QUICK HITS

- Saturday's game will be the 110th meeting between the Texas Longhorns and Oklahoma Sooners. It also will be
 the 93rd time the contest will be held in Dallas.
- Texas enters the contest after a 50-7 loss at No. 4/3 TCU.
- RB D'Onta Foreman ran for a career-high 112 yards at TCU, the first time the sophomore recorded a 100-yard game in his career.

AT&T RED RIVER SHOWDOWN

• There is no rivalry quite like the Texas-Oklahoma series. The series, which began in 1900, has been played in Dallas since 1912 and at the Cotton Bowl since 1929. Dallas' Cotton Bowl is located an equal distance from Austin and Norman, Okla. The stadium is split evenly among Longhorn and Sooner fans at the 50-yard line. It is the second-oldest UT series and tied for the 19th most-played rivalry in NCAA history. Only Texas A&M has met Texas on more occasions (117 times). Since 1900, the only years Texas and Oklahoma have not met were 1918, '20, '21 and 1924-28. The series resumed in 1929 at the State Fair of Texas and has remained a fixture since.



SCOUTING THE SOONERS

- Oklahoma comes to Dallas following a 20-point victory at home over then-ranked No. 23/21 West Virginia. The Sooners won 44-24 by forcing the Mountaineers into five turnovers.
- The Sooners scored 13 points off those turnovers, including one fumble return for a touchdown.
- Oklahoma is led by quarterback Baker Mayfield. The former Texas Tech Red Raider is averaging 345.5 yards passing per game and has 13 touchdowns on the year. He also has scored four times on the ground while averaging 34.5 yards per game to rank second on the team.
- The Sooners spread the ball around on offense with eight different players catching touchdown passes from Mayfield so far this season.

SERIES HISTORY

- Texas leads the all-time series against Oklahoma, 60-44-5.
- The Longhorns are 48-40-4 against the Sooners in games played in Dallas.
- The series is an even 5-5 over the last 10 meetings.

LAST MEETING

- Texas fell in the AT&T Red River Showdown last year by the score of 31-26.
- QB Tyrone Swoopes led Texas on a fourth-quarter charge with 13 unanswered points. Swoopes was 27-of-44 throwing for 334 yards with two TDs and added 50 yards rushing and one TD.

RIVALRY TRADITIONS

- STATE FAIR: The Texas-Oklahoma game is once again a part of a state festival with the State Fair of Texas surrounding the event. That continues a tradition which began in 1929. That year, the game was played in an old wooden structure called Fair Park Stadium, which was located on what is now a parking lot at Fair Park. A new stadium, also named Fair Park Stadium, was built in 1930 and renamed in 1936 as the Cotton Bowl. The name change came about because, at the time, Dallas was the largest interior spot cotton market in the world.
- THE BATTLE LINE: One of the unique characteristics of the Texas/OU rivalry is the colors. With the tickets divided equally, burnt orange and crimson split down the middle. OU claims the south horseshoe from the 50-yard line and UT the horseshoe north of midfield. As the home team, the Longhorns will wear burnt orange jerseys and occupy the west bench area (opposite the press box side) with that role reversing next season.
- THE GOLDEN HAT: To the victor goes the Golden Hat, a rotating trophy representing the winner of the Texas/ Oklahoma contest. It's a gold cowboy hat mounted on a large block of wood and it has been a part of the series since the State Fair of Texas donated it in 1941. The only change has been the actual color. When it first arrived, it was known as the "Bronze Hat" and actually was bronze. When that hat was reworked in the 1970s, it came out gold, hence it is now officially known as the Golden Hat.
- The Governor's Cup: The Governor's Cup is exchanged by the Governors of Texas and Oklahoma following the AT&T Red River Showdown. The tradition started when Texas Governor Dolph Briscoe donated the trophy, and each year it is transported from the office of the previous year's winning Governor to Dallas. It is displayed in the Hall of State on game day and then transported to the office of that year's winning Governor after it has received its engraving.
- **UT TORCH LIGHT PARADE:** The annual Torchlight Parade is set for 8 p.m. Wednesday at the Main Mall on the UT campus. Head coach Charlie Strong and the team will be on hand at approximately 8:30 p.m.

FOREMAN GAINING GROUND

- Sophomore D'Onta Foreman had a career day against TCU (Oct. 3) with career-high in yards (112) and carries (18).
- Foreman had 18 carries for 112 yards. It marked the first 100-yard game of his career.
- His previous bests were nine carries for 47 yards earlier this season against Cal.
- Also had career highs at TCU with two receptions for 32 yards.

GROWING BETTER WITH AGE

- Foreman tallied 73 yards on 15 carries all of 2014 as a freshman.
- Two carries for 37 yards in career debut against North Texas last year
- Five carries for 13 yards against West Virginia (Nov. 8, 2014)
- In 2015, Foreman has averaged 42.2 yards per game and 8.8 carries.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

- Texas leads the nation with three defensive touchdowns on the year. Tied with the Longhorns are five other schools: Buffalo, Cal, Middle Tennessee, Ole Miss, Ohio State.
- The Longhorns had two defensive touchdowns against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26) when Hassan Ridgeway returned a fumble 34 yards and Holton Hill returned an interception 41 yards. It was the first time since Oct. 31, 2009 that Texas had two defensive touchdowns in the same game, which also happened to be against Oklahoma State.
- Malik Jefferson returned a fumble 28 yards against Rice (Sept. 12) to register the first defensive touchdown of the season for the Longhorns.
- Also against Rice, Daje Johnson returned a punt 85 yards for a score. That gives Texas two games this season with multiple non-offensive touchdowns.

- The most defensive touchdowns Texas has had in a season was six in 2003.
- The Longhorns have had five defensive touchdowns in three seasons: 2006, 2000, 1987

YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE & FRESHMAN STARTERS

- Texas had a strong 2015 recruiting class and many of the newcomers wasted little time making an impact during preseason camp. Seven true or redshirt freshmen were listed as first-teamers on the depth chart heading into the Notre Dame game.
- The Longhorns ended up with five freshman starters in their opening lineup: WR John Burt, LT Connor Williams, RG Patrick Vahe, LB Malik Jefferson and CB John Bonney were in the starting lineup. In addition, Michael Dickson handled the punting chores. Redshirt freshman Edwin Freeman was listed as the first team weakside linebacker, but the Horns opened the Notre Dame game with five defensive backs.
- Texas was among the national leaders in true freshmen who played in the season opener. Only Georgia had more true freshmen play in Week 1 and only Florida State and NC State had more total freshmen play.
- Freshmen continue to make an impact as redshirt freshman **Jerrod Heard** got the first start of his career against Rice. Heard threw for 120 yards and two TD's while also rushing for 96 yards to lead the team. He followed that with a school record 527 yards of total offense against Cal.
- The 2015 recruiting class was highly touted and included 19 signees from Texas along with recruits from California, Florida, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi and New York.
- Coach Strong on his recruiting philosophy: "We know this the state of Texas will always be our home ground. We will always build it from this state. There are great high school coaches in this state. That's what it's all about. We will always know this, any time we need to go out of state where we can get into battles, I don't mind going outside the state to get in a battle. That's what it's all about; that's what recruiting is all about. We knew we were not going to back down."
- Texas may have one of the youngest teams in the nation. The Longhorns played 21 freshmen, including 15 true freshmen, in the season opener vs. Notre Dame. Only Florida State, NC State and Syracuse played more freshmen in their first game, and just Georgia had more true freshmen get on the field.
- Twice this year Texas has played a combined total of at least 20 freshmen: at Notre Dame and vs. Cal.
- The game against Cal saw Texas play its most freshmen. A total of 22 played with 15 of them true freshmen.
- Texas is averaging 19.2 freshmen seeing action per game this season.

DID YOU KNOW?

Texas is one of the best teams in the nation in **punt coverage** and **punt returning.** The Longhorns rank **No. 9 in the FBS** in average yards allowed on punt returns at **0.83.** Texas also ranks No. 9 in punt return average at **21.40** yards per return. The Horns are No. 2 and No. 1 in the Big 12 Conference in those categories, respectively. **Daje Johnson** averages 17.6 yards on punt returns to rank No. 1 in the conference and **No. 13 in the nation.**

- The only losses are to Oklahoma State (1997, 2015) and Kansas State (1998, 2007).
- Texas is 9-2 when its Big 12 opener is at home with losses to K-State in 2007 and Oklahoma State last week.

JEFFERSON MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT

• True freshman LB Malik Jefferson has made an immediate impact on the Texas defense. Through his first five collegiate games (all starts), Jefferson ranks second on the team in total tackles with 31 (18 solo). He also has added 3.5 TFL, five quarterback hurries, one PBU and one fumble recovery (returned 26 yards for a TD).

MALIK JEFFERSON BY THE NUMBERS

- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles (three solo) against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Team-high nine tackles (six solo), including one TFL, four QB hurries and one fumble recovery in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
 - Returned the fumble against Rice 26 yards for a TD, marking his first collegiate touchdown
 - Posted nine tackles (five solo), including 2.5 TFL, in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)

HEARD'S RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

 After playing just six snaps in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame, redshirt freshman QB Jerrod Heard had his name called just prior to kick in the Week 2 win against Rice and responded with a solid performance against the Owls. Heard put up record-setting numbers despite making just his second career start (and playing in his third collegiate game) in a 45-44 loss to Cal on Sept. 19.

JERROD HEARD BY THE NUMBERS VS. CAL

- Set a UT single-game total offense mark with 527 yards (364 pass/163 rush). This performance topped the previous mark of 506 (239 pass/267 rush) by Vince Young at Oklahoma State in 2005.
- Became the second UT quarterback in school history to throw for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards, joining Colt McCoy (304 pass/175 rush) at Texas A&M on Nov. 26, 2009
- · Led team to 650 yards of total offense, the eighthhighest single-game mark in UT history
- Completed 20-of-31 passes for 364 yards, including a long of 54 yards
- His 364 yards passing ranked 10th in UT singlegame history and was the second-highest total by a freshman in UT history (Major Applewhite had 408 vs. Oklahoma State in 1998).
- Became the first UT freshman QB to throw for 300 yards since Colt McCoy (308) in the 2006 Alamo Bowl vs. Iowa
- Rushed 24 times for 163 yards (6.8 avg) with three TDs, including a long of 45 yards
- · His 163 yards rushing marked the first time a UT freshman QB had rushed for 100 yards since Vince Young had 163 against Nebraska on Nov. 1, 2003 (14 carries) in Austin.
- His 163 yards rushing marked the eighth-best rushing effort by a QB in UT history and tied the best rushing effort by a freshman QB in school history
- · His three rushing TDs tied a UT single-game freshman record (shared by four other players; last was Joe Bergeron vs. Texas Tech in 2011).
- His 163 yards rushing tied for the seventh-best single-game effort by a freshman in UT history

HEARD IN THE 2015 SEASON

• Leads the team in rushing with 318 yards on 67 carries (4.7 avg) and three TDs

- Leads the team in total offense with 979 yards (195.8 avg)

Has completed 42-of-76 passes (.553) for 661 yards with two TDs and two INT's

JINKENS EMERGING AS SENIOR LEADER

• Senior Peter Jinkens has moved into a leadership role while taking command of the starting spot at strongside LB. A fourth-year player who served as a backup in 2012 and a part-time starter as a sophomore and junior, Jinkens has now played in 44 career games with 16 starts. He leads the team and ranks sixth in the Big 12 in total tackles with 40 (23 solo), including one sack, 4.0 TFL and three quarterback hurries this season.

PETER JINKENS BY THE NUMBERS

- Posted a team-high eight tackles (six solo), including one TFL, at TCU (Oct. 3)
- Posted a team-high nine tackles (five solo), including two TFL, against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Recorded six tackles (four solo) and one quarterback hurry against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Tallied seven tackles (four solo) in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Led the team with 10 tackles (four solo), including one sack and one TFL, at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)
- The 10-tackle effort at Notre Dame was just two stops shy of his career high (12 at Baylor in 2013)

THOMAS LEADING BY EXAMPLE IN SECONDARY

• Senior CB Duke Thomas is the unquestioned leader of the Texas secondary. A preseason All-Big 12 selection, Thomas has played in all 44 games over the last four seasons (28 starts). He ranks third on the team in total tackles with 27 (19 solo), including 3.0 TFL.

DUKE THOMAS BY THE NUMBERS

- Posted seven tackles (five solo), including one TFL, against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Registered seven tackles (five solo) against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Tallied two PBU's at TCU (Oct. 3)

RIDGEWAY COMES UP BIG

• Junior DT Hassan Ridgeway has played in 30 career games (12 starts) and was named to the 2015 preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. He battled through a back injury throughout fall camp and came off the bench in the first three games this year. Ridgeway earned his first start of the season in Saturday's loss to Oklahoma State and responded with a solid effort. For the year, he is tied for fifth on the team in total tackles with 19 (14 solo) and tied for second in TFL (3.5).

HASSAN RIDGEWAY BY THE NUMBERS

- Made his first start of the season against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26) and registered six tackles (four solo), including 1.5 TFL, one sack and one fumble recovered for a 34-yard TD.
 - The fumble recovery marked the first of Ridgeway's career.
 - In his first three contests (all off the bench), Ridgeway recorded 10 total tackles (nine solo), including two TFL.
 - Made three tackles, one solo, in his second start of the season at TCU (Oct. 3).

HILL RECORDS PICK-SIX

- True freshman CB Holton Hill delivered in a huge way during UT's loss to Oklahoma State (Sept. 26). Hill recorded his first career interception and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter. He also posted two solo tackles and one PBU. For the year, he has tallied seven tackles (all solo).
- The last time a true freshman returned an interception for a touchdown was Sept. 27, 2008 when Aaron Williams ran a pick-six back 81 yards against Arkansas. Williams currently plays for the Buffalo Bills.
- Hill got the first start of his career at TCU (Oct. 3). He registered seven tackles to rank second on the team for the game. His six solo stops paced the team along with senior Peter Jinkens.
- He also registered a PBU at TCU and leads the team in that category for the season with two.

HAVE YOU HEARD?

Redshirt freshman Jerrod Heard has performed well in his first three starts. Among the last seven Texas QBs starting the first three games of their careers, his 600 passing yards are tops and his 307 rushing yards rank second behind Vince Young's 322. A stat of note is Heard lost 55 yards on sacks and rushes against Oklahoma State. Heard has thrown for two touchdowns and ran for another three. Combined his rushing and passing make him the No. 1 quarterback in total offense among those being compared with 907 yards.

STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM

CLOSE CALLS IN BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS

• Texas easily could be entering Saturday's game against Oklahoma with a 3-2 mark if not for some late-game breakdowns and costly mistakes in two contests. The Horns have dropped their games against Cal (Sept. 19) and Oklahoma State (Sept. 26) by a total of four points, both in heart-breaking fashion.

KEY PLAY DOWN THE STRETCH VS. CAL

• Despite trailing by 21 points entering the fourth quarter (45-24), the Longhorns used a trio of TDs to pull within a single point (45-44) after Jerrod Heard's 45-yard TD run with 1:11 remaining. However, UT missed the tying extra point (wide right) and could not recover the ensuing onside kick attempt.

KEY PLAYS DOWN THE STRETCH VS. OKLAHOMA STATE

- Texas held a 27-24 lead with 4:03 remaining in the game, when OSU took over possession at its own 49.
- After an incompletion on first down, the Longhorns were penalized three successive times, moving the ball to the UT 19.
 - ^ A pass interference call moved the ball to the UT 44
 - ^ On an Oklahoma State rushing play, UT was called for defensive holding which moved the ball to the UT 34.
 - ^ Following that penalty, Texas also was flagged for unsportsmanlike conduct that took the ball to the UT 19.
- After UT held the Cowboys to a field goal (tying the score at 27-27), Texas took over on its own 25 with 1:26 remaining.
- The Longhorns went three-and-out on their offensive possession and were forced to punt.
- On the ensuing punt, UT fumbled the snap and was only able to punt the ball 10 yards which setup OSU at the UT 18. Two plays later, Oklahoma State PK Ben Grogan converted a 40-yard field goal with six seconds left to give the Cowboys the victory.

HAINES PREFERS TO PICK

• A former walk-on who was placed on scholarship prior to the 2014 season, junior SS Dylan Haines has played in 18 games (17 starts). Haines led the team in interceptions (four) and ranked second in pass breakups (seven) and third in tackles (86) last season. Despite missing the majority of the Cal game (Sept. 19) due to a targeting call early in the first quarter, Haines leads the team with two interceptions through the first five contests this year.

DYLAN HAINES BY THE NUMBERS

- Ranks fourth on the team in total tackles with 23 (19 solo), including one sack, one TFL and one PBU
- Recorded seven tackles (six solo), one interception (29-yard return) and one PBU against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Registered seven tackles (five solo) in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)
- Tallied four tackles (three solo) at TCU (Oct. 3)

TOTAL TEAM EFFORT

- Texas tallied 650 total yards on offense in the 45-44 loss to Cal (Sept. 19). That number ranks eighth in school history for a single game.
- The last time Texas had 600+ yards on offense was in the season opener against New Mexico State in 2013 when the Longhorns set the school record of 715 yards.
- Texas ran for 286 yards rushing and an average of 5.5 yards per carry.
- Jerrod Heard threw for 364 yards with four different players grabbing at least four receptions.

NO GRAY AREA

- Senior RB **Johnathan Gray** is climbing up the all-time lists at Texas. With a long history of legendary running backs for the Longhorns, Gray could move into the top 10 in yards soon.
- Gray needs just 342 yards to move ahead of Hodges Mitchell for 10th in school history. He is currently 15th and less than 40 yards from surpassing Steve Worster for No. 14 on the list.
- Against Cal on Sept. 19, Gray had just 46 yards rushing but made an impact on the passing game as well with a career-high 71 yards receiving.
- impact on the passing game as well with a career-high 71 yards receiving.
 He currently has five receptions for 79 yards. If he maintains that current pace of contributing to the passing game, he could crack the Texas all-time Top 10.

pace of contributing to the passing game, he could crack the Texas all-time Top 10 for receptions and receiving yards in a season by a running back. He also is approaching the Top Five in school history in those two categories for a career by running backs.

DAJE JOHNSON MAKING SIGNIFICANT IMPACT, ALTERING GAMEPLANS

- Texas is averaging 21.4 yards per punt return this season to lead the Big 12 Conference.
- **Daje Johnson** is the top individual in the league with an average of 17.6 yards.
- He is leading the Big 12 despite only gaining three yards on two punt returns at Notre Dame in the season opener and one return for zero yards at TCU (Oct. 3).

- Johnson was named **Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Week** following the Rice game (Sept. 12) for his 35 yards on kickoff returns, 119 punt return yards, including an 85-yard TD return.
- During the game against California (Sept. 19), the Golden Bears found ways to avoid kicking to Johnson and keep his dangerous speed out of the return game. Cal punted four times against Texas, but **never lined up in punt formation**. By having **quarterback** Jared Goff quick-kick every punt, it ensured the Longhorns would not have Johnson, a WR, on the field when the Golden Bears elected to punt.
- Texas had zero punt returns against Cal as a result of all punts going out of bounds or being fair caught.
- Cal also avoided Johnson on kickoffs by kicking high and short to the upbacks or directional kicking away from him to another kick returner.
- In the win over Rice, Johnson's punt return for a TD was the first by a Longhorn since he did so against Oklahoma on Oct. 12, 2013. That return also went for 85 yards against the Sooners.
- The 85-yard punt return is tied for the fourth longest in school history
- Johnson also became the eighth player in UT history to have at least two career punt returns for touchdowns. He is just one behind the career leaders: Jordan Shipley (2006-09), Aaron Ross (2003-06) and Jim Moore (1971-73).
- On kickoff returns, Johnson also is a threat. He ranks fourth in the Big 12 with an average of 24.5 yards.
- With Johnson's punt and kick returns added to his receiving yards, he ranks No. 8 in the Big 12 Conference in all-purpose yards at **114.8 yards per game.** Those numbers took a dip after he had one catch for five yards at TCU (Oct. 3) and left the game with an apparent injury.
- Helping Texas and its high average in punt returns is **Duke Thomas.** He also grabbed a short punt against Rice and returned it 56 yards to set up another Texas touchdown.
- With Johnson and Thomas combined, Texas tallied 175 punt return yards to break the school record. The previous best was 173 yards against Baylor on Nov. 3, 2001. All those yards came from Nathan Vasher.
- Texas averaged 43.8 yards on punt returns against Rice.

CHARLIE STRONG

Head Coach • Second Year

A two-time conference coach of the year and the architect of a revitalized University of Louisville program that posted at least 11 wins in each of his final two seasons, Charlie Strong is in his second year as the Texas head football coach.

Strong, the 29th head coach in UT history, spent the previous four seasons as Louisville head coach, re-energizing a program that was coming off back-to-back losing seasons (5-7 in 2008, 4-8 in 2009) and a 15-21 record in the three years prior to his arrival. He amassed a 37-15 record, a pair of Big East Conference Championships (2011, 2012) and was named Big East Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2012. He also led UofL to four straight bowl game appearances (3-1 record), including a victory over No. 4 Florida in the 2013 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

During 2014, Strong rallied the Longhorns from a 3-5 record to reach a bowl game despite the loss of two key starters on offense (QB David Ash, C Dominic Espinosa) and one on defense (DT Desmond Jackson) for nearly the entire season.

Texas ended the season with one of the better defenses in the nation, ranking 25th in the FBS in total yards allowed (348.5 per game), No. 11 in passing defense (184.2 ypg), No. 7 in yards allowed per play (4.68), 15th in passing efficiency defense (110.04 rating), tied for 11th in sacks (3.1 pg) and 31st in points allowed (23.8 pq).

A number of players earned individual honors in Strong's first season. Defensive tackle Malcom Brown was a finalist for both the Nagurski and Outland trophies, as well as becoming the 47th consensus All-American in school history. Brown and linebacker Jordan Hicks earned All-America honors. They were also among 10 players to secure All-Big 12 accolades.

Five players - Brown (first round to New England), Hicks (third round to Philadelphia), safety Mykkele Thompson (fifth round to NY Giants), cornerback Quandre Diggs (sixth round to Detroit) and tight end Geoff Swaim (seventh round to Dallas) - were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft.

During his final two seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals' were nation's fourth-winningest program, posting a 23-3 record (88.5 percent) and registering bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Louisville's 11-plus win seasons in 2012 and 2013 were the fourth and fifth in school history and the first back to back. UofL finished among the nation's top 15 for a school-record second straight year.

Strong spent seven seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Florida under Meyer from 2005-09 and Ron Zook from 2003-04 where he helped the Gators win a pair of national titles – 2008 over Oklahoma and 2006 over Ohio State.

From 2003-09, Strong's defensive units at Florida allowed an average of 17.6 points per game, which ranked ninth in the country over that span. His stint as defensive coordinator marked his fourth tenure at Florida, including a stretch from 1991-94 in which he coached defensive ends (1991-93) and defensive tackles (1994) after coaching outside linebackers in 1988-89, and serving as a graduate assistant in 1983-84. He served as Florida's assistant head coach from 2005-07 and was the associate head coach in 2008-09.

Before returning to Florida for the fourth time, Strong was defensive coordinator at the University of South Carolina from 1999-2002.

Outside of his time at Louisville, Florida, and South Carolina, Strong's career stops have included one season (1985) at Texas A&M as a graduate assistant before moving on to Southern Illinois as wide receivers coach from 1986-87, one season (1990) at Mississippi as wide receivers coach and four seasons (1995-98) as the defensive line coach at Notre Dame.

A native of Batesville, Ark., Strong was a three-year letterwinner (1979-81) and three-time all-conference safety at Central Arkansas, where he graduated in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in education. He and his wife, Vicki, have a son, Tory, and two daughters, Hailee and Hope.

It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews. Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.



SOUTH BEND, Ind. – No. 11/11 Notre Dame (1-0) knocked off Texas (0-1) by a 38-3 count Saturday evening before a sellout crowd at Notre Dame Stadium. Saturday's contest marked the first meeting between the two schools in nearly 20 years.

Both teams stalled on their opening drives before Notre Dame got on the board first on its second possession. Notre Dame QB Malik Zaire found Will Fuller down the middle for a 16-yard touchdown to stake the Irish to a 7-0 lead with 6:29 left in the first guarter.

Notre Dame marched 95 yards on its next possession and assumed a 14-0 lead when Josh Adams raced right on a jet sweep and scored from 14 yards out just before the end of the first quarter. The Irish's Justin Yoon connected for a 38-yard field goal with 7:53 remaining in the second quarter to push the Notre Dame lead to 17-0.

Texas made its first foray into Notre Dame territory in the closing minutes of the first half. Tyrone Swoopes, who shared time at quarterback with redshirt freshman Jerrod Heard, dumped a screen pass to Daje Johnson, who scampered 20 yards for a first down to the UT 45.

Swoopes carried for five yards to midfield before an Irish facemask penalty gave Texas the ball at the Notre Dame 35. The Horns settled for a 52-yard field goal attempt, but Nick Rose's kick sailed wide left as time expired in the first half. Rose had converted the kick twice but a pair of Notre Dame timeouts nullified both attempts.







AUSTIN, Texas — Boosted by a school single-game record 175 punt return yards, Texas secured its 16th straight home opening win and 13th consecutive victory over Rice as the Longhorns raced past the Owls on Saturday night at Darrell K. Royal — Texas Memorial Stadium, 42-28.

Senior wide receiver Daje Johnson was at the forefront of the return yardage record, bringing back three punts for 119 yards (39.7 average), including an 85-yard, first quarter scamper.

Freshman quarterback Jerrod Heard certainly made an impact in his first career start on the Forty Acres, throwing for 120 yards and two TDs while also rushing for 96 yards. Senior running back Johnathan Gray and sophomore receiver Armanti Foreman also scored in the first quarter to put Texas up 21-0 after the opening 15 minutes.

After stopping Rice on its opening drive, Texas wasted little time moving down field on its opening possession to nab a quick 7-0 lead via a 32-yard strike from Heard to Foreman. The signal caller also utilized his speed in helping UT on the nine-play, 80-yard drive as a 35-yard run by Heard on third-and-11 helped keep the drive alive.

After a quick three-and-out by Rice, Johnson pounced with his 85-yard punt return. The Pflugerville, Texas, native fielded the punt at his own 15-yard line and weaved his way through a crowd of blockers up the left sideline to pay dirt, expanding Texas' lead to 14-0. The punt return for a score marked the first for a Longhorn since Johnson also raced 85 yards for a TD during a 36-20 Texas victory over Oklahoma back on Oct. 12, 2013.

AUSTIN, Texas — Despite a school single-game total offense record of 527 yards from redshirt freshman quarterback Jerrod Heard, a furious fourth-quarter Texas rally came up just short on Saturday night in front of 91,568 fans at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium, as the Longhorns fell to California, 45-44.

UT had nearly fought its way out of a 21-point fourth quarter hole, with Heard scampering 45 yards for a TD with 1:11 left on the clock, before missing what would have been the game-tying extra point.


Heard was magnificent for the Burnt Orange & White, throwing for 364 yards and rushing for 163 more (three rushing scores) to break the old single-game total offense mark of 506 yards set by Vince Young at Oklahoma State in 2005. The 300-yard passing/100-yard rushing effort also marked the first for Texas since Colt McCoy threw for 304 and rushed for 175 against Texas A&M on Nov. 26, 2009.

Senior wide receiver Daje Johnson set a new career high for receiving yards with five catches for 145 yards, while sophomore running back D'Onta Foreman (47 yards rushing, TD) and senior running back Johnathan Gray (46 yards rushing, two TD's) combined for three rushing scores. Gray also managed a career-high 71 yards receiving on four catches.

The two teams combined for 1,198 total yards with the Longhorns out-gaining the Golden Bears by a 650-548 total. UT's offensive output, on 286 yards rushing and 364 yards passing, proved good enough to rate eighth all-time in program history.




AUSTIN, Texas — Two field goals over the final 1:33 of regulation helped No. 24 Oklahoma State (4-0, 1-0 Big 12 Conference) rally past Texas (1-3, 0-1 Big 12) on Saturday at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium, 30-27.

The Longhorns held a 27-24 lead with 1:33 left on the clock when OSU kicker Ben Grogan drilled a game-tying 41 yarder. With a final chance for a potential game-winning drive, UT went three-and-out and managed only a 10-yard punt off a fumbled snap as the Cowboys took possession at Texas' 18-yard line with 36 ticks left. After just one play, Grogan successfully knocked home a 40-yarder to complete the late comeback.

Oklahoma State out-gained the Horns by a 395-290 count with Texas managing a 171-103 advantage in rushing yards. Redshirt freshman quarterback Jerrod Heard was 9-for-17 passing for 119 yards and rushed for 48 more, while senior running back Johnathan Gray led the Burnt Orange & White on the ground with 55 yards.

UT junior defensive tackle Hassan Ridgeway managed his first career fumble recovery, returning it for a 34-yard TD early in the second quarter, while freshman defensive back Holton Hill returned an interception for a 41-yard score in the third. The occurrence of two defensive touchdowns in the same game marked the first time the Longhorns had accomplished the feat since Oct. 31, 2009, at Oklahoma State.







FORT WORTH, Texas — No. 4/3 TCU (5-0, 2-0 Big 12) posted a 50-7 win over Texas (1-4, 0-2 Big 12) Saturday afternoon at TCU's Amon Carter Stadium.

Texas forced a three-and-out on TCU's first possession, but on the Longhorns' ensuing possession, TCU recovered a Daje Johnson fumble and took over at the Texas 45.

Four plays later, TCU quarterback Trevone Boykin found KaVontae Turpin for a 13-yard score to stake the Horned Frogs to a 7-0 lead. Michael Dickson lined up for a Texas punt after the Horns' next possession, but the snap sailed over his head and into the end zone. Texas recovered the ball, but the play resulted in a safety and two points for TCU.

The Horned Frogs stretched their lead to 16-0 when Boykin found Josh Doctson for a 15-yard touchdown with 9:48 remaining in the first quarter. Texas and TCU traded punts before Boykin found Turpin again for a 49-yard touchdown that pushed the Horned Frogs lead to 23-0. TCU assumed a 30-0 lead behind a 29-yard halfback pass from Shaun Nixon to Doctson with 26 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

Texas advanced deep into TCU territory on a pair of first-half drives but failed to convert either into points. Running back D'Onta Foreman led off the first drive with a 15-yard run and gave Texas a fresh set of downs on the next series with three yards on third down. Quarterback Jerrod Heard found Foreman for 22 yards to the TCU 22, but the possession ended with an errant 39-yard field goal attempt from Nick Rose.
