Kansas State, Head Coach, Bill Snyder

On comeback in second half: We could have bounced back better than what we did. Once again, we made so many mistakes that were critical in the outcome of the ball game. I think Texas played very well. We had our opportunities and missed them

On defense: We played well on defense. A couple of young guys who hadn't really been on the field played real well and sustained us. We gave up a few plays, but we played reasonably well. It was a team loss and we had mistakes on offense and special teams that contributed to the loss as well.

On Jerrod Heard scrambling ability: As we knew going in and I have said all along, anybody that watches any game that Texas is in knows that he is a talented young guy. He's elusive, he's a change of direction guy, and he can make you miss.
