The Texas Track and Field team heads to Waco this weekend for the Michael Johnson Classic hosted by Baylor. The Longhorns will face a number of teams from the area, including fellow Big 12 Conference foes Texas Tech and TCU.

Action starts at 11 a.m. with field events and running events begin at 1 p.m. The field will feature some of the nation's top collegiate talent as well as a handful of Olympians. Former Texas starts and Olympic medalists Trey Hardee and Sanya Richards-Ross will be in action. Tickets are just \$10 for general admission and \$5 for children under 18.

It will be Texas past and present on the track for the women's 400 meters. Richards-Ross and 2014 Texas Ex Briana Nelson will be in the same heat with current Longhorns Courtney Okolo and Kendall Baisden. They also will all be next to each other with lane assignments 3-6. It will be the first race of the outdoor season for Richards-Ross.

The Longhorns enter this weekend's meet after a pair of wins at the Texas Invitational. At the home meet, the Longhorns saw a number of impressive performances and look to continue building off that success with the Big 12 Championships a month away. The men won the team scoring competition with 187 points with Minnesota finishing second with 97. The women held off Cal State Northridge 184-152.

TEXAS TRACK & FIELD NOTEBOOK

Longhorns Both in Top 10 Nationally

- This week the men and women both hold spots in the top 10 of the USTFCCCA Rankings. The women move up one spot to No. 3 and the men held their spot at No. 6.
- Texas is among six schools that have their men and women ranked in the top 10.
- The Big 12 Conference is well represented in the top 25 with five women's teams and four men's teams ranked this week. All nine men's and women's teams are among the top 15 with the Longhorns leading the way among Big 12 squads in both.

Standard Bearers

- Texas currently holds seven collegiate records combined among the men and women. The nearest competitor is Arizona and Colorado with five.

2015 The Bowerman Watch List

The most prestigious award in collegiate track and field, The Bowerman, is awarded by the USTFCCCA annually to the top male and female track and field star annually. Since its inception in 2009, the winners combined to win three Olympic medals in 2012.

- 3-time NCAA champion Ryan Crouser is on the men's April watch list.
- NCAA outdoor 400m champ Courtney Okolo is on the women's April watch list.
- Okolo was a finalist for the 2014 award after breaking the collegiate record in the 400.

Akinosun Wins Three Events.... Again

After Morolake Akinosun put on a show at the Texas Relays and winning three events, she did the same thing at the Texas Invitational. Akinosun also was received her second Big 12 Athlete of the Week award for her victories.

Freshmen Showing Talent

- Freshmen sprinters Caitland Smith and Shania Collins finished second and third in the 200 meter invitational at the Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. Smith crossed the line in 23.35 seconds with Collins right behind her in 23.47.
- Smith backed that up with a runner-up performance at the Texas Invitational last weekend in the 100 and took fourth in the 200 with new PR's of 11.58 and 23.32.

Distance Runners Shine at Stanford Invitational

- Texas sent its top distance runners to what has become one of the top distance meets in the nation every year, and the Longhorns came up big.
- Craig Lutz took 7th in the 10,000 meters, crossing in 28:33.48. Only Harry Green - at the 1988 and 1989 Mt. SAC Relays - has posted a faster 10,000m time by a Longhorn.
 - Lutz third among collegians in a race that produced the top 40 times on the 2015 NCAA performance list.
 - The men saw four runners post sub-30 times in the 10k. In section two, Mark Pinales (29:08.03), Eduardo Rodriguez (29:15.43) and Ryan Dohner (29:18.56) all flirted with cracking 29 minutes and prove Texas distance will be a force in 2015.
 - In the women's 10,000m, Megan Siebert cut more than two minutes off her best time, finishing 22nd in section one in 33:37.88.
 - Siebert's time ranks No. 3 in school history and 14th on the 2015 NCAA performance list.

Events to Watch

MICHAEL JOHNSON CLASIC

- **Women's 400m**
Olympic gold medalist and Texas Ex Sanya Richards-Ross will be making her 2015 outdoor debut. In her heat is fellow Texas Ex Briana Nelson and current Longhorn stars Courtney Okolo and Kendall Baisden.
- **Men's 400m**
Olympic gold medalist and Baylor alumnus Jeremy Wariner will be in action in this event. The professional runner is transitioning to the 800 meters this year in an attempt to qualify for the 2015 IAAF World Championships. He will be back in his element on Saturday along with 2014 Bowerman winner Deon Lendore of Texas A&M. Texas will have 3 runners in the previous heat, including Big 12 champion Zack Bilderback.
- **Men's 100m**
Speed will be all over the track for the final heat of this event. Baylor's Trayvon Bromell, TCU's Ronnie Baker and UT's Senoj-Jay Givans highlight the collegiates. Former Horned Frog Charles Silmon and former A&M star PJ Hardy also will be in the heat.
- **Women's Pole Vault**
Year of the Vault continues and this field will have 3 women from the field at the NCAA Indoor Championships, including UT's Kaitlin Petrillose and collegiate indoor record holder Demi Payne of Stephen F. Austin.

• Sandie Raines impressed in section one of the 5,000 meters. The sophomore transfer from Arkansas crossed the finish line in 15:48.04 to rank as No. 3 on the UT performance list and fifth on this year's national list.

400m Depth

- The women's team boasts one of the deepest 400m groups in the nation.
- The Longhorns displayed that depth finishing 1-2-4 at the Big 12 meet to score 23 points.
- Courtney Okolo is the collegiate record holder outdoors in the event at 50.03 seconds. She is the defending NCAA champion and also won her first indoor NCAA title this year.
- Ashley Spencer has two NCAA outdoor 400 titles to her claim as a freshman and sophomore.
- Kendall Baisden won the 2015 IAAF World Junior Championships 400m and 4x400.
- The trio of Okolo, Spencer and Baisden joined up with Morolake Akinosun to win the 4x400 at the NCAA indoor meet and posted the No. 5 time in collegiate history.
- The men's team also has strength in the 400m, Zack Bilderback successfully defended his Big 12 title in the 400 and finished sixth at the NCAA meet.
- Earlier this year Bilderback crossed the line in 45.95 seconds to finish third at the Tyson Invita-

Past winners from the previous four years since its inception have won two Olympic Medals, two IAAF World Championships and six World Championship medals.

The award is named after Bill Bowerman, former legendary coach of the Oregon Ducks and co-founder of NIKE, who make significant contributions to the sport of track & field.

- The men's 4x400 relay also broke the school record to finish third at the NCAA Championships in 3:06.56.

Crouser Repeats at Texas Relays

- Ryan Crouser also shined in his final Texas Relays wearing Burnt Orange. The NCAA champion won the men's shot put for a third consecutive year with his toss of 21.11 meters (69-3.25).

Dohmann Opens Season with Back-to-Back Wins

- Defending Big 12 Conference champion Fabian Dohmann opened his outdoor season at the Texas Relays with a victory in the javelin, throwing 70.86 meters (232-6) on his fifth attempt.
- Dohmann was standing in seventh heading into the final three throws. Evan Karakolis of Rice and Missouri's MaCauley Garton also threw over 230 feet.
- Dohmann won his next competition, claiming the Texas Invitational last weekend.

Rodriguez Wins in Final Texas Relays

- Senior Eduardo Rodriguez led through much of the men's 5,000 meters and showed guts in a shoulder-to-shoulder battle to win in his final Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays as a Longhorn. He clocked 14:20.53 to defeat post-collegiate runner Austin Bussing. Rodriguez followed up his win at the Texas Relays with a personal-best 29:15.43 at the Stanford Invitational to move to No. 9 on the UT all-time performance list.

Texas Takes Sixth at NCAA's

- The Longhorn men and women both finished sixth at the NCAA Indoor Championships
- Texas saw Courtney Okolo win the 400 meters for her first indoor title, and the women's 4x400 also took first place.

Snow Takes Bronze

- Morgan Snow backed up her impressive showing in the NCAA Championships prelims in the 60 meter hurdles by tying her personal best time to finish third and grab six valuable points for the team. Snow ran 8.07 seconds.
- Snow ran 8.07 seconds earlier during indoor season to finish second at the Tyson Invitational.

Givans Breaks School Record at NCAA's

- Senoj-Jay Givans had a very successful indoor season and capped it off with a school record.
- Givans broke the school record in the 60 meters during prelims at the NCAA Championships with a time of 6.57 seconds. He followed that up with a 6.58 time to finish fourth.
- At the Big 12 Championships, Givans successfully defended his title against three of the top five sprinters in the nation in the 60 meters.
- Givans is only the second athlete to repeat as men's 60m Big 12 champ.

Mahler Climbs to Sixth Place-Finish in Heptathlon

- Wolf Mahler claimed his first Big 12 Conference title in the heptathlon this year and rode that momentum to a sixth-place finish at the NCAA meet.
- Mahler posted personal bests in four of the seven events and used his speed in the 1,000 meters to move up the leader board in the final event and finish sixth with a total of 5,747 points.
- His score ranks sixth in school history as well.
- The 2015 NCAA indoor heptathlon was one of the most competitive in history. The margin of victory was only two points for Minnesota's Luca Wieland over Georgia's Garrett Scantling.

Raines Makes Strides in Distance Events for Texas

- Sandie Raines proved to be a valuable addition to the Texas distance group in 2015. The sophomore transfer from Arkansas ran No. 2 time in school history at the Husky Classic and was less than half a second from breaking the record in the 5000m.
- She backed that up by finishing 8th at the NCAA Championships to become a first team All-American in the event.
- At the Husky Classic, Raines finished third against an NCAA Championship caliber field.
- She made a significant impact at the Big 12 Championship, scoring 5 points in the 3000m and running a leg of the DMR that finished third to score 6 points.

Cross Country Makes the Grade

- Sandie Raines and Will Nation each were named to the USTFCCCA All-Academic Team this week. Raines was an all-region performer and holds a 3.58 GPA in psychology. Nation also earned all-region honors and carries a 3.36 GPA in computer science.
- Both the men's and women's teams were recognized as USTFCCCA All-Academic Teams by holding a high team GPA. The women boast a 3.49 as a team, the men have a team GPA of 3.07.
