## QUICK HITS

- Saturday's game will pit former Southwest Conference rivals now reunited in the Big 12 against each other for the fourth time since TCU joined the league.
- Texas enters the contest after a heart-breaking loss at home to No. 24/22 Oklahoma State, 30-27.
- The Longhorns registered two touchdowns on defense with a fumble and interception returned to paydirt. It was the first time since Oct. 31, 2009, against Oklahoma State the Longhorns had two defensive touchdowns in the same game.

## SCOUTING THE HORNE FROGS

- TCU welcomes Texas to Fort Worth this weekend after escaping with a 55-52 win at Texas Tech last Saturday, after the Horned Frogs scored a touchdown with 23 seconds left.
- The Horned Frogs have been one of the most prolific offenses this season scoring 23, 70, 56 and 55 points in their four contests so far. TCU is averaging 636.5 yards per game as well.
- TCU receiver Josh Doctson was named Walter Camp Football Foundation National Offensive Player of the Week for his showing at Texas Tech. He had 18 catches for 267 yards and three touchdowns.
- Quarterback Trevone Boykin entered the 2015 season as one of the favorites to win the Heisman Trophy. After throwing for 33 touchdowns last year, he already has tallied 14 so far and averages 367.5 yards per game.

## SERIES HISTORY

- Texas leads the all-time series against TCU, 62-22-1, after the Horned Frogs won, 48-10, in Austin last year.
- Since joining the Big 12 Conference in 2012, TCU has won two of the three games in the series.
- In the last 10 meetings, Texas is 7-3 against TCU with the other loss coming in 1992.
- Texas is 27-9 against TCU on the road.

## TEXAS IN BIG 12 OPENERS

- With the loss to No. 24/22 Oklahoma State last week, Texas is now 16-4 in Big 12 Conference opening games, including wins in 15 of the last 17.
- The only losses are to Oklahoma State (1997, 2015) and Kansas State (1998, 2007).
- Texas is 9-2 when its Big 12 opener is at home with losses to K-State in 2007 and Oklahoma State last week.

### CLOSE CALLS IN BACK-TO-BACK WEEKS

• Texas easily could be entering Saturday's game at TCU with a 3-1 mark if not for some late-game breakdowns and costly mistakes in each of its last two contests. The Horns have dropped their last two games by a total of four points, both in heart-breaking fashion.

#### KEY PLAY DOWN THE STRETCH VS. CAL

• Despite trailing by 21 points entering the fourth quarter (45-24), the Longhorns used a trio of TDs to pull within a single point (45-44) after Jerrod Heard's 45-yard TD run with 1:11 remaining. However, UT missed the tying extra point (wide right) and could not recover the ensuing onside kick attempt.

#### KEY PLAYS DOWN THE STRETCH VS. OKLAHOMA STATE

• Texas held a 27-24 lead with 4:03 remaining in the game, when OSU took over possession at its own 49.  
• After an incompletion on first down, the Longhorns were penalized three successive times which moved the ball to the UT 19.

^ A pass interference call moved the ball to the UT 44

^ On an Oklahoma State rushing play, UT was called for defensive holding which moved the ball to the UT 34.

^ Following that penalty, Texas also was flagged for unsportsmanlike conduct that took the ball to the UT 19.

• After UT held the Cowboys to a field goal (tying the score at 27-27), Texas took over on its own 25 with 1:26 remaining.  
• The Longhorns went three-and-out on their offensive possession and were forced to punt.  
• On the ensuing punt, UT fumbled the snap and was only able to punt the ball 10 yards – which setup OSU at the UT 18. Two plays later, Oklahoma State PK Ben Grogan converted a 40-yard field goal with six seconds left to give the Cowboys the victory.

### MANY HAPPY RETURNS

• Texas leads the nation with three defensive touchdowns on the year. Tied with the Longhorns are four other schools: Buffalo, Middle Tennessee, Ole Miss, Ohio State.  
• The Longhorns had two defensive touchdowns against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26) when Hassan Ridgeway returned a fumble 34 yards and Holton Hill returned an interception 41 yards. It was the first time since Oct. 31, 2009 that Texas had two defensive touchdowns in the same game, which also happened to be against Oklahoma State.  
• Malik Jefferson returned a fumble 28 yards against Rice (Sept. 12) to register the first defensive touchdown of the season for the Longhorns.  
• Also against Rice, Daje Johnson returned a punt 85 yards for a score. That gives Texas two games this season with multiple non-offensive touchdowns.

### DEFENSE SHOWS IMPROVEMENT

• The Longhorns struggled defensively during their opening three games, allowing an average of 37.0 points and 512.3 yards per game, including 240.7 yards rushing per contest. In Saturday's loss to Oklahoma State, UT's defense surrendered 395 total yards, including 103 rushing yards on 46 carries (2.2 avg.).

#### HORNS GET DEFENSIVE VS. OKLAHOMA STATE

• UT scored two defensive TDs against Oklahoma State – a 34-yard fumble return by Hassan Ridgeway and a 41-yard interception return by Holton Hill  
• In the fourth quarter, Texas held the Cowboys to just 26 yards of total offense on 14 plays (1.9 yards per play).

### JINKENS EMERGING AS SENIOR LEADER

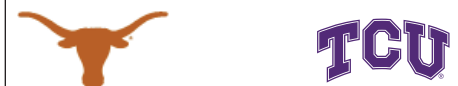
• Senior Peter Jinkens has moved into a leadership role while taking command of the starting spot at strongside LB. A fourth-year player who served as a backup in 2012 and a part-time starter as a sophomore and junior, Jinkens has now played in 43 career games with 15 starts. He leads the team and ranks seventh in the Big 12 in total tackles with 32 (17 solo), including one sack, 3.0 TFL and two quarterback hurries this season.

### PETER JINKENS BY THE NUMBERS

- Posted a team-high nine tackles (five solo), including two TFL, against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Recorded six tackles (four solo) and one quarterback hurry against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Tallied seven tackles (four solo) in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Led the team with 10 tackles (four solo), including one sack and one TFL, at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)
- The 10-tackle effort at Notre Dame was just two stops shy of his career high (12 at Baylor in 2013)

### JEFFERSON MAKES IMMEDIATE IMPACT

- True freshman LB Malik Jefferson has made an immediate impact on the Texas defense. Through his first four collegiate games (all starts), Jefferson ranks second on the team in total tackles with 29 (16 solo). He also has added 3.5 TFL, five quarterback hurries, one PBU and one fumble recovery (returned 26 yards for a TD).

### MALIK JEFFERSON BY THE NUMBERS

- Tied for the team lead with nine tackles (three solo) against Cal (Sept. 19)
- Team-high nine tackles (six solo), including one TFL, four QB hurries and one fumble recovery in the home win against Rice (Sept. 12)
- Returned the fumble against Rice 26 yards for a TD, marking his first collegiate touchdown
- Posted nine tackles (five solo), including 2.5 TFL, in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)

### THOMAS LEADING BY EXAMPLE IN SECONDARY

- Senior CB Duke Thomas is the unquestioned leader of the Texas secondary. A preseason All-Big 12 selection, Thomas has played in all 43 games over the last four seasons (27 starts). He ranks third on the team in total tackles with 24 (17 solo is tied for the team lead), including 3.0 TFL.

### DUKE THOMAS BY THE NUMBERS

- Posted seven tackles (five solo), including one TFL, against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Registered seven tackles (five solo) against Rice (Sept. 12)

### RIDGEWAY COMES UP BIG

- Junior DT Hassan Ridgeway has played in 29 career games (11 starts) and was named to the 2015 preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy. He battled through a back injury throughout fall camp and came off the bench in the first three games this year. Ridgeway earned his first start of the season in Saturday's loss to Oklahoma State and responded with a solid effort. For the year, he is tied for sixth on the team in total tackles with 16 (13 solo) and tied for the team lead in TFL (3.5).

### HASSAN RIDGEWAY BY THE NUMBERS

- Made his first start of the season against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26) and registered six tackles (four solo), including 1.5 TFL, one sack and one fumble recovered for a 34-yard TD.
- The fumble recovery marked the first of Ridgeway's career
- In his first three contests (all off the bench), Ridgeway recorded 10 total tackles (nine solo), including two TFL

### HAINES PREFERS TO PICK

- A former walk-on who was placed on scholarship prior to the 2014 season, junior SS Dylan Haines has played in 17 games (16 starts). Haines led the team in interceptions (four) and ranked second in pass breakups (seven) and third in tackles (86) last season. Despite missing the majority of the Cal game (Sept. 19) due to a targeting call early in the first quarter, Haines leads the team with two interceptions through the first four contests this year.

### DYLAN HAINES BY THE NUMBERS

- Ranks fourth on the team in total tackles with 19 (16 solo), including one sack, one TFL and one PBU
- Recorded seven tackles (six solo), one interception (29-yard return) and one PBU against Oklahoma State (Sept. 26)
- Registered seven tackles (five solo) in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame (Sept. 5)

## DID YOU KNOW?

Texas has scored **two non-offensive touchdowns** in **two games** this season. The last time the Longhorns accomplished that feat was in **2009** when Texas had two interception returns for touchdowns against Oklahoma State (10/31/2009) and returned an interception, punt return and blocked punt return for touchdowns against Colorado (10/10/2009). Texas scored a **total of 10** non-offensive touchdowns that season. The Longhorns have **four so far this year**.

## HILL RECORDS PICK-SIX

- True freshman CB Holton Hill delivered in a huge way during Saturday's loss to Oklahoma State. Hill recorded his first career interception and returned it 41 yards for a touchdown late in the third quarter. He also posted two solo tackles and one PBU. For the year, he has tallied seven tackles (all solo).
- The last time a true freshman returned an interception for a touchdown was Sept. 27, 2008 when Aaron Williams ran a pick-six back 81 yards against Arkansas. Williams currently plays for the Buffalo Bills.

## HEARD'S RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

- After playing just six snaps in the season-opening loss at Notre Dame, redshirt freshman QB Jerrod Heard had his name called just prior to kick in the Week 2 win against Rice and responded with a solid performance against the Owls. Heard put up record-setting numbers despite making just his second career start (and playing in his third collegiate game) in a 45-44 loss to Cal on Sept. 19.

### JERROD HEARD BY THE NUMBERS VS. CAL

- Set a UT single-game total offense mark with 527 yards (364 pass/163 rush). This performance topped the previous mark of 506 (239 pass/267 rush) by Vince Young at Oklahoma State in 2005.
- Became the second UT quarterback in school history to throw for 300 yards and rush for 100 yards, joining Colt McCoy (304 pass/175 rush) at Texas A&M on Nov. 26, 2009
- Led team to 650 yards of total offense, the eighth-highest single-game mark in UT history
- Completed 20-of-31 passes for 364 yards, including a long of 54 yards
- His 364 yards passing ranked 10th in UT single-game history and was the second-highest total by a freshman in UT history (Major Applewhite had 408 vs. Oklahoma State in 1998).

- Became the first UT freshman QB to throw for 300 yards since Colt McCoy (308) in the 2006 Alamo Bowl vs. Iowa
- Rushed 24 times for 163 yards (6.8 avg) with three TDs, including a long of 45 yards
- His 163 yards rushing marked the first time a UT freshman QB had rushed for 100 yards since Vince Young had 163 against Nebraska on Nov. 1, 2003 (14 carries) in Austin.
- His 163 yards rushing marked the eighth-best rushing effort by a QB in UT history and tied the best rushing effort by a freshman QB in school history
- His three rushing TDs tied a UT single-game freshman record (shared by four other players; last was Joe Bergeron vs. Texas Tech in 2011).
- His 163 yards rushing tied for the seventh-best single-game effort by a freshman in UT history

### HEARD IN THE 2015 SEASON

- Leads the team in rushing with 295 yards on 55 carries (5.4 avg) and three TDs
- Has completed 34-of-56 passes (.607) for 613 yards with two TDs and two INT's
- Leads the team in total offense with 908 yards (227.0 avg)

## TOTAL TEAM EFFORT

- Texas tallied 650 total yards on offense in the 45-44 loss to Cal (Sept. 19). That number ranks eighth in school history for a single game.
- The last time Texas had 600+ yards on offense was in the season opener against New Mexico State in 2013 when the Longhorns set the school record of 715 yards.
- Texas ran for 286 yards rushing and an average of 5.5 yards per carry.
- Jerrod Heard threw for 364 yards with four different players grabbing at least four receptions.

## YOUTHFUL EXPERIENCE & FRESHMAN STARTERS

- Texas had a strong 2015 recruiting class and many of the newcomers wasted little time making an impact during preseason camp. Seven true or redshirt freshmen were listed as first-teamers on the depth chart heading into the Notre Dame game.
- The Longhorns ended up with five freshman starters in their opening lineup: **WR John Burt**, **LT Connor Williams**, **RG Patrick Vahe**, **LB Malik Jefferson** and **CB John Bonney** were in the starting lineup. In addition, **Michael Dickson** handled the punting chores. Redshirt freshman Edwin Freeman was listed as the first team weakside linebacker, but the Horns opened the Notre Dame game with five defensive backs.
- Texas was among the national leaders in true freshmen who played in the season opener. Only Georgia had more true freshmen play in Week 1 and only Florida State and NC State had more total freshmen play.
- Freshmen continue to make an impact as redshirt freshman **Jerrold Heard** got the first start of his career against Rice. Heard threw for 120 yards and two TD's while also rushing for 96 yards to lead the team. He followed that with a school record 527 yards of total offense against Cal.
- The 2015 recruiting class was highly touted and included 19 signees from Texas along with recruits from California, Florida, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi and New York.
- Coach Strong on his recruiting philosophy: "We know this — the state of Texas will always be our home ground. We will always build it from this state. There are great high school coaches in this state. That's what it's all about. We will always know this, any time we need to go out of state where we can get into battles, I don't mind going outside the state to get in a battle. That's what it's all about; that's what recruiting is all about. We knew we were not going to back down."
- Texas may have one of the youngest teams in the nation. The Longhorns played 21 freshmen, including 15 true freshmen, in the season opener vs. Notre Dame. Only Florida State, NC State and Syracuse played more freshmen in their first game, and just Georgia had more true freshmen get on the field.
- Twice this year Texas has played a combined total of at least 20 freshmen: at Notre Dame and vs. Cal.
- The game against Cal saw Texas play its most freshmen. A total of 22 played with 15 of them true freshmen.

## DAJE JOHNSON MAKING SIGNIFICANT IMPACT, ALTERING GAMEPLANS

- Texas is averaging 23.8 yards per punt return this season to lead the Big 12 Conference.
- Daje Johnson** is the top individual in the league with an average of 19.8 yards.
- He is leading the Big 12 despite only gaining three yards on two punt returns at Notre Dame in the season opener.
- Johnson was named **Big 12 Conference Special Teams Player of the Week** following the Rice game (Sept. 12) for his 35 yards on kickoff returns, 119 punt return yards, including an 85-yard TD return.
- During the game against California (Sept. 19), the Golden Bears found ways to avoid kicking to Johnson and keep his dangerous speed out of the return game. Cal punted four times against Texas, but **never lined up in punt formation**. By having **quarterback** Jared Goff quick-kick every punt, it ensured the Longhorns would not have Johnson, a WR, on the field when the Golden Bears elected to punt.
- Texas had zero punt returns against Cal as a result of all punts going out of bounds or being fair caught.
- Cal also avoided Johnson on kickoffs by kicking high and short to the up-backs or directional kicking away from him to another kick returner.

## HAVE YOU HEARD?

Redshirt freshman Jerrod Heard has performed well in his first three starts. Among the last seven Texas QBs starting the first three games of their careers, his 600 passing yards are tops and his 307 rushing yards rank second behind Vince Young's 322. A stat of note is Heard lost 55 yards on sacks and rushes against Oklahoma State. Heard has thrown for two touchdowns and ran for another three. Combined his rushing and passing make him the No. 1 quarterback in total offense among those being compared with 907 yards.

## STRONG IN THE CLASSROOM

The University of Texas at Austin is considered one of the top public universities in the United States. Significant contributions to the academic, technological, business and arts have been made through the University and its alumni.

In its most recent university rankings, *U.S. News & World Report* rated The University of Texas at Austin the No. 16 public university in the country. *Forbes Magazine* rated it the No. 22 best value for colleges, and *Kiplinger* rated Texas the No. 14 best value for public institutions.

The acclaim is not limited to national rankings. The *U.S. News & World Report* rated UT Austin No. 30 on its list of Best Global Universities in 2014.

The University houses 18 colleges and schools that allow for students to earn degrees in 119 different undergraduate programs and 223 at the graduate level.

UT Austin has produced 31 Rhodes Scholars, one of the most prestigious post-graduate scholarships in all of academia. The most recent Longhorn to earn a Rhodes Scholarship is a member of the Texas Longhorns rowing team. Of the 31 Rhodes Scholars awarded in the history of UT Austin, nine of them have been student-athletes.

The campus offers 17 libraries and seven museums and students can get a head start on their future after college by utilizing one of the 16 career centers on campus.

Texas Head Football Coach Charlie Strong has seen his players take advantage of the countless opportunities the students at UT Austin have to advance their academic career. In his second season leading the program, the Longhorns have improved in a number of areas and posted the highest GPA in program history.

### Texas Football Academic Achievements

- After the Spring 2015 semester, the Texas Football team holds the highest cumulative GPA in program history with a 2.77.
- Eighteen (18) Texas Football students earned All-Big 12 Academic honors in the 2014 season.
- Sixty-seven (67) Texas Football students were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll by earning at least a 3.0 semester GPA in Fall 2014 and/or Spring 2015.
- Forty (40) current and former Texas Football student-athletes graduated or are projected to graduate during the 2014-15 academic year. Graduates included NFL alumni Priest Holmes, Nathan Vasher, and Marcus Wilkins.
- Texas Football posted the highest multiyear APR in program history with the 2013-14 data released in May.
- Current Texas Football students are pursuing majors from nearly every college on campus including: the McCombs School of Business, the Moody College of Communication, the College of Education, and the College of Liberal Arts, the College of Natural Sciences, and the Cockrell School of Engineering.

- In the win over Rice, Johnson's punt return for a TD was the first by a Longhorn since he did so against Oklahoma on Oct. 12, 2013. That return also went for 85 yards against the Sooners.
- The 85-yard punt return is tied for the fourth longest in school history
- Johnson also became the eighth player in UT history to have at least two career punt returns for touchdowns. He is just one behind the career leaders: Jordan Shipley (2006-09), Aaron Ross (2003-06) and Jim Moore (1971-73).
- On kickoff returns, Johnson also is a threat. He ranks fifth in the Big 12 with an average of 24.5 yards and the Longhorns rank sixth as a team.
- With Johnson's punt and kick returns added to his receiving yards, he ranks No. 4 in the Big 12 Conference in all-purpose yards at **142.2 yards per game**.

- Helping Texas and its high average in punt returns is **Duke Thomas**. He also grabbed a short punt against Rice and returned it 56 yards to set up another Texas touchdown.
- With Johnson and Thomas combined, Texas tallied 175 punt return yards to break the school record. The previous best was 173 yards against Baylor on Nov. 3, 2001. All those yards came from Nathan Vasher.
- Texas averaged 43.8 yards on punt returns against Rice.

### NO GRAY AREA

- Senior RB **Johnathan Gray** is climbing up the all-time lists at Texas. With a long history of legendary running backs for the Longhorns, Gray could move into the top 10 in yards soon.
- Gray needs just 398 yards to move ahead of Hodges Mitchell for 10th in school history. He is currently 15th and less than 90 yards from surpassing Steve Worster for No. 14 on the list.
- Against Cal on Sept. 19, Gray had just 46 yards rushing but made an impact on the passing game as well with a career-high 71 yards receiving.
- He currently has five receptions for 79 yards. If he maintains that current pace of contributing to the passing game, he could crack the Texas all-time Top 10 for receptions and receiving yards in a season by a running back. He also is approaching the Top Five in school history in those two categories for a career by running backs.

### LONGHORNS MAKING LONG GAINS

- Following the 38-3 season-opening loss to No. 11/11 Notre Dame, Head Coach Charlie Strong announced a change to the offense. Assistant Coach Jay Norvell would take over play calling duties from Offensive Coordinator Joe Wickline and Associate Head Coach for Quarterbacks Shawn Watson.
- Since that switch, the offense has seen an out-pouring of production with an average of 405.7 yards per game against Rice, Cal and Oklahoma State.
- Norvell made the switch to redshirt freshman Jerrod Heard at quarterback prior to the game against Rice, and in his second game as starter Heard posted the No. 1 total offense performance in school history in the 45-44 loss to Cal with 527 yards.
- Texas had just two plays of 20+ yards against Notre Dame.
- The Longhorns had four plays of 20+ yards against Rice and Oklahoma State and 10 against Cal.
- Four of those long plays have gone for touchdowns. The average length of those big-play scores is 43.3 yards.

# CHARLIE STRONG

## Head Coach • Second Year

A two-time conference coach of the year and the architect of a revitalized University of Louisville program that posted at least 11 wins in each of his final two seasons, Charlie Strong is in his second year as the Texas head football coach.

Strong, the 29th head coach in UT history, spent the previous four seasons as Louisville head coach, re-energizing a program that was coming off back-to-back losing seasons (5-7 in 2008, 4-8 in 2009) and a 15-21 record in the three years prior to his arrival. He amassed a 37-15 record, a pair of Big East Conference Championships (2011, 2012) and was named Big East Coach of the Year in both 2010 and 2012. He also led UofL to four straight bowl game appearances (3-1 record), including a victory over No. 4 Florida in the 2013 Allstate Sugar Bowl.

During 2014, Strong rallied the Longhorns from a 3-5 record to reach a bowl game despite the loss of two key starters on offense (QB David Ash, C Dominic Espinosa) and one on defense (DT Desmond Jackson) for nearly the entire season.

Texas ended the season with one of the better defenses in the nation, ranking 25th in the FBS in total yards allowed (348.5 per game), No. 11 in passing defense (184.2 ypg), No. 7 in yards allowed per play (4.68), 15th in passing efficiency defense (110.04 rating), tied for 11th in sacks (3.1 pg) and 31st in points allowed (23.8 pg).

A number of players earned individual honors in Strong's first season. Defensive tackle Malcom Brown was a finalist for both the Nagurski and Outland trophies, as well as becoming the 47th consensus All-American in school history. Brown and linebacker Jordan Hicks earned All-America honors. They were also among 10 players to secure All-Big 12 accolades.

Five players - Brown (first round to New England), Hicks (third round to Philadelphia), safety Mykkele Thompson (fifth round to NY Giants), cornerback Quandre Diggs (sixth round to Detroit) and tight end Geoff Swaim (seventh round to Dallas) - were selected in the 2015 NFL Draft.

During his final two seasons at Louisville, the Cardinals' were nation's fourth-winningest program, posting a 23-3 record (88.5 percent) and registering bowl victories in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. Louisville's 11-plus win seasons in 2012 and 2013 were the fourth and fifth in school history and the first back to back. UofL finished among the nation's top 15 for a school-record second straight year.

Strong spent seven seasons as the defensive coordinator at the University of Florida under Meyer from 2005-09 and Ron Zook from 2003-04 where he helped the Gators win a pair of national titles - 2008 over Oklahoma and 2006 over Ohio State.

From 2003-09, Strong's defensive units at Florida allowed an average of 17.6 points per game, which ranked ninth in the country over that span. His stint as defensive coordinator marked his fourth tenure at Florida, including a stretch from 1991-94 in which he coached defensive ends (1991-93) and defensive tackles (1994) after coaching outside linebackers in 1988-89, and serving as a graduate assistant in 1983-84. He served as Florida's assistant head coach from 2005-07 and was the associate head coach in 2008-09.

Before returning to Florida for the fourth time, Strong was defensive coordinator at the University of South Carolina from 1999-2002.

Outside of his time at Louisville, Florida, and South Carolina, Strong's career stops have included one season (1985) at Texas A&M as a graduate assistant before moving on to Southern Illinois as wide receivers coach from 1986-87, one season (1990) at Mississippi as wide receivers coach and four seasons (1995-98) as the defensive line coach at Notre Dame.

A native of Batesville, Ark., Strong was a three-year letterwinner (1979-81) and three-time all-conference safety at Central Arkansas, where he graduated in 1982 with a bachelor's degree in education. He and his wife, Vicki, have a son, Tory, and two daughters, Hailee and Hope.

Accredited media entities may not offer any live video, audio or other coverage of the event (or tape delay rebroadcast coverage in its entirety) without the advance written permission of The University of Texas athletics department. Video is for news usage only and may not be sponsored or sold. This policy includes all games, matches, practices and events involving any of Texas' athletics programs. It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews. Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.
