After a successful home meet last week, the Texas Track and Field team heads west for the Stanford Invitational. The Longhorns will only be sending a small group of distance runners to compete in what has become one of the top meets early in the outdoor season for the distance events.

The national descending order lists will have numerous entries from the Stanford Invitational after the two days of action at the Cobb Track and Angell Field. Texas will have runners competing on Friday only with the 5,000 and 10,000 meters closing the evening session late. Texas will also have competitors in the steeplechase and 1,500 meters.

The Stanford Invitational has become a premier meet for distance runners over the last few years. Fans can expect to see some of the top runners in the NCAA duke it out on the track for early-season bragging rights. Last year at this meet, Texas tallied a trio of top three finishes.

Fans can watch the action live with a FloPro subscription on FloTrack.org. Action from both days of the meet will be aired online. Live results also will be provided by [rtspt.com](http://rtspt.com) with links found at [TexasSports.com](http://TexasSports.com) and [GoStanford.com](http://GoStanford.com). Updates will be available on Twitter as well. Fans can keep up with the action by following @UTexasTrack and @StanfordXCTF.

Action gets underway as early as 11 a.m. Central on Friday in the field events and running events take to the track just before 12:30 p.m. Friday's action will run until after 11 p.m. local time in California with athletes looking to take advantage of cooler night temperatures for the long distance races. Saturday's schedule begins at the same time.

### TEXAS TRACK & FIELD NOTEBOOK

#### Longhorns Both in Top Five

- This week the men and women both hold spots in the Top Five of the USTFCCA Rankings. The women are No. 3 and the men stand at No. 5.
- The preseason outdoor rankings reflect the best marks from athletes last season.
- Texas is among four schools that have their men and women ranked in the Top Five.
- The Big 12 Conference is well represented in the Top 25 with six women's teams and four men's teams ranked this week. All four of the men's teams are in the top 15 and five of the women's are as well. Texas Tech (10) joins Texas in the men's Top 10 and Baylor's women are No. 10.

#### Standard Bearers

- Texas currently holds seven collegiate records combined among the men and women. The nearest competitor is Arizona and Colorado with five.

#### 2015 The Bowerman Watch List

The most prestigious award in collegiate track and field, The Bowerman, is awarded by the USTFCCA annually to the top male and female track and field star annually. Since its inception in 2009, the winners combined to win three Olympic medals in 2012.

- 3-time NCAA champion Ryan Crouser is on the men's Post-Indoor watch list.
- NCAA outdoor 400m champ Courtney Okolo is on the women's Post-Indoor watch list.

#### Akinosun Wins Three Events

Morolake Akinosun put on a show at the Texas Relays as a Longhorn by winning three events. For her efforts the junior was named the Texas Relays Most Outstanding Performer and received her first Big 12 Athlete of the Week Award.

- Ran anchor leg of the 4x100m relay to win with a time of 43.70 seconds
- Won 100m in wind-aided 10.94 seconds. That time would be fast enough to tie the school record but it cannot count toward records because it was wind-aided

### Freshmen Showing Talent

- Freshmen sprinters Caitland Smith and Shania Collins finished second and third in the 200 meter invitational at the Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. Smith crossed the line in 23.35 seconds with Collins right behind her in 23.47.

### Crouser Repeats

- Ryan Crouser also shined in his final Texas Relays wearing Burnt Orange. The NCAA champion won the men's shot put for a third consecutive year with his toss of 21.11 meters (69-3.25).

### Dohmann Opens Season with Win

- Defending Big 12 Conference champion Fabian Dohmann opened his outdoor season at Texas Relays with a victory in the javelin, throwing 70.86 meters (232-6) on his fifth attempt.
- Dohmann was standing in seventh heading into the final three throws. Evan Karakolis of Rice and Missouri's MaCauley Garton also threw over 230 feet.

### Rodriguez Wins in Final Texas Relays

- Senior Eduardo Rodriguez led through much of the men's 5,000 meters and showed guts in a shoulder-to-shoulder battle to win in his final Texas Relays as a Longhorn. He clocked 14:20.53 to defeat post-collegiate runner Austin Bussing
- Fellow senior Megan Siebert also ran well for the women as she finished second in 16:31.82.

### Texas Takes Sixth at NCAA's

- The Longhorn men and women both finished sixth at the NCAA Indoor Championships
- Texas saw Courtney Okolo win the 400 meters for her first indoor title, and the women's 4x400 also took first place.

## Events to Watch

### STANFORD INVITATIONAL

#### Men's & Women's 10,000m

The top long distance runners in the NCAA will be in these races looking to put down fast times early in the season. The men's field includes runners from distance powers Oregon, Iona, Northern Arizona and Oklahoma State. All-American Avery Kate from Iona will be among the top women in the field.

#### Women's 5,000m

This field will also be loaded with top runners. Last year's 10,000m NCAA champ, Emma Bates will be in this event. She also finished fourth in the 5k at the NCAA meet a year ago.

## 400m Depth

- The women's team boasts one of the deepest 400m groups in the nation.
- The Longhorns displayed that depth finishing 1-2-4 at the Big 12 meet to score 23 points.
- Courtney Okolo is the collegiate record holder outdoors in the event at 50.03 seconds. She is the defending NCAA champion and also won her first indoor NCAA title this year.
- Ashley Spencer has two NCAA outdoor 400 titles to her claim as a freshman and sophomore.
- Kendall Baisden won the 2015 IAAF World Junior Championships 400m and 4x400.
- The trio of Okolo, Spencer and Baisden joined up with Morolake Akinosun to win the 4x400 at the NCAA indoor meet and posted the No. 5 time in collegiate history.
- The men's team also has strength in the 400m, Zack Bilderback successfully defended his Big 12 title in the 400 and finished sixth at the NCAA meet.
- Earlier this year Bilderback crossed the line in 45.95 seconds to finish third at the Tyson Invitational while breaking his own school record of 46.03 set last year.
- The men's 4x400 relay also broke the school record to finish third at the NCAA Championships in 3:06.56.

## Snow Takes Bronze

- Morgan Snow backed up her impressive showing in the NCAA Championships prelims in the 60 meter hurdles by tying her personal best time to finish third and grab six valuable points for the team. Snow ran 8.07 seconds.
- Snow ran 8.07 seconds earlier during indoor season to finish second at the Tyson Invitational.

## Givans Breaks School Record at NCAA's

- Senoj-Jay Givans had a very successful indoor season and capped it off with a school record.
- Givans broke the school record in the 60 meters during prelims at the NCAA Championships with a time of 6.57 seconds. He followed that up with a 6.58 time to finish fourth.
- At the Big 12 Championships, Givans successfully defended his title against three of the top five sprinters in the nation in the 60 meters.
- Givans is only the second athlete to repeat as men's 60m Big 12 champ.

## Mahler Climbs to Sixth Place-Finish in Heptathlon

- Wolf Mahler claimed his first Big 12 Conference title in the heptathlon this year and rode that momentum to a sixth-place finish at the NCAA meet.
- Mahler posted personal bests in four of the seven events and used his speed in the 1,000 meters to move up the leader board in the final event and finish sixth with a total of 5,747 points.
- His score ranks sixth in school history as well.
- The 2015 NCAA indoor heptathlon was one of the most competitive in history. The margin of victory was only two points for Minnesota's Luca Wieland over Georgia's Garrett Scantling.

## Raines Makes Strides in Distance Events for Texas

- Sandie Raines proved to be a valuable addition to the Texas distance group in 2015. The sophomore transfer from Arkansas ran No. 2 time in school history at the Husky Classic and was less than half a second from breaking the record in the 5000m.
- She backed that up by finishing 8th at the NCAA Championships to become a first team All-American in the event.
- At the Husky Classic, Raines finished third against an NCAA Championship caliber field.
- She made a significant impact at the Big 12 Championship, scoring 5 points in the 3000m and running a leg of the DMR that finished third to score 6 points.

## Longhorns Earn USTFCCCA Honors

Following the NCAA Indoor Championships USTFCCCA awarded its All-America Team honors

- First Team Men: Zack Bilderback (400m, 4x400); Ryan Crouser (shot put); Senoj-Jay Givans (60m, 4x400); Chris Irvin (4x400); Wolf Mahler (heptathlon); Byron Robinson
- First Team Women: Morolake Akinosun (4x400); Kendall Baisden (4x400); Courtney Okolo (400m, 4x400); Sandie Raines (5000m); Morgan Snow (60H); Ashley Spencer (400m, 4x400)

Prior to the NCAA Indoor Championships the USTFCCCA handed out its regional awards for the indoor season. Texas claimed three South Central Region honors.

- Head Coach Mario Sategna was named Men's Head Coach of the Year
- Associate Head Coach Tonja Buford-Bailey earned Women's Assistant Coach of the Year
- Ryan Crouser was named Men's Field Athlete of the Year

## Texas Sweeps Big 12 Championships

- For the first time since 2006, the Texas Longhorns won both the men's and women's Big 12 titles.
- The men dominated the field scoring 140 points and winning 45.5 over Oklahoma State.
- The women held off a charge from Kansas State to win by 6.5 points. The Wildcats and Longhorns traded to the overall lead multiple times over the final few events with the 4x400

The award is named after Bill Bowerman, former legendary coach of the Oregon Ducks and co-founder of NIKE, who made significant contributions to the sport of track & field.

#### Crouser Breaks Big 12 Record

- Ryan Crouser won the men's shot put and did so by breaking the Big 12 Championship meet record and Leid Recreation Center facility record on his third attempt.
- Crouser improved on his NCAA lead with a mark of 21.14 meters (69-4.25).
- His mark currently ranks No. 3 in the world

#### Akinosun Scores Big for Texas

- Sprinter Morolake Akinosun scored 20.5 points at the Big 12 Championships
- Akinosun defended her 60m title with a time of 7.23 seconds, finished 2nd in the 200m and ran a leg of the winning 4x400m relay team.
- She ran all 3 events at the NCAA Championships, serving as the opening leg of the 4x400.

#### Cross Country Makes the Grade

- Sandie Raines and Will Nation each were named to the USTFCCCA All-Academic Team this week. Raines was an all-region performer and holds a 3.58 GPA in psychology. Nation also earned all-region honors and carries a 3.36 GPA in computer science.
- Both the men's and women's teams were recognized as USTFCCCA All-Academic Teams by holding a high team GPA. The women boast a 3.49 as a team, which ranks second in the Big 12. The men have a team GPA of 3.07.
