QUICK HITS

- Saturday's game will conclude the nonconference portion of the 2015 schedule for Texas
- Texas enters the contest after a 42-28 victory over former Southwest Conference rival Rice. The Longhorns won the battle thanks to stellar special teams play and a quick-striking offense as the team only held possession for 15:58.
- Cal comes to DKR following a 35-7 home win over San Diego State. The Golden Bears defeated Grambling State, 73-14, to open the season.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN BEARS

- Cal is in its third year under head coach Sonny Dykes. He has ties to the Big 12 Conference having graduated at Texas Tech and serving as an assistant coach there under Mike Leach. He went 22-15 as head coach at Louisiana Tech.
- The Bears are averaging 570.5 yards per game on offense with 396.0 through the air.
- Quarterback Jared Goff spreads the ball around to his receivers well. Six Bears have at least four catches so far this season, and five different players have caught touchdowns. Three are averaging more than 50 yards per game.

SERIES HISTORY

- Texas leads the all-time series against Cal, 5-0
- The Longhorns got the best of the Golden Bears, 21-10, at the 2011 Holiday Bowl to close the season with an 8-5 record
- The 2011 Holiday Bowl also marks the only time the two teams have met in the postseason
- Saturday's contest will be the first regular season meeting between Texas and Cal since 1970.
- In 1970, No. 2 Texas opened the season with a 56-15 home victory over Cal to spark a 10-1 season in which the Longhorns' claimed their third national championship.
- Texas has shutout Cal in two of the meetings. The first time the Longhorns and Bears met in 1959, Texas won 33-0. The other shutout came in 1969 by the final of 17-0.

SPECIAL TEAMS MAKE SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

- In the 42-28 win over Rice, the punt return team played a huge role. After Texas forced a three-and-out on Rice's second drive of the game, **Daje Johnson** took Rice's punt 85 yards to the end zone.
- Johnson's punt return for a TD was the first by a

Longhorn since he did so against Oklahoma on Oct. 12, 2013. That return also went for 85 yards against the Sooners

- The 85-yard punt return is tied for the fourth longest in school history
- Johnson also became the eighth player in UT history to have at least two career punt returns for touchdowns. He is just one behind the career leaders: Jordan Shipley (2006-09), Aaron Ross (2003-06) and Jim Moore (1971-73).
- Johnson also had punt returns of three and 31 yards for a total of 119 and an average of 39.7. This came a week after Johnson had just three yards on two punt returns against No. 11/11 Notre Dame.
- It was a total team effort on punt returns. **Duke Thomas** also grabbed a short punt and returned it 56 yards to set up another Texas touchdown.
- With Johnson and Thomas combined, Texas tallied 175 punt return yards to break the school record. The previous best was 173 yards against Baylor on Nov. 3, 2001. All those yards came from Nathan Vasher.
- Texas averaged 43.8 yards on punt returns against Rice.

BIG PLAYS FUEL HOME-OPENING WIN

- The Longhorns' 42-28 victory against Rice was sparked by the 'big play.' All totaled, the Longhorns had nine plays of at least 20 yards in Saturday's win, including four that went for touchdowns.

20-YARD PLUS PLAYS AGAINST RICE (9)

- Jerrod Heard 35-yard rush on UT's third offensive play from scrimmage
- Heard 32-yard TD pass to Armanti Foreman to cap first offensive possession
- Daje Johnson 85-yard punt return for TD in first quarter

JEFFERSON'S FAST START

- True freshman LB **Malik Jefferson** has made an immediate impact on the Texas defense. Through his first two collegiate games (both starts), Jefferson leads the team and ranks second in the Big 12 Conference in total tackles with 18 (team-high 11 solo).

MALIK JEFFERSON BY THE NUMBERS

- Team-high nine tackles (six solo), including one TFL, four QB hurries and one fumble recovery in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Returned the fumble against Rice 26 yards for a TD, marking his first collegiate touchdown
- Posted nine tackles (five solo), including 2.5 TFL, in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)

NOT BAD FOR STARTERS

- Redshirt freshman QB **Jerrod Heard** shined in his first career start on Saturday against Rice. After playing just six snaps in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame, Heard had his name called prior to kickoff and responded with a solid performance. HORNS STAY HOT IN HOME OPENERS

- With the 42-28 win over Rice on Saturday, Texas has now won 16 straight home openers. The last time Texas lost a home opener was against North Carolina State in 1999 when Texas fell 23-20.

YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE & FRESHMAN STARTERS

- Texas had a strong 2015 recruiting class and many of the newcomers wasted little time making an impact during preseason camp. Seven true or redshirt freshmen were listed as first-teamers on the depth chart heading into the Notre Dame game.
- The Longhorns ended up with five freshman starters in their opening lineup: **WR John Burt**, **LT Connor Williams**, **RG Patrick Vahe**, **LB Malik Jefferson** and **CB John Bonney** were in the starting lineup. In addition, **Michael Dickson** handled the punting chores. Redshirt freshman Edwin Freeman is listed as the first team weakside linebacker, but the Horns opened the Notre Dame game with five defensive backs.
- Freshmen continue to make an impact as redshirt freshman **Jerrod Heard** got the first start of his career against Rice. Heard threw for 120 yards and two TD's while also rushing for 96 yards to lead the team.
- The 2015 recruiting class was highly touted and included 19 signees from Texas along with recruits from California, Florida, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi and New York.
- Coach Strong on his recruiting philosophy: "We know this – the state of Texas will always be our home ground. We will always build it from this state. There are great high school coaches in this state. That's what it's all about. We will always know this, any time we need to go out of state where we can get into battles, I don't mind going outside the state to get in a battle. That's what it's all about; that's what recruiting is all about. We knew we were not going to back down."
- Texas may have one of the youngest teams in the nation. The Longhorns

DID YOU KNOW?

With **Jerrod Heard** getting the start and the win over Rice it marked the first time since **Sept. 17, 2011** against UCLA that a quarterback won in his first career start – a span of **52 games**. In that game against the Bruins, Case McCoy led Texas to a 49-20 win. He threw 12-of-15 for 168 yards and two touchdowns. McCoy connected with D.J. Grant six times for 77 yards and two of Grant's three touchdowns on the day.

played 21 freshmen, including 15 true freshmen, in the season opener vs. Notre Dame. Only Florida State, NC State and Syracuse played more freshmen in their first game, and just Georgia had more true freshmen get on the field.

- A total of 17 freshmen, including 15 true freshmen, played against Rice.

QUICK STRIKE

- Texas scored quickly to defeat Rice with scoring drives of: 9, 2, 1 and 5 plays
- Those quick scoring drives led to just 15:58 time of possession for Texas

FINDING PAYDIRT

- Texas scored 42 points in its home opener against Rice and 14 of those points were not scored by the offense.
- **Daje Johnson** struck first on special teams as he returned a punt 85 yards for a touchdown. It was the first punt return for a TD since the Oklahoma game on Oct. 12, 2013 — a span of 22 games.
- **Malik Jefferson** scooped up a fumble in the third quarter and ran it 26 yards to the end zone. It was the first time Texas had returned a fumble for a touchdown in 20 games.
- Although those were the only two scores by special teams and defense, there were a number of other big plays that helped set up scores by the offense: a 56-yard punt return to the Rice 6-yard line by **Duke Thomas** resulted in a TD; a 31-yard punt return by Johnson to the Rice 28-yard line set up a touchdown.

NO GRAY AREA

- Senior running back **Johnathan Gray** is climbing up the all-time lists at Texas. With a long history of legendary running backs for the Longhorns, Gray could move into the top 10 in yards soon.
- Gray needs just 459 yards to move ahead of Hodges Mitchell for 10th in school history. He is currently 15th and would move ahead of Eric Metcalf just before climbing over Hodges.

STRONG IMPROVEMENT

A long-time defensive coordinator, **Charlie Strong's** teams pride themselves on being tough, physical and sound defensively. During his four years (2010-13) as Louisville head coach, the team improved in a number of categories culminating with 2013's top-rated defense in the FBS. The Cardinals were in the top 25 nationally in total defense in each of Strong's four seasons. In the three years prior to his arrival, the Cardinals never finished higher than No. 65 in the FBS in total defense.

Strong's offenses, meanwhile, also showed great improvement during his tenure at Louisville. The year prior to Strong's arrival, the Cardinals ranked 91st nationally in total offense (334.1 yards/game), but improved their ranking by 20 spots in year one and checked in at 28th in the country in 2013 (460.8 yards/game). Louisville was one of the most efficient third-down teams in the nation as well while ranking 25th in scoring, its highest ranking since 2007.

CHARLIE STRONG

Head Coach • Second Year

A two-time conference coach of the year and the architect of a revitalized University of Louisville program that posted at least 11 wins in each of his final two seasons, Charlie Strong is in his second year as the Texas head football coach.

Strong, the 29th head coach in UT history, spent the previous four seasons as Louisville head coach, re-energizing a program that was coming off back-to-back losing seasons (5-7 in 2008, 4-8 in 2009) and a 15-21 record in the three years prior to his arrival. He amassed a 37-15 record, a pair of Big East Conference Championships (2011, 2012) and was named Big East Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2012. He also led UofL to four straight bowl game appearances (3-1 record), including a victory over No. 4 Florida in the 2013 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

During 2014, Strong rallied the Longhorns from a 3-5 record to reach a bowl game despite the loss of two key starters on offense (QB David Ash, C Dominic Espinosa) and one on defense (DT Desmond Jackson) for nearly the entire season.

Texas ended the season with one of the better defenses in the nation, ranking 25th in the FBS in total yards allowed (348.5 per game), No. 11 in passing defense (184.2 ypg), No. 7 in yards allowed per play (4.68), 15th in passing efficiency defense (110.04 rating), tied for 11th in sacks (3.1 pg) and 31st in points allowed (23.8 pg).

A number of players earned individual honors in Strong's first season. Defensive tackle Malcom Brown was a finalist for both the Nagurski and Outland trophies, as well as becoming the 47th consensus All-American in school history. Brown and linebacker Jordan Hicks earned All-America honors. They were also among 10 players to secure All-Big 12 accolades.

Five players - Brown (first round to New England), Hicks (third round to Philadelphia), safety Mykkele Thompson (fifth round to NY Giants), cornerback Quandre Diggs (sixth round to Detroit) and tight end Geoff Swaim (seventh round to Dallas) - were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft.

During his final two seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals' were nation's fourth-winningest program, posting a 23-3 record (88.5 percent) and registering bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Louisville's 11-plus win seasons in 2012 and 2013 were the fourth and fifth in school history and the first back to back. UofL finished among the nation's top 15 for a school-record second straight year.

Strong spent seven seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Florida under Meyer from 2005-09 and Ron Zook from 2003-04 where he helped the Gators win a pair of national titles - 2008 over Oklahoma and 2006 over Ohio State.

From 2003-09, Strong's defensive units at Florida allowed an average of 17.6 points per game, which ranked ninth in the country over that span. His stint as defensive coordinator marked his fourth tenure at Florida, including a stretch from 1991-94 in which he coached defensive ends (1991-93) and defensive tackles (1994) after coaching outside linebackers in 1988-89, and serving as a graduate assistant in 1983-84. He served as Florida's assistant head coach from 2005-07 and was the associate head coach in 2008-09.

Before returning to Florida for the fourth time, Strong was defensive coordinator at the University of South Carolina from 1999-2002.

Outside of his time at Louisville, Florida, and South Carolina, Strong's career stops have included one season (1985) at Texas A&M as a graduate assistant before moving on to Southern Illinois as wide receivers coach from 1986-87, one season (1990) at Mississippi as wide receivers coach and four seasons (1995-98) as the defensive line coach at Notre Dame.

A native of Batesville, Ark., Strong was a three-year letterwinner (1979-81) and three-time all-conference safety at Central Arkansas, where he graduated in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in education. He and his wife, Vicki, have a son, Tory, and two daughters, Hailee and Hope.

It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews. Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.
