NOTES AT A GLANCE

- Texas plays its first non-conference true road game in **Karen Aston's** tenure with a trip to Albuquerque, N.M., to face the New Mexico Lobos on Tuesday (8 p.m. CT). The all-time series between Texas and New Mexico is tied, 3-3.
- Former Longhorn standout **Edwina Brown** is in her second season as an assistant coach for New Mexico. As a student-athlete at Texas from 1996-2000, Brown was a two-time All-American and recipient of the Margaret Wade Award in 2000.
- The last time Texas and New Mexico played was on Nov. 17, 2006, marking the 1,000th game for Hall of Fame head coach **Jody Conradt** with the Longhorns.
- Last week Texas signed a recruiting class ranked No. 10 by *ESPN.com*.
- The Longhorns improved to 2-0 with a 54-point victory over Texas State last Wednesday (96-42). Junior forward **Nneka Enemkpali** led the Longhorns with 22 points and 17 rebounds — 10 of which were on the offensive end.
- Texas is holding opponents to 42.0 points per game with an average scoring margin of +37.5. The Longhorns are limiting opponents to a .236 field goal percentage, including a .117 mark from beyond the arc.
- Senior guard **Chassidy Fussell** leads UT in scoring this season (16.0 ppg). Fussell has led the Longhorns in scoring in each of the last three seasons, entering Tuesday with 1,437 career points (15.6 career ppg).
- Texas is receiving votes in the latest Associated Press top 25.
- **Imani McGee-Stafford** was named to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team and junior **Nneka Enemkpali** was named Honorable Mention Preseason All-Big 12. Last season the duo co-led UT in rebounding (9.4 rpg) and accounted for 26 double-doubles (13 each).
- Texas Women's Basketball is in its 40th season of competition. UT is the seventh-winningest program in NCAA Women's Basketball history with a 935-344 (.731) record through the previous 39 seasons.

ALBUQUERQUE, N.M. -- The No. 25 Texas Longhorns made a gallant run in the final seven minutes of play, overcoming a 17-point deficit by out-scoring No. 23 New Mexico in that span, but fell just short, 63-60, in women's basketball play Friday evening in a game played at University Arena (The Pit) on the UNM campus in front of 10,085.

This was the first game of the year for Texas, now 3-1, against a Top 25 opponent. New Mexico is 2-2.

UT head coach and Naismith Hall of Famer Jody Conradt, who ranks No. 2 in all-time college basketball victories (men's or women's), coached her 1,000th game on the Texas sidelines.

The loss denies the Longhorns a chance to start the season at 4-0 for the 13th time in Conradt's 31 years at Texas.

Texas was paced by the third double-double in a row from senior forward Tiffany Jackson. Jackson collected game-highs of 21 points and 11 rebounds to post her third double-double in four games. Hughes joined her in double figure scoring (12 points).

In that 22-8 run, Raven (five points), Arriaran (four) and Hughes (four) controlled the offense for UT.

New Mexico was paced by forward Dionne Marsh (20 points) and guard Julie Briody (18 points).

The Lobos used a six-for-20 effort from 3-point range and a 25-for-31 effort in free throws in posting the win. Texas made just one trey (Arriaran's in the waning seconds) and was 15-for-18 in foul shots.

Two of UT's starters -- redshirt freshman forward Earnesia Williams and junior guard Erneisha Bailey - also picked up three fouls in the first half. Williams played just five minutes, while Bailey, who came into the game as UT's top rebounder with a 10.7 rpg average, played just 11 minutes.

For the half, Texas made eight of 34 shots (24 percent) and the Lobos made just eight field goals. The difference was at the free throw line and from the 3-point arc. New Mexico was stellar with a 14-for-15 effort in free throws and also were five-for-14 in treys. Texas was six-for-nine from the line and 0-4 in 3-pointers.

Led by Jackson (13 first-half points), Texas did most of its damage in the paint, scoring 16 of its 22 points inside.

New Mexico held a 25-21 edge in first-half rebounding, and had six turnovers to just five for the Longhorns.

Conradt, who also is a member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, is on the UT bench for her 21st season. She holds an impressive record of 768-232 and a winning percentage of 77 percent at the Forty Acres.

In her career, the No. 2 all-time winningest collegiate coach has been on the sidelines for 1,179 career games overall in this her 38th year as a collegiate head coach. She is 885-294 (.752) in all-time games.

NEW MEXICO SERIES

- Texas and New Mexico meet for the seventh time on Tuesday and the first time since 2006.
- The series dates back to a 71-58 Texas win on Dec. 6, 2001 in Austin.
- The last time Texas and New Mexico met was on Nov. 17, 2006, marking Hall of Famer Jody Conradt's 1,000th game as head coach of the Longhorns. The 23rd-ranked Lobos defeated the 25th-ranked Longhorns by three points at The Pit in Albuquerque, N.M.
- New Mexico has won the last two games in the series.
- **Aston vs. New Mexico:** Head coach Karen Aston is 1-0 against New Mexico. As head coach at North Texas, Aston's Mean Green defeated the Lobos 63-50 on Nov. 14, 2011.

ASTON'S FIRST NON-CONFERENCE ROAD GAME

- Tuesday is the first non-conference true road game for **Karen Aston** since arriving at Texas in 2012. UT played five non-conference neutral site games during Aston's first season in 2012-13.
- Texas' last non-conference road game came against No. 8 Tennessee on Dec. 4, 2011 (L, 57-73).

LONGHORN CONNECTION - EDWINA BROWN

- Former Longhorn standout **Edwina Brown** is in her second season as an assistant coach for New Mexico.
- As a player at Texas from 1996-2000, Brown was a two-time All-American and a two-time First Team All-Big 12 pick. Brown was the recipient of the Margaret Wade Award in 2000, presented to the nation's top collegiate basketball player. She also was named the 2000 *ESPN.com* Player of the Year.
- The Lockhart, Texas native is the only player in UT history to record at least 1,700 points, 500 assists and 250 steals throughout her career, and the only player to lead the Longhorns in scoring, rebounding, assists and steals in the same year, a feat that she accomplished during both her junior and senior seasons.
- Brown was the No. 3 pick in the 2000 WNBA Draft by the Detroit Shock and played five years in the league.
- Brown was inducted into the Texas Women's Hall of Honor in 2009. She also served as an assistant coach at Texas during the 2011-12 season.

ROAD OPENERS

- Texas holds an all-time record of 17-22 when playing its first true road game of the season.

POSTGAME NOTES VS. TEXAS STATE

- Texas improved to 2-0 following a 96-42 victory over Texas State on Wednesday, Nov. 13 in Austin. The 54-point win was the largest for the Longhorns since a 112-53 win over Northwestern State on Nov. 16, 2010.
- **Series:** Wednesday's game marked the 29th meeting between Texas and Texas State. Texas leads the series 24-5 and has won the last 19 meetings.
- Texas shot 42.1 percent from 3-point and 48.6 percent from the field compared to Texas State's 16.7 percent from 3-point land and 22.8 percent from the field.
- Texas crashed the boards on Wednesday with 58 rebounds and 23 second-chance points.
- Texas had four players in double figures: Nneka Enemkpali (22), Imani McGee-Stafford (15), Celina Rodrigo (15) and Chassidy Fussell (14).
- Texas' 54-point win over Texas State was the largest margin of victory for the Longhorns since Nov. 16, 2010 when the Horns defeated Northwestern State, 112-53.
- The Longhorns' outscored Texas State in points in paint (46-to-10), points off turnovers (24-to-12), second-chance points (23-2), fast-break points (12-to-2) and bench points (35-to-11).
- **Lone Star State success:** UT has posted a 416-97 (.811) record against current NCAA Division I in-state foes in the program's history, including a 24-5 mark against Texas State.
- **Chassidy Fussell** posted 14 points, seven boards and five assists.
- **Imani McGee-Stafford** recorded her 18th career double-digit scoring effort with 15 points on 6-of-10 shooting.
- **Celina Rodrigo** came off the bench to score a career-high 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting in 22 minutes. Her previous career-high of 10 points came on Feb. 6, 2013 against Iowa State. Rodrigo's three 3-point field goals also marks a career high.
- **Nneka Enemkpali** recorded her 14th career double-double with 22 points and 17 rebounds for her sixth career 20-point performance (last 20 point-performance was against Kansas State, Jan. 26, 2013).
- **Krystle Henderson** dished out a career-high eight assists in 27 minutes. Her previous career-high of six came against Northwestern State on Nov. 12, 2011.

- Karen Aston announced the signing of four high school seniors to National Letters of Intent on Wednesday, Nov. 13.
- Aston's second recruiting class at Texas is receiving unanimous high regard among recruiting services, including a **No. 10 ranking by ESPN.com**.
- The four future Longhorns in the class of 2014 combine for three high school state championships and a .891 winning percentage (286-35 record). Atkins, Foman and McCarty teamed up to win Nike Nationals -- the AAU's premier national tournament -- for the Cy-Fair Shock.
- **Akigbogun**, a 6-1 forward from Regis Jesuit High School, was named the 2012-13 Gatorade Colorado Player of the Year after leading Regis Jesuit to the CHSAA 5A state championship title and garnering unanimous first-team all-state honors. Akigbogun recorded 13 double-doubles and averaged 14.2 points and 8.1 rebounds per game as a junior. She guided her high school team, coached by Carl Mattei, to a 65-15 record in three seasons as a letterwinner.
- Both Atkins and Foman are coached by former Longhorn Cathy Self-Morgan at Duncanville High School. In the last three seasons the duo has accounted for 113 wins (113-9, .926) and two state championships at Duncanville, including an undefeated 40-0 record last season.
- **Atkins** is the No. 4 overall recruit and the top-ranked guard in the class of 2014 according to ESPN.com. After winning her second state title with Duncanville as a junior, Atkins was tabbed as the unanimous high school player of the year in Texas by Gatorade, the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC) and the Dallas Morning News. Atkins averaged 16.8 points, 5.5 steals, 6.1 rebounds and 4.5 assists per game while shooting 55.4 percent from the field and 49.2 percent from behind the arc as a junior.
- **Foman** is ranked as the No. 24 guard in the country according to ESPN.com. The 5-foot-6 guard is a two-time UIL District 7-5A Defensive Player of the Year and was named TABC Class 5A All-State for the 2012-13 season. While leading Duncanville to a 40-0 record and a state title during her junior season, she averaged 11.2 points, 4.2 steals and 3.9 assists per game.
- **McCarty**, a 5-foot-4 point guard from Clear Springs High School, is the No. 29 overall recruit and the sixth-ranked guard in the class of 2014 according to ESPN.com. She is a three-time TABC 5A All-State honoree and a three-time District 24-5A Most Valuable Player. Coached by Pam Crawford at Clear Springs, McCarty has led her high school to a 108-11 record in three seasons as a starter and its first-ever appearance in the UIL state tournament in 2013. McCarty's career high school averages include 19.6 points, 4.3 assists and 4.1 steals per game.

40TH SEASON OF WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

- The University of Texas is in its 40th season of intercollegiate Women's Basketball during the 2013-14 season.
- Texas held an all-time record of 935-344 (.731) in its previous 39 years of competition.
- UT has had just four head coaches over a 40-year span -- Rod Page (1974-76), Jody Conratt (1976-2007), Gail Goestenors (2007-12) and Karen Aston (2012-present).
- In the 31 years Women's Basketball has been an NCAA-sanctioned sport, Texas has made 26 NCAA tournament appearances and three Final Fours with one NCAA title (1986).
- The Longhorns have won 12 conference regular season titles and 10 conference tournament titles.
- In the program's first game, Texas defeated Huston-Tillotson, 68-17, on Nov. 26, 1974.
- Entering the 2013-14 season, Texas is the seventh-winningest program in NCAA Women's Basketball history with its 935-344 (.731) record in 39 seasons. Since joining the NCAA in 1977, Texas has an 897-329 (.732) record.

TAU ADDED AS A WALK-ON

- Senior walk-on Helen Tau was added to the roster on Oct. 30, 2013.
- Tau served as a manager for UT during the 2012-13 season. The Lake Jackson, Texas native was a four-year letterwinner at Brazoswood High School and former president of Students for Texas Athletics at UT.
- Tau is on track to graduate from the McCombs School of Business in May of 2014.

• The Big 12 coaches selected of sophomore Imani McGee-Stafford to the Preseason All-Big 12 Team and junior Nneka Enemkpali as Honorable Mention Preseason All-Big 12.

• Last season, McGee-Stafford was named Big 12 Freshman of the Year and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention after setting a Texas record for blocks by a freshman (75) and leading the team in total rebounds (281) and field goal shooting percentage (.483, 138-286 FG). The Los Angeles product registered 13 double-doubles while averaging 11.1 points and 9.4 rebounds per game.

• Enemkpali was named All-Big 12 Honorable mention after the 2012-13 season, in which she recorded 13 doubles-doubles and set a Texas record for most consecutive double-doubles (six) in the first six games of the season. The Pflugerville, Texas native led Texas in total points (377), while averaging 13.0 points and 9.4 rebounds per game.

• Baylor's Odyssey Sims was named Preseason Player of the Year, Oklahoma State's Marisha Wallace was awarded Preseason Newcomer of the year and Baylor's Ieshia Small was tabbed Preseason Freshman of the Year.

• Texas was picked to finish fifth in the Big 12 coaches poll.

Karen Aston returned to the institution where she originally carved her reputation as an energetic leader and relentless recruiter in 2012, becoming just the fourth Texas Women's Basketball head coach in program history.

In year-one as head of the Texas program, Aston laid the foundation for the Longhorns' return to national prominence. Her first recruiting class at UT featured three starters and the 2013 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Imani McGee-Stafford.

Aston, an eight-year assistant to Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame coach Jody Conradt, was instrumental in the Longhorns' trip to the 2003 NCAA Women's Basketball Final Four and a pair of Sweet 16 appearances in 2002 and 2004.

She returned to the Forty Acres in 2012 after five years of experience reviving the women's basketball programs at Charlotte and the University of North Texas.

Aston tripled the Mean Green's victory total in one season, as UNT went 15-16 during the 2011-12 season under her direction after winning just five games the previous year. At Charlotte, Aston led the program to record-breaking heights, with 86 victories in four seasons, including a school-record 27 wins in 2010-11.

Aston led the 49ers to four-straight postseason appearances and the 2009 Atlantic 10 Tournament Championship en route to the school's second ever NCAA Tournament appearance. In her final season at Charlotte, Aston's squad advanced to the WNIT Final Four.

While on Conradt's Texas staff from 1998-2006, Aston saw the Longhorns post a 173-83 (.676) record during that span, with seven NCAA Tournament appearances, two trips to the "Sweet 16" and a march to the 2003 Final Four. The Longhorns also captured the 2003 Big 12 regular season and tournament titles, and UT shared the 2004 Big 12 regular season title. Aston was promoted from assistant coach to associate head coach in July of 2000 after serving as UT's assistant coach for two seasons.

Aston spearheaded UT's signing of 25 nationally-recognized recruits, including seven McDonald's High School All-Americans and seven WBCA/Nike All-Americans. Two of those high school All-Americans - Tiffany Jackson and Erika Arriaran - were named National High School Players of the Year. All eight of the recruiting classes Aston attracted were nationally ranked, including the No. 1 class in the nation in 2005-06.

Aston originally came to Austin from the University of North Texas, where she served as an assistant coach for two seasons (1996-98). Prior to joining the North Texas staff, Aston was an assistant coach at Baylor for two seasons (1994-96).

Following Aston's stint on the Forty Acres, she was named associate head coach at Baylor during the 2006-07 season. With Aston on board, the Lady Bears won 26 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Aston was recognized as one of the top high school women's coaches in the south. She coached five years at Vilonia

High School (1988-93) in Vilonia, Ark., and one year at Fort Smith Northside (1993-94) in Fort Smith, Ark. She guided Fort Smith Northside to a 24-10 record and a fifth-place finish in Class 4A. For her efforts, she was named the Arkansas Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

While at Vilonia, Aston was not only the head basketball coach but also the head cross country and track coach. In 1992-93, she was named the Arkansas Basketball Coach of the Year after leading Vilonia to a 36-1 record and a Class 2A State Championship. Aston's cross country teams also claimed back-to-back state titles in 1991 and 1992.

A native of Benton, Ark., Aston was a two-time first-team all-state selection at Bryant High School. She capped her high school career by leading Bryant to the 1982 Arkansas Class 4A State Championship. Aston earned a Bachelors of Arts degree in physical education from Arkansas-Little Rock in 1987. She played two seasons of basketball at UALR after transferring from Ouachita Baptist.
