Three-year letterwinner and one year starter who saw time at both the point and shooting guard spots ... finished his career ranked 18th in UT history in scoring (1,376 points) ... also ranked third on the school chart for highest career free throw percentage (.867, 345-of-398) ... led the Big 12 Conference in scoring (20.1 ppg) as a junior ... played in 103 career games and averaged 13.4 ppg over his three-year career ... two-time Academic All-Big 12 First Team choice ... declared for the NBA Draft following his junior season.

USBWA District VII Player of the Year ... earned a spot on the All-Big 12 Conference First Team and the NABC All-District 8 First Team ... Academic All-Big 12 First Team choice ... two-time Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week (Nov. 14 and Nov. 21) ... started all 34 games ... led the Big 12 Conference in scoring (20.1 ppg) ... his 683 points marked the sixth-highest single-season total in school history ... recorded 30-plus points four times during the season ... topped the 20-point mark 19 times and reached double figures in scoring in 32 of the 34 games ... also led the team in minutes played (35.6 mpg) and ranked second in both assists (130) and steals (41) ... recorded 28 points (10-of-19 FG) and eight assists in the win against Boston University (Nov. 13) ... posted a career-high 35 points (5-of-10 threes, 10-of-12 FT) with six assists and six rebounds against Rhode Island (Nov. 15) ... had 25 points (5-of-8 threes) and a career-high nine assists in 44 minutes against Oregon State (Nov. 19) ... added 17 points and seven assists in 28 minutes against N.C. shared by Reggie Freeman in 1994-95 and Joey Wright in 1988-89) ... reached double figures in scoring in 18 of UT's 36 games ... during UT's two NCAA Tournament contests, he averaged a team-best 22.0 points per game while converting a perfect 25-of-25 free throws ... registered 14 points in 22 minutes during the loss to No. 5/4 Pittsburgh in the title game of the 2K Sports Classic benefiting Coaches vs. Cancer (Nov. 19) ... added 17 points in 29 minutes at USC (Dec. 5) ... followed with 18 points (5-of-8 FG, 4-of-5 threes) in 24 minutes against Texas State (Dec. 11) ... recorded 17 points (5-of-7 threes) and tied a season high with six assists in 32 minutes against Coppin State (Dec. 31) ... posted 20 points (7-of-14 FG) in 29 minutes during the home overtime loss to eventual national champion and No. 8/9 Connecticut (Jan. 8) ... added eight points, tied a season high with six rebounds and tallied six assists against one turnover in the home win against No. 11/10 Texas A&M (Jan. 19) ... registered a game-high 23 points (6-of-10 FG, 3-of-6 threes, 8-of-10 FT) and added three boards, one assist and one steal in 29 minutes in the come-from-behind win at No. 2/2 Kansas (Jan. 22) ... 17 of his 23 points in the win at Kansas came in the second half (4-of-5 FG, 2-of-3 threes, 7-of-8 FT) ... tallied 18 points (7-of-13 FG) in 25 minutes at Nebraska (Feb. 19) ... added 21 points (6-of-12 FG, 4-of-6 threes) and five assists in 27 minutes at Colorado (Feb. 26) ... averaged 14.3 points (second on team) while hitting 15-of-28 (.536) field goals, including 8-of-16 (.500) from three-point range, and posted seven assists against three turnovers during UT's three games at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship ... recorded 11 points (5-of-8 FG) and five assists against one turnover in 23 minutes in the quarterfinal win against Oklahoma (March 10) ... registered 15 points (5-of-8 FG, 3-of-5 threes) in 24 minutes against Texas A&M in the semifinals (March 11) ... added 17 points (4-of-8 threes) in 22 minutes against No. 2/2 Kansas in the title game (March 12) ... posted a game-high 21 points (12-of-12 FT), six boards and three assists in the NCAA Second Round win against Oakland (March 18) ... hit eight of the 12 free throws in the final 7:32 to seal the victory against Oakland ... recorded a game-high 23 points (13-of-13 FT), three rebounds and three assists in 25 minutes during the NCAA Third Round contest against No. 17/15 Arizona (March 20) ... his 13 free throws made tied the school record for most free throws made without a miss in any game in UT history (shared with Jim Krivacs, 13-of-13 vs. Northern Montana on Nov. 27, 1978) ... his 11 free throws without a miss in the second half against Arizona also set a school record for most free throws made in a half without a miss ... earned a spot on the Spring 2011 Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll (minimum 3.0 GPA).

Played in 33 games (nine starts) ... led the Big 12 Conference in free throw percentage (.883, 83-of-94) ... posted 39 assists against 19 turnovers (2.05 ratio) over the final 14 games of the year ... second on the team in assists (80) and fifth in scoring (9.6 ppg) ... led the team in assists 10 times ... reached the 20-point mark in scoring three times and recorded 15 double-figure scoring games ... opened his career with seven straight double-figure scoring games ... changed his jersey number from 14 to 50 prior to the Nov. 29 game at Rice to pay tribute to injured teammate Varez Ward ... tallied 13 points (3-of-6 threes) against UC Irvine (Nov. 15) ... posted 10 points (3-of-3 FG, 2-of-2 threes, 2-of-2 FT) and three assists against Western Carolina (Nov. 18) ... scored 14 points (5-of-10 FG, 4-of-4 FT) versus Iowa (Nov. 23) ... notched 12 points (4-of-9 FG) and three assists against Pittsburgh (Nov. 24) ... totaled 15 points (8-of-8 FT), five rebounds and four assists at Rice (Nov. 29) ... recorded 11 points (4-of-4 FT) and four rebounds against USC (Dec. 3) ... followed with 13 points (5-of-12 FG, 3-of-6 threes),

Attended one year of post-graduate school at Parkview Christian School in Houston, Texas ... spent his junior and senior seasons at Memorial High School in Port Arthur, Texas ... averaged 29.9 points per game while playing in 11 contests during his senior season ... led Memorial to a 29-6 record while averaging 27 points, six assists, five rebounds and three steals per game as a junior ... earned all-state, all-region and first-team All-District 21-5A accolades in his junior season ... posted a career-high 50 points in a non-district game at Spring Westfield as a junior ... spent his freshman and sophomore years at Beaumont Kelly High School and led the Bulldogs to back-to-back 6A TAPPS (Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools) state titles ... averaged 25 points, seven assists and six rebounds per contest while earning first-team all-state honors as a sophomore ... averaged 20.3 points, seven assists and four rebounds per game while earning second-team all-state accolades in his freshman year.
