Texas Tech Head Coach Kliff Kingsbury

On winning at Texas: We tried not to play it up to big. We knew it would be a tough challenge on senior night with a very good University of Texas football team. We are excited to get it done. I don't think execution-wise offensively or defensively tackling we were very good. You have to give them credit on making it difficult on us.

On final play to Jakeem Grant: Yeah, I need to cite that. That play was from the Auburn vs. Texas A&M game. Coach [Eric] Morris was watching the game live and saw it and got the film and we put it in practice this week and ran it.

On facing adversity this season: We haven't played well on the road. Some of that is having tough opponents but we haven't been able to get it done on the road. Even tonight, there was a lack of execution. You have to give a lot of credit to the University of Texas fighting for their bowl life and just playing hard.

On significance of winning at Arkansas and Texas: To get two quality road wins, which we have struggled on the road traditionally, is a big step and we have to keep building on it.

On Patrick Mahomes winning against Texas: I told him [Patrick Mahomes] I never did it. I never even came close on the road. Early he was trying a little to hard, but he hung in there and kept making plays and has put himself in very rare company by winning here.
