NOTES AT A GLANCE

• No. 6/9 Texas (4-0) faces No. 4/5 Tennessee (4-1) on Sunday at 5:30 p.m. Central in Austin. The game will be televised nationally on FOX Sports 1 and broadcast on the Longhorn IMG Radio Network (103.1 FM iHeart Austin).

• **Series info:** Tennessee leads the all-time series with Texas, 23-12. This is the 33rd consecutive season the Longhorns and Lady Vols will meet. The last Texas victory in the series was a 73-59 win on Dec. 14, 2008 in Austin. When both teams are ranked in the AP Top 10, the Longhorns hold a 7-3 advantage.

• **Last time out:** Texas defeated UT-Pan American on Wednesday, 72-45, led by 20 points from sophomore center Kelsey Lang. Tennessee suffered its first loss of the season on Wednesday at Chattanooga, 67-63.

• **Lang stepping up:** Sophomore center Kelsey Lang leads Texas in scoring (14.5 ppg), shooting percentage (60.9 FG%) and minutes (30.8 mpg). Lang has reached double-figure points in all four games, including a career-high 20 points (10-13 FG) against UTPA on Wednesday. Her .769 shooting percentage from the field against the Broncs is the 12th-highest in program history.

• **Burnt Orange paint:** Texas is out-scoring its opponents 138-80 in the paint through four games. The Longhorns have an average scoring margin in the paint of +14.5 points.

• **Dominating the boards:** Texas features a rebounding margin of +17.3 through four games. On Wednesday Texas out-rebounded UT-Pan American 59-to-27 with 25 offensive rebounds and 23 second-chance points.

• **Texas sweeps Big 12 weekly honors:** Senior forward **Nneka Enemkpali** was named Big 12 Player of the Week and freshman guard **Ariel Atkins** was named Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Monday. Enemkpali averaged 14.0 points on 58 percent shooting and 8.5 rebounds in Texas' wins at No. 6/1 Stanford and UCLA. Atkins averaged 15 points and 3.5 rebounds last week, including 16 points in UT's overtime victory at Stanford.

• **Atkins at the line:** Freshman guard **Ariel Atkins** made the first 14 free throws of her collegiate career and is shooting 90 percent on the season (18-20 FT). The Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year has started all four games, averaging 10.5 points per game.

• **McCarty's breakout performance:** Freshman guard **Brooke McCarty** came off the bench to lead Texas to a 75-65 win at UCLA, scoring 20 points on 5-of-9 shooting from 3-point range. It was the first 20-point game from a UT guard since Feb. 20, 2013 (Chassidy Fussell 26 points vs. Kansas).

• **Injury update:** Junior center **Imani McGee-Stafford** (leg) is not cleared to participate on Sunday. Freshman forward **Diani Akigbogun** (knee) and sophomore forward **Nekia Jones** (illness) were cleared prior to Wednesday's game against UT-Pan American.

• **Next up:** Texas continues a six-game home stand against New Mexico on Wednesday, Dec. 3 at 7 p.m. Central (Longhorn Network).

TENNESSEE SERIES

- Long-time rivals Texas and Tennessee meet for the 36th time on Sunday in front of a national television audience (5:30 p.m. CT, FOX Sports 1). Tennessee leads the all-time series with Texas, 23-12.
- This is the 33rd consecutive season the Longhorns and Lady Vols will meet.
- Tennessee has won the last five games in the series, including a 75-61 decision on Dec. 8, 2013 in Knoxville last season.
- The series first began with an 84-60 Texas loss on Dec. 8, 1978, at a neutral site in the Mid-America Invitational. After that, the Longhorns went on to win seven of the next eight contests before the Lady Vols won the next 13 games.
- Over the last 13 meetings between the two teams, the Lady Vols hold a 8-5 series edge.
- Texas last toppled Tennessee by the score of 73-59 on Dec. 14, 2008, in Austin.
- **Karen Aston** is 0-2 against Tennessee in her eight-year head coaching career.

TEXAS-TENNESSEE CONNECTIONS

- **Kathy Harston**, Texas' Senior Associate Athletics Director for Sports Programs, served as Tennessee's Director of Basketball Operations from 2008-12. Prior to her stint in Knoxville, Harston worked for 18 years as an assistant coach at Texas from 1989-2007. She then served as an academic counselor at UT for one year in 2007-08. During Harston's time on the bench in Austin alongside Hall of Fame coach **Jody Conratt**, the Longhorns made 14 NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the Final Four in 2003 along with advancing to the "Elite Eight" in 1990 and the "Sweet 16" in both 2002 and 2004. Texas also claimed eight total conference championships, including five regular season titles and three postseason tournament crowns.
- **Conratt** and **Pat Summitt** are both Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame inductees and were the first two coaches to record 900 victories in Women's College Basketball.
- **Conratt** and **Summitt** attended each other's statute dedications at their respective institutions. Conratt's statue on the Erwin Center concourse was dedicated on 2012 and Summitt's statue near Thompson-Thompson-Boling Arena was dedicated on Nov. 22, 2013.

TEXAS VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

- Texas holds a 166-219 (.436) all-time record against opponents ranked by the Associated Press on the date of competition, including a 1-0 mark this season.
- UT is 72-123 (.378) against top-10 opponents. The Lady Vols will be the Longhorns' second top-10 opponent of the season after defeating then-No. 6/1 Stanford, 87-81, on Nov. 20 in Palo Alto.

**LAST TIME OUT: at TEXAS 72, UTPA 45**

- Texas defeated UT-Pan American on Wednesday, 72-45, led by 20 points from sophomore center Kelsey Lang.

- **Series:** Texas now leads the series with UTPA, 6-0. The last meeting was a 112-59 Texas victory on December 8, 2010 in Austin.

- **8th in all-time rebounds:** UT's 59 rebounds ranks tied for eighth in program history. It is the most rebounds in a game for the Longhorns since posting 62 against Hofstra on Nov. 10, 2012.

- **DEFENSE:** Texas held the Broncos to 27.9 percent shooting from the field (17-61 FG), the lowest an opponent has been held to this season.

- **Rebounding margin widens:** Texas won the rebound battle with UTPA, 59-27, including a 25-10 advantage in offensive boards. The Longhorns now have an average rebounding margin of +17.3 this season.

- **Block party:** Texas blocked eight shots on Wednesday, including five from senior forward Nneka Enemkpali.

Kelsey Lang (Sophomore, C)

- Scored a career-high 20 points (10-13 FG) with seven rebounds and two blocks 27 minutes.

- Her four consecutive games with double-figure points is a career-best.

- Made 10 of UT's total 27 field goals.

- UT's leading scorer with 14.5 points per game after Wednesday.

- Her 76.9 shooting percentage from the field (10-13 FG) ranks 12th in program history.

Brady Sanders (Junior, G)

- Scored a season-high 10 points (4-5 FG, 2-2 FT) with four rebounds and three assists in 19 minutes off the bench.

- Wednesday marked her 13th career double-figure scoring effort.

Tasia Foman (Freshman, G)

- Scored a season-high 10 points (8-10 FT, 1-2 FG) with four rebounds in just 13 minutes.

Brianna Taylor (Sophomore, G)

- Paced UT with a career-high 11 rebounds in 11 minutes.

Ariel Atkins (Freshman, G)

- Recorded a game-high five assists with two steals and seven rebounds in 28 minutes.

Nneka Enemkpali (Senior, F)

- Tied her career high in blocks with five, which also against Jackson State on Nov. 20, 2012.

Diani Akigbogun (Freshman, F)

- Made her collegiate debut, playing in three minutes with one field goal attempt.

- Sideline during preseason and the first three games due to a knee injury.

LONGHORNS SNAP TOP-RANKED STANFORD'S HOME WINNING STREAK

- Texas defeated No. 6/1 Stanford 87-81 in overtime on Nov. 20 to snap Stanford's 28-game home winning streak at Maples Pavilion and a six-game winning streak in the series against Texas.

- Texas led for 36:33, while Stanford led for just 4:30. The game was tied for 3:48.

- The last time Texas defeated an AP Top-10 opponent was then-No. 4 Baylor, 58-55, on Feb. 1, 2009 in Waco.

- The last USA TODAY Coaches No. 1-ranked team Texas defeated was Tennessee, 74-59, on Nov. 25, 2004.

- Texas made its way to a six-point halftime lead (43-37) on 53.3 percent shooting (16-30 FG). The Longhorns committed just four first-half turnovers.

- Texas held Stanford to one field goal in overtime (1-7 FG), outscoring the Cardinal in the extra period, 12-6.

- Texas shot 48.5 percent from the floor (33-68 FG), while holding Stanford to 35.9 percent (23-64 FG).

- Four Longhorns reached double-figure points, including a team-high 18 points from senior forward Nneka Enemkpali.

TEXAS NAMED NCAA TEAM OF THE WEEK

- *NCAA.com* named the Longhorns as the NCAA Women's Basketball Team of the Week after starting the season 3-0.

- Texas scored wins against UTSA (68-48), at No. 6/1 Stanford in overtime (87-81) and at UCLA (75-65). Texas' win at Stanford broke a 28-game home winning streak for the Cardinal at Maples Pavilion and came only three days after Stanford's stunning win against UConn that broke the Huskies' 47-game winning streak.

- Through three games, Texas features a balanced offensive attack combined with superior rebounding that resulted in a plus-12.4 rebound average. Sophomore center Kelsey Lang currently leads UT with 12.7 points per game on 54.5 percent shooting from the floor. This week, senior forward Nneka Enemkpali (12.0 ppg, 8.3 rpg) was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week, while guard Ariel Atkins (12.0 ppg, 16-18 FT) was named Phillips 66 Big 12 Freshman of the Week.

- Freshman guard **Ariel Atkins** made her first 14 free throws of her collegiate career.
- At the charity stripe, Atkins went 4-of-4 against UTSA (Nov. 15), 6-of-6 at Stanford (Nov. 20) and 6-of-8 at UCLA (Nov. 23). She made her first two FTs at UCLA before missing her first of the season.
- The Preseason Big 12 Freshman of the Year has started the first three games for UT, averaging 12.0 points per game.

McCARTY'S BREAK-OUT PERFORMANCE

- Freshman guard **Brooke McCarty** came off the bench to lead the Longhorns in scoring with 20 points (7-14 FG, 5-9 3FG) at UCLA (Nov. 23).
- It marked the first 20-point game from a Texas guard since Feb. 20, 2013 (Chassidy Fussell, 26 points vs. Kansas).
- McCarty's seven 3-point field goals this season ranks second in the Big 12.

- Senior forward **Nneka Enemkpali** was named to a pair of national player of the year watch lists this week -- the WBCA's **'Wade Watch'** and **Wooden Award Preseason Top 30**.
- **Wade Trophy:** regarded as "The Heisman of Women's Basketball," The Wade Trophy is presented annually to the WBCA NCAA Division I Player of the Year by SHAPE America - the Society of Health and Physical Educators and the WBCA. The 25-member list is made up of top NCAA Division I student-athletes who best embody the spirit of Lily Margaret Wade according to the following criteria: game and season statistics, leadership, character, effect on their team and overall playing ability.
- Created in 1976, the **John R. Wooden Award** is the most prestigious individual honor in men's and women's college basketball. It is bestowed upon the nation's best player at an institution of higher education who has proven to his or her university that he or she is making progress toward graduation and maintaining a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA. Previous winners include such notables as Larry Bird ('79), Michael Jordan ('84), Tim Duncan ('97), Candace Parker ('07 and '08), Kevin Durant ('09) and Maya Moore of Connecticut ('09 and '11).

• **Atkins** earned consensus All-American honors as a senior at Duncanville High School, where she led her team to a pair of Texas UIL Class 5A state titles (2012, 2013), a 105-game winning streak and a combined record of 148-10 during her four seasons. She averaged 17.9 points, 5.8 rebounds, 4.8 steals and 3.9 assists as a senior and was named the Morgan Wootten Player of the Year. Atkins is the fourth Longhorn to garner Preseason Freshman of the Year honors from the Big 12 coaches, joining Tiffany Jackson (2003-04), Brittainey Raven (2006-07) and Cassie Peoples (2011-12).

• **Enemkpali** earns Preseason All-Big 12 honors after being named All-Big 12 First Team last season. The Pflugerville, Texas, native led UT in both scoring (12.0 ppg) and rebounding (8.6 rpg) as a junior, and enters her senior year ranked third in career offensive rebounds per game (3.1) and ninth in career rebounds per game (7.6) at Texas.

• **McGee-Stafford** earns her second Preseason All-Big 12 nod as an honorable mention this year. The Los Angeles native was named Preseason All-Big 12 last season before leading Texas in blocks per game (2.2 bpg), and scoring (12.1 ppg) during conference play. The 2012-13 Big 12 Freshman of the Year enters her junior campaign ranked seventh in career blocks at UT (147).

Aborowa is a 6-foot-4 forward ranked No. 77 overall and No. 14 at the forward position in the class of 2015 (*ESPN.com*). Aborowa was born in Nigeria and has played the last two years in Philadelphia, Pa., at Neumann-Goretti High School and for the Philadelphia Belles club team. Aborowa led Neumann-Goretti to a 29-1 record and the Philadelphia Catholic League title as a junior, with its only loss coming in the state title game.

Karen Aston: "Christina adds much-needed depth at the forward position as Nneka [Enemkpali] graduates this spring. Fans will be drawn to her because of her infectious smile. She has tremendous upside and brings athleticism and a motor. Great coaches, both in high school and on the storied Philly Belles program, have developed her well. I look forward to seeing her blossom as a person and player here on the Forty Acres."

Higgs is a 5-foot-9 floor general ranked No. 6 overall and No. 3 at the guard position in the class of 2015 (*ESPN.com*). The Round Rock, Texas native is a two-time All-State performer and daughter of Texas assistant coach George Washington. Higgs was named to the Texas Association of Basketball Coaches (TABC) Small Private School All-State team after averaging 19.6 points and 10.6 rebounds as a freshman at The Kinkaid School in Houston. As a junior at Cedar Ridge High School in Round Rock, Higgs garnered TABC Class 5A All-State honors after averaging 22.5 points, 7.7 rebounds, 5.7 assists and 4.9 steals. She enters her senior year as a Sporting News Preseason High School All-American.

Karen Aston returned to the institution where she originally carved her reputation as an energetic leader and relentless recruiter in 2012, becoming just the fourth Texas Women's Basketball head coach in program history.

Since arriving at The University of Texas, Aston has made steps to lay the foundation for the Longhorns' return to national prominence, which she experienced as an eight-year assistant to Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame coach Jody Conradt. Aston was instrumental in the Longhorns' trip to the 2003 NCAA Final Four and a pair of Sweet 16 appearances in 2002 and 2004.

Entering the 2014-15 season, Aston has five postseason appearances as a head coach, a 135-93 (.592) overall record through seven seasons, and a 34-30 (.531) record through two seasons as UT's leader.

Aston bolstered the Longhorns' roster of 10 returning letterwinners for the 2014-15 season with a recruiting class ranked No. 11 by ESPN.com. Included in Aston's marquee recruiting class are McDonald's All-Americans Ariel Atkins and Brooke McCarty, Colorado Gatorade Player of the Year Diani Akigbogun and all-state guard Tasia Foman.

Aston and the Longhorns began a steady incline during the 2013-14 season with five wins over ranked opponents, a third-place finish in the Big 12 standings, a 10-win improvement from the previous season, and winning a game in the NCAA Championship for the first time since 2008. UT's tie for third-place in the Big 12 was the highest league finish since 2005.

As with any Karen Aston-coached team, defense and rebounding were essential factors of success in 2013-14. Texas led the Big 12 in field goal percentage defense (.347) and rebounding margin (+11.1), while enjoying improved success long-range shooting. After finishing last in the league in 3-point field goal percentage in 2012-13 (.278), UT paced the Big 12 with a .365 mark in 2013-14.

Three Longhorns earned All-Big 12 honors in 2013-14, led by first team Nneka Enemkpali (First Team), Imani McGee-Stafford (Second Team) and Chassidy Fussell (Honorable Mention). Fussell finished her collegiate career ninth on UT's all-time scoring list with 1,717 points.

In addition to on-court success, Aston's team reached high academic marks with a 3.32 cumulative team GPA for the 2013-14 academic year, completing ten consecutive semesters with a GPA of 3.0 or better. Each of her student-athletes currently holds a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, and six were named to the Big 12 All-Academic Team in 2014, leading the conference with five first-team nominees.

In Aston's debut as the Longhorns head coach on Nov. 9, 2012, she guided UT to a season-opening win over No. 14 St. John's, 70-60. Her first recruiting class at UT featured three starters and the 2013 Big 12 Freshman of the Year, Imani McGee-Stafford.

She returned to the Forty Acres in 2012 after five years of experience reviving the women's basketball programs at Charlotte and the University of North Texas.

Aston tripled the Mean Green's victory total in one season, as UNT went 15-16 during the 2011-12 season

under her direction after winning just five games the previous year. At Charlotte, Aston led the program to record-breaking heights, with 86 victories in four seasons, including a school-record 27 wins in 2010-11.

Aston led the 49ers to four-straight postseason appearances and the 2009 Atlantic 10 Tournament Championship en route to the school's second ever NCAA Tournament appearance. In her final season at Charlotte, Aston's squad advanced to the WNIT Final Four.

While on Conradt's Texas staff from 1998-2006, Aston saw the Longhorns post a 173-83 (.676) record during that span, with seven NCAA Tournament appearances, two trips to the "Sweet 16" and a march to the 2003 Final Four. The Longhorns also captured the 2003 Big 12 regular season and tournament titles, and UT shared the 2004 Big 12 regular season title. Aston was promoted from assistant coach to associate head coach in July of 2000 after serving as UT's assistant coach for two seasons.

Aston spearheaded UT's signing of 25 nationally-recognized recruits, including seven McDonald's High School All-Americans and seven WBCA/Nike All-Americans. Two of those high school All-Americans - Tiffany Jackson and Erika Arriaran - were named National High School Players of the Year. All eight of the recruiting classes Aston attracted were nationally ranked, including the No. 1 class in the nation in 2005-06.

Aston originally came to Austin from the University of North Texas, where she served as an assistant coach for two seasons (1996-98). Prior to joining the North Texas staff, Aston was an assistant coach at Baylor for two seasons (1994-96).

Following Aston's stint on the Forty Acres, she was named associate head coach at Baylor during the 2006-07 season. With Aston on board, the Lady Bears won 26 games and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

Before entering the collegiate coaching ranks, Aston was recognized as one of the top high school women's coaches in the south. She coached five years at Vilonia High School (1988-93) in Vilonia, Ark., and one year at Fort Smith Northside (1993-94) in Fort Smith, Ark. She guided Fort Smith Northside to a 24-10 record and a fifth-place finish in Class 4A. For her efforts, she was named the Arkansas Northwest Region Coach of the Year.

While at Vilonia, Aston was not only the head basketball coach but also the head cross country and track coach. In 1992-93, she was named the Arkansas Basketball Coach of the Year after leading Vilonia to a 36-1 record and a Class 2A State Championship. Aston's cross country teams also claimed back-to-back state titles in 1991 and 1992.

A native of Benton, Ark., Aston was a two-time first-team all-state selection at Bryant High School. She capped her high school career by leading Bryant to the 1982 Arkansas Class 4A State Championship. Aston earned a Bachelors of Arts degree in physical education from Arkansas-Little Rock in 1987. She played two seasons of basketball at UALR after transferring from Ouachita Baptist.
