• **TELEVISION:** The game will be televised nationally by ESPN. Roxy Bernstein (pxp) and Bill Walton (analyst) will call the action.

• **RADIO:** The Longhorn IMG Radio Network broadcast every UT game on the statewide network. Craig Way (pxp) and Roger Wallace (analyst) will call the action for this game remotely. Check www.TexasSports.com for a listing of affiliates carrying the game.

• **SERIES:** Texas leads, 2-0. Last meeting: Texas 104-83 (Nov. 20, 1991; Austin).

NOTABLES

• **THE SMART ERA BEGINS:** Friday's contest marks the debut of head coach Shaka Smart at Texas. In six seasons at VCU, Smart led the Rams to a 163-56 (.744) mark and five NCAA tourney appearances, including a trip to the 2011 Final Four. VCU and Duke are the only programs in the country to have won at least 26 games in each of the past six years.

• **MAKING HISTORY:** Texas and Washington will play in the first regular season game (professional or collegiate) in China.

• **FOR OPENERS:** The Horns have won 13 straight season openers and have posted an overall mark of 90-19 (.824) in its previous 109 season-opening games.

• **DEPTH AND EXPERIENCE:** Texas returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from last year's team. The Horns return 70 percent of their scoring, 66 percent of their rebounding and 76 percent of their minutes played from the 2014-15 roster.

Head Coach: Shaka Smart, 0-0 at Texas (1st year); 163-56 overall (7th year)

THE 110th SEASON

- Texas tips off its 110th season of intercollegiate basketball when it faces Washington as part of the Pac-12 China Game, presented by Alibaba Group, on Friday night (11 a.m. local time on Saturday in Shanghai).
- The Longhorns hold an all-time record of 1,178-1,022 (.627) in their previous 109 years of competition.
- UT played its first varsity basketball contest on March 10, 1906 and recorded a 27-17 win against Baylor in Austin. The Horns have fielded a varsity basketball team every year since then with the exception of the 1907-08 season.

DEBUT OF THE SHAKA SMART ERA

- Friday night's season opener against Washington marks the debut of the **Shaka Smart** era at Texas.
- The 38-year-old Smart was introduced as the 24th head basketball coach at The University of Texas on April 3, 2015.
- He spent the previous six seasons at Virginia Commonwealth University, leading the Rams to an overall record of 163-56 (.744) and five NCAA Tournament appearances including the 2011 Final Four.
- **The 163 wins tied Smart for the second-highest number of total victories during the first six years of a head coaching career in NCAA history** (Brad Stevens, Butler; 166-49 in 2008-12).
- VCU and Duke are the only two programs in the country to have posted at least 26 wins in each of the past six seasons.
- VCU is one of only 11 schools in the nation to earn an NCAA Tournament bid in each of the past five years (Cincinnati, Duke, Gonzaga, Kansas, Louisville, Michigan State, North Carolina, Ohio State, San Diego State and Wisconsin).

MAKING HISTORY IN SHANGHAI, CHINA

- Friday night's contest marks the first regular-season basketball contest, collegiate or professional, to be played in China.
- The event is hosted by the Pac-12 Conference as part of the league's Globalization Initiative.
- Alibaba Group, the world's largest online and mobile commerce company based in Hanzhou, is the presenting sponsor for this game. In addition to ESPN's coverage, the game will be distributed live via Alibaba's mobile and digital distribution platforms.
- Texas departed Austin at 3:30 a.m. CT on Saturday, Nov. 7. The team traveled via bus to Dallas and flew to Shanghai, arriving on Sunday at 5 p.m. Chinese time. UT spent Monday, Tuesday and part of Wednesday in Hangzhou, then returned to Shanghai for the remainder of its stay.

TEXAS IN SEASON OPENERS

- Texas has posted an overall mark of 90-19 (.826) in its previous 108 season-opening games.
- **UT has won 13 straight season-opening games entering Friday's contest.** This streak dates back to the start of the 2002-03 Final Four season. UT's last loss in a season opener came in an 88-74 defeat to Arizona on Nov. 17, 2001 in Austin.

WASHINGTON SERIES INFO

- Friday's contest marks the third meeting between Texas and Washington on the hardcourt.

- Texas holds a 2-0 lead in the all-time series against Washington that dates back to the 1942-43 season.
- In the first meeting (March 26, 1943), UT recorded a 59-55 win in the 1943 NCAA Western Regional in Kansas City, Mo. At that time, the NCAA Tournament only featured an eight-team field, so **the Texas-Washington game was essentially an NCAA quarterfinal matchup.** With the win, UT technically advanced to its first Final Four before falling to Wyoming 58-54 two days later in Kansas City.
- In the most recent matchup (Nov. 20, 1991), Texas registered a 104-83 home victory in the Chase Preseason NIT First Round (season opener for both teams).

TARLETON STATE EXHIBITION NOTES

- Texas posted a 95-61 home victory against Tarleton State (ranked preseason No. 2 in NCAA Division II poll) in an exhibition contest on Friday, Nov. 6.
- UT went 12-of-30 (.400) from three-point range and hit 23-of-27 from the FT line.
- Texas limited Tarleton State to 32.7% FG shooting (18-of-55), including a 5-of-22 (.227) mark from beyond the arc.
- Six different Horns hit at least one 3-pointer. Six different UT players scored at least eight points.
- **Cameron Ridley** posted a double-double with 15 points and 13 rebounds in just 18 minutes.
- The freshman trio of **Eric Davis, Jr.** (12), **Tevin Mack** (16) and **Kerwin Roach, Jr.** (16 points) combined for 44 points.

FREQUENT FLYER LONGHORNS

- UT's trip to Shanghai, China for its season opener is just the beginning of a unique early-season travel schedule for the Longhorns.
- After returning to Austin following a week in China, the Horns will spend eight days at home (play home opener on Saturday, Nov. 21) before leaving the country again for a five-day trip to the Bahamas (Nov. 23-27) to participate in the Battle 4 Atlantis.
- UT's non-conference schedule later includes a lengthy travel trip west to face Stanford (Dec. 19).
- **The roundtrip mileage breakdown for these three early-season trips totals 20,488 miles** (distance from Austin to Shanghai: 7,465 miles; distance from Austin to Atlantis: 1,297 miles; distance from Austin to Palo Alto, Calif.: 1,482 miles)

NAVY SEAL TEAM TRAINING

- After using Navy SEAL training for his final four years at VCU, Shaka Smart and strength/conditioning coach Daniel Roose brought the program to Texas.
- All players and members of the UT coaching and support staff took part in a three-day training session in late September.
- The goals of the training session were to improve communication, leadership and team-building.
- John McGuire, who spent 10 years as a Navy SEAL and the past 17 years organizing training sessions incorporating some of the same rugged regimens, led the training.

FIVE CORE VALUES OF TEXAS BASKETBALL

- Upon Smart's arrival at Texas, he laid out his five core values for the Texas Basketball program:
- **APPRECIATION:** We see every opportunity as a gift.
- **ENTHUSIASM:** We are passionate and excited about our process for success.
- **COMPETITIVENESS:** We aggressively pursue excellence.
- **TEAMSHIP:** We commit fully to aligning ourselves with the team.
- **ACCOUNTABILITY:** We are responsible for our team and ourselves.

A CONSISTENT DANCER

- Texas has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 16 of the last 17 and 24 of the last 27 years.
- UT has made a total of 32 all-time appearances in the NCAA Tournament (35-35 record).

WHAT RETURNS ...

- Texas returns four starters (guards **Isaiah Taylor** and **Demarcus Holland**, forward **Connor Lammert** and center **Cameron Ridley**) and 11 letterwinners from last year's team.
- The Horns return 70 percent of their scoring, 66 percent of their rebounding and 76 percent of their minutes played from the 2014-15 roster.

... AND WHAT WAS LOST

- Texas loses the services of a four-year starter at power forward in **Jonathan Holmes** and first-round NBA Draft pick forward/center **Myles Turner**.
- Holmes played in 127 career games (108 starts) and concluded his career ranked 24th on UT's all-time scoring list (1,166 points), ninth in rebounds (749) and 11th in blocks (113). He ranked second on the team in scoring (10.3 ppg) and rebounding (6.1 rpg) last year.
- Turner was the No. 11 pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Indiana Pacers. The 2015 Big 12 Freshman of the Year led the team in rebounding (6.5 rpg) and blocks (89) and ranked third in scoring (10.1 ppg).

FIVE-MAN SENIOR CLASS

- Texas will be led by a five-man senior class that includes: guards **Javan Felix** and **Demarcus Holland**, forward **Connor Lammert** and centers **Prince Ibeh** and **Cameron Ridley**.
- These five players have combined to play in a total of 510 games (252 starts) entering the 2015-16 season.

TAYLOR GETTING THE POINT

Junior **Isaiah Taylor** returns for his third year as the starting point guard. He has played in 59 career games (all starts) and has reached double figures in scoring 44 times, including eight 20-point performances.

- **Taylor was named to the five-person Preseason All-Big 12 Men's Basketball team.**
- He earned All-Big 12 Third Team honors as a sophomore in 2014-15, when he led the team in scoring (13.1 ppg), assists (4.6 apg), steals (23) and minutes (31.5 mpg).
- Taylor converted 85-of-101 (.842) free throws, added 3.2 rebounds per game and posted a 110-to-63 (1.75-to-1) assist-to-turnover ratio last year.
- He sports a career 1.72-to-1 turnover ratio (251 assists, 146 turnovers), which ranks eighth on the UT chart entering the season.
- Taylor also is a candidate for Academic All-America honors, earning Academic All-Big 12 First Team accolades as a sophomore.

HOLLAND IS THE GLUE

Senior **Demarcus Holland** returns for his fourth season in the backcourt rotation. The unquestioned team leader and "glue guy," he has played in all 103 career games (74 starts). Holland has reached double figures in scoring 22 times and in rebounds three times.

- A Big 12 All-Defensive Team selection as a sophomore in 2013-14, Holland has earned the team's Most Outstanding Defensive Player award in each of his first three seasons.
- He ranked second on the team in assists (82) and minutes (28.7 mpg) and sixth in scoring (7.1 ppg) last year.
- Holland shot a team-best 45.6 percent from 3-point range (26-of-57) last season.

RIDLEY'S RESUME

Senior center **Cameron Ridley** returns for his fourth season as a starter in the frontcourt rotation. He has played in 102 career games (85 starts) and reached double figures in scoring 32 times and in rebounds 19 times. Ridley has posted 13 career double-doubles entering the 2015-16 season.

- Ridley ranked second on the team in blocks (60), fourth in rebounding (5.3 rpg) and fifth in scoring (8.0 ppg) while averaging 21.4 minutes per contest.
- He hit the game-winning putback against Arizona State at the buzzer in the 2014 NCAA Second Round as a sophomore.
- Ridley earned USBWA All-District VII Team, All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and Big 12 All-Defensive Team accolades in his sophomore season.

PRINCE'S PRESENCE

Senior center **Prince Ibeh** returns for his fourth season in the frontcourt rotation. He has played in all 103 career games (six starts). In his career, he has reached double figures in scoring four times and in rebounding one time.

- Ibeh ranked third on the team with 47 blocks last season while playing just 10.6 minutes per contest.
- He shared the team's Outstanding Defensive Player honor with Demarcus Holland.
- Ibeh blocked at least three shots in six games last year.

RIDLEY & IBEH LEAD BLOCK PARTY

The Longhorns set a single-season team record for most blocked shots last season. UT recorded 265 blocks in its 34 games. The previous single-season team record was 206 blocks (set in 2013-14).

- UT averaged 7.8 blocks per contest last year. **Texas ranked FIRST nationally in blocks per game in the 2014-15 season.**
- The Horns reached double figures in blocked shots a total of eight times last year.
- Texas twice set the school single-game record for most blocked shots (14) last year. UT had 14 blocks at No. 8/9 Kansas (Feb. 28) and repeated the feat against K-State (March 7) in the regular-season finale. This also set a school mark for most blocks in a Big 12 game.
- UT set a single-game record for most blocked shots in a half (10) during the first half against Lipscomb (Dec. 16). The Horns matched that mark with 10 blocks in the first half against K-State (March 7).
- Senior centers **Cameron Ridley** (fourth) and **Prince Ibeh** (eighth) both enter the 2014-15 season ranked in the top eight in school history in career blocked shots.

LAMMERT PLAYING LARGE

Senior forward **Connor Lammert** returns for his fourth season in the frontcourt rotation. He has played in all 103 career games (39 starts). In his career, he has reached double figures in scoring 12 times and in rebounds six times and has two double-doubles.

- He ranked third on the team in rebounding (5.4 rpg) and fifth in assists (43) while playing 22.1 minutes per game.
- Lammert posted three double-digit rebounding efforts last year, including 10 boards in the NCAA Tournament loss to No. 22/22 Butler (March 19).

CLEANING THE GLASS

- Texas posted a +8.5 rebound margin (39.7-31.3) during the 2014-15 season. **The rebound margin (+8.5) ranked fourth nationally.**
- UT outrebounded its opponent in 27 of its 34 contests last season and posted a double-digit rebound advantage in 17 of those games.

YANCY EMERGES

Junior guard **Kendal Yancy** returns for his third season in the backcourt rotation. He has played in 68 career games (28 starts). In his career, he has reached double figures in scoring 11 times.

- Yancy was named the team's Most Improved Player last season.
- He ranked fourth on the team in assists (59) and seventh in scoring (6.3 ppg) in 21.3 minutes per contest.
- Yancy averaged 10.5 ppg while hitting 4-of-8 threes and added six assists without a turnover at last season's Phillips 66 Big 12 Championship.
- He set career highs in points (29), field goals made (9-of-17), three-pointers made (6-of-9) and free throws made (5-of-6) in 32 minutes against No. 14/14 Iowa State (Feb. 21) last year.

THE FELIX FILE

Senior guard **Javan Felix** returns for his fourth season in the backcourt rotation. He has played in 99 career games (48 starts). In his career, Felix has reached double figures in scoring 43 times, including seven 20-point performances.

- Felix ranked third on the team in assists (61) and fourth in scoring (8.7 ppg) in 23.3 minutes per game last season.
- He reached double figures in scoring 14 times last year.
- Felix earned All-Big 12 Honorable Mention accolades (by league's coaches) as a sophomore in 2013-14.
- He enters the season just 103 points shy of reaching the 1,000-career point plateau.

BARNETT MAKING STRIDES

Sophomore forward **Jordan Barnett** returns for his second season with the Longhorns. A versatile player who may see action at the small forward or power forward spot, he played in 21 games last year and averaged 1.9 points and 1.3 rebounds in 8.5 minutes per contest.

- Barnett had a season-high 11 points (4-of-5 FG, 3-of-3 threes), four rebounds, one assist and two steals in a season-high 24 minutes against Lipscomb (Dec. 16).

WHAT'S NEW ??

Texas adds a total of four newcomers to its rotation for the 2015-16 season. All three incoming freshmen were ranked among the Top 50 recruits nationally by ESPN last spring, and junior transfer **Shaquille Cleare** was tabbed as the No. 30 prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year in high school.

- Junior forward **Shaquille Cleare** (pronounced: CLAIR) sat out the 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules, after spending his freshman and sophomore years at Maryland (69 games played, 28 starts). Cleare was a high school teammate of UT guard **Isaiah Taylor** during Cleare's senior season (Taylor's junior year) at The Village School in Houston.
- Freshman guard **Eric Davis, Jr.** was tabbed the No. 45 prospect in the nation by ESPN following his senior year. A Jordan Brand All-American and finalist for Mr. Basketball in the state of Michigan as a senior, he led Saginaw Arthur Hill HS (Saginaw, Mich.) to a 24-4 mark and trip to the Class A state championship game while averaging 25 points, seven assists and six rebounds per game.
- Freshman guard/forward **Tevin Mack** was tabbed the No. 48 overall prospect in the country by ESPN following his senior year. The South Carolina 3A co-Player of the Year as a senior, he averaged nearly 30 points and nine rebounds per game while pacing Dreher HS (Columbia, S.C.) to an 18-7 record and the third round of the state playoffs.
- Freshman guard **Kerwin Roach, Jr.** was tabbed the No. 34 prospect in the nation by Rivals.com and No. 47 by ESPN following his senior season. He averaged 20.7 points, 4.8 assists and 3.0 steals per game while pacing North Shore HS (Houston, Texas) to a 27-7 mark as a senior. Roach led his team to the Class 5A state title in his junior year. He also competed in track and field and won back-to-back Class 5A state championships in the triple jump as a junior and senior.

SUCCESS IN THE CLASSROOM

- Texas Basketball has received public recognition awards for its multi-year NCAA Division I Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the last six years (2010-15). The awards are given to teams scoring in the Top 10 percent of all squads in their respective sport. **UT has earned a perfect 1,000 score in each of the last six multi-year APR reports.** In addition, Men's Basketball has posted perfect 1,000 APR single-year scores in EVERY season dating back to 2005-06 (nine consecutive years).
- Six Texas players earned a spot on the 2015 Academic All-Big 12 Men's Basketball Team. **UT's five first-team selections were the top mark in the conference.** Texas and West Virginia paced the league with six total selections. **Demarcus Holland, Prince Ibeh, Connor Lammert, Tarale Murry and Isaiah Taylor** were named to the First Team, while **Kendal Yancy** was selected to the Second Team.

THREE-POINT STREAK

The last time Texas did not convert a three-pointer in a contest came on Dec. 18, 1990, in an 87-84 overtime victory at UC-Santa Barbara. The Horns were 0-of-2 from beyond the arc on that day. **The Longhorns enter the 2015-16 season having hit at least one 3-pointer in 825 consecutive games.** In fact, UT has converted at least one three-pointer in 953 of 959 games since the trey was introduced prior to the 1986-87 season. The Horns have failed to attempt at least one three-pointer just one time in school history (Feb. 24, 1988; at TCU, 69-55 win).

OFF THE COURT WITH THE HORNS



- **Jordan Barnett's** father, Bob Bonner, played basketball at Midwestern State University (Wichita Falls, Texas) for four years. Jordan and his mom (Karen Barnett) lived in San Antonio, when Jordan was two-to-six years old.
- **Shaquille Cleare's** father, Brian, played basketball at the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma (Chickasha, Okla.). He wears jersey No. 32 to honor his father, who also wore No. 32 during his collegiate playing days. - **Eric Davis'** father, Eric Sr., played football at Saginaw Valley College (1992-94). His uncle, Tony Davis, played basketball at the University of Minnesota.
- **Javan Felix** is oldest of four children (has three younger sisters). The Felix family was forced to relocate to Atlanta for four months while Javan was in sixth grade due to Hurricane Katrina (August 2005). The family was able to return to New Orleans in January 2006. Felix has interest in becoming an NBA General Manager following his playing career.
- **Demarcus Holland** moved to Dallas from Tyler when he was in the second grade. He has one older brother, Derrick, Jr., and three younger brothers, Craig, Desmond and Devon.
- **Prince Ibeh** was born in London and lived there for his first five years. He moved with his family to Amarillo, Texas at age five and lived there until he was 10 years old. The family then moved to Dallas when Prince was 10. His parents (Francis and Charity) lived in Mbaise, Nigeria before moving to London in 1987. Prince's middle name is Chinenye (pronounced KEN-yay). The name in Nigerian means "god's gift." Prince has three older brothers and one younger sister.
- **Connor Lammert** has an older brother, Clark, who played basketball at Texas Tech (2012-15). His father, Dean Lammert, played basketball at Texas A&I University (now called Texas A&M University-Kingsville) from 1980-83. His mother, the former Christi Scherrey, played volleyball at Texas A&I University from 1979-82.
- **Tevin Mack's** brother, Jermaine Washington, played basketball for two seasons at the University of Nevada (2003-05). In Washington's senior year, Nevada defeated Texas in the 2005 NCAA First Round.
- **Kerwin Roach's** father, Kerwin Sr., played basketball at Texas Southern University. Kerwin is an elite triple jumper who plans to compete for Texas in the outdoor season. He won back-to-back 5A state championships in the triple jump for North Shore HS as a junior (2014) and senior (2015). Roach also set a Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays meet record with a jump of 50-8.00 (15.44 meters) in April 2015 on the UT campus.
- **Isaiah Taylor's** uncle, Terrell Lowery, played basketball at Loyola Marymount (1989-92). As a sophomore on the 1990 LMU squad that advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Tournament, Lowery also played professional baseball, including stints with the Chicago Cubs (1997-98), Tampa Bay Devil Rays (1999) and the San Francisco Giants (2000).
- **Kendal Yancy's** brother, Terrel Harris, played basketball at Oklahoma State and went on to play professionally with the Miami Heat (2011-2013) and New Orleans Hornets.

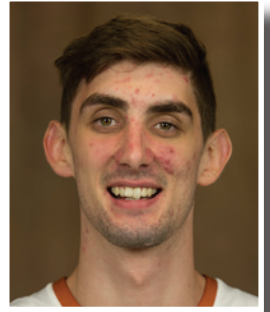

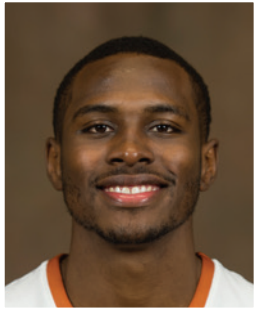

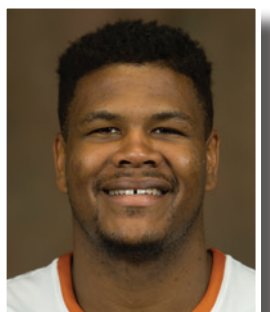
