The Texas Track and Field team heads to the oldest track meet in the United States this week as the Longhorns are set to compete at the 121st Penn Relays. Considered by many to be the most prestigious relays meet in America and started in 1895, the Penn Relays traditionally brings the best sprint and distance relay squads to Philadelphia and historic Franklin Field to go head-to-head on the track.

This year, Texas will compete in the 4x100, 4x200, 4x400 for the men and women and the men's 4xMile and women's 4x1,500 in addition to a handful of individual running and field events.

On the line will be the highly coveted Penn Relays Wheels - the giant wooden trophies handed out to winners. Texas has won 37 relay events in Penn Relays history and hopes to add to that list of success this year.

Texas has its eyes set on the record books as well. Last year, the team of Briana Nelson, Courtney Okolo, Kendall Baisden and Ashley Spencer set the Penn Relays record in the 4x400. With three of those four runners back for 2015, the Longhorns hope to make a push for that record again.

The Longhorns have won the most women's 4x400 titles at Penn Relays as well. Texas has crossed the line first a total of 11 times for the women. South Carolina is next with six victories. No other school has won more than two.

Each year the Penn Relays also brings in top talent from Jamaica. This meet is an important one to the island nation as its top high schools and colleges bring teams to compete. Texas sophomore Senoj-Jay Givans competed at the Penn Relays twice during his high school days.

The meet also coordinates a series of relays pitting top American professionals against international athletes for what is tabbed as USA vs. The World. Two Texas alumnae are among the pool of athletes eligible for Team USA. Marshavet Hooker is listed in the USA pool for the 4x100 and Briana Nelson is in the 4x400 relay pool of athletes.

Action for the main events gets underway on Thursday from Franklin Field after a heptathlon and decathlon earlier in the week. The first event for Texas will be the women's college pole vault at 10 a.m. Eastern on Thursday to start the three days of competition.

Fans can watch the action live online at FloTrack.org with a subscription to the site's FloPro services. Some local radio stations in Philadelphia will also be airing coverage, which can be heard online at power99.com, wdasfm.com and iheartradio.com. Fans can also use the iHeartRadio app on their phones.

TEXAS TRACK & FIELD NOTEBOOK

Longhorns Both in Top 10 Nationally

- This week the men and women both hold spots in the top 10 of the USTFCCCA Rankings. The women move up one spot to No. 3 and the men held their spot at No. 6.
- Texas is among six schools that have their men and women ranked in the top 10.
- The Big 12 Conference is well represented in the top 25 with five women's teams and four men's teams ranked this week. Four of the women's teams are ranked No. 11 or better.

Okolo Beats the Best

Courtney Okolo recently defeated Olympic gold medalist Sanya Richards-Ross head-to-head at the Michael Johnson Classic in a Texas past vs. present heat. Sophomore Kendall Baisden also bested the Olympian to finish second.

- Okolo crossed the line in a world-leading time of 50.99 seconds
- Okolo was named Big 12 Female Track & Field Athlete of the Week
- It was the 3rd honor for the women in 4 weeks after Morolake Akinosun won a pair

Standard Bearers

- Texas currently holds seven collegiate records combined among the men and women. The nearest competitor is Arizona and Colorado with five.

Events to Watch

121st PENN RELAYS

• Women's 4x400m Championship of America

Texas broke the Penn Relays record last year and returns 3 of those 4 runners. The Longhorns will be up against rival Texas A&M in what should be one of the top events of the entire meet.

• Men's 4x400m Championship of America

Texas A&M, LSU and Texas are all in a field loaded with All-Americans.

• Men's 4x100m Championship of America

TCU and LSU have won this event 9 times and will see strong competition. Watch out for back-to-back champ UTech from Kingston, Jamaica. The Penn Relays has a tradition of bringing in the top high school and college talent from the island nation.

• Men's 4xMile Championship of America

A rarely-held event, the 4xMile will have distance fans drooling this year. Texas will go head-to-head with some of the top distance programs in the NCAA. Some media members in the track and field community are calling for the first-ever sub-16 by a collegiate team.

• Shuttle Hurdles

Although Texas is not competing in the Shuttle Hurdles, it also is a rarely-held event that brings excitement to the track.

Past winners from the previous four years since its inception have won two Olympic Medals, two IAAF World Championships and six World Championship medals.

The award is named after Bill Bowerman, former legendary coach of the Oregon Ducks and co-founder of NIKE, who made significant contributions to the sport of track & field.

Akinosun Wins Three Events.... Again

After Morolake Akinosun put on a show at the Texas Relays and winning three events, she did the same thing at the Texas Invitational (April 11). Akinosun also was received her second Big 12 Athlete of the Week award for her victories.

- Ran anchor leg of the 4x100m relay to win with a time of 43.61 seconds
- Won 100m in 11.37 seconds
- Won 200m in Mike A. Myers Stadium record, 22.70 seconds

Freshmen Showing Talent

- Freshmen sprinters Caitland Smith and Shania Collins finished second and third in the 200 meter invitational at the Nike Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays. Smith crossed the line in 23.35 seconds with Collins right behind her in 23.47.
- Smith backed that up with a runner-up performance at the Texas Invitational last weekend in the 100 and took fourth in the 200 with new PR's of 11.58 and 23.32.

Distance Runners Shine at Stanford Invitational

Texas sent its top distance runners to what has become one of the top distance meets in the nation every year, and the Longhorns came up big.

- Craig Lutz took 7th in the 10,000 meters, crossing in 28:33.48. Only Harry Green - at the 1988 and 1989 Mt. SAC Relays - has posted a faster 10,000m time by a Longhorn.
- Lutz third among collegians in a race that produced the top 40 times on the 2015 NCAA performance list.
- The men saw four runners post sub-30 times in the 10k. In section two, Mark Pinales (29:08.03), Eduardo Rodriguez (29:15.43) and Ryan Dohner (29:18.56) all flirted with cracking 29 minutes and prove Texas distance will be a force in 2015.
- In the women's 10,000m, Megan Siebert cut more than two minutes off her best time, finishing 22nd in section one in 33:37.88.
- Siebert's time ranks No. 3 in school history and 14th on the 2015 NCAA performance list.
- Sandie Raines impressed in section one of the 5,000 meters. The sophomore transfer from Arkansas crossed the finish line in 15:48.04 to rank as No. 3 on the UT performance list and fifth on this year's national list.

400m Depth

- The women's team boasts one of the deepest 400m groups in the nation.
- The Longhorns displayed that depth finishing 1-2-4 at the Big 12 meet to score 23 points.
- Courtney Okolo is the collegiate record holder outdoors in the event at 50.03 seconds. She is the defending NCAA champion and also won her first indoor NCAA title this year.
- Ashley Spencer has two NCAA outdoor 400 titles to her claim as a freshman and sophomore.
- Kendall Baisden won the 2015 IAAF World Junior Championships 400m and 4x400.
- The trio of Okolo, Spencer and Baisden joined up with Morolake Akinosun to win the 4x400 at the NCAA indoor meet and posted the No. 5 time in collegiate history.
- The men's team also has strength in the 400m, Zack Bilderback successfully defended his Big 12 title in the 400 and finished sixth at the NCAA meet.
- Earlier this year Bilderback crossed the line in 45.95 seconds to finish third at the Tyson Invitational while breaking his own school record of 46.03 set last year.
- The men's 4x400 relay also broke the school record to finish third at the NCAA Championships in 3:06.56.

Crouser Repeats at Texas Relays

- Ryan Crouser also shined in his final Texas Relays wearing Burnt Orange. The NCAA champion won the men's shot put for a third consecutive year with his toss of 21.11 meters (69-3.25).

Dohmann Opens Season with Back-to-Back Wins

- Defending Big 12 Conference champion Fabian Dohmann opened his outdoor season at the Texas Relays with a victory in the javelin, throwing 70.86 meters (232-6) on his fifth attempt.
- Dohmann was standing in seventh heading into the final three throws. Evan Karakolis of Rice and Missouri's MaCauley Garton also threw over 230 feet.
- Dohmann won his next competition, claiming the Texas Invitational last weekend.
