#### A LOOK AT THE REGIONAL

- Fresh off of its record fifth Big 12 Tournament championship, Texas was awarded the No. 3 seed in the Dallas Regional hosted by Dallas Baptist, where the Patriots are the No. 1 seed. Oregon State is the No. 2 seed and Virginia Commonwealth is the No. 4 seed in the region.
- The Longhorns (30-25) will open double elimination play Friday, May 29 against the Beavers (38-16-1) at 1:30 p.m. Central.
- UT is making its 57th appearance in an NCAA Regional, most by any school in Division I. Texas is making its 15th appearance in the NCAA Tournament under head coach Augie Garrido, having advanced to nine Super Regionals and to the College World Series eight times (2000, 2002-05, 2009, 2011, 2014).

#### A LOOK AT THE LONGHORNS

- The Longhorns were able to win their record fifth Big 12 Tournament thanks to three complete games and a 1.75 ERA over the four games in Tulsa, a similar effort to the 1.72 mark the team posted in 2014 during 15 games in the postseason.
- With the win in the championship game, the Longhorns have now hit the 30-win mark in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- Parker French and Connor Mayes earned Co-Most Outstanding Pitcher honors for the tournament. Both threw complete games victories (Mayes' was a shutout) and French picked up an additional victory in relief in the title game.
- Zane Gurwitz was named Big 12 Tournament Most Outstanding Player after going 8-for-13 in the tournament, including a game-winning two-RBI single in the championship game.
- Joe Baker, Tres Barrera, Bret Boswell and Brooks Marlow were also named to the All-Tournament Team for their efforts.
- On May 19, the Big 12 announced that Ben Johnson received first-team All-Big 12 honors and Barrera and French earned second team recognition for their seasons.
- In addition, Boswell, Michael Cantu and Mayes gave UT a league-high three players on the All-Freshman Team.
- The Longhorns have won four straight regional championships (2009, 2010, 2011, 2014).
- Garrido is a win away from number 800 in his 19-year career at Texas. The winningest coach in collegiate history, he has an 81-43 record in 33 NCAA Regional appearances.



- ▶ C.J Hinojosa provided six of the 20 long balls in Big 12 play, and Ben Johnson (55) and Hinojosa (53) finished first and second in the league in total bases during conference games. Texas led the league in slugging in conference games (.400) (more on page 6).
- ▶ Senior right-hander Parker French earned the 21st and 22nd wins of his career in the Big 12 Tournament. The righty tossed a complete game win vs. Texas Tech on May 20 and nabbed a second win in relief against Oklahoma State in the title game. The start vs. Tech also moved him into fifth all-time in school history in pitching starts (he now has 53). For the year, French is seventh in the Big 12 in ERA (2.33) and leads the team in wins (5).
- ▶ Senior Kirby Bellow got the save in the championship by tossing two scoreless innings, giving him 13 consecutive outings without surrendering an earned run.
- ▶ Though he did not reach safely in two games of the Big 12 Tournament, Tres Barrera has still reached base in 49 of 55 games, including the first 17 of the year. The sophomore is also one of just two Longhorns to start all 55 games this season (Collin Shaw the other).
- ▶ Junior left fielder Ben Johnson leads the Big 12 in triples (7), ranks second in multi-hit games (26), is third in total bases (119) and tied for third in hits (79).
- ▶ Nine of UT's 25 losses have come by one run (most in Big 12), five by two runs and six in extra innings. However, the Horns did win back-to-back one-run games in the Big 12 Tournament (5/20 vs. Texas Tech & 5/21 vs. Baylor).
- ▶ UT matched Baylor for the lead league with 12 selections to the 2015 Academic All-Big 12 Baseball team, while the Longhorns' nine members on the first team were a league best.
- ▶ Despite being just five game over .500 thus far, UT has posted a plus-54 run differential over the course of the season (260 to 206).
- ▶ Freshman Connor Mayes is fifth in the Big 12 in appearances with 27 and leads conference freshmen with a 2.29 ERA and .215 batting average against. His ERA sits sixth best overall in the Big 12, and the .215 opp. b/avg. is fifth.
- ▶ Mayes also became the first player to record two games of 10-plus strikeouts in the same season (3/14 vs. West Virginia & 5/23 vs. Baylor) since Taylor Jungmann did so in 2011.
- ▶ The freshman's complete game shutout vs. Baylor on May 23 was the first by a UT pitcher since Brandon Workman did it on June 4, 2010.

Houston Regional Champion

- UT is outscoring its opponents 78-33 in the seventh and eighth innings this season, and is 22-0 when leading after seven frames.
- Texas scored first in all four games of the Big 12 Tournament this past weekend, and the Horns are 22-6 this season when doing so.
- 13 different Longhorns batted in the Big 12 Tournament and 11 got at least one hit. Last season, only 10 players batted throughout the entire duration of the postseason.
- Texas has the 30th most difficult schedule in the country according to Boyd's World.com. The Longhorns entered the year with the fourth-ranked intended strength of schedule (Chart on p. 5).
- UT pitchers rank third in the Big 12 in ERA (3.15) and the bullpen has a 2.48 mark.
- Brooks Marlow ranks third in school history with 657 assists, and is also third in double plays with 141 (chart on p. 7).
- UT has scored 121 of its 260 runs (46.5%) on the year with two down in the inning, including eight of its 16 runs in the Big 12 Tournament.
- Joe Baker (.405), Ben Johnson (.329) and C.J. Hinojosa (.313) have come up with clutch two out this season (Averages are with two outs).
- Of Texas' 260 runs, 165 (63.5%) have come when the leadoff man gets aboard.
- Both Ben Johnson (.913) and Tres Barrera (.884) boast on an OPS over .800. Mark Payton (.811) was the only Longhorn with an OPS over .800 last season. The lineup currently holds a team OPS of .743 after posting a .709 mark in 2014.
- Both Johnson (March 8) and Barrera (Feb. 17) have had five-hit games this season, marking the first time two Longhorns have recorded five-hit games in the same year since 2007 (Josh Prince and Bradley Suttle, chart on p. 7).
- Texas has 10 multi-home run games this season after having just two in 2014, and the Horns are 9-1 in those games. UT hitters also have 116 multi-hit games (2.3 a game).
- The 16 run game at Kansas on April 19 marked the most runs by UT since 2011, most extra base hits (13) in the BBCOR bat era (since '11), the most homers in a game (5) since 2010 and the 23 hits were the most since UT matched the school record of 25 in 1998.
- Junior shortstop C.J. Hinojosa shined in the game, as he became the first Longhorn to hit for the cycle since Kyle Russell on 4/24/07, while driving in four and scoring three times.
- Ben Johnson also homered twice that day, the second time this season he's done that this year (also March 5 at Stanford). He's the first Longhorn with two multi-home run games in a season since Kevin Keyes did it three times in 2010.
- Junior left-hander Travis Duke ranks eighth in the NCAA with a career ERA of 1.70 over 95 1/3 innings of work.

**ALL BIG 12** - Texas placed three players on the All-Big 12 Baseball Team, a league-high three on the All-Freshman Team and seven on the Big 12 All-Tournament Team, including Zane Gurwitz who was named Most Outstanding Player.

**BULLPEN BOOST** - The bullpen has tossed 232 2/3 innings this season and holds a 2.48 ERA. The relievers saw a streak of 22 2/3 scoreless frames come to an end against Texas A&M Corpus Christi (3/31) when Jake McKenzie (2-0, 0.53 ERA in 17 IP) gave up his first and only run of the season via a long ball in the sixth inning. Connor Mayes also saw his scoreless streak out of the pen come to an end against the Islanders when he surrendered three runs in the 10th inning, but he still holds a 1.87 ERA out of the pen this season in 43 1/3 innings with 33 strikeouts to lead all UT relievers. Travis Duke boasts a career ERA of 1.70 in 95 1/3 innings of work, which ranks ninth nationally among active career leaders, and junior left-handers Kirby Bellow (1.04 ERA, 34 2/3 IP) and Ty Culbreth (2.36 ERA, 26 2/3 IP out of the pen) have five and four saves respectively.

**FLASHING THE LEATHER** - Brooks Marlow was named to the 2014 Rawlings Division I Gold Glove Team. The four year starter at second base fielded at a .991 clip last season and holds a .979 career fielding percentage.

**DOUBLE PLAY DUO** - Texas second baseman Brooks Marlow and shortstop/third baseman C.J Hinojosa helped Texas finish first in the Big 12 and tied for second nationally with 71 double plays in 2014. Last season, Marlow was involved in 56 of the double plays and Hinojosa 49, and Marlow has had a hand in 138 double plays in his career, which is third in school history. In its first 55 games in 2015, Texas has turned 51 double plays (third in the Big 12), with Hinojosa contributing on 34 and Marlow on 32.

**BEN AT HIS BEST** - Ben Johnson set a new a career high when he had five hits (5-for-5) in the series finale against Stanford (March 8). Johnson is the second Longhorn to post a five-hit game this season (Tres Barrera 5-for-6 vs. UTSA on Feb. 17), and just the ninth UT batter to accomplish the feat since 2003 (chart on page seven). He is also the first UT hitter to have two multi-homer games in the same year since Kevin Keyes did it three times in 2010.

- Through the first 55 games, the junior left fielder is 79-for-233 (.339) with 11 doubles, seven triples, five home runs, 31 RBIs, 38 runs scored and 16 stolen bases. Johnson leads the Big 12 in triples (7), is second in multi-hit games (26), third in total bases (119) and tied for third in hits (79).

- In Big 12 regular season play, he had a team-leading .350 batting average with 13 extra base hits (eight doubles, three triples, two home runs), seven steals and an OPS of .980 in 23 games. Johnson tied for second in the league with 35 hits and eight doubles, and his 55 total bases led the league during conference play.

- After recording a career-high four steals against Prairie View A&M (4/28), the junior has now recorded career highs in hits (5), home runs (2), RBIs (3), total bases (11) and steals (4) in games this season. The four steals were just one shy of the school record.

**BIG 12 LEADERS** - Several Longhorns are at or near the top of the Big 12 in a number of categories for the season, including Ben Johnson who is leading the conference in triples (7) and Tres barrera who is third in home runs (9).

**WEEKLY AWARDS** - Freshman catcher Michael Cantu was the first Longhorn award winner for 2015 after earning Big 12 Newcomer of the Week Honors (Feb. 16-22). The freshman catcher tied for the team lead with seven RBIs on the week while adding six runs and a pair of doubles, and he drew a team-high six walks to have a team-best .545 on-base percentage.

- Cantu again earned Newcomer of the week honors the week of April 13-19, by going 7-for-14 in the weekend series against Kansas, with a slash line of .500/.714/.563 while doubling and scoring three times each. The freshman backstop also caught two games and played first base in the other as part of a defense that did not commit an error all weekend long.

- Freshman pitcher Connor Mayes earned Newcomer of the Week Honors March 9-15. The right-hander from Lake Travis tossed 6 2/3 scoreless innings with a career-high 10 strikeouts, while allowing just three hits and issuing one walk in a relief outing vs. West Virginia on March 14. It was the first double-digit strikeout game for a UT pitcher since Taylor Jungmann struck out 12 Aggies on May 19, 2011 in nine innings of work.

- Junior infielder C.J Hinojosa was named Big 12 Player of the Week May 11-17. The junior led Texas to a series victory at Baylor by homering four times in three games while totaling five RBIs and five runs and hitting .462 (6-for-13). The four home runs in three games surpassed his total number of home runs on the season (3) heading into the series.

**MAJOR ARMS LOST** - The Texas pitching staff has taken a significant hit in 2015 after losing over half of its innings (356 2/3 of 601) from last year. RHPs John Curtiss, Nathan Thornhill and Lukas Schiraldi were taken in the 6th, 13th and 15th rounds of the MLB Draft respectively, while lefty Dillon Peters was taken in the 10th round. Sophomore right-hander Morgan Cooper, meanwhile, will miss the 2015 season after undergoing Tommy John Surgery on his right elbow. The righty from Jarrell, Texas put up an impressive freshman campaign, going 4-2 with a 2.89 ERA in 56 innings while striking out 41 en route to being named to the Big 12 All-Freshman team and a second-team Freshman All-American by Perfect Game.

**ROTATING ROTATION** - The Longhorns' pitching rotation was in flux throughout Big 12 play, as they used the same combination from one weekend to the next just one time through all seven weekends. Beyond Parker French locked in as the game one starter, Texas has used six different pitchers to fulfil the other two games each week. In contrast, last season three pitchers (French, Dillon Peters, Nathan Thornhill) accounted for 23 of the 24 conference starts on the mound.

**STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE** - The Longhorns have one of the more difficult schedules in the Big 12 Conference and their slate currently sits as the 30th most challenging in the country (according to Boyd'sWorld.com). This is no surprise, as Texas began the season ranked fourth in Intended Strength of Schedule. Texas has already faced Rice (#34 RPI) in a four game non-conference set and #48 RPI Nebraska (March 27-29) in a three game, as well as conference foes #12 Oklahoma State (April 3-5) and #8 TCU (April 25 & 26) for three games apiece.

RHP Kyle Johnston, Fr. 1B Travis Jones, r-Fr. OF Ben Kennedy, r-Fr. INF Connor Macalla, Fr. C Michael McCann, Fr. RHP/ INF Jake McKenzie, Fr. OF Patrick Mathis, Fr. RHP Connor Mayes, Fr. RHP Tyler Schimpf ... Sophomores Kacy Clemens and Andy McGuire also made their first appearances on the mound and sophomore Josh Sawyer made his first career start. **PITCHING FACTORY** - Pitching coach Skip Johnson is in his ninth season at Texas having built quite an impressive resume for developing pitchers. During his tenure on the 40 Acres 24 Longhorn pitchers have been drafted, including three first-rounders, and his pitching staffs have ranked in the top-10 nationally in ERA six times. In 2014, the staff posted a 2.25 ERA, fourth-best in the country, and the lowest mark at Texas since 1977.

- These quick freshman contributions should not come as a surprise, as Texas' 2014 recruiting class was ranked seventh-best in the nation by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper. The Longhorns signed 10 players for the class of 2014, eight of which are from the state of Texas. Despite three of those being selected in the MLB Draft this summer (RHP Tyler Schimpf, C Michael Cantu, INF Travis Jones), all 10 players reported to campus and of the 21 players signed in the last two years, 20 have joined the Longhorns on the 40 Acres.

**EXPERIENCE AT THE PLATE** - Of the eight positional starters at the College World Series last year, Texas returned seven in 2015. Juniors C.J Hinojosa (.298 avg. and a nine game hit streak in 2014) and Ben Johnson (.405 slg pct. & 21 SB in 2014) lead the way while sophomores Tres Barrera (5 HR & 35 RBI in 2014) and Zane Gurwitz (.284 avg. & 10 2B in 2014) are building off successful freshman campaigns. These returns have helped the Longhorns to a season OPS of .743, after posting a .709 mark in 2014.

**SENIOR ANCHOR** - For the second year in a row the Longhorns' pitching staff is anchored by an experienced senior. Parker French (7-5, 2.41 ERA in 2014) is filling the role Nathan Thornhill (9-3, 1.51 ERA) played in 2014 in leading a young Texas pitching staff.

- In his 14 starts and 15 appearances of 2015, French is 5-3 with a 2.33 ERA (7th Big 12) in 85 innings (9th in Big 12).

- French ranks second among active career Big 12 leaders in innings pitched (333.2) and is third in wins (22).

• The outfield also has senior leadership once again with the presence of Collin Shaw (.355 OBP & 12 SB in 2014). Shaw had an impressive NCAA Tournament in 2014, hitting .324, and he fielded .991 on the season with four outfield assists and several tremendous diving catches throughout the year.

- In the first 55 games this season, Shaw is second in the Big 12 with 19 doubles. Shaw also made Sports Center Top-10 grab (No. 2 play) Feb. 17 against UTSA and hit the first five home runs of his collegiate career (3/14 vs. West Virginia, 3/22 vs. Kansas State, 3/29 at Nebraska, 4/28 vs. Prairie View A&M, 5/16 at Baylor).

• Senior gold glove-winning second baseman Brooks Marlow also returns in 2015 to provide leadership to the infield. In addition to his excellent defense, Marlow also finished second on the team in runs scored in 2014, and he was third on the team in OBP (.383) and home runs (3) while hitting primarily in the leadoff spot for the Horns.

- Marlow has five home runs on the season (t-3rd on the team), is fourth on the team with 52 hits and his four RBI performance against Minnesota (Feb. 22) was the first of his career.

- The senior also boasts a career .979 fielding percentage thanks to committing just nine errors over the past two seasons combined.

**BIG IN BIG 12 PLAY** - Several Longhorns were at their best during conference regular season play this year, including Ben Johnson and C.J Hinojosa who were first and second in total bases, helping Texas to a conference-leading .400 team slugging percentage and 20 home runs over the 24 game span.

- Hinojosa also tied for first in the league in homers with six and second in slugging (.576), while Johnson is tied for second in hits with 35.

- On the mound, Parker French's 2.42 ERA was good for sixth in the league and his 36 strikeouts ranked tied for seventh. Additionally, Kirby Bellow ranked tied for sixth in both wins (3) and saves (2) during conference play.

- Bellow did not allow an earned run in his nine conference appearances, and freshman Kyle Johnstone sported a 1.00 ERA over 18 innings, but both fell short of the conference requirement (1 IP for each conference game) to qualify for the league lead.

**SOLID AT HOME** - Texas played its best ball this season at UFCU Disch-Falk Field, posting a 17-9 record. The pitching staff was especially salty at home, holding a 2.34 ERA over 26 games, and the offense held an impressive .777 OPS (.404 slg% + .373 ob%), thanks to 74 extra base hits (2.85 a game). The Longhorns blasted 12 home runs this season at home in 26 games, after hitting just five in 2014 over a 33-game span.

**A LOOK AT THE STAFF** - Head coach Augie Garrido is in his 19th season at Texas and 47th overall with a career record of 1,950-917-9. He is assisted by Skip Johnson (ninth season at Texas), Tommy Nicholson (fifth season at Texas) and Ryan Russ (fourth season at Texas). Johnson has led UT to top-10 national finishes in ERA in six of his eight seasons on the Forty Acres. Nicholson, a volunteer assistant in 2009 and 2010, returned to the staff as an assistant coach prior to the 2013 season. He coaches the infielders and hitters and has landed two-straight top-10 recruiting classes. Russ, in his fourth season as volunteer assistant, coaches the outfielders and helps coach the hitters.

**2014 BIG 12 CREDENTIALS** - Among returners, RHP Chad Hollingsworth and 2B Brooks Marlow earned second-team All-Big 12 honors in 2014; Ben Johnson received honorable mention; and C Tres Barrera, RHP Morgan Cooper and INF/OF Zane Gurwitz were selected to the All-Freshman team. Barrera was also named Newcomer of the week twice (3/31 & 5/19).

**2014 ACCOLADES** - Three Longhorn players received postseason recognition for their achievements last season:

- Morgan Cooper (4-2, 2.98) and Tres Barrera (.261, 5 HR) were named second team Perfect Game Freshmen All-Americans at pitcher and catcher respectively. Barrera also won the College Home Run Derby at TD Ameritrade Park by blasting 41 home runs. Cooper however, will miss the 2015 season because of Tommy John Surgery on his throwing elbow.
- Barrera was also named a second team freshman All-American by Baseball America for his work both behind the plate and at it.
- Sophomore shortstop C.J. Hinojosa was named the CWS All-Tournament Team shortstop. He collected five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI in Omaha.

**ACADEMIC SUCCESS** - The Texas Baseball team's semester GPA in Fall 2014 was 3.15, and they hold a 3.23 cumulative team GPA. The squad has earned a GPA of 3.0 or better for nine consecutive semesters with a 3.1 or better for seven consecutive semesters.

- In 2015, the Longhorns tied for the lead league with 12 selections on the Academic All-Big 12 baseball team which was released on May 14. Texas' nine first team selections were a league high and Parker French was named to the first team for the third straight year.
- Over seventy-six percent of Baseball students hold a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or better, and over sixty-six percent of students on the team earned a 3.0 or better in Fall 2014 and were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll.
- Eleven students were named to the 2014 Academic All-Big 12 Team, including John Curtiss, an English/History major, who graduated with Plan I and Academic All-American Honors, and earned the NCAA Elite 89 Award for holding the highest cumulative GPA of any student-athlete of the eight teams at the 2014 College World Series.
- Curtiss also earned the Big 12 Conference's highest academic honors with the Dr. Prentice Gautt Postgraduate Scholarship and the Dr. Gerald Lage Academic Achievement Award.
- The Baseball program has received APR Public Recognition Awards six times for having multiyear Academic Progress Rates in the top ten percent in their sport (2008-09, 2009-10, 2010-11, 2011-12, 2012-13, 2014-15), and they earned the College World Series Award for the team with the highest GPA in both 2007 and 2009.
- Current Baseball students are pursuing majors from nearly every college on campus, including Business, Communication, Education, Engineering, and Liberal Arts, and since 2006, over 30 Texas Baseball student-athletes have returned to campus to earn their degrees.

Against UTSA (Feb. 17), and at Kansas (April 19) the Texas offense accumulated 20+ base hits, a feat that had only been accomplished by the Horns five other times since 2003. It is the first two times the Longhorns had 20 hits in a game in the BBCOR bat era, and the game against UTSA marked the only time since 2003 that it had been done at UFCU Disch-Falk Field in a nine-inning game (the 20 hits against Boston College spanned 25 innings).

Texas followed that performance against UTSA with a 17 hit, 13 run outing on Feb. 20 against Minnesota. Their 27 runs in the those two games are the most in back-to-back games since they had 35 vs. UT Arlington and Oklahoma State on April 20th and 23rd of 2010.



## 2014 NOTES:

- Texas' recorded its 35th appearance in the College World Series in 2014, and its eighth trip since 2000, which also leads the nation ended in a tie for third place. The Longhorns' 85 wins in the CWS is also a record, and they have compiled an 85-59 (.586) record overall. Texas' six national titles are tied for second all-time with LSU, trailing only USC (12).
- Texas finishes the year (46-21), and in the top four in the World Series for a record 26th time. The Longhorns have finished in the top four six out of eight trips to the CWS in the Garrido era.
- Head coach Augie Garrido finishes his 15th appearance in the CWS with a 41-22 record. He is the winningest coach in college baseball history (1,920 career victories).
- The 103 bunts during the 2014 season for the Longhorns were the fifth most in a season in the Augie Garrido era. The four seasons with more sacrifices also ended in Omaha, including the 2005 National Championship year (116 sacrifices).
- The Texas pitching finished the year with a 2.25 ERA, the lowest team ERA since 1977 (2.12).
- Travis Duke was nearly untouchable all of 2014 for the Longhorns allowing just one earned run, good for a 0.29 ERA in 30 2/3 innings.
- In the post season the pitching staff had a 1.25 ERA and a .214 opponent batting average.
- The team's CWS ERA was 1.38, which includes their back to back shutouts (6/18 & 6/20). Texas had 13 shutouts on the year, tied for fifth-best in the country.
- The Longhorns finished the year first in the Big 12 and second in the nation in double plays turned with 71. Texas also finishes the year 34th in the country in fielding percentage (.974).
- C.J Hinojosa's ended the season on a nine game hit streak and an 11 game on-base streak. He was the only Longhorn to record a hit in all five CWS games.
- Hinojosa was named to the CWS All-Tournament Team for his outstanding performance. He had five hits including a home run and a double, two walks, three runs scored and two RBI.
- The Texas offense has 20 extra base hits in NCAA Tournament Play (14 doubles, three triples and three home runs) compared to six (five doubles and a triple) four their opponents.
- The Longhorns hit three triples in their final two games of the year (Gurwitz, Marlow, Barrera) to give them 18 on the season.

During his first 19 years on the Forty Acres, Garrido became the all-time winningest coach in NCAA Division I baseball history by capturing his 1,428th career win on June 9, 2003, (a 6-5 Texas victory over then No. 1 Florida State during NCAA Super Regional action in Tallahassee, Fla.), then moved past Gordon Gillespie as the winningest coach in all divisions with win number 1,894 on March 25, 2014.

He brought Texas back to the CWS for the first time since 1993 during the 2000 campaign, and returned the Horns to the pinnacle of collegiate baseball in 2002 by leading UT to a 57-15 record that produced the school's first-ever Big 12 regular-season and tournament championships, as well as its first national title since 1983. He duplicated the feat in 2005, guiding the Longhorns to their sixth National Championship, the second-most for one school in NCAA history. Texas' rise under Garrido has been the culmination of inking 17 straight top 15 recruiting classes and producing teams that have stood tall against perennial powers such as LSU, Miami (Fla.), Stanford and USC. Now, in his 19th year in Austin, Garrido, who was selected as both the 2002 and 2005 National Coach of the Year, looks to keep the program in contention for college baseball's ultimate prize each and every season.

Garrido is the only coach in baseball history to tally 1,900 or more career victories. He is also the first coach to lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Cal State Fullerton & Texas), guide squads to National Championships in four different decades, and is one of only three coaches in history to win five or more NCAA titles (1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005). Garrido is one of only three coaches in the modern era of NCAA football, baseball and men's or women's basketball to ever lead teams from two different schools to national crowns (Nick Saban, Rick Pitino). Additionally, Garrido has earned 15 trips to the CWS and 33 NCAA Regional Championship appearances, including 15 at Texas, while garnering National Coach of the Year honors six times (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2005), regional coach of the year accolades on seven occasions (1975, 1979, 1984, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2005) and conference coach of the year distinctions eight times (1987, 1995, 2002, 2004, 2006, 2007, 2010, 2011) after leading his clubs to 25 league crowns.

His overall record after 46 years of college coaching, including a 769-368-2 (.675) mark with UT over the last 18 seasons, stands at 1,950-917-9 (.681), which translates into an average of over 41 victories per season.

The Vallejo, Calif., native is just the 13th coach in UT's 120-year baseball history, and, with the exception of the war years of 1943-45 when Blair Cherry was at the helm, is only the fourth Texas head coach since 1911.

As a result of his unique coaching style, Garrido has been ranked as one of the top three baseball teachers in the nation by Major League Baseball Directors of Player Development. To deserve that distinction, Garrido has coached three Golden Spikes Award winners, four National Players of the Year, six College World Series MVPs, 53 All-Americans, 14 All-League MVPs over his career. He has also had 15 of his players selected in the first round of the Major League Baseball Draft, including Longhorns Beau Hale (No. 14) in 2000, Omar Quintanilla (No. 33) in 2003, both J.P. Howell (No. 31) and 2005 American League Rookie of the Year Huston Street (No. 40) in 2004, the duo of Drew Stubbs (No. 8) and Kyle McCulloch (No. 29) in 2006, Chance Ruffin (No. 48) in 2010, Taylor Jungmann (No. 12) in 2011 and Corey Knebel (No. 39) in 2013. In addition, during his 18 years at UT, Garrido has tutored the skills of 27 players who have earned All-America honors a total of 34 times, 25 Freshman All-Americans, including a school-record four in 2006, 155 All-Conference performers, 11 USA Baseball National Team members and 97 players who have gone on to play in professional baseball.

Garrido's name is also held in high regard when people speak of his accomplishments in the College World Series. He is currently tied for second with five National Championships (trailing only Rod Dedeaux's 10 at USC) and 15 appearances (trailing Cliff Gustafson with 17), and ranks third in victories (41) and series games (63) among all-time coaches. He is also one of only eight men in history to coach two or more different teams in the CWS and is only the third Longhorns head coach (Bibb Falk & Cliff Gustafson) in the 120 completed years of Texas baseball to lead the Horns to Omaha.






