QUICK HITS

- Saturday's game will open Big 12 Conference play for both the Texas Longhorns and Oklahoma State Cowboys.
- Texas enters the contest after a near comeback against the Cal Golden Bears, falling 45-44. The Longhorns trailed by 21 points in the fourth quarter and scored three touchdowns to pull within one point, but the tying PAT was missed with 1:11 remaining on the clock.
- Redshirt freshman quarterback Jerrod Heard set a school record for total offense in the loss to Cal with 527 yards. He passed for 364 yards and ran for 163 to break Vince Young's record of 506 total yards.

SCOUTING THE COWBOYS

- The Cowboys break into the rankings this week. They are No. 24 in the AP Poll and No. 22 according to the coaches.
- Oklahoma State routed UTSA on Saturday by the final score of 69-14. The Cowboys poured it on late with four touchdowns in the fourth quarter and amassed a total of 529 yards for the contest.
- The Cowboys are averaging 508.7 yards per game on offense, as they have emerged as one of the top attacks in the Big 12 Conference over the last few years.
- Quarterback Mason Rudolph averages 315.7 yards passing and has five touchdowns on the year.
- One of the top targets for the Cowboys' offense is David Glidden. He has 12 catches through three games for an average of 94.3 yards per game and has hauled in three touchdowns.

SERIES HISTORY

- Texas leads the all-time series against Oklahoma State 24-5 after the Longhorns won last year's meeting in Stillwater, 28-7.
- The series has been somewhat even of late with three of Oklahoma State's five wins all-time against the Longhorns coming in the last six years. The series is 3-3 since 2009.
- Before winning three of the last five meetings starting in 2010, the last win Oklahoma State had against Texas was in 1997 in Stillwater, 42-16.
- Texas is 14-4 at home against Oklahoma State.

TEXAS IN BIG 12 OPENERS

- Texas is 16-3 in Big 12 Conference opening games, including wins in 15 of the last 16.
- The only losses came to Oklahoma State (1997) and Kansas State (1998, 2007).
- Texas is 9-1 when its Big 12 opener is at home with the lone loss coming to K-State in 2007.

HEARD'S RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

- After playing just six snaps in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame, redshirt freshman QB Jerrod Heard had his name called just prior to kick in the week two win against Rice and responded with a solid performance against the Owls. Heard put up record-setting numbers despite making just his second career start (and playing in his third collegiate game) in Saturday's 45-44 loss to Cal.

JERROD HEARD BY THE NUMBERS VS. CAL

- Set a UT single-game total offense mark with 527 yards (364 pass/163 rush). This performance topped the previous mark of 506 (239 pass/267 rush) by Vince Young at Oklahoma State in 2005.
- Became the second UT quarterback in school history to throw for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards, joining Colt McCoy (304 pass/175 rush) at Texas A&M on Nov. 26, 2009
- Led team to 650 yards of total offense, the eighth-highest single-game mark in UT history
- Completed 20-of-31 passes for 364 yards, including a long of 54 yards
- His 364 yards passing ranked 10th in UT single-game history and was the second-highest total by a freshman in UT history (Major Applewhite had 408 vs. Oklahoma State in 1998).
- Became the first UT freshman QB to throw for 300 yards since Colt McCoy (308) in the 2006 Alamo Bowl vs. Iowa
- Rushed 24 times for 163 yards (6.8 avg) with three TDs, including a long of 45 yards
- His 163 yards rushing marked the first time a UT freshman QB had rushed for 100 yards since Vince Young had 163 against Nebraska on Nov. 1, 2003 (14 carries) in Austin.
- His 163 yards rushing marked the eighth-best rushing effort by a QB in UT history and tied the best rushing effort by a freshman QB in school history
- His three rushing TDs tied a UT single-game freshman record (shared by four other players; last was Joe Bergeron vs. Texas Tech in 2011).
- His 163 yards rushing tied for the seventh-best

HEARD IN THE 2015 SEASON

- Leads the team in rushing with 247 yards on 36 carries (6.9 avg) and three TDs
- Has completed 25-of-39 passes (.641) for 494 yards with two TDs and one INT
- Leads the team in total offense with 741 yards (247.0 avg)

TOTAL TEAM EFFORT

- Texas tallied 650 total yards on offense in the 45-44 loss to Cal last week. That number ranks eighth in school history for a single game.
- The last time Texas had 600+ yards on offense was in the season opener against New Mexico State in 2013 when the Longhorns set the school record of 715 yards.
- Texas ran for 286 yards rushing and an average of 5.5 yards per carry.
- Jerrold Heard threw for 364 yards with four different players grabbing at least four receptions.

DAJE BREAKING AWAY

- Receiver Daje Johnson has emerged as one of Jerrod Heard's favorite targets. He hauled in five catches for a career-high 145 yards in the loss to Cal for an average of 29 yards per catch.
- His 145 yards also put him among the best performances in school history. He now ranks 45th in school history for receiving yards in a game. His previous career-high was 85 yards at Kansas State in 2012.
- Johnson had 99 yards in the first quarter alone on two catches.
- He had catches of 45, 55 and 26 yards to provide a deep threat and spark for the Longhorns.

SPECIAL TEAMS MAKE SIGNIFICANT IMPACT, ALTER GAMEPLANS

- Texas is averaging 29.7 yards per punt return this season. **Daje Johnson** was named **Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Week** for his 35 yards on kickoff returns, 119 punt return yards, including an 85-yard TD return against Rice in Week 2.
- Johnson has five punt returns for an average of 24.4 yards. That would be the conference leader by far, but he does not have the 2.0 returns per game to be eligible for the Big 12 list.
- He is not on the list due to his dangerous speed and Cal's interesting choice of gameplanning to avoid **Daje Johnson**. Cal punted four times against Texas, but **never lined up in punt formation**. By having **quarterback** Jared Goff quick-kick every punt, it ensured the Longhorns would not have Johnson, a WR, on the field when the Golden Bears elected to punt.
- Texas had zero punt returns against Cal as a result of all punts going out of bounds or being fair caught.
- Cal also avoided Johnson on kickoffs by kicking high and short to the up-backs or directional kicking away from him to another kick returner.
- In the win over Rice, Johnson's punt return for a TD was the first by a Longhorn since he did so against Oklahoma on Oct. 12, 2013. That return also went for 85 yards against the Sooners.
- The 85-yard punt return is tied for the fourth longest in school history
- Johnson also became the eighth player in UT history to have at least two career punt returns for touchdowns. He is just one behind the career leaders: Jordan Shipley (2006-09), Aaron Ross (2003-06) and Jim Moore (1971-73).
- Johnson also had punt returns of three and 31 yards for a total of 119 yards and an average of 39.7. This came a

DID YOU KNOW?

With his **364** yards passing and **163** rushing, **Jerrold Heard** is only the second quarterback in Texas history to pass for **300 yards** and rush for **100** in the same game. The only previous occurrence was against Texas A&M in 2009 when **Colt McCoy** threw for 304 yards and rushed for 175. Heard's **527 total yards** is a **school record** as well. He also tied a freshman record with **three rushing touchdowns** in the game against Cal last weekend.

week after Johnson had just three yards on two punt returns against No. 11/11 Notre Dame.

- Helping Texas and its high average in punt returns is **Duke Thomas**. He also grabbed a short punt against Rice and returned it 56 yards to set up another Texas touchdown.
- With Johnson and Thomas combined, Texas tallied 175 punt return yards to break the school record. The previous best was 173 yards against Baylor on Nov. 3, 2001. All those yards came from Nathan Vasher.
- Texas averaged 43.8 yards on punt returns against Rice.

LONGHORNS MAKING LONG GAINS

- Following the 38-3 season-opening loss to No. 11/11 Notre Dame, Head Coach Charlie Strong announced a change to the offense. Assistant Coach Jay Norvell would take over play calling duties from Offensive Coordinator Joe Wickline and Associate Head Coach for Quarterbacks Shawn Watson.
- Since that switch, the offense has seen an out-pouring of production with an average of 463.5 yards per game against Rice and Cal.
- Norvell made the switch to redshirt freshman Jerrod Heard at quarterback, and Heard posted the No. 1 total offense performance in school history in the 45-44 loss to Cal last weekend with 527 yards.
- Texas had just two plays of 20+ yards against Notre Dame.
- The Longhorns had four plays of 20+ yards against Rice and 10 against Cal.
- Four of those long plays have gone for touchdowns. The average length of those big-play scores is 43.3 yards.

NO GRAY AREA

- Senior RB **Johnathan Gray** is climbing up the all-time lists at Texas. With a long history of legendary running backs for the Longhorns, Gray could move into the top 10 in yards soon.
- Gray needs just 452 yards to move ahead of Hodges Mitchell for 10th in school history. He is currently 15th and would move ahead of Eric Metcalf just before climbing over Hodges.
- Last week against Cal, Gray had just 46 yards rushing but made an impact on the passing game as well with a career-high 71 yards receiving.
- He currently has five receptions for 79 yards. If he maintains that current pace of contributing to the passing game, he could crack the Texas all-time Top 10 for receptions and receiving yards by a running back.

YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE & FRESHMAN STARTERS

- Texas had a strong 2015 recruiting class and many of the newcomers wasted little time making an impact during preseason camp. Seven true or redshirt freshmen were listed as first-teamers on the depth chart heading into the Notre Dame game.
- The Longhorns ended up with five freshman starters in their opening lineup: **WR John Burt**, **LT Connor Williams**, **RG Patrick Vahe**, **LB Malik Jefferson** and **CB John Bonney** were in the starting lineup. In addition, **Michael Dickson** handled the punting chores. Redshirt freshman Edwin Freeman was listed as the first team weakside linebacker, but the Horns opened the Notre Dame game with five defensive backs.
- Texas was among the national leaders in true freshmen who played in the season opener. Only Georgia had more true freshmen play in Week 1 and only Florida State and NC State had more total freshmen play.
- Freshmen continue to make an impact as redshirt freshman **Jerrod Heard** got the first start of his career against Rice. Heard threw for 120 yards and two TD's while also rushing for 96 yards to lead the team. He followed that with a school record 527 yards of total offense against Cal.
- The 2015 recruiting class was highly touted and included 19 signees from Texas along with recruits from California, Florida, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi and New York.
- Coach Strong on his recruiting philosophy: "We know this – the state of Texas will always be our home ground. We will always build it from this state. There are great high school coaches in this state. That's what it's all about. We will always know this, any time we need to go out of state where we can get into battles, I don't mind going outside the state to get in a battle. That's what it's all about; that's what recruiting is all about. We knew we were not going to back down."
- Texas may have one of the youngest teams in the nation. The Longhorns played 21 freshmen, including 15 true fresh-

men, in the season opener vs. Notre Dame. Only Florida State, NC State and Syracuse played more freshmen in their first game, and just Georgia had more true freshmen get on the field.

- A total of 17 freshmen, including 15 true freshmen, played against Rice.
- A total of 22 freshmen played against Cal, again with 15 of them true freshmen.

VACARRO'S CAREER NIGHT

- Junior S Kevin Vacarro delivered in a huge way during Saturday's loss to Cal. After starting SS Dylan Haines was disqualified due to a targeting call early in the first quarter during Cal's second offensive series, Vacarro took Haines' spot and did not skip a beat.

KEVIN VACARRO BY THE NUMBERS

- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles (seven solo) and added one PBU and one forced fumble (that UT recovered in its own end zone) against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Ranks fourth on the team for the season with 13 total tackles (nine solo)
- Previous career high for tackles was three in this year's season opener at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)
- Entered his junior season with just four career total tackles (all coming in his freshman season in 2012)

JEFFERSON'S MAJOR IMPACT

- True freshman LB Malik Jefferson has made an immediate impact on the Texas defense. Through his first three collegiate games (all starts), Jefferson leads the team and ranks third in the Big 12 Conference in total tackles with 27 (team-high 14 solo). He also has added 3.5 TFL, four quarterback hurries and one fumble recovery (returned 26 yards for a TD).

MALIK JEFFERSON BY THE NUMBERS

- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles (three solo) against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Team-high nine tackles (six solo), including one TFL, four QB hurries and one fumble recovery in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Returned the fumble against Rice 26 yards for a TD, marking his first collegiate touchdown
- Posted nine tackles (five solo), including 2.5 TFL, in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)

JINKENS EMERGING AS SENIOR LEADER

- Senior Peter Jinkens has moved into a leadership role while taking command of the starting spot at strongside LB. A fourth-year player who served as a backup in 2012 and a part-time starter as a sophomore and junior, Jinkens has now played in 42 career games with 14 starts. He ranks second on the team and ninth in the Big 12 in total tackles with 23 (12 solo), including one sack, one TFL and one quarterback hurry this season.

PETER JINKENS BY THE NUMBERS

- Recorded six tackles (four solo) and one quarterback hurry against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Tallied seven tackles (four solo) in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Led the team with 10 tackles (four solo), including one sack and one TFL, at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)
- The 10-tackle effort at Notre Dame was just two stops shy of his career high (12 at Baylor in 2013)

BIG-PLAY BURT

- True freshman WR **John Burt** has caught at least one deep ball in each of his first three collegiate games. Burt has six receptions for a 182 yards (30.3 avg) and one TD through the first three contests.
- His season total of 182 yards is quickly approaching the Top 5 in school history for a freshman.

BURT GOING DEEP

- Catches of 43, 6, 7, 9 yards against Cal for total of 65 yards
- One catch for 69 yards (TD) vs. Rice (Sept. 12) on UT's first offensive play of the third quarter
- The TD catch vs. Rice marked the 11th-longest reception by a freshman in UT history
- One reception for 48 yards at Notre Dame (Sept. 5) which setup a field goal

HORNS STAY HOT IN HOME OPENERS

- With the 42-28 win over Rice on Saturday, Sept. 12, Texas has now won 16 straight home openers. The last time Texas lost a home opener was against North Carolina State in 1999 when Texas fell 23-20.

STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM

The University of Texas at Austin is considered one of the top public universities in the United States. Significant contributions to the academic, technological, business and arts have been made through the University and its alumni.

In its most recent university rankings, *U.S. News & World Report* rated The University of Texas at Austin the No. 16 public university in the country. *Forbes Magazine* rated it the No. 22 best value for colleges, and *Kiplinger* rated Texas the No. 14 best value for public institutions.

The acclaim is not limited to national rankings. The *U.S. News & World Report* rated UT Austin No. 30 on its list of Best Global Universities in 2014.

The University houses 18 colleges and schools that allow for students to earn degrees in 119 different undergraduate programs and 223 at the graduate level.

UT Austin has produced 31 Rhodes Scholars, one of the most prestigious post-graduate scholarships in all of academia. The most recent Longhorn to earn a Rhodes Scholarship is a member of the Texas Longhorns rowing team. Of the 31 Rhodes Scholars awarded in the history of UT Austin, nine of them have been student-athletes.

The campus offers 17 libraries and seven museums and students can get a head start on their future after college by utilizing one of the 16 career centers on campus.

Texas Head Football Coach Charlie Strong has seen his players take advantage of the countless opportunities the students at UT Austin have to advance their academic career. In his second season leading the program, the Longhorns have improved in a number of areas and posted the highest GPA in program history.

Texas Football Academic Achievements

- After the Spring 2015 semester, the Texas Football team holds the highest cumulative GPA in program history with a 2.77.
- Eighteen (18) Texas Football students earned All-Big 12 Academic honors in the 2014 season.
- Sixty-seven (67) Texas Football students were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll by earning at least a 3.0 semester GPA in Fall 2014 and/or Spring 2015.
- Forty (40) current and former Texas Football student-athletes graduated or are projected to graduate during the 2014-15 academic year. Graduates included NFL alumni Priest Holmes, Nathan Vasher, and Marcus Wilkins.
- Texas Football posted the highest multiyear APR in program history with the 2013-14 data released in May.
- Current Texas Football students are pursuing majors from nearly every college on campus including: the McCombs School of Business, the Moody College of Communication, the College of Education, and the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Natural Sciences, and the Cockrell School of Engineering.

COACHING STAFF



CHARLIE STRONG

Head Coach • Second Year

A two-time conference coach of the year and the architect of a revitalized University of Louisville program that posted at least 11 wins in each of his final two seasons, Charlie Strong is in his second year as the Texas head football coach.

Strong, the 29th head coach in UT history, spent the previous four seasons as Louisville head coach, re-energizing a program that was coming off back-to-back losing seasons (5-7 in 2008, 4-8 in 2009) and a 15-21 record in the three years prior to his arrival. He amassed a 37-15 record, a pair of Big East Conference Championships (2011, 2012) and was named Big East Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2012. He also led UofL to four straight bowl game appearances (3-1 record), including a victory over No. 4 Florida in the 2013 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

During 2014, Strong rallied the Longhorns from a 3-5 record to reach a bowl game despite the loss of two key starters on offense (QB David Ash, C Dominic Espinosa) and one on defense (DT Desmond Jackson) for nearly the entire season.

Texas ended the season with one of the better defenses in the nation, ranking 25th in the FBS in total yards allowed (348.5 per game), No. 11 in passing defense (184.2 ypg), No. 7 in yards allowed per play (4.68), 15th in passing efficiency defense (110.04 rating), tied for 11th in sacks (3.1 pg) and 31st in points allowed (23.8 pg).

A number of players earned individual honors in Strong's first season. Defensive tackle Malcom Brown was a finalist for both the Nagurski and Outland trophies, as well as becoming the 47th consensus All-American in school history. Brown and linebacker Jordan Hicks earned All-America honors. They were also among 10 players to secure All-Big 12 accolades.

Five players - Brown (first round to New England), Hicks (third round to Philadelphia), safety Mykkele Thompson (fifth round to NY Giants), cornerback Quandre Diggs (sixth round to Detroit) and tight end Geoff Swaim (seventh round to Dallas) - were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft.

During his final two seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals' were nation's fourth-winningest program, posting a 23-3 record (88.5 percent) and registering bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Louisville's 11-plus win seasons in 2012 and 2013 were the fourth and fifth in school history and the first back to back. UofL finished among the nation's top 15 for a school-record second straight year.

Strong spent seven seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Florida under Meyer from 2005-09 and Ron Zook from 2003-04 where he helped the Gators win a pair of national titles - 2008 over Oklahoma and 2006 over Ohio State.

From 2003-09, Strong's defensive units at Florida allowed an average of 17.6 points per game, which ranked ninth in the country over that span. His stint as defensive coordinator marked his fourth tenure at Florida, including a stretch from 1991-94 in which he coached defensive ends (1991-93) and defensive tackles (1994) after coaching outside linebackers in 1988-89, and serving as a graduate assistant in 1983-84. He served as Florida's assistant head coach from 2005-07 and was the associate head coach in 2008-09.

Before returning to Florida for the fourth time, Strong was defensive coordinator at the University of South Carolina from 1999-2002.

Outside of his time at Louisville, Florida, and South Carolina, Strong's career stops have included one season (1985) at Texas A&M as a graduate assistant before moving on to Southern Illinois as wide receivers coach from 1986-87, one season (1990) at Mississippi as wide receivers coach and four seasons (1995-98) as the defensive line coach at Notre Dame.

A native of Batesville, Ark., Strong was a three-year letterwinner (1979-81) and three-time all-conference safety at Central Arkansas, where he graduated in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in education. He and his wife, Vicki, have a son, Tory, and two daughters, Hailee and Hope.
