## Longhorns Begin Third Season Of Strong Era

- The University of Texas Football program enters the third season of the Charlie Strong era in 2016. The Longhorns kick off the season on Sept. 4 at home against Notre Dame.
- Strong, who added five new assistant coaches in the offseason, has proven effective in turning programs around throughout his career as a head coach.
- During his first two seasons at Louisville, Strong's Cardinals won just eight conference games and were around the .500 mark overall. But in his third season UofL burst onto the national scene with 11 wins and an appearance in the Sugar Bowl.

## The 2016 Schedule

- The 12-game 2016 slate features six games at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium, while the Longhorns will play five road games and the annual Red River Showdown in Dallas against Oklahoma.
- The Longhorns' 2016 opponents combined for a record of 89-64 (.582) in 2015, making it the 26th-toughest schedule in the country entering the season.
- Nine of Texas' 2016 opponents went to bowls, including three – Notre Dame, Oklahoma State and Oklahoma – who played in one of the New Year's Six bowls.
- Five opponents – Baylor (10), Notre Dame (10), Oklahoma (11), Oklahoma State (10) and TCU (11) – totaled double digit wins a season ago.
- UT will play 11 of its 12 opponents from the 2015 schedule once again this season, swapping out Rice in week two for a matchup with UTEP.

## The Youth Movement

- Despite having a young roster in each of the last two seasons, many Longhorns have gotten immeasurable experience during Charlie Strong's first two seasons.
- Texas will return 226 career starts on their roster entering the 2016 season.
- Of his 43 signees in his first two classes, 32 of them have seen significant snaps as freshmen and sophomores.
- In 2015, the Longhorns started a school-record 10 true freshmen while playing a total of 17.
- UT's underclassmen combined to score 33 of 40 touchdowns a season ago, while recording 12 of 13 interceptions.
- In total, 36 players saw action for the first time in their careers during the 2015 season. Only three programs - Kansas (39), Florida State (39) and TCU (37) - had more players take to the field for the first action of their collegiate careers in 2015.

## Home Or Away, The Longhorns Come To Play

- During the last 10 seasons, it hasn't mattered if the Longhorns are playing in front of a raucous crowd at DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium, or in a hostile environment on the road.
- Despite having an incredible home-field advantage and a home record of 43-20 (.683) over the last 10 seasons, the Longhorns have found nearly as much success playing on the road.
- Since the beginning of the 2006 season, UT boasts a road record of 30-14 (.682).
- The 0.1% difference in winning percentage at home vs. on the road has made the Longhorns the third-best road team in college football during the course of the last 10 seasons.

- Among a strong lineup of opening weekend college football games during Labor Day Weekend, Notre Dame and Texas will meet for the 12th time in history.
- The two teams will meet on Sunday night (Sept. 4) in primetime on ABC. Kickoff at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium is slated for 6:30 pm CT.
- Texas' 886 wins all-time are the third-most in college football history, while their .710 winning percentage is the seventh-best.
- Notre Dame's 892 wins all-time are the second-most in college football history, while their winning percentage of .732 is the best all-time.

## Previewing The Longhorns Offense

Head coach Charlie Strong made several changes to his offensive coaching staff following the 2015 season, bringing in four new faces to coach the Longhorns on the offensive side of the ball. After the offense struggled for much of 2015, offensive coordinator Sterlin Gilbert was hired from Tulsa to lead Texas' offense into a new era with an up-tempo system. Along with Gilbert came Matt Mattox from Tulsa, who will serve as the offensive line coach and running game coordinator. Former Longhorn running back Anthony Johnson returns to the 40 Acres to coach the UT running backs, while veteran college and NFL coach Charlie Williams was hired as the wide receivers coach. Those four join Jeff Traylor, who enters his second season as Texas' tight ends coach and special teams' coordinator. The Longhorns are expected to return starters at seven offensive positions for the 2016 season. Texas will return tight end Andrew Beck (10 starts) and both John Burt (12 starts) and Armanti Foreman (six starts) at wideout. Both quarterbacks who combined to start all 12 games a season ago, including Jerrod Heard who started 10, return for the Longhorns in 2016. On the offensive line, UT returns Kent Perkins (10 starts), Patrick Vahe (10 starts) and Connor Williams (12 starts).

## Sterlin Gilbert's Offense

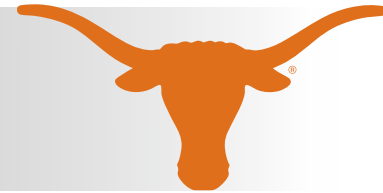
- The 2016 season will mark the fourth time in five seasons as a collegiate offensive coordinator that Sterlin Gilbert has been installing an offense as a first-year system.

## Quarterbacks

- Texas has three quarterbacks competing for the job entering fall camp in 2016. Back are Jerrod Heard (10 starts) and Tyrone Swoopes (2 starts) who combined to start all 12 games a season ago. Entering the fray is true freshman Shane Buechele, who was an early enrollee and competed during the Longhorns' spring practice sessions.
- Heard, after starting 10 games a season ago as a redshirt freshman, missed the second half of spring practices due to a shoulder injury. He did not play in the spring game, but is expected to be healthy and compete for the job entering fall camp. Last season, Heard passed for 1,214 yards and rushed for another 556. In his second career start against California, he set the school record for single-game total offense with 527 yards.
- Swoopes, who is dangerous with both his feet and arm, enters the 2016 season with a team-best 17 career rushing touchdowns including 12 during the 2015 season. He totaled 16 touchdowns last season and excelled in a feature package that became known as '18 Wheeler.'
- Buechele, a true freshman from Arlington Lamar High School, made a strong impression during spring practices and in the spring game. In the Orange-White game, Buechele passed for 299 yards and two scores.

## Running Backs

- Lifetime Longhorn Anthony Johnson was hired in the offseason to lead Texas' impressive group of running backs in 2016. UT's rich tradition of running back success will look to continue in 2016 with an up-tempo offense that will provide increased snaps.
- The Longhorns lose running back Johnathan Gray, who started the first 10 games last season and rushed for 489 yards.
- Texas returns junior D'Onta Foreman and sophomore Chris Warren, who combined to rush for 1,151 yards and nine touchdowns in 2015.
- Foreman carried the ball 95 times a season ago and led the team with 681 yards and five touchdowns.
- Warren burst onto the scene at the end of his freshman season, rushing for a UT freshman record 276 yards and four touchdowns against Texas Tech.
- Kirk Johnson, who began to show his ability in 2015 and should compete for significant time in the fall, missed spring practice and the spring game as he worked back from injury.
- Roderick Bernard, who made the switch from wide receiver during the spring, could also push for time at running back as a change-of-pace option for the Longhorns.

## Wide Receivers/Tight Ends

- Two position groups that could see increased productivity in 2016 in Sterlin Gilbert's up-tempo system are wide receivers and tight ends.
- Veteran coach Charlie Williams was hired during the offseason to coach the wide receivers at Texas, while second-year assistant coach Jeff Traylor coaches the inside receivers and tight ends.
- The Longhorns return two receivers who caught double-digit passes a season ago in sophomore John Burt (28 receptions) and junior Armanti Foreman (11 receptions). Both players had two touchdown catches.
- Two tight ends who caught passes a season ago return in Caleb Bluiett and Andrew Beck.
- Texas will be looking for several players to increase productivity and contribute in 2016, including senior Jacorey Warrick and juniors Lorenzo Joe, Dorian Leonard and Jake Oliver. Early enrollee Collin Johnson and others will also factor into the mix for the Longhorns along with several other freshmen.

# SEASON OUTLOOK



## Offensive Line

- A new pace and new style are expected under first-year offensive coordinator Sterlin Gilbert and offensive line coach Matt Mattox, who comes to the 40 Acres with Gilbert after spending the last three seasons with him at Tulsa, Bowling Green and Eastern Illinois.
- The offensive line returns 35 of 60 starts from a season ago, but will have to replace starters Taylor Doyle (12 games, center) and Sedrick Flowers (11 games, left guard).
- Connor Williams (12 starts), Patrick Vahe (10 starts) and Kent Perkins (10 starts) return for the Longhorns in 2016.
- Texas was the only team in the country in 2015 to start two true freshman on the offensive line (Vahe and Williams), as both were named freshman All-Americans.
- Several players will compete for starting positions in 2016 along the offensive line. Among them will be junior Tristan Nickelson (3 starts) and Brandon Hodges (redshirt) along with sophomore Elijah Rodriguez and early enrollee Zach Shackelford. Several other newcomers could also compete for time in 2016.

## Previewing The Longhorns Defensive

The Longhorns defense will look to take a step forward in 2016 under third-year defensive coordinator Vance Bedford, who came with Charlie Strong from Louisville where the duo combined to put some of the nation's top defenses on the field. Bedford will lead a defensive coaching staff comprised of linebackers coach Brian Jean-Mary (third season at Texas), defensive line coach Brick Haley (second season at Texas) and defensive backs coach Clay Jennings (first season at Texas). Last season, Texas had a young defense which struggled to find consistency at times, but was among the nation's best at forcing turnovers. The Longhorns forced 25 turnovers and had a plus-11 turnover margin, the eighth-best mark in the country. Their three defensive touchdowns were 25th-most in the nation while their 12 fumble recoveries put them at 11th. On the defensive side of the ball, Paul Boyette Jr. (six starts), Bryce Cottrell (eight starts) and Naashon Hughes (12 starts) return up front, while freshman All-American Malik Jefferson (nine starts) is also back. In the secondary, the Longhorns return safeties Dylan Haines (11 starts) and Jason Hall (11), while at cornerback Holton Hill (eight starts) and Davante Davis (five starts) are back.

## Defensive Line

- Defensive line coach Brick Haley will look to continue to build that group as he enters his second season at Texas in 2016.
- On the inside, the Longhorns will need to overcome the loss of significant experience in both Desmond Jackson (52 games/21 starts) and Hassan Ridgeway, who was drafted in the fourth round by the Indianapolis Colts following his junior season.
- Paul Boyette, who started six games a season ago, and Poona Ford, who started five games last season, will be looked to in order to fill the void after contributing 76 tackles, 14.0 TFL and 5.5 sacks.
- Sophomore Chris Nelson will also be looked to for contributions during the 2016 season, as will several members of the Longhorns' large incoming class which features six defensive linemen.
- At the end position, Bryce Cottrell started the final eight games last season and was opposed by junior Naashon Hughes who started all 12 games at fox end.
- Senior Quincy Vasser and sophomores Charles Omenihu and Breckyn Hager are expected to see significant time lining up outside, too, in addition to several others.

## Linebackers

- The Longhorns return a young core at linebacker in 2016, led by 2015 freshman All-American Malik Jefferson.
- Brian Jean-Mary is in his third season coaching the linebackers at Texas, in addition to his recruiting coordinator duties.
- Jefferson finished second on the team a season ago with 61 tackles.
- The Longhorns will have to replace their leading tackler from 2015 in Peter Jinkens, who totaled 75 tackles and was named first team All-Big 12.
- Jefferson will be joined by the likes of senior Tim Cole, sophomores Edwin Freeman and Anthony Wheeler, early enrollee Demarco Boyd, and many others who will compete for significant time at the linebacker position in 2016.

## By The Numbers

**3** The Longhorns had three freshmen All-Americans in 2015, tied for most in the country with Alabama.

**4** UT had four non-offensive touchdowns last season, including one by Malik Jefferson (fumble) and Holton Hill (interception).

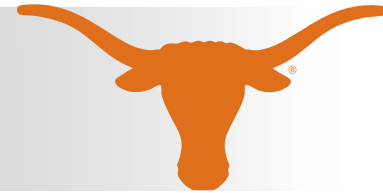

## Texas Named 'The Real #DBU'

- According to a study by CBS Sports during the spring, Texas ranked as the top school in college football for a defensive back.
- Besides Earl Thomas and Michael Griffin being Pro Bowlers, and Michael Huff and Aaron Ross winning the Thorpe Award, the Longhorns have also produced, Cedric Griffin, Tarell Brown, Aaron Williams and Kenny Vaccaro. Texas DB's have started 687 games in the NFL over the last decade.

## Defensive Backs

- In 2016, experience in the defensive secondary will be a key to the Longhorns' success. Texas returns 46 starts from the 2015 secondary, but will be tasked with replacing both the skill and leadership of Duke Thomas who was named team MVP after starting all 12 games in 2015.
- Back, however, are the likes of Dylan Haines (23 career starts) and Jason Hall, who both started 11 games last season.
- Haines, the team leader with five interceptions, missed the final game at Baylor due to injury. He did not play in the spring game.
- Joining that safety duo in the secondary will be Holton Hill (eight starts) and Davante Davis (five starts), who earned honorable mention All-Big 12 honors as true freshmen at corner.
- In addition, John Bonney and Antwuan Davis both return with starting experience at corner.
- The line of young talent continues with sophomores CB Kris Boyd, S DeShon Elliott and S P.J. Locke, while the group should also benefit from the return of senior Sheroid Evans, who has missed the last two seasons due to injury.
- Senior Kevin Vaccaro, who made several impressive plays in the spring, will contribute for defensive coordinator Vance Bedford and first-year defensive backs coach Clay Jennings.

## Special Teams

- Texas used much of the spring to work new players into the fold on special teams, as second-year assistant coach Jeff Traylor is tasked with replacing kicker Nick Rose (UDFA Atlanta Falcons) and returner Daje Johnson (UDFA Atlanta Falcons).
- Back is sophomore punter Michael Dickson, who was named honorable mention All-Big 12 as a true freshman in 2015. A native of Sydney, Australia, he averaged 41.3 yards per punt on 77 attempts.
- Deep snapper Kyle Ashby and holder Trey Holtz also return for the Longhorns in 2016.
- Texas had some of the best special teams units in not only the Big 12 Conference last season, but in the entire country.
- The Longhorns 39.3 net punting average was fourth in the conference and 26th in the country.
- UT's punt return defense was fourth in the conference and 15th in the nation, while their punt return unit ranked second in the conference and 27th in the nation.

## 2016 Signing Class Among Nation's Best

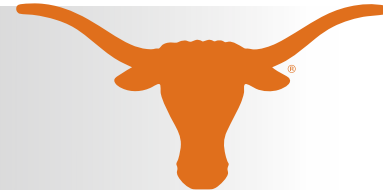
- Head coach Charlie Strong and his staff pulled in what was considered to be among the nation's top recruiting classes by every major outlet that covers college football recruiting.
- One major key to the 2016 Texas recruiting class was its size, as Strong and his staff added 10 300-pounders to the roster, which now brings the total to 21 players on the 2016 roster weighing in over 300 pounds.
- Four early enrollees are already a semester into their collegiate careers and participated in Texas' spring practices. LB Demarco Boyd, QB Shane Buechele, WR Collin Johnson and OL Zach Shackelford all partook in spring drills for the Longhorns.







# SEASON OUTLOOK



## Brotherly Love

- The Longhorns will have four sets of brothers on their roster when they open fall camp for the 2016 season. The four sets of brothers are the third-most in the country behind Iowa and West Virginia, who both have five.
- Back are the Foreman brothers, who hail from Texas City, Texas. Twins, Armanti is a junior wide receiver while D'Onta is a junior running back.
- Collin Johnson enrolled early as a wide receiver and joins his brother, sophomore running back Kirk Johnson. They are the sons of legendary Longhorn defensive back Johnnie Johnson. The Johnson's are from San Jose, Calif. and went to Valley Christian.
- Demarco Boyd, a freshman linebacker who enrolled early, joins his brother Kris, a sophomore cornerback. That pair hails from Gilmer, Texas, where they once played for Jeff Traylor.
- Twin brothers from Sachse, Texas, are the Longhorns' fourth set of brothers on this year's roster. Devin Duvernay, a wide receiver, and Donovan Duvernay, a defensive back, join Texas as part of their 2016 recruiting class.

## Burt Blazing On Field And Track

- Sophomore wide receiver John Burt had a standout freshman season on both the football field for Coach Charlie Strong and on the track for Coach Mario Sategna.
- Burt was named the 12th-fastest player in college football as part of the NFL.com "16 for '16" series.
- A native of Tallahassee, Fla., Burt was the Longhorns' leading receiver as a true freshman catching 28 passes for 457 yards and two touchdowns. He started all 12 games last season for UT.
- On the track, Burt finished second in the 110m Hurdles at the Big 12 Championships and qualified for NCAA Championships in Eugene, Ore.
- Burt was one of five who also play football at their respective FBS schools to qualify for the NCAA Championships. He was one of just two freshmen to qualify in the 24-person field.

## Freshman All-Americans Back For Encore

- Three Texas Longhorns were named freshman All-Americans following last season. LB Malik Jefferson, OL Patrick Vahe and OL Connor Williams all picked up the honors.
- Jefferson started nine games and was second on the team with 61 tackles. He also added a team-high six quarterback pressures and returned a fumble for a touchdown.
- Vahe started the first 10 games of the season at right guard, before missing the final two due to injury.
- Williams started all 12 games at left tackle after enrolling during the spring 2015 semester. Of 14 true freshman offensive tackles to play at least 240 snaps, Williams was the only one with a positive overall grade according to Pro Football Focus.

## Football Succeeding In The Classroom

- The Longhorns continue to succeed in the classroom under head coach Charlie Strong, as 47 student-athletes were named to the Big 12 Commissioner's Honor Roll in the spring semester. Of those players, two had a perfect 4.0 grade point average and 40 will be on the 2016 roster.
- Additionally, three Longhorns were named to the 2015-16 Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team in P Michael Dickson, LB Anthony Wheeler and OT Connor Williams.

## Five Graduates Back In 2016

- In May, 24 current and former Longhorn football players graduated with their degree from The University of Texas.
- Five of those graduates will return to the program for the 2016 season. Among them are DS Kyle Ashby, DL Paul Boyette Jr., LB Timothy Cole, DB Dylan Haines and QB Trey Holtz.

## The 2016 NFL Draft

- Texas had just one player drafted during the 2016 NFL Draft, but five other players signed as undrafted free agents.
- DL Hassan Ridgeway was a fourth round pick of the Indianapolis Colts, marking the first Longhorn to be drafted by the Colts since TE Kerry Cash in 1991.
- The Longhorns have now had at least one player selected in the first four rounds of the draft in 15 of the last 16 years, dating back to 2001.

## Longhorns In The Super Bowl

- Fozzy Whittaker's appearance in Super Bowl 50 with the Carolina Panthers in 2016 marked the 11th straight season in which a former Longhorns has appeared in the Super Bowl.
- The stretch, which began in 2007, is tied for the longest in UT history.
- In total, 53 former Longhorns have been members of 44 different Super Bowl squads.
- Of the Longhorns to have played in the Super Bowl, 23 of them have been victorious.

## Longhorns In The Pro Bowl

- Texas has had 41 different Pro Bowlers representing 23 franchises who have made a total of 103 all-time appearances.
- Texas standouts Earl Thomas and Derrick Johnson were named Pro Bowlers in 2015 and both appeared in the 2016 game.
- Thomas' appearance was his fifth consecutive, tying him for the most in UT history.
- Johnson's appearance was the fourth of his career.
- Texas has had a Pro Bowler in each of the last 15 seasons, the longest consecutive streak in school history.
