A LOOK AT THE MATCHUP

- Texas leads the all-time series with UT Arlington 56-17, and holds a 55-17 lead at UFCU Disch-Falk Field.
- The only prior meeting between the two clubs not at home for Texas was on Feb. 6, 2007, at Dell Diamond in Round Rock while UFCU Disch-Falk Field was being renovated.
- The Longhorns are making their first appearance at Globe Life Park (formerly the Ballpark in Arlington) since the 2004 Big 12 Tournament was held there.

A LOOK AT THE LONGHORNS

- ► The Texas baseball team ranks in the Top 25 of each major college baseball poll (Collegiate Baseball - 14; NCBWA - 14; USA Today Coaches Poll - 16; D1Baseball.com - 17; Perfect Game -18; Baseball America - 21).
- Ben Johnson leads the Big 12 in hits (38), batting average (.432), total bases (58) and slugging percentage (.659) and Collin Shaw leads the league in doubles with 13 (Chart on p. 3).
- ▶ The Longhorns mashed 10 extra base hits in the three-game set vs. WVU (5 2B, 2 3B, 3 HR), giving them 65 (43 doubles, 8 triples, 14 home runs) through the first 20 games. At this point last season, Texas had 27 extra base hits (15 doubles, 9 3B, 3 HR). (Chart on p. 3).
- ▶ Of Texas' 114 runs, 59 have come with two outs this season (51.8%) after eight of its 15 runs scored against WVU this past weekend came with two down. The Horns are hitting .295 (66-for-224) with two outs this season.
- ▶ In contrast, Texas is holding opponents to a .210 batting avg. (43-for-205) with two down in the inning.
- ▶ Texas has now scored 83 of its 114 runs (72.8%) on the year in innings where the leadoff man reaches base safely. Longhorn leadoff hitters are reaching base 39.1% of the time (68 of 174 innings).
- ▶ UT is outscoring its opponents 48-12 from the seventh inning on this year, and is 9-0 when leading after the sixth inning.
- Connor Mayes picked up Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors on Monday after striking out 10 in 6 2/3 scoreless innings of relief vs. West Virginia last Saturday.



- ▶ The Horns are 13th in the country in walks and walked 12 times in the past three games to give them 97 base on balls in their first 20 contests.
- ► Texas has four players hitting over .300: Ben Johnson (.432), Michael Cantu (.328) Collin Shaw (.313) and Tres Barrera (.310).
- The same four players all also boast an OPS over .800: Johnson (1.122), Barrera (1.012), Shaw (.916) and Cantu (.877). Mark Payton (.811) was the only Longhorn with an OPS over .800 last season and 2015 currently holds a .808 OPS after having a .709 in 2014.
- ▶ Johnson has recorded multiple hits in 12 of the first 20 games this season, and has had five games with three or more hits thus far (more on Johnson on p. 3).
- Both Johnson (March 8) and Barrera (Feb. 17) have had five-hit games this season, marking the first time two Longhorns have recorded five-hit games in the same year since 2007 (Josh Prince and Bradley Suttle, chart on p. 5).
- Parker French earned the 19th win of his career against Stanford (March 7), and holds a season ERA of 1.72 which ranks fifth in the Big 12. His nine inning seven strikeout performance on Friday (March 13) vs. West Virginia was a career high in innings pitched and season high in strikeouts.
- ▶ The Longhorn bullpen boasts a 1.56 ERA on the season after outstanding efforts from freshmen Connor Mayes (6 2/3 IP, 10 K, 0 R) and Kyle Johnston (2 IP, 3 K, 0 R) this past weekend vs. WVU (more on p. 3).
- ▶ The pitching staff tossed three consecutive shutouts Feb. 28-29 vs. Minnesota, which was the first time Texas has done that since March 22-24, 2002, against UTPA. Prior to that, Texas hadn't recorded three straight since 1983 vs. Dallas Baptist.
- ▶ The 31 runs scored by the Longhorns in the Minnesota series was the highest total in a four-game set since they had 34 against Dallas Baptist in 1989.
- Longhorn base runners swiped six bases Feb. 22 against Minnesota, the most since they had six steals against California on March 30, 2012.

2014 COMPARISON - The 2015 Longhorn offense has posted very impressive numbers through 20 games compared to the 2014 squad that finished tied for third in the nation. The team batting average is currently 36 points higher than last season, and this year's lineup has mashed 38 more extra base hits than this time last year (including 11 additional home runs). Conversely, the 2015 pitching staff has surrendered only nine more extra base hits than the 2014 team in the first 20 contests (29 XBH in 2015, 20 XBH in 2014) . There is a full statistical comparison through 20 games on page seven.

BEN AT HIS BEST - Ben Johnson set a new a career high when he had five hits (5-for-5) in the series finale against Stanford (March 8). Johnson is the second Longhorn to post a five-hit game this season (Tres Barrera 5-for-6 vs. UTSA on Feb. 17), and just the ninth UT batter to accomplish the feat since 2003 (chart on page five). Through the first 20 games, the junior left fielder is 38-for-88 (.432) with three doubles, four triples, three home runs, 16 RBIs, 16 runs scored and two stolen bases. With two outs, Johnson is hitting .476 (10-for-21) with eight RBI, including a three-run HR. Johnson leads the Big 12 (3rd in NCAA) in hits (38), batting average (.432), slugging percentage (.659) and total bases (58).

BULLPEN STRENGTH - The bullpen has tossed 80 2/3 innings this season and given up just 14 earned runs (1.56 ERA). Senior Kirby Bellow (1.88 ERA), who earned his first career save in game three of the Stanford series, leads the relievers with 14 1/3 innings pitched and nine appearances on the year. Additionaly, Connor Mayes has not allowed a run in 12 1/3 innings of work out of the bullpen while striking out 13, Jon Malmin has a 0.87 ERA in 10 1/3 IP and Travis Duke boasts a career ERA of 1.09 in 74 1/3 innings of work. Mayes, Jake McKenzie (6 1/3 IP) and Andy McGuire (3 IP) are all yet to allow a run out of the pen.

BIG 12 LEADERS - Several Longhorns are at or near the top of the Big 12 in a number of categories, including Ben Johnson leading the conference in hits, batting average, slugging percentage and total bases.

DOUBLE PLAY DUO - Texas second baseman Brooks Marlow and shortstop C.J Hinojosa helped Texas finish first in the Big 12 and tied for second nationally with 71 double plays in 2014. Last season, Marlow was involved in 56 of the double plays and Hinojosa 49, and Marlow has had a hand in 121 double plays in his career, which is fourth in school history. In its first 20 games in 2015, Texas has turned 21 double plays (tied for 17th in the NCAA), with Hinojosa contributing on 17 and Marlow on 12.

FLASHING THE LEATHER - Senior second baseman Brooks Marlow was named to the 2014 Rawlings Division I Gold Glove Team. Marlow, a four year starter at second base, fielded at a .991 clip last season and holds a .980 career fielding percentage.

WEEKLY AWARDS - Freshman catcher Michael Cantu was the first Longhorn award winner for 2015 after earning Big 12 Newcomer of the Week Honors (Feb. 16-22). The freshman catcher tied for the team lead with seven RBIs on the week while adding six runs and a pair of doubles, and he drew a team-high six walks to have a team-best .545 on-base percentage. - Freshman pitcher Connor Mayes earned Newcomer of the Week Honors March 9-15. The right-hander from Lake Travis tossed 6 2/3 scoreless innings with a career-high 10 strikeouts, while allowing just three hits and issuing one walk in a relief outing vs. West Virginia on March 14. It was the first doule-digit strikeout game for a UT pitcher since Taylor Jungmann struck ot 12 Aggies on May 19, 2011 in nine innings of work.

NEW BASEBALL FOR 2015 - NCAA Baseball will begin using a flat-seamed ball for the 2015 season. The new balls will travel approximately 20 feet farther when hit deep into the outfield than the raised-seamed balls used in the past.

• From the NCAA: "Flat-seamed baseballs launched out of a pitching machine at averages of 95 mph, a 25-degree angle and a 1,400 rpm spin rate traveled around 387 feet compared to raised-seamed baseballs that went 367 feet. Due to variables, not every trajectory hit with a flat-seamed ball will travel exactly 20 feet farther than a raised-seamed ball, but a 20-foot average difference is an approximate representation of what can be expected." **TEXAS DEBUTS** - Eleven players have made their collegiate debuts for Texas far this season: freshman infielder Joe Baker, redshirt freshman third baseman Bret Boswell, freshman catcher Michael Cantu, freshman pitcher Kyle Johnston, freshman first baseman Travis Jones, redshirt freshman infielder/DH Connor Macalla, freshman catcher Michael McCann, freshman pitcher/infielder Jake McKenzie, freshman outfielder Patrick Mathis, freshman pitcher Connor Mayes, freshman pitcher Tyler Schimpf ... Additionally, sophomores Kacy Clemens and Andy McGuire made their first appearances as a pitcher and sophomore Josh Sawyer made his first career start. Several of these players who made their debuts have contributed to the Longhorns success this season:

- Joe Baker earned his first career on Feb. 21 against Minnesota (game 1) as the designated hitter, going 1-for-2 with a walk, a hit and a run scored in the game.
- Has reached base in 7 of 13 plate appearances thus far this season.
- **Bret Boswell** had a two-out single to extend the top of the 10th inning against Rice (Feb. 15) and set the table for the game-winning hit.
- Had a 3-for-5 day with a double two RBIs and a run scored against UTPA (Feb. 25) that included a walk-off RBI single.
- For the season, Boswell is second on the team in doubles (7) and tied for third in runs (14).
- **Michael Cantu** had five RBIs Feb. 20 vs. Minnesota, marking the first time a freshman has done that since Cohl Walla and Jonathan Walsh both achieved it during the 2010 season.
- Named Big 12 Co-Newcomer of the week for the week of Feb. 16-22. Had a team-high .545 OBP for the week, and tied for the team lead with seven RBIs.
- Is second on the team with a .328 batting average through the first 20 games, first on the squad with 17 walks and is tied for third in runs scored with 14.
- **Kyle Johnston** earned his first career save in his first inning pitched on (Feb. 15) by retiring two batters and preserving a 4-3 Texas lead.
- In 8 2/3 frames this year, Johnston sports a 2.08 ERA with six strikeouts.
- Connor Macalla lifted a sacrifice fly to centerfield to give Texas a 4-3, 10 inning win over West Virginia on March 13.
- **Connor Mayes** tossed a scoreless eighth inning at Rice on Feb. 13 in a 3-1 Texas win in his college debut.
- Pitched three scoreless innings vs. UTSA (Feb. 17) to earn his first collegiate win in his first-career start.
- Spun 6 2/3 innings of shutout relief vs. West Virginia March 14, surrendering just three hits and one walk while striking out 10.
- Holds a 1.59 ERA in 11 1/3 innings this year with eight strikeouts and has not allowed a run in relief (5 2/3 IP).
- Michael McCann smashed a game-winning RBI double in the top of the 10th inning on Feb. 15 to give Texas a 4-3 lead.
- Had two hits and a run scored against UTSA (Feb. 17).
- Jake McKenzie drew a walk and scored a run in his first career start in the Longhorns' 4-3 win over Rice on Feb. 15.
- Has pitch 6 1/3 innings scoreless innings on the season, allowing just two hits and three walks while striking out six.

These quick freshman contributions should not come as a surprise, as Texas' 2014 recruiting class was ranked seventh-best in the nation by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The Longhorns signed 10 players for the class of 2014, eight of which are from the state of Texas. Despite three of those being selected in the MLB Draft this summer (RHP Tyler Schimpf, C Michael Cantu, INF Travis Jones), all 10 players reported to campus and of the 21 players signed in the last two years, 20 have joined the Longhorns on the 40 Acres.

HIT PARADE - Against UTSA (Feb. 17), the Texas offense accumulated 20 base hits, a feat that has only been accomplished by the Horns five other times since 2003. It was the first time the Longhorns had 20 hits in a game in the BBCOR bat era, and marked the only time since 2003 that it had been done at UFCU Disch-Falk Field in a nine-inning game (the 20 hits against Boston College spanned 25 innings). Texas followed that performance with a 17 hit, 13 run outing on Feb. 20 against Minnesota. Their 27 runs in the those two games are the most in back-to-back games since they had 35 vs. UT Arlington and Oklahoma State on April 20th and 23rd of 2010.

SPEED IN THE OUTFIELD - UT has the potential for speed on the base paths, including the three starting outfielders who combined for 43 steals in 2014 (Ben Johnson - 21, Collin Shaw - 13, Zane Gurwitz - 9). Johnson not only led the squad with his 21 swiped bags, but was also not thrown out all season. Through 20 games in 2015, though, Johnson has stolen just two bags, and Shaw and Gurwitz each have one.

EXPERIENCE AT THE PLATE - Of the eight positional starters at the College World Series last year, Texas returned seven in 2015 (though first baseman Kacy Clemens makes the switch to pitcher). Juniors C.J Hinojosa (.298 avg. and a nine game hit streak in 2014) and Ben Johnson (.405 slg pct. & 21 SB in 2014) lead the way while sophomores Tres Barrera (5 HR & 35 RBI in 2014) and Zane Gurwitz (.284 avg. & 10 2B in 2014) are building off successful freshman campaigns. The six returners who are seeing regular playing time have helped Texas to a .275 team batting average and an average of 5.7 runs a game through the first 20 games. The team also currently has an OPS of .808 after posting a .709 OPS in 2014.

SENIOR ANCHOR - For the second year in a row the Longhorns' pitching staff is anchored by an experienced senior. Parker French (7-5, 2.41 ERA in 2014) is filling the role Nathan Thornhill (9-3, 1.51 ERA) played in 2014 in leading a young Texas pitching staff.

- In his first five starts of 2015, French is 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA (5th in Big 12). In 31 1/3 innings, he has allowed just 25 hits, while holding opponents to a .229 batting average.
- French is the active career Big 12 leader in innings pitched (280) and wins (19).
- The outfield will also have senior leadership once again with the presen 4 The Horns entered the series vs. West Virginia 10th in the country in walks and walked 12 times in the past three games to give them 97 base on balls in their first 20 contests. ce of Collin Shaw (.355 OBP & 12 SB in 2014). Shaw had an impressive NCAA Tournament in 2014, hitting .324, and he fielded .991 on the season with four outfield assists and several tremendous diving catches throughout the year.
- In the first 20 games this season, Shaw is second in the NCAA with13 doubles. He is hitting .313 with an .916 OPS, and is third in the conference with 19 RBIs. Shaw also made Sports Center Top-10 grab (No. 2 play) Feb. 17 against UTSA.
- Senior gold glove-winning second baseman Brooks Marlow also returns in 2015 to provide leadership to the infield. In addition to his excellent defense, Marlow also finished second on the team in runs scored in 2014, and he was third on the team in OBP (.383) and home runs (3) while hitting primarily in the leadoff spot for the Horns.
- Marlow has three of the team's 14 home runs on the season and his four RBI performance against Minnesota (Feb. 22) was the first of his career.

MAJOR ARMS LOST - The Texas pitching staff is taking a significant hit in 2015 after losing over half of its innings (356 2/3 of 601) from last year. RHPs John Curtiss, Nathan Thornhill and Lukas Schiraldi were taken in the 6th, 13th and 15th rounds of the MLB Draft respectively, while lefty Dillon Peters was taken in the 10th round. Sophomore right-hander Morgan Cooper, meanwhile, will miss the 2015 season after undergoing Tommy John Surgery on his right elbow. The righty from Jarrell, Texas put up an impressive freshman campaign, going 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA in 56 innings while striking out 41 en route to being named to the Big 12 All-Freshman team and a second-team Freshman All-American by Perfect Game.

DIFFICULT ROAD AHEAD - Texas finished the 2014 season third in RPI, played the third most difficult schedule in the country and finished fifth in Iterative Strength according to BoydsWorld.com. The 2015 slate is just as challenging as they will play 24 games against teams that reached the NCAA Tournament in 2014, including the four-game sets at Rice (Feb. 13-15) and Stanford (March 5-8) that have already been played. Thus far in 2015, Texas currently sits 8th in Iterative Strength and 16th in RPI (BoydsWorld.com).

- 20 of their contests against 2014 NCAA Tournament teams come on the road, including both the non-conference series at Rice (Feb. 13-15) and Stanford (March 5-8).
- Additionally, Texas will play 13 games against teams who won Regional championships last year, with a three-game series scheduled vs. conference foes Oklahoma State (April 3-5), TCU (April 24-26) and Texas Tech (May 1-3), to go along with the four-game set vs. the Cardinal.
- The second half of the schedule will see Texas play 16 of its last 27 regular season games vs. NCAA Tournament teams, starting with a three-game non-conference series at Nebraska (March 27-29). Other games vs. 2014 postseason teams are at Oklahoma State (April 3-5), vs. Sam Houston State (April 14) and at Kansas (April 17-19).
- Texas closes Big 12 play in difficult fashion, facing a pair of 2014 CWS participants in the Horned Frogs before hosting the Red Raiders. UT closes the regular season with a conference series at Baylor (May 16-17), with the Big 12 Tournament set for May 20-24 in Tulsa, Okla.



PITCHING FACTORY - Pitching coach Skip Johnson enters his ninth season at Texas having built quite an impressive resume for developing pitchers. During his tenure on the 40 Acres 24 Longhorn pitchers have been drafted, including three first-rounders, and his pitching staffs have ranked in the top-10 nationally in ERA six times. In 2014, the staff posted a 2.25 ERA, fourth-best in the country, and the lowest mark at Texas since 1977.

A LOOK AT THE STAFF - Head coach Augie Garrido is in his 19th season at Texas and 47th overall with a career record of 1,933-899-9. He is assisted by Skip Johnson (ninth season at Texas), Tommy Nicholson (fifth season at Texas) and Ryan Russ (fourth season at Texas). Johnson has led UT to top-10 national finishes in ERA in six of his eight seasons on the Forty Acres. Nicholson, a volunteer assistant in 2009 and 2010, returned to the staff as an assistant coach prior to the 2013 season. He coaches the infielders and hitters and has landed two-straight top-10 recruiting classes. Russ, in his fourth season as volunteer assistant, coaches the outfielders and helps coach the hitters.

2014 ACCOLADES - Three Longhorn players received postseason recognition for their achievements last season.

- Morgan Cooper (4-2, 2.98) and Tres Barrera (.261, 5 HR) were named second team Perfect Game Freshmen All-Americans at pitcher and catcher respectively. Barrera also went on to win the College Home Run Derby at TD Ameritrade Park by blasting 41 home runs in the contest. Cooper however, will miss the 2015 season because of Tommy John Surgery on his throwing elbow.
- Barrera was also named a second team freshman All-American by Baseball America for his work both behind the plate and at it.
- Sophomore shortstop C.J Hinojosa was named the CWS All-Tournament Team shortstop. He collected five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI in Omaha.

2014 BIG 12 CREDENTIALS - Among returners, RHP Chad Hollingsworth and 2B Brooks Marlow earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2014; Ben Johnson received honorable mention; and C Tres Barrera, RHP Morgan Cooper and INF/OF Zane Gurwitz were selected to the All-Freshman team. Barrera was also named Newcomer of the week twice (March 31 and May 19).

ACADEMIC SUCCESS - The Texas Baseball team's semester GPA in Fall 2014 was 3.15, and they hold a 3.23 cumulative team GPA. The squad has earned a GPA of 3.0 or better for nine consecutive semesters with a 3.1 or better for seven consecutive semesters.

- Over seventy-six percent of Baseball students hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, and over sixty-six percent of students on the team earned a 3.0 or better in Fall 2014 and were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.
- Eleven students, the most in program history, were named to the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Team, including John Curtiss, an English/History major, who graduated with Plan I and Academic All-American Honors, and earned the NCAA Elite 89 Award for holding the highest cumulative GPA of any student-athlete of the eight teams at the 2014 College World Series.
- Curtiss also earned the Big 12 Conference's highest academic honors with the Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarship and the Dr. Gerald Lage Academic Achievement Award.
- •The Baseball program has received APR Public Recognition Awards five times for having multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top ten percent in their sport (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13), and they earned the College World Series Award for the team with the highest GPA in both 2007 and 2009.
- Current Baseball students are pursuing majors from nearly every college on campus, including Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, and Liberal Arts, and since 2006, over 30 Texas Baseball student-athletes have returned to campus to earn their degrees.



2014 NOTES:

- Texas' recorded its 35th appearance in the College World Series in 2014, and its eighth trip since 2000, which also leads the nation ended in a tie for third place. The Longhorns' 85 wins in the CWS is also a record, and they have compiled an 85-59 (.586) record overall. Texas' six national titles are tied for second all-time with LSU, trailing only USC (12).
- · Texas finishes the year (46-21), and in the top four in the World Series for a record 26th time. The Longhorns have finished in the top four six out of eight trips to the CWS in the Garrido era.
- Head coach Augie Garrido finishes his15th appearance in the CWS with a 41-22 record. He is the winningest coach in college baseball history (1,920 career victories).
- The 103 bunts during the 2014 season for the Longhorns were the fifth most in a season in the Augie Garrido era. The four seasons with more sacrifices also ended in Omaha, including the 2005 National Championship year (116 sacrifices).
- The Texas pitching finished the year with a 2.25 ERA, the lowest team ERA since 1977 (2.12).
- Travis Duke was nearly untouchable all of 2014 for the Longhorns allowing just one earned run, good for a 0.29 ERA in 30 2/3 innings.
- •In the post season the pitching staff had a 1.25 ERA and a .214 opponent batting average.
- •The team's CWS ERA was 1.38, which includes their back to back shutouts (6/18 & 6/20). Texas had 13 shutouts on the year, tied for fifth-best in the country.
- •The Longhorns finished the year first in the Big 12 and second in the nation in double plays turned with 71. Texas also finishes the year 34th in the country in fielding percentage (.974).
- C.J Hinojosa's ended the season on a nine game hit streak and an 11 game on-base streak. He was the only Longhorn to record a hit in all five CWS games.
- •Hinojosa was named to the CWS All-Tournament Team for his outstanding performance. He had five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI.
- The Texas offense has 20 extra base hits in NCAA Tournament Play (14 doubles, three triples and three home runs) compared to six (five doubles and a triple) four their opponents.
- The Longhorns hit three triples in their final two games of the year (Gurwitz, Marlow, Barrera) to give them 18 on the season.

BACK HOME IN OMAHA - Texas made its record 35th appearance in the College World Series in 2014, and its eighth trip since 2000, which also leads the nation. The Longhorns' 85 wins in the CWS is also a record, and they have compiled an 85-59 (.590) record overall. Texas' six national titles are tied for second all-time with LSU, trailing only USC (12).

Head Coach Augie Garrido



Eight trips to the College World Series (CWS). National Championships in both 2002 and 2005. Second-place finishes in 2004 and 2009. Seven Big 12 Conference Championships (2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, and 2011) and four league tournament crowns (2002, 2003, 2008 and 2009). These are the results and why head coach Augie Garrido was hired to guide the Texas baseball program in 1996.

During his first 18 years on the Forty Acres, Garrido became the all-time winningest coach in NCAA Division I baseball history by capturing his 1,428th career win on June 9, 2003, (a 6-5 Texas victory over then No. 1 Florida State during NCAA Super Regional action in Tallahassee,

Fla.), then moved past Gordon Gillespie as the winningest coach in all divisions with win number 1,894 on March 25, 2014.

He brought Texas back to the CWS for the first time since 1993 during the 2000 campaign, and returned the Horns to the pinnacle of collegiate baseball in 2002 by leading UT to a 57-15 record that produced the school's first-ever Big 12 regular-season and tournament championships, as well as its first national title since 1983. He duplicated the feat in 2005, guiding the Longhorns to their sixth National Championship, the second-most for one school in NCAA history. Texas' rise under Garrido has been the culmination of inking 17 straight top 15 recruiting classes and producing teams that have stood tall against perennial powers such as LSU, Miami (Fla.), Stanford and USC. Now, as he enters his 19th year in Austin, Garrido, who was selected as both the 2002 and 2005 National Coach of the Year, looks to keep the program in contention for college baseball's ultimate prize each and every season.

Garrido is the only coach in baseball history to tally 1,900 or more career victories. He is also the first coach to lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Cal State Fullerton & Texas), guide squads to National Championships in four different decades, and is one of only three coaches in history to win five or more NCAA titles (1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005). Garrido is one of only three coaches in the modern era of NCAA football, baseball and men's or women's basketball to ever lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Nick Saban, Rick Pitino). Additionally, Garrido has earned 15 trips to the CWS and 32 NCAA Regional Championship appearances, including 14 at Texas, while garnering National Coach of the Year honors six times (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005), regional coach of the year accolades on seven occasions (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2005) and conference coach of the year distinctions eight times (1987, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011) after leading his clubs to 25 league crowns.

His overall record after 46 years of college coaching, including a 769-368-2 (.675) mark with UT over the last 18 seasons, stood at 1,920-892-9 (.681), which translates into an average of over 41 victories per season.

The Vallejo, Calif., native is just the 13th coach in UT's 120-year baseball history, and, with the exception of the war years of 1943-45 when Blair Cherry was at the helm, is only the fourth Texas head coach since 1911.

As a result of his unique coaching style, Garrido has been ranked as one of the top three baseball teachers in the nation by Major League Baseball Directors of Player Development. To deserve that distinction, Garrido has coached three Golden Spikes Award winners, four National Players of the Year, six College World Series MVPs, 53 All-Americans, 14 All-League MVPs over his career. He has also had 15 of his players selected in the first round of the Major League Baseball Draft, including Longhorns Beau Hale (No. 14) in 2000, Omar Quintanilla (No. 33) in 2003, both J.P. Howell (No. 31) and 2005 American League Rookie of the Year Huston Street (No. 40) in 2004, the duo of Drew Stubbs (No. 8) and Kyle McCulloch (No. 29) in 2006, Chance Ruffin (No. 48) in 2010, Taylor Jungmann (No. 12) in 2011 and Corey Knebel (No. 39) in 2013. In addition, during his 18 years at UT, Garrido has tutored the skills of 27 players who have earned All-America honors a total of 34 times, 25 Freshman All-Americans, including a school-record four in 2006, 153 All-Conference performers, 11 USA Baseball National Team members and 97 players who have gone on to play in professional baseball.

Garrido's name is also held in high regard when people speak of his accomplishments in the College World Series. He is currently tied for second with five National Championships (trailing only Rod Dedeaux's 10 at USC) and 15 appearances (trailing Cliff Gustafson with 17), and ranks third in victories (41) and series games (63) among all-time coaches. He is also one of only eight men in history to coach two or more different teams in the CWS and is only the third Longhorns head coach (Bibb Falk & Cliff Gustafson) in the 120 completed years of Texas baseball to lead the Horns to Omaha.


