SIGNIFICANT NUMBERS

48,093 — Attendance. Texas ranked 8th in the nation in home attendance in 2014.

0 — Points scored by Baylor on its first drive. Entering today's contest, the Bears were the **only team in the nation** to score on its opening drive in every game this season.

9 — With the start today for P.J. Locke it marks the 9th true freshman to start a game for the Longhorns this season.

30.9 — Baylor's average points scored in the first half leading into today's game. Texas held the Bears scoreless in the first half for the first time since Oct. 29, 2011 when Baylor trailed Oklahoma State, 35-0.

11-3 — UT's record under Charlie Strong when the Longhorns score first.

25.0% — Texas held Baylor to 25% on third downs today. The Bears were 4-of-16 overall and went 2-of-9 in the first half.

172 — The difference in offense in today's contest. Texas won the game despite being outgained 479-307.

POSTGAME NOTES

TEAM NOTES

- Texas Team Captains: Seniors **Desmond Jackson, Johnathan Gray and Duke Thomas**. Texas won the toss and deferred to the second half. Baylor elected to receive the opening kickoff.
- Series: Texas is now **75-26-4 against Baylor** all-time and **30-16-2 in Waco** against the Bears. This is UT's first game played in McLane Stadium.
- Texas took over on downs and held Baylor scoreless on the Bears' opening drive of the game. It was the **first time this season Baylor did not score** on its opening possession.
- Entering today's game Baylor was outscoring opponents **18.2-8.5 in the first quarter**. Texas held a 17-0 lead after the first 15 minutes today. Texas led 20-0 at halftime. The last time Baylor went scoreless in the first half was **Oct. 29, 2011** at Oklahoma State (35-0). Before today's contest, Baylor had outscored opponents 340-159 in the first half for an average of 30.9-14.5.
- UT's last win over a ranked opponent on the road was **Nov. 3, 2012** at Texas Tech, 31-22.

OFFENSE

Chris Warren III, RB

- Rushed for 106 yards on 28 carries to post back-to-back 100-yard games to close the 2015 season.
- He becomes the 12th freshman in school history to post two 100-yard games in a season.

Tyrone Swoopes, QB

- Completed 12-of-19 passes for 151 yards and one TD.
- Ran for 52 yards on 10 carries with 1 TD.
- Finished the season with 12 rushing TDs to lead the team.

Caleb Bluiett, TE

- Caught a 57-yard TD pass from Swoopes on UT's third play from scrimmage to take an early 7-0.
- Was the 8th-longest reception in Texas program history by a TE and 4th-longest TD reception by a tight end.
- Bluiett's only other TD of the season came in the 24-17 upset of No. 10/9 Oklahoma.

DEFENSE

P.J. Locke, CB

- Forced the first fumble of his career during the first quarter. The turnover later resulted in a 9-yard TD run by the Longhorns.

Duke Thomas, CB

- Pulled his first INT of the season and 7th of his career.

Jason Hall, S

- Pulled in his second INT of the season and his career during the second quarter today. Hall was credited with a 17-yd return. He ran the ball back inside Baylor's 10-yd line but was called back due to a holding penalty during the return.

Poona Ford, DT

- Forced and recovered a fumble in the fourth quarter that helped Texas take time off the clock and potentially pin Baylor deep in its own territory for its final drive.

SPECIAL TEAMS

Nick Rose, PK

- Nailed a career-long 53-yd FG late in the second quarter to give Texas a 20-0 lead.
- Was the longest FG by a Longhorn since Kris Stockton connected from 53 yards vs. Rice in 1998, a span of 227 games.
- Went 3-for-4 on FGs today. The last time Rose made 3 FGs was last season against Oklahoma State.
