Delice To Be Inducted Into Javelina Hall of Fame

Patrick Delice, one of the best track athletes to ever compete at Texas A&I and Texas A&M-Kingsville, will be inducted into the Javelina Hall of Fame Feb. 27 in the Memorial Student Union Building ballrooms.

Delice, from Trinidad and Tobago, won NCAA Division II national championships in the 200-meter and 400-meter dashes outdoors and in the 55-meter dash indoors.

His 6.24 time in the 55-meter dash is a school all-time best.

Outdoors, he was an All-American in the 200 and 400 as well as a member of the 400-meter relay team. He was an indoor All-American in the 55-meter dash.

Delice has the LSC's best time ever in the 400 and set schools

records in the 200 and 400. He was on the sprint relay unit that set a school record.

His personal best in the 400 was 44.58 and that came in Abilene.

His best time in the 200 was 20.31, still the best ever for a Javelina, and his 400-meter time remains an all-time best for the Javelinas.

Delice was on the 1993 Javelina 400-meter relay team that set the school record with a 39.36 and that remains the all-time best.

Delice competed for his home country in the 1988 Olympic Games in South Korea and at the 1992 Olympic Games in Spain.

He was in the World Championships in 1991 in Japan, in 1992 in Germany and in 1995 in Sweden.

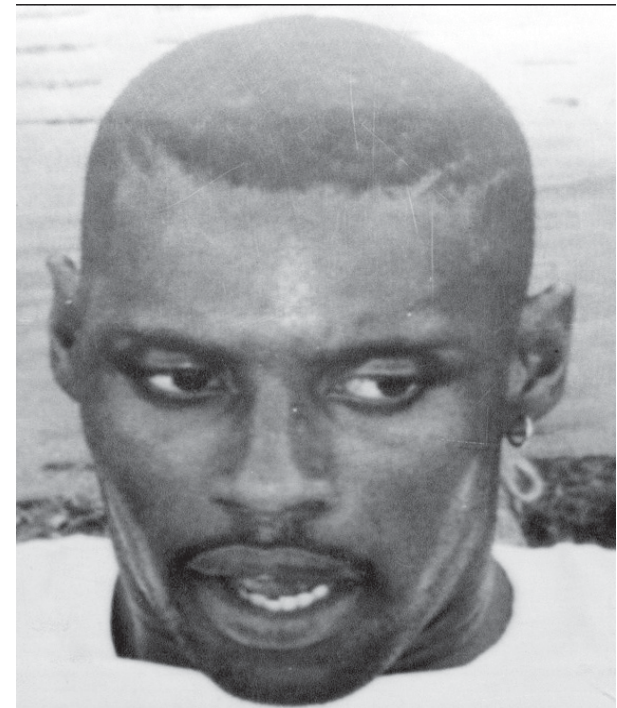
He ran in the World Indoor championships in Hungary in 1989.

Delice was entered in the Pan American Games in 1987 in Indianapolis, Ind., in 1991 in Cuba and in 1995 in Argentina.

He was in the Commonwealth Games in 1990 in New Zealand and in 1994 in Canada.

He competed in the Central American and Caribbean

Championships in 1989 and 1993 in Puerto Rico.

Christopher, Mosquera Nominees for LSC Honor

Texas A&M-Kingsville track and field athletes Cynai Christopher and Ronald Mosquera are nominees for Lone Star Conference athletes of the year.

Christopher, senior from Missouri City (Hightower), is a sprinter and Mosquera, senior from Cali, Colombia, is a thrower.

Both are NCAA Division II All-America first team honorees.

Christopher had the Javelinas' best times in the 200-meter and 400-meter dashes and ran a leg on the nationally ranked 1600-meter relay unit.

Mosquera was one of the top performers at the NCAA Division II national championships.

He won the national gold medal in the shot put and was silver medalist in the discus.

FORMER JAVELINA QUARTERBACK Randy Johnson is a nominee for the 2026 San Antonio Sports Hall of Fame.

Johnson played for the Javelinas in 1962-65 and was a first-round draft choice of the Atlanta Falcons. He was the 16th player chosen.

In addition to playing with Atlanta (1966-70), he was with the New York Giants (1971-73), the Washington Redskins (1975) and Green Bay Packers (1976).

He attended San Antonio Sam Houston High School. Johnson is a member of the Javelina Hall of Fame.

THE PENNSYLVANIA STATE Athletic Conference has extended an invitation to Lackawanna (Pa.) College to become its 18th member institution.

Lackawanna is currently a junior college and will transition to the NCAA and Division II.

JAVELINAS STILL NO. 1 in NAIA national football championships won.

Texas A&I's seven national championships while a member of the NAIA are still the most won by a school in the organization.

The Javelinas won nationals in 1959, 1969, 1970, 1974, 1975, 1976 and 1979.

Texas A&I moved into NCAA Division II in 1982.

Carroll (Wis.) has the second most titles with six and Carson-Newman (Tenn.) has won five.

Two teams have won three and 10 have taken two titles. No other school has won more than one.

The Javelinas might have added more national titles to their total had they been given the opportunity in 1967 and 1977.

The 1967 team went undefeated and beat No 1-ranked Southwest Texas in the season finale but didn't participate in the national playoffs.

The Javelinas, who had won three championships in a row, tied Abilene Christian for the Lone Star Conference title in 1977 but weren't chosen. ACU took the national trophy.

...The University of Houston's men's basketball team's run in the Final Four generated a significant impact.

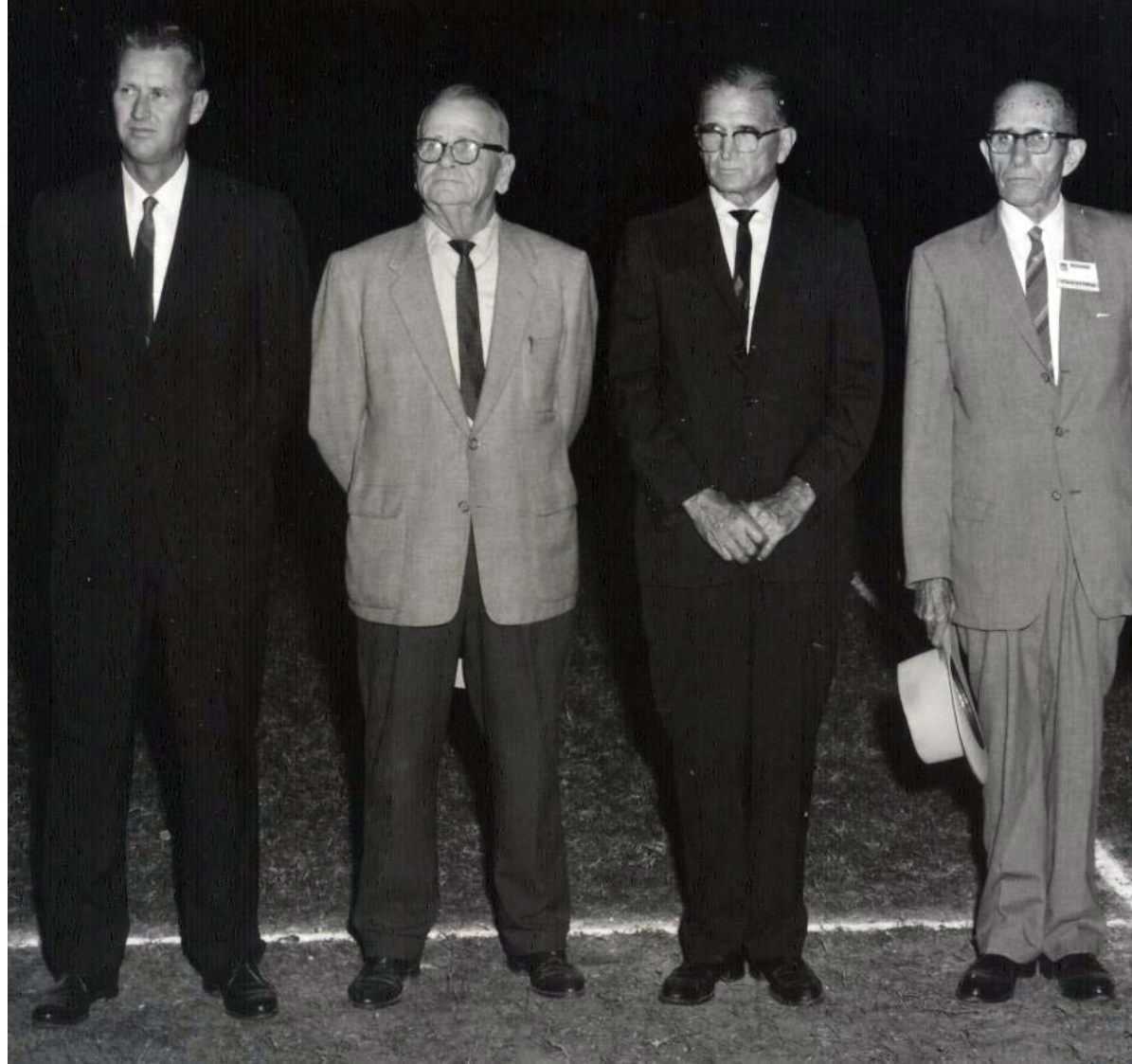
It generated \$6.1 billion in advertising value equivalency, according to an athletic official.

It has been a member of the Sun Belt Conference since 2013.

Since leaving the LSC in 1984, the school has been in the Gulf Star Conference, Southland Conference, Western Athletic Conference and Sun Belt Conference and was an independent in 2011.

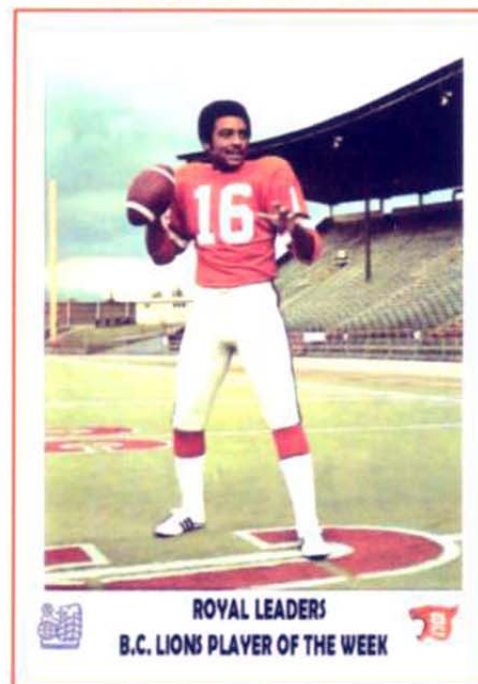
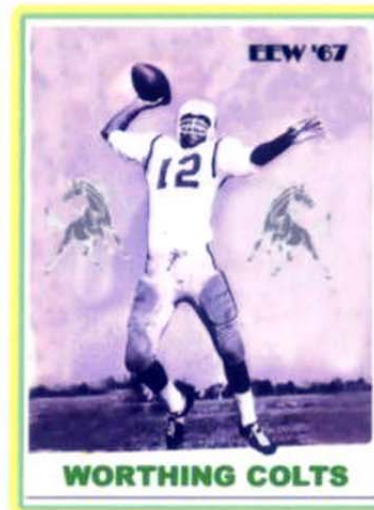
