Texas Soccer Program Notebook

Texas wrapped up its 21st season of Division I intercollegiate soccer back in November of 2014. The Longhorns were 11-8-4 last year and now hold an all-time record of 236-162-41 (.584) in their 21 years of competition. UT played its first Division I soccer contest on Sept. 3, 1994, a 4-2 loss at Pepperdine.

UT has made 11 appearances in the NCAA Tournament. The Longhorns sport a 7-11-1 (.395) record during NCAA postseason action.

The Longhorns have advanced to NCAA Tournament Round of 16 three times (2004, 2006 and 2007).

Texas has made it to the NCAA Tournament Second Round five times (2004, 2006, 2007, 2008 and 2014).

The Longhorns have claimed three conference championships. UT won the 2001 Big 12 regular season title in addition to capturing Big 12 Tournament crowns in 2006 and 2007.

Texas has had two players participate for her country's national team. Vanessa Martinez (2002-03) was a member of the Mexican National Team from 1999-2004. Kelly Wilson (2001-04) suited up for the United States at the 2002 and 2005 Algarve Cup, an international invitational held annually since 1994 in Portugal.

UT has had five players earn a total of eight National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-America honors. Kasey Moore (2006-08) is the only three-time selection, while Kelly Wilson (2001-02) received a pair of nods. Kati McBain (2002), Kelly McDonald (2003) and Kelsey Carpenter (2006) complete the Longhorns' All-America group.

The Longhorns have had one NSCAA First-Team All-America selection -- Kasey Moore in 2006.

Texas has had one freshman earn NSCAA All-America honors -- Kelly Wilson in 2001 (second team selection).

UT has four *Soccer America* All-Freshman Team members -- Kelly Wilson (2001), Caitlin Kennedy (2004), Kasey Moore (2005) and Dianna Pfenninger (2005).

Texas has had four players drafted into Women's Professional Soccer, three of them as top-25 selections (Kasey Moore/15th/2008, Stephanie Logterman/20th/2008, Jill Gilbeau/22nd/2008, Kelly Wilson/44th/2004).

UT has had one individual earn Big 12 Player of the Year honors, Kelly Wilson in 2002, and one named the two-time Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, Kasey Moore in 2007 and 2008.

The Longhorns have had three individuals tabbed as the Big 12 Freshman of the Year: Kati McBain in 2000, Kelly Wilson in 2001 and Kasey Moore in 2005.

Texas has had one Big 12 Coach of the Year honoree. Chris Petrucelli took home the honor in 2001.

In 2005, Texas' Kelly Wilson was one of 13 members named to the Big 12 Conference 10th Anniversary Team.

The Longhorns hold a 13-15-6 (.471) all-time record in 19 appearances in the Big 12 Conference Tournament. UT has advanced to the semifinals of the postseason league tourney a total of 11 times (1997, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2014).

UT is the lone current member of the Big 12 to have qualified for the league's postseason tournament each year.

Texas has concluded the season ranked in the top 25 of the NSCAA poll five times, most recently in 2008 when it finished 18th. The Longhorns finished a program-best eighth in 2006, when they won their first Big 12 Tournament championship and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Texas has also ended the year standing 11th (2007), 14th (2002) and 16th (2004).

Texas enters the 2015 season having qualified for the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the last 14 years. Since first making the event in 2001, the Longhorns have missed the NCAA Tournament just three times, in 2009, 2012 and 2013.

UT will open the 2015 campaign having won 10 or more matches in 13 of the past 15 seasons. The only seasons Texas finished with fewer than 10 victories were a 9-9-3 record in 2009 and an 8-10-2 mark in 2012.

The Longhorns have compiled an all-time record of 116-35-16 (.743) in 16 seasons at Mike A. Myers Stadium and Soccer Field. Since the facility opened in 1999, Texas has posted four undefeated home campaigns -- 9-0-1 in 2002, 9-0-2 in 2007, 6-0-4 in 2008 and 9-0-1 in 2013.

Texas had a total of 12 Academic All-Big 12 Team selections in 2014, including 10 of which earned first-team honors. Sophomore Isabelle Kerr was one of just six Big 12 players to earn a 4.0 GPA.

The Longhorns have had four Capital One Academic All-America selections. Emily Anderson is the only two-time winner, receiving second-team honors in 2008 and first-team recognition in 2009. Kelly Wilson (first team/2004) and Kelsey Carpenter (third team/2007) are the program's other two award winners.

UT has had two student-athletes receive an NCAA Postgraduate Scholarship (Kelly Wilson/2004, Stephanie Logterman/2008).

The Texas Soccer team has held a 3.2 cumulative GPA or better for the last 19 consecutive semesters entering the Fall 2014 semester. In eight of those semesters, the team has posted a 3.4 cumulative GPA or better.

After spending 12 successful years building the Tennessee Lady Vol soccer program into a perennial championship contender,

Angela Kelly made the choice to bring her expertise to the Forty Acres by taking over the head coaching position with the Texas soccer program on Dec. 19, 2011.

In three years at the helm of the Longhorn program, the Brantford, Ontario, Canada, native is already establishing her mark on the program, leading UT to a 31-24-8 overall record, a pair of Big 12 Championship semifinals (2012 & 2014) and back to the NCAA Tournament (2014) for the first time since 2011. From a player standpoint, Kelly can boast of four National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA)/Continental Tire All-Central District selections, nine All-Big 12 Conference choices, a pair of CoSIDA/Capital One Academic All-District 7 honorees and 33 Academic All-Big 12 inclusions.

Despite facing a schedule that for the majority of the season was ranked by the NCAA among the 10 toughest in all of Division I by winning percentage, Kelly's third campaign in charge of the Texas soccer program provided more evidence of the program's continuing upward trajectory. UT completed the 2014 season with an 11-8-4 overall record (4-4 in the Big 12) and a Big 12 Championship semifinal berth while reaching the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since registering a 1-0 win over Washington State in Portland, Ore., back during the 2008 campaign.

Boosted by the efforts of senior defenders Brooke Gilbert, Whitney Jaynes and Julie Arnold, sophomore Isabelle Kerr as well as first-team All-Big 12 goalkeeper Abby Smith, the 2014 squad boasted another strong defense. The Horns backline recorded 10 shutouts, the second-most in a single season in program history behind the 11 totaled by the 2008 team, while Smith's nine solo shutouts between the pipes equaled Dianna Pfenninger's 2008 single-season mark. Included were high-profile blankings of No. 6 Texas Tech (W, 1-0), No. 9 West Virginia (T, 0-0, 2OT - Big 12 semifinals) and No. 25 Arkansas (T, 0-0, 2OT). Smith also led the Big 12 in saves with 98, the sixth-highest single-season total in program history.

Offensively, Texas had 11 different players combine to total 33 goals, the fourth-most goals in the league and the most by a UT team since 2007, while 15 players contributed points. Freshman forward Olivia Brook led the charge with a team-leading seven goals and two assists for 16 total points on her way to earning Big 12 All-Newcomer Team honors. In the process, the Houston, Texas, native also became the first UT freshman ever to score five goals over her first five career matches.

Junior midfielder Lindsey Meyer added a career-best five goals, including match-winners to beat both Texas A&M-Corpus Christi and Iowa State, while Gilbert and junior forward Chantale Campbell contributed four scores each. Senior midfielder and NSCAA/Continental Tire All-Central Region selection Sharis Lachappelle and sophomore midfielder Julia Dyché tallied three goals

apiece, with the former getting credit for the match-winning score during the 3-0 NCAA Opening Round win over Rice. Sophomore forward Jasmine Hart recorded three assists during a 5-1 rout of Nevada (Aug. 31), tying for the third-most helpers in a single match in UT history, on her way to putting up a pair of goals and a team-best five assists for nine points.

Highlighted by an unbeaten 9-0-1 record at Mike A. Myers Stadium, Texas registered an impressive 12-6-2 overall mark during the 2013 campaign while finishing the season with eight wins over its final 12 contests. Despite being picked sixth in the preseason, UT tallied a 5-2-1 conference record to finish third in Big 12 play, marking the program's first top-three league finish since 2007. Unfortunately, after being knocked out of the Big 12 Championship quarterfinals by Oklahoma State (2-1) and despite possession of a strong resume, the Longhorns failed to earn a bid to the NCAA Tournament Field of 64.

In all, 13 Texas players combined to total 31 goals, with then-sophomore forward Kelsey Shimmick, Meyer, Lachappelle, Gilbert and Chantale Campbell (team-leading five assists and 13 total points) all tying for the team lead with four scores each. Smith and Lachappelle earned NSCAA/Continental Tire All-Central Region honors, while that duo plus Gilbert were selected to the various All-Big 12 squads. Between the pipes Smith finished the year ranked second in the league in save percentage and third in both save percentage and shutouts (eight).

During her initial year in Austin (2012), Kelly guided the Longhorns to an 8-10-2 record as her lineup regularly featured eight underclassmen. She helped Texas to its seventh Big 12 Championship semifinal appearance over the last nine years and to fourth-place in the regular-season standings, marking its highest finish since 2007.

The squad tied for the Big 12 lead in fewest goals allowed during the league campaign with five (the fewest surrendered since five in 2008) and placed second in goals-against average. UT also began the Big 12 slate with a 3-0-0 record for the first time since 2002 and only the third time in program history.

The Longhorns earned numerous individual accolades in 2012 as four players were named to the All-Big 12 Newcomer Team, the most for any program in the conference and equaling the 2001 UT squad for the most in Texas history. Kelly guided Kristin Cummins to first-team all-league honors, becoming the first Longhorn since 2008 to receive the nod. Freshman Smith and sophomore transfer Lachappelle were also named to the Big 12 Second Team. Eight UT student-athletes were named to the First-Team Academic All-Big 12 squad, the most since 2007.

At Tennessee, Kelly took the helm of a program that had never advanced to the NCAA Tournament, won a Southeastern Conference Tournament match or collected any First-Team All-SEC honors or other league seasonal hardware. She eventually led the Lady Vols to four-consecutive SEC Eastern Division crowns, three-straight SEC regular-season titles and four SEC Tournament titles. She was tabbed the SEC Coach of the Year from 2003-05.

Kelly led UT to a 160-84-20 (.644) mark during her tenure. While at Rocky Top, Tennessee reached nine NCAA Tournaments and made five Sweet 16 appearances. Her squads were 10-8-2 in the NCAA Tournament.

Six Lady Vols garnered All-America honors under Kelly's guidance, including three-time NSCAA All-American defender and current Texas assistant coach Keeley Dowling. Tennessee also earned 43 All-SEC and 22 SEC All-Tournament Team nods.

The Lady Vols were also exemplary performers in the classroom as Kelly's Tennessee student-athletes earned 142 selections to the Academic All-SEC Team and SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll. During her years in Knoxville, four individuals earned CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and 13 garnered Academic All-District accolades.

In her first season, Kelly led Tennessee to the best conference campaign in program history up to that point, finishing 12-8 overall and 7-2 in league

action. Along with program bests for conference wins and highest finish in league play, Tennessee also boasted its initial First-Team All-SEC selection in Kelly Berrall.

During Kelly's second season, the Lady Vols made their first-ever appearance in the national rankings and earned a bid to the NCAA Championship for the first time in school history. Tennessee rolled to an 11-6-1 overall record and a 7-2 mark in league action. Kelly guided the team to a victory over eighth-ranked Florida, a win that snapped a streak of 50-straight conference triumphs for the Gators. She assembled a stellar recruiting class with the freshman group rated No. 5 in the nation by Soccer Buzz.

In 2002, the Lady Vols continued their rise, posting then school single-season records for most wins (18), longest unbeaten streak (nine), longest winning streak (eight), longest home win streak (nine) and best home record (9-1). Tennessee finished 18-6-1 overall, won the SEC Eastern Division, captured the SEC Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Regional semifinal with wins against Furman and No. 22 Cincinnati.

Individually that year, Dowling became the first All-American in school history. Kim Patrick was one of 15 finalists for the Hermann Trophy, awarded to the top player in Division I.

The Lady Vols ran roughshod through the SEC in 2003, winning the Eastern Division title and regular season crown with a 7-1-1 league mark while earning their second consecutive SEC Tournament championship to take the SEC Triple Crown. The effort earned Kelly her first of three consecutive SEC Coach of the Year awards. Tennessee put together a program-best 12-match unbeaten streak and posted a 17-5-2 overall record on the way to a second-straight NCAA Regional semifinal berth. The Lady Vols' stout defense registered 12 shutouts as the unit was led by Dowling, who earned Tennessee's first SEC Defensive Player of the Year accolade in addition to repeating as an All-America selection.

Tennessee posted another 17-5-2 campaign in 2004, winning a third-straight SEC Eastern Division title and second consecutive league regular season crown with a 10-1 mark. Kelly earned her second-straight league coach of the year honor while a program-best seven players claimed All-SEC honors. Dowling capped her career with her third All-America campaign, and Tennessee again advanced to the NCAA Regional semifinal.

The 2005 season resulted in the program's second Triple Crown in three years. In what was supposed to be a rebuilding year, Tennessee went 15-6-2 with a 10-1 record in league action en route to earning a spot in its fifth-straight NCAA Championship.

In 2006, Kelly led Tennessee to its fourth NCAA Regional semifinal in five years. The Lady Vols posted a 12-7-4 mark, finishing second in the league and division with a 6-3-2 SEC record. Ali Christoph became the second player in school history to earn two All-America selections and the third player to pick up Academic All-America recognition.

The Lady Vols attained their highest ranking in program history in 2007. In her eighth season at the helm, Kelly guided the squad to its best start at 7-1-1, boosting UT to No. 6 in the Oct. 2nd NSCAA poll. Kylee Rossi became Tennessee's first two-time SEC Offensive Player of the Year, helping lead the Lady Vols to their fifth NCAA Regional semifinal.

A year later, the program captured its fourth SEC Tournament crown under Kelly's tutelage. Tennessee entered the tournament as the No. 6 seed and became the lowest-seeded team to win the title, earning an eighth-straight NCAA Tournament appearance.

The 2009 & 2010 campaign saw a brief downswing in fortunes as Tennessee registered 8-9-3 and 10-9-1 records, respectively. In 2009, seven one-goal defeats proved the culprit, while in 2010 a 2-5 start that featured matches against three ranked teams including No. 1 North Carolina on the road put the Lady Vols in a tough spot from the outset. UT would rally, however, going 8-4-1 down the stretch (7-3-1 in the SEC) but were denied an

NCAA bid for the second straight season.

Kelly regrouped the squad in 2011, guiding the Lady Vols back to the NCAA Tournament with a 15-7 overall mark and a 7-4 record in league action to take second in the SEC Eastern Division. The squad climbed as high as No. 12 in the NSCAA poll (Sept. 27) after starting the season 7-1.

Prior to becoming head coach at Tennessee, Kelly served for four years as an assistant coach for the Lady Vols. She arrived in Knoxville in 1996 after spending time as a student assistant coach under legendary coach Anson Dorrance at the University of North Carolina.

Kelly was a four-year letterwinner for the Tar Heels from 1991-94. She garnered All-America recognition as a senior and was a three-year All-Atlantic Coast Conference performer.

Playing well in the College Cup spotlight, Kelly was also a three-time NCAA Championship All-Tournament Team selection. She scored eight goals and registered four assists in NCAA Tournament play to help UNC to four consecutive national titles. In 1994, she scored the game-winning goal in the Tar Heels' 5-0 victory over Notre Dame and tied for the NCAA Tournament lead in points scored with 11 (four goals, three assists).

During her career, the Tar Heels posted a 97-1-1 record and won four ACC regular-season titles and four ACC Tournament crowns.

When her collegiate playing career ended, Kelly held the NCAA record for most matches played (99). A durable midfielder, she started 94 games and ended her career ranked 11th in school history with 38 goals, 12th in scoring with 103 points and 18th in assists with 27. She was named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Women's Soccer Team in 2002.

Kelly also enjoyed a successful international career. She was a member of the Canadian National Team for nine years, appearing in 29 matches. She started every contest in the midfield for Canada at the 1995 FIFA Women's World Cup in Sweden. She also played two seasons in the W-League for the Raleigh Wings, capturing national championships in 1998 and 1999. On May 11, 2004, she was inducted into the Canadian Soccer Hall of Fame in Vaughan, Ontario. She became just the third woman to be enshrined in the hall.

A native of Scotland, Kelly spent her youth in Brantford, Ontario, Canada. She earned a bachelor's degree in physical education with an emphasis in psychology from the University of North Carolina in 1994.

National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) All-America honoree as a defender at Tennessee, joined the Longhorn staff in December 2011, after serving for four years as an assistant coach for the Lady Vols.

During her time in Austin, Dowling has helped lead Texas to 31 victories, a pair of Big 12 Championship semifinal berths and a 2014 NCAA Tournament appearance, all while helping mentor defenses that have combined for 26 total shutouts. While part of the staff on the Forty Acres, four of her charges have earned NSCAA/Continental Tire All-Central District honors while nine have reaped All-Big 12 Conference accolades.

During the recently-completed 2014 campaign, Dowling help direct Texas to an 11-8-4 overall record, a berth in the Big 12 Championship semifinals and back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. Headed by an experienced backline, boasting a trio of seniors in Brooke Gilbert, Whitney Jaynes and Julie Arnold, and one the top goalkeepers in the nation in Abby Smith, UT's defense posted 10 shutouts, just one from equaling the program single-season record of 11 established back in 2008. Among the shutouts were high-profile blankings of No. 6 Texas Tech (W, 1-0), No. 9 West Virginia (T, 0-0, 2 OT - Big 12 Championship semifinals) and No. 25 Arkansas (T, 0-0, 2OT).

From an individual standpoint, Gilbert proved a threat not just on the defensive end of the pitch during 2014, but also on the offensive end, totaling four goals and dishing a pair of assists for 10 total points to rank fourth on the squad. Fellow senior defensive stalwarts Jaynes (one goal, three assists) and Arnold (first career goal) and sophomore defender Isabelle Kerr (one assist) also contributed as part of a combined 15 different Longhorn players that totaled points during the season.

Texas registered an impressive 12-6-2 record in 2013, going unbeaten at home in the friendly confines of Mike A. Myers Stadium (9-0-1) for the first time since 2008 (6-0-4). UT managed eight wins over its last 12 contests and went 5-2-1 in league play, rating third in Big 12 play and marking its first top three conference finish in seven years. Despite an impressive resume, however, the Horns failed to earn a bid into the NCAA Tournament Field of 64.

Defensively, the 2013 season was one of the finest campaigns in school history. Texas allowed just 16 goals over 20 matches and posted eight shutouts, marking the second-fewest goals permitted in a single year in program history.

In her initial season on the Forty Acres in 2012, Dowling helped Texas continue its string as the only current Big 12 Conference mem-

ber to make the league's postseason tournament every year of its existence. The Longhorns locked up the No. 4 seed to the event, its highest since finishing the regular season in second place in 2007.

During the campaign, UT earned its first victory over a ranked opponent since Oct. 22, 2010, with a 1-0 victory over No. 22 Oklahoma State on Oct. 5. To begin the league season, Texas shut out Iowa State and Oklahoma, marking the first time since Oct. 10-15, 2010, that the Longhorns had blanked consecutive Big 12 Conference opponents. In league action, Texas allowed just five goals versus Big 12 foes in tying for the conference lead in that category.

During her time as an assistant coach in Knoxville, Dowling helped guide the Lady Vols to a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances and one Southeastern Conference Tournament title.

The Carmel, Ind., native played three seasons of professional soccer as she suited up for Women's Professional Soccer (WPS). She was the eighth overall pick of the WPS Allocation Draft in October 2008, heading to Sky Blue FC and earning a starting spot on defense.

She joined a roster that included U.S. Women's National Team members Christie Rampone, Heather O'Reilly and Natasha Kai. In 2009, Dowling helped Sky Blue FC to the WPS title, scoring the eventual winning goal during a 1-0 semifinal victory. The effort earned the team an opportunity to visit the White House in the summer of 2010 to be honored by President Barack Obama.

During the 2009 campaign, Dowling played in 19 games, starting 18. A year later, she appeared in 20 games with 18 starts for Sky Blue FC. In 2011, she signed with Atlanta Beat, starting all 11 games before suffering a season-ending ACL tear. For her career, she played in 50 games, including 47 starts.

In addition to the WPS experience, Dowling played for the United Soccer League W-League's Charlotte Lady Hawks and professionally in Sweden. While with the Hawks, Dowling was named to the 2005 W-League All-League Team as well as the All-Central Conference Team.

As a player for the Lady Vols, Dowling earned three consecutive NSCAA All-America selections (2002-04), becoming the first All-America honoree in program history. She helped Tennessee to its first NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 appearance in 2002 and to a four-year record of 63-22-6 (.725 winning percentage).

The 2003 and 2004 Soccer Buzz Central Region Player of the Year also earned SEC Defensive Player of the Year honors during those two campaigns. In addition to the NSCAA accolades, Dowling picked up All-America honors from four organizations during her playing career. She was a four-time All-SEC selection, a two-time Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy semifinalist (2003-04) and a two-time Soccer Buzz Player of the Year finalist (2003-04). She also excelled in the classroom, earning Academic All-SEC honors on three occasions.

At the end of her four years, Dowling had tallied 25 goals, 15 assists and 65 points in 89 games, all starts. She still rates in four Tennessee career top-10 lists: matches played, matches started, points and goals.

After spending the 2005 campaign as a student assistant coach, Dowling started her full-time coaching career as an interim assistant in the 2007 NCAA Tournament when Lady Vols then-assistant coach Jen Laughridge Grubb gave birth to her first child. Dowling served as interim assistant coach from the opening rounds of the tournament through the end of Grubb's maternity leave.

Possessing a wealth of international playing experience, Dowling served as a captain on the U.S. U-19 Women's National Team and earned a gold medal at the FIFA U-19 Women's World Championship in 2002. Two years later, she helped the U.S. U-21 team to a gold medal in the Nordic Cup.

Dowling was one of 35 players selected to compete for a spot on the national team roster for the Algarve Cup in Portugal in 2007 and competed for a roster spot for the 2008 Olympics. She did not make the final roster, but signed a contract with U.S. Soccer in March, earning an automatic invitation to any national team tryouts for the next year.

Dowling earned her bachelor's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise science from the University of Tennessee in December 2005.

Jaimel Johnson recently completed her third season as an assistant coach for the Texas soccer program. She joined the Longhorn staff in January 2012 after serving as the goalkeepers coach at the University of Iowa for two seasons.

During her time at Texas, Johnson has mentored goalkeepers that have contributed to 26 total shutouts while posting a 31-24-8 overall record. Included among those matches are a pair of Big 12 semifinal berths (2012 & 2014) and an NCAA Tournament bid in 2014.

Johnson's efforts have helped develop Abby Smith into one of the top collegiate goalkeepers in the nation as the Plano, Texas, netminder has earned a pair of National Soccer Coaches Association (NSCAA)/Continental Tire All-Central Region selections (2013 & 2014) and three consecutive All-Big 12 Conference nods (2012, 2013 & 2014). Smith currently rates among the Texas career goalkeeping top five in shutouts (second - 24), lowest goals-against-average (first - 0.80), wins (tied for third - 28), saves (fifth - 204) and minutes played (fifth - 5,047).

Under Johnson's tutelage, Smith continued her impressive play between the pipes as a junior in 2014 while helping Texas to an 11-8-4 overall mark, a Big 12 Championship semifinal berth and back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2011. The first-team All-Big 12 Conference inclusion equaled Dianna Pfenninger's UT single-season record for shutouts with nine, including high-profile blankings of No. 6 Texas Tech (W, 1-0), No. 9 West Virginia (T, 0-0, 2OT - Big 12 semifinals), No. 25 Arkansas (T, 0-0, 2OT) and Rice (W, 3-0 - NCAA First Round), registered a 0.92 GAA (sixth all-time in UT history) and led the Big 12 with 98 saves. Senior goalkeeper Ava Vogel also contributed a shutout by starting in place of an injured Smith to blank UALR (2-0). As a team, Texas posted 10 shutouts in 2014, coming within one of tying the all-time program single-season mark established back in 2008 (11).

The 2013 season proved to be one of the best defensive campaigns in the history of Texas soccer as UT allowed just 16 goals over 20 matches, the second-fewest in a single season in program history. Smith registered eight solo shutouts between the pipes, while her 0.78 goals-against-average proved to be the third lowest all-time by a Longhorn netminder. As a result, UT managed a 12-6-2 overall record and registered the first unbeaten home mark (9-0-1) since going 6-0-4 back in 2008. The 12 total victories also marked the most by a Texas soccer team since a 13-win campaign in 2008.

During her initial campaign on the Forty Acres, Johnson helped guide freshman Smith to second-team All-Big 12 Conference honors as well as a unanimous selection to the league's all-newcomer squad. Under Johnson's watch, Smith established the Texas freshman record for lowest goals-against average at 0.63, besting Alex Gagarin's 0.89 GAA in 2001. Smith also tied Jaime Strong's 1994 rookie mark for

most shutouts (seven).

Smith made her Longhorn debut against Fresno State on Sept. 14, 2012, after returning from the Under-20 U.S. Women's National Team and the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup championship, and became the first UT freshman to record a shutout in her debut since Dianna Pfenninger against SMU on Aug. 26, 2005. She recorded a career-high eight saves against Texas Tech, becoming the first UT goalie with eight stops in a Big 12 contest since Pfenninger tallied eight against Oklahoma on Oct. 17, 2008. During the year, Smith also picked up a pair of league weekly honors, receiving the Oct. 5 defensive player of the week nod and the Sept. 25 newcomer of the week award.

While at Iowa, Johnson helped the 2011 Hawkeyes to a 13-4-3 record, a five-win improvement from the 2010 squad. During the 2011 campaign, goalkeepers Emily Moran, Caitlin Schnorbach and Kiley Beck posted eight shutouts and a 0.82 goals-against average, allowing only 17 goals during the season. Moran, a senior, logged all but 78:10 of the 1868:56 minutes, was named to the Big Ten All-Tournament Team and ended her career as the program's all-time leader in wins.

During Johnson's first year at Iowa, the Hawkeyes went 8-9-3. Her goalkeepers held opponents to 1.34 goals per game and allowed only 28 total scores as Moran and Kali Feiereisel combined to post seven shutouts. Moran's 99 saves ranked sixth on the Hawkeye single-season chart.

Prior to her coaching career, Johnson was a four-year goalkeeper (2005-08) under Angela Kelly at the University of Tennessee. She

finished her career with 60 matches started, 253 saves, a .780 save percentage, 20 shutouts and a 31-20-8 record.

She was an NSCAA/adidas All-America, NSCAA first-team All-Southeast Region and first-team All-Southeastern Conference selection in 2007 after making a program-best 111 saves and posting a 0.88 goals-against average, the third-best mark in Lady Vol history.

Before her senior campaign, Johnson was named to the Missouri Athletic Club Hermann Trophy Watch List in 2008. She was also a nominee for the NCAA Woman of the Year Award for the 2008-09 school year.

Johnson, a two-time team captain, led the Lady Vols to four-straight NCAA Tournament appearances and holds the Tennessee record for saves in an NCAA Tournament contest after stopping 12 at Portland on Nov. 12, 2006. She also helped the Lady Vols claim two SEC Tournament titles in 2005 and 2008. Johnson, a second-team all-league honoree in 2008, was named the most valuable player of the SEC Tournament as a senior. She is the only Tennessee player to ever be named the event's MVP.

Also excelling in the classroom, Johnson was a four-year member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll and was named to the SEC All-Academic Team from 2006-08 in addition to the SEC Freshman Academic Honor Roll for the 2005-06 campaign. In 2007, Johnson was an ESPN the Magazine Academic All-District IV selection. A year later, she was an NSCAA/adidas All-South Region Scholar.

Johnson possesses years of international experience as a member of the U.S. National Team pool in 2003 (U-17), 2006 (U-19) and 2008 (U-23).

The Boston Breakers selected Johnson in the inaugural WPS draft in 2009 and she made the Chicago Red Stars' roster for the 2009 season. She was one of seven players nominated for the WPS' Hint Water Sportswoman of the Year Award.

Johnson graduated from Tennessee in 2009, majoring in sport management with a minor in business.

Texas head soccer coach Angela Kelly added a high-profile piece to the Longhorns coaching puzzle in August of 2014 by hiring United States Women's National Team legend Kristine Lilly to serve as a volunteer assistant coach for the Longhorns' program.

In her first season on the Forty Acres, Lilly helped mentor a squad that completed the campaign with an 11-8-4 overall record, advancing to the Big 12 Championship semifinals while earning the program's first bid to the NCAA Tournament since 2011. The 2014 Longhorns ended the year by knocking off Rice (3-0) in the NCAA First Round before falling in second round action to No. 12 Notre Dame (2-1) in College Station, Texas.

One of the most accomplished players in the sport of soccer and certainly one of the most successful and decorated female athletes in United States history, Lilly remains the world's all-time appearance leader with 352 caps. Prior to her retirement as a player on Jan. 5, 2011, she played in five FIFA Women's World Cups (1991 champion, 1995 third place, 1999 champion, 2003 third place and 2007 third place) and three Olympic Games (1996 gold medal, 2000 silver medal, 2004 gold medal), helping Team USA win four of those tournaments, finish second once and third three times. Lilly was inducted into the U.S. Olympic Hall of Fame in 2012 and the U.S. Soccer Hall of Fame in 2014.

Lilly is the only player to appear for the United States in four different decades and is both the youngest and oldest player to ever score a goal for Team USA. She debuted for the U.S. at the age of 16 years and 12 days in just the 16th match ever played by the USA women on Aug. 3, 1987, making her the second-youngest player ever to don a U.S. jersey (Mia Hamm). Lilly also is the oldest player to earn a cap by more than three years over long-time teammate Joy Fawcett.

She served as captain for the U.S. Women's National Team from 2005-07. Prior to the 2008 Olympics, she played in every match the U.S. Women's National Team played in Women's World Cup and Olympic competition, and started all but one of those matches. Lilly scored 130 goals in her career, and she is the all-time leader in minutes played (28,700).

Throughout her 23-year National Team career, Lilly started in 330 of her 352 games played. Her 105 career assists are second only to Mia Hamm. During her career, Lilly played against 39 different countries, scored against 30 different countries, played in 21 countries and scored in 16 countries. She was named the U.S. Soccer Female Athlete of the Year three times (1993, 2005 and 2006), and she finished second in the voting for the FIFA Women's World Player of the Year in 2006.

A four-year letterwinner at North Carolina (1989-92), Lilly was a four-time First-Team NSCAA All-American who helped lead the Tar Heels to four consecutive NCAA titles. The winner of the 1991 Hermann Trophy as the top women's college soccer player in the

nation and a finalist for the same award in 1992, she was twice named the Offensive MVP of the NCAA Championship (1989 and 1990).

Lilly also won the 1991 Missouri Athletic Club Player of the Year Award and was a finalist for the Broderick Award as the outstanding female athlete in all of college sports. As a senior in 1992-93, she was tabbed UNC's Athlete of the Year.

Lilly completed her collegiate career at UNC with 78 goals and 41 assists. She was named to Soccer America's Team of the Decade for the 1990s. Lilly had her UNC jersey number 15 retired by the school in 1994. She earned a bachelor's degree in communications from North Carolina in 1993.

A native of Wilton, Connecticut, Lilly is married to David Heavey. The couple has two daughters, Sidney and Jordan.



2014 Season in Review: Notebook

BACK IN THE NCAA'S

Texas earned the program's first NCAA Tournament bid since 2011 and 11th in program history during the 2014 campaign. UT also secured its first NCAA win since 2008 and initial NCAA home victory since 2004 with a resounding, 3-0 win over Rice in first round action on November 14 at Mike A. Myers Stadium. The Longhorns would eventually fall to No. 12 Notre Dame (2-1) during NCAA second round play in College Station, Texas, finishing the year at 11-8-4 overall.

THAT'S A LOT OF SHUTOUTS

The Burnt Orange & White backline, consisting typically of seniors **Julie Arnold**, **Brooke Gilbert** and **Whitney Jaynes** and sophomore **Isabelle Kerr**, UT's standout junior goalkeeper **Abby Smith** and senior netminder **Ava Vogel** combined to help Texas post double-digit shutouts in 2014. With 10 blankings, UT tied for the second-most shutouts in a single-season in program history (2006, 2007), just one off the 11 registered by the 2008 squad in setting the standard. Smith also equaled former Longhorns keeper Dianna Pfenninger for the most solo shutouts in a single season with nine.

CORNER CREATORS

Texas ranked in the top five in the nation in corner kicks and in the top two in the Big 12 throughout the 2014 campaign. The Longhorns registered a total of 153 corner kicks for the season, an average of 6.7 per match, just coming up short of equaling the 2003 UT team's single-season mark of 162.

CAN'T SCORE IF YOU'RE NOT ALLOWED TO SHOOT

Under the guidance of head coach **Angela Kelly**, Texas continued its trend of great success when holding opponents under 10 shots in a match. UT was an impressive 8-0-1 in such instances during the 2014 campaign with the lone blemish coming in a season-opening, 2-2 tie versus Arizona State. Opponents Texas held under 10 shots and defeated included Hawai'i, Nevada, Texas A&M-Corpus Christi, Montana, Iowa State, UALR, Oklahoma and Rice.

STRONG ON PENALTIES IN 2014

Texas demonstrated great poise during the 2014 campaign when forced to step to the spot to take a penalty kick. That's good because UT went there a lot. The Longhorns earned four PK's during the regular-season with **Brooke Gilbert** (two), **Sharis Lachappelle** (one) and **Lindsey Meyer** (one) combining to go 4-for-4. Once postseason play started, Texas found itself in consecutive penalty-kick shootouts versus No. 16 Texas Tech and No. 9 West Virginia in the Big 12 Championship. UT topped the Red Raiders, 6-5, before falling to the Mountaineers, 6-5. Combining all PK's taken during the season, the Horns were 15-for-18 from the spot (83%).

FRESH FACES

A pair of freshmen made solid impacts on Texas soccer fortunes during the 2014 campaign. Forward **Olivia Brook** got off to the best start by any freshman in UT soccer history, scoring five goals over her first five matches on the way to a team-best seven tallies and 16 total points. Included among those scores was her clutch overtime-winning score at the 97:00 mark of the 1-0 upset of No. 6 Texas Tech (Sept. 26). Rookie **Morgan Murphy** scored just one goal and dished a single assist, but her goal proved memorable as it served as her first collegiate match-winner in a 1-0 victory at rival Oklahoma (Oct. 24).

SPREADING THE HEROICS AROUND

Texas had no shortage of heroines during the 2014 campaign as nine different players were credited with at least one match-winning goal. In fact, the only two players with more than one match-winning score were junior midfielder **Lindsey Meyer** and senior midfielder **Sharis Lachappelle** who managed two each. It was Lachappelle who scored the match-winner at the 28:48 mark of the 3-0 NCAA First Round victory over Rice on Nov. 14.

BIG 12 RECOGNITION

Texas had three players named to the various 2014 All-Big 12 teams prior to the start of the Big 12 Championship. Junior goalkeeper **Abby Smith** was tabbed to the first team, her third consecutive Big 12 accolade after second team nods in 2012 & 2013. Senior midfielder **Sharis Lachappelle** followed up two previous selections (2012 - 2nd; 2013 - 1st) with another second team inclusion, while freshman forward **Olivia Brook** was named to the Big 12 All-Newcomer Team. Texas has boasted at least three players on the all-league teams in each of the last five seasons and for 13 of the last 14 years.

KEEP THE CROOKED NUMBERS OFF THE BOARD

Under the guidance of head coach **Angela Kelly**, Texas boasts a lot of success when the defense keeps the crooked numbers off the opponent's side of the scoreboard. Since the beginning of the 2012 campaign, the Longhorns have limited the opposition to a single goal or less in 46 of 63 possible matches. In those instances, Texas owns a 30-10-6 overall record and has gone 23-3-5 since beginning the 2013 season.

NSCAA HONORS A PAIR OF LONGHORNS

The National Soccer Coaches Association of America included a pair of Longhorns on both the 2014 NSCAA/Continental Tire All-Central Region teams. Junior goalkeeper **Abby Smith** was chosen to the first team and senior midfielder **Sharis Lachappelle** drew an inclusion to the third team. The honor marked the second of each player's career in the Burnt Orange & White after Smith and Lachappelle were tabbed to the second and third NSCAA/Continental Tire All-Central Region squads in 2013, respectively. UT now owns 45 overall All-Central Region selections in program history and has had at least one player honored as NSCAA All-Region in 14 of the last 15 seasons.

GETTING IT DONE IN THE CLASSROOM

According to a release from the conference office, 12 members of the Texas soccer team were tabbed to the various Academic All-Big 12 teams in 2014, tied for the second-most in the league behind Baylor (13).

Sophomore **Isabelle Kerr**, tabbed as a 2014 Capital One Academic All-District 7 selection by CoSIDA, led the way for the Longhorns in earning first-team honors as one of just six nominated Big 12 players to carry a perfect 4.0 GPA (finance). She was joined on the first team by senior **Julie Arnold** (B.S. in sport management/pursuing master's in education), sophomore **Julia Dyche** (business), senior **Brooke Gilbert** (applied movement science), senior **Cierra Grubbs** (psychology/pre-medicine), sophomore **Jasmine Hart** (business), senior **Sharis Lachappelle** (mathematics/teaching), junior **Ali Schmalz** (psychology), junior **Abby Smith** (physical culture & sports, minor in communication) and senior **Ava Vogel** (physical culture & sports). Juniors **Chantale Campbell** (applied learning & development) and **Lindsey Meyer** (public relations) represented UT as part of the second team. For Arnold and Gilbert, the league academic award marked their third consecutive first-team inclusion. Grubbs, Lachappelle, Schmalz, Meyer and Smith all earned their second career Academic All-Big 12 plaudits.

Smith and Lachappelle were also honored for their academic prowess by the NSCAA. Smith was voted a third-team NSCAA Women's University Division Scholar All-American, while Lachappelle joined her teammate as a second-team NSCAA Scholar All-South Region inclusion.

Mike A. Myers Stadium and Soccer Field

As The University of Texas Soccer program enters its fourth season under the direction of head coach Angela Kelly, players and coaches alike have the benefit of calling the Mike A. Myers Stadium and Soccer Field home. Made possible through the generous donations of UT benefactor Mike A. Myers, the state-of-the-art, \$13 million facility possesses all the amenities that make it one of the top dual-sport venues in the nation today.

Myers Stadium consists of a full-size soccer field surrounded by a nine-lane European oval track. There is seating for 20,000 spectators, two separate scoreboards dedicated solely to soccer and track & field, full lighting for night events, and a first-class sound system, all of which adds up to one of the nation's finest collegiate soccer environments.

At the southwest corner of the facility is a full-functioning fieldhouse in which the Longhorns women's soccer team owns a newly-remodeled, spacious locker room equipped with personalized lockers, and its very own team lounge that can be used for club meetings, studying or simply relaxing. The fieldhouse was redecorated in the fall of 2012 and early spring of 2013 and now features murals of UT's most recognizable Soccer standouts. It includes locker rooms and team rooms for men's and women's track & field, locker rooms for officials and visiting teams and a training room specifically constructed for soccer as well as track & field.

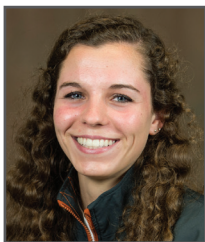
