### NOTABLES

#### • QUITE A TURNAROUND

Last year, the Longhorns suffered through a 16-18 season (7-11 Big 12, seventh) and did not advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 15 years under Rick Barnes (streak of 14 consecutive NCAA tourney appearances). This season, the Horns have posted a 23-10 record, including an 11-7 mark and tie for third place in the Big 12 Conference.

#### • WINNING THE FIRST ONE

Since the NCAA expanded its tourney field to 64 teams in 1985, the Longhorns are 16-6 in their opening game in the NCAA Tournament. Texas is 5-2 in its last seven NCAA opening-round contests.

#### • HOLMES LEADS BY CONSISTENT EXAMPLE

An All-Big 12 Second Team pick (coaches), junior forward **Jonathan Holmes** leads the team in scoring (13.0 ppg), ranks second in rebounding (7.2 rpg) and third in blocks (38) while averaging 23.9 minutes per contest. Holmes has reached double figures in scoring in 23 of his 30 games played, including five 20-point efforts, and has converted 51.2% of his field goal attempts this season.

### TEXAS IN THE BIG DANCE

This marks the 15th appearance in the last 16 seasons and 31st all-time appearance by the Longhorns in the NCAA Tournament. Texas sports a 34-33 (.507) record in its previous 30 trips to the Big Dance. This also marks the 23rd time in the past 26 seasons the Horns have earned a bid to the NCAA tourney.

### TOURNAMENT TESTED

To say Texas has played a schedule that prepared it for the NCAA Tournament would be an understatement. Of Texas' 33 games this year, 18 have come against teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns hold a 9-9 mark against 2014 NCAA participants: 1-0 vs. Mercer, 1-0 vs. Stephen F. Austin, 0-1 vs. BYU, 1-0 vs. North Carolina, 0-1 vs. Michigan State, 0-2 vs. Oklahoma, 1-1 vs. Oklahoma State, 1-1 vs. Iowa State, 1-1 vs. Kansas State, 2-1 vs. Baylor, 1-1 vs. Kansas).

### WINNING THE FIRST ONE

Since the NCAA expanded the tournament field to 64 teams in 1985, **the Longhorns are 16-6 in their opening game in the NCAA Tournament.** Texas has won five of its last seven NCAA tourney opening-round contests entering Thursday's game.

### AN "ELITE" PROGRAM

Texas has reached the NCAA "Elite Eight" twice in the last eight years and three times in the last 11 seasons. During the Barnes era, the Horns have made trips to the regional final in 2003 (beat Michigan State to advance to the Final Four), 2006 (lost to LSU in overtime) and 2008 (lost to Memphis).

### IN "SWEET" COMPANY

Texas has advanced to at least the NCAA "Sweet 16" a total of five times in the last 12 years (2002, 2003, 2004, 2006 and 2008). The Longhorns are one of just 13 schools to accomplish this feat, joining Duke (9), Kansas (9), Michigan State (7), Connecticut (6), Kentucky (6), North Carolina (6), Syracuse (6), Arizona (5), Pittsburgh (5), Wisconsin (6), Louisville (5) and Xavier (5).

### BARNES IN THE BIG DANCE

Texas coach Rick Barnes is no stranger to March Madness. Over the last 26 seasons in stops at Providence, Clemson and at Texas, he has now guided 21 of those teams to the NCAA Tournament. **Barnes will be making his 18th trip in the last 19 years to the Big Dance this season.** He posts an 18-14 (.563) mark at Texas in NCAA Tournament games and an overall record of 20-20 (.500) in the Big Dance. Barnes has made six trips to the "Sweet 16" in the last 17 years, including a Final Four appearance in 2003 and "Elite Eight" appearances in 2006 and 2008.

### BIG 12 CONFERENCE AWARDS

A total of five University of Texas players earned spots on the 2013-14 Phillips 66 All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Award teams, the league office announced March 9. In addition, **Rick Barnes** was named Coach of the Year for the fourth time (1999, 2003, 2008 and 2014), tying Kansas coach Bill Self for most Coach of the Year accolades in Big 12 history. Junior forward **Jonathan Holmes** earned a spot on the five-person All-Big 12 Second Team, while sophomore guard **Javan Felix**, sophomore center **Cameron Ridley** and freshman guard **Isaiah Taylor** were among 12 individuals to claim a spot on the All-Big 12 Honorable Mention Team. In addition, sophomore guard **Demarcus Holland** and Ridley were both named to the six-person Big 12 All-Defensive Team, while Taylor earned a spot on the five-person Big 12 All-Newcomer Team. The official All-Big 12 awards are selected by the league's head coaches, who are not allowed to vote for their own players.

### SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12 UNDER BARNES

Since head coach Rick Barnes took over the Longhorns in 1998-99, Texas is the second-winningest team in regular season Big 12 Conference games over the last 16 years with 178 wins.

### BUILDING A SOLID RESUME

The Longhorns have posted a 5-4 record against AP Top 25 opponents this year. **UT's resume includes road wins against No. 14 North Carolina (86-83) and No. 24 Baylor (74-60) and home victories against No. 8 Iowa State (86-76), No. 22 Kansas State (67-64) and No. 6 Kansas (81-69).**

### NIGHT AND DAY

Through 33 games last year, the Longhorns had posted a 16-17 overall record, including a 7-11 mark in Big 12 Conference play. This season, the Horns are off to a 23-10 start, including an 11-7 mark in league play.

### WHAT'S IN A WIN

- A win would mark the **1,698th** victory in program history.
- A win would mark head coach Rick Barnes' **382nd** victory at Texas and his **584th** victory all-time as a head coach.

### BAYLOR POSTGAME NOTES

- The Longhorns averaged 18.5 assists per game in two Big 12 Conference Championship games while committing only 10.5 turnovers per game.
- Texas committed a season-low six turnovers against Baylor.
- **Prince Ibeh** led Texas with three blocks. He has blocked at least three shots in a game six times this season.
- **Cameron Ridley** led Texas in rebounding (seven) for the 13th time this season.
- **Isaiah Taylor** reached double figures in scoring (16 points) for the 25th time this season and led Texas in scoring for the 10th time this season. This season, Taylor has averaged 18.7 ppg, 4.7 rpg and 5.7 apg in 33.0 mpg in three games against Baylor. He also dished out a team-high seven assists, one shy of his season high, while committing just one turnover.
- **Martez Walker** reached double figures in scoring (10 points) for the fifth time this season. He also matched his season high with two steals. Over the last four games, Walker is averaging 8.5 ppg and 3.8 rpg.
- **Kendal Yancy** matched his career high with 12 points and reached double figures in scoring for the third time this season. Over the last two games, Yancy is averaging 7.5 ppg in 19.0 mpg.

### WINNING THE CLOSE ONES

**Texas is 10-3 this season in games decided by seven points or less.** This mark includes an 86-83 win at No. 14/18 North Carolina (Dec. 18) and a 67-64 home victory against No. 22 Kansas State (Jan. 21).

### DIFFERENCE BETWEEN WINNING AND LOSING

In their 23 wins entering the NCAA Tournament, the Longhorns have held their opponents to an average of 64.9 points per game on a combined 37.0% FG shooting (502-of-1357), including a 31.2% mark from three-point range (154-of-494). Texas also has hit 45.2% from the floor (34.5% from three-point range) and posted a +9.5 rebound margin (43.0-33.5) in its wins. During their 10 losses, the Horns have allowed their opponents to average 81.9 points per game on a combined 46.5% FG shooting (266-of-572), including a 41.9% mark from three-point range (83-of-198). UT has hit just 38.7% from the floor (28.6% from three-point range) and posted a +1.8 rebound margin (38.9-37.1) in its defeats.

### COACH OF THE YEAR, AGAIN

**Rick Barnes** was tabbed the Big 12 Coach of the Year by the league's coaches. This marked the fourth time that Barnes has claimed the honor (1999, 2003, 2008 and 2014), tying Kansas' Bill Self for most Coach of the Year accolades in Big 12 history.

### CONSISTENT SUCCESS IN THE BIG 12

Texas has reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the first 16 seasons under Rick Barnes (the first 13 years featured 16-game league schedules). The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in all but one of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin. UT has recorded at least 13 conference victories in six of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11).

### A LOOK BACK AT THE SEVEN-GAME WIN STREAK

After starting league play with an 0-2 mark, the Longhorns responded with seven consecutive Big 12 wins, including four against ranked opponents in No. 8 Iowa State, No. 22 Kansas State, No. 24 Baylor and No. 6 Kansas. During the streak, Texas hit 70.0% from the free throw line and held its opponents to a combined 38.3% FG shooting, including a 28.7% mark (41-of-143) from three-point range. Texas' streak ended in a 74-57 loss at Kansas State (Feb. 8).

### HORNS REACH 20-WIN MARK ... AGAIN

With UT's 88-71 home victory against West Virginia on Feb. 15, the Longhorns reached the 20-win mark for the 14th time in 16 seasons under coach Rick Barnes. UT had a school-record streak of 13 consecutive 20-win seasons snapped last year. Prior to that streak, the previous school mark for most consecutive 20-win seasons was four (1988-89 to 1991-92). The Longhorns have reached the 20-win plateau of total of 29 times in their 108 seasons of basketball.

### DID YOU KNOW?

### BLOCK PARTY

**Entering the NCAA Tournament (through games as of March 13), UT is ranked 11th nationally in blocked shots per game (6.1 bpg).** The Horns have recorded at least seven blocks in 17 of their first 33 games. UT registered a season-high 12 blocks in wins against UT Arlington (Nov. 29) and No. 6 Kansas (Feb. 1), just one shy of the single-game team record.

- On the season, UT has posted a 198-120 advantage in blocked shots.
- Texas has had at least 11 blocks in a game three times this season (11 vs. Houston Baptist, 12 vs. UT Arlington and No. 6 Kansas).
- UT tied a school record for most blocks in a half with 9 in the second half against No. 6/7 Kansas (Feb. 1). This matched the mark of nine blocks against Kansas State in the second half on Feb. 3, 2007.
- **Cameron Ridley's** 71 blocks this season ranks ninth in the Texas single-season record book.

### PROTECTING THE ROCK

Texas has been an improved team when it comes to protecting the basketball through the first 33 contests this year. Last season, the Horns averaged 14.7 turnovers per game and recorded a 391-to-500 assist-to-turnover ratio on the year. This season, Texas is averaging just 12.4 turnovers per contest and sports a 421-to-408 assist-to-turnover ratio. The Horns committed a season-low six turnovers in their Big 12 Conference Championship semifinal loss to Baylor (March 14).

## CLEANING THE GLASS

Texas has outrebounded 26 of its first 33 opponents this season while posting double-digit rebound advantages in 11 of its first 33 games. For the season, UT owns a +7.2 rebound margin (41.8-34.6).

- UT posted double-digit rebound margins against South Alabama (40-30), Stephen F. Austin (41-26), Houston Baptist (52-33), Temple (55-42), Rice (42-29), Oklahoma State (45-33), West Virginia (49-30), TCU (56-25), West Virginia (41-26) and TCU (48-32).
- The Longhorns recorded a season-high 56 rebounds in the win at TCU (Feb. 4), including a season-best 25 offensive boards. Jonathan Holmes' game-high 16 rebounds (six offensive) were the most this season by a Longhorn.
- **UT posted a 56-25 advantage on the glass at TCU (Feb. 4). Texas' +31 rebounding margin was its fourth-highest single-game mark in school history (since 1961-62).**

## DEFENSE WINS

Solid defense has been a trademark of the Texas program under Rick Barnes. Since Barnes arrived in Austin, the Horns have held 263 of their 546 opponents to under 40% FG shooting. **Texas sports a 237-26 (.901) mark in the Barnes era when accomplishing the feat (19-0 mark this season).** UT has held its first 33 opponents to an average of 70.0 ppg on 39.8 percent FG shooting.

- UT has held 19 of its first 33 opponents this year to under 40% FG shooting.
- Texas had a season-high 12 steals in its loss to BYU (Nov. 25).
- Against UTA (Nov. 29), the Horns rejected a season-high 12 shots (one shy of the team's single-game record).
- UT held West Virginia (Jan. 13) to just 16.0 (4-of-25) percent from beyond the arc, a season-low 3FG percentage for a Texas opponent.
- Texas limited Baylor (Jan. 25) to a season low in points (60) and to a 3-of-17 (.176) mark from three-point range. The 3 three-pointers were the fewest made by a UT opponent this year.
- Texas' 12 blocks against Kansas (Feb. 1) matched a season high (UTA, Nov. 29) and were one shy of the school single-game record (13, twice). It also tied the UT record for most blocks in a Big 12 game (fifth time in Big 12 play, last was Feb. 8, 2010 vs. No. 1 Kansas).
- Texas has had 10+ blocks three times this season.
- Texas held TCU (March 5) to a .194 (6-of-31 FG) shooting percentage from the field in the second half and a .259 (14-of-54 FG) percentage for the game, the lowest this season by a UT opponent. The Longhorns also held the Horned Frogs to only six field goals in the second half and 14 made field goals in the game, a season low by an opponent.

## HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

- Texas defeated four consecutive AP Top 25 opponents in four consecutive games for the first time in school history (No. 8 Iowa State on Jan. 18, No. 22 Kansas State on Jan. 21, at No. 24/23 Baylor on Jan. 25, No. 6 Kansas on Feb. 1).
- The Longhorns became just the second team in NCAA Division I since the 1996-97 season to record four straight wins against AP Top 25 teams in four consecutive games. Kansas accomplished the feat earlier this year, while North Carolina achieved the milestone in 1996-97.
- UT tied a school record by winning its fourth consecutive game against an AP Top 25 opponent. The Longhorns won four straight (in a five-game span) against AP Top 25 opponents during the 2010-11 season (No. 11 Texas A&M on Jan. 19, at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, No. 11 Missouri on Jan. 29, at No. 16 Texas A&M on Jan. 31).

## COMEBACK HORNS

The Longhorns have rallied for second-half comeback wins in seven of their first 22 victories.

- UT overcame a nine-point deficit (62-53) with 9:44 left against Mercer (Nov. 8), going on a 23-11 run to close the game.
- The Horns also trailed South Alabama (Nov. 12) by 10 points (64-54) at the 11:51 mark, before closing the contest on a 30-13 run.
- In the win against SFA (Nov. 15), UT faced a five-point deficit (40-35) with 16:31 left. Tied at 60-60 at the 3:10 mark, the Horns closed the game with a 12-2 spurt.
- Texas trailed by nine points (60-51) with 8:43 left against UT Arlington (Nov. 29) before rallying for a 21-9 run to close out the contest.
- UT trailed by three (73-70) with 2:31 left in the second half at Temple (Dec. 7). The Horns rallied back to force overtime and pulled out an 81-80 win. UT trailed 80-78 with 14 seconds left in overtime, before Javan Felix knocked down a 3-pointer with eight seconds left that proved to be the game-winner.
- The Horns trailed by one (64-63) against Texas Tech (Jan. 11) with 1:19 left before Cameron Ridley knocked down the game-tying and game-winning free throws with 31 seconds remaining.

## BEATING THE BEST

UT's win at No. 2 Kansas on Jan. 22, 2011 equaled the highest-ranked (AP) opponent the Longhorns have defeated in school history. Six of Texas' nine all-time wins against AP Top Three teams have come during the Rick Barnes era.

## HOLMES LEADING BY CONSISTENT EXAMPLE

The most experienced player on this year's roster, junior forward **Jonathan Holmes** leads the team in scoring (13.0 ppg), ranks second on the team in rebounding (7.2 rpg) and third on the team in blocks (38) while averaging 23.9 minutes per game this season. Holmes missed the game against UTA (Nov. 29) due to the death of his grandmother, and he did not play against Oklahoma State (Feb. 11) or TCU (March 5) due to a right knee injury. He has played in 93 career games (75 starts) and has reached double figures in scoring 41 times and in rebounds nine times. Last year as a sophomore, he led the team in rebounding (5.6 rpg) despite averaging just 20.5 minutes per game. Holmes has reached double figures in scoring in 23 of his first 30 games. For the season, he has converted 133-of-260 (.512) field goals, including 28-of-79 (.354) from three-point range, and 95-of-128 (.742) free throws. He has recorded five career double-doubles, including four this season (vs. BYU - 10 pts. and 10 rebs., at UNC - 15 pts. and 10 rebs.), at OSU - 10 pts. and 12 rebs., at TCU - 20 pts. and 16 rebs.)

Freshman **Kendal Yancy** has started 10 games (Houston Baptist, UT Arlington, Vanderbilt, Temple, Texas State, North Carolina, Michigan State, Rice, Oklahoma and Oklahoma State) this season. Through 32 contests, Yancy is averaging 3.5 points and shooting 40.4 percent (36-of-89) in 12.5 minutes per game. Yancy was ranked as the No. 85 prospect nationally in the ESPN100 following his senior year. He averaged 12.2 points, 6.6 rebounds and 7.8 assists per game while leading his team to a 33-6 record and a trip to the Texas 5A state semifinals as a senior.

- Off the bench against DePaul (Nov. 26), Yancy reached double figures for the first time in his career (10) while setting season highs in field goals made (4-of-7) and minutes played (23).
- Against Vanderbilt, he set a season high in points (11) and rebounds (6) while tying his season high in field goals made with 4-of-6. He reached double figures in scoring for the second time in his career.

- Played a season-high 25 minutes against Temple (Dec. 7).
- Matched his season high in rebounds with six in 10 minutes of action against No. 8/10 Iowa State (Jan. 18).
- Matched his career high with 12 points and reached double figures in scoring for the third time this season in the Big 12 Championship semifinal loss to Baylor (March 14).
- **Over the last two games, Yancy is averaging 7.5 ppg in 19.0 mpg.**

## ACADEMIC ACCOLADES

Four University of Texas men's basketball players earned a spot on the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team. Sophomore **Connor Lammert** was named to the First Team, while sophomores **Javan Felix**, **Demarcus Holland** and **Prince Ibeh** were each selected to the Second Team. All four individuals earned their first career selections to the academic all-league team. First-team members honor those who have maintained a 3.20 or better GPA, and the second-team honorees are those who have a 3.00 to 3.19 GPA. To qualify for the team, student-athletes must maintain a 3.00 GPA or higher either cumulative or the two previous semesters and must have participated in 60 percent of his team's scheduled contests.

## SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last four years (2010, 2011, 2012 and 2013). The awards are given each year to teams scoring in the top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. UT has earned a perfect 1.000 score in each of the last four multi-year APR reports. In eight of the last nine years, two or more student-athletes have represented Texas on the Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team.

## BARNETT COMMITS DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

**Jordan Barnett** (St. Louis, Mo.) has signed a National Letter of Intent to play basketball next season at The University of Texas. He will join the Longhorns for the 2014-15 season.

- **Barnett** (6-7, 190), a forward from Christian Brothers College High School who played under coach Bob McCormack, is ranked as the No. 83 prospect in the nation by ESPN and No. 101 by Rivals.com. As a junior last season, Barnett led CBC with 17.1 points, 7.7 rebounds and 1.7 blocked shots per game while hitting 37.6 percent of his three-point attempts. In his sophomore year, he helped the Cadets to the Class 5 quarterfinals by leading the team with 14.2 points, 6.8 boards and 1.7 blocked shots per game. Barnett also knocked down a team-high 48 three-pointers and led the team with a 48.5 shooting percentage from beyond the arc.

## THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter the NCAA Championship having hit at least one 3-pointer in 789 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three in 917 of 923 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one 3-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

## OFF THE COURT WITH THE HORNS

- **Brandon Allums** served as a practice player for the Texas women's basketball team last season.
- **Damarcus Croaker** became a father on Feb. 4, 2014. His girlfriend, Amber Shazier (pronounced: SHAY-zure), gave birth to their son – Damarcus Dewayne Croaker, Jr. – at 1:27 a.m. in Orlando, Fla. Damarcus, Jr. checked in at 5 pounds, 12 ounces.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who is a sophomore on the basketball team at Texas Tech. His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets. Harris is currently playing for the Erie BayHawks of the NBA Developmental League.

### Year 16 at Texas for Barnes

The all-time winningest coach in UT history, Rick Barnes, is in his 16th season at Texas. He has compiled over 500 wins in his 27 years as a head coach at George Mason, Providence, Clemson and Texas. During the 2010-11 season, Barnes earned his 500th career victory and became the 12th active Men's Basketball Division I coach to reach the 500-win milestone (counting victories only while at Division I schools). Barnes has guided his teams to a total of 21 NCAA and three NIT trips.

- UT has recorded at least 13 league victories in seven of Barnes' 16 seasons in Austin (13-3 in 1998-99, 1999-2000, 2002-03, 2005-06, 2007-08 and 2010-11). The Longhorns have reached the 10-win mark in Big 12 Conference play a total of 11 times in the 16 seasons under Barnes. Texas posted 9-7 conference marks in 2004-05, 2008-09 and 2009-10 and a 9-9 league record in 2011-12. The Horns have recorded at least nine league wins in 15 of Barnes' first 16 seasons in Austin.

- UT owns a 33-18 (.647) mark against AP Top 25 opponents at the Erwin Center under Barnes.

- Barnes carried a streak of 17 consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances into the 2012-13 season. Barnes reached the NCAA tourney in each of his last three years at Clemson (1996-98) and in each of his first 14 seasons at Texas (1999-2012).
