A LOOK AT THE MATCHUP

- Texas holds a 9-0 all-time record vs. Prairie View A&M, with all nine games coming in Austin.
- Last season, the Longhorns defeated the Panthers 6-3 on April 29.

A LOOK AT THE LONGHORNS

- After dropping three games to TCU on the road this past weekend, Texas welcomes a five-game home stand, where they hold a 15-7 record on the season while posting a 2.05 ERA and .271 batting average.
- Opponents are hitting just .216 at UFCU Disch-Falk Field this year and have a 4.68 ERA over the 22 games.
- Despite scoring just one run in a loss in the series finale vs. TCU, the Longhorns are averaging 6.0 runs a game over their past seven contests.
- Freshman pitcher Connor Mayes tossed 5 1/3 innings of relief on Sunday, and he now qualifies for ninth in the Big 12 in ERA at 2.17 over 45 2/3 innings on the year with 35 strikeouts.
- The right-hander from Lake Travis leads Big 12 freshmen in ERA (2.17), appearances (23) and opponent batting average (.209).
- Junior left fielder Ben Johnson leads the Big 12 in triples (7), is second in total bases (105) and is third in hits (66) and slugging percentage (.553). Senior right fielder Collin Shaw leads the league in doubles (16) (chart on p. 4).
- With a two-hit and three-hit game this past weekend, Johnson now has a team-leading 21 multi-hit games in 2015, including eight games with three or more base knocks.
- Senior second baseman Brooks Marlow was charged with an error in the bottom of the eighth inning on Sunday that snapped a streak of 277 2/3 innings without an error. The last miscue had come on March 8 at Stanford, and he is fielding .987 on the season.
- Of Texas' 22 losses, nine have come by one run, including a loss to TCU on Saturday (4/25). UT also has five losses by two runs and six in extra innings. In the last 19 games, the Horns have dropped four in extras and five by one run.
- UT is outscoring its opponents 63-21 in the seventh and eighth innings this season, and is 17-0 when leading after seven frames.
- Texas has the 18th most difficult schedule in the country according to Boyd's World.com (Chart on p. 4).

- ▶ Despite allowing 15 earned runs vs. TCU, Longhorn pitchers still rank fourth in the Big 12 in ERA (3.14) and the bullpen has a 2.30 mark on the season.
- ▶ The Horns' 44 double plays are third in the league and tied for 17th in the nation.
- ▶ Brooks Marlow ranks third in school history with 633 assists, and is also third in double plays with 137 (chart on p. 6).
- ▶ UT has scored 100 of its 209 runs (47.8%) on the year with two down in the inning.
- ▶ C.J. Hinojosa (.333), Ben Johnson (.333) and Joe Baker (.300) have come up with clutch two out this season (Averages are with two outs).
- ▶ Of Texas' 209 runs, 133 (63.6%) have come when the leadoff man gets aboard.
- ▶ The Horns are fourth in the Big 12 in walks, and three Longhorns rank in the top 10 in the conference in walks (Cantu 5th with 28, Barrera 6th with 26, Boswell 7th with 24). Texas has 183 bases on balls in its first 44 contests (4.2 per game).
- ▶ Both Ben Johnson (.966) and Tres Barrera (.920) boast an OPS over .900. Mark Payton (.811) was the only Longhorn with an OPS over .800 last season. The lineup currently holds a team OPS of .730 after posting a .709 mark in 2014.
- ▶ Both Johnson (March 8) and Barrera (Feb. 17) have had five-hit games this season, marking the first time two Longhorns have recorded five-hit games in the same year since 2007 (Josh Prince and Bradley Suttle, chart on p. 7).
- ▶ The 16 run game at Kansas on April 19 marked the most runs scored by UT since 2011, most extra base hits in the BBCOR bat era (since '11), the most homers in a game since 2010 and the 23 hits were the most since UT matched the school record of 25 in 1998.
- ▶ Junior shortstop C.J. Hinojosa shined in the game, as he became the first Longhorn to hit for the cycle since Kyle Russell on 4/24/07, while driving in four and scoring three times.
- ▶ Ben Johnson also homered twice that day, the second time this season he's done that this year (also March 5 at Stanford). He's the first Longhorn with two multi-home run games in a season since Kevin Keyes did it three times in 2010.

- Texas has seven multi-home run games this season after having just two in 2014, and UT hitters have 96 multi-hit games (2.2 a game).
- Senior right-hander Parker French earned the 19th win of his career against Stanford (March 7), and holds a season ERA of 2.62 for the 2015 season. His 9-inning, seven strikeout performance on Friday (March 13) vs. WVU was a career high in innings pitched and season high in strikeouts.
- French ranks first among Big 12 active career leaders in innings pitched (314.0) and is third in wins (19).
- Junior left-hander Travis Duke ranks fourth in the NCAA with a career ERA of 1.57 over 91 2/3 innings of work.
- Connor Mayes' 10 strikeouts March 14 vs. WVU were the most by a UT pitcher since May 19, 2011 when Taylor Jungmann struck out 12 Aggies. Mayes holds a 2.02 ERA with 29 strikeouts over 35 2/3 innings on the year.

BULLPEN BOOST - The bullpen has tossed 203 1/3 innings this season and holds a 2.30 ERA. The relievers saw a streak of 22 2/3 scoreless frames come to an end against Texas A&M Corpus Christi (3/31) when Jake McKenzie (1-0, 0.71 ERA in 12 2/3 IP) gave up his first run of the season via a long ball in the sixth inning. Connor Mayes also saw his scoreless streak out of the pen come to an end against the Islanders when he surrendered three runs in the 10th inning, but he still holds a 2.03 ERA out of the pen this season in 40 innings with 30 strikeouts to lead all UT relievers. Travis Duke boasts a career ERA of 1.57 in 91 innings of work, which ranks fourth nationally active career leaders, and junior left-handers Kirby Bellow (1.20 ERA, 30 IP) and Ty Culbreth (1.90 ERA, 23 2/3 IP out of the pen) have four saves each. Culbreth is tied for the team lead with three victories.

BEN AT HIS BEST - Ben Johnson set a new a career high when he had five hits (5-for-5) in the series finale against Stanford (March 8). Johnson is the second Longhorn to post a five-hit game this season (Tres Barrera 5-for-6 vs. UTSA on Feb. 17), and just the ninth UT batter to accomplish the feat since 2003 (chart on page seven). He is also the first UT hitter to have two multi-homer games in the same year since Kevin Keyes did it three times in 2010.

- Through the first 44 games, the junior left fielder is 66-for-190 (.347) with 10 doubles, seven triples, five home runs, 28 RBIs, 30 runs scored and 10 stolen bases. Johnson leads the Big 12 in triples (7), is second total bases (105) and is third in slugging percentage (.553) and hits (66).

- In Big 12 play, he has a team-leading .342 batting average with 12 extra base hits (seven doubles, three triples, two home runs), five steals and an OPS of 1.004 in 18 games.

SOLID AT HOME - Texas has played its best ball this season at UFCU Disch-Falk Field, posting a 15-7 record thus far. The pitching staff has been especially salty at home, holding a 2.05 ERA over the first 22 games, and the offense holds and impressive .778 OPS (.409 slg% + .369 ob%), thanks to 67 extra base hits (3.05 a game). The Longhorns have blasted 10 home runs already this season at home, after hitting just five in 2014 over a 33-game span.

DOUBLE PLAY DUO - Texas second baseman Brooks Marlow and shortstop/third baseman C.J. Hinojosa helped Texas finish first in the Big 12 and tied for second nationally with 71 double plays in 2014. Last season, Marlow was involved in 56 of the double plays and Hinojosa 49, and Marlow has had a hand in 137 double plays in his career, which is third in school history. In its first 44 games in 2015, Texas has turned 44 double plays (third in the Big 12 & tied for 17th in the country), with Hinojosa contributing on 31 and Marlow on 28.

FLASHING THE LEATHER - Marlow was named to the 2014 Rawlings Division I Gold Glove Team. The four year starter at second base fielded at a .991 clip last season and holds a .981 career fielding percentage.

WEEKLY AWARDS - Freshman catcher Michael Cantu was the first Longhorn award winner for 2015 after earning Big 12 Newcomer of the Week Honors (Feb. 16-22). The freshman catcher tied for the team lead with seven RBIs on the week while adding six runs and a pair of doubles, and he drew a team-high six walks to have a team-best .545 on-base percentage. - Cantu again earned Newcomer of the week honors the week of April 13-19, by going 7-for-14 in the weekend series against Kansas, with a slash line of .500/.714/.563 while doubling and scoring three times each. The freshman backstop also caught two games and played first base in the other as part of a defense that did not commit an error all weekend long. - Freshman pitcher Connor Mayes earned Newcomer of the Week Honors March 9-15. The right-hander from Lake Travis tossed 6 2/3 scoreless innings with a career-high 10 strikeouts, while allowing just three hits and issuing one walk in a relief outing vs. West Virginia on March 14. It was the first double-digit strikeout game for a UT pitcher since Taylor Jungmann struck out 12 Aggies on May 19, 2011 in nine innings of work.

STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE - The Longhorns have one of the more difficult schedules in the Big 12 Conference and their slate currently sits as the 18th most challenging in the country (according to Boyd'sWorld.com). This is no surprise, as Texas began the season ranked fourth in Intended Strength of Schedule. Texas has already faced Rice (#39 RPI) in a four game non-conference set and #17 RPI Nebraska (March 27-29) in a three game, as well as conference foes #23 Oklahoma State (April 3-5) and #9 TCU (April 25 & 26) for three games apiece.

EXPERIENCE AT THE PLATE - Of the eight positional starters at the College World Series last year, Texas returned seven in 2015. Juniors C.J Hinojosa (.298 avg. and a nine game hit streak in 2014) and Ben Johnson (.405 slg pct. & 21 SB in 2014) lead the way while sophomores Tres Barrera (5 HR & 35 RBI in 2014) and Zane Gurwitz (.284 avg. & 10 2B in 2014) are building off successful freshman campaigns. These returns have helped the Longhorns to a season OPS of .730, after posting a .709 mark in 2014.



PITCHING FACTORY - Pitching coach Skip Johnson enters his ninth season at Texas having built quite an impressive resume for developing pitchers. During his tenure on the 40 Acres 24 Longhorn pitchers have been drafted, including three first-rounders, and his pitching staffs have ranked in the top-10 nationally in ERA six times. In 2014, the staff posted a 2.25 ERA, fourth-best in the country, and the lowest mark at Texas since 1977.

TEXAS DEBUTS - Twelve players have made their collegiate debuts for Texas this season: Fr. INF Joe Baker, r-Fr. INF Bret Boswell, Fr. C/1B Michael Cantu, Fr. RHP Kyle Johnston, Fr. 1B Travis Jones, r-Fr. OF Ben Kennedy, r-Fr. INF Connor Macalla, Fr. C Michael McCann, Fr. RHP/INF Jake McKenzie, Fr. OF Patrick Mathis, Fr. RHP Connor Mayes, Fr. RHP Tyler Schimpf ... Sophomores Kacy Clemens and Andy McGuire also made their first appearances on the mound and sophomore Josh Sawyer made his first career start. Several of these players have had significant contributions this season:

• Joe Baker

- Hit his first career home run and an important two-out double on April 19 against Kansas and has made several excellent defensive plays at shortstop throughout the year.

• Bret Boswell

- For the season, Boswell is tied for third on the team in doubles (8), and is third in walks (24).

• Michael Cantu

- Named Big 12 Co-Newcomer of the week for the week of Feb. 16-22 and April 13-19.

- Is third on the team with a .277 batting average, leads the squad with 28 base on balls and is third in runs scored (24).

• Kyle Johnston

- In 24 frames this year, Johnston sports a 2.63 ERA with 23 strikeouts.

• Connor Macalla

- Lifted a sacrifice fly to center to give Texas a 10 inning win over West Virginia on March 13.

• Connor Mayes

- Named Big 12 Newcomer of the week for the week of March 9-15.

- Holds a 2.17 ERA in 45 2/3 innings with 35 strikeouts on the season.

• Michael McCann

- Smashed a game-winning RBI double in the top of the 10th inning Feb. 15 against Rice.

• Jake McKenzie

- Has pitch 12 2/3 innings on the season, allowing just one run on eight hits and four walks while striking out 10 (0.71 ERA).

- These quick freshman contributions should not come as a surprise, as Texas' 2014 recruiting class was ranked seventh-best in the nation by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The Longhorns signed 10 players for the class of 2014, eight of which are from the state of Texas. Despite three of those being selected in the MLB Draft this summer (RHP Tyler Schimpf, C Michael Cantu, INF Travis Jones), all 10 players reported to campus and of the 21 players signed in the last two years, 20 have joined the Longhorns on the 40 Acres.

SENIOR ANCHOR - For the second year in a row the Longhorns' pitching staff is anchored by an experienced senior. Parker French (7-5, 2.41 ERA in 2014) is filling the role Nathan Thornhill (9-3, 1.51 ERA) played in 2014 in leading a young Texas pitching staff.

- In his first 11 starts of 2015, French is 2-3 with a 2.62 ERA. In 65 1/3 innings.

- French ranks first among active career Big 12 leaders in innings pitched (309.0) and is third in wins (19).

- The outfield also has senior leadership once again with the presence of Collin Shaw (.355 OBP & 12 SB in 2014). Shaw had an impressive NCAA Tournament in 2014, hitting .324, and he fielded .991 on the season with four outfield assists and several tremendous diving catches throughout the year.

- In the first 44 games this season, Shaw leads the Big 12 with 16 doubles. Shaw also made Sports Center Top-10 grab (No. 2 play) Feb. 17 against UTSA and hit the first three home runs of his collegiate career (3/14 vs. West Virginia, 3/22 vs. Kansas State, 3/29 at Nebraska).

- Senior gold glove-winning second baseman Brooks Marlow also returns in 2015 to provide leadership to the infield. In addition to his excellent defense, Marlow also finished second on the team in runs scored in 2014, and he was third on the team in OBP (.383) and home runs (3) while hitting primarily in the leadoff spot for the Horns.

- Marlow has four home runs on the season, is third on the team with 42 hits and his four RBI performance against Minnesota (Feb. 22) was the first of his career.

- The senior also boasts a career .981 fielding percentage thanks to committing just six errors over the past two seasons combined.

MAJOR ARMS LOST - The Texas pitching staff is taking a significant hit in 2015 after losing over half of its innings (356 2/3 of 601) from last year. RHPs John Curtiss, Nathan Thornhill and Lukas Schiraldi were taken in the 6th, 13th and 15th rounds of the MLB Draft respectively, while lefty Dillon Peters was taken in the 10th round. Sophomore right-hander Morgan Cooper, meanwhile, will miss the 2015 season after undergoing Tommy John Surgery on his right elbow. The righty from Jarrell, Texas put up an impressive freshman campaign, going 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA in 56 innings while striking out 41 en route to being named to the Big 12 All-Freshman team and a second-team Freshman All-American by Perfect Game.

A LOOK AT THE STAFF - Head coach Augie Garrido is in his 19th season at Texas and 47th overall with a career record of 1,942-914-9. He is assisted by Skip Johnson (ninth season at Texas), Tommy Nicholson (fifth season at Texas) and Ryan Russ (fourth season at Texas). Johnson has led UT to top-10 national finishes in ERA in six of his eight seasons on the Forty Acres. Nicholson, a volunteer assistant in 2009 and 2010, returned to the staff as an assistant coach prior to the 2013 season. He coaches the infielders and hitters and has landed two-straight top-10 recruiting classes. Russ, in his fourth season as volunteer assistant, coaches the outfielders and helps coach the hitters.

2014 BIG 12 CREDENTIALS - Among returners, RHP Chad Hollingsworth and 2B Brooks Marlow earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2014; Ben Johnson received honorable mention; and C Tres Barrera, RHP Morgan Cooper and INF/OF Zane Gurwitz were selected to the All-Freshman team. Barrera was also named Newcomer of the week twice (3/31 & 5/19).

2014 ACCOLADES - Three Longhorn players received postseason recognition for their achievements last season:

- Morgan Cooper (4-2, 2.98) and Tres Barrera (.261, 5 HR) were named second team Perfect Game Freshmen All-Americans at pitcher and catcher respectively. Barrera also won the College Home Run Derby at TD Ameritrade Park by blasting 41 home runs. Cooper however, will miss the 2015 season because of Tommy John Surgery on his throwing elbow.
- Barrera was also named a second team freshman All-American by Baseball America for his work both behind the plate and at it.
- Sophomore shortstop C.J. Hinojosa was named the CWS All-Tournament Team shortstop. He collected five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI in Omaha.

NEW BASEBALL FOR 2015 - NCAA Baseball will begin using a flat-seamed ball for the 2015 season. The new balls will travel approximately 20 feet farther when hit deep into the outfield than the raised-seamed balls used in the past.

• From the NCAA: "Flat-seamed baseballs launched out of a pitching machine at averages of 95 mph, a 25-degree angle and a 1,400 rpm spin rate traveled around 387 feet compared to raised-seamed baseballs that went 367 feet. Due to variables, not every trajectory hit with a flat-seamed ball will travel exactly 20 feet farther than a raised-seamed ball, but a 20-foot average difference is an approximate representation of what can be expected."

ACADEMIC SUCCESS - The Texas Baseball team's semester GPA in Fall 2014 was 3.15, and they hold a 3.23 cumulative team GPA. The squad has earned a GPA of 3.0 or better for nine consecutive semesters with a 3.1 or better for seven consecutive semesters.

- Over seventy-six percent of Baseball students hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, and over sixty-six percent of students on the team earned a 3.0 or better in Fall 2014 and were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.
- Eleven students, the most in program history, were named to the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Team, including John Curtiss, an English/History major, who graduated with Plan I and Academic All-American Honors, and earned the NCAA Elite 89 Award for holding the highest cumulative GPA of any student-athlete of the eight teams at the 2014 College World Series.
- Curtiss also earned the Big 12 Conference's highest academic honors with the Dr. Prentice Gault Postgraduate Scholarship and the Dr. Gerald Lage Academic Achievement Award.
- The Baseball program has received APR Public Recognition Awards five times for having multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top ten percent in their sport (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13), and they earned the College World Series Award for the team with the highest GPA in both 2007 and 2009.
- Current Baseball students are pursuing majors from nearly every college on campus, including Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, and Liberal Arts, and since 2006, over 30 Texas Baseball student-athletes have returned to campus to earn their degrees.

Tres Barrera put himself in elite Longhorn company with his 5-for-6, six RBI performance against UTSA on Feb. 17, as it was the first time since 2003 that a UT player had five hits and six RBIs in the same game since 2003. Ben Johnson had a five hit day against Stanford on March 8, making it the first time two UT players have had five hit games in the same season.

Against UTSA (Feb. 17), and at Kansas (April 19) the Texas offense accumulated 20+ base hits, a feat that had only been accomplished by the Horns five other times since 2003. It is the first two times the Longhorns had 20 hits in a game in the BBCOR bat era, and the game against UTSA marked the only time since 2003 that it had been done at UFCU Disch-Falk Field in a nine-inning game (the 20 hits against Boston College spanned 25 innings).

Texas followed that performance against UTSA with a 17 hit, 13 run outing on Feb. 20 against Minnesota. Their 27 runs in those two games are the most in back-to-back games since they had 35 vs. UT Arlington and Oklahoma State on April 20th and 23rd of 2010.



- Texas' recorded its 35th appearance in the College World Series in 2014, and its eighth trip since 2000, which also leads the nation ended in a tie for third place. The Longhorns' 85 wins in the CWS is also a record, and they have compiled an 85-59 (.586) record overall. Texas' six national titles are tied for second all-time with LSU, trailing only USC (12).
- Texas finishes the year (46-21), and in the top four in the World Series for a record 26th time. The Longhorns have finished in the top four six out of eight trips to the CWS in the Garrido era.
- Head coach Augie Garrido finishes his 15th appearance in the CWS with a 41-22 record. He is the winningest coach in college baseball history (1,920 career victories).
- The 103 bunts during the 2014 season for the Longhorns were the fifth most in a season in the Augie Garrido era. The four seasons with more sacrifices also ended in Omaha, including the 2005 National Championship year (116 sacrifices).
- The Texas pitching finished the year with a 2.25 ERA, the lowest team ERA since 1977 (2.12).
- Travis Duke was nearly untouchable all of 2014 for the Longhorns allowing just one earned run, good for a 0.29 ERA in 30 2/3 innings.
- In the post season the pitching staff had a 1.25 ERA and a .214 opponent batting average.
- The team's CWS ERA was 1.38, which includes their back to back shutouts (6/18 & 6/20). Texas had 13 shutouts on the year, tied for fifth-best in the country.
- The Longhorns finished the year first in the Big 12 and second in the nation in double plays turned with 71. Texas also finishes the year 34th in the country in fielding percentage (.974).
- C.J Hinojosa's ended the season on a nine game hit streak and an 11 game on-base streak. He was the only Longhorn to record a hit in all five CWS games.
- Hinojosa was named to the CWS All-Tournament Team for his outstanding performance. He had five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI.
- The Texas offense has 20 extra base hits in NCAA Tournament Play (14 doubles, three triples and three home runs) compared to six (five doubles and a triple) four their opponents.
- The Longhorns hit three triples in their final two games of the year (Gurwitz, Marlow, Barrera) to give them 18 on the season.

Head Coach Augie Garrido



Eight trips to the College World Series (CWS). National Championships in both 2002 and 2005. Second-place finishes in 2004 and 2009. Seven Big 12 Conference Championships (2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, and 2011) and four league tournament crowns (2002, 2003, 2008 and 2009). These are the results and why head coach Augie Garrido was hired to guide the Texas baseball program in 1996.

During his first 18 years on the Forty Acres, Garrido became the all-time winningest coach in NCAA Division I baseball history by capturing his 1,428th career win on June 9, 2003, (a 6-5 Texas victory over then No. 1 Florida State during NCAA Super Regional action in Tallahassee, Fla.), then moved past Gordon Gillespie as the winningest coach in all divisions with win number 1,894 on March 25, 2014.

He brought Texas back to the CWS for the first time since 1993 during the 2000 campaign, and returned the Horns to the pinnacle of collegiate baseball in 2002 by leading UT to a 57-15 record that produced the school's first-ever Big 12 regular-season and tournament championships, as well as its first national title since 1983. He duplicated the feat in 2005, guiding the Longhorns to their sixth National Championship, the second-most for one school in NCAA history. Texas' rise under Garrido has been the culmination of inking 17 straight top 15 recruiting classes and producing teams that have stood tall against perennial powers such as LSU, Miami (Fla.), Stanford and USC. Now, as he enters his 19th year in Austin, Garrido, who was selected as both the 2002 and 2005 National Coach of the Year, looks to keep the program in contention for college baseball's ultimate prize each and every season.

Garrido is the only coach in baseball history to tally 1,900 or more career victories. He is also the first coach to lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Cal State Fullerton & Texas), guide squads to National Championships in four different decades, and is one of only three coaches in history to win five or more NCAA titles (1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005). Garrido is one of only three coaches in the modern era of NCAA football, baseball and men's or women's basketball to ever lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Nick Saban, Rick Pitino). Additionally, Garrido has earned 15 trips to the CWS and 32 NCAA Regional Championship appearances, including 14 at Texas, while garnering National Coach of the Year honors six times (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005), regional coach of the year accolades on seven occasions (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2005) and conference coach of the year distinctions eight times (1987, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011) after leading his clubs to 25 league crowns.

His overall record after 46 years of college coaching, including a 769-368-2 (.675) mark with UT over the last 18 seasons, stood at 1,920-892-9 (.681), which translates into an average of over 41 victories per season.

The Vallejo, Calif., native is just the 13th coach in UT's 120-year baseball history, and, with the exception of the war years of 1943-45 when Blair Cherry was at the helm, is only the fourth Texas head coach since 1911.

As a result of his unique coaching style, Garrido has been ranked as one of the top three baseball teachers in the nation by Major League Baseball Directors of Player Development. To deserve that distinction, Garrido has coached three Golden Spikes Award winners, four National Players of the Year, six College World Series MVPs, 53 All-Americans, 14 All-League MVPs over his career. He has also had 15 of his players selected in the first round of the Major League Baseball Draft, including Longhorns Beau Hale (No. 14) in 2000, Omar Quintanilla (No. 33) in 2003, both J.P. Howell (No. 31) and 2005 American League Rookie of the Year Huston Street (No. 40) in 2004, the duo of Drew Stubbs (No. 8) and Kyle McCulloch (No. 29) in 2006, Chance Ruffin (No. 48) in 2010, Taylor Jungmann (No. 12) in 2011 and Corey Knebel (No. 39) in 2013. In addition, during his 18 years at UT, Garrido has tutored the skills of 27 players who have earned All-America honors a total of 34 times, 25 Freshman All-Americans, including a school-record four in 2006, 153 All-Conference performers, 11 USA Baseball National Team members and 97 players who have gone on to play in professional baseball.

Garrido's name is also held in high regard when people speak of his accomplishments in the College World Series. He is currently tied for second with five National Championships (trailing only Rod Dedeaux's 10 at USC) and 15 appearances (trailing Cliff Gustafson with 17), and ranks third in victories (41) and series games (63) among all-time coaches. He is also one of only eight men in history to coach two or more different teams in the CWS and is only the third Longhorns head coach (Bibb Falk & Cliff Gustafson) in the 120 completed years of Texas baseball to lead the Horns to Omaha.
