 16-10, to host North Alabama.

The Javelinas were undefeated in the Lone Star Conference.

Regular-season victories came over Southwest Texas, East Central Oklahoma, Portland (Ore.) State, Texas A&M-Commerce, Central Oklahoma, Tarleton State, Eastern New Mexico, Abilene Christian and Angelo State.

Playoff wins were over Western Colorado in the first round, Portland State in the quarterfinals and Indiana (Pa.) in the semifinals.

The loss, other than to North Alabama in the championship, was to Central State of Ohio.

Ron Harms, Javelina Hall of Fame member, was head coach of the team and the assistant coaches were Juan Castillo, offensive line; Richard Cundiff, linebackers; Jim Dawson, secondary; Don Pittman, offensive backs; Chris Ballard, receivers; Rod Mounts, tight ends; Tally Neal, defensive line; James Bryant, linebackers, and Keithen DeGrate, offensive line.

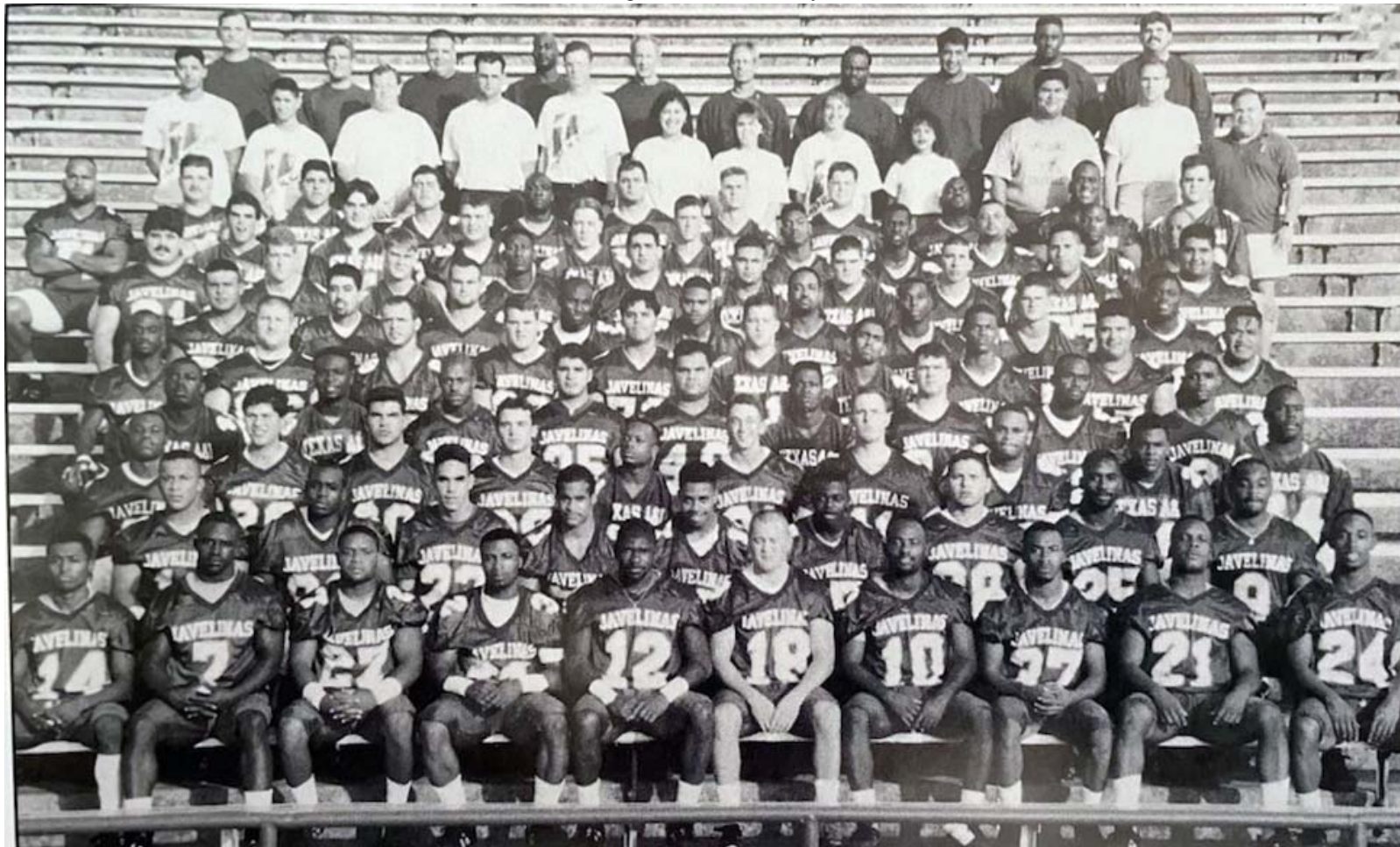
Harms was named the LSC coach of the year.

Making All-America first team were Kevin Dogins, Jaime Martinez and Jeff Rodgers.

Dogins was on the NCAA Division II All-America first team, American Football Quarterly All-America first team and C.M. Frank All-America first team. He was the LSC’s outstanding lineman of the year.

Martinez was on the Football Gazette All-America first team and
