Texas Track & Field splits up again for a pair of meets this weekend that have earned a reputation as two of the best each year for certain disciplines. The sprinters, hurlders and jumpers go to the Tyson Invitational hosted by Arkansas where the Longhorns will see the best of the best in those events. The pole vaulters, throwers and distance runners will compete at the Husky Classic, which will see the best distance runners in the nation duke it out on the track at Washington's Dempsey Center.

The Longhorns enter this week's action after seeing strong marks from the sprinters at the Husker Invitational while the throwers and vaulters posted a slew of personal bests in New Mexico. Texas hopes to build on those performances as the Big 12 Conference Championship approaches in two weeks.

Many of the sprint events at the Tyson Invitational will feature half of the top 16 runners in the nation. With only 16 individuals qualifying for NCAA Indoor Championships in each event, nearly every race in Arkansas can be viewed as a preview of the national championship meet.

Fans will be able to watch the action from both meets this weekend online with coverage at the Tyson Invitational provided by SEC Network+, which can be viewed online at espn3.com or on the WatchESPN app for smartphones and tablets. Live coverage of the Husky Classic will be provided by FloTrack for subscribers to the site's FloPro services.

Live results will again be provided at the Tyson Invitational by FlashResults.com for fans wanting to follow the action that way and links to live results from the Husky Classic will be at GoHuskies.com.

Fans can get updates on the Longhorns from both meets on the team's official Twitter account @UTexasTrack. Links to live results, heat sheets and live video will be posted prior to the start of each day's action as well.

TEXAS TRACK & FIELD NOTEBOOK **Longhorns Among NCAA Favorites**

- Texas is among the elite programs in the NCAA again in 2017 and the women are eyeing their first NCAA indoor title since 2006 as they stand at No. 8 in the USTFCCCA Indoor Rankings heading into this weekend's action. The men's team is No. 15 in the rankings after finishing 5th at the NCAA Championship last year.
- Texas began the season with both teams in the Top 10. It was 1 of 7 schools to have its men's and women's teams ranked in the Top 10 in the preseason.
- The Big 12 Conference has 3 other men's team ranked in the Top 25: Texas Tech (12), Kansas (16), Oklahoma State (20).
- The Big 12 has 4 other women's teams ranked in the Top 25: Baylor (12), Kansas State (13), Oklahoma State (19),
- Last year at NCAA Indoors the women won 3 events with Teahna Daniels claiming the 60m with an American Junior record time of 7.11 seconds. She is back for her sophomore season. **Courtney Okolo** won the 400m and anchored the victorious 4x400m relay and has graduated, but half of the champion relay squad is back in 2017. For the men, Zack Bilderback became the first Longhorn to win the men's 400m, but the then-senior graduated. Ryan **Crouser also** won his fourth overall NCAA title in the shot put to close his collegiate career.
- The men finished the indoor season in fifth place at the NCAA Championships with 25 points.
- The women finished fourth at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a total of 44 points.

2017 Bowerman Watch List

The most prestigious award in collegiate track and field, The Bowerman, is awarded by the USTFCCCA annually to the top male and female track and field star annually. Since its inception in 2009, the winners gone on to win multiple Olympic medals. One Longhorn is on the February Watch List among those up for the award.

- Senior **Byron Robinson** won the 400m hurdles at the Big 12 Championship in May, posted the fastest time in the NCAA and ran for Team USA in the 2016 Summer Olympic Games to help garner his spot on the list.
 - > Robinson ran No. 1 time in collegiate season last year in 49.10 seconds at the LSU Alumni Gold
 - > Claimed Big 12 Conference title in 49.39 seconds

WOMEN'S 60M

Sophomore **Teahna Daniels** takes on some of the best sprinters in the NCAA this weekend. The 2016 NCAA champion will be in the field that could be a preview of the NCAA Championships in March with 6 of the top 8 times this year competing.

MEN'S 60M

The men's 60m will also feature elite talent, including senior **Senoj-Jay Givans**. With 9 of the top 16 in the NCAA this season in the field, look for times at the Tyson Center to be fast. There are 7 runners in the field who have run 6.65 or faster in 2017.

MEN'S 400M

Seniors **Aldrich Bailey Jr. and Byron Robinson** made their season debuts in this event last week and rank in the Top 12. This field will also be loaded with some of the best of the best with 4 of the top 10 and half of the fastest 16 in the NCAA this year.

WOMEN'S 400M

Senior **Chrisann Gordon** and sophomore **Zola Golden** are in arguably the deepest women's running event at the Tyson Invitational with both ranking 14th or better. The field has 5 top 8 times from this season and 8 of the top 16.

WOMEN'S 60M HURDLES

Freshmen **Alexis Duncan** made her debut as a Longhorn last week and will see some of the top hurdlers in the country this weekend. She ranks No. 22 in her event and junior **Ariel Jones** is No. 24 as the pair will face 4 of the top 10 runners in Arkansas.

MEN'S LONG JUMP

Jumpers have thrived at Tyson Invitational in the past and this year's field for the long jump is stacked. With 4 of the top 8 jumpers in the nation, including No's. 1, 3, 4, it will be an exciting event to watch as No. 8 **Steffin McCarter** looks to improve on his season-best mark of 7.77m (25-6.00) for the Longhorns.

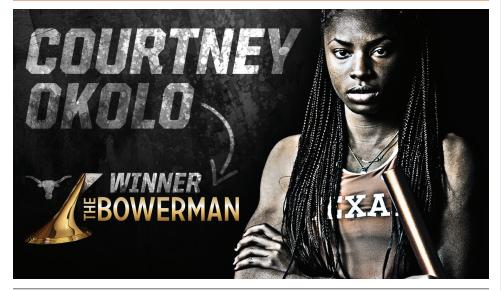

• MEN'S & WOMEN'S 5000M

The Husky Classic has become a big meet for distance runners looking to qualify for NCAA Championships. With many of the top runners in the country yet to run the 5,000m many of them will take to the track this weekend attempting to post an eventual top 16 time to make the NCAA meet. Texas has seen success at this meet in the past. Craig Lutz broke the school record in the men's 5,000 at Husky in 2015. Senior Sandie Raines was less than half a second from breaking the women's record the same year.

- > Ran personal best 48.79 to finish 2nd at U.S. Olympic Trials and qualify for Team USA
- > Advanced through prelims at the Olympic Games with time of 48.98
- > Improved his PR in the semifinals to 48.65 for the No. 8 time but missed advancing to the final by .01.
- > During 2016 indoor season, Robinson broke the school record in the 600 yards to win the Big 12 Championship.
- > His time of 1:07.99 also broke the Big 12 meet record.

Long Vaulting Among National Leaders

- Junior pole vaulter **Kally Long** opened the 2017 season with the best performance of her career, clearing a pair of personal records. It was the best jump in the NCAA to open the season and still ranks No. 3 so far in 2017.
- Long cleared 4.37m and 4.42m (14-6.00) to win the Texas A&M Team Invitational over Big 12 Outdoor champ and All-American Annie Rhodes of Baylor. Long cleared 5 of 6 bars on first attempts and cleared 4.42m on her second.
- Long cleared that height on a short approach. After the meet, she said she was only using an 8-step approach
- In her second competition of the season, Long dominated the field with a clearance of 4.35m (14-3.25) to win the Cherry & Silver Invitational by 10 inches. She had close misses at 4.45m.
- Long has continued her strong performances in 2017 with another mark of 4.42m at the New Mexico Classic. She had three attempts at 4.52m with a near make on her final try. She finished 4th in the competition behind a trio of post-collegiate and professional vaulters.

Poth Posts 3rd Personal Best

- Redshirt sophomore **Barrett Poth** is among the top pole vaulters in the NCAA this season and has performed consistently each meet.
- In 3 competitions, Poth has posted 3 personal bests and 2 victories.
- Poth opened 2017 with a win at the Texas A&M Invitational at 5.32m (17-5.50) for the win.
- He followed with a clearance of 5.35m (17-6.50) to finish 2nd at the Cherry & Silver Invitational.
- His last time out, Poth cleared 5.40m (17-8.50) to win again and rank 13th in the NCAA this year.
- He ranks 4th in school history as well.

Bailey Runs Away at Husker Invitational

- Senior Aldrich Bailey Jr. made his season debut in the 400 meters at the Husker Invitational last weekend with a victory. After running mostly relays in previous meets, Bailey crossed with a time of 46.38 seconds to win and rank No. 5 in the NCAA so far this season.
- Bailey backed that win up with another more dominant showing in the 200 meters. His time of 20.96 bested the field by .30 as he continues running fast this season.

Olympian Makes 2017 Debut

- After a long summer of competition and finishing 9th at the Olympic Games this summer in Rio in the 400m hurdles, senior Byron Robinson made his season debut for the Longhorns at the Husker Invitational.
- Robinson finished 2nd in the 400 meters behind teammate Aldrich Bailey Jr. with a time of 46.68 to rank 11th in the NCAA so far this season.
- Robinson also ran the opening leg of the 4x400m relay that finished 2nd behind Kansas by just .01.

BEVO BREAKTHROUGH PERFORMANCE OF THE WEEK

This season the coaching staff is recognizing one Longhorn every week who goes above and beyond in competition and wears Burnt Orange with pride while representing Texas with the **BEVO Breakthrough Performance of the Week**.

Last week's winner was thrower **David Rueff**. At the New Mexico Classic, Rueff posted a personal record to finish in 8th place behind some of the top throwers in the nation. But it was by how much further his PR throw was that impressed. Rueff improved on his previous PR by more than 5 feet with a toss of 15.65m (51-4.25). The throw also ranks him



No. 8 in the Big 12 Conference and in position to potentially score at the championship meet.

Throwers Roll at New Mexico Classic

- Texas sent its throwers to the New Mexico Classic and came away with multiple personal records despite not winning any of the four events.
- Junior **Lauryn Caldwell** inched closer to the school record in the weight throw as she posted a personal record for the 2nd time this season and is now just 19 inches from breaking the school record as she finished 5th in the weight throw at New Mexico behind some of the top throwers in the nation.
- Junior **Alan Zapalac** also improved his PR in the weight throw with a runner-up finish at 20.55m (67-5.25). He also ranks No. 2 in school history.
- In the shot put, redshirt freshman **David Rueff** saw a dramatic improvement as he broke his previous PR by more than 5 feet to finish in eighth place. His mark also catapulted him into 8th on the Big 12 performance list this season and in position to potentially score at the conference championship meet in two weeks.

4x400m Relays Gaining Steam

- Texas ran a pair of strong relay teams at the Husker Invitational with the men's and women's teams ranking among the top in the NCAA this season.
- The women's team of **Chrisann Gordon, Zola Golden, Ariel Jones and Serenity Douglas** clocked in at 3:33.71 to win and set a new meet record at the 42nd Husker Invitational.
- The men ran **Byron Robinson, Carlton Anumnu, Senoj-Jay Givans and Chris Irvin** ran one of the most exciting races of the meet. The Longhorns finished second in 3:07.83, which would have been good for a new meet record, but Kansas out-leaned Irvin at the finish line by just .01.
- Irvin nearly caught the Jayhawks from behind running an impressive anchor leg in 46.3 seconds.

Hurdler Returns to Track with Fire

- Redshirt junior hurdler **Spencer Dunkerley-Offor** made his return to the track after missing 2016 due to injury in style at the Texas A&M Invitational. He won the 60m hurdles with a time of 7.88 seconds, just .06 off his PR.
- The next time he stepped on the track he broke his PR with a time of 7.78 during prelims at the Rod McCravy Memorial. That time ranks him No. 9 in the NCAA so far this season and No. 4 in school history.
- Dunkerley-Offor was a first team All-American outdoors in 2015 finishing sixth in the 110m hurdles and was runner-up at both Big 12 Championships.

Bruckner Debuts with Runner-Up

- Freshman thrower Elena Bruckner made her collegiate debut with a runner-up finish in the shot put.
- The lefty threw the shot 16.00m (52-6.00) to trail Baylor's Cion Hicks by just. The mark ranks Bruckner sixth in school history already and currently stands at No. 14 in the NCAA this year.
- Bruckner was the No. 1 throws recruit out of high school, ranking in the top three in the shot put and discus.
- She qualified for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the discus, finishing 16th and went on to represent Team USA at the IAAF World Junior Championships and finished 7th in both events.
- Bruckner ranks No. 3 all-time in the high school shot put in the U.S. and is No. 4 in the discus all-time.
- In her second meet as a Longhorn, Bruckner got a win in the shot put at the Cherry & Silver Invitational. She also debuted in the weight throw and ranks 4th in school history in that event.

Men's Jumps Dominate at Texas A&M

- Texas opened the season with an impressive showing from the men's jumps group, winning all 4 jumping events at the Texas A&M Invitational
- Sophomore **Steffin McCarter** dominated the men's long jump with win by more than 16 inches. His jump of 7.77m (25-6.00) is No. 4 in the NCAA this season and moves him to No. 6 in school history.
- Freshman **Obrien Wasome** won big in the triple jump. He bested the field by nearly 3 feet at 15.58m (51-1.50).
- Redshirt Sophomore **Barrett Poth** posted a PR in the pole vault at 5.32m (17-5.50) to defeat Texas A&M's Audie Wyatt on misses. His height is currently No. 11 in the NCAA.
- Senior **Spencer McCloud** started the 2017 season with the first collegiate win of his career. He cleared 2.08m (6-9.75) to get the win over a jumper from A&M.

Standard Bearers

- No school holds more current collegiate records than the Texas Longhorns. The men and women combine to hold a total of 8 collegiate records heading into the 2017 season. The nearest competitor is Arkansas with 5 records. Arizona, Colorado and LSU each have four. All of Colorado's records are held by one athlete.
- Two of UT's records were set during the 2016 campaign. **Ryan Crouser** tied the indoor collegiate record in the shot put at the Big 12 Indoor Championships. **Courtney Okolo** already owned the collegiate record in the outdoor 400 meters, but she cut .32 off her time running 49.71 seconds at the LSU Alumni Gold in April.

Longhorns Dominate at Olympic Games

- Texas had its most successful Olympics in history in 2016 with a 9 Longhorns competing in Rio in track & field.
- The Longhorns won 6 medals for an amazing .667 percentage at the Games.
- Michelle Carter (2006) became the first American woman to win gold at the Olympics in the shot put. Carter broke her own American record in the process, winning on her last throw of the competition over two-time defending champion Valerie Adams of New Zealand.
- Texas made it a double in the shot put with 2016 Longhorn Ryan Crouser winning the men's competition. Crouser had one of the most impressive performances in the history of the event. He had zero fouls in his series of six throws, with all of them registering at least 20 meters. His winning throw of 22.52m (73-10.75) was a new Olympic record and ranks him No. 10 all-time in the shot put.
- **Ashley Spencer** (2015) won the third individual medal for the Longhorns in her first year back in her old event. Spencer transitioned back to the 400m hurdles in 2016 and stormed onto the scene with a bronze medal in Rio. Spencer clocked in at 53.27 seconds despite a few setbacks during the run. Spencer got off on her strides and led with her "off" foot over each hurdle but persevered and closed hard over the final 100 meters to move into medal position. Spencer also showed guts during the semifinals when she clipped the eighth hurdle but managed to save herself from falling, regained her stride and pushed to the finish to advance to the final.
- Courtney Okolo (2016) won gold for Team USA in the 4x400m relay. The NCAA champion in the 400m and anchor leg for UT's relay team that won titles and ran some of the fastest times in collegiate history had a different role wearing Red, White and Blue. Okolo ran the opening leg in both the prelims and the final to put her team in the lead and set the tone for the gold medal performance.
- Morolake Akinosun (2016) earned a gold medal with Team USA in the 4x100m relay. Akinosun ran the anchor leg in the prelims to get her medal in what was one of the most bizarre events of the Olympics. Team USA was interfered with during an exchange in the prelims and dropped the baton. After a protest, the Americans were allowed to re-run the race, solo, to see if they could qualify based on time and get an at-large bid to the final. With Akinosun running by herself down the final stretch, the U.S. clocked 41.77 for the fastest overall time in prelims. USA went on to win gold in 41.01 in the final.
- Current Longhorn and 2017 senior **Chrisann Gordon** also won a relay medal for role with Jamaica. Gordon ran the third leg for Jamaica in the prelims to help her country make the final and earn her right to a medal. She ran her leg in 50.75 seconds as the team clocked 3:21.42. Gordon handed the baton to the anchor leg with a significant lead in their heat. The Jamaicans would take second in the final and give Gordon a silver medal.
- In addition to the 6 Olympic medalists, also representing The Forty Acres in Rio were:
 - > Byron Robinson (2017 senior), USA, 9th place 400m hurdles
 - > Marielle Hall (2014), USA, 33rd place 10,000m
 - > **Jamal Wilson (2011)**, The Bahamas, 25th place High Jump
