NOTABLES

- **SUCCESS AGAINST THE BOBCATS:** UT has posted 25 straight victories against Texas State entering Saturday's contest. The Horns have won 21 consecutive home games against the Bobcats, including all 12 prior meetings at the Erwin Center.
- **DEFENSE AND REBOUNDING:** Texas has held each of its first eight opponents to below 65 points AND 38% FG shooting. The Horns also have outrebounded their opponents in seven of their first eight games and sport a +13.5 rebound margin (44.5-31.0) entering Saturday's contest.
- **HOME WIN STREAK:** UT carries a 12-game home win streak into Saturday's contest against Texas State. The Horns are 182-21 (.897) at the Erwin Center in the last 13 seasons (dating back to the start of the 2002-03 season).

TEXAS STATE SERIES INFO

- Saturday's contest marks the 49th meeting between Texas and Texas State.
- UT holds a 43-5 lead in the all-time series against Texas State that dates back to a 52-15 Texas victory in Austin on Jan. 15, 1917.
- UT has won the last 25 games against Texas State, the longest current winning streak against any Texas opponent.
- The Horns have won 21 consecutive home games against Texas State, including all 12 prior meetings in the Erwin Center.
- The last time the Bobcats defeated the Horns was a 33-31 decision in Austin on Dec. 7, 1937.
- In last year's meeting in Austin (Dec. 14, 2013), Texas registered an 85-53 victory.

LONE STAR STATE SUCCESS

- Since Rick Barnes arrived in Austin prior to the 1998-99 season, the Longhorns have emerged as the dominant college basketball program in the state of Texas.
- **The Horns have posted a 141-21 (.870) record against in-state foes during the Barnes era entering Saturday's game**, including marks of 29-8 against Baylor, 30-4 against Texas Tech, 23-7 against Texas A&M and 6-0 against TCU.

HORNS AT HOME

- UT is currently in its 38th season of play at the Frank Erwin Center.
- **Texas has won 12 consecutive home games dating back to last season entering Saturday's contest.**
- The Longhorns have registered an all-time record of 454-104 (.814) in the building.
- Since Rick Barnes arrived in Austin, UT has recorded a 229-32 (.877) mark at the Erwin Center, including a 107-24 (.817) record in Big 12 Conference home games.
- **Texas is 182-21 (.897) at the Erwin Center in the last 13 seasons (dating to the start of the 2002-03 season).**

KENTUCKY POSTGAME NOTES

- Texas out-rebounded Kentucky 42-31 to mark the first time this year that the Wildcats had lost the battle on the glass. It marked the sixth time in eight games that UT had posted a double-digit rebound advantage.
- The Horns posted a 27-11 rebound advantage in the first half, including a 13-2 margin on the offensive glass.

- Texas held Kentucky to 37.5% FG shooting (21-of-56), including a 1-of-12 (.083) mark from three-point range.
- **Jonathan Holmes** reached double figures in scoring (14 points) for the fifth time this year and 47th time in his career (103 games).
- **Demarcus Holland** reached double figures in scoring (10 points) for the fourth time this year and 15th time in his career (77 games). He also posted a season-high five assists against just one turnover in 38 minutes.
- **Connor Lammert** tied his season high with nine rebounds.
- **Kendal Yancy** tied his career high with six rebounds (four offensive).

HISTORICALLY GOOD DEFENSE

- Texas held each of its first seven opponents to below 60 points.
- **The last time UT held its first seven opponents under 60 points to open a season was 1950-51.** Texas held all 27 of its opponents that year to below 60 points.

NOTEWORTHY VICTORY AT UCONN

- UT's 55-54 win in Storrs (Nov. 30) snapped a 44-game win streak by the Huskies against non-conference opponents at Gampel Pavilion. The streak dated back to a UConn loss to Detroit-Mercy in the 2001 NIT (March 18, 2001).
- The last time UConn had lost a regular season non-conference game in Gampel to a ranked (AP) opponent came on Feb. 6, 1993 to No. 12 Florida State.
- Prior to the win by Texas, UConn had not lost an on-campus, non-conference game played in November/December since a 91-85 defeat to Holy Cross on Dec. 5, 1973.

CHECK OF THE POLLS

- Texas is ranked No. 8 in the most recent AP poll (Dec. 8) and No. 9 in the most recent USA Today coaches' poll (Dec. 8).
- **During the Rick Barnes era, the Horns have spent 185 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 89 in the Top 10.**
- Texas was ranked No. 10 in The Associated Press preseason poll. This marked the first time the Horns have appeared in the AP preseason poll since the 2009-10 season, when UT began the year at No. 3.
- Texas has now made 15 appearances in school history in the AP preseason poll. Prior to its four-year absence from the preseason rankings, the Horns were ranked in the AP preseason poll for nine consecutive years (2001-02 through 2009-10).
- UT was ranked No. 10 in the USA Today coaches' preseason poll. This marks the 12th time in the last 14 years that the Horns have been ranked in the coaches' preseason poll. It's the highest preseason coaches' poll ranking for UT since the Longhorns were tabbed No. 3 in 2009-10.

A CONSISTENT DANCER

Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 15 of Rick Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin. UT has made a total of 31 all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament (35-34 record). The Horns have earned a bid to the NCAA tourney 23 times in the last 26 years.

HORNS REACH 20-WIN MARK ... AGAIN

With their 24-11 mark last year, **the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark for the 14th time in 16 seasons under coach Rick Barnes.** UT had a school-record streak of 13 consecutive 20-win seasons snapped in 2012-13. Prior to that streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92). The Longhorns have reached the 20-win plateau of total of 29 times in their previous 108 seasons of basketball.

AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA Elite Eight twice in the last nine years and three times in the last 12 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis). UT has advanced to the NCAA Elite Eight a total of seven times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1990, 2003, 2006 and 2008).

IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA Sweet 16 a total of five times in the last 13 years. The Longhorns have advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 a total of 13 times in program history (1939, 1943, 1947, 1960, 1963, 1972, 1990, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008).

2K CLASSIC CHAMPIONS

- Texas captured the 2K Classic benefitting Wounded Warrior Project championship with back-to-back wins against nr/#25 Iowa (71-57) and Cal (71-55) at Madison Square Garden.
- UT captured its first November neutral-site tournament title since the 2009 CBE Classic in Kansas City.

DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 271 of their 556 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 244-27 (.900) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat** (7-1 mark in 2014-15).

- **UT has held its first eight opponents to an average of 53.9 ppg on a combined 31.6% FG shooting (148-of-469), including a 26.6% mark from three-point range (37-of-139).**
- The Horns have held each of their first eight opponents to under 65 points **AND** 38% FG shooting.
- Texas limited No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30) to 54 points on 30.4% FG shooting (17-of-56), including a 3-of-16 (.188) mark from three-point range.
- UT held Saint Francis (Nov. 25) to 46 points on 31.0% FG shooting (18-of-58).
- Texas limited Cal (Nov. 21) to 55 points on 31.3% FG shooting (20-of-64). The Horns held the Golden Bears to 21 points on 24.1% FG shooting (7-of-29) in the first half.
- UT held No. nr/25 Iowa (Nov. 20) to 57 points on 29.6% FG shooting (16-of-54), including a 4-of-14 (.286) mark from three-point range.
- Texas held Alcorn State (Nov. 16) to 53 points on 29.7% FG shooting (19-of-64).
- Texas limited North Dakota State (Nov. 14) to 50 points on 27.4% FG shooting (17-of-62). The Horns held the Bison to 18 points on 21.4% FG shooting (6-of-28) in the first half.

BLOCK PARTY

UT ranked 11th nationally in total blocked shots (206) and 14th nationally in blocks per game (5.9 bpg) last year. **The Horns set a single-season team record with 206 blocks in 2013-14** (previous mark: 203 in 1997-98). The Horns recorded at least seven blocks in 17 of their 35 games last year.

- **UT has averaged 7.4 blocks per contest in its first eight games this year (59 total blocks).**
- The Horns have posted at least seven blocks in six of their last seven contests.
- **Texas tied a single-game school record with 13 blocks in Tuesday's win against UT Arlington (also blocked 13 vs. UTSA on Dec. 29, 2004 and vs. Cal on Nov. 15, 2000).**
- UT recorded eight blocked shots at No. 24/22 UConn (Nov. 30).
- Texas registered 10 blocks against Cal (Nov. 21). Six different Longhorns recorded a blocked shot during that contest.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas outrebounded 27 of its 35 opponents last season while posting double-digit rebound advantages in 12 of its 35 games. For the season, UT ranked 10th nationally with a +7.0 rebound margin (41.4-34.4).

- **Texas sports a +13.5 rebound margin (44.5-31.0) through the first eight games this year and has outrebounded its opponent in seven of its first eight contests.**
- UT has posted double-digit rebound margins in six of its first eight games this season.
- The Horns registered a +11 rebound margin (42-31) at No. 1/1 Kentucky (Dec. 5). The Wildcats entered the game with a +14.6 rebound margin.
- Texas posted a 52-25 (+27) rebound margin against UT Arlington (Dec. 2). The Horns grabbed more offensive boards (28) than UTA had total rebounds (25).
- Texas ranked third nationally last year in offensive rebounds per game (15.1 rpg)
- UT ranked fifth nationally in total rebounds (1,449) and 20th nationally in defensive rebounds per game (26.3 rpg) last season.

BALANCE AND DEPTH

- **Seven UT players in the current rotation** (NOT including the injured Isaiah Taylor) **are averaging at least 5.3 points per game through the first eight contests.**
- All eight UT players who saw game action against Cal (Nov. 21) scored at least four points and all eight grabbed at least one rebound.
- Texas had seven players score at least seven points in the win against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).
- Against North Dakota State (Nov. 14), six Texas players scored at least eight points (Taylor 18, Holmes 15, Turner 15, Ridley 9, Felix 9, Holland 8).
- Five different UT players scored at least 20 points in a game during the 2013-14 season (Javan Felix, Demarcus Holland, Jonathan Holmes, Cameron Ridley and Isaiah Taylor).

HOLMES LEADS BY CONSISTENT EXAMPLE

The lone scholarship senior on this year’s roster, forward **Jonathan Holmes** returns for his fourth year as a starter in the frontcourt. Holmes has played in **103 career games (85 starts)** and recorded 925 career points. He earned All-Big 12 Second Team (coaches), USBWA All-District VII Team and NABC All-District 8 Second Team honors as a junior, while leading the team in scoring (12.8 ppg) and ranking second in rebounding (7.2 rpg) and third in blocked shots (40) in 24.3 minutes per contest. In his career, Holmes has reached double figures in scoring 47 times and in rebounds 11 times and has six career double-doubles.

- **Holmes leads the team in scoring (12.9 ppg) and rebounding (8.1 rpg) in 27.0 mpg while hitting 33-of-74 (.446) field goals, including 15-of-34 (.441) from three-point range.**
- He tied his career high in rebounds (16) and blocks (three) against UT Arlington (Dec. 2). Nine of his 16 boards came on the offensive glass.
- Holmes set a career high with five assists against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).
- He recorded 15 points (5-of-6 FG, 2-of-3 threes, 3-of-3 FT) and six boards in 15 minutes against North Dakota State (Nov. 14).

LAST-SECOND HEROICS FOR HOLMES ... AGAIN

Jonathan Holmes connected on the game-winning three-pointer from the left corner with 2.2 seconds left during the win at No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30). This marked Holmes’ second collegiate game-winning shot, either at the buzzer or within the final three seconds of regulation. Last year (Jan. 21, 2014), he converted a three-pointer from the right corner as time expired to lift Texas to a 67-64 home win against No. 22 Kansas State. In addition, Holmes also hit a game-tying three-pointer with three seconds left in regulation to force overtime in a home contest against West Virginia (Jan. 9, 2013) during his sophomore campaign.

HOLMES SHINES IN THE BIG APPLE

Jonathan Holmes claimed 2K Classic Tournament MVP honors, averaging 20.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game while hitting 13-of-23 (.565) field goals, including 4-of-8 (.500) threes, and 10-of-13 (.769) free throws during the two contests at Madison Square Garden.

- Holmes also earned Phillips 66 Big 12 Player of the Week (Nov. 24) accolades for his performance in New York City.
- He had a team-high 19 points (7-of-12 FG, 3-of-5 threes) and five boards in 31 minutes against No. nr/25 Iowa (Nov. 20). Holmes scored 17 of his 19 points in the second half (6-of-8 FG, 3-of-4 threes in final 20 minutes).
- Holmes tallied a game-high 21 points (6-of-11 FG, 8-of-10 FT), 13 rebounds and two blocks in 32 minutes against Cal (Nov. 21) in the title game.

HOLLAND IS THE GLUE

Junior **Demarcus Holland** returns for his third year in the backcourt. He has played in all 77 career games (55 starts) in his first three seasons. Holland started all 35 games and led the team in steals (42) and ranked second in minutes (29.6 mpg), third in assists (2.4 apg), fourth in rebounding (4.7 rpg) and fifth in scoring (7.1 ppg) as a sophomore. He was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team last year and has earned the team’s Most Outstanding Defensive Player award in each of his first two seasons. In his career, Holland has reached double figures in scoring 15 times and in rebounds three times.

- He registered 10 points (5-of-5 FT), four rebounds (three offensive), five assists against one turnover and two steals in 38 minutes at No. 1/1 Kentucky (Dec. 5).
- Holland tallied 10 points (5-of-8 FG) and three boards in 35 minutes against No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30).
- He recorded 11 points (7-of-7 FT) and five rebounds in 35 minutes during the 2K Classic title game against Cal (Nov. 21).
- Holland posted 10 points (3-of-3 FG), four rebounds and four assists in 20 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16).

THE FELIX FILE

Junior **Javan Felix** returns for his third year in the backcourt and has assumed the starting role at point guard with the injury to Isaiah Taylor. Felix has played in 75 career games (48 starts) in his first three seasons. He earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades as a sophomore and ranked second on the team in assists (2.8 apg) and third in scoring (11.6 ppg). In his career, Felix has reached double figures in scoring 31 times, including six 20-point performances.

- Felix recorded 10 points and four assists against two turnovers in 37 minutes at No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30).
- He did not play against Saint Francis (Nov. 25). Felix was nursing a left foot injury but was available to play.
- Felix posted 11 points, four rebounds and three assists in 27 minutes off the bench against No. nr/25 Iowa (Nov. 20).

RIDLEY RISES

Junior center **Cameron Ridley** returns for his third season in the frontcourt. He has played in 76 career games (62 starts). Ridley earned USBWA All-District VII Team and All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades and was named to the Big 12 All-Defensive Team last year. He also shared the team’s Most Improved Player award in 2013-14. Ridley led the team in rebounding (8.2 rpg), blocks (76) and double-doubles (10) and ranked fourth on the team in scoring (11.2 ppg) in 25.6 minutes per game as a sophomore. He hit the game-winning putback against Arizona State at the buzzer in the NCAA Second Round. In his career, Ridley has reached double figures in scoring 23 times and in rebounds 16 times and has 11 career double-doubles.

- Ridley posted 16 points (7-of-8 FG), five boards and three blocks in 19 minutes against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).

LAMMERT PLAYING A LARGER ROLE

Junior **Connor Lammert** returns for his third season in the frontcourt. He has played in all 77 career games (21 starts) during his first three seasons. Lammert ranked third on the team in rebounding (5.2 rpg), fourth in blocks (17) and sixth in scoring (5.8 ppg) while averaging 20.7 minutes per contest as a sophomore. In his career, he has reached double figures in scoring eight times and in rebounds three times.

- Lammert leads the squad with 18 assists against just eight turnovers through the first eight games.** He also ranks third on the team in rebounding (6.8 rpg).
- He tied a season high with nine rebounds (four offensive) in 34 minutes at No. 1/1 Kentucky (Dec. 5).
- Lammert tallied 11 points (3-of-4 FG, 4-of-4 FT) and six boards in 24 minutes against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).
- He posted six points and nine rebounds in 30 minutes against Cal (Nov. 21).
- Lammert set a career high with seven assists without a turnover to go along with eight points in 17 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16). Six of his seven assists came in the first half.

TAYLOR INJURY UPDATE

Sophomore point guard **Isaiah Taylor** suffered a left wrist injury during the win against Iowa (Nov. 20). He is out indefinitely (no timetable for his return but this is not a season-ending injury).

TAYLOR TIDBITS

Isaiah Taylor started the first 38 games of his career prior to suffering his wrist injury against Iowa (Nov. 20). Taylor earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and Big 12 All-Newcomer Team accolades as a freshman. He led the team in assists (4.0 apg) and minutes (30.1 mpg) and ranked second in scoring (12.7 ppg) and steals (37) last season. Taylor had five 20-point performances and reached double figures in scoring a team-best 27 times as a freshman. He sported a 141-to-83 (1.7-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and dished out at least five assists in a game 15 times last year.

- Taylor reached double figures in scoring in each of UT's first three games this year. He averaged 15.0 ppg to go along with 4.0 rpg and 3.0 apg in 25.0 mpg while hitting 16-of-30 (.533) field goals, including 4-of-8 threes, and 9-of-11 (.818) free throws.**
- He recorded 15 points (11 in second half) against Iowa (Nov. 20).
- Taylor posted a game-high 18 points (6-of-11 FG, 2-of-3 threes, 4-of-4 FT) and seven rebounds (one shy of career high) in 28 minutes against North Dakota State (Nov. 14). Sixteen of his 18 points came in the second half.
- He appeared on a regional cover of *Sports Illustrated* in early November. Texas was one of five schools selected for a regional

cover in the magazine's annual College Basketball Preview issue, joining Arizona, Duke, Kentucky and Wisconsin.

- Taylor was one of 36 players named to the preseason watch list of candidates for the 2015 Bob Cousy Collegiate Point Guard of the Year Award. The annual honor recognizes the top point guards in men's college basketball.
- Taylor has been named (along with Myles Turner) to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's Preseason Top 50 (Nov. 17) and the Naismith Trophy Men's 50 Watch List (Dec. 3).

TURNER OFF TO SOLID START

Freshman forward **Myles Turner** leads the team in blocked shots (23 total, 2.9 bpg) and ranks second in scoring (11.4 ppg) and rebounding (6.9 rpg) through the first eight contests. He has converted 29-of-57 (.509) field goals and 29-of-34 (.853) free throws while averaging 19.9 mpg coming off the bench.

- Turner has recorded at least five blocked shots in three of his first eight contests.**
- He posted 18 points (14-of-17 FT), 10 rebounds (six offensive) and five blocks in 22 minutes against UT Arlington (Dec. 2).
- Turner registered seven points, five boards and five blocks in 19 minutes at No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30).
- He had 10 points (4-of-7 FG), seven boards and six blocks in 20 minutes against Alcorn State (Nov. 16). His six blocks were one shy of the UT freshman mark (shared by Chris Mihm and Tristan Thompson).
- Turner tallied 15 points (6-of-8 FG, 3-of-4 FT), six rebounds and two blocks in 20 minutes against North Dakota State (Nov. 14). The 15 points were just five shy of the UT record for most in a collegiate debut (20 by Kevin Durant in 2006-07). His two blocks were just one shy of the UT record for most in a collegiate debut (3 by both Cameron Ridley and Damion James).
- Turner has been named (along with Isaiah Taylor) to the John R. Wooden Award presented by Wendy's Preseason Top 50 (Nov. 17) and the Naismith Trophy Men's 50 Watch List (Dec. 3).

TURNER'S RECORD NIGHT

Myles Turner recorded his first career double-double with 25 points (11-of-12 FG, 3-of-3 threes), 10 rebounds, three blocks, two assists and one steal in 25 minutes during the home win against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).

- Turner tied the UT single-game record for highest FG percentage (min. 10 attempts). He converted 11-of-12 (.917) field goal attempts. That tied the mark set by Butch Skeete at SMU on Feb. 6, 1962 (11-of-12 FG).

TURNER'S SUMMER VACATION

Myles Turner was a member of the USA Under-18 National Team which won the gold medal at the 2014 FIBA Americas U18 Championship in June in Colorado Springs, Colo. Turner set a USA U18 competition record with 18 total blocks during the five-game tournament.

YANCY'S YOUTH

Sophomore **Kendal Yancy** returns for his second year in the backcourt. He has played in 42 games (11 starts) in his first two seasons. Yancy averaged 7.5 points, 3.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists while hitting 3-of-4 threes in 19.5 minutes per game during UT's two contests at last year's Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.

- **Yancy ranks fifth on the team in assists (12) through the first eight contests.**
- He tied his career high in rebounds (six) and added nine points (3-of-5 FG, 2-of-2 FT) and two assists in 30 minutes against UT Arlington (Dec. 2).
- Yancy tied his career high with six rebounds (four offensive) in 17 minutes at No. 1/1 Kentucky (Dec. 5).
- He started and tied his career high in points (12) and rebounds (six) while setting career highs in field goals made (5-of-10) and minutes (34) against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).
- Yancy recorded a career-high four assists without a turnover in 17 minutes against North Dakota State (Nov. 14).

- Croaker posted two points, three boards and two assists in 23 minutes against Saint Francis (Nov. 25).

TRIO OF FRESH FACES

- Freshman forward **Jordan Barnett** was tabbed the No. 86 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year at Christian Brothers College High School (St. Louis, Mo.). Barnett averaged 20.8 points, 8.2 rebounds and nearly two blocks per game while leading CBC to a 25-7 record and the Missouri Class 5 state championship as a senior. He recorded 43 points, 20 rebounds and three blocks in the 86-77 overtime win against Columbia Hickman in the state title game.

- Junior forward **Shaquille Cleare** (pronounced **CLAIR**) spent his first two years at Maryland before transferring to Texas prior to the fall semester. He will sit out the 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules. Cleare will have two years of eligibility remaining, beginning with the 2015-16 season. He was tabbed the No. 30 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year at The Village School (Houston, Texas). Cleare was a high school teammate of UT guard **Isaiah Taylor** during Cleare's senior season (Taylor's junior year).
- Freshman forward **Myles Turner** was tabbed the No. 2 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year at Euless Trinity High School (Bedford, Texas). The 16th McDonald's All-American and 11th Jordan Brand All-American in UT history, Turner also was a member of the U.S. team at the Nike Hoop Summit this past spring. He averaged 18.1 points, 12.2 rebounds and 6.8 blocks per game as a senior while leading Trinity to a 24-7 record.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last five years (2010-14). The awards are given to teams scoring in the Top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1,000 score in each of the last five multi-year APR reports. In addition, Men's Basketball has posted perfect 1,000 APR single-year scores in EVERY season dating back to 2005-06 (eight consecutive years).
- The Men's Basketball team's semester GPA in Spring 2014 was a 3.33 (4.0 scale), the highest single-semester team GPA in program history. The team entered the 2014 Fall semester with a cumulative GPA of 3.20.
- UT led the Big 12 Conference in the number of Academic All-Big 12 selections in men's basketball for four consecutive years (2008-11). Texas had six players earn the accolade in both 2008 and 2009 and five players claim a spot in 2010. The Horns also had four selections on the 2011 squad.
- Four UT players earned a spot on the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team. **Connor Lammert** was named to the First Team, while **Javan Felix**, **Demarcus Holland** and **Prince Ibeh** were each selected to the Second Team.

THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Saturday's contest having hit at least one 3-pointer in 799 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three-pointer in 927 of 933 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one three-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

COACH OF THE YEAR, AGAIN

Rick Barnes was tabbed the Big 12 Coach of the Year in 2013-14 by the league's coaches. This marked the fourth time that Barnes has claimed the honor (1999, 2003, 2008 and 2014), tying Kansas' Bill Self for most Coach of the Year accolades in Big 12 history.

SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12 UNDER BARNES

Since head coach Rick Barnes took over the Longhorns in 1998-99, Texas is the second-winningest team in regular season Big 12 Conference games over the last 16 years with 178 wins.

CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the first 16 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

BEATING THE BEST

UT's win at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, 2011 equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. Six of Texas' nine all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come during the Rick Barnes era.

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Despite a young roster last year that featured only one scholarship junior and no seniors, **Texas went 11-3 in 2013-14 in games decided by seven points or less.** This mark included an 86-83 win at No. 14/18 North Carolina (Dec. 18), a 67-64 home victory against No. 22 Kansas State (Jan. 21) and the 87-85 victory against Arizona State (March 20) in the NCAA Second Round - won on a **Cameron Ridley** putback as time expired.

- UT is 1-0 in games decided by seven points or less this year. Jonathan Holmes hit a 3-pointer with 2.2 seconds left to lead Texas to a 55-54 win at No. 24/22 Connecticut (Nov. 30). The Horns faced a five-point deficit (51-46) with three minutes remaining in the comeback win at Storrs.

OVERTIME SUCCESS

Texas played its only overtime game of the 2013-14 season at Temple (Dec. 7) and pulled out an 81-80 victory. The Horns have won their last four overtime contests, dating back to an 89-86 double-overtime home win against Iowa State on Feb. 13, 2013.

UT INKS GUARD DUO DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Eric Davis (Saginaw, Mich.) and **Kerwin Roach** (Houston, Texas) signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. The guard duo will join the Longhorns for the 2015-16 season.

- Davis** (6-3, 172), a guard from Saginaw Arthur Hill High School who plays under coach Greg McMath, is ranked as the No. 41 overall prospect in the nation by ESPN, No. 42 by 247Sports and No. 53 by Rivals.com. He averaged 27 points, five rebounds, four assists and three steals per game in his junior year while leading Arthur Hill to the Saginaw Valley League championship. Davis earned Michigan Class A Player of the Year honors as a junior.
- Roach** (6-3, 160), a guard from Houston's North Shore High School who plays under coach David Green, is ranked as the No. 35 overall prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and No. 71 by 247Sports. He averaged a team-best 16.1 points per game as a junior while leading North Shore to a 33-3 record and the Class 5A state title. Roach also claimed the 5A state championship in the triple jump last May in Austin.

- **Shaquille Cleare's** father, Brian, played basketball at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma (Chickasha, Okla.). He wears jersey No. 32 to honor his father, who also wore No. 32 during his collegiate playing days. Cleare was high school teammates with **Isaiah Taylor** at The Village School (Houston), when Cleare was a senior and Taylor was a junior.
- **Damarcus Croaker** became a father on Feb. 4, 2014. His girlfriend, Amber Shazier (pronounced: SHAY-zure), gave birth to their son – Damarcus Dewayne Croaker, Jr. – at 1:27 a.m. in Orlando, Fla. Damarcus, Jr. checked in at 5 pounds, 12 ounces.

- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Jonathan Holmes'** father, Daryl, played football at the University of Nebraska (lettered in 1980 as a defensive end).
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a senior on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Tarale Murry** is the cousin of former UT basketball player Ivan Wagner and former UT football player Wane McGarity.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). Year 17 at Texas

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 17th season at Texas. He has compiled nearly 600 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 21 NCAA and three NIT trips.

- UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the 16 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 15 of Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin.

- UT owns a 33-18 (.647) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

- Barnes had a personal streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped during the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
