1996 THE COLLEGE OF NEW JERSEY WOMEN'S SOCCER PROSPECTUS

Entering its seventh year as a varsity sport, the 1996 Lions expect a very exciting season. In just six brief years the Lions have already accomplished several impressive feats highlighted by the 1993 and 1994 NCAA Division III Championships. Under the direction of Head Coach Joe Russo, the Lion women's soccer team has tallied an impressive 103-11-10 mark, including a record of 10-3-1 in NCAA Tournament play since 1991. The 1995 season saw the Lions produce two All-American performers seniors Jackie Dirr and Kim Faust, who was named the 1995 NSCA Division III National Player of the Year.

In just six brief seasons, the Lions have already established themselves as one of the premier women's soccer programs in Division III having earned NCAA Tournament appearances that past five consecutive years.

With five starters back from last year's 16-3-1 team, Russo faces a rebuilding year. Despite the tough graduation losses of the college's all-time leading goal and assist scorers, Jennifer Mazucco and Jackie Dirr, the school's goalkeeper who holds almost every record, Danielle Mastro Simone, Russo is enthusiastic about the talented pool of newcomers and transfers that could propel the Lions back to the Final Four once again this fall. Ranked second in Division III in the *College Sports Magazine* pre-season poll, Russo's roster includes 42 of last year's 58 goals as well as a veteran defense that will help anchor a defense that has yielded just 48 goals in six years.

The Lions' rise to national prominence was a quick one as the Lions earned a berth in the 1991 NCAA Division III Tournament in only its second full season of varsity competition. The team advanced to the finals of the South Regionals before falling to eventual Division III champion, Ithaca College 1-0. The 1992 season was another banner year as the Lions achieved an undefeated regular-season record and once again went to the NCAA Tournament. They advanced to the East Regional Championship before dropping a 1-0 decision once again to the eventual Division III Champion, Cortland State.

With two of the team's top four scorers from last year back, the team should be in good shape offensively. Traci Tapp (Marlton, NJ), led the team in scoring as a rookie with 11 goals. Senior forward Jennifer Mirigliani (Marlton, NJ) added seven goals and assisted on three others and brings 14 goals and four assists into her final season with the squad. Junior forward Cheryl Adranovitz (Middletown, NJ) added four goals off the bench and brings scoring ability to the lineup with her 26 total points. Junior Lisa Buckley (Freehold, NJ) leads a talented list of holdovers from the 1995 team, that also includes junior twins Karen and Kristy Coveleski (Sussex, NJ).

At midfield, Russo will look for the likes of sophomore Melissa Wester (Bridgewater, NJ) and junior Francine Ungarten (Little Silver, NJ) to serve as leaders. Ungarten started all 20 games last year as a rookie, while Wester connected for three goals with a pair of assists in her first campaign. Add a talented number of newcomers such as Erin Donohue (Marlboro, NJ), Erica Wisniewski (Manalapan, NJ), and Kim Richards (Caldwell, NJ) to the mix and Russo may find these talented freshmen in starting roles. Donohue is a Shore Conference Player of the Year, while Wisniewski is a three-time All-Shore midfielder and Richards, a true finisher tallied 98 goals at James Caldwell High School.

Despite the graduation loss of goalkeeper Mastro Simone, who tallied 55 career shutouts in 67 career games played with a 0.339 goals against average, the Lions are thrilled at the prospects of her replacement. Daniela Kolarsick (Old Bridge, NJ) is the top goalkeeper in New Jersey and turned down Division I scholarship offers to stay in state. Combined with the likes of junior Leslie Nazarian (Wyckoff, NJ) and sophomore Lorie Ruina (East Windsor, NJ), the Lions should once again be tough to penetrate.

Adding support in the backfield will be a veteran list of players that includes, 1995 NJAC Rookie of the Year, Jessica Gonzalez (Trenton, NJ), junior tri-captain Heather Batz (Trenton, NJ), senior tri-captain Karyn Wolowicz (Randolph, NJ) and a talented list of newcomers.

All told, Russo has an experienced core of veterans, who combined with the talented crop of newcomers, should find the Lions' opponents challenged on every outing.

The Lions will face several of the nation's top ranked teams once again this fall, including three teams from last year's NCAA Tournament, including a Final Four participant and host, Richard Stockton College. The Lions open with a home match against Messiah College on September 2 before travelling to the first of three tournaments on the slate at Binghamton University. At the Binghamton Tournament, the Lions will face Cortland State, the 1992 NCAA Champions, before seeing the host, Binghamton the next day. Other trips include a stop in Virginia at Mary Washington College to face 1992 Final Four squad, Mary Washington and Wilmington College. In mid-October, the Lions travel to Texas where they will see NCAA participant, Trinity University and Southwestern University.

In addition, the Lions will also battle it out in NJAC league play with Jersey City State, Ramapo, Kean, Montclair State, Rowan, William Paterson and Richard Stockton. Since league play was established in 1994, the Lions are 12-0 and have yielded just four goals in conference play. They will see hefty competition from a much improved William Paterson squad, that was the ECAC Runner-up and arch rival, Richard Stockton, a 1995 Final Four participant.

Non-conference match-ups include home contest against Goucher, Gettysburg, and Elizabethtown, while TCNJ will travel to Philadelphia Textiles and Sciences to open play in October. Since women's soccer came to Lions Stadium in 1990, the Lions have gone 40-2-3, tallying 144 goals and yielding just five in 45 matches.
