NOTABLES

- **LOOKING FOR 20 WINS ... AGAIN**
With a victory in Saturday's home game against West Virginia, the Longhorns would secure a 20-win season for the 14th time in 16 years under coach Rick Barnes.
- **FELIX GETS HOT FROM DISTANCE**
Sophomore guard **Javan Felix** had one of his better long-range shooting performances during Tuesday's home win against Oklahoma State. Felix recorded a game-high 27 points (one shy of his career high) while setting a career high in three-point field goals made (6-of-8).
- **RIDLEY SEES DOUBLE**
Sophomore center **Cameron Ridley** posted his sixth double-double of the year (third in Big 12 play) with a 12-point, 13-rebound effort in Tuesday's victory against Oklahoma State. The 13 rebounds were one shy of his career high. In league play, Ridley is averaging 11.0 points, a team-best 9.2 rebounds and 2.2 blocks per game while converting 53.3% (40-of-75) from the field.

TEXAS VS. WEST VIRGINIA

- Five of the six games between Texas and West Virginia have been decided by four points or less, including one in overtime. The cumulative series score is 420-412 in favor of Texas.
- The six previous meetings between Texas and West Virginia have been decided by a combined 22 points, and all but the previous contest on Jan. 13, 2014, has come down to the final possession. The largest margin of victory in the series came in the most recent 80-69 win by Texas in Morgantown.
- UT's most memorable win in the series came in a 74-71 victory courtesy of a Kenton Paulino three-pointer at the buzzer in the 2006 NCAA "Sweet 16" in Atlanta.
- The Longhorns and Mountaineers have met just once before in the Frank Erwin Center (Jan. 9, 2013) when West Virginia prevailed 57-53 in overtime.

SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12 UNDER BARNES

Since head coach Rick Barnes took over the Longhorns in 1998-99, Texas is the second-winningest team in regular season Big 12 Conference games over the last 16 years with 175 wins.

NIGHT AND DAY

Through 24 games last year, the Longhorns had posted a 11-13 overall record, including a 3-8 mark in Big 12 Conference play. This season, the Horns are off to a 19-5 start, including an 8-3 mark in league play.

BUILDING A SOLID RESUME

The Longhorns have posted a 5-2 record against AP Top 25 opponents this year. **UT's resume includes road wins against No. 14 North Carolina (86-83) and No. 24 Baylor (74-60) and home victories against No. 8 Iowa State (86-76), No. 22 Kansas State (67-64) and No. 6 Kansas (81-69).** Texas owns a 6-3 record in away/neutral-site games this season.

A CHECK OF THE POLLS

Texas is ranked No. 19 in the most recent Associated Press poll (Feb. 10) and No. 19 in the most recent USA Today Coaches poll (Feb. 10). During the Rick Barnes era, the Horns have spent 178 weeks in The AP Top 25, including 84 in the Top 10.

WHAT'S IN A WIN

- A win would mark the **1,694th** victory in program history.
- A win would mark head coach Rick Barnes' **378th** victory at Texas and his **580th** victory all-time as a head coach.
- A win would improve UT's record to **20-5**, marking the program's best 25-game start to a season since 2010-11 (started 22-3). It would also mark the **sixth** time in the Rick Barnes era (last 16 years) that the Horns have opened the year with at least 20 wins in their first 25 contests (22-3 in 2005-06, 2010-11; 21-4 in 2003-04, 2007-08; 20-5 in 2009-10).

OKLAHOMA STATE POSTGAME NOTES

- UT posted a 40-34 advantage on the glass. Texas has outrebounded 19 of its first 24 opponents and is 16-3 in those games.
- The Horns held the Cowboys to a 35.6 percent (21-of-59) from the field. Texas is 15-0 when holding opponents under 40 percent this year.
- Texas' 54 points in the first half were its most in any half this season.
- UT's eight first-half 3-pointers were the most in any half this season. Texas finished with 11 made 3-pointers to tie its season best.
- Texas shot 85.7 percent from the line in the first half (12-of-14) and finished shooting 77.4 percent (24-of-31).
- UT's 21-point halftime lead (54-33) was the largest by the Horns at the break all season.
- **Javan Felix** set a career high in three-point field goals made (6-of-8), topping his previous high of four vs. Texas State (12-14-13). He reached the 20-point mark (27 points, one shy of career high) for the third time this season and fifth time in his career (57 games). Felix also reached double figures in scoring for the 15th time this season and 24th time in his career.
- **Prince Ibeh** matched his career high in steals with two.
- In his second start of the season, **Connor Lammert** set career highs in three-point field goals made (3-of-6) and minutes (34). He finished one point and one rebound shy of recording his first collegiate double-double (nine points, nine boards).

(OKLAHOMA STATE NOTES CONT.)

- **Cameron Ridley** recorded his sixth double-double (12 points, 13 rebounds) of the season and seventh in his career (57 games). It also marked his third double-double in Big 12 play this year. He set a career high in free throws made (10-of-12) and reached double figures in scoring for the 13th time this season and 15th time in his career. Ridley reached double figures in rebounding for the ninth time this year and 12th time in his career.
- **Isaiah Taylor** reached double figures in scoring (16 points) for the fifth straight game and 19th time this year (24 games). Over the last five games, Taylor is averaging 18.8 ppg (31-of-69 FG, 31-of-34 FT) in 34.4 mpg.
- **Martez Walker** set a career high in scoring (12 points) and tied his career high in field goals made (4-of-6) and three-point field goals made (2-of-3). He reached double figures in scoring for the third time this year (23 games).

WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

Texas is 6-1 this season in games decided by three points or less. This mark includes an 86-83 win at No. 14/18 North Carolina (Dec. 18) and a 67-64 home victory against No. 22 Kansas State (Jan. 21).

LOOKING FOR 20 WINS ... AGAIN

With a win on Saturday against West Virginia, the Longhorns would reach the 20-win mark for the 14th time in 16 seasons under coach Rick Barnes. UT had a school-record streak of 13 consecutive 20-win seasons snapped last year. Prior to that streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92). The Longhorns have reached the 20-win plateau a total of 28 times in their previous 107 seasons of basketball.

THE LONGHORNS AT HOME

Texas is in its 37th year of play in the Frank Erwin Center. The Longhorns have registered an all-time record of 446-104 (.811) in the building. Since Rick Barnes arrived in Austin, UT has recorded a 221-32 (.874) mark at the Erwin Center including a 104-24 (.813) record in Big 12 Conference home games. Texas is 175-21 (.893) at the Erwin Center in the last 12 seasons (dating to the start of the 2002-03 season).

HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

- Texas defeated four consecutive AP Top 25 opponents in four consecutive games for the first time in school history (No. 8 Iowa State on Jan. 18, No. 22 Kansas State on Jan. 21, at No. 24/23 Baylor on Jan. 25, No. 6 Kansas on Feb. 1).
- The Longhorns became just the second team in NCAA Division I since the 1996-97 season to record four straight wins against AP Top 25 teams in four consecutive games. Kansas accomplished the feat earlier this year, while North Carolina achieved the milestone in 1996-97.
- UT tied a school record by winning its fourth consecutive game against an AP Top 25 opponent. The Longhorns won four straight (in a five-game span) against AP Top 25 opponents during the 2010-11 season (No. 11 Texas A&M on Jan. 19, at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, No. 11 Missouri on Jan. 29, at No. 16 Texas A&M on Jan. 31).
- When UT faced No. 6 Kansas last Saturday, it marked the first time in program history that the Longhorns had played four consecutive games against AP Top 25 foes.
- This marks the first time Texas has defeated two AP Top 10 opponents at home in a season since the 2002-03 Final Four year. UT defeated No. 9 Oklahoma State (78-65) on Feb. 1, 2003. Texas also defeated No. 5 Oklahoma (67-61) on Feb. 10, 2003.

HORNS END SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK

After starting league play with an 0-2 mark, the Longhorns responded with seven consecutive Big 12 wins, including four against ranked opponents in No. 8 Iowa State, No. 22 Kansas State, No. 24 Baylor and No. 6 Kansas. During the streak, Texas hit 70.0% from the free throw line and held its opponents to a combined 38.3% FG shooting, including a 28.7% mark (41-of-143) from three-point range. Texas' streak ended in a 74-57 loss at Kansas State (Feb. 8).

DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINNING AND LOSING

In their three Big 12 Conference losses, the Longhorns allowed an average of 83.0 points per game on a combined 47.0% FG shooting (78-of-166), including a 43.6% mark from three-point range (24-of-55). **In its eight league wins, Texas has allowed an average of 65.5 points per game on a combined 38.0% FG shooting (178-of-469), including a 29.5% mark from three-point range (46-of-156).**

BLOCK PARTY

Entering Saturday's contest against West Virginia (through games as of Feb. 9), UT is ranked 11th nationally in blocked shots per game (6.3 bpg). The Horns have recorded at least seven blocks in 13 of their first 24 games. UT registered a season-high 12 blocks it wins against UT Arlington (Nov. 29) and No. 6 Kansas (Feb. 1), just one shy of the single-game team record.

- On the season, UT has posted a 147-86 advantage in blocked shots.
- Texas has had at least 11 blocks in a game three times this season (11 vs. Houston Baptist, 12 vs. UT Arlington and No. 6 Kansas).
- UT tied a school record for most blocks in a half with 9 in the second half against No. 6/7 Kansas (Feb. 1). This matched the mark of nine blocks against Kansas State in the second half on Feb. 3, 2007.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas has outrebounded 19 of its first 24 opponents this season while posting double-digit rebound advantages in nine of its first 24 games. For the season, UT owns a +7.8 rebound margin (42.0-34.2).

- UT posted double-digit rebound margins against South Alabama (40-30), Stephen F. Austin (41-26), Houston Baptist (52-33), Temple (55-42), Rice (42-29), Oklahoma State (45-33), West Virginia (49-30) and TCU (56-25).
- The Longhorns recorded a season-high 56 rebounds in the win at TCU (Feb. 4), including a season-best 25 offensive boards. Jonathan Holmes' game-high 16 rebounds (six offensive) were the most this season by a Longhorn.
- **UT posted a 56-25 advantage on the glass at TCU (Feb. 4). Texas' +31 rebounding margin was its fourth-highest single-game mark in school history (since 1961-62).**

TAYLOR HITTING HIS STRIDE

Freshman point guard Isaiah Taylor has averaged 13.7 ppg and 2.7 rpg while recording 29 assists against 20 turnovers in 32.8 minutes per game over the last nine contests.

- Recorded a team-high 14 points (5-of-9 FG, 4-of-4 FT) and added four assists against just two turnovers in the win against Texas Tech (Jan. 8).
- At West Virginia (Jan. 13), he reached double-figure scoring with 10 points, pulled down a season-best eight rebounds and dished out a team-high four assists against just two turnovers in the win.
- He reached double figures in scoring (12 points) for the 14th time this season (18 games), shot 9-of-12 from the line and dished out three assists in the win against No. 8/10 Iowa State (Jan. 18).

DID YOU KNOW?

Facts on the Texas Basketball program

- Texas is one of just 13 schools to have advanced to at least the "Sweet 16" of the NCAA Tournament in five of the last 12 years, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).
- Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Rick Barnes era, the Longhorns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).
- Texas is the only school in the country that can claim two different National Player of the Year winners in the last 11 seasons (T.J. Ford in 2003; Kevin Durant in 2007).

- At No. 24 Baylor (Jan. 25), Taylor set a career high with 27 points (previous: 17 vs. Mercer, Nov. 8) and reached double figures in scoring for the 15th time in his career (20 games). Taylor was one point shy of matching the top individual game by a Longhorn this season (Javan Felix – 28 vs. Oklahoma, Jan. 4).
- Reached the 20-point mark (23) for the second straight game and second time this year (21 games) in Texas' 81-69 win over No. 6 Kansas. He was named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week (Feb. 3) for his performance against the Jayhawks.
- In the win at TCU (Feb. 4), he dished out a game-high seven assists, his most in Big 12 play and one shy of his career best, and reached double figures in scoring (11 points) for the 18th time this season.
- Went 7-of-7 from the free-throw line at Kansas State (Feb. 8) for his fifth perfect performance from the line this year. He ended the game with a team-high 17 points.
- Reached double figures in scoring (16 points) for the fifth straight game and 19th time this year in the 87-68 win over Oklahoma State (Feb. 11).
- **Over the last five games, Taylor is averaging 18.8 ppg (31-of-69 FG, 31-of-34 FT) in 34.4 mpg.**

IMPROVEMENT AT THE LINE

Texas has been an improved free throw shooting team during its first 11 league contests. **The Horns have converted 209-of-292 (.716) free throws in Big 12 games after hitting 63.1% (251-of-398) from the stripe during their first 13 non-conference contests.** In its last nine games, Texas has converted 180-of-249 (.723) free throws.

RIDLEY AND IBEH MAKE IMPROVEMENTS AT THE LINE

Leading Texas' marked improvement at the free-throw line has been the big man duo of sophomores **Cameron Ridley** and **Prince Ibeh**. In the last 13 games, Ridley has improved nearly 15 percent to 70.1 (54-77) compared to 55.6 (35-63) during the first 11 games of the season. Ibeh has increased his average to 65.0 (13-20) in Texas' last 12 games.

DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 259 of their 537 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 233-26 (.900) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat (15-0 mark this season).** UT has held its first 24 opponents to an average of 69.8 ppg on 39.7 percent FG shooting.

- UT has held 15 of its first 24 opponents this year to under 40% FG shooting.
- Texas held Rice to a 29.1 field goal percentage (16-of-55), marking the lowest percentage it has held an opponent to this season. The Longhorns also held Rice to team season lows in points (44), field goals made (16-of-55) and FG percentage (.291).
- Texas made a season-high 12 steals in its loss to BYU (Nov. 25).
- Against UTA (Nov. 29), the Horns rejected a season-high 12 shots (one shy of the team's single-game record).
- UT held West Virginia (Jan. 13) to just 16.0 (4-of-25) percent from beyond the arc, a season-low 3FG percentage for a Texas opponent.

- Texas limited Baylor (Jan. 25) to a season low in points (60) and to a 3-of-17 (.176) mark from three-point range. The 3 three-pointers were the fewest made by a UT opponent this year.
- Texas' 12 blocks against Kansas (Feb. 1) matched a season high (UTA, Nov. 29) and were one shy of the school single-game record (13, twice). It also tied the UT record for most blocks in a Big 12 game (fifth time in Big 12 play, last was Feb. 8, 2010 vs. No. 1 Kansas).
- Texas has had 10+ blocks three times this season.

PROTECTING THE ROCK

Texas has been an improved team when it comes to protecting the basketball through the first 24 contests this year. Last season, the Horns averaged 14.7 turnovers per game and recorded a 391-to-500 assist-to-turnover ratio on the year. This season, Texas is averaging just 12.9 turnovers per contest and sports a 287-to-309 assist-to-turnover ratio. The Horns committed a season-low eight turnovers in their win against No. 8/10 Iowa State (Jan. 18).

COMEBACK HORNS

The Longhorns have rallied for second-half comeback wins in seven of their first 19 victories.

- UT overcame a nine-point deficit (62-53) with 9:44 left against Mercer (Nov. 8), going on a 23-11 run to close the game.
- The Horns also trailed South Alabama (Nov. 12) by 10 points (64-54) at the 11:51 mark, before closing the contest on a 30-13 run.
- In the win against SFA (Nov. 15), UT faced a five-point deficit (40-35) with 16:31 left. Tied at 60-60 at the 3:10 mark, the Horns closed the game with a 12-2 spurt.
- Texas trailed by nine points (60-51) with 8:43 left against UT Arlington (Nov. 29) before rallying for a 21-9 run to close out the contest.
- UT trailed by three (73-70) with 2:31 left in the second half at Temple (Dec. 7). The Horns rallied back to force overtime and pulled out an 81-80 win. UT trailed 80-78 with 14 seconds left in overtime, before Javan Felix knocked down a 3-pointer with eight seconds left that proved to be the game-winner.
- The Horns trailed by one (64-63) against Texas Tech (Jan. 11) with 1:19 left before Cameron Ridley knocked down the game-tying and game-winning free throws with 31 seconds remaining.
- In the win at TCU (Feb. 4), UT trailed by four (32-28) with 15:27 remaining in the second half. The Longhorns outscored the Horned Frogs 31-22 down the stretch en route to a 59-54 victory.

LOOKING TO GET BACK TO THE BIG DANCE

Last year, Texas had its streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances snapped at 14. Prior to that, UT had advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of Rick Barnes' first 14 seasons in Austin (1999-2012). Prior to the Barnes era, UT's previous mark for consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances was four (set twice).

AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA "Sweet 16" a total of five times in the last 12 years (2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008). The Longhorns are one of just 13 schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).

CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the first 15 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

BEATING THE BEST

UT's win at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, 2011 equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. Six of Texas' nine all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come during the Rick Barnes era.

FELIX'S CAREER NIGHT

Sophomore guard **Javan Felix** posted a career-high 28 points (10-of-19 FG, 6-of-8 FT) off the bench against Oklahoma (Jan. 4). Felix also set a career high in FT made (6-of-8) and recorded five assists against just one turnover in 31 minutes.

THE FELIX FILE

The top returning scorer from last season's team (6.8 ppg), sophomore guard **Javan Felix** ranks third on the team in scoring (12.3 ppg) and assists (2.9 apg). He missed the game at TCU (Feb. 4) due to symptoms of a concussion suffered in the final minutes against Kansas (Feb. 1). The New Orleans native has played in 57 career games (33 starts).

HOLMES LEADING BY CONSISTENT EXAMPLE

The most experienced player on this year's roster, junior forward **Jonathan Holmes** leads the team in scoring (13.1 ppg), ranks second on the team in rebounding (7.4 rpg) and third on the team in blocks (28) while averaging 24.1 minutes per game this season. Holmes missed the game against UTA (Nov. 29) due to the death of his grandmother, and he did not play against Oklahoma State (Feb. 11) due to a right knee injury. He has played in 85 career games (68 starts) and has reached double figures in scoring 35 times and in rebounds nine times. Last year as a sophomore, he led the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg) despite averaging just 20.5 minutes per game.

- Holmes has reached double figures in scoring in 17 of his first 22 games. For the season, he has converted 95-of-185 (.514) field goals, including 22-of-56 (.393) from three-point range, and 77-of-99 (.778) free throws.
- Holmes has recorded five career double-doubles, including four this season (vs. BYU - 10 pts. and 10 rebs., at UNC - 15 pts. and 10 rebs.), at OSU - 10 pts. and 12 rebs., at TCU - 20 pts. and 16 rebs.)

RIDLEY RISES

Sophomore center **Cameron Ridley** has started all 24 games this year and leads the team in rebounding (8.1 rpg) and blocked shots (55) and ranks fourth in scoring (10.9 ppg) while averaging 25.4 mpg. He played in 33 of 34 games (19 starts) as a freshman and led the team in blocked shots (47) and ranked fourth in rebounding (4.3 rpg) while averaging 16.4 minutes per contest last year.

- He has reached double figures in scoring 13 times this season and 15 times in his career (57 games).
- Scored a career-high 22 points (8-of-10 FG, 6-of-8 FT) against Texas State (Dec. 14).
- Has recorded at least three blocks nine times this season.

LAMMERT PLAYING A LARGER ROLE

Sophomore forward **Connor Lammert** ranks fourth on the team in rebounding (4.9 rpg) and sixth in scoring (5.7 ppg) in 19.5 minutes per game while hitting 51-of-105 (.486) field goals, including 12-of-34 threes (.353), and 22-of-32 (.688) free throws through the first 24 contests. He also ranks fourth on the team in blocked shots (11). By comparison, Lammert averaged 4.5 points and 4.2 rebounds in 21.0 minutes per game while hitting 48.1 percent (64-of-133) from the floor last year.

- Against Houston Baptist (Nov. 18), he scored a season-high 13 points, added a game-high nine rebounds and tied his career high in 3-pointers made (2-of-2).

- All four freshmen have earned starting nods through the first 24 games. Taylor has started all 24 games at point guard. Yancy has started 10, while Croaker (BYU and DePaul) and Walker (vs. Texas Tech, at TCU) have each made two starts.
- The four frosh made an impact during the team's season-opening victory against Mercer. All four freshmen scored and combined to post 28 points (8-of-15 FG, 3-of-4 threes, 9-of-15 FT), eight rebounds and two assists in 58 minutes.

TAYLOR TIDBITS

Freshman **Isaiah Taylor** has earned the starting nod at point guard in each of the first 24 games to start his collegiate career. He leads the team in assists (3.6 apg), is second in scoring (12.5 ppg), minutes (29.7 mpg) and steals (22). Taylor sports an 86-to-59 (1.5-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio and also averages 3.1 rebounds per game. He has reached double figures in scoring in 19 of the first 24 contests. Taylor was rated as the No. 13 prospect in the state of Texas by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 17.6 points, 10.8 assists and 6.0 steals per game while leading his team to a 23-5 mark as a senior.

- In his first collegiate game, Taylor posted a team-high 17 points (4-of-10 FG, 9-of-14 FT) to go along with three rebounds and two assists in 29 minutes.
- The 17 points marked the sixth-highest scoring output by a UT player in his freshman debut and just three shy of the record held by Kevin Durant (20 vs. Alcorn State on Nov. 9, 2006).

- Pulled down a career-high eight rebounds in Texas' 80-69 win at West Virginia (Jan. 13).
- Shot 9-of-12 from the line and dished out three assists in Texas' 86-76 win over No. 8/10 Iowa State (Jan. 18).
- Set a career high with 27 points and reached double figures in scoring for the 15th time in his career (20 games) at Baylor (Jan. 25). He was named the Athlon Sports National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 27) following the win over the Bears.
- He reached the 20-point mark (23) for the second straight game and second time this year (21 games) in the win over No. 6 Kansas.
- Named the Phillips 66 Big 12 Rookie of the Week (Feb. 3) following his performance against the Jayhawks.
- **Over the last five games, Taylor is averaging 18.8 ppg (31-of-69 FG, 31-of-34 FT) in 34.4 mpg during the stretch.**

TAYLOR'S CAREER DAY

Sophomore guard **Isaiah Taylor** set a career high with 27 points (10-of-18 FG, 7-of-8 FT) in Texas' 74-60 win at No. 24 Baylor (Jan. 25). He reached double figures in scoring for the 15th time in his career (20 games) and was one point shy of matching the top individual game by a Longhorn this season (Javan Felix – 28 vs. Oklahoma, Jan. 4). Taylor was named the Athlon Sports National Freshman of the Week (Jan. 27) for his efforts.

WALKER'S WAY

For the year, freshman **Martez Walker** is averaging 3.4 points, 1.8 rebounds and 11.1 minutes per game, while shooting 28-of-66 (.424) from the field. Walker was ranked as the No. 8 player in the state of Michigan by ESPN.com following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 20.4 points and seven rebounds per game while leading his team to a 25-1 mark and the Michigan Class A state quarterfinals as a senior.

- Scored 10 points against Houston Baptist (Nov. 18) in 18 minutes and did the same in 19 minutes at West Virginia (Jan. 13).
- Against Rice, he set season highs in rebounds (5) and minutes (21) and tied his season high in 3-pointers made (2-of-3).
- Made his first career start against Texas Tech (Jan. 11) and matched his season high in rebounds with five.
- Made his second career start in the win at TCU (Feb. 4) where he scored five points and registered three rebounds in 26 minutes.
- Set a career high in scoring (12 points) and tied his career high in field goals made (4-of-6) and three-point field goals made (2-of-3) in the 87-68 win over Oklahoma State (Feb. 11).

CROAKER'S CREDENTIALS

Freshman **Damarcus Croaker** has played in all 24 games, including starts against BYU and DePaul. For the season, he is averaging 4.3 points per game. Croaker was ranked as the No. 105 prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and tabbed the No. 6 prospect in the state of Florida following his senior year. He averaged a team-best 23.9 ppg and paced his team to the 2013 Florida High School Athletic Association regional quarterfinals.

- In his first career start (vs. BYU, Nov. 25), he finished with a season-high 14 points. He also knocked down a season-high 3 three-pointers.
- Against Oklahoma, he set season highs in points (15), three-pointers made (5-of-8) and minutes played (26).
- In Big 12 play, he is averaging 4.2 ppg (eighth on the team) while converting 16-of-41 FG (.390), including 10-of-29 threes (.345), in 10.5 mpg.

YANCY'S YOUTH

Freshman **Kendal Yancy** has started 10 games (Houston Baptist, UT Arlington, Vanderbilt, Temple, Texas State, North Carolina, Michigan State, Rice, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State) this season. Through 23 contests, Yancy is averaging 3.7 points and shooting 41.4 percent (29-of-70) in 13.3 minutes per game. Yancy was ranked as the No. 85 prospect nationally in the ESPN100 following his senior year. He averaged 12.2 points, 6.6 rebounds and 7.8 assists per game while leading his team to a 33-6 record and a trip to the Texas 5A state semifinals as a senior.

- Off the bench against DePaul (Nov. 26), Yancy reached double figures for the first time in his career (10) while setting season highs in field goals made (4-of-7) and minutes played (23).
- Against Vanderbilt, he set a season high in points (11) and rebounds (6) while tying his season high in field goals made with 4-of-6. He reached double figures in scoring for the second time in his career.
- Played a season-high 25 minutes against Temple (Dec. 7).
- Matched his season high in rebounds with six in 10 minutes of action against No. 8/10 Iowa State (Jan. 18).

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last four years (2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013). The awards are given each year to teams scoring in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1.000 score in each of the last four multi-year APR reports. In seven of the last eight years, two or more student-athletes have represented Texas on the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team.

BARNETT COMMITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

Jordan Barnett (St. Louis, Mo.) has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. He will join the Longhorns for the 2014-15 season.

- **Barnett** (6-7, 190), a forward from Christian Brothers College High School who played under coach Bob McCormack, is ranked as the No. 83 prospect in the nation by ESPN and No. 101 by Rivals.com. As a junior last season, Barnett led CBC with 17.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game while hitting 37.6 percent of his three-point attempts. In his sophomore year, he helped the Cadets to the Class 5 quarterfinals by leading the team with 14.2 points, 6.8 boards and 1.7 blocked shots per game. Barnett also knocked down a team-high 48 three-pointers and led the team with a 48.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc.

THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter Saturday's game having hit at least one 3-pointer in 780 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 908 of 914 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

OFF THE COURT WITH THE HORNS

- **Brandon Allums** served as a practice player for the Texas women's basketball team last season.
- **Damarcus Croaker** became a father on Feb. 4, 2014. His girlfriend, Amber Shazier (pronounced: SHAY-zure), gave birth to their son – Damarcus Dewayne Croaker, Jr. – at 1:27 a.m. in Orlando, Fla. Damarcus, Jr. checked in at 5 pounds, 12 ounces.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a sophomore on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets. Harris is currently playing for the Erie BayHawks of the NBA Developmental League.

Year 16 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 16th season at Texas. He has compiled over 500 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 20 NCAA and three NIT trips.

• UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' 15 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 10 times in the 15 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 14 of Barnes' first 15 seasons in Austin.

• UT owns a 33-18 (.647) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

• Barnes carried a streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances into the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
