NOTABLES

• **DEFENSE AND REBOUNDING:** Texas limited its first two opponents to an average of 51.5 points per game on a combined 28.6% FG shooting (36-of-126). UT held both North Dakota State (27.4%) and Alcorn State (29.7%) to below 30% FG shooting. The Horns also sport a +19 rebound margin (49.0-30.0) in their first two games.

• **TAYLOR AT THE POINT:** Sophomore point guard **Isaiah Taylor** averaged a team-best 15.0 ppg while hitting 11-of-19 (.579) field goals, including 4-of-6 threes, in the first two games. He averaged 5.0 rebounds in 24.5 mpg while also posting seven assists against three turnovers.

• **DEPTH AND BALANCE:** Through the first two games, 10 Texas players have averaged at least 12.5 minutes per game. Eight UT players are averaging at least 5.0 points per contest, and six Texas players are averaging at least 4.5 rebounds per game.

2K CLASSIC BENEFITING WWP

- The 2K Classic is celebrating its 20th anniversary this season and returns to Madison Square Garden for the 17th consecutive year.
- No. 10 Texas, No. 24 Syracuse, California and Iowa served as regional hosts. Those four teams automatically advance to the Championship Rounds on Nov. 20-21 at Madison Square Garden.
- The 2014 2K Classic marks the second year that Wounded Warrior Project is the beneficiary of the event. The mission of the WWP is to honor and empower wounded warriors. WWP raises awareness and enlists the public's aid for the needs of injured service members, helps injured servicemen and women aid and assist each other, and provides unique, direct programs and services to meet their needs (www.woundedwarriorproject.org).

TEXAS IN THE 2K CLASSIC

- **The Longhorns are making their fifth appearance in the 2K Classic.** UT also competed in the tourney in 1997, 2002, 2006 and 2010.
- Texas sports a 9-4 mark in its five 2K Classic appearances. In its last appearance (2010), the Horns defeated Navy (83-52) and Louisiana Tech (89-58) in regional round play in Austin. Texas then topped No. 13/16 Illinois (90-84 ot) in the semifinals before falling to No. 5/4 Pittsburgh (68-66) in the championship game.

TEXAS VS. IOWA

- Thursday's contest marks the fifth meeting between Texas and Iowa. The two teams have split the previous four contests.
- It does mark the fourth time since the start of the 2004-05 season that the two schools have met in a November neutral-site tournament.
- In the first meeting, Iowa recorded a 98-92 victory on March 19, 1992 during a NCAA First Round contest in Greensboro, N.C.
- The Hawkeyes then topped Texas 82-80 in the 2004 EA Sports Maui Invitational semifinals (Nov. 23, 2004).
- Then-No. 2 Texas registered a 68-59 win against No. 18 Iowa in the title game of the 2005 Guardians Classic in Kansas City (Nov. 23, 2005).
- Then-No. 3 Texas posted an 85-60 victory in the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic semifinals in Kansas City (Nov. 23, 2009).

ALCORN STATE POSTGAME NOTES

- Texas registered win No. 1,700 in program history with the victory against Alcorn State. The Horns now sport an all-time record of 1,700-1,008 (.628) in 109 years of intercollegiate basketball. Texas became the 17th program in NCAA Division I history to reach the 1,700-win mark.
- UT held Alcorn State scoreless for more than six minutes to begin the contest. The Braves did not score their first point until the 13:34 mark on a free throw. Texas did not allow a made field goal until 9:28 remained in the half. Alcorn State went 0-of-14 from the floor to start the game.
- Texas limited Alcorn State to 53 points on 29.7% FG shooting (19-of-64). UT improved to 239-26 in the Barnes era when holding its opponent below 40% FG shooting.

- UT posted a +19 rebound margin (47-28). This marked the second straight game to open the season that the Horns have registered a +19 rebound margin (51-32 against North Dakota State on Friday).
- Texas recorded 24 assists on its 32 made field goals. For the game, the Horns had 24 assists against just 12 turnovers.
- **Demarcus Holland** reached double figures in scoring (10 points) for the 12th time in his career (71 games).
- **Connor Lammert** set a career high with seven assists without a turnover in 17 minutes played. His previous high was four against Iowa State (Feb. 13, 2013). Lammert had six of his seven assists in the first half.
- **Isaiah Taylor** reached double figures in scoring (12 points) for the 29th time in his career (37 games).
- **Myles Turner** reached double figures in scoring (10 points) for the second straight game to open his collegiate career. He added six blocks and seven rebounds in 20 minutes of action. His six blocks were one shy of the UT single-game freshman record (7 by Tristan Thompson in 2010-11, 7 by Chris Mihm twice in 1997-98).

CHECK OF THE POLLS

- Texas is ranked No. 10 in the most recent AP poll (Nov. 17) and No. 10 in the most recent USA Today coaches' poll (Nov. 17).
- **During the Rick Barnes era, the Horns have spent 182 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 86 in the Top 10.**
- Texas was ranked No. 10 in The Associated Press preseason poll. This marked the first time the Horns have appeared in the AP preseason poll since the 2009-10 season, when UT began the year at No. 3.
- Texas has now made 15 appearances in school history in the AP preseason poll. Prior to its four-year absence from the preseason rankings, the Horns were ranked in the AP preseason poll for nine consecutive years (2001-02 through 2009-10).
- UT was ranked No. 10 in the USA Today coaches' preseason poll. This marks the 12th time in the last 14 years that the Horns have been ranked in the coaches' preseason poll. It's the highest preseason coaches' poll ranking for UT since the Longhorns were tabbed No. 3 in 2009-10.

A CONSISTENT DANCER

Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 15 of Rick Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin. UT has made a total of 31 all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament (35-34 record). The Horns have earned a bid to the NCAA tourney 23 times in the last 26 years.

HORNS REACH 20-WIN MARK ... AGAIN

With their 24-11 mark last year, **the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark for the 14th time in 16 seasons under coach Rick Barnes.** UT had a school-record streak of 13 consecutive 20-win seasons snapped in 2012-13. Prior to that streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92). The Longhorns have reached the 20-win plateau of total of 29 times in their previous 108 seasons of basketball.

AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA Elite Eight twice in the last nine years and three times in the last 12 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis). UT has advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight a total of seven times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1990, 2003, 2006 and 2008).

IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA Sweet 16 a total of five times in the last 13 years. The Longhorns have advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 a total of 13 times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1960, 1963, 1972, 1990, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008).

COACH OF THE YEAR, AGAIN

Rick Barnes was tabbed the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2013-14 by the league's coaches. This marked the fourth time that Barnes has claimed the honor (1999, 2003, 2008 and 2014), tying Kansas' Bill Self for most Coach of the Year accolades in Big 12 history.

SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12 UNDER BARNES

Since head coach Rick Barnes took over the Longhorns in 1998-99, Texas is the second-winningest team in regular season Big 12 Conference games over the last 16 years with 178 wins.

CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the first 16 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Despite a young roster last year that featured only one scholarship junior and no seniors, **Texas went 11-3 in 2013-14 in games decided by seven points or less.** This mark included an 86-83 win at No. 14/18 North Carolina (Dec. 18), a 67-64 home victory against No. 22 Kansas State (Jan. 21) and the 87-85 victory against Arizona State (March 20) in the NCAA Second Round - won on a **Cameron Ridley** putback as time expired.

DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 265 of their 550 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 239-26 (.902) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat** (2-0 mark in 2014-15).

- **UT has held its first two opponents to an average of 51.5 ppg on a combined 28.6% FG shooting (36-of-126).**
- Texas limited NDSU (Nov. 14) to 50 points on 27.4% FG shooting (17-of-62), including a 7-of-29 (.241) mark from three-point range. The Horns held the Bison to 18 points on 21.4% FG shooting (6-of-28) in the first half.
- Texas held Alcorn State (Nov. 16) to 53 points on 29.7% FG shooting (19-of-64).
- UT held 19 of its 35 opponents last year to under 40% FG shooting (19-0 mark in those games).

BLOCK PARTY

UT ranked 11th nationally in total blocked shots (206) and 14th nationally in blocks per game (5.9 bpg) last year. **The Horns set a single-season team record with 206 blocks in 2013-14** (previous mark: 203 in 1997-98). The Horns recorded at least seven blocks in 17 of their 35 games last year.

- UT has averaged 6.0 blocks per contest in its first two games this year.
- Texas had at least 11 blocks in a game three times last season (11 vs. Houston Baptist, 12 vs. UT Arlington, 12 vs. No. 6/7 Kansas).
- Texas' 12 blocks against Kansas (Feb. 1) matched a season high (UTA, Nov. 29) and were one shy of the school single-game record (13, twice). It also tied the UT record for most blocks in a Big 12 game (fifth time in Big 12 play, last was Feb. 8, 2010 vs. No. 1 Kansas).
- **Cameron Ridley's** 76 blocks last season ranked seventh in the UT single-season charts.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas outrebounded 27 of its 35 opponents last season while posting double-digit rebound advantages in 12 of its 35 games. For the season, UT ranked 10th nationally with a +7.0 rebound margin (41.4-34.4).

- **Texas sports a +19 rebound margin (49.0-30.0) through the first two games this year.**
- The Horns posted a +19 (51-32) rebound margin against NDSU (Nov. 14) and a +19 (47-28) margin against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).
- Texas ranked third nationally last year in offensive rebounds per game (15.1 rpg)
- UT ranked fifth nationally in total rebounds (1,449) and 20th nationally in defensive rebounds per game (26.3 rpg) last season.
- UT posted a 56-25 advantage on the glass at TCU (Feb. 4). Texas' +31 rebounding margin was its fourth-highest single-game mark in school history (since 1961-62).

BALANCED OFFENSE

- Eight UT players are averaging at least 5.0 points per game through the first two contests.
- Against North Dakota State (Nov. 14), six Texas players scored at least eight points (Taylor 18, Holmes 15, Turner 15, Ridley 9, Felix 9, Holland 8).
- Texas had seven players score at least seven points in the win against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).
- Five different UT players scored at least 20 points in a game during the 2013-14 season (Javan Felix, Demarcus Holland, Jonathan Holmes, Cameron Ridley and Isaiah Taylor).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

- Texas defeated four consecutive AP Top 25 opponents in four consecutive games for the first time in school history (No. 8 Iowa State on Jan. 18, No. 22 Kansas State on Jan. 21, at No. 24/23 Baylor on Jan. 25, No. 6 Kansas on Feb. 1) last year.
- The Longhorns became just the second team in NCAA Division I since the 1996-97 season to record four straight wins against AP Top 25 teams in four consecutive games. Kansas accomplished the feat earlier during the 2013-14 season, while North Carolina achieved the milestone in 1996-97.
- UT tied a school record by winning four consecutive games against AP Top 25 opponents. The Longhorns won four straight (in a five-game span) against AP Top 25 opponents during the 2010-11 season (No. 11 Texas A&M on Jan. 19, at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, No. 11 Missouri on Jan. 29, at No. 16 Texas A&M on Jan. 31).

OVERTIME SUCCESS

Texas played its only overtime game of the 2013-14 season at Temple (Dec. 7) and pulled out an 81-80 victory. The Horns have won their last four overtime contests, dating back to an 89-86 double-overtime home win against Iowa State on Feb. 13, 2013.

BEATING THE BEST

HOLMES LEADS BY CONSISTENT EXAMPLE

The lone scholarship senior on this year's roster, forward **Jonathan Holmes** returns for his fourth year as a starter in the frontcourt. Holmes has played in 97 career games (78 starts). He earned All-Big 12 Second Team (coaches), USBWA All-District VII Team and NABC All-District 8 Second Team honors as a junior. Last year, Holmes led the team in scoring (12.8 ppg) and ranked second in rebounding (7.2 rpg) and third in blocked shots (40) while averaging 24.3 minutes per contest. He was named the team's Most Valuable Player and team captain and shared the team's Most Improved Player award in 2013-14. In his career, Holmes has reached double figures in scoring 43 times and in rebounds nine times and has five career double-doubles.

- **Holmes recorded 15 points (5-of-6 FG, 2-of-3 threes, 3-of-3 FT) and six rebounds in just 15 minutes against North Dakota State (Nov. 14).**

TAYLOR TIDBITS

Sophomore **Isaiah Taylor** returns for his second season after starting all 35 games at point guard as a freshman. Taylor earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and Big 12 All-Newcomer Team accolades as a freshman. He led the team in assists (4.0 apg) and minutes (30.1 mpg) and ranked second in scoring (12.7 ppg) and steals (37) last season. Taylor had five 20-point performances and reached double figures in scoring a team-best 27 times as a freshman. He sported a 141-to-83 (1.7-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and dished out at least five assists in a game 15 times last year.

- **Taylor has reached double figures in scoring in each of UT's first two games this year and is averaging a team-best 15.0 ppg to go along with 5.0 rpg in 24.5 mpg while hitting 11-of-19 (.579) field goals, including 4-of-6 threes.** He has seven assists against three turnovers this season.
- He recorded 12 points (5-of-8 FG, 2-of-3 threes) and five assists against one turnover against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).
- Taylor posted a game-high 18 points (6-of-11 FG, 2-of-3 threes, 4-of-4 FT) and seven rebounds (one shy of career high) in 28 minutes against NDSU (Nov. 14). Sixteen of his 18 points came in the second half.
- He appeared on a regional cover of *Sports Illustrated* in early November. Texas was one of five schools selected for a regional cover in the magazine's annual College Basketball Preview issue, joining Arizona, Duke, Kentucky and Wisconsin.
- Taylor was one of 36 players named to the preseason watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball.
- Taylor has been named (along with Myles Turner) to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's Preseason Top 50 (Nov. 17).

RIDLEY RISES

Junior center **Cameron Ridley** returns for his third season in the frontcourt. He has played in 70 career games (56 starts). Ridley earned USBWA All-District VII Team and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades and was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team last year. He also shared the team's Most Improved Player award in 2013-14. Ridley led the team in rebounding (8.2 rpg), blocks (76) and double-doubles (10) and ranked fourth on the team in scoring (11.2 ppg) in 25.6 minutes per game as a sophomore. He hit the game-winning putback against Arizona State at the buzzer in the NCAA Second Round. In his career, Ridley has reached double figures in scoring 22 times and in rebounds 16 times and has 11 career double-doubles.

HOLLAND IS THE GLUE

Junior **Demarcus Holland** returns for his third year in the backcourt. He has played in all 71 career games (49 starts) in his first three seasons. Holland started all 35 games and led the team in steals (42) and ranked second in minutes (29.6 mpg), third in assists (2.4 apg), fourth in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and fifth in scoring (7.1 ppg) as a sophomore. He was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team last year and has earned the team's Most Outstanding Defensive Player award in each of his first two seasons. In his career, Holland has reached double figures in scoring 12 times and in rebounds three times.

- Holland posted 10 points (3-of-3 FG), four rebounds and four assists in 20 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).

Lammert ranked third on the team in rebounding (5.2 rpg), fourth in blocks (17) and sixth in scoring (5.8 ppg) while averaging 20.7 minutes per contest as a sophomore. In his career, he has reached double figures in scoring eight times and in rebounds three times.

- Lammert set a career high with seven assists without a turnover to go along with eight points in 17 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16). Six of his seven assists came in the first half.

YANCY'S YOUTH

Sophomore **Kendal Yancy** returns for his second year in the backcourt. He played in 34 games (10 starts) as a freshman and averaged 3.4 points in 12.1 minutes per contest. Yancy averaged 7.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists while hitting 3-of-4 threes in 19.5 minutes per game during UT's two contests at the Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.

- Yancy recorded a career-high four assists without a turnover in 17 minutes against NDSU (Nov. 14).

CROAKER'S CREDENTIALS

Sophomore **Damarcus Croaker** returns for his second season in the backcourt. He played in 33 games (two starts) as a freshman and averaged 3.3 points in 9.5 minutes per contest. Croaker recorded 14 points against BYU (Nov. 25) and tallied a season-high 15 points (5-of-8 threes) in 26 minutes against Oklahoma (Jan. 4).

TRIO OF FRESH FACES

- Freshman forward **Jordan Barnett** was tabbed the No. 86 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year at Christian Brothers College High School (St. Louis, Mo.). Barnett averaged 20.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and nearly two blocks per game while leading CBC to a 25-7 record and the Missouri Class 5 state championship as a senior. He recorded 43 points, 20 rebounds and three blocks in the 86-77 overtime win against Columbia Hickman in the state title game.
- Junior forward **Shaquille Cleare (pronounced CLAIR)** spent his first two years at Maryland before transferring to Texas prior to the fall semester. He will sit out the 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Cleare will have two years of eligibility remaining, beginning with the 2015-16 season. He was tabbed the No. 30 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN

following his senior year at The Village School (Houston, Texas). Cleare was a high school teammate of UT guard **Isaiah Taylor** during Cleare's senior season (Taylor's junior year).

- Freshman forward **Myles Turner** was tabbed the No. 2 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year at Euless Trinity High School (Bedford, Texas). The 16th McDonald's All-American and 11th Jordan Brand All-American in UT history, Turner also was a member of the U.S. team at the Nike Hoop Summit this past spring. He averaged 18.1 points, 12.2 rebounds and 6.8 blocks per game as a senior while leading Trinity to a 24-7 record.

TURNER OFF TO SOLID START

- **Myles Turner** ranks second on the team in scoring (12.5 ppg) and has averaged 6.5 rpg and 4.0 bpg through his first two collegiate contests while playing 20.0 mpg coming off the bench. He has converted 10-of-15 (.667) field goals and 5-of-6 (.833) free throws.
- Turner tallied 15 points (6-of-8 FG, 3-of-4 FT), six rebounds and two blocks in 20 minutes against NDSU (Nov. 14). The 15 points were just five shy of the UT record for most in a collegiate debut (20 by Kevin Durant in 2006-07). His two blocks were just one shy of the UT record for most in a collegiate debut (3 by both Cameron Ridley and Damion James).
- He had 10 points (4-of-7 FG), seven boards and six blocks in 20 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16). His six blocks were one shy of the UT freshman mark (shared by Chris Mihm and Tristan Thompson).
- Turner has been named (along with Isaiah Taylor) to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's Preseason Top 50 (Nov. 17).

TURNER'S SUMMER VACATION

Myles Turner was a member of the USA Under-18 National Team which won the gold medal at the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship in June in Colorado Springs, Colo. Turner set a USA U18 competition record with 18 total blocks during the five-game tournament.

UT INKS GUARD DUO DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Eric Davis (Saginaw, Mich.) and **Kerwin Roach** (Houston, Texas) signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. The guard duo will join the Longhorns for the 2015-16 season.

- **Davis** (6-3, 172), a guard from Saginaw Arthur Hill High School who plays under coach Greg McMath, is ranked as the No. 41 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN, No. 42 by 247Sports and No. 53 by Rivals.com. He averaged 27 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals per game in his junior year while leading Arthur Hill to the Saginaw Valley League championship. Davis earned Michigan Class A Player of the Year honors as a junior.
- **Roach** (6-3, 160), a guard from Houston's North Shore High School who plays under coach David Green, is ranked as the No. 35 overall prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and No. 71 by 247Sports. He averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game as a junior while leading North Shore to a 33-3 record and the Class 5A state title. Roach also claimed the 5A state championship in the triple jump last May in Austin.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last five years (2010-14). The awards are given to teams scoring in the Top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1,000 score in each of the last five multi-year APR reports. In addition, Men's Basketball has posted perfect 1,000 APR single-year scores in EVERY season dating back to 2005-06 (eight consecutive years).
- The Men's Basketball team's semester GPA in Spring 2014 was a 3.33 (4.0 scale), the highest single-semester team GPA in program history. The team entered the 2014 Fall semester with a cumulative GPA of 3.20.
- UT led the Big 12 Conference in the number of Academic All-Big 12 selections in men's basketball for four consecutive years (2008-11). Texas had six players earn the accolade in both 2008 and 2009 and five players claim a spot in 2010. The Horns also had four selections on the 2011 squad.
- Four UT players earned a spot on the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team. **Connor Lammert** was named to the First Team, while **Javan Felix**, **Demarcus Holland** and **Prince Ibeh** were each selected to the Second Team.

THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Thursday's contest having hit at least one 3-pointer in 793 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 921 of 927 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

- **Brandon Allums** served as a practice player for the Texas women's basketball team in 2012-13.
- **Jordan Barnett's** father, Bob Bonner, played basketball at Midwestern State University (Wichita Falls, Texas) for four years. Jordan and his mom (Karen Barnett) lived in San Antonio, when Jordan was two-to-six years old.
- **Shaquille Cleare's** father, Brian, played basketball at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma (Chickasha, Okla.). He wears jersey No. 32 to honor his father, who also wore No. 32 during his collegiate playing days. Cleare was high school teammates with **Isaiah Taylor** at The Village School (Houston), when Cleare was a senior and Taylor was a junior.
- **Damarcus Croaker** became a father on Feb. 4, 2014. His girlfriend, Amber Shazier (pronounced: SHAY-zure), gave birth to their son – Damarcus Dewayne Croaker, Jr. – at 1:27 a.m. in Orlando, Fla. Damarcus, Jr. checked in at 5 pounds, 12 ounces.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006. Felix has interest in becoming an NBA General Manager following his playing career.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Jonathan Holmes'** father, Daryl, played football at the University of Nebraska (lettered in 1980 as a defensive end).
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a senior on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Tarale Murry** is the cousin of former UT basketball player Ivan Wagner and former UT football player Wane McGarity.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Myles Turner** wears jersey No. 52 to honor Habram (huh-BRAUM) Rosario, a close friend and middle school teammate who passed away from leukemia when Myles was in ninth grade (Rosario wore No. 52 on the middle school team).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets.

Year 17 at Texas

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 17th season at Texas. He has compiled nearly 600 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 21 NCAA and three NIT trips.

- UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the 16 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 15 of Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin.

- UT owns a 33-18 (.647) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

- Barnes had a personal streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped during the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
